



After 3.08 P. M. be cautious regarding machinery, and excess in matter of pleasure.

New Moon. First Quarter Begins on 5th at 5.37 A. M.

INFLUENCE OF THE NEW MOON

THE last few degrees of the sign Leo are rising on eastern horizon at the time of New Moon, July 5th, 8.28 A. M., Washington, D. C., mean time. The sun and Moon are conjoined in the eleventh "Mansion" of a chart made for that time; they have just passed Mars, are near Mercury, and forming sextiles to Jupiter and

BACON MYSTERY CLEARS.

CIPHER CODE USED BY ANCIENT SCIENTIST IS EXPLAINED TO SURGEONS

Philadelphia, April 20.—The first public explanation of the key discovered to the cipher code used by Roger Bacon, the thirteenth-century philosopher, which has revealed Bacon knew of the telescope, microscope and scientific facts hitherto supposed to have been unknown until centuries later, was made tonight before the College of Physicians and Surgeons.



Addresses were made by W. M. Voynich of London, owner of the Roger Bacon manuscript in which the key to the code was found, Prof. Romaine Newhold of the University of Pennsylvania, who is working on the cipher, and Prof. C. S. McClug who is assisting Prof. Newhold.

"At present it is only possible to conjecture at the extent and importance of the discoveries," said Prof. Newhold, " for the art of reading the cipher is yet in its early stages and it is not certain that the whole manuscript can be read.

The manuscript falls in four divisions he continued, "dealing with plants, the heavenly bodies, the generation of animal life and preparation of drugs. The common link connecting all four is probably Bacon's interest in the prolongation of human life."

"Plants are discussed because of their medicinal properties; stars because they determine a man's character at his birth and influence him throughout life; embryology because of the bearing on later life of all factors influencing conception, and pharmacology because drugs are essential to the sure of disease."

From the 1st to 6th of July. We judge July to be very good thruout as there are seven sextiles for this month exhibited among the planets, but from 24th to

29th some important change is shown as Venus moves to square of Saturn on the 29th, with Sun semi-square the latter on the 30th, indicating a decided change to COLDER. Mercury sextile Jupiter on the 31st is some offset.

Minor disturbances are shown for August, on the 4-6-10-11-12-16-18. Centering about the 25th dense fog conditions are an indication for some sections of the Pacific seas-coast-line, with Mars conjunction Neptune. Other disturbances for the 27th, 28th, also for the 31st, with Sun opposition Uranus, and Mars parallel Neptune.

September indications are decidedly important for 1921, as Jupiter passes the conjunction of Saturn on September 10th. Said conjunction being termed "The Great Mutation," Jupiter crossing the equinoxial point on September 25th, so we judge—early rainfall—that same will be noticeable on September 2nd and 6th. Quite pronounced by the 10-12-13-15-16 in warm rains, but the latter becoming torrential in nature from the 19th on to 23rd.

Figure for Sun's entry into sign Libra, September 23rd, 6:20 a. m. (P. S. T.) shows Sun semi-square Neptune, Mercury patallel, also in strong aspect with Uranus, also opposition of Mars with Uranus. Altogether the above figure indicates COLDER AND TEMPESTUOUS CONDITIONS TO FOLLOW, quite noticeable about the 29th, with Sun parallel Saturn also.

Followed on October 1st with Mars parallel Uranus and Venus, ruler of the above figure, in opposition and parallel Uranus. From September 23rd and on we judge that Saturn and Neptune are the principal factors in succeeding weather change that there will be a PHENOMENAL CHANGE TO COLD, while Sat-



urn is crossing the equinox, this taking place on October 7th, with the Moon square Saturn late evening of the 6th and early morning of the 7th. Very cold, with cold rains or snow, in many parts of the coast between the 10th and 16th.

In our study of this weather problem for this coast, we conclude by stating that after Jupiter and Saturn equinoxial excitement has subsided, beginning practically about January of 1922, there is indicated a temporary return to dryer conditions, lasting thruout part of 1923, during which the Moon's Nodal Influence, STILL SOUTH, will be felt. When the "Node" crosses over to North Latitude, late 1923 there will be a more regular rain fall for the nine years to follow, NO MORE PROLONGED DROUGTH CONDITIONS within the years as mentioned.

Note:—For the benefit of those who are not familiar with our methods, shall state that all dates given—mark—central—on a storm center all nature seems AT REST, often a very beautiful day and very deceiving to the many who are not familiar with the natural law governing—storms, and weather change.

TWO-MILLION-MILE TAIL OF PONS-WINNECKE COMET WILL SIDE-SWEEP OLD MOTHER EARTH THIS MONTH

Spectacular Wanderer Traveling Toward This Globe at Rate of 72,0000 Miles an Hour, but Scientists Say No Damage Will Result From Appendage's Contact With This Planet—Meteorites Will Shower Skies and Be Burned Out.

BRIDES and poets, as a general rule, are permitted to mononoplize the month of June. This year, however, the newlyweds and the verse smiths will be obliged to share their fascinating June-time with a whizzing comet which drags a tail more than two million miles in length.

This comet is known to astronomers as the Pons-Winnecke. The latter name is pronounced "Vinnicke." It was named in honor of two celebrated astronomers. Pons was a Frenchman and Winnecke a German. The former, who was known in his day as the greater "comet hunter," discovered the Pons-Winnecke on June 12, 1819. From that time until 1858 it was not observed by any of the world's astronomers. During the latter year Winnecke, the German, observed a comet and for a time thought that he had found an entirely new one. He was shortly convinced that it was merely a return of the Pons comet. Since that time it has always been referred to as the Pons-Winnecke.

This elongated bird of the distant heavens, shaped something like an eel or snake, is an amazingly swift flyer. It is traveling toward the United States at a

speed of 72,000 miles per hour, or 1,728,000 miles per day. By June 27 it will reach a point in the skies about two million miles from the earth. This will be sufficiently close for the tail to side-swipe old mother earth and show whether it is made of harmless material or damaging stuff. For several days prior to June 27 the brilliant tail will be observable from all parts of the country.

It is rather difficult to conceive of anything two million miles in length. If that two-million-mile tail were attached to a live serpent of some kind, capable of controlling it in any desired fashion, it could easily be looped around the equatorial section of the earth 80 times. If the fair maid who is supposed to inhabit the moon should happen to take a fancy to the Pons-Winnecke comet tail and want to decorate her country, she would have enough streamers reaching all the way to the earth and enough left over to make a big bow hair ribbon for herself.

When Asaph Hall, professor of mathematics of the United States naval observatory, Washington, was asked whether any serious consequences were liable to result from the swishings of the Pons-Winnecke's tail against the bosom of the earth, he laughed heartily and said: "No, nothing serious is going to happen. The result of the contact will merely be aspectacular shower of meteorites in the skies. They will travel so swiftly through space that they will doubtless be entirely burned out before reaching this planet. This vivid meteor shower, as a matter of fact, will be as harmless as the 'sparklers' used by little boys and girls on the Fourth of July."

This view of Prof. Hall is concurred in by that eminent English scientist, George F. Chambers, who says: "The idea of any danger happening to our planet, or to any other planet, from the advent of any of these

wandering strangers may be dismissed once and for all, especially as we now know that the earth passed bodily through the tail of the great comet of 1861 during June of that year."

This calm and serene view of comets has not always prevailed. In past years the appearance of a comet in any section of the world was invariably looked upon as an omen of bad luck and possible destruction of the earth. The pessimistic joy-killers of the world have never overlooked an opportunity to link up any natural catastrophe with the coming or going of a comet. Here is their record of unfortunate occurrences covering a period from the year A. D. 14 down to the world war, which they attribute to comets:

- A. D. 14—A comet preceded the death of Augustus, the first emperor of Rome. Earthquake in Italy.
- 55—Suicide of Pontius Pilate, the judge who condemned Christ.
- 68—Halley's comet. Suicide of Nero, persecutor of Christians. Siege of Jerusalem.
- , 73—A comet shone 180 days over Cypress. Earthquake in Cypress, in which 10,000 persons perished.
- 79—Death of Emperor Vespasian, who began the siege of Jerusalem. The Roman historians, Dion Cassius and Suetonius, relate that Vespasian, when taken sick, heard his astrologers discussing in a low tone of voice the comet, which was then visible, which, they said, predicted his death. The emperor roused angrily and said: "This hairy star is not meant for me. It must be meant for my enemy, the king of the Parthians, for he is hairy, while I am bald." On the following night Vespasian died in great pain, and the comet was seen no more. Shortly after Vespasian's death follow-

ed the fierce eruption of Mount Vesuvius, November 1, which destroyed the two flourishing cities of Herculaneum and Pompeii.

- 1002—A comet over England and Scandinavia. Massacre of all Danes in England by King Ethelred. 1066—Halley's comet. It appeared in May at Easter time and shone for 40 nights, waxing and waning with the moon. William the Conqueror haled it as an omen of destruction to Harold of England just before the battle of Hastings.
- 1148-9—Second crusade. Utter destruction of whole army of French and German crusaders.
- 1200—Comet recorded by Hal Ben Rodoan, an Arab astronomer, over North Africa. Bloody revolt of Arab warriors in Morocco
- 1212—Lance-shaped comet shining over western Europe for 18 nights. The children's crusade. sands of German and French boy crusaders perished or were sold into slavery. Bloody invasion of Tartar hordes into Russia and Poland.
- 1223—Preaching of fifth crusade. Outbreak of "Guelph and Ghibelline" war between Emperor Frederick II of Germany and Pope Gregory IX.
- 1264—Very bright comet observed shining all over Europe for three months. Pope Urban IV died on the night of the comet's disappearance.
- 1298—Because of the appearance of a comet over middle Germany there were riots in Nuremberg and other neighboring cities, followed by a general massacre of the Jews in those cities.
- 1300—A brilliant preceded the jubliee of Pope Boniface VIII. The pope interpreted the comet as a happy omen, but because of the popular dread of the comet



there were riots and bloodshed in Rome and elsewhere in Italy. The chroniclers of the times pointed out the significant fact that shortly after his jubilee Pope Boniface was made a prisoner by King Philip of France, causing him to die of rage.

- 1305—A comet "of horrible aspect" burning all through passion week preceded the outbreak of the terrible black plague which swept from the orient all over Europe and Asia.
- 1333—Chinese and Arab astronomers record a bright comet over China, Turkestan and Persia. Birth of Tamerlane, the "scourage of the nations," at Samarkand, in Turkestan.
- 1347—A comet precedes the "black death," a terrible pestilence, followed by famine all over the world. One-fourth of all the people of Europe died. Fifteen million deaths in China—twenty-five million in Europe.
- 1363—A comet of immense size shone for three months over northern Europe. Pestilence and famine in England, Poland and Russia.
- 1811-12—This huge comet was one of the most famous of modern times. It was first seen in France on March 26, 1811, and was last observed over southern Russia on August 17, 1812—an appearance of 17 months, the longest on record. For a while it had two tails, then only one. The length of this tail was estimated as 100,000,000 miles. It was called "Napoleon's comet." Under its luster Napoleon gathered his "grand armee," the greatest army assembled in Europe since Xerxes, and invaded Russia. Wars were fought at the same time in Portugal and Spain, where the British stormed Ciudad Rodrigo and Badajos; and in America, where Harrison's victory over the Indians under Tecumseh at Tippecanoe, and the sea-fight between the Pre-

sident and Little Belt ushered in the war of 1812. In Egypt the comet was taken as an omen of the bloody massacre of the Mamelukes perpetrated at Cairo.

1821—"Napoleon's comet." Seen one night only over France and over St. Helena the night before the death of Napoleon at St. Helena.

1835-6—Halley's comet. Immediately after the comet became generally visible in the old world the bubonic plague, known of old as the "black death," broke out in Egypt. In the city of Alexandria alone 9,000 people died in one day. By the Moslems this calamity was generally attributed to the evil influence of the comet.

In America the comet became visible to the naked eye only late in the year. Then, on its approach to the sun, it was lost to view and passed over to the southern hemisphere, where is was next observed by Sir John Herschel in South Africa.

Shortly after its brief blaze over North America the great "New York fire" laid waste the entire business section of the biggest city in the new world. All the commercial centers of the city, including the richest firms and largest commercial warehouses, were laid in ashes. The fire raged through days and nights. In all, 530 houses burned down and \$18,000,000 of property was consumed. Owing to the intense cold, the sufferings of the homeless were pitiable.

In Florida, at the same time, Osceola, the chieftain of the Seminole Indians, called upon the comet as a signal for war against the whites. The Indians called the comet "Big Knife in the Sky."

The war began with a bloody massacre of American soldiers under General Wiley Thompson at Fort King. All were slaughtered. Osceola scalped General Thompson with his own hands. On the same day Major Dade



of the United States army, who was leading a relief expedition into Florida from Tampa Bay, was ambushed by the Indians near Wahoo Swamp and massacred with his men. Of the whole expedition only four men escaped death.

With the passing of the comet to the southern hemisphere bloody wars broke out one after another in Mexico, Cuba, Central America, Ecuador, Bolivia, Peru and Argentina. All those countries were in a welter of blood.

At the same time the American settlers of Texas declared themselves independent and made open war on Mexico. The war began with the battle of Gonzales, in which 500 American frontiermen fought and defeated over a thousand Mexican soldiers. This was followed by other fierce fights at Goliad and Bexar.

Next came the bloody massacre of the Alamo, when all of Bowie's and Crokett's American followers were killed in an all-night fight. Out of 200 Americans every man fell at his post. This was the deed of blood on which Joaquin Miller wrote his stirring "Ballad of the Alamo."

One month before the final disappearance of the comet the Texas war came to an end with the bloody battle of San Jacinto, when Sam Houston, with 800 American frontiermen, defeated 1500 Mexicans and made a prisoner of President Santa Ana of Mexico.

When the comet had passed to the southern hemisphere it was seen at its brightest in South Africa. The pious Boers of Cape Colony understood it to be a sign from heaven and forthwith set out on their great trek across the Orange and Vaal Rivers, where they founded the Orange Free State and Transvaal republic.

Thus the comet was the signal for the first blood



drawn in the long fight between the British and Boers.

1843—Another famous comet seen all over the world during the spring of that year. Especially brilliant in the southern hemisphere and in India. War in India on the part of the British against Afghanistan, Beluchistan, Scinde and against the Sikhs.

1848—Encke's famous periodic comet. Bloody revolutionary risings and civil wars in France, Hungary, Bohemia, Austria, Germany, Italy and Poland.

1858-59—Donati's comet. This comet, which appeared to be charging straight down from the zenith and had a curved tail, was observed from June, 1858, to April, 1859. It was seen at its brightest in the south, in Italy, Mexico and in the far east. While it shone over the far east there were bloody wars between the British and the risen people of India; between the British and the Chinese, who objected to having opium thrust upon them; while Japan was in the throes of revolutoin and civil war. In Mexico the standard of revolt against the clericals was raised by Juarez, thus plunging Mexico into civil war and war with France. mediately after the disappearance of the comet war broke out in Italy between the French and Italians on one side and the Austrians on the other, ending in the bloody battle of Solferino.

1861—"First civil war comet." The brightest comet of the 19th century. Sir John Herschel, the English astronomer, said of this comet: "It far exceeded in brightness any I have before observed, those of 1811 and the recent splendid one of 1858 not excepted."

The comet was first seen by a layman and appeared at its brightest during the summer months in North America. Its coming was heralded as meaning a great civil war.

1862—"Second civil war comet." Another comet of very peculiar appearance, with jets of flame flaring from its head, showed itself during the summer months in North America. The civil war was then at its height. The coming of the comet was taken to herald the bloody battles of Shiloh, Williamsburg, Seven Days, Seven Pines, Cedar Mountain and Antietam, all fought that year after the comet's disappearance

1877—Coggia's comet. This comet was seen at its brightest over southern France and Spain during the summer months of that year. Spain was then in the throes of the bloody Carlist war.

1881—Garfield's comet. The comet showed itself for a few nights only in March during the week following President Garfield's inauguration. It was observed also in Russia. On March 13 Emperor Alexander II of Russia was assassinated with a bomb. Three months later President Garfield was assassinated in Washington.

1882—Comet of Tel-el-Kebir. A comet with two tails was seen at its brightest over Egypt during the first two weeks of September. Egypt was then in the midst of Arabia Pasha's uprising against the British. On September 18, when the comet was last seen, Arabi Pasha was overthrown by General Wolseley in the bloody battle of Tel-el-Kebir.

1906—San Francisco comet. A comet discovered by Ross on March 17, remaining visible for one month. Observed from the Lick observatory in California. On April 17 came the California earthquake and burning of San Francisco.

1908—Morehouse's comet. Visible for more than a month, during the autumn. In Italy it was interpreted afterward as an omen foreboding the Messina earthquake late in the year.

ANENT THE COMET

IN 1910, when the earth was to pass through the tail of Halley's Comet, predictions made by Astronomers (not Astrologers) as to the dire results of damage which might occur, caused world-wide anxiety and fear. The "Bulletina" assured its readers that no ASTRO-LOGICAL configurations near that date showed any catasrophy. Nor was there any need for alarm. Slight changes in atmospheric conditions, noticable only to those who were psychic enough to perseive them, is all that transpired at that time. However, the elements which the comet introduced to our system soon bred war and pestilence. The Comet made its appearance in Aries, the Sign which rules England; King Edward died soon afterward. The Comet formed a square adverse aspect to Neptune which was located in Cancer, ruling China; the Chinese dynasty was overthrown with much bloodshed. Events in Servia occured which led to the assassination of Prince Rudalph of Austria which brought on the great European war. During the war pestilence swept the world, visiting America in 1918, as indicated by the total eclipse of June 8th, as described in "How Planets Affect People."

Many of our readers will recall a more recent excitement when an Astronomer (NOT an Astrologer, as erroniously stated by a prominent New York occult monthly magazine) predicted a world cataclysm to



take place December 17, 1919, because of a supposed combination of planets which would affect the earth and the Sun. So much notoriety was given the prediction that some people died of fright, others committed suicide, several went insane, many became ill through worry and fear. The "Bulletina" told its readers in Vol. 12, No. 134, "Not to be alarmed," that the planets mentioned were not in orb of influence at the time predicted and that no Astrological evidence indicated any such trouble. None occured.

The Pons-Winnecke Comet is now being commented upon by Astronomers; the newspapers will probably feature it; a great deal of unnecessary excitement is likely to prevail; but there are no ASTROLOGICAL indications to show any physical damage to the earth by its near approach.

This Comet is a familiar visitor; (its period is about three years and one-third, the feature which should excite interest at this visit is owing to the relative periods of the earth, and the Comet, its nearest approach to the earth has been gradually diminishing, until now its transit nearly coincides with our own position in orbit. Its nearest approach will be around June 27th, according to astronomical calculations.

This short period Comet (its period was erroneously given by N. Y. Times Cable in March-April Bulletina) was sighted by Professor Barnard of the Yerkes Observatory, Lake Geneva, Wisconsin on the morning of April 10th, in Right Ascension 15 hours, 58 minutes, which is equal to longitude Scorpio 21 degrees, with Declination 37° 15' North. It is travelling in a southeasterly direction toward Sagittarius, into which Zodical Sign it cuts before passing out of our range.

Between June 20 and July 20 will be one of the best periods in this year, from an Astrological standpoint, as



there will occur more benign major aspects and less malefic aspects during that time than is usual. Hence, the transit of the Comet in this period is NOT a herald of disasterous collision. There is no danger that the Comet will consume or destroy the earth.

The Pons-Winnecke Comet is said to belong to the system of Jupiter, who possesses four moons and a coterie of small comets.

Comets appearing in "fixed" signs, such as Scorpio usually portend earthquakes, dries up olives and fruits and makes the air contagent with fevers and pestilence. In Sagittarius, thefts, rapines, destruction of horses.

The countries said to be ruled by Scorpio are: Algeria, Borbary, Bavarid, Cappodocia, Judea, Jutland, Morocco, Norway, N. Syria, Transvaal, Catalonia, Queenslands. Towns and Cities: Fez, valentia, Frankfort on Oder, Dover, Liverpool, Messina, Worthing, E. Grimstead, New Orleans, Washington, D. C., Baltimore, Hull, Milwaukee, Cincinnati, St. Johns, Newfoundland, Halifax, Stockfort, Newcastle, Glossop.

Countries ruled by Sagittarius: Arabia, Australia, Felix, Cape Frnisterre, Dalmatia, Hungary, Moravia, Sclavonia, Spain, Tuscany, Madazascar.

Towns and cities: Avignon, Buda, Cologne, Narbonne, Rattenburg, Nottingham, Sheffield, Stuttgart, Sunderland, Taranto, Toledo, W. Bromwich, Bladford. Astrology has not yet recorded or classified all the countries and cities according to their ruling signs.

In the Bulletina of February 1920, Vol. 12, No. 136, was given a list of places ruled by all the Signs as far as known.

"If this map is correct the present transit of Jupiter over the radical Sun should benefit the government and expand business enterprise in your city. ever, Uranus transiting to opposition of the Sun and remaining in close proximity to this position throughout the latter part of 1922 is ominous of some reforms in the motion picture industry and also presages some elements of unrest among the industrial classes. fortunately, the coincidental transit of Jupiter through the ascendant will contribute to modify the Uranian influence then operating. The conjunction of Venus with Neptune is a salient feature of this chart, and being posited in the twelfth mansion, is a favorable indication for those whose interests are related to mysticism. The Moon, rising the midheaven opposes both Venus and Neptune, and squares Uranus which tenants the 9th. But, after all, these are related more to spiritual expression than to the material and external side of things, and adverse aspects usually indicate greater progress through striking out for new things as the result of difficult struggles. In connection with art, music, inspirational development along new thought lines, and for unique ideas Los Angeles should ultimately hold a world position. The transit of Jupiter over the conjoined Venus and Neptune this coming October should invite special interest as concerns the motion picture industry. Much of the oriental ideas will doubtless be expressed, and you may have observed that since Neptune entered Leo this oriental expression first manifested itself through the wierd syncopated music in the dance halls and is now finding way into our fashions. Like every planetary influence we first expressed the lower octave of the Neptune influence reflecting through the heart sign, but as this proceeds we shall aspire to a higher vibration and

Prohibition is playing its particular part in this regeneration of the American race, and as our material vehicles become better purified by the sacrifices endured for a time we shall become more fit instruments to attune ourselves to higher vibratory forces whereby we may be enabled to regenerate higher senses within us.

Of course we all understand, in some measure, that Neptune has but little sympathy for the material, and when expressed through matter excites the sensations and leads to chasing bubbles that may eventually burst and cause chaos and obsession. Some new order of teachings will probably then spring up which will furnish another element of attraction and add to the city's prestige. Uranus in the midheaven Los Angeles will always tend to something original and unique. Summed up, Los Angeles might be classed as the Orient of America. And eventually it will be the mystical center from which many of our future teachings will be received.

THE STARS INCLINE BUT DO NOT COMPEL By C. Tousey Taylor, Seattle, Wash.

Two Astrological magazines this month have articles denying the above statement and incline to the belief in foreordination. I once held to that belief and no one can blame an investigator of that grand and noble science for reaching that conclusion, unless he has first come into an understanding of what God is, and some of His immutable laws. As every manifestation depends entirely on thought—riches, poverty, success, failure, misery or happiness—then the question hinges on the one point of whether man can control his thoughts? If so then he is a free moral agent; if not then his life may be foreordained.

Gods laws are all fixed, unchangeable and eternal, but there is no law of God or man until thought has set it in motion. When one hundred and forty-four thousand of the twelve tribes, which we are, agree, the rest of the





VACCINATION AND ASTROLOGY

He died at the age of 19 (a Mars period) of smallpox (a Martial disease). The "directions" operating was Mars conjunction and parallel ascendant. He was vaccinated in infancy. Mars in the sign of the Bull (Taurus) and afflicted would show no help from that animal source.

In fact, he would have been better off without the lymph in his system; this is shown by Mars being tinctured with evil rays from Uranus and Saturn.

GREAT MEN AND ASTROLOGY

In a small work called "The Uses of Biography," by Edwin Paxton Hood, London, England, published in 1853, in chapter VII, the writer gives an account of the foibles and vices of great men, and on pages 116 and 117 we have the following sentences:

"Cardinal Richelieu, the minister of a great empire (France) believed in the calculation of nativities. Even Sir Isaac Newton gave credit to the idle nonsense of judicial astrology; he who first calculated the distances of the stars and revealed the laws of motion by which the Supreme Being organizes and keeps in their orbits unnumbered worlds he who had revealed the mysteries of the stars themselves. Dryden, Sir Isaac Newton's contemporary, believed in the same absurdity."

(Is it not strange that a man may excel in all the modern sciences, and even make wonderful discoveries in such as astronomy and mathematics, and be counted sane and sensible, and even a very learned man, but the moment he touches astrology, by some legerdemain, he is said instantly to become insane or a scoundrel? There is no doubt but Sir Isaac Newton was an excellent Astrologer, and even calculated his own and most of his friends' horoscopes. Cardinal Richelieu no doubt understood Astrology, but probably he employed eminent Astrologers to do the most of the calculations for him in his judicial Astrology, as had Queen Elizabeth.)

"It is published by William Congreve, an English actor, and the same was also published in the Encyclopaedia Britannica and a number of other publications, that John Dryden calculated his son Charles' horoscope, and the predictions were filled to the letter. notice the exact moment of the child's birth. In about a week after her confinement Mr. Dryden took the occasion to tell his wife that he had calculated the child's horoscope and observed with grief that the child was born in an evil hour. That Jupiter, Venus and the Sun were all under the earth, and the Lord of the ascendant was afflicted with a hateful square of Saturn and Mars. He went on to tell her that if he lives to arrive at his 8th birthday he will come near to a violent death, but if he escapes that, and I see but small hopes that he will, in his 23rd year he will again be under the same evil direction, and if he escapes that also, the 33rd and 34th years will, I fear There he was interrupted by the grief of Lady Dryden, who could no longer hear one calamity after another prophesied for her new-born son.

"When young Dryden arrived near his 8th year, it was arranged that Lady Dryden should spend the summer vacation with her Uncle Mourdant, and Mr. Dryden was invited to the country seat of Earl of Berkshire, his brother-in-law, to spend his vacation." (It appears from the account published that Dryden had two sons, John and Charles; it was arranged that each of them should take one of the boys. Lady Dryden wished her husband to take John, as she desired to have Charles with her, feeling that he would be safer under her maternal care than in his father's company.) "But Dryden insisted on taking Charles, and they parted in anger."

On the child's 8th birthday it was arranged by the Earl of Berkshire that his guests should go hunting, and Dryden, to keep the child out of mischief, set him a double lesson in Latin, with a strict injunction that he should not go out of the house. Charles was performing his duty in obedience to his father, but as ill-fate would have it, the stag made toward the house, and the noise, alarming the servants, they hastened out to see the sport. One of the servants took young Dryden

by the hand and led him out to see it also; when just as they came to the gate, the stag, being at bay with the dogs, made a bold push and leaped over the court wall, which was low and very old, and the dogs, following, threw down a part of the wall ten yards in length, under which Charles Dryden lay buried. He was immediately dug out, and after six weeks' languisling in a dangerous way, he recovered. In the 23rd year of his age Charles fell from the top of an old tower belonging to the Vatican at Rome, occasioned by a dizziness with which he was seized, the heat of the day being excessive. He again recovered, but was ever after in a languishing, sickly state. In the 33rd year of his age, being returned to England, he was unhappily drowned at Windsor. He had, with another gentleman, swam twice across the Thames, but returning a third time, it was supposed he was taken with a cramp, because he called out for help, though too late. The father's calculation proved but too prophetical."


