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
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
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
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
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




OUR BROTHER, CHRIST


THE GREATER GOOD

"Peace—be still and fear not."



N awakening there is a new sense of strength, but gradually through lack of knowledge and discipline our thoughts undo the process which is ever striving to produce equilibrium. Nothing destroys vital force as much as contention or inharmonious argument, so it is well to avoid both unless you wish to scatter what has been gathered from hours of sweet repose. Seek congenial companionship and surroundings.

Hurrying through one's work or pleasure is also a great dissipator of vital force. Take life easy, for haste makes waste. Many deny themselves pleasures and recreations as they go along and hurry to save up enough to keep them in old age. When they reach a period where they think they can "let up" a little they find their capacity for enjoyment gone.

Fear is another scatterer of vital energy. It is the outgrowth of ignorance, as we fear that which we do not understand. Only the truth will set us free. As immortal souls there is nothing that should terrify us, yet all are more or less subject to fear. The very air is freighted with it. We fear sickness, accidents. loss of money, or power, or each other. We must strive to shut out these devitalizing thoughts and substitue those of perfect faith and trust in the Power that gives us life.

We should have faith in, and strive to co-operate with, Infinite law and trust to its outworkings. If we would only realize that whatever comes to us is the best that could happen to us at that particular time; that we have attracted it to ourselves; that it is necessary for some purpose, we could say "All is good" and learn the necessary lesson through it. Changes must come in order to have progression. One door never closes until another opportunity is prepared, so rest easily on the current of life and let it bear you along peacefully and trustfully.

THOUGHT ATMOSPHERE

We all have our atmosphere or aura and are surrounded by it. This aura cannot be seen with the ordinary eye, just as we can not see the earth's atmosphere, but it is there nevertheless. We generate our aura and its quality changes as our thoughts change. We can govern it and use it as our protection or let it ruin us, just as we will.

We absorb the thought atmosphere of those around us just as a sponge does water. Our very clothing is saturated with our

thoughts. Many rooms have a calm, peaceful atmosphere while others are so permeated with sad or unpleasant thoughts that sensitive ones feel the influence and cannot remain there long without being affected by them. Some homes are so filled with the gloomy thoughts of their occupants that one feels no pleasure in remaining there even if furnished with every luxury.

How often we meet perfect strangers whom we feel that we would not care to know intimately while again we meet others whose countenance shines with benevolence and kindness and feel that it would be a pleasure to know them. Each carries their atmosphere wherever they go and sensitive ones with clairvoyant vision can tell at a glance our true character.

COLOR OF AURAS.

According to knowledge obtained from those possessing clairvoyant vision the aura of one in intense anger shows dark coils and waves and sharp lightning flashes. Is it any wonder that such indulgences bring on sickness of body and depression of mind and cause the loss of friends? When one does not control one's emotions one creates bonds which tie and fetter and are only to be dissipated by generating pleasurable and gentle emotions. Sympathy and compassion create a clear rose colored aura; wisdom and religious feeling create a clear blue; a high type of intellect creates clear yellow; devotion to high ideals creates pure violet. When we are highy developed we radiate life as from a sun.

ATTRACTION.

Whatever thoughts you think become as magnets to attract or repel, and your atmosphere goes with you radiating good-will to all, or polluting the air for others to inhale. Each thought has an interior power, which is exactly like the thought itself in nature and quality, and will express it in the body. The ideas held in mind become manifested in life, so think only of that which you wish to bring into manifestation.

This is the way to attract to you the things you desire. Live on the sunny side of life. Count everything a joy, believing that all things are working for your greater good. Keep in a calm quiet state of mind and feel peace vibrating through you. Exercise the power of thought in healing any adverse condition—physical, mental and moral.

In order to generate a harmonious aura it is well to make affirmations of truth. These are to be accepted, not reasoned over, and, if held in mind, will mould your life into their own likeness.

AFFIRMATIONS

An affirmation is a mental exercise which when sufficiently repeated strengthens the good, and crowds out the injurious thoughts. It is easy to say "I am strong" when the body shows forth perfect health, or "I am happy" when everything goes right, but we must learn to make these statements in spite of present conditions realizing that by so doing we are helping to bring about the desired results.

A few affirmations are hereby presented to the reader which may be changed to suit individual needs:

"I am master of myself."

"I can and will do whatever I desire to do."

"I am moulding my mind and body now."

"I am bright, cheerful and happy this minute."

"I am growing each day in health, strength and power."

"I am looking forward not backward, upward not downward."

- "I am reaching out to the Source of Power for help to overcome."
- "I am letting go of all thoughts of sickness, sorrow and anxiety."
- "I am selecting only the thoughts which shall create harmony within."
- "I am at peace with all the world and realize more the Great Love which enfolds me."
- "I am a part of all that exists and live, move, and have my being in Infinite Life."
- "I am given dominion over all things, and will make this body a temple of health."
- "I am looking on the bright side of every event, and evolving power to get good out of each."
- "I am avoiding all irritability, impatience and pessimism, and growing amiable, so everyone likes me."
- "I am refraining from censuring, criticising and condemning my fellow traveller along life's journey."
- "I am attracting to myself the friends, the work and all that I need to make my life happy, useful and prosperous."

"I am becoming receptive to the inflow of Divine Love, power, health, knowledge, success and plenty."

"I have no fear of the future, of disaster, sickness, disease or poverty, for I live in God, am supplied by His bounty."

"I will enjoy re-creating my body after my ideal. While eating I will realize that the food is being converted into blood, bone and tissue harmoniously."

"I will direct my thought forces with love to any organ of the body that does not do its work perfectly."

"I am free to live my own life. I am not held down by any condition or environment, and know that I have the power to shape my life as I wish it to be."

"The path before me grows brighter, and I know that the future holds greater happiness for me than I have realized in the past."

By affirming these and other vital truths you will fill the mind with new thoughts and crowd out accumulated rubbish.

The majority of people need to pass through many bitter experiences before they are aroused to think and live according to the new light which is given them. They refuse to die to the old, hence cannot live in the new and realize the happiness and satisfaction it brings. There is wonderful truth in the lines by Goethe:

"Die to the old; live to the new; Grow strong with each tomorrow, Else drag with thee to life's dull end A lengthening chain of sorrow."
