Part XI

Requirements for Inducing the Trance

About this same time my Master began my training in the trance in earnest. This is a very particular step. It necessitates a nearly clean and healthy physical condition, as well as perfect emotional and mental control. Fear has to be eliminated gradually as the process develops. Great care and watchfulness are necessary on the part of the Master. He assures himself of the heart action and keeps within the bounds of safety always. Otherwise, without such careful training and intelligent guidance one cannot develop the ability to go into the trance and remain cataleptic for hours at a time without incurring great danger to life.

I shall never forget the effect on my mind and body the first time I actually induced catalepsy. When I returned to consciousness, it seemed a terrible thing had happened. Maybe the word terrible does not convey the right thought. Wonderful might be more correct, but the influence was terrific. Later on, I tried to induce the state all alone, and for days I tried to no avail. I could not do it. But as the months passed, and my Master guided and encouraged, as well as instructed, my whole body and mind became so inured to the process that its final effects were very pleasant and profitable.

People generally think the cataleptic condition which I enter when I am buried alive for hours must be a terrible ordeal. Some feel so sorry for me and wonder whether I will not ultimately kill myself with such strenuous practices. I wish to assure all such that it is of benefit to my health and improves my physical condition much more than ordinary physical exercise. It stimulates my vital organs and at the end of every performance I am elated and happy, hungry and healthy.

The trance is accomplished by a two-fold practice. The first, of course, is mental. I must eliminate all fear. Fear would mean instant and sure death. I must control my thoughts and adhere to one specific purpose. I must even make up my mind how long I am to remain asleep, and will awaken when the time is up. It may be seven hours or one, but when the pre-determined time has elapsed I will awaken. Only those who know the power of positive suggestion to the subconscious mind can understand how this is possible.

The other requirement for the cataleptic state is physical pressure. The first stages are accomplished by attention, concentration, and powerful will. My body responds to these indomitable powers. My heart gradually slows down to twenty beats per minute. My bloodstream quiets and ceases its ordinary surging. When the heart reaches twenty beats per minute, I begin physical pressure on the throat which cuts off the blood circulation to the brain to the extent that it quits active functioning; consciousness ceases, the blood slows down, the heart becomes increasingly quiet until it reaches four beats per minute.

All else which is necessary to continue in that physical and mental state is the application of the law of the subconscious mind which, in such practice, is called autosuggestion. The body stiffens in every part except the solar plexus, heart, and abdominal contents. The real vital parts function slowly, rhythmically, and easily. The abdomen continues a rhythmic heaving and falling, swelling, expanding, and contracting. The solar plexus rhythmically raises and lowers just as it does in quiet deep breathing.

My mind is correctly charged with the requirements for the trance so that just at the instant the brain ceases functioning the lungs expand to their limit and draw in a deep draught of air; the tongue turns back as it might do if one were attempting to swallow its tip first. This seals the throat, and it so remains during the trance. There is one of many very definite requirements for safety in the trance and that is the complete sealing of the lungs. During the time of the trance, the body is nearest at perfect rest as it ever can be while life lasts.

I am not anticipating that any of my students will attempt to enter this state of body and mind. But I am explaining this much so that those of my students who are alert to the implications which I here make can see the reasonableness of the whole process and not make the mistake which is so common among the unthinking who declare, without a second thought or a moment's intelligent investigation, that being buried alive for hours without a supply of oxygen is impossible and simply cannot be done.

As a matter of fact, a similar state of body and mind is induced by disease. There are many cases on record where people have appeared to be dead, and even those poor victims who have actually been buried alive, are but the result of the same law which I use consciously. This is called catalepsy by physicians and by others it is called suspended animation. In all cases there is an interference with the free flow of the blood to the brain. In this condition the body is at so nearly perfect rest that many times when the energies return and the vital processes again become normal, it is found that the patient is entirely recovered.

Some want to know what happens when I awaken from the trance. Usually there is no conscious memory, for the physical brain is quiescent. The experiences during the trance are practically of a superphysical grade. I know that I can go in my consciousness back to my Temple and talk with those whom I know, while I am buried in America, and a lecture being given over my "remains." There is abundant proof of this fact, as is given in exchanges of information with those who talk to me concerning the subjects discussed.

In the trance my spirit is temporarily liberated from my body and, when I return, I am for a moment, at the instant of awakening, as strange to my surroundings as though I had never seen or known them before. My friends tell me there is an absolutely vacant look on my face, and I know this must be because my mind is completely blank. This lasts only a moment and obtains while the soul is re-entering the body. Just as soon as it takes possession of the brain I recall and am at home again.

If I am to be awakened ahead of the time which I have specified to my subconscious mind when entering the trance, all that is necessary is to pull my hands away from my face. When this is done and the pressure is released, the nerves actuate the heart which begins to beat, running up almost instantly to 120 beats per minute, then gradually quiets down to normal. The whole body jumps into action as though rejoicing that the Master has returned and it is at liberty to go again. Very soon after awakening I am ravenously hungry. It is something like the hunger which results from long and vigorous outdoor exercise. This is partly induced by the fact that I do not eat for twenty-four hours previous to burial to insure a minimum of carbon in my system.

After I began the practice of going into the trance and rendering my body immune to ordinary physical torture, my work continued without any spectacular element, until I was ready to go to the final Temple for which all the others are but preparatory. This event is one for which we work for so many years. It is, indeed, the goal of our efforts, and well it may be. And so, I wish to tell you something about this great event.

The Trip to the Great Master's Temple

We go from the various preparatory Temples, of which there are six in number, to enter the final Temple where the only eleven-ring Master living in the visible sphere conducts the work. To meet this Master face to face and talk one hour with him is an event which no student ever forgets. Its memory is one of the sacred treasures which has nothing to compare with it.

The groups from the various Temples all start out at about the same time

and converge toward one spot on the bank of the River Nile. When we meet, we have our festivities and from there on we all travel together.

The Egyptian Masters have a mechanical way of communicating with each other over hundreds of miles. The six Temples are situated within a radius of several hundred miles, and yet they communicate so dependably that they all start so as to meet at the appointed place at about the same hour. An American newspaper published an article concerning this a few years ago, from which I quote a few lines: "It is well known that the English at war in the East, wonder how the enemy could always trace their movements, seemingly knowing about battles even before they had fired a gun. Without any warning, plans that had been a deep secret were exposed, and a tribe of hillsmen would descend upon the British like a hurricane. Faster than a telegram, faster than the telephone, the scouts would transfer their thoughts, quicker than it takes to tell it, the message is sent to the waiting scout many miles away."

But to me it is extremely simple. Our method of telegraphy has existed for thousands of years, and wherever there are two membrs of the Coptic Cult, remember this—they can use this method so easily and effectively that secrets cannot be kept from them. With such a people it is useless to go to war.

Our Masters would communicate with the other groups each evening at the quiet hour. We students would arrange ourselves in a circle, each facing outward from the center. The Master would occupy the center and, after a few chants and a short period of concentration, he would begin to locate the various companies, which he could do perfectly, both as to direction and distance.

So, with the Master using this dependable mechanical telegraph, we students would be testing our ability to locate the companies by mind power, or mental sensitiveness and receptivity, sometimes called telepathy. And when the quiet hour was over, we would each report to our Master what we received. He would thus check up on us and so could determine our ability to a nicety.

In due season all companies would arrive. We would stay several days on the River Bank enjoying a great celebration, conducting our services of chants, testing our ability, and generally making merry. Our psychic ability was tested again and again, and well it might be, for it would certainly be needed within a few days. If we failed we would never enter the Temple of our ideal, but would either lose our physical life or go home defeated.

From this point we all traveled together toward a certain place on the Nile, where hidden on the opposite bank was the goal of our journey. When we had reached the exact spot, again we held festivities of chanting and singing, beating our drums, and generally expressing our joy.

Now it is well known that the Nile is infested with vast numbers of crocodiles, and this point is no exception. Our music brought the curious ones to the (Continued on Page 27)

AN OCULIST AS A CATARACT PATIENT

There is an old saying that,, "A doctor operates on others, but they themselves are seldom operated on." It is like taking one's own medicine in order to sympathize with one's patient.

That is what happened to the writer and, being an oculist, he took his dose in one of his own eyes.

For some time the need of an operation was apparent, and when the time came it was done.

There was no worry about it for the weeks before operation. Not because the patient was a doctor and an oculist, but because of an attitude of mind gradually cultured since he was a boy. The same attitude of mind can be cultured in others who may want it. At the age of 14 years he was impressed with these lines from Pope's Essay on Man.

"All are but parts of one stupendous whole,

Whose body nature is and God the Soul."

As time went on, with reading and thinking along this same line and a growing acquaintance with Eastern thought and modern psychology, there was acquired the feeling that the physical body was not the real man.

From one's earliest recollections to the present moment, one knows that he is himself. That is the conscious self-identity of one's self despite the changes in body and in thought and is the most patent fact and the most potent factor in the life of man. Everything else changes but your self, you always know yourself as yourself, waking and dreaming.

Thinking along this line will soon teach one not to keep on identifying himself with his body. That enabled the writer to carry on prior to the operation as if none were to be done.

The morning of the operation found no change in the mental attitude just explained. While I knew each step of the operation, I kept my mind on my breathing. Attending to its regular rhythmic flow, slowly and easily, out and in. There was no pain, and no distress at any time.

Then followed a week in bed, obeying orders, and not trying to peep under the bandage to see if I could see.

I learned something about the intimate relation of the fifth nerve connections with the eye, the nose, and the mouth. Reflexes from the nose in even gently using a handkerchief, and from the jaw in as gently using a tooth brush. The eye caught the reflex and registered it as a feeling of soreness, like touching a small boil. Even body movements would give a reflex if done suddenly, and urgently. "Stay in bed and keep quiet," had a meaning I can now make use of to the advantage of my patients. It was a "take your own medicine," lesson. A demonstration that experience is the best teacher.

A radio was offered to me, but I replied to the generous offer by saying that: "For many years as a student of medicine, I had found the study of man in health of body and of mind to lead me into the inner, world of thought, and now was the time for me to test out such thought provoking statements as "We carry a world within us when we think" and "The Kingdom of Heaven is within."

To me it was a chance to practice concentration and meditation for a longer period than I had heretofore enjoyed. So for two weeks with no radio or other diversion, I did just that. It was easy for me because many years ago I had found the way to do it, and also its value.

The lines from Pope, referred to in the foregoing, had been throughout the years a means to this end almost daily. The method is one of quieting the inner mind by making it think what you want it to think. This stops it from thinking over the things of the day, which are solely outer mind activities. Soon there is a relaxed feeling of body and mind. With the mind one-pointed by concentration on one thought for a time, one then thinks along any pre-selected line of thought on which you wish to meditate. Note any new ideas, inspirations, or intuitions that come. Make a note of them when through

with your meditation.

That program will mean little to one who has not had the experience. To one who has had it, that program will be restful and informative.

As an individual, I know that I know. As an individual intelligence, I have known myself as myself ever since I can remember anything. The individual intelligence uses the physical body. One needs no demonstration of the fact that he has a mind. He does not ask to be shown a mind before he believes he has one. Neither does he need to have it proven to him that he is an individual, separate and distinct from every other individual in the world, and that he is intelligent. The individual intelligence is the answer to the question, "Has man a soul?" A little thought along the foregoing lines will lead one to see that man, the individual intelligence, is the soul

All of this did not retard the healing. It may even have had some influence on the 100 per cent results which followed, and the sojourn in the hospital was in the nature of a retreat. Peace and benediction take on a new meaning, just as do other words, when they are worked out in one's life, as well as in one's intellect.

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
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THE GREAT PYRAMID

"In that day shall there be an altar to the Lord in the midst of the land of Egypt, and a pillar at the border thereof to the Lord. And it shall be for a sign and for a witness unto the Lord of hosts in the land of Egypt."—Isaiah 19:19-20.

N previous articles we learned of the Signs and Wonders of the heavens. As we now have a more comprehensive idea of God's plan for man's salvation as it is written in the stars and in the Bible, we will turn to the third aspect of the interpretation of the plan of man's evolution and salvation. For this we need to turn our thoughts to Egypt and to the Great Pyramid at Gizeh, which is the wonder of the ages.



As man stands at the threshold of the Aquarian Age, he is in a quandry as to what he should believe. With his old footing, which was belief in church doctrine slowly slipping away, he seems to have lost his anchorage. His mind has been developed to such a degree that he thinks everything must be proven scientifically to be true. This theory has added its weight to make him lose a grip upon himself.

As the ALL WISE sees and knows all, He has made provision for just such a period in man's evolution. We find that the scientific and mathematical proof of the laws of the universe are imbedded in the structure and symbolism of the Great Pyramid, which has been called the Bible in Stone.

We find that the Bible relates the history of man and that the medium of its interpretation is language and now we shall find that the Pyramid gives scientific proof of these historic facts through the medium of mathematics. This monument to the One God is very, very old, and yet its divine message fits man's need in this present day and age. We find these words in the Bible, "But we speak the wisdom of God in a mystery, even the hidden wisdom, which God ordained before the world unto our glory."—I Corinthians 2:7.

Because man has developed his faculty of reason he has been able to understand the scientific formula of the structure and nature of the universe, and this knowledge has given him the desire to solve this ancient mystery.

History records that about the year 800 A.D. Al Mamoun broke into the Pyramid in search of treasures. He did not find that which he sought but he did lead the way in the exploring of its then unknown passageways. Since then man has found that it is a treasure house of mind and spirit. After this forced entrance into the Pyramid, man's curiosity was aroused and he began his endless quest through its passageways and chambers in search of a key that would unlock this storehouse of wisdom.

When looking at the diagram one notices a passageway that leads to the pit and a short distance from the entrance in the passageway, the scored lines may be found. These lines are the key that unlocked the doors of time. They give answers to past events and insight into future ones.

On the diagram we notice that the light from a star shines directly down the passageway that leads to the pit and that the scored lines are at right angles to the passageway. These lines are the hands of the time clock. The Pyramid is so oriented that the light of the star Thuban, which is alpha Draconis, shone down the passageway that led to the pit. At the same time directly above the scored lines was the star Alcoyne, the brightest star of the Pleiades, located in the constellation Taurus, the Bull.

Modern astronomy fixed the date of these scored lines as September 22, 2144 B. C. and this point became the point of measure in the chronological time system. This established the date of the erection of the Pyramid as 2625 B. C.

The star Thuban slowly receded from this position in relation to the passageway. As it slipped backward in the Circle of the Ages, the star groups above the scored lines moved accordingly in keeping with the motion of the heavenly bodies, and also in keeping with the history of man as it is written in the stars.

When we gaze at the formation of the structure of the Pyramid we quickly recognize its unique construction. It has four sides, triangular in shape. Here we have a correlation of the four major elements in the human body, namely, fire, earth, air, and water, and of the three states of consciousness of man, superconscious, subconscious, and conscious.

The trine or triangle symbolizes spirit. The square symbolizes matter or earth. Therefore, this structure tells the story of man and his relation to heaven and earth.

This Pyramid is a masterpiece of mathematics and to understand its message man should view it intelligently. He should have some knowledge of mathematics and geometry as well as astronomy for these are the tools of the master mathematician, the God who geometrizes and who guides the stars in their courses and directs the destiny of man.

The history of man's evolution and salvation can be read with accuracy by those who need proof there is a God and who look at life from a purely scientific standpoint. It may be well to state that no one who ever becomes star or heaven conscious could ever doubt there is a master mind controlling the motion of the heavenly bodies. He may call this power by some other name than God, but to that force which guides the stars in their courses he bows in reverence.

In the previous articles on the precession of the equinoxes, we gained some insight into the mechanism of the universe and now we shall find that this is also recorded in the structure of the Great Pyramid. We observed that the earth rotates on its axis which causes sunrise and sunset. It travels through its orbit around the sun once in a year, which gives the change of seasons. Then the precessional cycle brings about the evolution of man as he grows through the various ages of the Circle of the Ages.

As the present cycle is stated to be one of 25,826.54 years, we find that each sign of the precessional cycle extends over a period of approximately 2,152 years, while the length of time through the constellations varies because the constellations are not of equal length.

Is it mere chance that this house of mystery has been locked and lost to the world for so many centuries? It has only been in very recent years that its vast volume of information has been brought to light.

When one turns back to antiquity, one learns of sun worship. In ancient days Osiris symbolized the spirit of the sun god and the ideals toward which man was striving. When we become aware of the true principles of the Aquarian Age, we-shall find these same ideals will harmonize with the Christian worship, for then we shall learn of the Christ as the bright and morning star.

This "Altar to the Lord" stands as a symbol of God's plan and purpose to all ages and to all generations.

We find that the record of man's evolution has been written in symbols in the interior of the structure where the elements of time could not destroy its message.

The ascending passage floorline extended to meet the sides of the true Pyramid base determines the date 4,000 B. C. which is the beginning of its chronological time system. This date does not record the creation of the universe but does record the beginning of the Adamic race. The unit of measure is the inch of our standard linear measure.

Counting from the scored lines, the date of the creation of Adam as given (Continued on Page 31)

FEAR NOT

"Beware of fear that spreadeth, like the black and soundless wings of midnight bat, between the moonlight of the Soul and thy great goal that loometh in the distance far away... The more he fears, the more that light shall pale— and that alone can guide." *The Voice of the Silence*, Fragment iii, Blavatsky.

"For the thing which I greatly feared is come upon me, and that which I was afraid of is come unto me." Job, iii, 25.

"Fear not, stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord, which he will shew to you today." *Exodus*, xiv, 13.

A student recently wrote us: "I am asking for help from the torment of certain persons whom I fear who are practicing hoodooism and black magic on me. They work on me nights . . . Why do they still persecute me? They must fear me and what I know about them." And not infrequently we receive similar letters expressing fear of hypnotism and black magic from the living, and also fear of evil influences from discarnate mortals in the astral world.

We will, therefore, explain our teachings on this subject in order that all may be informed on the fundamentals of the subject and so know how to protect themselves through the conscious use of their own spiritual powers.

Why fear the dark or hypnotism, voodooism or astral entities? Such fear makes you mentally and physically negative and thus opens your mind and aura to invasion by the very forces you fear. There is no need to fear hypnotism, for no one can hypnotize you against your will. Therefore, keep mentally positive and refuse to listen to or respond to suggestions of which you do not approve. There is no need to fear voodooism or other forms of black magic if you fill yourself so full of the blazing white magic of the Christ-light that you are radiant and positive and cannot respond to any negative influences, ideas, or suggestions.

If you are sensitive enough to feel the presence of your loved ones in the invisible there is no need to fear them; for they come to you only out of love, affection, and their desire to be comforting and helpful, hence they should bring only peace, harmony, and helpful suggestions.

But remember that they are not bright and shining, all-wise angels, but are still only your mortal friends "one flight up with their overcoats off" unless they have advanced greatly since passing on. Therefore, judge all impressions they give you by your own common sense, just as you would were they still here. And you do not need to fear evil influences from less advanced entities in the invisible unless through fear you react to them. You are not even likely to contact them at all unless there is something in you which affinitizes with them and attracts them to you. And even that you can conquer through the power of the Christ within.

Fear is the first great "lion in the path" or barrier to progress for the pilgrim on the Path of Attainment. And it must be faced and conquered before we can progress much further.

But none of these things need be feared if they are resolutely faced, recognized, and understood for what they are, and the proper steps are taken to prepare for and counteract them as you prepare to meet and counteract a storm with umbrella, raincoat and rubbers.

You usually fear that which you do not understand. And yet, as we have said elsewhere: "Many teachers oppose any discussion of fear or evil conditions for fear that it will instill fear-thoughts into the student's mind, as if giving a traveller directions how to pass in safety through the congested traffic of a great city would be inculcating in him fear of entering it! Fear of a subject, condition, or experience can be conquered, not by denying its existence or refusing to consider it, but by accurate knowledge of its most important phases and how to master them."

Some schools of thought resolutely deny and refuse to admit that there are evil, disintegrating or even negative influences, even while they respond to and suffer from them. For instance, one extensive school of mental science greatly fears "malicious animal magnetism" and fights desperately against it, even while denying its existence. If it does not exist why trouble to deny it? Such an attitude of mind naturally prevents one from recognizing the condition, much less investigating it, understanding it and finding out its cause and cure.

Elsewhere (in *The Voice of Isis* and *Evolution and the Bible*) we have gone into some detail as to the origin and presence of evil in the world, but here we need only point out the fact that since evil is not created by God, that is no reason for denying its existence, for it was created not by God, but by man.

"Had man never sent out evil thoughts, wicked words, blasphemies and curses, the earth's aura could never be so charged with destructive forces that a catastrophe was necessary to dissipate them. Had man never exercised demoniacal cruelty to his brother man, neither the animate nor the inanimate worlds would be at enmity with him."

The philosophical definition of reality is that of ideal and unchanging perfection. But even though evil is transient and not eternal, and therefore is not "real" according to the above definition, nevertheless it is real to you while you are reacting to it. For anything is real to you to which your consciousness reacts.

Even your dreams are real to you while you are reacting to them. Bad weather is transient and is not "unchanging perfection," but it is folly to deny that it exists as long as you react and suffer from it! The point is that by recognizing it for what it is, we need not fear it, for we can largely protect ourselves from it and hence from reacting to and suffering from it, except relatively. Mere recognition of evil for what it is—a mortal-created negative and disintegrating center of force—does not necessarily involve fear of it or contamination by it. You are contaminated by it only to the extent that you respond to and give it power over you. And you do not have to respond. But if you refuse to recognize mud in the gutter and do not step over or go around it, you may be besmirched by it.

In a similar way, nothing need enter your aura or your consciousness which you do not admit by reacting to it. And ignorance and fear are open doors to such reaction. "Fear, O Disciple, kills the will and stays all action," for it is a paralyzing emotion. In the body it paralyzes muscular action so that one may be literally "scared stiff" and be unable to move. It also paralyzes the digestive functions and permits abnormal and often poisonous products to be generated. Fear of illness thus prepares the way for it.

You are all normally immune to all diseases as long as your "inner radiance," vitality or life-force is up to normal. But if it becomes depleted in any way—through overwork, exposure, wrong diet and elimination, worry, negative thoughts, destructive emotions, and so forth—then your normal rate of vibration is lowered and the body becomes a soil or a culture medium in which lower forms of life—germs, bacteria, etc. — can grow, and by their poisonous excretions—toxines—upset the whole system.

Do you fear diseases, or even catching cold? If so, that fear paralyzes your natural immunity, lowers your vitality, and aids in bringing the disease upon you. For fear causes weakness, disintegration and hence weak spots, and the weak spots ultimately break down and make gaps which let the evil forces enter. The debilitating effects of fear also cause sluggish functioning of your organs and inability to produce their normal secretions.

Do you fear the loss of a position or attainment? Then such a fear makes you mentally negative, apprehensive and discouraged, and allows opposing forces so to operate that you may actually lose the position which you might have held had you been positive, vital, cheerful, and optimistic. ANCIENT EGYPT IN THE LIGHT OF TRUTH



Part XVIII

NCIENT EGYPT'S version of cosmo-genesis throws more light upon the true significance of Atlantis and Mu in relation to the inner-African pygmy mummy-god 'PTAH (Fig. 1), who represents the original gnome king and master mason in his form of PTAH-TANEN (Fig. 2 and Fig. 3) the "intra-cosmic architect" and leader-in-chief of the seven CHNEMU (Fig. 4) "earth-spirits."

As such, PTAH or PTAH-TAN-EN is the overlord of TA-THUN-EN or TA-TUNEN (Fig. 5) the "land beneath the waves"—as submerged continents or worlds within the NUN or MU (Fig. 6) waters at the time of the first Great Deluge, or "Great Flooding" by name. This as a sunken Foreworld — often called ATLU - ANT - TAUI or ATRU -MU-ANT-TAUI (Fig. 7) the "earths (worlds, continents) covered with water"—submerged by the AT-LU-MU or ATRU-MU (Fig. 8) "water flood."

And it is PTAH - TANEN, as leader of the seven elemental "earth spirits" (Ali, Kabiri, Geborim, Elohim), the CHNEMU (Fig. 13), the original "seven dwarfs" of the Fairy tale Snow White, who fashions the AMENTA (Fig. 14) "hidden (occult) sphere" of godhood making ... paged in the early-Christian Pistis Sophia (Codes Brucianus) via the Aegypto-Gnostic type-name of Aber-Amentho as applied to Jesus the Christ.

Here, it may be shown that Jesus' mystic name of Aber-Amentho has its roots in the following hieroglyphic word signs: AB (Fig. 15) the cardiac organ or heart; ABA (Fig. 16) to give battle, wage war; ABA (Fig. 17) entrance, to make a way through, as "soul passage"; AMENT (Fig. 18) or AMENTET (Fig. 19) or AMENTI (Fig. 20) or AMENTA (Fig. 21) the "hidden land" or "underworld" in the "West"—as an extra-dimensional "occult sphere" of elemental good demons and blessed spirit-souls on the road to godhood. And it is PTAH (Fig. 22) the "artisan-tunneler-opener", of PTAH or PTH (Fig. 23) the barred door or gateway, and the mystic sesame which opens the blocked entrance by magical means, who in his character of elemental gnome and "intra-cosmic architect," PTAH - TANEN (Fig. 24), serves as prototype archetype for Alberich, Oberon, Vulcan, Hephaestos. Even as PTAH (Fig. 25) in his character of mummy god made copy for Osiris, Serapis, Priapus, Lazarus, and Christos.

As the master magician, PTAH wields the original magician's wand and power-sceptre USR (Fig. 26) as symbolizing the jackal-head of AN-UP or ANPU (Fig. 27) the "soul guide" Anubis, and the AP-UAT (Fig. 28) "Opener-of-Ways" whose symbol as jackal headed power sceptre is also carried by his malevolent counterpart, the Satanic "dark prince" SUT or SET (Fig. 29). This, in order to indicate the elemental Power Force of Evil as essential to physically weaker Good, for the conquest of Death and Darkness.

And, as the master mason and mystery teacher par excellence who instructs Horus or Osiris in the logia kuriaka magical lore of the Greater Mysteries, PTAH (Fig. 30) stands upon the MAAT (Fig. 31) pedestal of Truth as built on-the-level, on-thesquare.

In this enterprise of magical wisdom lore, Ptah is ably assisted by the Truth goddess MA or MAAT (Fig. 32) who represents the female side of the male-female aspect of The Mysteries of elemental alchemy and the MAAT (Fig. 33) twofold Law of Right and Truth by way of impartial Justice.

Ancient Egypt's version of homogenesis concerns itself with the creation of a non-human non-historical, elemental archetype for TEMU (Fig. 34) "mortal mankind" to be —as exemplified by the original Adam or Adam, ATMU or ATUM (Fig. 35) "god of mankind" as elemental first or great ancestor of humankind as is.

In his character of elemental first ancestor of the human species AT-UM or ATMU (Fig. 36) represents the original "first man" Adam, prior to and as elemental progenitor of the first man of the species homo sapiens.

place where we camped. When all the festivities were over, the great ordeal, fraught with such intense possibilities for failure or success, was at hand. This ordeal I will attempt to describe.

Our Final Test

No student ever graduates into this highest Temple without swimming the River Nile at this point. There is no other available entrance for any student. There is a tunnel on the opposite bank. We are instructed minutely in just what direction to swim so we will enter the tunnel. Through it, we swim out to the opposite bank where, nearby, hidden in a mountain is the mystery Temple where we learn our final lessons and make our final tests.

It is impossible to know whether crocodiles are present in the water nearby by just looking into it, for a few feet below the surface they would be invisible. But we must not, on penalty of death, make our jump into the water as long as a crocodile is in the near vicinity. There is no chance about it—if a crocodile is near, he will spring upon you and his long, sharp scissors jaws will clamp down upon the middle of the body, instantly cutting it in two, and this world hears from such an unfortunate no more.

Each youth is instructed long years before to locate the crocodile by mind power, and he practices to this end all those years. Just as in all the training, when the crucial moment comes, no one is compelled to make the jump or even urged to do so. Now, as always, it is a matter of personal choice. The process is to sit in meditation on the River Bank until one is convinced that the crocodiles are gone, then make the jump, and soon be rewarded by joining our associates in the Temple.

If a youth never gets that sense of confidence, he never jumps, and this happens to some few in every group. They finally give it up and return to their Temple, there to try again to develop the ability to reach the final goal, or they give it up and go out into the world and do as the rest of the world does in the business and social world.

Some of our number refused to jump. Most of them made the plunge, and all but one came out victorious. Just one lad never appeared again. I am asked how we felt about his failure and physical death. Well, in the first place, we know that he has lost nothing. He has gained in that he developed enough character and courage to make the attempt. Nevertheless, there is the human tendency to grieve that one of the number will never be with us again in this world.

I am also asked whether there is any blame attached to such a death. Perhaps no blame as such. This would be the wrong word. But the Master of this youth loses one-half of one ring of his head gear, which indicates an earned rank in the Temple. This is a sufficient reminder to the Master that he did not train his student well enough.

We have no rank in the Temple except that indicated by those rings around our headdress. You can observe by my pictures what I mean by the headdress. You can see that it is made of soft white cloth and fastened to the head with a winding cord. The number of times which this winds around indicates the grade of scholar. No one has any other title than Master, and his degree is indicated by the number of those windings. If one wishes to indicate any particular person's standing, he will speak of him as a "Seven," or a "Ten," or "Eleven," which latter is the highest possible. In all the history of the seven Temples, there has never been but one Eleven Ring Master living at the same time. All others must wear at most only ten rings.

THE FINAL GOAL OF OUR IDEALS

Temple of Mystery

And now let us suppose that we have arrived at this final goal of our Temple life. I will now attempt to tell you something of this place of mystery, the very existence of which is known to so few people at any one time.

The Temple history extends back about 9,000 years. The Temple itself is hewn out of a hill. Passers-by can travel as near to it as your main highways are to the average farm house, and yet it has never been discovered by an outsider.

You may want to know why the strict secrecy. Well, in the first place, it has always been necessary because of the need of self-preservation. Egypt has all these thousands of years been invaded by vandals. Mohammedans have been the most numerous and, therefore, the dominant element. The Coptic Cult, a Christian group, has always been so in the minority that their numbers make but slight impression upon the public affairs of the country.

Always, they have been persecuted. A Coptic follower who is for any reason hailed into court has no consideration and not the least guaranty of justice. This reason is sufficient to account for the intense secrecy concerning their places of worship and the training of their children.

There are many passers-by who see any and all of the Temple buildings or Temple sites, such as this mountain which contains this Temple of Divine Wisdom, but never is there anything which hints at the nature of the within, and it is impossible for anyone not invited to find entrance.

In fact, some of the graduates of this Temple are farmers in its vicinity. There have been times without number all through these years gone by when some information or rumor of the existence of this Coptic center would reach the ears of some ambitious bandit. No sooner would he start on his journey, intent upon the destruction of the Temple itself and the murder of its inhabitants, than these supposed ordinary farmers would receive the word from brothers hundreds of miles away, and the word would be transmitted from one to another. By the time the thieves and murderers would arrive at the scene, there would be nothing which would give the slightest hint that anything out of the ordinary existed in that region.

And yet, within that mountain are collected those personalities in which the brains of the ages are epitomized, whose personal power is so great that if they were as unmerciful as their would-be enemy, it would be a sad day indeed for anyone who attempted to do them harm. But these wise people are Christians, and their main emphasis is that of their great Leader who commands that "Ye love one another." Therefore, they never attempt to do harm to anyone.

This Temple of Divine Wisdom is older than the pyramid of Gizet, which is somewhere around 7,000 years old. You see, there was a great civilization which dates back into prehistoric times, which had its heyday in the continent of Atlantis which sank into the bottom of the Atlantic Ocean somewhere around 14,000 years ago. When this continent disappeared, it carried down the main part of its material products. But some of the works of these people still stand and have been discovered recently in Central and South America, where great white cities in almost perfect preservation still stand. They are overgrown with tropical vegetation. But among them are pyramids which are builded on the exact pattern of Gizet, and their perfection cannot be exceeded even in our day of mechanical contrivances which seem to enable us to transcend any previous nation in our power to build mathematically and mechanically.
