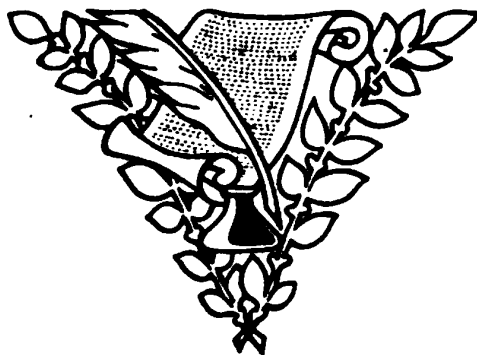

Eastern Standard time is 3 hours advanced.

When it is noon, Pacific time, it is 1 P. M. Mountain time; 2 P. M. Central time; 3 P. M. Eastern time.

Persons living in Mountain, Central or Eastern time zones should add 1, 2, or 3 hours, respectively, to the time given in the "Favorable and Unfavorable Days."

The Moon's position given on each day is its place at 4 A. M., Pacific time, which is the same as 5 A. M. Mountain; 6 A. M. Central; 7 A. M. Eastern time.

SATURDAY, 1st—Moon $14^{\circ} 17'$ in Libra at 4:00 A. M., Pacific time, which is the same at 5:00 A. M. Rocky Mountain time, 6:00 A. M. Central, 7:00 A. M. Eastern.

A very Happy New Year to all! The planetary vibrations are splendidly in keeping with this day—very auspicious for the beginning of a new year. Let joy be unconfined. Let the vibrations of Venus find their finest response in your being, sing a heart-felt melody of peace and good-will to all. Let Mercury and Uranus inspire your mind to still greater progress and achievement in the days of 1921 to come, wherein you will find greater opportunities, acquire more wisdom and be of greater service in the field of upliftment in your sphere. Affirm resolutely that glorious victories and success will crown your highest efforts this year. Today is very good for metaphysical treatments, study, correspondence, visits, visiting the sick, courtship, marriage, or travel.

Sunday, 2nd—Moon enters Scorpio at 9:28 A. M., Pacific time. Sun $11^{\circ} 34'$ in Capricorn. The aspects for today are very good, that of Mars gives industry and activity; Uranus, desire to do something differently or to go to some new place, desire for change or adventure; Jupiter inclines to excess, to overdo, to be somewhat extravagant or careless; Mercury gives desire for expression, fluent in conversation or in correspondence, mental activity, observation, favors visits, lectures, meetings. A good day to exercise the educational, spiritual and social faculties.

Monday, 3rd—Moon $9^{\circ} 39'$ in Scorpio. Today we find some mixed influences in operation—the Moon and Sun adverse with Neptune, and Jupiter “stationary,” and about to retrograde. These conditions tend to produce negative states, peculiar feelings, misjudgment, confusion, or misunderstandings. However, the moon is in good aspect with the Sun and Jupiter, which is beneficial, and therefore if we resolutely maintain poise and calm we may rise superior to undesirable tendencies and make good use of our efforts through ordinary duties.

Tuesday, 4th—Moon enters Sagittarius at 4:24 P. M. The Moon in good aspect with Saturn helps to steady the other somewhat irritating and disruptive tendencies; it is good for attending to ordinary duties of laborious or tedious character, especially where it does not bring one into contact with many people—Saturn inclines to seclusive efforts. Somewhat favorable for reading, study or lectures along occult lines. Be cautious in aggressive business pursuits, careful in dealing with the opposite sex. Not auspicious for marriage, partnership, travel, or social affairs.

Wednesday, 5th—Moon $4^{\circ} 02'$ in Sagittarius. The Moon favorably aspected to Mercury and Neptune makes this a fair day for minor business activities, short jour-

neys, shopping, correspondence, study, visits, and matters connected with liquids, drugs, oils. Also good for psychical research and experiment. Any tendencies to artistic expression should be encouraged and inspiration on ideals should be cultivated and given due meditation.

Thursday, 6th—Moon $16^{\circ} 01'$ in Sagittarius. Moon forming adverse aspects to Jupiter and Saturn. The common tendency of these is toward depression, restlessness, nervousness, impatience, anxiety about finances or other obligations, extremes in thought and feelings. Not a good day for important business transactions where perfect judgment is required. Avoid new undertakings and risky ventures. Pay attention to health and bodily comforts, use strong, encouraging affirmations—"I am superior to difficulties." "Good fortune is at hand." "Harmony reigns in my affairs." "Tomorrow will be better."

Friday, 7th—Moon enters Capricorn at 8:10 A. M. Good vibrations from Venus, Mars and Uranus. Encourage tendencies to sing, whistle, hum or otherwise produce music. Do things which are artistic, mechanical or inventive. Good for business requiring aggressiveness, or muscular energy. Favorable for social, industrial or progressive affairs. Investigate, experiment, invent, rearrange, remove or travel. "Do with thy might what thy hands find to do" may be a good idea to follow today.

First Lunar Quarter Begins on 8th at 9:29 P. M.
New Moon.

Saturday, 8th—Moon $9^{\circ} 48'$ in Capricorn. A number of minor adverse aspects operate during the day, followed by a benign vibration from Jupiter. These usually spur us into action along lines and with things needing attention, and, if we maintain poise in spite of any minor difficulties which may arise, we will be enabled

to execute a great amount of useful work. When the end of the day comes, although it may not have been a "perfect day," yet we may be very well pleased with the achievements. Avoid anxiety and risky matters; work industriously but not feverishly.

Sunday, 9th—Sun $18^{\circ} 42'$ in Capricorn. Moon enters Aquarius at 8:50 P. M. Good aspects prevail for the usual Sunday affairs. Especially favorable for religious, philosophical and scientific matters. Tendency to pleasure, sports and out-of-door amusement. Some tendency to excess in eating or in pleasure. Inclination to romance and adventure. Amorous instincts, yet danger of difficulty with the opposite sex.

Monday, 10th—Moon $3^{\circ} 32'$ in Aquarius. While the aspects of today are not particularly malign, yet they are of such nature as to produce irritation, impatience and dissatisfaction if such emotions are permitted to go through the being unrestrained—they CAN be converted into useful forces by a determined will. There may appear some tendency to forgetfulness, oversight, or misunderstanding, but deliberate action can overcome it. Be cautious in the use of liquids, oil, chemicals, etc.

Tuesday, 11th—Moon $15^{\circ} 27'$ in Aquarius. Numerous vibrations causing activity in a variety of channels. If haste, force and abruptness are eliminated from speech and action a great deal of useful work may result. However, be cautious in dealings with opposite sex; also with vehicles of locomotion. From 4:16 P. M. to 11:30 P. M. is best part of day for important business, correspondence, study, treatments and social affairs.

Wednesday, 12th—Moon enters Pisces at 9:10 A. M. Planetary vibrations of a stimulating or exciting nature prevail today, but if the feelings can be controlled the energy may be transmuted to muscular activity of use-

ful character. Don't be too quick at jumping to conclusions—decide things slowly. Don't be too readily annoyed by others. These aspects require self-control in order to avoid accidents and controversy. Be cautious in all dealings with others.

Thursday, 13th—Moon $9^{\circ} 27'$ in Pisces. There is likely to manifest intense mental activity without fully developed thoughts or else hastily conceived ideas leading to nervous, impatient or premature action; this can be overcome by positively and frequently declaring to yourself your ability to proceed in orderly manner. Be careful in agreements, promises and correspondence. Do not hastily assume large or uncertain obligations. Assume no risky liabilities, no bail, bonds, security or notes for others. Some tendency to overestimate or in some way be extreme. Be conservative.

Friday, 14th—Moon enters Aries at 8:14 P. M. Until 10:00 A. M. Pacific time, which is the same as 1:00 P. M. Eastern time, the Moon opposes Saturn, the effect of which produces nervous, anxious feelings, or "fear thoughts," fear delay, loss, failure, trouble or something, and little annoyances usually appear to test the self-control, to determine how much you are boss of the domain within the mind. However, if you would help your peace of mind, don't attempt long jobs and expect to get them done quickly today. Ease on high tensions. Relax.

Saturday, 15th—Moon $4^{\circ} 01'$ in Aries. Excellent vibrations. A good day to begin new business, seek new customers, clients, patients, students. Mail, advertise, correspond, study, collect. Better for quickly moving matters than for slowly maturing projects. Deal with teachers, laborers, artists and psychics. Favorable for occult affairs and for matters connected with liquids, oils or chemicals. Sometimes aspects like these have the effect of producing a sense of ease, com-

fort or contentment, so that the day slips by without fullest use being made of the fruitful influences.

**Second Lunar Quarter Begins on 16th at 10:29 P. M.
Light Increasing**

Sunday, 16th—Moon $16^{\circ} 39'$ in Aries. Sun $25^{\circ} 50'$ in Capricorn. Numerous aspects occur today, but none of them conducive to spiritual emotions or religious fervor; on the contrary, they are more apt to make one stern or relentless, easily irritated and annoyed by trifles seeming to welcome conflict or controversy. This being a day for recreation and relaxation as well as for spiritual upliftment, it should not be difficult to maintain poise, cheer and kindness, thus cultivating happiness. "Watch your step" when with others today—they feel the surge within, too.

Monday, 17th—Moon enters Taurus at 4:40 A. M. A fairly good day for general aggressive business activity, especially dealings with municipal, federal or postal officials, mechanics and machinery dealers. Not so favorable for ladies, artists, actors, miners and psychics. With routine duties one should be able to accomplish much today.

Tuesday, 18th—Moon 13° in Taurus. Fruitful influences prevail conducive to growth and extension. Inclines to cheer, harmony and jovialty. Tendency to pleasure and extravagance. Very good for matters along artistic and professional lines, buying or donning new clothing or jewelry. Very good for social affairs, marriage, or beginning new business. Favors matters of land, produce, property and mines. Collect. Do your very best toward progress and advancement, but be moderate in eating. A child conceived or born on this day will be very practical, artistic, intellectual and fortunate.

Wednesday, 19th—Moon enters Gemini at 9:22 A. M.

Until 11:25 A. M. the planetary aspects are fairly good for general business, including correspondence and shopping. After 11:25 A. M. the Moon applies to adverse aspects with Uranus and Mars, which incline to haste, force, harshness and to accidents. Be cautious with vehicles, machinery, electricity and explosives. Use consideration in dealings with others and caution in your work; make the quality of thoughts rich and vital, and you will find no difficulty in transcending these vibrations.

Thursday, 20th—Moon $11^{\circ} 07'$ in Gemini. Sun enters Aquarius at 5:55 A. M. Pacific time. The aspects are not particularly malign, but they are of a nature which inclines to misjudgment, to overstep conventional ethics, to irregularity, leading to loss, disappointment or delays. Avoid risky ventures, be careful in finances. Assume no doubtful liabilities, bail, bonds, notes, guarantees, etc. Agreements are not apt to be rigidly adhered to. Relax and recreate through light amusements.

Friday, 21st—Moon enters Cancer at 10:35 A. M. Until 8:03 A. M., i. e., 11:03 A. M. Eastern time, the aspects are somewhat adverse, so the more important business had best be done later in the day. In this morning period care should be exercised in relation to liquids, oils, chemicals, fish and canned goods—avoid foods with the slightest taint. After 8:03 A. M. (11:03 A. M. Eastern time) the vibrations gradually change for the better and become beneficial in nature, especially good for progressive affairs, invention, travel, or metaphysical healing.

Saturday, 22nd—Moon $10^{\circ} 59'$ in Cancer. Until about 3:00 P. M. the vibrations are very fruitful and beneficial, conducive to generosity, magnanimity, harmony and jovialty. Best part of day for shopping, etc. Afterward the indications are somewhat doubtful in nature, inclining to excess, misjudgment, extravagance or ex-

tremes in some form. Be moderate in dining.

**Third Lunar Quarter Begins at 3:08 P. M. on 23rd.
Full Moon. Decreasing.**

Sunday, 23rd.—Moon enters Leo at 9:45 A. M. Sun $2^{\circ} 58'$ in Aquarius. Moon in opposition to Sun and Mercury tends to produce some discordant emotions, inclining to arrogance, domineering, positive, critical states which, if expressed, bring up inharmonies. Therefore, be cautious of giving offense or hurting the feelings of sensitive people. Be careful in agreements, promises and correspondence. Quiet recreations rather than undertaking laborious tasks.

Monday, 24th—Moon $11^{\circ} 39'$ in Leo. Fairly good for ordinary affairs, but not for new or very important business. Any tendency to be perverse, radical or irrational should be speedily overcome to permit conditions remaining normal. A day to adjust oneself to circumstances rather than upheave conditions.

Tuesday, 25th—Moon enters Virgo at 9:05 A. M. Be cautious and deliberate in all affairs, as the Moon opposes Uranus until 3:30 P. M., inclining to premature decisions and actions. After 3:30 the nature of the vibrations change and are good for general business activities, study, reading, lectures, correspondence, visits.

Wednesday, 26th—Moon $11^{\circ} 39'$ in Virgo. Aspects of conflicting quality appear today, good and adverse alternating. From 5:28 A. M. to 0:39 P. M. Moon opposes Mars, but between 0:38 and 2:36 P. M. Moon is conjunction Jupiter, which is good if moderation is exercised in eating and care to avoid other excesses or extravagance. After 2:36 P. M. is somewhat lowering to vitality, morals and mental status, tending to depression, sorrow, discontent, and inharmony with opposite sex. A period for relaxation and quiet recreation rather than concentration on business or personal affairs. If distressful thoughts insist upon intruding, use

this watchword until they are dispelled: "I am greater than my problems." "The infinite storehouse is open to me." "Harmony reigns in my affairs."

Thursday, 27th—Moon enters Libra at 4:41 A. M. Were it not for a gleam from Venus this would be a real Saturnine day—Moon conjunction Saturn in the morning and Parallel in the evening—but a Venus ray comes in between times which makes it possible for us to use the urges (manifest them) as practical, artistic, steady, concentrated effort. To some it will tend to sorrow in love, trouble in domestic affairs, loss, delays and disappointments—which is simply to show they are not making sufficient effort to find the heaven within.

Friday, 28th—Moon $9^{\circ} 53'$ in Libra. From 4:00 A. M. to 8:00 P. M. the vibrations are of beneficial nature. Good for general business activity, dealings with teachers, printers, writers, psychics, sailors or fishermen. Correspond, study, visit, shop or take short journeys. Favors matters relating to shipping, liquids, oils or chemicals.

Saturday, 29th—Moon enters Scorpio at 4:26 P. M. The prevailing aspects produce tendencies to industrious activity, while there might be some inclination to negative health states. Not what might be called an auspicious day, yet with due care and effort much may be accomplished. The afternoon and evening is good for study, correspondence, shopping, visits, recreation, or muscular labors.

Fourth Lunar Quarter Begins on 30th at 0:03 P. M.
(Pacific Time). Dark. Decreasing.

Sunday, 30th—Moon $6^{\circ} 11'$ in Scorpio. Sun $10^{\circ} 04'$ in Aquarius. Somewhat adverse aspects prevail. Use extra effort to be hopeful, cheerful, optimistic, patient and considerate. There may be some tendency to ner-

vous depletion, in which case recline; or, if extra heart stimulation appears, avoid stimulating food and exciting conditions; recreate quietly.

Monday, 31st—Moon 18° 43' in Scorpio. No less than eleven planetary aspects operate on this date, the combined influence of which is good for general business activity, although care should be exercised in the wording of agreements, contracts, promises and correspondence.

Jupiter in Virgo, retrograde after 4th.

Saturn in Virgo, retrograde after 4th.

Uranus in Pisces.

INFLUENCE OF THE NEW MOON

Between January 9th and February 7th

ACCORDING TO ASTROLOGY

When the New Moon occurs on January 9th, 0:21 A. M. mean time at Washington, D. C., the sign Libra is rising on eastern horizon, Venus, the planetary ruler of Libra, is located in the 5th "house," in Pisces, the sign of its "exaltation" in conjunction with Mars and Uranus. Pisces is on the cusp of 6th, but these three planets are still in 5th house. This indicates public interest turned particularly to matters of financial adjustments, speculation and young people. The configuration is somewhat adverse for moral status, indicating more than the usual statutory crimes, scandals, divorces and hasty, ill-starred marriages. Speculative stocks will show remarkable changes. As the general trend of prices is downward, due largely to Jupiter's approaching conjunction with Saturn, sudden advances in stocks are more than apt to be followed with declines, especially with railroad, electric, motor, industrials and some cereals.

Activity in recruiting for army and navy and controversies within labor unions.

Neptune in tenth domain calls attention to shipping interests and political plans.

Jupiter and Saturn influencing the twelfth cusp denotes some pessimism and talk about hard times; financial "drives" for hospitals, homes, etc. Their conjunction in the earthly sign Virgo gives activity in real estate and demand for garden and farm lands.

Mercury with Sun and Moon at the door of 4th house, in Capricorn, increases activity in realty, causes storms and unsettled weather. Many changes among executive officers.

Moon in Last Quarter. Decreasing. Dark.

Tuesday, 1st—Moon enters Sagittarius at 2:04 A. M. Pacific time, which is 3:04 Rocky Mountain, 4:04 Central, 5:04 A. M. Eastern time. The time quoted in this chapter is Pacific time. Readers living east of the Pacific Coast should change their times accordingly.

Adverse aspects prevail until 3:42 P. M. Avoid sudden changes of plans and do not embark on risky ventures, voyages or journeys. Be careful in correspondence, contracts or agreements, cautious with vehicles, explosives, liquids, oils, chemicals or gas. Not good for psychical experiments. Unless mental poise and deliberate actions are maintained, high tension, worry, misunderstandings and premature conditions will result from the combined influences. After 3:42 P. M. things change for the better—improved vitality and

improved psychic conditions. Favorable for general business, recreation and social matters.

Wednesday, 2nd—Moon $13^{\circ} 01'$ in Sagittarius. After 4:13 A. M. Pacific time the Moon forms adverse aspects to Jupiter, Mars and Saturn, which inclines to harshness, cruelty or anger. A day to exercise continual self-control in all matters. Avoid risky ventures in business, with animals, vehicles, machinery or otherwise. Attend to ordinary minor affairs, acting with studied carefulness. Try hard to remain cheerful, optimistic and hopeful. If one can control their feelings, the force of these vibrations can be turned to account in performing duties quietly and in muscular employment. It is, however, a day to relax from strenuous affairs. Have due regard for the laws of health.

Thursday, 3rd—Moon enters Capricorn at 2:14 P. M. Although influences of mixed nature operate, the day is fairly good if social and business customs are adhered to. Fair for correspondence, study and minor business, but use care in dealings with ladies, artists, musicians, milliners, dressmakers, tailors, hotel keepers, managers and officials. After 5:00 P. M. is fair for progressive matters, lectures and quiet recreation.

Friday, 4th—Moon $6^{\circ} 47'$ in Capricorn. Mars reaches exact opposition to Saturn at 10:01 P. M., which indicates that extra caution should be used to avoid worry, trouble, accidents, etc. Not a good day for matters of machinery, mines, land, property or produce. A slightly good aspect of the Sun exists and also of Jupiter, which should make it possible to proceed in all general affairs of ordinary import by steady, careful effort.

Saturday, 5th—Moon $18^{\circ} 37'$ in Capricorn. After 5:51 A. M. the planetary vibrations are of excellent nature, producing chemical compounds and cellular ac-

tivity in the body which express as constructive activity, causing practical application and aggressive enterprise of satisfactory character. Attend to old business, especially concerning land, property, produce, mines, machinery, or animals. Deal with contractors, carpenters, masons, machinists, soldiers, miners, publishers, or public officers. Very good aspects for taking chiropractic or osteopathic treatments and out-of-door exercises. A child born on this day will rise to honors through merit of inherent abilities.

Sunday, 6th—Moon enters Aquarius at 2:59 A. M. Sun $17^{\circ} 10'$ in Aquarius. Very good for all usual Sunday occupations until 6:52 P. M., then somewhat adverse for dealings with the opposite sex, occult, psychic, and social affairs. Tends to deplete vitality, to affronts, offense or controversy. Sudden decisions or radical changes had best be avoided.

First Quarter Begins on 7th at 4:37 P. M. New Moon.

Monday, 7th—Moon $12^{\circ} 25'$ in Aquarius. The principal aspects of Moon conjunction Sun, Moon parallel Mercury and Uranus tend to nervousness, high tension and excessive mental activity. If these tendencies can be controlled, the force can be used for progressive studies, writing letters, articles, plays, or lectures; for dealings with authors, publishers, book concerns, inventors, electricians and railroad or auto people. Favorable for invention, revising, renovating, changing things about. Care should be exercised in dealings with the opposite sex and going to extremes of any sort avoided. Be moderate but alert and observative, and learn something new or useful.

Tuesday, 8th—Moon enters Pisces at 3:04 P. M. A fairly good day for all general affairs. Finish up old business, visit hospitals, libraries, churches, universities, etc. Inclines to interest in the old, curious, unique, orig-

inal, inventions, research and adventure. Avoid extremes or over-enthusiasm; use caution in motoring or in using explosives, gas, or liquids. Favors dreams and intuitive impressions. Deal with professional people.

Wednesday, 9th—Moon $6^{\circ} 32'$ in Pisces. Fairly good for business of ordinary importance, correspondence, domestic affairs, amusements, or matters of land, planting, trimming, etc. Read, study, practice art, music, games. Good for social affairs in evening, but be moderate in eating.

Thursday, 10th—Moon $18^{\circ} 45'$ in Pisces. Several adverse aspects prevail which tend to sensations of irritation, fear, depression, hopelessness, regret, discontent and complaint, but don't allow these to manifest as such—transmute the forces, refine them; look up, not down; look ahead, not back. Friday, 11th—Moon enters Aries at 1:51 A. M. With due regard for the proprieties and conventionalities in business and social matters, by acting and speaking in as refined a manner as possible, by being gentle in the approach of every situation, one may be enabled to proceed without the difficulties which might otherwise ensue as the result of some mixed aspects operating today. The best part of day is after 4:50 P. M., thence good for dealings with ladies, artists, musicians, tailors, psychics, writers, publishers, teachers; also excellent for social functions. **INFLUENCE OF THE NEW MOON
Between February 7th and March 9th**

According to Astrology

The new moon which occurs on February 7th at 7:29 P. M., Washington, D. C., mean time, is coincident with the rising of the Sign Virgo, wherein is posited

Jupiter and Saturn, both "retrograde," which is similar to their positions at time of Sun's Ingress at Winter Solstice on December 21st, 1920. The "retrograde" positions indicate a change in conditions, downward trend of prices, let up of feverish manufacturing and labor activity, it could be termed a slacking up of business. As Mars has just (Feb. 5th) passed the opposition of Saturn it too indicates some release from the stress of the times or subsiding of excitement; a wave of crime and general turbulence diminishing.

Uranus and Mercury conjoined near the cusp of 7th house denotes danger of sudden and unexpected breaks with foreign powers, labor disputes, and considerable sickness, as they have still much influence in the 6th house, wherein the lunation takes place, causing a prevalence of the "grip" or other physical disorders having for their origin improper distribution of the fluids and gases of the body. Venus or 8th cusp, in Aries, its "detriment" denotes high mortality.

Jupiter and Saturn represent the conflict of two forces, each seeking dominance; Saturn represents those who have large stocks accumulated at high prices who are trying to keep prices up until they unload; Jupiter represents those who would return conditions to reasonable or normal status. While the other planetary indications produce so much strife and danger of war that it puts things into a state of uncertainty which is not at all beneficial nor conducive to peace, progress, prosperity and harmony. Yet, in spite of it all, there are great opportunities for advancement by those fearless enough not to be deterred by seeming discord.



METABOLISM

Webster's Dictionary: "Metabolism—The act or process by which living tissues or cells take up and convert into their own proper substance the nutritive material brought to them by the blood, or by which they transform their cell protoplasm into simpler substances, which are fitted either for excretion or for some special purpose, as in the manufacture of the digestive ferments. Hence, metabolism may be either constructive (anabolism) or destructive (katabolism)."

In Astrology metabolism or bodily processes are understood to receive their direction from planetary vibrations, the influence of some planets and aspects being constructive and others destructive, both operations being necessary to well-being. The benign planets direct anabolism, or constructive process; the malign planets and aspects affecting katabolism, or destructive process.

For instance, Saturn is commonly symbolized as the "Reaper"—an old man bearing a scythe—usually thought to indicate death, but in reality signifying the demise, decay and dissolution of old worn-out tissue which must be excreted. In this we see that the office of Saturn is just as beneficial as that of any planet; without the influence of Saturn the human system would soon become congested with non-functioning matter.



ASTRO-METABOLISM

The human body possesses innumerable sensory nerves, each of which has an "end-organ," whose office is to receive stimulus from without, transmit the vibra-

tion to "nerve centers," where in turn it is forwarded by means of the "sympathetic system" to those organs (and particularly to the brain organ) which are responsive to particular incoming stimulus, causing chemical changes to take place which give rise to sensation; sensation produces thoughts in kind; thoughts determine acts; acts determine environment.

Before one is conscious of a sensation a chemical change has taken place, a stimulating vibration has been received which gave the chemical situation an urge and a direction, according to the character of the vibration. The vibrations of Mars are positive, exciting, inflammatory; those of Venus are soothing, pacifying, cheering. The vibrations of each planet having their own particular influence.

The working of the mind (the thoughts) is mostly the result of internal changes due to external causes and particularly due to Solar, Lunar and Planetary vibrations.

One of the greatest of modern-day scientists has said: "Life is a constant internal adjustment to external environment." A careful study of planetary influences as indicated by Astrology, proves that ponderous statement a fact. When Jupiter is adversely aspected certain unfavorable chemical conditions affect the functioning of the liver and the organs of calculation in the brain, with the result that he misjudges and makes erroneous decisions and futile attempts; failing to succeed from his own vain efforts he may be tempted to decamp with the cash of the bank or the funds of an employer.

And so the student sees in the birth chart, in the recurring planetary positions, and in the acts of an individual, correspondences which inspire him to further research until at last he is enabled to utilize the knowledge gleaned in the every-day affairs of life. Knowing something of the nature of planetary laws, he aims to work in conscious harmony with auspicious indications and to transmute, by aspiring effort of will, those tendencies which, if followed heedlessly, would lead to distress.

The wonders of Astrology have not half been revealed—great fields of inquiry yet remain unexplored to try the mettle of aspiring minds. But in the thousands of

PLANETARY METEOROLOGY

Lincoln, Calif, Nov. 18, 1920, (7 P. M.)

Editor Llewellyn George.

Dear Friend: We gladly answer your query of the 12th inst., as to "length and severity" of the winter beginning for the benefit of Bulletinsa readers in general. We append the following long range forecast of the weather in a general way from date, to March, 1921, as affecting this coast, all based upon our past experience and study of "Astro Meteorology."

During the past summer and fall months, we gave out here from time to time warnings, of a winter coming **THAT WOULD ECLIPSE ALL OF THE PAST SIX**, due to the approaching equinoxial transits of both Jupiter and Saturn. That the chief disturbances would not begin until after the close of a Mars-period. That latter period would differ from that of last December and January, in that it would not be so dry. Latter forecast remarkably fulfilled in that this section was visited by a number of very heavy thunder-storms, a decided Jupiter influence, in evidence always while the latter is moving to the equinoxial point.

We have just passed a Venus-Saturn, disturbance the same centering on the 11th inst., since then the meteorological conditions have become denser with the working up of the next storm due to a sesquiquadrature of the Sun's transit with the position of Jupiter, as we write these lines latter disturbance is causing a torren-tial downpour all over northern California. As the season advances most all strong aspects of the Moon with Jupiter, or Saturn, will be sufficient to cause showers between storm periods. We stated previously here that after the fall election, showers between storms would

become more frequent, but that as long as Jupiter, remained "forward" in motion temperatures generally not severe, excepting a time about Dec. 16th, this favoring the growth of grass and in this way the—stockmen, until Jupiter and Saturn, retrograde in motion beginning on January 4th, 1921.

For month of December, we shall mention two very important aspects to illustrate the principles of Meteorology, first of these centering on December 10th with the Sun—IN—square aspect with Jupiter, this indicating the next torrential downpour, followed by the Sun's square with Saturn, centering on the 16th, the latter aspect indicated to be most severe in cold rains, heavy south wind, heavy snowfall in the Sierras, temporary low temperatures at this time. Again pronounced disturbance is an indication for the 28th with Mercury square Saturn, the Moon's transit semisquare Saturn and Jupiter, and Venus parallel Neptune.

"Bulletina" readers will remember our former statement to the effect that, "when superior planets cross the equinoxial, or solstitial points storms on this coast sweep as far south as Los Angeles." So from January 4th and throughout February and part of March, much severe-biting-cold-weather is indicated for this coast also periods of modification. At times heavy rainfall and flood condition in lower altitudes, also heavy snowfall in the Sierras. Localized flurries of snow is another indication these appearing at very low altitudes, or on the floor of both Sacramento and San Joaquin Valleys, especially between Jan. 3d and 7th, 1921.

Important dates for month of January are shown for the 3d, 4th, 6th, 7th, 10th, 14, 17, 18, 26th, to practically Feb. the 1st. This last period mentioned indicates much rain, heavy fall in the Sierras, cyclonic south and southeast winds, this month ending coincident with Sun parallel Mercury, the latter opposition Neptune, Mars parallel Jupiter, centering on last named date. Venus

opposition Saturn, Mars opposition Jupiter on the 28th. Sun, sesquad. Saturn on the 29th—Mars parallel Saturn on the 31st, and decidedly important Sun's transit in opposition and parallel with Neptune on Feb. 1st. We estimate that the above storm will be one LONG REMEMBERED.

Another storm follows up this one indicated by the opposition of Mars with Saturn centering on February 5th. Other disturbance for February are shown for the 10th, 13th, 14th, 17th, 20th, 23d, 24th and 25th.

Three important disturbances are indications for the first half of March with the Sun opposition Jupiter, on the 5th, Sun parallel Mars and Saturn, on the 6th and 7th Sun opposition Saturn, with Mercury parallel Jupiter on the 12th of March. Latter mentioned storms are likely to break with equinoxial fury. Concluding for the present we extend hearty greetings and a Happy New Year, not only to the Editor, but also to all the Bulletin readers.

To the Editor: We notice with pleasure in your favor of Dec. 12th that you had a good view of Mt. Lassen, on your trip down through the state, which reminded us of the April issue of the "Bulletin" 1917, in which we gave an extensive article in regard to this volcano, stating in said article that the volcano would not subside until after 1920. Mt. Lassen has spouted smoke at times ever since 1917. Staged a big eruption Monday, September 6th, 1920, at 4:30 P. M. far exceeding any in the last two years in volume and altitude, smoke and ashes ascending to a height of 10,000 feet, taking on the cauliflower shape similar to the eruptions of 1914 and 1915. Last eruption reported took place October 23d of this year, lasting from 7 a. m. to 5 P. M. this blowout came from an eastern fissure of said peak. Scoffers of astrology please take notice.

ANSWERS TO CORRESPONDENTS

By The Editor.

Quest.—I was born at 6 p. m. in Nebraska; what was my “rising” sign? Have been told that Tuesday was my “lucky” day, but have not found it particularly so.
—M. E. R.

Ans.—As you do not give date of birth we cannot say what sign rises at 6 p. m. Suggest that you consult chapter in “Planetary Daily Guide For All,” entitled, “Instructions for Finding Signs Ascending at Birth Time.”

People sometimes think that the day of the week on which birth occurred will be a “lucky” day; or, the day of the week ruled by the planet which rules the sign of the zodiac in which they were born. But if one certain day is likely to be more “lucky” than another it will be that day ruled by the planet most fortunately configured in the natal horoscope. The days of the week are named after planets, thus: Sunday, Sun; Monday, Moon; Tuesday, Mars; Wednesday, Mercury; Thursday, Jupiter; Friday, Venus; Saturday, Saturn. As Uranus and Neptune are the octaves of Mercury and Venus, respectively, in such matters as this they are assigned Uranus to Wednesday, Neptune to Friday. In Astrology it is quickly seen that “lucky” days do not happen by chance—in fact there is no “chance”; there is well regulated, duly timed operation of nature. Fruitful (lucky) days are the result of fruitful planetary aspects. Students can easily learn how to pick out, in advance, the days which will be most beneficent by examination of their natal chart compared with current (transit) movements of the planets. In a forthcoming issue of the “Bulletina” an example of the method will be given. In the absence

of a chart a great deal of information can be derived about the quality of days by reading the daily indications for each month as given in the "Bulletina."



Quest.—I wish to transact some important business; your "Planetary Daily Guide For All" 1920, gives Dec. 13 as one of my best days; it also shows that the Moon enters my Sign on some day at 2:39 p. m. Pacific Time. Will it be more auspicious to wait until after the time Moon enters my Sign Aquarius on Dec. 13th?—P. J. M.

Ans.—Whether or not the Moon's influence would be more benefic when entering your Sign is a matter which would have to be decided by examining your birth horoscope to see what "aspects," if any, it made at that point. Because few people are able to do this, the "Planetary Daily Guide" gives the dates when the different planets will be aspected which is an important factor, that requires merely a glance in the book to reveal. As you were born on Feb. 10, 1886, the Sun was 21 in Aquarius, which is not far enough along in the Sign for the Moon to be "Combust" with it on Dec. 13, 1920; on which date it will form a benign trine aspect to the place of Jupiter and Uranus at your birth (5° and 7° Libra). Reference to the "Bulletina" shows that Dec. 13, 1920, is a good day generally. Summary: The "Guide" shows Dec. 13, 1920, favorable to your ruling planet Uranus; the "Astrological Bulletina" gives that day as good generally; reference to an ephemeris for your birth day shows Moon on Dec. 13, 1920, forming a good trine to Jupiter and Saturn at your birth. Now if your birth chart indicates that you can have success in the matter you are undertaking, you are indeed most likely to be very successful in it on Dec. 13, 1920.

If your birth chart is unfavorable for the matter you will at least avoid the loss and trouble you would otherwise have, by thus choosing a day of benign influences.

AN ANSWER TO MRS. W. H. V.

So far as I am aware there is no particular or set standard of ethical rules pertaining among Astrologers more than among those of any other of the educational professions. I believe that the highest standard of conduct, in this or any line, is simply to be kind, considerate, and just in criticism—if any. Doing these things, each in his own way, cannot fail to add to the dignity and value of the Cause.

If I have failed to grasp your inquiry as intended, and therefore failed to give you desired information, I might be able to say more, which might be of service, and in such case, if you care to, write your question again in different form.



Quest.—Please tell when are best periods to cultivate will power, and to take physical exercises. Am working now but am going to quit and build myself up mentally, spiritually and physically.—I. P.

Ans.—Mars governs will-power, Mercury rules ordinary studies; Jupiter rules higher or collegiate studies; Saturn determines much of your physical state; the life-giving Sun has much to do with the higher and spiritual aspirations. Exercises had best be performed regularly every morning, but on the days when Mars is well aspected (see Planetary Daily Guide) special or more strenuous work may be undertaken. A little study every day is very beneficial, but special lessons may be taken on the days when Mercury is well aspected. On the days when Jupiter is benign go to hear lecturers on more intricate subjects. On the days when Saturn is adversely aspected it would be well to pay more than the usual attention to the rules of health, being espe-

cially careful not to over-exercise or otherwise become exhausted. When the Sun is well aspected act on your highest impulses in generosity, kindness, compassion, helpfulness to others less fortunate than yourself. It is not necessary to quit your work to do these things—contact with your fellow men, and the necessity of meeting business problems, if met cheerfully, are excellent means for aiding an all around development and brings opportunity for performing daily acts of useful service. Kindness and consideration for others are excellent stepping-stones for the unfoldment of admirable qualities—both in yourself and the other fellow.

Like Astrology, this subject appeals to the highest type of intelligence, so we find among its devotees—ministers, doctors, dentists, lawyers, jewelers, etc.

There is now on foot a combined great wave of effort to STOP EXPOSING, a most reprehensible practice, for when the secret is out the charm is gone so various magical societies are busy with this vital question including the N. C. A., The S. A. M., the P. A. L. M., etc.
