

Mr. Colville will answer questions at the close of the lecture and his books and pamphlets on many interesting subjects will be on sale.



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

One in love and aspirations


For a brotherhood of nations!

The torch-bearers of Truth ever bear her beacon, flaming free, unfettered and fearless. This day revives, all glorious, enduring Truth.





SOME EVIDENCES OF DUAL CONSCIOUSNESS. By W. J. Colville.

Among the many intricate, and sometimes perplexing problems which confront the student of anthropology there is none that stirs up more controversy than that of dual personality.

Ever since Thomson Jay Hudson published his widely circulated treatise "The Law of Psychic Phenomena," advancing the now famous "two minds theory," discussion has waxed energetic in all quarters where psychic mysteries are topics of consideration. Hudson undoubtedly set many people to thinking deeply who had not given much thought previously to this intricate and fascinating problem.

The theory of our having two minds instead of only one, as has been commonly supposed, answers many an otherwise unanswered, if not unanswerable, question. We are by no means certain that generally accepted definitions of our two minds completely satisfy all legitimate cravings for intelligible explanations of extraordinary psychical experiences.

Passing from one state of consciousness to another, carrying over memories of experiences pertaining to one plane to another, is by no means a very unusual mental performance, but functioning on two planes of consciousness at once is decidedly remarkable, yet not so uncommon among highly sensitive persons as may often be supposed. We know of many instances where a sensitive has seen his or her physical body leaning back in a chair, or reclining on a couch, while the astral body or etheric double has been actively receiving information and performing definite acts temporarily separated from the physical organism, though sufficiently united with it to prevent severance of the mystic tie which binds the inner and outer bodies together until physical dissolution finally disconnects them. To be conscious on two planes of activity at the same instant proves that we must have so disciplined our vehicles as to be able to act consciously through at least two of them simultaneously instead of only successively as is the common rule.

The physical body being the most external of the several bodies we contemporaneously own, is the most likely of all to become deranged, therefore caution is necessary if we try experiments in the art of so disconnecting ourselves from it that we consciously function outside of it.

When conditions are highly favorable from all standpoints, such experiences may be beneficial and enlightening in large degree and especially useful in throwing light upon the mystery of our complex being. We sometimes gain wondrously clear visions and material which we can subsequently utilize, when functioning unusually. A certain kind of information can only be gained through the avenue of one or more of the five bodily senses; we do not gain knowledge concerning the outermost material world in trance or reverie or during sleep any more than we derive knowledge pertaining to the spiritual regions while we are wide awake and busily engaged with external occupations. Many persons of highly sensitive temperament possessing strong desire to know something definitely concerning other planes of existence than the physical, retire to rest for the express purpose of gaining that specific information—this they sometimes derive from the enlarging of their own inner perceptiveness; at other times from direct contact with other entities, either incarnate or excarnate, who possess the knowledge of which the seeker is in quest, or which his immediate interior state of affection and general receptivity renders him particularly susceptible to obtain. Any one who has learned to pass in and out of the physical body at will,—which is the special attainment of adepts or magicians of the higher grades,—can demonstrate the reality of the spiritual universe to a great degree in a thoroughly firsthand manner. The conscious development and exercise of the superphysical faculties renders one amazingly superior to the ordinary cares and anxieties of the general material life.

On the inner planes of nature causes are seen as clearly as we can see effects on the physical plane, and because of this any one who is definitely clairvoyant or clairaudient sees or hears so-called coming events as accomplished actualities. We cannot see anything that does not now exist; therefore, strictly speaking, no one ever sees or can see the future, but speaking relatively we do see what is future so far as the material plane of final ultimation is concerned, because that which is already consummated on an inner plane is working its way outward and must in due course reach its final exterior destination unless some force is exerted to prevent the

otherwise inevitable culmination. When a so-called accident is foreseen in so useful a way that it is prevented from occurring, the explanation of this interesting phenomenon is not far to seek or difficult to find. A certain fact has already transpired on the psychic plane or in the astral world, which is now acting as an efficient cause for some nearing effect in the physical domain. A force is exerted to arrest the progress of this coming event and its journey is actually stopped as much as the journeying of a human being might be intercepted by some effectual intervention.

Very often the lucide or "flying soul," who is temporarily liberated from accustomed thraldom to material boundaries, sees and hears distinctly what is going on in the thought-realm fully as clearly as we ever, in our ordinary waking conditions, become aware of what is physically taking place around us.

What is specially needed to induce, and then to wisely regulate, psychical experiences is, in the first place, to take care that we are in a thoroughly harmonious interior condition, free from all ill-will and also from all troublesome thoughts and anxieties. Then with firm desire, coupled with unfaltering anticipation that we shall successfully connect ourselves with spheres or centres of intelligence with which we desire to be co-operatively united, we can picture ourselves as faring forth on our astral journey to the region we wish to explore.

This vital bond of interior sympathy holds us in close spiritual contact with whosoever and whatever we desire most to be in union with, therefore indecision, fear, and all other perturbed mental states are detrimental to success and also extremely conducive to physical derangement resulting from psychic perturbation. The normal psychic,—and psychics can be thoroughly and sublimely normal—is one who has so learned to regulate dual functioning as to be able to apportion degrees of intelligence to an inner and an outer vehicle of conscious activity. In such cases there is no lack of concentration, but there is deliberate dual concentration. If one feels any timidity at first in the conduct of unfamiliar experiments it is well to try them only in company with some experienced friend in whom one feels complete confidence. The outer mind must be suppressed before the inner can greatly

assert itself; that is why secluded places and leisure hours are most conducive to desirable psychical experiences.

We all possess interior faculties which, as yet, we use only spasmodically or sporadically; but we can learn to gain such hold over our inner selves, by perseverance in the taking regularly of a few simple and profitable exercises, that we need not long remain strangers to at least a recognizable portion of our hidden resources.

Where there is active fear or definite misgiving it is never wise to attempt any psychic training, and we must never allow ourselves to believe that we are at the mercy of unseen forces that can do what they please with us regardless of our consent or lack of consent. We should never encourage the idea that we are under any sort of control, for the desirable and healthy condition is always one of voluntary collaboration whenever we are acting in concert with companion entities, no matter in what immediate roles we may be playing.

The real object of stimulating the inner faculties is that we may be able to enlarge the scope of our perceptiveness and become consciously familiar with our ability to function on more than one plane of conscious activity. The so-called subjective mind is the dwelling place of memory. All our past experiences of every sort have left their impress on our subconscious memorial tablets; but we are capable also of super-conscious activities and can reach out for new and higher knowledge than any we have yet absorbed. We shall find that we can continually attain to ever widening heights and depths of Life Universal.

To the illumined of all ages gave I the Great Light and that light shineth unto everlasting. Thus do I call upon thee to bear the Torch of Truth, free and undiminished, even as it is given unto thee. Thus shalt thou become a Light Bearer with faith manifest in active works.

Be valiant and unafraid even as was the Master, the Lord Jesus. The Christ speaketh unto thee and thro' thy kinship with the Great Brotherhood of all ages, do I urge thee to speak in due times and seasons.

"In the meditation of thy soul thou hast opened the channels of intercommunication with the Spirit of Truth. The teachings I give unto thee are not for thyself alone, therefore when thou hearest my voice write thou my words in order that thou mayst send them forth as messengers unto the world.

Many will oppose thee, sects and cults will endeavor to ensnare thee, casting their nets about thee that thou mightest be enchained by their doctrines, to promulgate man's teachings rather than inspired Truth through the Voice Direct. This thou hast attained to hear.

Thou art mine illumined of Soul, and only as thou dost keep thyself free to speak my words canst thou hear my voice.—Peace be with Thee."

Blessed art thou, my Child of Light, blessed art thou in the noontide, at even, and in the fair morn forever! Hold thou thy soul in readiness to receive my Truth.

ABUNDANT LIFE AND HOW TO OBTAIN IT

The Healing Power.

The key note of an individual denotes the amount of healing power he possesses. The notes on the scale are all related to motion or vibration in nature and the different colors are the effect of a certain rate of motion. There are light and dark people, positive and negative people, magnetic and electric people all placed on the musical scale.

In the chromatic scale you will find that F Sharp is the pivotal point or the perfect balance. It is on this note that all natural healers or those possessing the perfect power to heal are placed. They possess a balance of magnetic and electric forces and usually have light auburn hair.

The most magnetic people belong to higher C and usually have black hair, while the electric people belong to lower C and have fiery-red hair. The greatest normal activity is possessed by people located on F, F sharp or G. They impart strength and vitality to all they come in contact with.

The greatest abnormal activity is possessed by those located on the extremes of the musical scale. They are more liable to disease, and create inharmony wherever they go. They are very hypnotic and possess great will power and are usually successful in business. They never impart vitality but may arouse it in others.

It is said that Jesus selected his twelve disciples with reference to their position on the chromatic scale and that he himself was the pivotal point in the scale and was located on F sharp, also that Judas the betrayer was located on lower C. Each was necessary to form the perfect whole. Jesus lived a life filled with love, truth and wisdom and was the greatest healer known to mankind. We can choose him as our example, endeavoring to follow in his footsteps.

Mind Culture.

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

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

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
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
