It is a source of contentment and peace of mind to know that he will be seconded by a man who is not only a statesman, but a disciple of the principles of brotherly love in the person of Thomas Marshall. Add to these the inestimable value of the counsel and co-operation of that wise, generous and self-sacrificing man, William Jennings Bryan. In these three we have a trinity of influences that cannot but lead this country into safe, peaceful and prosperous channels.

"ALETHEIAN voices the sentiment of thousands of peaceful, progressive and indomitable souls who will give our new President every aid in their power. Minds that are not working for personal preference or political supremacy or for individual power, but minds that are united in one vast harmonious whole, laboring for the common good.

"The listening soul can hear the paean of thanksgiving, the 'spirit voices' in solemn dedication of hearts and minds to the new freedom. A pledge to right wrongs, to elevate woman, to save the child, to eliminate selfishness, and bring about peace, * * fair play, honest reward for honest labors, Justice, Mercy and Love. Some of you may not see it as I see it and as many

other seeing sculs do. There is a vast throng of us who welcome this new administration as the beginning of an era where the great lines of government shall be gathered together into a mighty chord of stability, honesty, and charity for all men. A unity of high and low, rich and poor, wherein we shall come as a nation to recognize and to promulgate the rights of man with equal brotherhood."

Note the enactment of the Child Labor Law, the Seaman's Act, so ably championed by Robert LaFollette who could not get it through former administrations, the Championship of Woman, by both Wilson and Bryan, and the enactment of the Eight Hour Law and the settlement of the Rail Road Strike, in justice to humanity and for the common good. Peace and Prosperity are ours, while other Nations are at war.

ALETHEIAN MAGAZINE for November, 1912, voiced the following:

"Woodrow Wilson will be the greatest president since Washington. The administration will be a stirring and eventful one. The United States will be forced to intervene in Mexico, yet there will be no war between Mexico and the United States."

And again on another page in the same issue we find this:

"The Eagle Broods o'er the mountains and there shall my Flag be unfurled," saith the Goddess of Liberty. "From the sandy shores of the Atlantic to the rocky slopes of the Pacific shall the flag be rested from the usurper, and my beautiful stars no longer dragged through the mire of iniquitous graft. Yet there shall be no war, but peace and plenty in fair Freedom's Land! The peoples of the United States shall dwell in peace and plenty, and shall offer succor and sustenance to the weary and oppressed!"

*Note that the flag has indeed been unfurled from coast to coast and our soldiers have carried it to the uttermost borders and beyond, not to make war but to preserve peace.

Building the New Jerusalem

THE word Jerusalem signifies "The Place of Peace." The United States of America presents, at this time the modern, earthly Jerusalem. It is the only great quarter of the globe now resisting warfare, and maintaining peace. When we speak of the "New Jerusalem coming down out of Heaven," as described by John, the Revelator; we understand that the Spirit of Peace, proceeding from "the Heavens," signifies the descent of the spirit to the peoples of any land and does not, necessarily, refer to the rebuilding of the Jerusalem of two thousand years ago. Here in this land of America, rapidly trending toward universal peace the spiritual Jerusalem, or the Place of Peace, takes concrete form in response to Divine command, or inspiration, reaching the souls of those "mighty in counsel and in wisdom."

All of the great work, the progress of the world, has been through inspiration. All knowledge and wisdom proceeds from inspiration, in answer to our aspiration. Our poetry, art and music, even our industrial advancements are the result of inspiration, responding to man's urgent need; to the cry of the soul's fervent aspiration.

Scientists tell us that man was placed upon the earth with no tools except his hands. Therefore, if man evolved for the use of his hands such tools as were required, he must have done so by inspiration. If there was no one to show him where these were to be found, and for what purpose they should be used, inspiration, responding to necessity's aspiration, must have been the source from whence they were derived.

Aspiration and Inspiration

Thought radiates from the center; so even if man in his original creation was as crude as scientists assert, he was capable of being touched by inspiration, and one must realize what that power was and whence it proceeded. Few intelligent beings are willing to accept all that some "scientists" assert. If we accept the evolution of man, we must realize that through his mental forces man receives and puts forth thoughts that have entered his consciousness

from some source. We must believe that there is a divine law sending forth Inspiration in response to the Aspiration of beings in all realms. Just as our electric light is the manifestation of a force generated in a dynamo and sent forth, vibrating over countless wires, to expression in radiant lights for the use of mankind; so inspiration proceeds from a dynamic center over countless invisible lines, or waves of light, to manifest in countless human intellects thru what we call **Intelligence**. Wondrous beings who are directors of this force, from the great central dynamo of the universe, constantly oversee the work of the transmission of inspiration, just as our great electrical engineers, wire chiefs and numberless assistants of the electrical systems of the material world, control and execute the work of our telephone and wireless apparatus.

The great realm of spirit has its master guardians of the light ever at work, so when we speak of the Source of Inspiration, we may liken it to a great dynamo sending forth powerful vibrations for the illumination of mankind. Thru wise and lofty spiritual beings this illumination is transmitted from mind to mind, from element to element, from plane to plane throughout the Universe.

The Grecians were not wrong in their belief in those superior beings whom they called "The Gods." Though science, of a sort, would deny the existence of these godlike beings, yet the same science says that nothing rises higher than its source; so let us accept the thought that in the most ancient, as well as in modern times there were upon the Earth plane men, of such transcendent nobility of soul, of such spiritual aspiration that, closely attuned to the great center of power, they were and are perfect instruments, vibrating to the music of the spheres. Such beings should be regarded as lofty, god-like souls and, whether in the realms of the heavens, or toiling for humanity in the earth-plane, these beings radiate life, hope, healing, and illumination through telepathic communication; furnishing undying inspiration for all who aspire.

In unquestioning loving obedience only may be found that perfection of service, achieving highest attainment. In all the recorded words of Jesus, the Christ, his chosen were never taught to look upon him as God, the Creator; but as sent of the Creator, and as a God among men of all

time because of the perfect purity of his life. The perfection of his instrumentality as a spiritual being, revealed the Divine in Man. Thus he was the Child of God, yet the Son of man. If one gives the entire life to the transmission of inspiration from the Supreme Center he becomes an absolute vehicle for the Creator.

One can allow the soul's fountain to become choked with rubbish, one can attempt to shut off the flow of spirit but it will burst forth in spite of material opposition. Those who have the "gifts of the Spirit" must use them. Realize that this gift of inspiration is a holy gift, become its perfect channel, and grow to the stature of the Christ. The spiritual self, conceived of the Holy Spirit, though clothed in mortal flesh, is still a spiritual being. Every spiritual entity inhabiting bodies and brains was conceived of the Holy Ghost, or Spirit, manifesting in flesh, or humanity. Here we perceive the allegory of the bond woman.

Every child of the flesh is the child of bondage. Every child of the spirit is the child of freedom. When the spirit becomes the victor over the flesh such an one entereth into the kingdom of understanding; the gate thereto is Aspiration, the path Service, the goal Attainment;—Thus shall we build the New Jerusalem—The Place of Peace.

Am I then a pessimist? Do I dwell in the low foglands of doubt and fear? Do I slumber in a tottering shanty of shadows? Furthest from all this possible! Unbounded is my faith in God and in the deeper spiritual side of humanity.

Standing upon the lofty summit of a persistent trust in the Divine Goodness, I see through and beyond these clouds and eclipses—beyond all these mental, social and theological nightmares, to that mighty omnipotence in the heavens and to those shimmering sunbeams that make the grasses grow and the fragrant roses bloom, thinking in the meantime of these lines:

“The stamp of rank in nature
Is capacity for pain
And the sweetness of the singer
Is the sadness of the strain.”

Those earnest souls who have climbed to the mountain tops in this or foreign lands, have seen strata of golden sun-kissed clouds below them; and yet, those down in the lowlands, seeing the undermost surfaces of these clouds, pronounce them darkest gray or black.

Undoubtedly, above all clouds, turmoils, tempests and great storm centers in the physical, the sun shines and so, lifted to that higher plane of the spiritual, the sun of righteousness—the Divine Sun of Love and Wisdom—shines in matchless glory—shines to lighten and morally illumine all the tribes and tongues and races of humanity.

There is no absolute and eternal evil in the universe. Hades, the hell of the ancients, was and now is only a kind of a kindergarten—a kindly retributive prelude of lessons to an introduction into the delightful mansions of the sages and inspired seers gone before.

Progress is the resounding keynote in these inquisitive and perilous times. Men and women think and great reasoners traverse all lands; and the better and the higher are in the ascendancy. As well strive to bind the waters of the ocean with a rope of sand or hush the winds fresh from Aeolus’ hand, as to bid the currents of free thought

cease circulating among inquiring masses that dare to assert their independence. Popes and priests have measurably been shorn of their power. Century-mossed systems have lost their vitalizing force and creedal ceremonies have become dull and irksome. The great, throbbing heart of humanity calls for living inspirations and greater, grander truths, fresh from the Father and the angels that do the Divine Will.

Emerson, in his address to the Senior Theological class at Cambridge, said: "It is my duty to say to you that the need was never greater for a new revelation than now." It demands men and women, enthusiastic and full-orbed, who see in every soul a possible Christ, in every life a symbol-thought of God, in every well-timed bath a baptism, in every day a Sabbath, in every house a living temple and in every heart an altar of worship whereon the fires of love and devotion are kept as incense continually burning, making life's busy homes precious and sunny, something like the Syrian orange tree that bears in its bosom at the same time the fragrance of blossoms with the matured fruitage; men whose warm blood, deep sympathy and great moral independence tell in torrent-like grandeur against political knavery, social vices and whose searching eyes flash, burning words convince, vibrating lips persuade and startling inspirations touch the hearts' deepest affections, thus leading the soul to bow in devotion before the altar of Divine Truth.

These are our brave martyrs—the daring aviators of the twentieth century, speaking and living their highest thoughts, though the fire, the faggot or the cross face them.

Oh, we need great moral heroes who dare and do and who would die for heaven's glorious truth. We need great spiritual heroes all aflame with odes, with rhapsody, with lyric, uttered in tongues of fire, stirring the very depths of the inmost consciousness and arousing such consciences to duty undone; of the spiritual life un-lived; of a desired heaven here and now undreamed of, echoing in the soul's memory chambers for truth—more truth—higher truth—more brotherhood and more firm impulses of kindness, forgiveness, self-sacrifice, religious zeal and devotion to the divine principles of that God-inspired spiritualism that educates, sanctifies and saves.

Forget not that man, in whatever age or realm of being, is a conscious individuality with such clinging personalities

to his vigorous tree of life, or rather as tendencies, habits and varying discordant deeds, all of which are the subjects of culture and vast unfoldments; and so heavenward, all things tend.

Oh blissful faith; oh indescribable knowledge—eternity—how grand! How uplifting the thought!

When all Spiritualists the wide world over become convinced and enthused with this holy Spiritualism that underlies all the world's reforms and practice its precious precepts imbedded in its phenomena, its philosophy and its fascinating religion, brutal wars will cease, sectarian dogmatisms will perish and all earnest souls will be baptized afresh with the spirit of love; estranged hands will again be clasped; unsympathizing hearts will be warmed with the kindling emotions of human tenderness, all combining to constitute the world into one vast commonwealth of freedom, justice, philanthropy and universal harmony.

Just a few words to you—you, gentle reader—hoping to incite in your inmost being deeper thoughts and loftier ideals. Listen: You, my friend, brought nothing into this material world but a little naked body, some infantile screams, some inherited tendencies, spiritual possibilities and a life germ of immortality. How very poor and dependent you were!

Well, you can take nothing out of this world in passing through death's grim gateway, but consciousness, memory, mental attainments, moral qualities and spiritual treasures—nothing else. Where—and what then? I know, and you know; and you ought to so live as to hear beyond the curtain of change: "Well done thou good and faithful servant."

Behold now your waiting friends, your lovely home and the indescribably beautiful scenery. Looking farther, behold those crystal fountains, those gardens, groves, flowers, schools and lyceums, colleges and universities, limited by the laws of adaptation and merit. Behold the historical libraries extending back to the period that marked the era when first inhabited by rational intelligences. The presence of the "White Comrade" beheld by many; the actual touch of his hands, soothing the dying, binding up the wounds of the suffering, attest the marvelous power of the Presence, called by some an "apparition!"

The appearance of "Le Comrade Blanc" at Nancy, in the Argonne, at Soissons, and at Ypres has arrested the attention of the scientific world. The men in the trenches speak the name of "The White Comrade" with bated breath and with reverent wonder and awe. They neither doubt nor deride, for many have seen him and have been sustained, comforted and even miraculously, as they believe, rescued from death by One whom they term the "Comrade in White."

Not only spiritual publications, but the secular press, give wide circulation to the following account of the "Friend of the Wounded," furnished by a soldier:

"After many a hot engagement a man in white had been seen bending over those who lay behind on the field. "Snipers sniped at him. Shells fell all around. Nothing had power to touch him. This mysterious one, whom the French called 'The Comrade in White,' seemed everywhere at once." The soldier's account proceeds more circumstantially:

"It was the next day. At noon we got word to take the trenches in front of us. They were two hundred yards away, and we weren't well started till we knew that the big guns had failed in their work of preparation. We had advanced 150 yards when we found it was no good. Our captain called to us to take cover, and just then I was shot through both legs.

"I fell into a hole of some sort. I suppose I fainted, for when I opened my eyes I was all alone. The pain was horrible, but I

to enter into a treaty for that purpose, and to that end have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

“The President of the United States, the Honorable William Jennings Bryan, secretary of state; and

“Her Majesty the Queen of The Netherlands, Chevalier W. L. F. C. van Rappard, envoy extraordinary and minister plenipotentiary of The Netherlands to the United States;

“Who, after having communicated to each other their respective full powers, found to be in proper form, having agreed upon and concluded the following articles:

“ARTICLE I

“The High Contracting Parties agree that all disputes between them, of every nature whatsoever, to the settlement of which previous arbitration treaties or agreements do not apply in their terms or are not applied in fact, shall, when diplomatic methods of adjustment have failed, be referred for investigation and report to a permanent international commission, to be constituted in the manner prescribed in the next succeeding article; and they agree not to declare war or begin hostilities during such investigation and before the report is submitted.

“ARTICLE II

“The international commission shall be composed of five members, to be appointed as follows: One member shall be chosen from each country, by the government thereof; one member shall be chosen by each government from some third country; the fifth member shall be chosen by common agreement between the two governments, it being understood that he shall not be a citizen of either country. The expenses of the commission shall be paid by the two governments in equal proportion.

“The international commission shall be appointed within six months after the exchange of the ratifications of this treaty; and vacancies shall be filled according to the manner of the original appointment.

“ARTICLE III

“In case the High Contracting Parties shall have failed to adjust a dispute by diplomatic methods, they shall at once refer it to the international commission for investigation and report. The international commission may, however, spontaneously offer its services to that effect, and in such case it shall notify both governments and request their co-

operation in the investigation.

“The High Contracting Parties agree to furnish the permanent international commission with all the means and facilities required for its investigation and report.

“The report of the international commission shall be completed within one year after the date on which it shall declare its investigation to have begun, unless the High Contracting Parties shall limit or extend the time by mutual agreement. The report shall be prepared in triplicate; one copy shall be presented to each government, and the third retained by the commission for its files.

“The High Contracting Parties reserve the right to act independently on the subject-matter of the dispute after the report of the commission shall have been submitted.

“ARTICLE IV

“The present treaty shall be ratified by the President of the United States of America, by and with the advice and consent of the senate thereof; and by Her Majesty the Queen of The Netherlands; and the ratifications shall be exchanged as soon as possible. It shall take effect immediately after the exchange of ratifications, and shall continue in force for a period of five years; and it shall thereafter remain in force until twelve months after one of the High Contracting Parties have given notice to the other of an intention to terminate it.

“In witness whereof, the respective plenipotentiaries have signed the present treaty and have affixed thereunto thir seals.

“Done in Washington on the eighteenth day of December, in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and thirteen.”

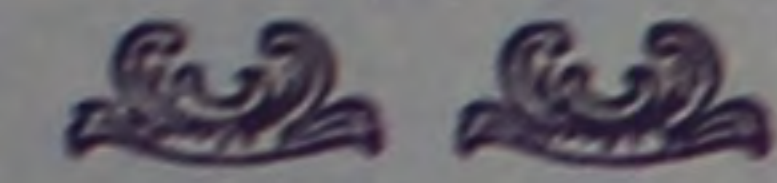
