YOUR HOROSCOPE.

THE OUTLOOK FOR OCTOBER 1906.

The month starts in October 2nd with the Full Moon at 6-48 A. M. Chicago standard time, the New Moon on the 17th of October at 4-42 P. M. Chicago time. Full Moon again the 31st of October at 10-45 P. M.

At the time of the New Moon of Sept. 18th the Sun is about to cross the Equinox and is coming square to Uranus, Jupiter and Neptune, indicating a very changeable condition from this time for the next three months, some activity in business, speculative markets, stocks etc., there will be sudden rises, but some very good breaks before the quarter is past, unusual calamities in various parts of the world. Business active altho uncertain, many will make investments, go into large deals and eventually lose all that they have invested. These evil aspects are the influences that cause the small capitalist to use bad judgment and eventually lose all that he has; the large capitalists are the ones that use these periods to take profits.

From the Full of the Moon on the 2d of October, I look for activity in general business lines. The Sun square to Neptune indicates large deals in stocks and cereals, and I judge that the markets will have considerable advance, I favor the Bull side on all breaks in the wheat markets, but look for the stocks to sell off more after advances than the wheat, the position of Uranus opposite Jupiter and Neptune indicates conflicts among the large operators and it is probable that there may be unusual moves in all markets. The sign Libra ascends at Washington, (the last degrees of Virgo) and Jupiter being the high planet exalted in Cancer, indicates a very good period for the president, and the position of Venus favors good success in a financial way for the public generally. From the New Moon of October 17th, the Sun will be coming to a good aspect of Uranus, and Jupiter, indicating a more favorable and steady period, the full effect of this will not occur till the last of the month, therefore I judge that from the 17th to 28th of October, will be comparatively quiet, yet a very good period for starting important business or changes. The judgment of the average person is much better in this period, there will be less deceit in the papers, advice given from those in high places of a nature that is beneficial.

THE DAYS.

October 7th, 14th, 20th, 27th. Moon in evil aspect to Saturn, bad days for forming opinions, making changes, starting new enterprises, etc. Be careful, ask no favors.

October 16th, 22nd and 29th, Moon evil aspect to Uranus, is deceiving, changeable and uncertain, avoid sudden changes, ask no favors, guard against accidents and disputes.

October 15th, 21st, 29th, Moon aspecting Mars by evil aspects, guard

against losses, quarrels, accidents, etc.

October 4th, 9th, 18th, 26th, 31st, Moon in good aspect to Jupiter, Uranus and Neptune, these are very good days, and the best days of the months to ask favors, start changes, new enterprises, deal with officials, etc.

The best long periods, of two weeks, are when the Moon is from new to full, if the Sun is coming to a good aspect, or from Full to new if come to bad aspects. From October 17th to 31st should be the best period in the month of October 1906.

DIRECTIONS.

The horoscope of Charles Louis Tucker who was electrocuted for murder of Miss Mabel Page, at Weston, Mass., offers an excellent test of the accuracy of directions—especially those of the *mundane house*, which are the very "core" of every horoscope, and which are too often ignored by the sages—especially during the hot weather when mathematics are dry and ice is "out of sight." After a careful rectification of the horoscope we find Mars in the ascendant in Cancer retrograde, and weak and square to Mercury and the Sun in Aries in the M. C. Thus the radix shows the publicity (angles), the discredit, and the sudden death. Without discussing the question of his guilt or innocence, I merely give the directions which closed the last chapter of an existence unfortunate in its notoriety. At the time of the crime the IIIrd house was $14^{\circ} 28'$ of Virgo by direction (O. E.) and Uranus had retrograded to $14^{\circ} 28'$ of the same sign by direction.

Uranus ruled the VIIIth at birth and this direction connected his *walk* with the crime. The M. C. was applying to a conjunction of Mercury's radix and close to a parallel of Uranus, and as Mercury was evil to Mars in the ascendant at birth and had progressed to a parallel of Mars by direction, he was charged with being "occupied" (M. C.) in the crime during the walk. It is well to note that though the IIIrd was *exact* conjunction with Uranus at the time—the indication of the crime taking place during his walk—yet his M. C. did not complete the aspect to Mercury's Radix till the following January, when the jury found him guilty (?) of being so "occupied." Does this make him innocent in fact and guilty only by law? Remember /T/ always shows the volitional (voluntary) design; Mercury the reason or instrument of the will or design, and Mars the *resulting action*. Let the student judge for himself; noting at the same time that the ascendant was directed parallel to Jupiter was $1^{\circ} 28'$ from the conjunction of Mars; while the Sun was sextile to Mars Radix and exactly square to the progressed VIIIth. During the imprisonment, his ascendant held the close parallel of Jupiter, lord of his counsel (VIth) in the XIth (assistance) strong in Taurus, but shortly before the week of June 10th, this aspect caluminated and in its stead arose the *exact* conjunction of the ascendant to Mars ($2^{\circ} 42'$ Leo) without even a fractional error of measurement. The VIIIth was still square to the Sun within $4'$ and the M. C. was exact parallel to Uranus' Radix without mathematical error—the latter direction ending a *career* of discredit in the electric chair (IT/) lord of VIIIth.)

The ascendant and Mars in their exact conjunction was but $20'$ past the opposition of the radical VIIIth. On the day of electrocution Saturn transited $14^{\circ} 53'$ —(which is the exact opposition of Uranus in the Radix, and Uranus, Mars, and Mercury were all parallel to the radical ascendant by transit. But what would transits avail without directions? *Nothing*. What would directions of planets signify without

the directions of the twelve houses? Nothing but the *quality* of the influences, for the *prime movers of the events are the houses to planets—they alone specify what and when*, with consistency to the Radix of course.

PLANETARY HOURS.

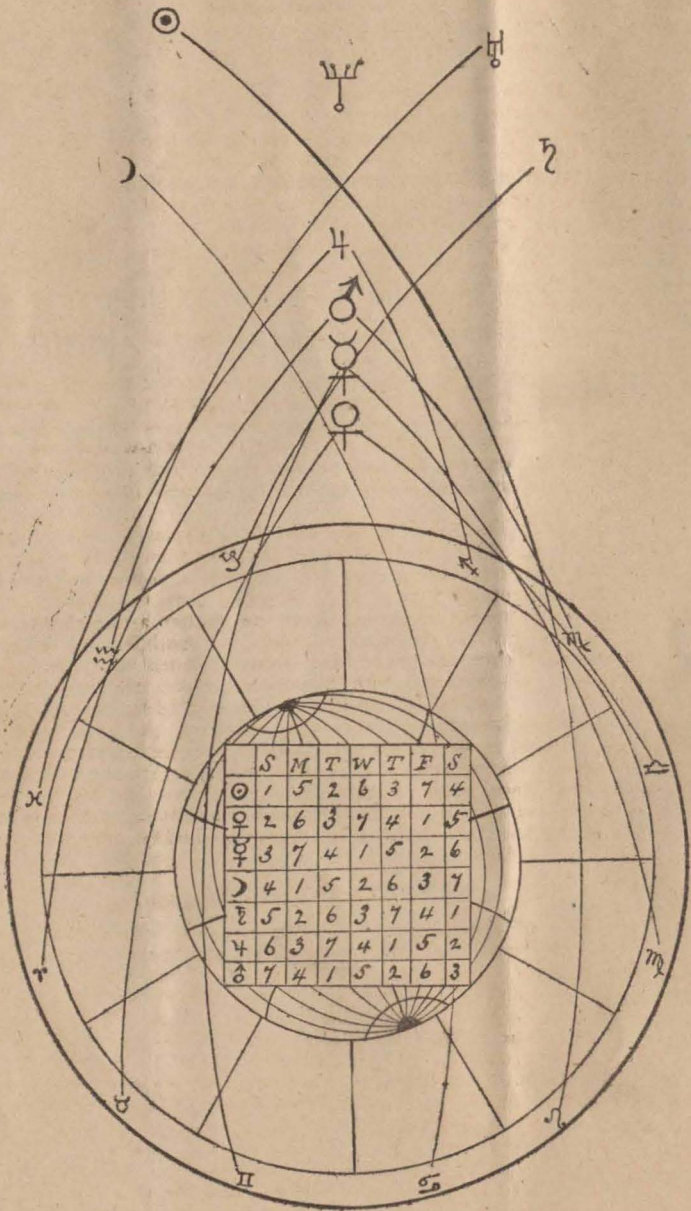
The planetary hours are calculated from the rising of the Sun, in that part of the country where one desires judgment.

Each planet will influence or affect the hour according to its nature. Sunday is ruled by the Sun.

Monday	"	"	Moon.
Tuesday	"	"	Mars.
Wednesday	"	"	Mercury.
Thursday	"	"	Jupiter.
Friday	"	"	Venus.
Saturday	"	"	Saturn.

The first hour begins with sunrise, thus as Sunday is the Sun's day the 1st hour is the Sun, the 2nd Venus, 3rd Mercury, 4th Moon, 5th Saturn, 6th Jupiter, 7th Mars, 8th Sun, 9th Venus, 10th Mercury, 11th Moon, 12th Saturn, 13th Jupiter, 14th Mars, 15th Sun, 16th Venus, 17th Mercury, 18th Moon, 19th Saturn, 20th Jupiter, 21st Mars, 22nd Sun, 23rd Venus, 24th Mercury.

Instructions.

The Sun means leadership or an influence which makes you best fitted to promote business, or ambitious affairs and spiritual attainments.

In its hour or when it is in good aspect, it is a good time to advance openly, ask favors. The mind is open, free and generous and you will be pulling with the tide or stream, though it may be in an under-current. The result will give good business conditions, powerful friends and contentment, etc. (Sunday.)

The Moon or Luna relates to common affairs or people, moving about, changes, messengers or visitors, etc. (Monday.)

Mars signifies energy, ambition, courage, boldness, military, surgery, fire, fire, machinery, sharp instruments, accidents and speculation. Business and family affairs, health, preferment and success and the opposite sex. It endows one with nerve, strife, push and perseverance. The attributes of Mars are both good and ill, etc. (Tuesday.)

The Planet Mercury denotes intellectual faculties, the organs of speech. It rules quick, sharp work. Anything requiring dexterity of the hands, tongue, mind or feet. The mind is keen during its ruling hour and has good judgment in wide-awake matters, such as to bind a bargain, get information, anything concerning letters or messengers, it must be done or be gained quickly, etc. (Wednesday.)

Jupiter—Thursday means morality, humanity and religious sentiments. It is conducive to gain by judgment and discretion. It is considered the best influence of all the planets, being the most favorable for benefits of all kind. It is a good time to think for money or favors from those in power, and the higher attainments in life, etc.

Venus—Friday—denotes the fine arts' qualities, as music, painting, decorating, polite literature and accomplishments or pleasure, business connected in some way with fastidious or pleasurable things. Also relates to love, courtship, society or domestic felicity, peace of mind, etc.

Saturn—Saturday—denotes the reflecting and reasoning powers of man. Home, property, personal affairs, real estate, gifts, favors, health, the aged, common, laboring people, sedate or gloomy disposition, rocks and dark places, cold matters, heavy materials or things for laborious works. During its ruling hour the mind is serious, contemplative, reserved and attentive, and much good may be gained by concentrating the mind under its influences, etc.

***** PLANETARY HOURS.

There are many people who practice daily the planetary hours system, altho they know very little of astrology, and find that events and routine of each hour corresponds to the planets ruling that time.

For instance, if one takes ill in the hour of Saturn, they will have a very serious time of it, Mars high fever or surgical instrument and so on. Visitor calling in the last quarter of the Moon and if she is slow in motion, they will be very apt to remain over, in Saturn's hour, and be rather unpleasant, or the conversation be dull or most miserable. I never like visitors in the hour of Saturn, especially if my own significator is afflicted, for we generally have it unpleasant, and if there is any business attached, disappointments and ill feeling will happen. I know one very successful seer that uses the hours continually, she knows but little, only the nature of the planets and houses, and she gets the very foundation of the reading without a card, map or any other method but the time, and

is said to be very correct. I know if I follow right through the hours, I can do better or avoid mistakes and other annoyances, besides know how to handle others and keep out of danger, but I don't always do it. Some astrologers cut up the hours as the season of long or shorter days, thus making the night longer or less, but others do not. I take the natural hour, 60 minutes make the hour, from sunrise the hour begins. If I take a trip down to the sea, I try and start in the Sun's hour, and when I get there Venus' hour comes and then I have a very good time, but should I start home in the hour of Saturn, then a slow and unpleasant time, and with Mars being the ruler, a rough crowd, and generally some dangerous or quarrelsome Moon

Horoscope for Students.

(The object of this lesson is to show how to judge the general Horoscope.)

The Horoscope of a male, born in Vienna, March 29th, 1868, at 5:30 p. m. The Horoscope made for this time, shows the sign Libra ascending, 7°. as Venus rules this sign, it is the ruling planet. I judge the Horoscope as follows: For disposition: The ascending sign, the sign the ruling planet is in, and the sign the Sun and Moon are in shows the disposition of the native. Libra ascending indicates a somewhat modest nature, when younger, was quite bashful or diffident altho has outgrown this somewhat; the first degrees of Libra always give an industrious nature, likes to be active or busy about something most of the time and is not well contented unless active or busy altho is somewhat particular about what he does, does not like hard or dirty work; is naturally quite sympathetic, can be influenced to a great extent if kindness is used, is quite trusting, dislikes to refuse to do a favor when asked. Venus in Taurus, its own sign, indicates a thoughtful nature, deep minded, somewhat cautious, fearful of pain, even in temper altho has a good amount of temper when it is aroused. As Venus is well aspected to Jupiter, it shows that he is quite orderly and neat and particular, has a fair amount of pride or self esteem, but not in the least conceited; is generally pleasant and accommodating, inclined to look on the bright side of things. The Sun in Aries, indicates a good amount of ambition and perseverance, not easily discouraged; being in a fiery sign indicates that he dislikes a master, prefers to be his own, and will be to quite an extent, altho Libra ascending shows a too modest nature to allow him to put himself forward as much as would be best for him to do so. As the Sun is strongly aspected to Uranus, the Occult planet, it shows that he likes the curious and the mysterious, and things out of the common; is somewhat fond of travel and changes and will have considerable traveling in coming years and make many changes. The Moon in the sign Gemini, indicates a sympathetic and generous nature, kind hearted, altho the Moon being in a square aspect to Mars indicates that he is hasty at times, lacks a little in patience. Uranus is the high planet in the Horoscope, and as the high planet always has a strong influence over one, it shows that he is very firm and persistent and a little inclined to be headstrong when he makes up his mind to anything, cannot be driven easily against his will, likes the unusual, and will be more so as he gets older. Taking the Horoscope as a whole, with the Sun and Uranus strong, it indicates a somewhat unusual nature with un-

usual likes and dislikes, a generally good disposition altho one that is not very well understood by his associates.

For mentality: The ascendant, the Moon and Mercury and the general aspects show this. The Moon in strong aspect, (square) to Mercury, in the 9th, shows that he is sharp, observing, can keep some of his affairs to himself or evade a question when he wishes to do so. The ascendant well aspected by Saturn shows that he thinks deeply about various things that he does not speak of. Uranus in the mid-heaven indicates some out of the ordinary ideas, and some quite eccentric ones, loves the curious, is very intuitional, sometimes seems to feel the approach of coming events, is somewhat changeable and inclined to have too many things on his mind at once, has a very strong will power but lacks in concentration. Uranus in this place shows that he is somewhat subject to periods when he gets very blue or down hearted altho these periods may not last very long. If he would practice concentration, keeping the mind on one thing longer, it would bring very good results in many ways. I judge from the aspect of Mercury to Venus and Mars that he has quite good calculation in some ways, a good memory, can reason well; but the conflicting aspects indicate that he would not have as good a chance to get an education as he should have to have the best success. The good aspects of the Moon show that the mind will never become weak or unbalanced.

For health: The Sun rules the health by being in the 7th house and it being in strong aspect to Uranus shows that he has very good vitality and quite a strong constitution, as a rule, does not give way to sickness easily, will always recover very quickly when taken sick. Uranus in Cancer afflicting the Sun indicates that he will eventually have some weakness in the liver and the digestive organs altho regularity in all habits, temperance in every way and a little care of the diet will overcome this. At the same time, the position of Uranus indicates that he is inclined to go to excess in some ways. The Sun being afflicted by the high planet shows many narrow escapes from accidents, and shows that when he dies, it will be quite suddenly altho if cautious, he may have a long life. There will be evil periods for the health when it will be affected somewhat, during the spring of 1908, and during 1913 the Sun is afflicted by a parallel aspect of Saturn which is evil for health. At the age of 56 years there will be an evil period for the health, also at the age of 63 years. With an airy sign ascending and Venus in Taurus, it shows that he would have the best health and the longest life if he lived outside of the city, the country is much the best for health, altho Uranus and the Sun shows that he likes activity and excitement and he will probably live in the city many years.

For marriage: Venus, the Moon and 7th house, and ruler of the 7th house rules marriage. Venus in sextile aspect to Mars indicates that he likes the company of the opposite sex. The Moon in strong aspect to Mars also indicates this, and in some ways, he would be more contented married than he would be single, at the same time the Moon in strong aspect to Mars indicates that he would have periods. In lawsuits he will not be fortunate and should always try married life; if he had married while young, he would have separated from the wife, or she would have had considerable bad health and not been long lived. However, the aspect of Mars indicates more inharmony in marriage than otherwise, altho Neptune in the 7th, indicates that the wife would have periods when her health

would be very bad and I judge not a very long lived person. As the Moon is separating from two aspects, Saturn and Mercury, it indicates a late marriage, as the Moon comes to an aspect of Saturn in 1908 with Venus near the cusp of the mid-heaven by Direction, he will contemplate a marriage altho it is not a fortunate time for such. To have the best success and harmony and contentment in marriage, he should marry one signified by Venus sextile to Jupiter, one of middle height, quite well built, with brown or dark hair, full round form and features.

For business and financial affairs: The ruling planet well aspected is a very good indication for general good success, and many very good business periods altho Uranus in the 10th house shows some periods when he will have severe losses and reverses unless very careful at certain times. Uranus shows a busy life, altho many times he may work from choice rather than from actual necessity. The Sun refers to employment and the square aspect of Uranus shows many changes in employment. He would not be fortunate in a business for himself if in anything of a risky nature where he had to trust others to any extent; in a business where there is no risk, no trusting to any extent, he would have very good success. Mars in aspect to Jupiter with Mercury applying to a conjunction of both, indicates a love for speculation. There are periods when he may have very good success in this altho many when his judgment will be very bad. Should be very careful not to speculate in evil periods. In lawsuits he will not be fortunate and should always try to avoid such. Uranus in the 10th afflicting the Sun shows that a judge would not give unbiased judgment, and the Moon representing a jury, shows that a jury would not give fair treatment. In the future, I find the following good and evil periods: The fall of 1906, Jupiter transiting the mid-heaven, a good indication for regular business affairs, but not favorable for starting new business enterprises, as Jupiter transiting the radix of Uranus indicates bad results from such. Venus on the cusp of the 10th by Direction shows pleasant social affairs and a favorable period generally. 1907 fortunate after March till as late as October, Jupiter transiting the 10th house, the last of 1907 the Moon by Direction in conjunction with Saturn, evil for risks, speculation or radical changes. Uranus transiting opposite its radix in the year 1907 shows a period when he will contemplate travel and changes of location. I judge will have traveling the last of the year, caused by Moon in the 3d house. From February, 1908, till the fall of the year Saturn transiting the 7th house, the Sun's radix and square to Uranus signifies a dull period, bad for risks and changes, a time to be very careful of health, avoid all risks and unnecessary changes, avoid speculation or investments. From the last of 1909, the indications change for the better, and I judge will improve to quite an extent. 1910 should be very favorable as Jupiter will transit the ascendant, semi-square of Jupiter and the Sun will cause considerable activity in business affairs, till as late as 1914 except for the health as mentioned. The position of Venus in the 8th house of the Horoscope indicates that he will have an inheritance of some money or property some time in his life if not already.

The Horoscope is very favorable for the study of the occult if you will take up the study and stick to it, the main weakness is in the indications that you will be inclined to neglect the study for other things.

I was instructed to arrange for a game each Sunday, weather permitting. (The young men of this place are all workers and Sunday is the only time they have for recreation). Now take my Horoscope to start with, I have the sign Libra, ascending, Cancer the mid-heaven, the Moon ruler of honor, etc. Now start with June 10, 1906, the first game of the season. All games were called about 2:45 each Sunday afternoon. Each Sunday some ball team came to our village, each one coming was arranged with on their challenge, no one being refused unless the game had had been arranged for. I will give the dates of each game and the result of each one, those who wish to, may figure for it, and see my judgment of the outcome. I made but one error on judging the outcome of the games. June 10th, the home team won, the Moon in my Horoscope being in Aquarius, forming a good aspect to the Sun, no evil aspects to planets in my chart. June 17th, the home team lost, the Moon in Taurus applying to a bad aspect of my Sun and Saturn (in my nativity). June 24th home team lost, the Moon coming to an evil aspect of my Saturn with no good aspects close. July 1st, home team won, the Moon forming good aspects to several planets. July 8th, home team won, the Moon coming to a good aspect of Jupiter, and no evil aspect in my chart. July 15th, home team won again, the Moon well aspected, both by transit and in my chart. July 22d, home team won again, a close game and won by one score in last inning, note the close aspects here. July 28th, home team lost to a club that should have been beaten easily, but my Moon conjunction with Saturn in my Radix and by transit seemed to be the Jonah. August 5th, the club arrangements were made with did not show up. No aspect of the Moon, I judged that they would not, with no reason but the Moon void of aspect. August 12th, home team won, the only indication being my Moon coming to a conjunction of my Venus. August 19th, home team won again. But a very poor game was played and looked to be either side's game till the last. Sept. 2d, home team lost, Moon afflicted by the Sun and Saturn. I figured it would lose and the strange part of it is that the player that lost the game was a Capricorn man. He seemed to go into a trance whenever there was any fielding to do.

From my observations, I have concluded that any sport is determined before; the winner of a prize fight has the fight won or lost as soon as it is arranged altho they don't see it that way till actual experience shows them, they must go thru the motions indicated by their stars. I believe that if Astrology was well understood, and the right man put in the right place as indicated by the Horoscope, half the trouble of humanity would be a thing of the past.

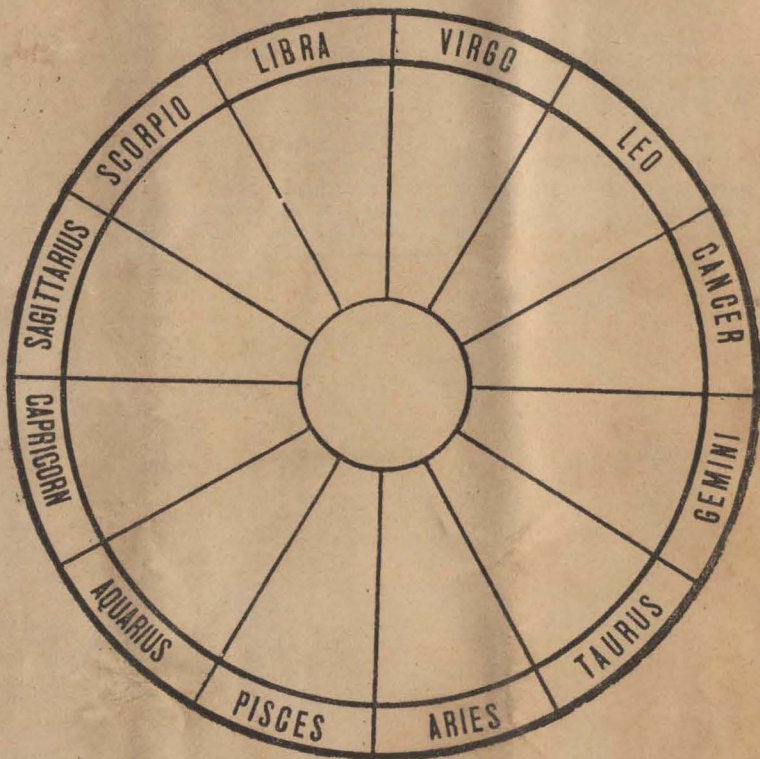
