ONOMATIC INDICES

UNE is from Juno, a Roman goddess, daughter of Saturn, sister and wife of Jupiter. Juno symbolizes the perfected expression of the Lui influence in nature, manifested through the age of Mercury. She was peculiarly the guardian deity of women, and the protectress of marriage, because it is through her influence that the Divine Marriage between substance and spirit, matter and mind takes place.

In nature these activities may forth as careen as and Violet, which by combination produce all these higher colors of the spectrum. The activity at this season is so positive that Juno loses her former feminine qualities and becomes Diana, "goddess of the chase," or else changes her gender wholly becoming Dionysius, Ionah, Jonah or John, "the dove," so called because of the inherent quality of volatility manifest by this lunar substance.

Alchemically, June is said to be ruled by the Moon, because the "White Work" is then complete. This whiteness is the result of increased transparency, brought about solely by the interaction of the Venusian and Jovian rays, supplemented by the Red Ray from the ascendant Aries.

The sublimations in the Vase of Art are literally white, but reflect from their inner depths all shades intermediate between red, green and violet-yellow and blue being the two principal re-

sultants.

The period from May 20th to June 21st is ruled by Gemini, "the twins," which express occultly the two eternally co-operating principles, in which Mercury abides and operates, for Mercury is the Messenger, Expresser, of all "gods." The latter part of June is ruled by Cancer, the true sign of the moon.

The Gemini are the Castor and Pollux of the Greeks, Romulus and Remus of the Romans, the two Gods of the Door of China, Fafnir and Fasolt of the Norsemen, Quan and Habel of the Chaldeans,

Gog and Magog of the Israelites.

Anciently these powers were always symbolled as "two brothers," but in later mythology they became "brother and sister," and finally the conception appeared to be Hermaphroditic. Hence the idea of the dual sex-nature of the "Son," Mercury, Christ.

Now all this refers to principles underlying actual fundamental SUBSTANCE, and not at all to any organic form or existence. If one desires to apply the thought to humanity, he can rightfully do so, for every principle of Alchemy is capable of application on every plane. The present race is now actually entering the Gemini phase, the sexes being independent and loosely united-working out the miracle of the Perfect Character, corresponding to the White Work in Alchemy.

But any personal application here is both meaningless and misleading, for the older myths relate entirely to the Primal Mater, its attributes and activities. It is, perhaps, easier to note these in human character than elsewhere, unless the maniping of the Prima Materia be understood.

In the lower nature, Mercury manifests as subdeceit, cunning, shrewdness. In fact, the monkey seems almost wholly dominated by this influence, and it is the moving spirit of a very large proportion of the genus homo, it seems.

On a higher plane, Mercury appears as ingenuity, versatility, resource and fertility, making what is termed the clever, enterprising, busy individual.

On a still hister plane Mercury "loosens the tongue and sharpens the wit," endows with imagination, perception, power of expression, making the orator, the artist, the musician.

Mercury governs very largely the nervous system, and as an essence exists in a subtle form of matter, forming a part of every living structure.

The first half of the month of June corresponds to the letter K, meaning "strength." The latter half to L, meaning "balance." The former is the

"Maiden," the latter the "Hanging Man" in the Tarot symbols. A definite CYCLE is completed in the number Twelve-hence its extensive use in symbolism: The Twelve Signs of the Zodiac, the Twelve Tribes of Israel, the Twelve Labors of Hercules, etc. The "Silver Work" is here finished and the Gold Work ready to begin.

COLOR MAGIC

LESSON I

N OBJECT is Black, as I have said, when it absorbs all the rays of light. Hence, the object itself must be filled with the principle of light. Such light may truly be said to "shine in darkness," and it is only because on the earth-plane we judge by appearance that we fail to apprehend this light in apparent darkness.

He who would know the secret of Light must, therefore, search for it in darkness where it lies concealed like a snail within its shell, or unmani-

fest like the odor within the rosebud.*

The spiritual eye which alone sees all things in their true essence is enabled to pierce this dark

covering and perceive the glowing light.

The unfolding of this faculty of super-sight is as much a matter of cultivation as any other faculty. All that is demanded for its acquirement is patience, faith, concentrated effort, and unremitting practice. The first trials-many trials-may be without noticeable result at the time, but each brings one a little nearer the desired result. Some who have unconsciously been developing this power through other studies or occupations are found to be far advanced already, and need only a little practice to attain astonishing results. No one who perseveres can fail.

The practice is divided into two parts: 1st, the purely intuitional or psychic, and 2d, the intellectual outpicturing or coloring. All ideas come into the mind as images, and take spiritual form upon the retina of the Intuition, which is a spot of intense blackness in comparison with which ordinary darkness seems like a luminous cloud.

On this background they at first appear like the negative of a photograph, and it is in this dark room the Magic Artist develops his picture. Multitudes of these images flit constantly into that fairy chamber, fragile as sunbeams—sunbeams in

^{*}A good illustration of this is found in the metal called Uranium -named from the planet Uranus. Hidden within the dark mass of this metal is a strange substance, unlike any other hitherto discovered. This substance is Radium, two pounds of which are concealed in some 5000 tons of Uranium. Radium gives off the most powerful light, also heat, without combustion or dimunition. This substance is worth over three million dollars a pound at the present time. Thus it will be seen that it is worth while to search for "light in darkness."

truth—vanishing away before the artist knows whither or whence, and before they can be seized and fixed on the plate.

Thus, in common life, the most beautiful images, that might have appeared as things exquisite and rare, are lost. Poets, painters, musicians—these are they who have practiced the art of catching these sunbeam thoughts and fixing them in the wonderful globe of Memory, whence they are drawn out and translated into words, figures, tones.

We speak of a "dark mind," meaning one on which these psychic images are not readily impressed, and of a "bright mind" as one manifestly illumined by them. The one functions in the lunar, the other in the solar sphere, as will be explained in later lessons.

The origin of thought is magical, but it is only natural magic, after all; and the great popular error in belief—an error stimulated by much of the teaching in vogue—is that this subject pertains to the supernatural, and that it is beyond the understanding of any save the few who are specially gifted.

It is true that in all ages of the past those who chanced to discover this gift (common to all) rose rapidly above the masses, and through an exhibition of their superior powers became prophets and priests—wise men—who ruled the people and administered all affairs.

It is wrong to suppose that one thought has a different origin from another, or that one is "material" and another "spiritual." All thought is of God, and the vehicle of all alike is Light. Conception can only follow reception. The common mind is chaos, and order comes through concentration. He that will, CAN.

It is the object of these lessons to enable the student to acquire a new and peculiar—that is to say, extended—power of concentration, to awaken images and to interpret them. This last is by far the more difficult art, and the majority of psychic students leave off just where they should begin. That is, they advance to the Middle Chamber—the image chamber—and there pause as one might in a gallery of paintings and statuary to admire and marvel at the forms and figures.

Thought always comes first in the form of symbols. The highest art, the most profound mental acquisition, is to translate these into the language of the outer world. Plenty of people "see things" but they are unable to tell the meaning of what they see. There is no one living who does not possess the intuitive faculty, because intuition is the basis of all thought; and there is hardly one who cannot with practice extend the power by increasing the sensitiveness of this inborn faculty. That this is no idle pastime, but one that redounds to the happiness and prosperity of the individual in every way will be shown by demonstration. This is indeed "seeking first the kingdom of heaven, and finding thereafter ALL THINGS ADDED.

The time of day at which this Light pours into the mental disk, which we will call the Subjective World, varies greatly with different individuals. It will, if one is free from care and worry, be strongest at the time of day corresponding to the position of the Solar Sign at birth. This is shown in the horoscope, and it may also be found by trial. The best results are usually obtained by sitting at this time. But for general practice, I shall recommend the early morning hour.

Procure a box of ordinary water-color paints, a memorandum book, a lead pencil and pencil dividers for drawing circles, also a number of white cards the size of an ordinary photograph. This will constitute the necessary outfit for beginning the work.

Draw with the dividers a circle two inches in diameter and paint the area an intense black. Be careful to have it perfect and true when finished. This should be made in the center of one of the white cards, and labeled in the corner (on the back) Magic Disk No. 1—Black.

I. PSYCHIC DRILL—Reception. Seated in an easy chair, facing the North,* breathe gently for a few moments until you become perfectly still, and the "mental buzz" is hushed. Do not close the eyes; resist the feeling of drowsiness. Now place before your eyes at a distance of about three feet the Black Disk and gaze intently at it for something like a minute. Then slowly close and open the eyes four times, letting them when open rest always upon the disk. The eyes now should remain closed, not tightly, and the hand should be placed so as to cover them and shut out the external light as much as possible.

Remain quite passive in this position till out of the canopy of darkness there slowly develops a white spot resembling in shape the disk. It will not remain fixed, but will move slowly up or down and disappear. Repeat this exercise several times. Do not continue the practice over five minutes at any one sitting, and do not strain to try to see any particular thing, neither be disappointed if at first you fail to see anything whatever. No phenomena will take place till the mind is in thorough repose, and to gain this condition requires some time.

II. Mental Drill.—Expression. Take the pencil and blank book and begin by writing down the names of all the Black objects that occur to you. Now, in this practice, the important point is not at all to see how many objects you can collect, as you might copy them from a dictionary, but rather to record the names of those objects that come before the mind subjectively in the form of images. The mind should remain passive, and produce, as it were, those subjective images spontaneously.

Proceed very slowly, holding one image some little time before you dismiss it to make room for another, as if you were holding a New Year's reception, or entertaining business callers.

^{*} The North is symbolically the place of darkness.

Every few minutes gaze again at the Black Disk to awaken new images, each of which should be recorded, together with whatever thought comes in connection therewith.

Ten minutes of this form of practice is quite enough at first. Go then about your regular occupation. During the day many "black images" are likely to pop suddenly into mind. Make a note of these if possible, and write them out at night in your memorandum. Do not sit for development in the evening, but as you retire spend some time in trecalling what has occurred to you through the day, and something of importance may be suggested to you mentally, which will be a proof of your progress in development. Then again, you are likely to dream something in connection.

What we desire ultimately to separate in mind are the common, everyday thoughts and thoughts of a higher nature suggested symbolically. At the very commencement of this practice, rightly carried out, there begins to be developed a perception of correspondencies—a faculty in which, from lack of cultivation, nearly everyone is sadly deficient. It is this faculty alone which makes it possible to unfold the higher wisdom. All visible things and objects are symbols of something existing in the unseen. These are the things that cannot be definitely expressed in words, and which if they are ever apprehended by the human mind must be unfolded by this subtle, spiritual faculty.

The following are a few BLACK objects that occur to me at random: A cloud—a cave—charcoal—ink—an African—ebony—night—eclipse—the tomb—a veil—death—the underworld—the spleen—Saturn. On each of these I would meditate, and write down whatever thoughts, ideas or visions that occur to me. Example from my memoranda:

"A dark cloud overspreads the sky. I rise rapidly up through this cloud and discover that it is not dark as it appears, but just a moving mass of particles of vapor. It is like a great river in the air and I am swimming in it. Each of these little particles is a world complete in itself. Each is transparent in itself, being filled with the eternal light. I will gather a handful of these crystal globes from out the dark looking cloud, and bring them to earth with me. When I arrive I find them all run together into one tiny drop of pure, clear liquid. In this crystal drop is hidden the miracle of all worlds. Thus have I evolved light from darkness."

There are many dark tales in mythology which should meanwhile come in for their share of reflection. For example, Noah in the Ark, Jonah in the Whale, Jesus in the Tomb, The Israelites in Egypt, the Ships of Crete returning victorious with the Black Veil.

The following Scriptural passages are symbolical and should be carefully studied and meditated upon."

Clouds and sky:—1 Kings 18:45, Jer. 4:28, Is. 50:3. Mount:—Heb. 12:18.

Gates:—Jer. 14:2

Horses:-Zech. 6:2, 6, Rev. 6:5, 12.

Hair:-Song 5:11.

Face:—Job 30:30, Song 1:5, Lam. 5:10; 4:8, Joel 2:6.

Reflection with the aid of the Magic Disk will reveal ultimately all that is hidden here.

What we aim to accomplish by this method of practice is the balancing of the intuitional and intellectual faculties, which in nearly every individual are normally out of harmony. Do not consider the task puerile and unworthy of attention because more "brains" are not employed. Most people have brains plus, and are minus the true faculty of perception which must be, as it were, drawn in by concentration from the outer aura. "Except ye become as little children" ye shall not enter into the Kingdom of the Wise.
