Note: The time used in the "Bulletina" is Pacific Standard time, unless otherwise stated.

Rocky Mountain Standard time is one hour in advance or later than Pacific time.

Central Standard time is 2 hours in advance.

Eastern Standard time is 3 hours advanced.

When it is noon, Pacific time, it is 1 P.M. Mountain time; 2 P.M. Central time; 3 P.M. Eastern time.

Persons living in Mountain, Central or Eastern time zones should add 1, 2, or 3 hours, respectively, to the times given in the "Bulletina."

When "Daylight Saving" time is used, add 1 more hour to the time given.

The Moon's position given on each day is its place at 4 A.M., Pacific time, which is the same as 5 A.M. Mountain; 6 A.M. Central; 7 A.M. Eastern time.

**T**HE 13th degree of Leo is ascending on eastern horizon at the moment when the Sun makes its ingress to the sign Capricorn. In a chart of the skies made for the moment of ingress, 8:06 p. m., December 21, Washington, D. C., the Sun is located in the 5th section; a position which directs special attention to affairs of pleasure, sports, gaming, courtship, children, schools, theatres, and speculation. The Sun bears a good aspect to Saturn and to the planet Neptune, indicating great amounts of money to be expended in matters related to the above mentioned, which helps improve

labor conditions somewhat. However, the Sun is afflicting Venus and Jupiter of the U. S. horoscope, denoting unfavorable news, rumors and reports concerning foreign financial affairs, which will cause excitement.

Neptune, Mars and Jupiter are in the section of the chart ruling financial affairs, and as they are mainly well aspected they indicate improving conditions through the expenditure of huge amounts for harbors, dams, waterways, construction, and industrial enterprises. Considerable controversy is apt to arise over naval affairs and foreign debts. Jupiter indicates the availability of "big" money for investment enterprises.

The Moon is in the third section of the chart in good aspect to Mars of the U. S. horoscope, indicating some secret agreements with foreign and also neighboring countries. But the Moon is in opposition to Uranus in this chart, indicating the breaking up or overthrow of previously made agreements or connections, which will result in much criticism, hostility and enmity; some of this will come through England, Japan and Russia.

Venus is in the fourth section of the chart, denoting improving domestic and employment conditions, considering the season of the year, but its opposition to Uranus of the U. S. horoscope indicates anxiety and hindrance due to unfavorable foreign reports and conditions.

Mercury is on the cusp of the 5th house of this chart in adverse aspect to Mars and Neptune, indicating exciting speculative changes influenced greatly by foreign affairs and by uncertainties and disturbances in Congress; in other words, by political conditions.

The position of Saturn in the 6th section shows that in matters of employment all is not yet as desirable as could be, as there will still be considerable lack of work. Yet, as Saturn has some good aspects in this chart, also with planets in the U. S. horoscope, it provides an undertone of steady, substantial, though slow, improvement in employment.

The position of Uranus in the 9th section tends to religious and scientific controversies as well as trouble over foreign affairs. It also denotes accidents and explosions at sea, mutinies, strikes, wrecks. Being in the "house of voyages" and opposed by the Moon in the "house of journeys," it indicates a period of unusual and numerous accidents in all means of travel. Its indications are more ominous because it is in adverse aspect to the place of Mars in the August eclipse chart, where Mars was in the house of public enemies.—L. G.

## ASTROCAUSE

### Monthly Business Outlook Indicated By The INFLUENCE OF THE NEW MOON Between Dec. 27, 1932 and Jan. 25, 1933.

According to Astrology.

**S**AGITTARIUS, the twentieth degree is rising on the eastern horizon at moment of New Moon, December 27, 6:15 a. m., Washington, D. C. The conjunction of the luminaries takes place in the ascendant of a chart made for this data, in the 5th degree of Capricorn. As the lights are in good aspect to Neptune and Mars it denotes many changes in the country, some improvement in employment and in matters of transportation, publication and postal affairs. It also indicates some improved foreign relations and benefit through science, invention and commerce; industry and medicine should benefit through important new discoveries; religion and philosophy also advancing. However, this New Moon takes place in opposition to the Sun and Jupiter and square to Saturn of the U. S. horoscope. This directs much attention to the con-



ditions of poverty and suffering, calling for strong efforts to alleviate it. It may also indicate considerable illness and higher mortality than usual for this period. It may also denote the passing of important personages connected with the government. The presence of Pluto on the 8th cusp of this chart also presages the sudden passing of some very prominent people.

Mercury is close to the ascendant where it inclines to disturb and agitate the populace through acts of legislators and politicians, while labor questions are also likely to be a source of apprehension, as well as relations with foreign powers. Mercury has a good aspect with Uranus, denoting better monetary distribution and improvement in finances to farms and homes. However, Saturn in the 2nd section of the chart indicates difficulties through heavy taxation and slow business improvement.

The position of Uranus retrograde in the fourth section indicates some very severe storms and high winds. It usually causes loss or trouble to water and power concerns, mining disasters, earthquakes and explosions in buildings. The question of land taxation and property values is likely to prove agitating.

Mars, Jupiter and Neptune are posited in the 9th section of this New Moon chart, a position where Mars inclines to disputes in legal, religious and scientific circles, fires and

accidents to shipping, deaths among men prominent in shipping, clerical and legal affairs. Trouble in colonial matters, disputes over trade and commerce. The position of Mars is between that of Jupiter and Neptune, tending to involve their influences with the Martian activity, strengthening it and making it more far-reaching.

Venus is located in the 12th domain where it afflicts Mars and Neptune, denoting much crime against children and women, trouble in public institutions, scandal and waste of money in connection with them. However, the position of Venus favors hospitals and charitable institutions through donations, legacies and endowments.

## FAVORABLE and UNFAVORABLE DAYS JANUARY, 1933.

According to astrological indications.

**Moon in First Quarter until January 3rd.**

(Notice: The Moon's position given on each day is its place at 4 a. m., Pacific Standard time. See inside front cover for time changes to places other than the Pacific time zone. The Moon advances at the rate of approximately one degree in 2 hours. The following indications are of interest to every one regardless of their birth month.)



**SUNDAY, 1st**—Moon 15 deg. 40 min. in Pisces: a flexed, watery, fruitful, feminine sign ruled by Neptune; governs feet and psychic faculties.

Apparently the year is not starting off with very good grace, considering the Moon's adverse aspect to Mars at 8:38 a. m., its adverse aspect with Mercury culminating at 1:54 p. m. and its adverse aspect with Jupiter reaching its maximum at 6:13 p. m. This combination of aspects sets up vibrations which incline to nervousness, impatience, irritability and misjudgment, as well as to excess or extravagance. Fortunately, this is Sunday and no

important transactions or decisions are necessary. Therefore, considering the day and its usual interests, we may relax, release our minds from serious problems, throw dull care away and perhaps thus transcend annoyances which otherwise might appear. Conditions improve considerably after 6:13 p. m.

**Monday, 2nd**—Moon enters Aries at 7:14 a. m.: a movable, fiery, masculine sign ruled by Mars; governs head and face.

Although no planetary aspects actually reach their culminating degree in the morning, nevertheless, the day is influenced until 4:18 p. m., by two benign configurations which are auspicious for things related to land, property, produce, mining, old business and those things which require a long time for their consummation. Favorable for dealing with those engaged in professional pursuits.

Conditions change after 4:18 p. m., the vibrations rising to high-pitched acceleration likely to manifest as nervousness, impatience, irritability, misjudgment, worry, controversy and accidents. A great deal of self-control should therefore be maintained and continual effort made to keep the mind calm and normal.

**Second Lunar Quarter begins on 3rd.**  
at 8:24 a. m. Increasing in light and power.

**Tuesday, 3rd**—Moon 10 deg. 38 min. in Aries: a movable, fiery, masculine sign ruled by Mars; governs head and face.

The influences delineated for last night continue their activity until their maximum is reached at 8:24 a. m. today. The period preceding this time is therefore very inauspicious for plans, decisions, changes or risky business ventures.

Between 8:24 a. m. and 4:43 p. m. the Moon is applying to a good aspect with Venus, making this the best portion of the day, but it should be employed only for ordinary pursuits and those matters which incline to harmony, peace, temperance, pleasure, sociability or artistic improvements.

The balance of the day and evening is dominated by the Moon's conjunction with Uranus. This is a high-tension aspect and to many it inclines to nervousness, irritability, impatience, impulsiveness and radical tendencies. To those who are able to maintain poise, the vibrations lead to interest in new, progressive, out-of-the-ordinary, inventive or research matters, especially along the lines of metaphysics, telepathy, astrology, thought transference or humanitarian efforts.

**Wednesday, 4th**—Moon 22 deg. 43 min. in Aries at 4 a. m., Pacific Standard time, transits through the sign and enters Taurus at 6:37 p. m. Aries is a movable, fiery, masculine sign ruled by Mars; governs head and face.

The principal influence operating throughout the business portion of the day is the Moon's

good aspect to Mercury, which favors general business activities along the usual lines as well as literary efforts, also correspondence, communications and business contacts.

As the Moon changes signs at 6:37 p. m., Pacific time, the vibrations also change in nature and become inauspicious and somewhat disruptive towards peace of mind and friendly relations with others. They may also incline to physical indisposition. Therefore a great deal of care need be exercised during the evening to maintain friendly relations, especially in domestic life, and to safeguard the health as well as to maintain an optimistic spirit in spite of unfavorable appearances.

**Thursday, 5th**—Moon 4 deg. 39 min. in Taurus: a fixed, earthly, feminine, semi-fruitful sign ruled by Venus; governs throat and neck.

The unfavorable influences delineated for last night continue until approximately 4 a. m. today, Pacific time, which is equivalent to 5 a. m. Mountain, 6 a. m. Central, 7 a. m. Eastern time, after which they may change slightly for the better, but the day remains inauspicious for important or new undertakings, plans, decisions or changes. Best for routine work, that is, ordinary pursuits carried on in the usual manner.

Conditions change and improve considerably after 6:13 p. m., due to an entirely different

set of planetary vibrations whose influence is energizing and inspiring, encouraging hope, good cheer and ambition.

**Friday, 6th**—Moon 16 deg. 30 min. in Taurus: a fixed, earthly, feminine, semi-fruitful sign ruled by Venus; governs throat and neck.

An unusually fine combination of planetary aspects operates until 5:42 p. m., when the Moon's good aspect to Jupiter culminates. These vibrations favor matters related to construction, art, literature, education, new thought and dealings with those in refined or professional pursuits. These aspects incline to harmony, good cheer and social good fellowship.

While the benign aspects reach their culmination at 5:42 p. m., the vibrations in operation throughout the balance of the day and evening favor pleasure and social contact.

**Saturday, 7th**—Moon enters Gemini at 7:19 a. m.: a flexed, airy, masculine, barren sign ruled by Mercury; governs hands, arms, shoulders, lungs and the nervous system.

The parallel of Venus and the Sun culminating at 10:33 a. m., and the Moon's good aspect to Saturn reaching its maximum at 5:06 p. m., are the principal planetary features of today and they should easily exceed in strength the influence of two minor aspects of adverse nature which operate in the meantime.

Attend to matters of refining, educational or artistic nature and such as may accelerate the finer and spiritual qualities. The vibrations are also good for matters of land, property, produce, mines and things which require a long time for their development.

The vibrations change after 5:06 p. m., are less dangerous and unfavorable for matters pertaining to liquids, beverages or chemicals. They incline to confusion, deception or misunderstanding, therefore, be cautious but frank and explicit, and protective.

**Sunday, 8th**—Moon 10 deg. 15 min. in Gemini: a flexed, airy, barren, masculine sign ruled by Mercury; governs hands, arms, shoulders, lungs and the nervous system.

The adverse aspect between Venus and Jupiter which culminates at 4:09 p. m., inclines to extremes, excess, extravagance and to overdoing pleasure or social activities, therefore moderation is the watchword in order to enjoy pleasure without pain. The balance of the day and evening contains mingled vibrations, an adverse aspect to Mars and a good one to Uranus. These vibrations incline to overpositivity and selfishness, to daring and risky ventures not uncoupled from danger; therefore, to the watchword of moderation we must add discretion and must not exceed the bounds of safety in our activities.

**Monday, 9th**—Moon 22 deg. 16 min. in Gemini at 4 a. m., Pacific Standard time, transits through the sign and enters Cancer at 7:16 p. m. Gemini is a flexed, airy, barren, masculine sign ruled by Mercury; governs hands, arms, shoulders, lungs and the nervous system.

As the aspects in operation throughout the day and evening are principally of adverse nature, it will be inauspicious for new undertakings, plans, decisions or changes. The tendency may be to act upon impulse, but hasty and unpremeditated actions should be avoided as well as the tendency to upset previously arranged plans. These vibrations tend to interruption, disruption, irregular and radical action. They incline to too much aggressiveness, over-positivity and disregard for consequences. These disturbing and disintegrating vibrations can be greatly modified by restraining methods and a determination to maintain poise and calm with constructive rather than destructive views. Be very cautious with regard to machinery, vehicles, explosives and careful also with regard to promises, agreements, correspondence and communications.

**Tuesday, 10th**—Moon 4 deg. 26 min. in Cancer: a movable, watery, fruitful, feminine sign ruled by the Moon; governs breast and stomach.

The Moon is in good aspect to Neptune until 2:45 p. m., favoring matters related to liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs, beverages, canned goods, fish and the sea as well as matters of psychic interest. In a general way the aspect also favors ordinary business and domestic activities. This vibration has a lingering but diminishing influence until about 5 p. m., after which the vibrations begin to change, becoming more energizing and activating as the evening advances, but caution should be observed in travel.

**Third Lunar Quarter begins on 11th, at 0:36 p. m. Full Moon. Beginning to decrease.**

**Wednesday, 11th**—Moon 16 deg. 45 min. in Cancer: a movable, watery, feminine, fruitful sign ruled by the Moon; governs breast and stomach.

Until after the time of the change of the Moon, 0:36 p. m., Pacific time, the vibrations are such as to suggest caution, moderation and deliberation in all important matters. Be careful with regard to explosives, things electrical as well as vehicles. However, for matters which principally require muscular effort and in ordinary pursuits conditions are fair if the cautions are observed.

The vibrations change and improve in quality considerably after 0:36 p. m., favoring attention to general business matters as well as

educational and literary pursuits or dealings with those in professional offices. Fairly good also for matters pertaining to land, property, produce and old business. These things are all more favorably indicated between 0:36 and 5:39 p. m., although the balance of the day is fair to a moderate degree, but not for matters related to liquids.

**Thursday, 12th**—Moon enters Leo at 5:26 a. m.: a fixed, fiery, barren, masculine sign ruled by the Sun; governs heart, sides and upper portion of the back.

The principal vibrations to consider until 3:45 p. m. are the Moon's adverse aspect to Mars and its opposition to Saturn. These disfavor new and important undertakings, especially those which are expected to consummate quickly. These vibrations incline to interruptions, disruption, delay and disappointment and are unfavorable for industrial or mechanical affairs as well as land, property, produce and mines.

Conditions change and improve somewhat after 3:45 p. m., making the balance of the day and evening fair for ordinary pursuits or recreation and amusement.

**Friday, 13th**—Moon 11 deg. 54 min. in Leo: a fixed, fiery, barren, masculine sign ruled by the Sun; governs heart, sides and upper portion of the back.

According to common superstition, which is in no way connected with astrology, Friday, the 13th, is supposed to be an unlucky day. But today should not be unlucky because the Sun is in trine aspect to Jupiter until 11:50 a. m., after which the next principal aspect is the Moon's trine to Uranus, culminating at 6:20 p. m. Therefore the principal portion of the day is graced with beneficent aspects favorable to important and progressive matters. This should be a good day to deal with those in high office, in professional or artistic pursuits or engaged in metaphysical, astrological and other new thought and humanitarian lines. The vibrations are also somewhat favorable for matters of land, property and mines and products of the earth, as well as for things which combine the artistic with practical utilities.

After 6:20 p. m., the vibrations may be even more energizing and activating, but accompanied by danger of accidents. Therefore a great deal of moderation and caution is necessary.

**Saturday, 14th**—Moon enters Virgo at 1:41 a. m.: a flexed, earthly, barren, feminine sign ruled by Mercury; governs solar plexus and bowels.

The Moon's good aspect to Venus until 3 p. m., followed by Mercury in good aspect to

Neptune until 7 p. m., are fairly good indices for the day in relation to matters of pleasure, art, music, adornment, sociability, beauty and domestic efforts. Good also for literary matters, education, reading, correspondence, communications, business contacts, and matters related to liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs and the sea, as well as psychic interests. The vibrations operating after 7 p. m. are principally of Neptunian nature, inclining to peculiar conditions, feelings or premonitions and suggest caution to avoid misunderstanding, confusion or deception. Discrimination should be used in relation to liquids, chemicals or beverages.

**Sunday, 15th**—Moon 7 deg. 47 min. in Virgo: a flexed, earthly, barren, feminine sign ruled by Mercury; governs solar plexus and bowels.

The aspects which operate until 10:21, a. m., Pacific time, are of energizing nature, inclining to excessive mental and physical activity. They tend to interest in odd jobs, clearing up things as well as discussions and travel. They are irreligious aspects and tend to disregard the Sabbath. However, after 10:21 a. m., the vibrations gradually change and later the Moon forms a parallel with Jupiter which favors religious and educational matters as well as social contact and matters of the usual Sunday interest.

**Monday, 16th**—Moon 21 deg. 01 min. in Virgo at 4 a. m., Pacific Standard time, transits through the sign and enters Libra at 8:02 p. m. Virgo is a flexed, earthly, barren, feminine sign ruled by Mercury; governs solar-plexus and bowels.

From the conjunction with Jupiter at 7:48 a. m., the Moon goes to a trine good aspect with the Sun which reaches its maximum at 1:29 p. m. This very benign configuration graces the preceding period with vibrations which are favorable for domestic, business, personal and professional pursuits. This should be a good time to deal with those in high office, with large mercantile concerns, as well as bankers, lawyers, judges, ministers, educators and all those whose work is uplifting. A good day for consultation, communications, conferences, plans, decisions and changes. The strength of the forementioned aspects diminishes after 1:29 p. m. The other vibrations are fair in nature, especially for matters of sociability and for things of practical, substantial nature or related to land, property, mines and produce.

**Tuesday, 17th**—Moon 4 deg. 28 min. in Libra: a movable, airy, masculine, semi-fruitful sign ruled by Venus; governs the kidneys.

Until 6:37 a. m., Pacific time (equivalent to 7:37 Mountain, 8:37 Central, 9:37 a. m. East-

ern time), the vibrations are favorable for commonplace activities and matters related to land, property or produce.

The aspects which operate throughout the balance of the day and evening are energizing and activating, but incline to hasty, premature action. The tendency of these vibrations is disruptive, disconcerting and irritating. They incline to high tension, irritability and impatience, consequently there is liability to discord, dissension and unexpected opposition. They incline to misjudgment and give danger of accidents. By subduing or avoiding these tendencies and maintaining a spirit of calm, deliberation, moderation and discrimination, stoutly maintaining the higher and more constructive attitudes of life, the otherwise unfavorable consequences may be avoided or transcended. Although the names of the aspects in operation today are different, their effect is similar to those described for yesterday afternoon

and evening. This is due to the parallel of Mars and Uranus and the Moon's adverse aspect to the Sun, which reaches its maximum at 10:15 p. m. The day is therefore inauspicious for important or new undertakings, plans, decisions, changes or risky ventures of any sort. Aim to be very practical and discreet, avoiding anger or excitement, maintaining poise and calm under all circumstances, and proceeding with usual and ordinary duties in a self-possessed and calm manner. By these means a great deal of useful work may be accomplished and unnecessary discord and trouble avoided.

**Thursday, 19th**—Moon enters Scorpio at 0:24 a. m.: a fixed, watery, fruitful, feminine sign ruled by Mars; governs the bladder.

The vibrations are mixed throughout the day and evening, the good alternating with the adverse. The Moon is afflicting Saturn, but favoring Venus and Neptune. This is not an auspicious day for important matters or new undertakings, but is fairly favorable for those things which require necessary attention. While disfavoring matters of land, property and produce, it is somewhat favorable for things of artistic and refining nature as well as matters pertaining to liquids, chemicals, oils or the sea.

Conditions change and improve considerably after 6 p. m., being more benign, strengthen-

ing, activating and uplifting. Favorable for light recreation, correspondence and literary efforts.

**Friday, 20th**—Moon 16 deg. 16 min. in Scorpio: a fixed, watery, fruitful, feminine sign ruled by Mars; governs the bladder. The Sun enters Aquarius at 3:53 a. m., Pacific time.

Until 3:15 p. m., when the Moon's good aspect to Jupiter reaches its maximum, the vibrations are of benign and fruitful nature. They favor attention to literary matters, correspondence, communications, printing, construction, mechanical and industrial affairs as well as wholesale matters, dealings with large concerns and those engaged in professional occupations. **Saturday, 21st**—Moon enters Sagittarius at 2:54 a. m.: a flexed, fiery, masculine sign ruled by Jupiter; governs liver, hips, thighs and the condition of the blood.

A good aspect between Mercury and Mars culminates at about 1 p. m., while the Moon's good aspect to Saturn reaches its maximum at 1:38 p. m. These make the preceding period of the day very favorable for activity in connection with the usual, regular or ordinary

pursuits. Good for matters of literature, printing, mechanism, industry, construction or things pertaining to land, property, mines or produce. Because good and adverse aspects to the major planets are in operation today, their

The Moon's good aspect to Venus and Mercury until 10 a. m., Pacific time, favors minor matters of usual interest, but as the Moon goes to a conjunction with the Sun and within a few hours afterwards to a conjunction with Saturn, the entire day and evening may be considered inauspicious for new or important undertakings, plans, decisions or changes. ### INSTRUCTIONS

#### For Using Favorable and Unfavorable Days

The daily influences described in foregoing pages are likely to affect every one to some extent. They will affect some people more than others according to how the vibrations of the day do or do not coincide with the indications and operations in the individual horoscope.

It is not intended that the things given in the foregoing list of favorable and unfavorable days should be the only ones attended to, but rather that they may be incorporated into the general daily affairs. However, from an astrological standpoint it is well to avoid adverse days and try to choose those which are favorable, in keeping with the old astrological axiom, "The better the day the better the deed."

By knowing the dates of favorable and unfavorable influences it gives us the opportunity to **think before it is time to act** and to set

a day in advance for any affair which will be most in keeping with the good results desired, according to astrology.

The mathematical principles upon which astrology is based are scientific, but the delineations deduced therefrom are not always exact, due to insufficient knowledge concerning certain planets and elements.

The principal daily aspects of the planets are interpreted here only for the purpose of aiding investigation, study and comparison of events or conditions as they transpire, in the hope that by such careful observation students will be enabled to work more in harmony with the laws of nature for better results and greater progress.

Note: The planetary aspects given in the foregoing chapter are delineated from day to day regardless of weather indications which involve the branch of astrology known as Astro-meteorology, concerning which see chapter headed "Brief Weather Forecast" in this issue.

**Second** lunar quarter begins on 3rd, at 8:24 a. m. Increasing in light and power.

**Third** lunar quarter begins on 11th, at 0:36 p. m. Full Moon. Beginning to decrease.

**Fourth** lunar quarter begins on 18th, at 10:15 p. m. Decreasing. Dark.

**First** lunar quarter begins on 25th, at 3:20 p. m. New Moon. Beginning to increase.

**Mercury** transits from the 20th degree of Sagittarius to end of the sign and enters Capricorn on January 8th, transiting entirely through the sign Capricorn by January 27th, entering Aquarius and reaching 5:54 of that sign by end of the month. Mercury is square Jupiter on 3rd; trine Neptune 14th; square Uranus 21st; trine Mars 21st; trine Jupiter 23rd; parallel Venus 24th.

**Venus** is transiting from the 13th degree of Sagittarius to the end of the sign, entering Capricorn on January 14th, transiting to the 21st degree of that sign by end of the month. Venus is square Mars, trine Uranus, semi-square Saturn on 5th; square Jupiter 8th; trine Neptune 21st; trine Mars 29th; square Uranus 30th; trine Jupiter 31st.

**Sun** is transiting from the 10th degree of Capricorn to the end of the sign, entering Aquarius at 3:53 a. m., Pacific time, January 20th, and transiting that sign to 11th degree by end of the month. Sun is square Uranus, trine Mars on 9th; trine Jupiter on 13th; parallel Saturn 24th; conjunction Saturn 27th.

**Mars** is transiting direct in 18th and 19th degree of Virgo until January 21st when it assumes retrograde position in the 20th and 19th degrees during the balance of the month. Venus is square Mars on 5th; Sun trine Mars on 9th; Mars parallel Uranus 13th; Mars parallel Uranus again on 18th; Mercury trine Mars on 21st; Venus trine Mars 29th.

**Jupiter** is transiting direct in the 23rd degree of Virgo until January 8th, when it assumes retrograde position in which it transits the 23rd and 22nd degrees of Virgo during the balance of the month. Mercury square Jupiter on 3rd; Venus square Jupiter 8th; Sun trine Jupiter on 13th; Mercury trine Jupiter 23rd; Jupiter sesquiquadrate Saturn 29th; Venus trine Jupiter 31st.

**Saturn** is transiting the 4th to 7th degrees of Aquarius during the month of January. Sun parallel Saturn 24th; Sun conjunction Saturn 27th; Jupiter sesquiquadrate Saturn 29th.

**Uranus** is transiting the 19th degree of Aries during the month of January. Sun square

Uranus on 9th; Mars parallel Uranus 13th; Mars parallel Uranus again on 18th; Mercury square Uranus on 21st; Mars sesquiquadrate Uranus on 28th; Venus square Uranus on 30th.

**Neptune** is retrograde in the 10th and 9th degrees of Virgo during the month of January. Mercury trine Neptune on 14th; Venus trine Neptune on 21st.

**Pluto** is transiting the 22nd degree of Cancer during the entire month. Its aspects are: January 1st trine Moon; 3rd square Moon; 6th sextile Moon; 11th conjunction Moon; 13th opposition Sun; 16th sextile Moon; 18th square Moon; 20th trine Moon; 23rd opposition Mercury; 24th opposition Moon; 28th trine Moon; 30th sextile Jupiter; 31st square Moon and opposition Venus.

**Moon's North Node** is receding from Pisces 10:53 to 9:17 during the month of January. The **South Node** is always at opposite point of the zodiac. The Moon changes from south to north declination on January 2nd. It changes from north to south on the 16th and from south to north again on the 29th.

INFLUENCE OF THE NEW MOON  
Between January 25 and February 24, 1933.

**L**EO, the eighteenth degree, is on the ascendant of a chart made for time of New Moon, January 25th, 6:12 p. m., Washington, D. C. The lunation occurs in the fifth degree of Aquarius and in the sixth section of the sky. This section has much bearing on civil service, the navy, health boards, public health and the working people. As the lights are conjoined with Saturn it is an unfavorable augury for such matters, denoting disturbance, dissatisfaction, much sickness, privation, want, lack of employment, high mortality and the passing of some prominent servant of State. However, the luminaries are also in good aspect to Uranus of the U. S. horoscope which indicates that despite the unfavorable conditions mentioned there will be influences at work, especially by the Government, to relieve the situation and bring about relief and improvement.

Venus and Mercury are also affecting the sixth space in the 14th and 26th degrees, respectively, of the sign Capricorn. Venus has two good aspects and one adverse in this chart, while it is also in adverse relation to Saturn of the U. S. horoscope, consequently, its benign influence is working under a handicap. In other words, conditions affecting farming and foreign affairs interfere with employment. Mercury is afflicting the position of Saturn of the August (1932) eclipse, so that it too, is unable to render specific benefit; on the contrary, it adds worry, apprehension, nervousness and much annoyance to all the matters before mentioned.

Three planets occupy the "house of finances" in this chart. They are Neptune, Mars and Jupiter,—all retrograde. Neptune usually indicates much fraud, collapse of unreliable enterprises, loss through illicit practices, theft, and loss of revenue. Mars usually indicates failures and great waste of public money. Military and foreign affairs will be sources of loss. Jupiter indicates enormous expenditures and as it is in adverse aspect to Mars of the U. S. horoscope it denotes huge losses through foreign conditions. However, Venus of this chart is in good aspect to Jupiter, indicating that benefits will be derived through some large investments and expenditures which will tend to buoy up hope for further future improvement.

As these are dominant planetary vibrations of the day, their influence is inauspicious for new business, important undertakings, plans, decisions or changes. These aspects usually incline to high nervous tension, impatience, irritability, distemper, misjudgment and to obstacles, de-

lays or disappointment. Use extra caution in correspondence, communications, promises, agreements or contracts. These vibrations require a strong effort to maintain poise, hopefulness and good cheer. They seem to make false appearances seem real and hide from us the truth, therefore strive to bring the nobility within to the surface and thus transcend the agitation of the day.

**Second Lunar Quarter begins on 2nd,  
at 5:17 a. m. Increasing in light and power.**

**Thursday, 2nd**—Moon 12 deg. 38 min. in Taurus: a fixed, earthly, feminine, semi-fruitful sign ruled by Venus; governs throat and neck.

The aspects are of somewhat adverse nature until 7 a. m., Pacific Standard time, principally due to the Moon's adverse aspect with the Sun. This period is favorable only for matters of routine nature and those which are not of great importance.

Conditions change and improve steadily after 7 a. m., due to the Moon's good aspects with Venus, Mars and Jupiter, which makes the balance of the day and evening favorable for matters relating to refinement, beauty, art, pleasure, sociability, construction, mechanical affairs, commercial activity and business related to those in the professions. The Moon's good aspect to Venus governs the early morning hours, inclining to cheer, pleasure, good nature and friendly feelings and is favorable for matters relating to refinement, art, music, adornment, sociability and domestic affairs.

Between 5 a. m. and 1 p. m. Saturn reaches its maximum influence of a good aspect with Uranus. This favors matters of land, property, produce, mines, transportation, invention, as well as metaphysics, humanitarian, benevolent, fraternal and progressive affairs. Although this aspect reaches its maximum at approximately 1 p. m., its influence lasts throughout the rest of the day and evening, principally because the Moon goes to a good aspect with Saturn, which reaches its culmination tomorrow morning, thus carrying forward the fore-mentioned influences through the remainder

**Saturday, 4th**—Moon 6 deg. 23 min. in Gemini: a flexed, airy, barren, masculine sign ruled by Mercury; governs hands, arms, shoulders, lungs and the nervous system.

While Mercury is parallel with Saturn today, the Moon is in good aspect with both Mercury and Saturn (one in the morning and one in the afternoon) thus with but little effort the mind should be able to transcend the tendency to nervousness, high tension, or irritability. The aspects are not good for matters related to liquids, chemicals, oils, drugs or the sea, but they do somewhat favor matters connected with land, property, mines and produce.

**Sunday, 5th**—Moon 18 deg. 19 min. in Gemini: a flexed, airy, barren, masculine sign ruled by Mercury; governs hands, arms, shoulders, lungs and the nervous system.

The Moon is in aspect with Uranus in the early morning, tending to physical activity with desire for change, travel, adventure or research. However, as the Moon is at the same time in adverse aspect with Jupiter and Saturn until 1:52 p. m., Pacific time, caution should be observed in all activity to avoid extremes, misjudgment, extravagance or excess.

**Sun** is transiting Aquarius from 12th degree to end of the sign until February 18th when it enters Pisces at 6:16 p. m., Pacific Standard time. It transits forward in that sign and reaches the 9th degree by end of the month. Mercury is conjunction Sun on 7th; Sun sextile Uranus on 9th; parallel Mars on 21st; eclipsed on 24th; opposition Neptune on 27th.

**Mars** is retrograding in Virgo from the 19th to 11th degree during the month of February. Mars is parallel Neptune on 11th; parallel Mercury on 18th; opposition Mercury on 21st.

**Jupiter** is retrograding in Virgo between the 22nd and 19th degrees during the month of February. Jupiter is parallel Mercury on 23rd; opposition Mercury 24th.

**Saturn** is transiting in Aquarius from 7th degree to 10th degree during the month of February. Mercury is conjunction Saturn on 1st; parallel Saturn on 4th; Saturn is conjunction Venus on 14th; parallel Venus 15th.

**Uranus** is transiting in Aries from the 19th to 20th degree during the month of February. Mercury is sextile Uranus on 8th; Sun sextile Uranus on 9th; Uranus parallel Mercury on 20th; sextile Venus 23rd.

**Neptune** is retrograding in the 9th and 8th degrees of Virgo during the month of February. Mars is parallel Neptune on 11th; Mercury opposition Neptune on 18th; Sun parallel

Neptune 25th; Sun opposition Neptune on 27th.

**Pluto** is transiting in the 21st degree of Cancer during the month of February. Its aspects with the Moon are as follows: Sextile on 2nd, conjunction on 7th, sextile on 12th, square on 14th, trine on 16th, opposition on 20th, trine on 25th, square on 27th. Jupiter is semi-sextile Pluto on 6th; Mercury is trine Pluto on 25th.

**Moon's North Node** is receding from 9:14 of Pisces to 7:48 during February. The **South Node** is always at the opposite point in the zodiac. The Moon's declination is north until February 13th when it changes to south, changing to north again on the 26th of February.

### Travel

If this rule is observed the journey will in all probability prove safe, pleasant and profitable.

GLARING example of a bill inimicable to Scientific Astrology was proposed in 1927 to Congress, in Washington, D. C., which was, in part, as follows:

**A BILL**

Amending subchapter 5 of the Code of Law of the District of Columbia, as amended to June 7, 1927, relating to offenses against public policy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

That subchapter 5 of the Code of Law for the District of Columbia, as amended to June 7, 1927, relating to offenses against public policy, be, and the same is hereby, amended by adding thereto a new section as follows:

“Any person pretending to tell fortunes where lost or stolen goods may be found; any person who, by game or device, sleight of hand, pretending, fortune telling, or by any trick or other means, by the use of cards or other implements or instruments, fraudulently obtains from another person property of any description; any person pretending to remove spells, or to sell charms for

protection or to unite the separated, shall be considered a disorderly person. Any person violating the provisions of this law shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$250 or by imprisonment not to exceed six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment."

69th Congress, 1st Session—H. B. 8989

No real students of astrology pretend to tell fortunes or to tell where stolen goods are to be found. Neither do they use sleight of hand tricks, cards or implements in any way for any astrological purposes. They do not pretend or try to remove spells, sell charms, find lost lovers, etc., yet, where such bills as this have become law, capable astrologers have been included in it and treated accordingly, as the bill is covertly worded (without mentioning the word, "astrology,") so that local officials could arrest any practitioner on the charge of "an offense against public policy."

But, because there is a **real** astrology, which has scientific values, educational and humanitarian principles, and because there are honest, intelligent and capable students of the subject, it is the belief of the National Astrological Association that such proposed bills should be amended so as not to class these people among the frauds. The bill should be worded so as to allow them to pursue their research, studies, teaching, classes and personal service in the same dignified manner as exponents of any other cause are permitted to do, and to accord them the same rights granted to workers in other scientific and educational lines.

It is quite possible that the sponsors of such bills have not had occasion to consider this side of the question and are not yet familiar with the work and purposes of the N. A. A., or doubtless such bills would provide a clause so that their enactment would

not interfere with work of the character of the N. A. A. and other societies teaching **real** astrology for humanitarian and educational purposes.

All bills proposed to "prevent offenses against public policy" should have a clause attached something similar to the following:

#### Clause

"Providing that there is nothing in this bill (or ordinance) intended to limit or interfere with the practice of those who are honestly engaged in educational, religious, scientific or humanitarian efforts, as teachers, lecturers, writers; whose work is obviously beneficial and who are duly qualified, authorized, ordained or credentialed by a properly chartered association, and who are not acting in violation of the spirit of this bill (or ordinance)."

The foregoing is reprinted from the "Bulletina" of July-August-September, 1927, as a sample of some of the attempts to regulate or suppress "fortune telling." Such effort is laudable providing that the ordinances are properly worded to affect "fortune telling" only, and do not leave opportunity for misconstruction by those who are empowered with enforcement, to the detriment of those teachers and practitioners whose work is obviously educational and beneficial.

As the foregoing proposed bill made no such wise provision or distinction, the "Bulletina" readers and also N. A. A. members were requested to notify their Representatives and Senators of their disapproval unless amended as suggested. The result was, as Senator Samuel M. Shortridge, of California, telegraphed us, the bill died with adjournment of Congress.

This incident was followed by drastic legislation in New York which was also inimicable to **legitimate** astrological practices. I emphasize the word **legiti-**

**mate** because there has been much done under the name of astrology which does not rightfully belong to its practice or teachings, but which does properly apply under the head of "fortune telling." Malpractice not only brings its own eventual punishment, but also injures legitimate efforts carried on under the same nomenclature.

By malpractice, I am referring to the practice of preparing readings by mass production and selling them under the pretense of **PERSONAL horoscopes**; and also to those who travel from place to place advertising to do all kinds of impossible things under the name of astrology. **Ordinances or bills which will legislate such practices out of existence will be welcomed by sincere astrological teachers, students, practitioners and societies.**

Most of the bills which have come to our notice to date class all astrological work in the same undesirable category. The bill passed in Missouri prohibits all astrological practice. One such case of miscarriage of justice came to our notice some time ago. A gentleman in Columbus, Ohio, who had been teaching and practicing astrology correctly and successfully for many years, was suddenly arrested on the charge of "practicing without a license." When he attempted to secure one, it was found that, according to the law, **no license could be granted**; yet he was arrested for practicing without one! However, he convinced the City Council that licenses should be granted to **qualified** practitioners, that is, after they had passed proper examination. He prepared a set of examination questions, some of which we supplied from our correspondence course of lessons, and, as the city clerk and none of the Council were capable of conducting such examinations, they appointed him chief examiner. The result is that illiterate Gypsies and other untrained applicants have been unable to qualify and therefore are not permitted to practice.

### Sincere Students of Astrology Everywhere

The ordinances which have been proposed or enacted, and which are well meaning, but improperly worded and therefore unjustly including or implying the inclusion of those who are not "fortune tellers," have not passed unnoticed. The National Astrological Association has for some time been working on this problem in an endeavor to formulate a bill which would eliminate charlatanism and properly protect worthy astrological practice; a bill that could, (with but few minor changes) be introduced in the legislature of each state and which would supersede all existing local city ordinances. A State Board of Examiners would be empowered to grant **qualified** applicants permission to practice, while local city ordinances would only determine the fees to be paid for such license and practice within its precincts.

The State Astrological Society of Massachusetts in Boston is working on such a bill as is also the N. A. A. Chapter in Pittsburgh. Members in Northern California met last year to discuss such a bill and are presumably now working on it in preparation for presentation at the next State Legislature. It is needless and obviously impossible to provide bills for every city in the U. S. where state bills are enacted. As such bills seek no special favor (they provide the proper distinction which eliminates the charlatan), they satisfy all interested parties and there should be no question of their enactment. Such a state bill would eliminate the obnoxious city ordinance which has been in effect in Los Angeles for many years. Under the heading of "An Ordinance Regulating Fortune Telling," a fee of \$50.00 a month was formerly required and it was indeed distasteful for astrological practitioners to find themselves in such a category, as well as being required to pay an exorbitant fee for legitimate **practice** that was primarily intended to be prohibitive for "fortune telling" only. The city actually aided and abetted "fortune telling" (by permitting it for a fee) while unintentionally working

a hardship on others whose work came under the same nomenclature but who were by no means in the same class.

In September, 1932, Councilman Clarence E. Coe conceived the idea of presenting a bill which would entirely abolish "fortune telling" and relieve the city of Los Angeles of the stigma of abetting charlatans, even in the face of losing fees at a time when the city needed money. A commendable idea, quite in keeping with our own principles. We wrote him to that effect, upon being informed that the proposed ordinance was designed solely against "fortune telling."

**This ordinance in its present form is far from being the kind which we would have proposed.** However, in Pasadena and other cities where ordinances of this same wording have been in effect for years, it has served the intended purpose of suppressing "fortune telling" while not interfering with the work of teachers, classes, societies, etc., whose work obviously was in no way associated with the condemned practices.

As we heard about the proposed ordinance but a few days before it went before the Council, there was insufficient time to secure information from the people in the cities beforementioned who are working on the formula for **state** legislation and to procure matter from them which might be arranged to serve as an alternate or substitute to supersede the proposed local ordinance; and even so there is always an element of chance that it would not be acceptable. Consequently, a letter was sent to be read before the City Council endorsing the ordinance, in so far as it eliminated "fortune telling" **but also placing an interpretation on the ordinance which defined it by making a distinction between the legitimate pursuit of the philosophies mentioned and their ABUSE to the extent of obtaining money under false pretenses.**

Another important feature of the letter was that while recognizing the need of an ordinance which would correct existing evils, **such ordinance should only be continued in force until ANOTHER could be presented which would more adequately provide for standardized regulation and control of public practice** (such as would be provided by a State Board of Examiners). When the ordinance came before the City Council this letter was read from the floor. The value of having this letter go on record, defining the defects of the present ordinance and serving notice of a new one to be proposed later, can readily be appreciated. The fact that other bodies and individuals made efforts to have the ordinance defeated or changed without avail, makes the recording of this letter timely and fortuitous, for those legitimately engaged in the various philosophies affected by the ordinance. A copy of this letter follows, also a copy of the ordinance and other letters concerning it.

#### Ordinance No. 71,928

The people of the City of Los Angeles do ordain as follows :

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to advertise by sign, circular, hand-bill or in any newspaper, periodical or magazine, or other publication or publications, or by any other means, to tell fortunes, to find or restore lost or stolen property, to locate oil wells, gold or silver or other ore or metal or natural product; to restore lost love or friendship or affection, to unite or procure lovers, husbands, wives, lost relatives or friends, for or without pay, by means of occult or psychic powers, faculties or forces, clairvoyance, psychology, psychometry, spirits, mediumship, seership, prophecy, astrology, palmistry, necromancy, or other craft science, cards, talismans, charms, potions, magnetism or magnetized articles or substances. Oriental mysteries or magic of any kind

or nature, or numerology, or to engage in or carry on any business the advertisement of which is prohibited by this ordinance; provided, that nothing in this ordinance contained shall apply to any ordained or duly accredited minister of any form of religious belief, or to the faith, practice or teaching of any religious body; provided, that fees, gratuities, emoluments or profits therefor shall be paid solely to or for the benefit of said religious body. . . . and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Dear Sir:

In the matter of the ordinance proposed by you for enactment, relative to the promotion and practice of what are generally regarded as philosophies of life:

The National Astrological Association is a non-profit corporation student research body of approximately two thousand members scattered throughout the world. It is not identified with any other institution. Its objectives, copy of which is inclosed, are altruistic, educational and scientific. A copy of its Code of Ethics is also inclosed.

**It is assumed that the proposed ordinance is not directed against any or all of those philosophies which are embraced by the terminology employed, but rather against their abuse as a means of enticing and deceiving the individual to the extent of procuring money under false pretenses. The need of correct legislation which will remedy this condition in the interest of public welfare is obvious.**

It is apparent that if any one of these philosophies were not definitely specified in this proposed legislation, every one of those charlatans who are the cause of its enactment would immediately renew their illicit practices under the terminology of such one or ones as might be exempted.

**Since there is not now any local formulated method for the standardized recognition and control of these philosophies, such as legislation duly provided for law, medicine, dentistry and realty, it is the sense of the Board of Directors of the National Astrological Association that the mutual interests of the people and these sciences will be most effectively served if this proposed ordinance is adopted and is continued in force until such time as the recognized exponents of these philosophies may, in the estimation of your honorable body, present such evidence of legitimacy of procedure and of standardization, together with such reasonable principles of regulation and control, as will warrant recognition of the right to present to the public a duly accredited and responsible service.**

While the foregoing letter was criticized by some who did not realize its purport, it was also commended by many who appreciated its defining value, especially in the absence of any other constructive document. However, it was not our intention to rest the matter there but rather to proceed along the lines suggested in the first pages of "Chats," that is, by proposing a suitable and equitable amendment. With that in view the following letters were written: the first to Councilman Clarence E. Coe personally, and the second for him to present to the City Council—which was done.

Dear Sir :

The accompanying letter expresses the sentiments of a very large number of reputable people who are vitally interested in this matter, from various angles.

The need of an ordinance against pernicious fortune-telling is obvious and the numerous associations engaged in constructive interpretation of the philosophies will be glad to co-operate to suppress such practices.

An amendment is proposed which will assure the ordinance being effective against abuses of deceiving the public, obtaining money under false promises or pretenses, and which will at the same time adequately protect those whose work does not violate the spirit of the ordinance.

Some years ago in Berkeley, where this identical ordinance has been in effect, a refined, well-known and accomplished lady was arrested on the charge of fortune-telling. Her defense was submitted, proving that her work was educational and constructive; she was a member of the National Astrological Association, Theosophical Society, Woman's Club, etc. She is a writer, teacher and lecturer on scientific astrology, and nothing in her work could be classed as properly coming under the (fortune-telling) ordinance.

The prosecuting attorney, after reading her defense, said: "If this lady will sign a waiver not to sue the city or the Police Department for damages, I will ask the Judge to dismiss the case." This was done. The result is that no arrests are being made; the bars are down, the legitimate and the pernicious both practice, but the city derives no license fees whatever.

### Between Astrologian and Fortune-Teller

This is an unfavorable state of affairs for those engaged in legitimate philosophical work, unfair to the public, and is a loss to the city. (This condition also exists in Los Angeles at the present time), and we believe that it can be avoided here, and the spirit of the ordinance maintained, if equitably amended.

The various schools, classes, societies, etc., mentioned, are by no means teaching or training "fortune-tellers"; they are investigating, studying and demonstrating the influences of natural phenomena and interpreting their findings in terms of the reactions produced, for the purpose of better understanding Life and its daily problems. Astrology properly interpreted is the Science of Life's Reactions to Planetary Vibrations, and is studied for the purpose of better understanding how to work in conscious harmony **with** Nature.

It may seem surprising, but there are thousands of people vitally interested in this ordinance. They hope it will eliminate the abuses intended, but they also hope it will be made to protect adequately those whose work is obviously beneficial.

It is on those grounds that they seek your aid to enact an amendment which will specifically clear the situation in justice to all concerned.

If you will have this amendment enacted you will allay the fears of a large number of deserving people and render an appreciated favor to progressive movements in Los Angeles.

In the previous Los Angeles ordinance to regulate fortune-telling, the license fee was placed at a figure intended to be prohibitive. In the proposed amendment to the new ordinance, the duly qualified practitioners are not fortune-tellers, consequently the license fee should be in proportion to those of other recognized professions,

Relative to the ordinance proposed by you for enactment and effective November 3rd, 1932, prohibiting the practice of fortune-telling:

As stated in our letter of Sept. 14th, 1932 (from the National Astrological Association) and later read before the City Council, we understand that the ordinance is not directed against the study and research of any or all those **philosophies** which are embraced in the terminology of the ordinance, but rather it is interpreted to specifically legislate against the abuse of the philosophies as a means of enticing and deceiving individuals to the extent of procuring money under false pretenses, such as promising to find or restore lost or stolen property; locate oil wells; restore lost love, procure husbands or wives, etc. The need of legislation which will correct such abuses of the philosophies and of public confidence, is obvious.

### **Between Astrologian and Fortune-Teller**

It is also obvious that if any one of these philosophies were not specifically named in the ordinance, every one of those charlatans who are the cause of its enactment would immediately renew their illicit practices under the terminology of that one exempted.

But there are many reputable organizations in Los Angeles, the majority of which have been established for many years, who are legitimately researching, teaching, espousing and employing the subjects named in the ordinance.

These organizations hold classes and public meetings which comprise and are regularly attended by a large number of progressive citizens. They also advertise their meetings, publish programs, books, magazines, etc. Their work is educational and not associated with the fortune telling practices which the ordinance intends to suppress.

Because the new ordinance does not explicitly exempt the qualified exponents, teachers, practitioners, publishers, etc., of such philosophies as mentioned above, there exists an uncertainty, lest the officials empowered to enforce the ordinance misconstrue its meaning and jeopardize the work of those who are not violating its spirit.

There is a possibility of it being misapplied, due to the general nature of the new ordinance, and causing damage to the objectives and work of these legitimate concerns. This view is held by the officers, members, congregations and others interested in such philosophies. It is also held by other business concerns and their employees who are patronized for supplies by the forementioned organizations. These supplies by printers, publishers, stationers, paper houses, engravers, commercial artists, binderies, advertising agencies, newspapers, etc., would immediately be curtailed.

### **Chats—Lawfully Regulated Philosophies**

These industries, as well as bookstores throughout the city of Los Angeles feel that any misconstruction of the new ordinance which would restrict, damage or suppress the work of such philosophies would be **acts in restraint of trade.**

As it is evidently not the intention of the Council to interfere with other than the pernicious "fortune-telling" named in the ordinance, such intention, if explicitly expressed, would remove the uncertainty of the large number of concerns interested in this matter and obviate the danger of injustice.

Therefore, the following amendment is suggested:

"Provided that nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to apply to or interfere with the work of those who are actively and honestly engaged in educational, philosophic, scientific or humanitarian pursuits as exponents, teachers, lecturers, writers, publishers; whose work is obviously constructive, and who are duly qualified, authorized or certified by a properly incorporated school, college, institute, society or association, which teaches astrology, numerology, philosophy, psychology, palmistry, graphology, vocational or character analysis. Provided that such duly authorized practitioners of the aforementioned pursuits be entitled to public practice, subject to such rules, regulations and license as may be adopted by the City of Los Angeles."

The foregoing amendment is respectfully submitted to your honorable body for consideration, with the plea of those interested that it be adopted.

Gentlemen:

Supplementing our letter of October 25th to Hon. Clarence E. Coe, Councilman, also acknowledging Mr. Coe's letter of Nov. 4th, 1932, to Mr. Llewellyn George (Vice Pres.,) we are pleased to submit the following reasons why this amendment would assist to make the ordinance more effective, and equitable to the various philosophies mentioned in our previous letter:

### **Will Dignify and Prosper Any Locality**

1st: We believe that the adoption of the proposed amendment will serve the purpose of making it clear that those schools, societies or organizations (mentioned in the proposed amendment) who are already established in Los Angeles for the purpose of research and study in the philosophies embraced in the terminology of the ordinance, are not affected by said terminology, and that their educational work will in no way be restrained or interfered with by those empowered to enforce the ordinance.

2nd: In the amendment it will be apparent that the responsibility will rest upon the said philosophies, societies, etc., of Los Angeles, as to the character, ability and integrity of such applicants for public practice as they may endorse. As those who are endorsed will doubtless be representatives of their particular society, school, organization, etc., that group will necessarily protect its own good name and work by exercising due caution regarding whom they recommend for practice. Undoubtedly they will recommend only those who are experienced and fully conversant in their own particular philosophy, also being qualified and capable of practicing and maintaining their code of ethics, thus giving assurance of their sponsoring constructive and educational features of that philosophy.

3rd: If the proposed amendment is adopted, it should relieve the City of Los Angeles of the responsibility of deciding the qualifications, ability and integrity, etc., of future applicants for public practice, while at the same time the ordinance proper will automatically eliminate fortune-tellers, fakers and other undesirables, who would otherwise ply their pernicious practices falsely under the name of one of these philosophies previously mentioned.

4th: If adopted, the amendment should protect the public and assure preservation and lawful operation

according to the spirit of the ordinance and the proposed amendment.

5th: The amendment, if adopted, will also assure the City of Los Angeles a revenue which does not now exist. It will also simplify the work and duties of those empowered and delegated to enforce the ordinance, thus giving assurance to the City of Los Angeles and the various societies, schools, organizations, etc., affected, that no interference or serious damage to legitimate bodies and their work will occur.

With these factors in mind, which make for better general public welfare and protection in this matter, we sincerely trust that you will give favorable consideration to our proposed amendment and that it will be adopted by the Public Welfare Committee and the City of Los Angeles.

#### Mankind's Progress

If you have a clock that runs too fast or too slow, blame it on the moon, although the moon is not necessarily always responsible. Two scientists of Yale university, now have found after months of extensive research that both the moon and altitude affect the accuracy of clocks in homes.

They found that if a clock were to be raised or lowered successively, every effect of the change in the earth's attraction on the pendulum could be detected and registered in a month of observations.

The two scientists reached their conclusions by checking the variations registered by various clocks with a chronograph, a device said to detect a variation as slight as one-thousandth of a second. While such a slight change is too little to bother most folks, they found that the moon can affect clocks as much as three or four minutes a month. —L. A. Record.

## BALANCE IN ASTROLOGY

WHAT is trouble, evil, difficulty, misery, pain and unhappiness? The answer: A disturbed equilibrium. Life manifests itself through waves, much like the waves of the ocean. Like the waves of the ocean, the crests of life produce corresponding valleys, or depressions. The law is that a hill is just as high as a valley is deep. Riding on the peak of the wave of life is pleasant, but being lowered to the bottom is unpleasant. There is no such thing as riding on the crest of a wave at all times. If we wish to avoid extreme unpleasantness, or unhappiness, we must avoid extreme pleasure and gratification. High waves are interesting but dangerous. Low waves are not so interesting, but less dangerous. All extremes are troublesome.

In Natal Astrology the disturbed equilibrium is indicated by evil aspects, also by too many planets being placed in signs of similar nature. If we find charts where there is a lack of balance, we must counteract that lack through constructive effort and a proper exercise of the will. Let us take two cases—two extremes. Let us call case No. 1 the chart of Jones, and case No. 2 the chart of Smith.

In the chart of Jones, we find the signs Capricorn, Cancer and Scorpio prominent. There are good aspects, but also powerful afflictions. All three signs are saving and self-protective in nature. Jones is not a popular person. He is ambitious, harsh, stern, reserved, conventional, cautious, suspicious, jealous, and,

above all, very selfish. He is nearly devoid of all sympathy, but to his credit it must be said that he is just, just with but little mercy. He is a good organizer, planner, manager. While he is not popular, he never becomes involved in difficulties. He possesses all traits necessary to keep him out of trouble. He is not a happy person. He wants to be alone. Where people gather socially he is more, or less, of a "wet blanket." His realm is business. Except for the occasional intensity of Scorpio (which is generally held in check by Capricorn) he is not colorful, but very dry and uninteresting. His acquisitiveness and shrewdness soon elevate him in the world of commerce. Worldly goods do not come easy to him however. Capricorn leads in his chart, and Capricorn is not a "fortunate" sign. All he accumulates is the result of labor, application, persistence and organizing powers. Jones grows old and philosophical and he realizes that somehow things are top-heavy. So much as to the diagnosis of Jones' case.

Now the remedy. Astrology sees ourselves as we are seen by others. Jones in his early career does not realize the preponderance of certain traits over others, a preponderance that disturbs the balance. He should be told to be less stern, conventional, suspicious and selfish, and more sympathetic, sociable, humanitarian and trusting. He should be told to unlock his heart to others. He should be told to let down his reserve, to be more hospitable, less forbidding. He should realize that his case represents an extreme. Extremes are always painful. If he is hunting for happiness, he should give more and take less. He has acquired too much (even if lawfully so).

Now as to Smith. Here we have an entirely different picture. Smith has Pisces, Sagittarius and Leo prominent, but afflicted. We find that Sagittarius dominates the field. Smith is a much more fortunate person than Jones. Sagittarius does not find it necessary to labor as strenuously as does Capricorn. Smith is a Jupiter-Sun-Neptune individual. He possesses all

the attributes of the three forces mentioned. Smith does things as if by magic, especially in his early career. Material things come his way. Needless to say, he has such traits as joviality, hospitality, generosity, very prominent. He is very sociable and very popular. Leo gives him much self-esteem. He is proud and sensitive. He is at his best when things come his way. Where hospitality is concerned he certainly shows an excess of this trait. All goes well with Smith until the afflictions begin to operate. It so happens that his worst afflictions in the radical chart influence his fourth, also eighth and twelfth houses, departments that refer to the outcome of things, more or less. Smith is getting along in years. The fourth house influence begins to operate. Good aspects in his progressed chart show less and less power. Unfavorable aspects become stronger as the years pass by. The excess of his traits causes trouble. Smith's motto is: "What is mine, is yours." He keeps an open house. "Come in at any time and make yourself at home." He is the magnet that draws all sorts of social leeches, "moochers" and parasites, who deplete the supply in his icebox and steal his time. Visitors drop in at almost any time at the house. Smith is entertaining into the wee hours of the morning. He loses sleep. Lost sleep interferes with his efficiency at the office. The boss sounds repeated warnings and finally Smith loses his position. Positions are not easy to obtain. A long period of unemployment follows. There is an orgy of entertainment at his house. Smith worries about the lack of employment, but drowns his worry by making merry. In the meantime there has been no income, all outgo. Smith is under very extravagant Mars-Sun-Jupiter afflictions in his progressed chart. Saturn is close at hand. One of Smith's "friends" takes his motto too literally. He helps himself to Smith's wife. A divorce follows. Bills are overdue. Smith's house goes under the hammer. No position as yet. His friends leave, one by one. His Leo pride does not permit him to seek help. His circumstances are very



reduced, indeed. His plight is pitiful. One more to be supported by the taxpayers' money. So much as to Smith's trouble. Now the remedy.

Smith has too much generosity, sympathy and hospitality in his make-up. To be more correct, these traits are perverted. Any desirable trait, if excessive, or perverted, reaches the point where it becomes undesirable, a fault, not a virtue. It almost seems that too much goodness is "badness." Smith would fit very well into an unselfish and Utopian age, but the age in which he lives is very practical, mercenary and selfish. Therefore, he should be told early in his career to look out for himself first. He should be told that his Jupiterian "luck" will not last forever. What Smith needs is a healthy dose of so-called "selfishness," just as Jones needs a prescription of unselfishness. Smith has been a much happier person than Jones. His (Smith's) old age, however, is apt to be rather lonely, and loneliness is one condition very punishing to him. While Jones should give more and take less, Smith should take more and give less. The former has already taken too much. The latter has already given too much. In both cases the balance has been disturbed, and if harmony and happiness are desired, it must be restored. Not all the troubles and difficulties in both cases can be done away with, but they can be minimized. Applying the law of Karma, certain debts become overdue and the payment can no longer be postponed. If Jones and Smith must pay penalties contracted in past lives, at least they should pay them in the most graceful manner possible.

Balance is harmony, concord, happiness. A disturbed balance is discord, misery, unhappiness. A certain fluctuation of the scales of life is necessary. A perfect balance would be a very drab condition. In fact, a perfect balance would be no life at all. The trouble lies in **too violently disturbing** the scale. Moderation in all things is the remedy. We often misuse, or over-use, certain terms. A term now much

over-used is the term "positive." The universal cry is: "Be positive." We are told that being negative is a condition to be shunned. What does being positive mean? It means expression, action, initiative and aggressiveness. It means the opposite of negative. To be negative means to rest, meditate, absorb and to store up energy. It is not possible to be positive, to expend energy, to act, to express, unless a condition of negativity has preceded positivity, a condition of storing up of energy.

Both positivity and negativity are necessary. They are equally desirable. Over-emphasizing either one is troublesome. There are just as many positive signs in the Zodiac as there are negative. Night is just as natural as day. Night, or negativity, does not mean inertia. Forcing, or over-doing positivity, results in exhaustion, and exhaustion will prolong the negative state when this state does come. The age in which we live is over-positive. The candle is being burned at both ends. There is excessive speed. Adrenalin has its place, but the adrenalin of our high-pressure-salesmanship-age is being administered in over doses. Three lives are being crowded into one. We act as if this is our last incarnation. What exhaustion it will be when exhaustion finally does come! When twelve year old children have acquired the sophistication, the blasé and worldly-wise manner of a thirty-year old person, we know that our being too positive is having dire results. We are being robbed of our happiness. The remedy is: **simplicity**. Simplicity means a slowing-down process; to be sure, a contraction, painful at first as all contractions are, but it is the only way out to restore a horribly disturbed equilibrium. Simplicity will save us from becoming exhausted. If the depression through which we have just passed, has taught us simplicity and wholesomeness, it has served its purpose. Prior to 1929 the fly-wheels of life were revolving at a terrific rate of speed. There was danger of them flying off their base and destroying us. The years between 1922 and 1928

were years of unprecedented boom. Conditions actually reached a point where every school boy considered himself poverty-stricken unless he had his private automobile. People were not satisfied with making a living. They had to make fortunes. Then the depression came. More school boys ride on bicycles now and less ride to school in private automobiles. Grown people are now satisfied with making a living. The boom years caused us to lose our sense of proportion; our sense of values became distorted. Things came to us with but little effort. The depression is just Nature's way of restoring this sadly disturbed balance.

Now is the time to forestall another depression. Let us not pray for a boom, but rather for a **gradual expansion**, because as surely as the Sun rises, a depression or trouble in some form or other will follow a boom. Let us avoid extremes, individually and collectively. All good and evil originate on the thought and desire planes. Unhealthy and demoralizing booms and painful deflations are nothing but the result of wrong thoughts and desires. Let us not think in terms of booms and depressions. Moderation and simplicity are happiness. Let us think in such terms.

## SUN SPOTS AND SOLAR RADIATION

**ASTRONOMERS** are studying the Sun with much interest at the present time as the sun spot cycle is nearing its minimum.

Economists, business men, financiers and politicians are studying fundamental conditions with intense interest in the hope that they may detect the first indications of a turn in the Business Cycle.

It is possible that the two cycles may have something in common now that all efforts of men have failed to revive the business cycle.

The accepted factors that men have used to guide them in forecasting have failed and the business leaders of the world are in a state of perplexity. The state of the present uncertainty was well stated by Dr. Paul F. Cadman of the University of California at the bankers convention in Los Angeles as follows:

"The greatest danger that America faces today is not the prostration of industry, nor the collapse of finance, nor the increase in unemployment, nor even the possibility of revolution. It is the breakdown of our faith in our traditions, our ideals and ourselves. Unless that faith can be restored there is no hope of lasting recovery. At this moment we are desperately in need of faith in our leaders, in ourselves."

That the business need is greater faith cannot be questioned. The problem is: how are we to generate the necessary faith? In this intellectual age when the established systems of men have failed there can be but one answer. An increase in demonstrable truth, an increase in knowledge of nature's laws that dominate the activity of the earth and of men. Any one

who can increase man's knowledge of the laws of nature will increase the faith of men.

Business activity is the use of the stored energy of men and nature to produce and distribute raw materials and finished products to feed, clothe, house, transport, entertain and otherwise serve the public.

Man's body, life and energy and all the things in which he trades, originate with the radiation of the Sun. As the direct radiation of solar light and heat varies, and the distribution of the direct solar light and heat to the earth varies, so do the activities of the earth and of men vary.

Therefore, men must know the time of the rise and fall in solar energy, and must know the time length of the cyclic distribution of solar energy to the earth, and regulate his activities accordingly if he is to avoid the evils of the rest or negative periods.

The distribution of the solar energy in longitude around the earth each day, by the rotation of the earth, regulates the time of day when the mass is active and at rest. The movement of the earth in its orbit each year varies the latitude of the solar distribution north and south of the earth's equator and times the activities of the earth and men in summer and winter.

The effect of such variations in solar radiation upon the thoughts and acts of men is known to all intelligent persons and is the basis of our industrial systems.

However, it is not generally known to business men that there is a rise and fall in the direct radiation of the sun over a period of approximately 11 years, nor that there are longer cycles of the distribution of solar energy than the cycles of the day, month and year.

These longer cycles have as marked effect upon the thoughts and acts of men as the variations in the shorter cycles.

A knowledge must be obtained by men of the changes in the solar cycle of radiation and of the

major cycles of solar distribution if the major periods of mass activity and rest are to be understood and utilized.

Man's inventiveness and advancement have not enabled him to dominate the recurrence of these major cycles. Instead, man's artificial systems have digressed so far from the normal movements of nature as to endanger the whole business and financial structures.

The solar cycle has a variation of 9 to 14 years. Its mean time is 11.2 years. At the maximum of solar activity, the radiation of the Sun is 5% or more in excess of minimum.

It has been found that the length of each sun spot cycle is limited to 90 degrees of longitude between the planets Saturn and Uranus. The old sun spots reach the Sun's equator and disappear just prior to the formation by Saturn of angles of 45, 135, 225 and 315 degrees to Uranus.

It has been found that the minimum sun spot periods recur as Jupiter forms its last angle of 90 degrees, or multiples of 90 degrees, to Neptune and Pluto before Saturn forms its minimum angles to Uranus.

At the same time that the minimum period is formed, new spots appear with reversed polarity under the angle formations of Jupiter to Neptune and Pluto. In 1913 the reversal in polarity was under the angle of Jupiter to Pluto. In 1923, the reversal came under Jupiter to Neptune. The next reversal should come under Jupiter 90 degrees from Pluto in June 1934.

The time of maximum activity of the new spots of each cycle recur just prior to the formation by Saturn to Uranus of angles of 0, 90, 180, 270 degrees. The extreme maximum of sun spots recur as Jupiter makes its last 90 degree angle to Neptune and Pluto before Saturn forms its maximum angles to Uranus.

These are the principal factors that time the solar cycle of rise and fall in radiation. There are several additional factors.

The startling fact of this discovery is that it is the angle formations of the two largest planets, Saturn and Jupiter, to the three invisible planets, Uranus, Neptune and Pluto (not visible to normal eye sight) that fluctuate the radiation of the Sun.

This proves that it is not the mass, nor the volume of light, nor the visibility to man, that determine the influence of the planetary bodies upon the Sun and Earth.

A table of the dates of planetary angles that measure the times of minimum solar radiation since 1856 is as follows:

## THE PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION

WHEN the time came for me to make a forecast concerning the outcome of the presidential election I began the work by following the usual astrological procedure. I spent one entire evening working up the natal and progressed horoscopes of President Herbert Hoover, whose birth data has been established as 10:59 p. m., August 10th, 1874 at West Branch, Iowa. This gives Taurus  $24^{\circ}$  on the natal ascendant;  $20^{\circ}$   $\text{\textcircled{C}}$  on progressed ascendant.

The following evening until the "wee sma' hours" I spent on the chart of Franklin Delano Roosevelt for whom I had been given the data 2:52 a. m., January 30th, 1882, at Hyde Park, N. Y. The next step would have been to make a comparison of the two charts by checking their progressed aspects to find which had the preponderance of testimonies indicating accession to the high office. But on the very next morning a friend telephoned and said, "I have Roosevelt's time from a member of the family; it is 9 a. m. This great difference in time was something to think about so I called up the teacher of an astrological class and asked him about the birth time. His reply was that his Society had communicated with a member of the Roosevelt family and they received the reply that the time was 8 p. m. A magazine came into my hands that day which gave the time as 7 p. m., while from another source came the information (?) that birth occurred in the afternoon!

Here was an array of **five** different birth times all called **authentic**. The data of the nominations was



no more certain, there being three different times quoted for Hoover's nomination. I am citing this incident to show how difficult it is to acquire correct data of celebrated persons and how easy it is for a student to be misled in deductions and predictions, and why students sometimes differ in their judgments. It was possible to have worked out which of these times was right by using the rules and process of "Rectification," but as that was a task requiring much more time than at my disposal, I dropped the whole procedure and resorted to one much more simple and which I had used successfully on many occasions for various contests.

What was it? Simply looking at the "Time Table of Planetary Aspects" in the "Bulletina" for election day, November 8, 1932. Here we see the principle aspect is Moon sextile Saturn ( $\text{D} \times \text{S}$ ). The Moon is the indicator of the general public; the sextile is creative, i.e., for, with or to; while Saturn rules mules and consequently the Democratic Party of which the mule is emblematic.

This dominating aspect plainly showed what would happen on that date, but there was further corroborating testimony shown by the Moon changing signs on that day. It transited into the sign Aries, a "movable" sign of the zodiac, denoting that public sentiment would be for a change.

The above information predicting success for the Democrats was given to the Los Angeles Times before election, after which Mr. Harry Carr, the celebrated writer of its "Lancer" column said, "Believe it or not, about a month ago I received a letter from an astrologer in which he said that Roosevelt would be elected." This subject was also written up as a news item and given to a syndicate which published it in their eastern papers. Mr. E. Wagner, who is now publishing the N. A. A. Journal, handled the news feature. Many "Bulletina" subscribers wrote inquiries prior to election all of whom were answered as above.

This matter could have been presented in the last issue of the "Bulletina" but you will recall that on page 119 we had an article calling for predictions by qualified students to be published in **this** issue; courtesy prevented publication of my own findings previous to theirs. It will be remembered that Dr. Henry Gordon, President of the N. A. A. predicted this election last July.

A prediction based on the method I have outlined could have been made as far back as the Spring of 1931, or as soon as the 1932 ephemeris of the planetary positions and aspects was available. In fact, even earlier than that if one cared to employ the calculations necessary to establish the planetary configurations as they would be on November 8th, 1932. All of which goes to prove there is no **chance**, all is the operation of Divine Law and astrology is its interpreter.

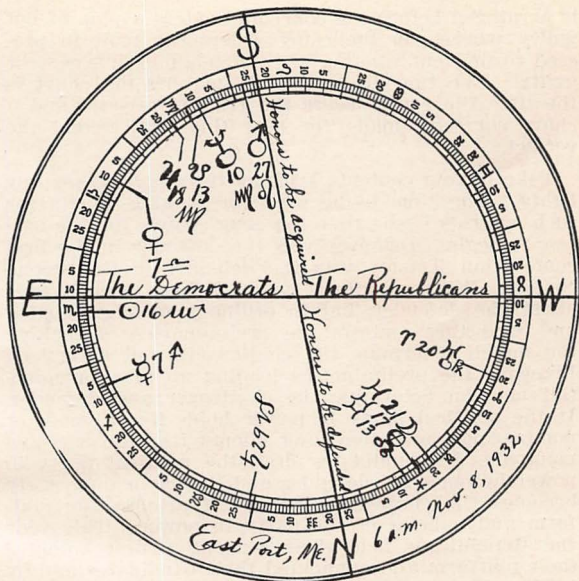

## ROOSEVELT WILL WIN

FOR THIRTY YEARS I have been a diligent student and researcher in what I have termed "Momentary Astrology." What can take place **this moment** between two boxers, two wrestlers, two baseball teams, two football teams, between horses in races, between dogs in races, between plaintiff and defendant in lawsuits, between armies in warfare, between two candidates for political office? I have sought and found the astrological rules for predetermining the outcome in all of these.



In order to successfully determine the outcome of the pending presidential election, one must first ascertain who is the challenger and who is the defender in the contest.

In all title contests the title holders are always the defenders. In law the defendant is always the defender. Usually the office holder is the defendant, but not always, in a political contest over an office. When the challenger and the defender are ascertained then the time and place for the contests' beginning is the time to be used in making the chart. Take a case in court. The defendant

is arraigned before the court and enters a plea of not guilty whereupon the court orders the trial to proceed to find out whether the defendant is innocent or guilty. The time to be used in making the chart is the time the court orders the trial to proceed and a chart correctly made for that time will reveal the verdict.

Take boxing contents such as the Tunney-Dempsey fights. The time to be used for making charts for such contests is the time the gong sounds for the contest to begin. Dempsey was the defender in the first contest but Tunney was the defender in the second contest. Where a title is involved there is no trouble about the defender, but in ordinary matched boxing and wrestling contests the preliminaries of making the match determine the challengers and defenders. Likewise the preliminaries leading up to a presidential election determine the challenger and defender. If the political party in power holds its national, or nominating convention, and adopts its platform and nominates its candidates first, the political party in power becomes the defender and the contending party becomes the challenger because it attacks the platform and policies of the party in power. This year the Republicans held their convention first, adopted their platform and nominated their candidates and by holding the office now they are the defenders in the pending election. The Democrats are attacking the Republican party platform and the Republican policies in office. All attackers are challengers.

The preliminaries of the two major political parties have been made for the voting to actually begin on the eastern coast of this country at six a. m. on November 8, 1932, E. S. T. A letter from the Secretary of State of Maine imparts the information that the laws of Maine permit voting to begin at six a. m. and to close at 7 p. m. A chart made for North Latitude 45 degrees and West Longitude 67 degrees at 6 a. m., November 8, 1932, will reveal the winner of the election to be held on that day throughout this

country. In a chart made for that time and place we find the 12th degree of Scorpio on the horizon and the 23rd degree of Leo on the Meridian. Mars rules the Ascendant and Sun rules the Meridian. They are in mutual reception.

In making charts for all such contests I prefer to use your zodiacal chart and merely draw the horizon and meridian lines across the charts (omitting the mundane houses) and place the planets in their proper longitudes. Every celestial influence east of the meridian line helps or hinders the challenger and every celestial influence west of the meridian line helps or hinders the defender in the contest. So, in order to get the chart for the coming election properly before the mind we should write "The Democrats" on the horizon line east of the meridian and "The Republicans" on the horizon line west of the meridian. We should write on the meridian line above the horizon line "Honors to be Acquired." On the meridian line below the horizon we write "Honors to be Defended," indicating the office to be defended in this election.

The first rule in "Prize Fights and Astrology" says that when ruler of the Ascendant is in the Midheaven it is a sign that the challenger will win. The fourth rule says that when the ruler of the meridian is on the ascendant it is a sign the challenger will win. There are twenty-four of these rules for finding winners in all contests, where only one contender and one defender are in the contest. In this chart we find Sun, Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn and Neptune east of the meridian and all favoring the challenger to win. The only adverse influence is the Moon's South Node. Even Saturn and Neptune favor the challenger in this chart.

Now, observe the celestial influences west of the meridian line. We find the Moon, Fortuna, Moon's North Node favoring the defender, but Uranus, ruler of the fourth, is retrograde and disposed of by Mars,

ruler of the election. Uranus ruling the fourth, retrograding and disposed of by Mars, ruler of the election, are signs that the Republicans cannot make a successful defense of their platform and policies against the attacks of the challenging party. The presence of Fortuna west of the meridian shows where the money is in this election. The presence of the Moon west of the meridian is a sign that the common people of the Republican party will stand pat and "vote 'er straight," but the chart as a whole shows where the honors of the contest are going. The Democrats will win the honors.

Since the chart reveals the winner, it also reveals in a limited way the activities of the two contenders for the next four years, and the nature of political action of the successful party. Mars on the meridian of the chart will make four years of democratic rule very aggressive, dominating, domineering, and warlike with slight hopes for relief from the monetary monster that has economically wrecked and financially ruined a nation of people. The defender will retrograde, retire, recede from his exalted position into "innocuous desuetude."



## THE WHY OF WHO NEXT

THE LETTER "J" is 30% of the initials of presidents and vice-presidents from Washington down to Johnson in 1868. John Garner may bring the 27th "J" to these offices.

Counting both presidents and vice-presidents, the name "John" (not John Barleycorn who is never out of office) appeared in eight administrations of the eighteen between 1788 and 1860, which is the last instance. Seven of the eight were Democratic. Shall we "garner" another John?

There have been no presidents by the name of Charles and only three vice-presidents by this name: Fairbanks, Dawes and Curtis, neither of the former having been reelected.

The letter "H" has been the last initial of five presidents of the United States: Harrison, Hayes, Harrison, Harding and Hoover, and three vice-presidents: Hamlin, Hendricks and Hobart, all of whom failed to be reelected.

Since 1900, there have been four presidents whose names have contained "oo": Roosevelt, Woodrow (Wilson), Coolidge and Hoover, who so far, have each been twice elected. By strange coincidence, the "oo" appears in the names of both the 1932 presidential candidates.

Approximately every twenty years since 1841, a Republican president has died suddenly or tragically during his term of office: Harrison, Lincoln, Garfield, McKinley and Harding. —?— 1941-1945.

Seemingly, the Democratic Party was in control prior to 1840, from which time a Democratic president has been returned to power every twenty years, alternating between the years of Republican tragedies. This periodicity has failed but once, in 1876, and then only through nefarious manipulation of the Tilden-Hayes tie vote. The validity of the count was questioned and for the first time in history, an Electoral Commission was appointed to investigate the asserted frauds in this regard. But the Democrats underestimated the intellectual **resources** of their opponents.

The Tweed Ring (1871 and 1875) and Tammany (1932) investigations are similar, all occurring during a Republican administration, about eleven or twelve years after the Party's entrance into power (1860, Lincoln and 1920, Harding), all taking place during a long period of a major depression. Furthermore, these various political upheavals, similar to the schisms in the Democratic Party just prior to the

Cleveland elections, were brought to a climax on the eve of a coming National election.

In 1920 the Republican Party returned to power, as is regular every twenty years (since 1840). Likewise, 1932 is the comparative return of the Democratic twenty-year cycle (since 1852). To summarize:

The twenty-year Democratic cycle has returned.

The present Tammany court investigations seem to be fomenting a somewhat parallel case to the Tweed Ring, at another political cross roads.

The "oo" in the names of the presidential candidates Hoover and Roosevelt, if considered by itself, would indicate a close election.

But the two initials "H" of Herbert Hoover are doubly significant because of the traditional failure of reelection of any candidate with this initial.

And as for a "Charles" in a second term,—they are conspicuous by their absence.

The name "John" has recurred most frequently as a name of president or vice-president, and with but one exception the men have been Democrats.

The initial "J" has appeared the most often of any in these offices.

Incidentally, "R" is the beginning of **R**oosevelt and the end of **Hoo**ve**R**.

**METHODS IN ASTRO-ECONOMIC RESEARCH****By L. J. Jensen**

(Editor's note: The aspects of the planets are interpreted here only for the purpose of aiding investigation, study and comparison of events or conditions as they transpire, in the hope that by such careful observation students will be enabled to work more in harmony with the laws of nature for better results and greater progress.)



**E**CONOMICS and the forecasting of probable economic trends have become major problems in modern life. For a decade, and sometimes as long as two or three, the comparatively slight ebb and flow of the indices of trade and industry pass unnoticed by the average individual. Then a cataclysm develops, and economic study again comes to the front rank of attention. So it is that after a three year debacle of declining values, heartaches and blasted hopes, the world is facing the future with the question, "What will be the outcome?" All of the popularly recognized statistical methods of forecasting during the past decade failed in the emergency, just as they are failing to advise anything definite as to the probable trend in the years to come. Yet several astrological researchers definitely forecast the 1929 to 1932 depression, not only as to the exact length, but as to the probable depth. When one person makes such a correct forecast it is termed luck,

but when several persons in various parts of the world concur in their forecasts, it is something more than mere coincidence and therefore deserving of serious consideration.

Little of tangible research value will result from presenting a forecast in typical almanac manner in these pages. It is the prime purpose of this article to suggest definite and tangible methods of approaching the subject of astro-economics. The serious premises of the science can then be approached by the student, to test, accept or reject. There is no subject which the average student cannot grasp, providing he applies himself to it. But most people like their studies ready made and will not apply themselves. It is for this reason that scientific astrological research has suffered at the hands of innumerable mephistophelean success-mongers whose knowledge of the subject is about equal to that contained in a Ten Cent Store Sun-Sign tract.

In first approaching the subject the student will probably be forced to adjust his philosophy of life before much progress can be made. The premise of astro-economics is neither fatalistic, nor does it lean to the other extreme of accepting that currently sanctified doctrine of 'free-will,' promulgated in the 18th and 19th centuries as the tenets of Calvinistic dogmatic theology. Rather, it is in agreement with the philosophy of Spinoza who taught there is a self-sufficing, lawful order of nature, which the human mind is sufficiently adequate to analyze. That all things are necessarily determined by nature, natural law, and therefore without miracles. That the laws of the universe are immutable; and man, as an integral part of the universe is subject to those laws. An application of that philosophy readily coincides with the currently recognized laws governing the theory of vibration and applied in modern radio transmission, the refraction of light, etc. On the same premises astrology is the study of man's reaction to the interaction of planetary vibration, or, the laws

of nature and the universe. Students should carefully read "How Planets Affect You" and "Powerful Planets" by Llewellyn George, "Man-Grand Symbol of the Mysteries" by Manly Hall, "Tertium Organum" by Ouspensky, and "The Philosophy of Spinoza" in this connection.

The easiest step in astrological research is the mathematical work of casting the maps or charts of the planetary positions. Several adequate texts are available but "Simplified Scientific Astrology" by Max Heindel, or "Practical Astrology for Everybody" by Llewellyn George are suggested. In addition to one of these texts a Heindel or Dalton "Tables of Houses" is required, together with geocentric ephemerides which show the place of the Sun daily to seconds. The Raphael, or the Barth "Die Deutsche Ephemeride," are very satisfactory and easily available.

Constantly keep in mind the premise that all mundane indications, major aspects of the planets, eclipses and sensitive points, affect everybody on earth, but no two persons are affected in exactly the same way, as indicated by the individual charts. This premise places natal astrology subservient to mundane—economic or national—astrology, which is the only scientific basis from the economic standpoint. Texts easily available for working guides are "Planetary Effects on Stock Market Prices" by James Mars Langham, "The Law of Values" by Sepharial, "A Text Book of Astrology" by A. J. Pearce, "Mundane Astrology" by Raphael, "Mundane Astrology, 10 Sections, by the Brotherhood of Light; "The Earth in the Heavens" and "The Stars" by L. Edward Johndro.

A great deal of disappointing experiment will be avoided if all radix, horary and progression methods of radical charts are ignored in early research. The maze of detail will only nonplus the student. In the beginning, and for all general indications thereafter, use only those charts which involve the major planetary conjunctions, and particularly the Mutation and

Rotational Conjunction maps of Jupiter-Saturn. Follow these with their Solar Return maps. In 'progressing' use the method of the ancients which is a diurnal map based on the Solar Return, of the major conjunction maps. Phenomenal results will accrue so far as general economic events and trends are concerned.

The minor trend can be located by correlating the Solar Ingress maps for each year with the Lunation and Lunar-Quadrate maps of each month. Then, last but very important, is the necessity of being constantly cognizant of all past eclipse and other sensitive points which continue operative, particularly if these points are accentuated by major fixed star positions.

With the many complexities and ramifications of human life it is impossible to say that this is all that is necessary. The details involving pivotal public people, powerful corporations, geographical locations, the signifiers of such items as the trend of steel ingot production, wheat, stocks, etc., are all separate from the whole, but they are inter-related and follow the same general trend together economically. And in approaching the study it is the general trend we are first concerned with. So far huge expenditures have been made in economic research without even unearthing clues to the probable general trend. Astro-economics has some answers for the problem.

With this foregoing method there will be no necessity for any imaginative hocus-pocus in order to fit a planetary indication into actual mundane events. In articles to follow an attempt will be made to point out forthcoming indications by this method. This may enable a large number of serious astro-economic researchers to compare their observations for the ultimate benefit of all concerned. Plans have been laid along this line pending the reaction of readers, as to their interest in the field.

A concluding point to grasp clearly is that, in mundane astrology at least, square or opposition aspects are not necessarily evil or adverse. Effects are dependent on the position of the planets involved in the figure as to aspect relationship, and sign occupancy; decan position, and to some extent even the dwadash-ama position. Sepharial in "The Manual of Astrology" and Alan Leo in "Esoteric Astrology" contribute to an analysis of this problem. Also, a very worthwhile treatise has been recently released by Sidney K. Bennett in "The Aspect Houses" for aspect relationship analysis.

### **Observations on the General Economic Outlook**

**1 9 3 3**

Astro-economics as a practical science must rise or fall on premises which can be easily checked by cold mathematical calculation. Day-dreaming metaphysical postulates have no place in the field, although this does not infer that the occult and esoteric part of natal astrology is to be totally discounted. But, in astro-economics, definite conclusions which are workable at all times must be evolved if scientific progress is to be made.

A check of the interaction of the major slow-moving planets in both good and adverse aspect during the past one hundred years of economic history reveals that major bad aspects mark periods of depression and major good aspects mark periods of boom. These periods are intensified or discounted in specific departments of economic life, depending on sensitive and eclipse points which may or may not be aroused at the time, and revealed in the charts for the particular period involved. In previous articles the writer has discussed some of these points.

In looking for the indications marking the general economic trend in 1933 it is found that six major favorable aspects will occur between the important slow moving planets—five quincunc aspects and one

trine. Of the quincunc aspects three are  $150^\circ$  each and two are  $210^\circ$  each. The trine is a  $240^\circ$  aspect. Note: Compute these aspects in a clockwise motion with the faster moving planet as significator.

There are no major adverse aspects during 1933, although some researchers might offer several which are rejected in the methods used by the Ancients in computing aspects. Added to the foregoing configurations are a Solar eclipse in  $5^\circ$  Pisces  $28'$  on February 24th and a Solar eclipse in  $27^\circ$  Leo  $44'$  on August 21st; Mercury is stationary six times, Mars two, Jupiter two, Saturn two, Uranus one and Neptune two; there are four quarterly Ingress figures; twelve Lunation figures; and several minor conjunctions. The general interpretation is that the outlook is optimistic and bullish with the general economic trend pointed to definite recovery, particularly in the last half of the year.

The  $150^\circ$ , or in reverse order, the  $210^\circ$  major aspects are related to the sixth and eighth houses of a mundane chart, involving the conditions of work, service, employment, agriculture, etc. in the former; and research, methods, to some extent public finance, finances with foreign powers, agreements, conservation, etc. in the latter. The entire five aspects in this regard are in general favorable. Accentuating these configurations is the  $240^\circ$  trine of Jupiter and Saturn which culminates on October 26th, involving in aspect ninth house matters or shipping, commerce, foreign relations, education, including publishing, radio, law, etc. If the student will fit these configurations into the major past conjunction figures and their diurnal Solar return figures, little difficulty should be experienced in timing the general economic trend, and picking out several of the important economic barometers.

In checking the general trend it is best to use a combined index of general economic activity, and then apply the inter-related minor cyclical indices to

specific significators. Use as a check such indicators as the Dow Jones Industrial Averages for stock prices, the New York Times Index for industrial activity, the Annalist Index of Wholesale Commodity Prices for trade, etc. For unknown reasons economists have not, until recently, attempted a combined weighted average of all the important indices of trade, business, industry and finance which would constitute a complete barometer of the general economic trend. Without such a barometer it is difficult to check the major configurations exactly. However, The Business Week, a McGraw Hill Publication on economics, some time ago formulated such a combined Index which is now available weekly. This combined index coincides exactly with our forecast, issued in these pages in 1931, that the general economic low point was first reached late in March 1932; although individual barometers of such indices as stock prices, bonds, commodity prices, industrial activity, employment and carloadings did not register their several lows until June and July 1932. Contrary however to the rapid rise this summer in these latter indices, the combined index has remained in a narrow range of about five points since the low in March, showing little upturn but also no further decline.

The writer conducts an investment and economic service business for business executives and investors, believing that semi-individual advice is necessary at least once a week to every economic layman. Therefore it is not his intention to attempt to forecast stock market trends for speculative purposes in these pages. Such a procedure tends to invite people unfamiliar with stock market operations to speculate, and perhaps suffer loss. **The purpose of this series is to attempt to make some slight contribution to those astro-economic researchers who have difficulty in checking their observations and methods with others.** In this connection the following may be of value during the first quarter of 1933.

**January, 1933**

Further steps in reconstruction plans towards accentuating recovery will come to the front in this month. Throughout the world the problem of unemployment and the difficulties of labor become paramount, resulting in many conferences and meetings which will turn out favorably. However, the difficulties in foreign affairs, particularly in Asia and the Far East, the condition of the common people and the repercussions of the general political and economic upheaval have not healed and the stock market is dull generally. However, if extreme care is exercised the present month will offer opportunities for investment which are unsurpassed in this generation.

The following days should be observed as marking days of important changes in market trend: the 3rd, 5th, 9th, 14th, 21st, 23rd, 28th and 30th.

**February, 1933**

This is a month of sensational announcements and developments throughout the world. The pessimism of years is passing, the world is attaining a foot hold in a recovery program. Although there continues to be considerable doubt expressed as to the future, with great unrest and a strong undercurrent of dissatisfaction, the stock market has rallying ability and the foundation is laid for a tremendous speculative boom.

The following days should be observed as marking days of important changes in market trend: the 1st, 2nd, 8th, 9th, 14th, particularly the 18th, 23rd and 25th.

**March, 1933**

The crossing and recrossing of Mars by transit over the August 31st, 1932 eclipse and Jupiter-Neptune Conjunction points, combined with its opposition to the February Solar eclipse point, will necessitate close observation in all mundane and natal figures



during this month. War talk from across the seas, unexpected announcements, violent political discord and many important changes impend in international affairs. The stock market responds in many displays of fireworks and the unexperienced trader will have to be careful to avoid the pitfalls of the financial tension. Students should particularly observe the period of the 6th to 10th and the 15th to 17th in all mundane affairs.

The following days should be observed as marking days of important changes in market trend; the 3rd, 10th, particularly the 14th, 21st and 27th.

while talking over the radio for "Literary Digest," gave a few of my points about the tragic deaths of every 5th President, and said,

"General Grant was a Democrat, who, owing to his war record, was put up on a fusion ticket for the Republican party, and with aid of split Democrats won the election as a "Republican."

This, I did not know when I wrote the article. I wish I had, for this would have checked up exactly my statement that every alternate 20 years, there is an overturn of parties. 1872 and 1876 were the periods which failed. Now that I know Grant was a Democrat it checks correctly.)

**BRIEF WEATHER FORECASTS****Temperature and Rainfall for First Quarter of 1933****By L. H. Weston**

A VERY BRIEF general weather forecast is given here by means of a table, in which the normals for the calendar months are given and the expected departures from those normals expressed by an algebraical sign. That is, a **plus** would indicate that somewhat more than the given normal is to be expected, while a **minus** sign indicates an expected deficiency, below the normal. Where the \* is inserted no very appreciable departure from the given normal is expected.

The fundamental essential of a weather forecast is to give the probable departure from the seasonal normal of temperature and rainfall. The normals are well known even to close fractions, but as a rule absolute normal weather only rarely prevails, and if we could estimate beforehand the probable way in which the variation would tend, no very much greater refinement is likely to be required. For example, take the forecast for San Diego as of January, 1933, which is estimated to be above normal both as to temperature and rainfall, then obviously a knowledge of the exact amount of excess, while it might in some respects be desirable, would in no way be essential to establish a reasonable expectation as to weather conditions in that month for that station.

The twelve stations given in this table are selected in such a way as to cover about twelve climatological regions in this country. It will be noticed that Albany and New York City have practically the same climate and weather changes. More than a hundred stations have been gone over in the original calculations, or about seven in each region. We might have given regions, instead of stations, and perhaps that will be done hereafter, when a more careful discussion of them can be given in a few lines.

### How I Apply the Daily Delineations in the "Astrological Bulletina."

Not as a student of astrology, but as a layman with a sincere interest in that science, I have evolved and used for the past two years, the following method for "tying in" astrology with my daily affairs:

Upon receipt of a new "Bulletina" I take a set of leaves for a pet vest-pocket note book and enter therein the daily forecasts as outlined for the next quarterly period. Using four lines for each day I write a brief summary for that, such as

This gives me my orders for the day, as you might say, but leaves sufficient space in which to note the hour and minute of anything which appears of sufficient importance to warrant checking up via astrology.

In the evening I consult the Planetary Time Table, note the next approaching aspect and mark the memorandum accordingly. And lastly, at the expiration of that quarter I file the notes, together with that quarter's "Bulletina," for future reference, having found many occasions where they are of value.

How correctly these delineations check, when often immediate appearances vary from the "diagnosis" in the "Bulletina," is many times startling. An example, decidedly fresh in my mind, occurred on Sept. 2nd last. At 5:50 p. m. we received word that a close relative had been badly injured in an auto accident. We were greatly worried and upset at the news but as quickly as possible I consulted the "Bulletina," found that the oncoming aspect read G  $\searrow$  P  $\odot$ , (Moon in  $\sphericalangle$ , 1st quarter).

The Moon parallel Sun, and the interpretation of that aspect so far as an auto accident was concerned, meant nothing to me as layman. But that capital G made me confident that things were not as bad as they appeared, and it so turned out. The injuries were "next door" to serious, but have progressed satisfactorily in spite of the injured's 67 years.

As early as possible the next morning I phoned the son of the lady who was driving the car and he told me that, while his mother had been taken to the hospital for observation, it was believed that it was only a matter of nervous shock. Again I consulted the "Bulletina," the next aspect reading: A ♃ □ ♂, (♃ same). This lady died that night.

While this particular occurrence is considerably more dramatic than my usual reasons for consulting the "Bulletina." It is one of many examples I have had where the immediate appearances were opposite the interpretations in the "Bulletina," and where the "Bulletina" was right. I now accept these interpretations without reservation, and base my future actions on my particular question accordingly.

Then, when a particular problem or question warrants it, I amplify this by taking the data to a qualified astrologer for more detailed information, thus giving me a completely rounded out picture of that particular problem or question. The conscientious and sincere assistance which I receive amply repays the small cost and, having watched the outcome of a number of these questions, I find that I have been saved both time and money losses. Many time, irrespective of how good or how bad a question looked at the time, I have followed their advice and in no instance have I regretted it.

Lastly, and again referring to that little note-book, let me say that it is of great value in arranging important appointments. When to see or "re-see" a man requires only a quick glance at the book and an opportunity to suggest a favorable day. In fact it is surprising how many times it helps. —C. E. P.

### Overland With the "Bulletina"

'Tis said that the proof of the pudding is in the eating thereof and it is true! Not until after taking a cross country auto trip in company with my "little blue pal," the "Bulletina," was it possible to prove both to myself and a group of friends how really exact astrology is and how scientific its findings are if one will only observe them and keep an account of the results.

We left for Chicago on Friday, July 1st, under Venus sextile to Neptune at 4:22 a. m., leaving at 4:05 in order to play safe and get started under this most pleasant ray. The next aspect shown in the table was Moon semi-square Mercury which brought us to a halt in Death Valley due to the lack of proper oil distribution on the valves of our Franklin sedan. After spreading the liquid on in a temporary fashion we proceeded without further difficulty until 4:59 p. m. At this time the Moon-Saturn adverse ray slowed us down by bringing rough roads so we called a halt and stopped for dinner. After some driving in the darkness we stopped for the night near Salt Lake City at the close of a day's run of 607 miles with but the one minor difficulty.

Next morning, Saturday July 2nd, we left at 3:50 on the Moon sextile Uranus and drove until we ran into some slight showers near Laramie, Wyoming, as the Moon entered Cancer at 4:07 p. m. (5:07 Mountain time). We stopped in Laramie under the good Moon-Mercury aspect to enjoy a wonderful dinner and proceeded to Cheyenne in the darkness over some bad curves as Mercury paralleled Mars at 7:54 Mt. time. Leaving next morning under good Moon-Neptune aspect at 4:09 Mt. time, we made good time until 2:50 Central time when several erratic drivers almost wrecked us. We were brought to a stop by a washed out road thru which all machines proceeded in single file in deep mud. An irrigation ditch had overflowed and washed out the entire road for over a mile. Road repair gangs were at work and super-

vised our passage. At 4:20 Central time, New Moon, we stopped in Omaha at the home of relatives and after giving them a surprise at our unexpected arrival we enjoyed an excellent meal. Left Omaha at 8 p. m. but were held up for some time at 8:05 by a long freight train which obstructed our path when Mercury opposed Saturn; this aspect also caused us to become confused and without the "Bulletina's" warning about misdirection we might have gone for miles on the wrong road. Due to its cautioning words however we "checked and double checked" with the result that we found our way back to the correct road within five minutes after one party had misdirected us. However the adverse rays continued to work that night and we got little sleep due to the fire crackers and noise in the street under our hotel window. Continuing our journey the morning of the "Fourth" everything went fine until the Moon squared Uranus at which time we went "haywire," took the wrong road despite every precaution but doubled back and recovered our proper bearings fifteen minutes later, only to run into some very crazy drivers and a traffic jam in which we were almost wrecked several times. Finally reached our objective shortly after the aspect culminated and discovered that the aged mother of our companion had been injured and operated on, greeting us at the door with a bandaged leg and foot which coincided with a remark I had made to my friends that if we arrive under this Moon square Uranus or immediately after its culmination we shall hear of an accident to the old lady. The accuracy of this prediction is still puzzling my companions on this "star" guided journey. Owing to a Moon opposition Saturn ray at 7:26 the next morning I advised that we remain until 8:30 a. m., but they insisted upon leaving, so we left—in a driving rain storm!

Entering Chicago under good rays, we went to work with vim and vigor, arranged appointments for the 6th and much to the wonder of my companions things all seemed to break "our way."



Skipping over the many other interesting facts which I tabulated on the journey, we will pass to the afternoon and evening of Monday, July 11th, at which time the Moon squared Saturn and stopped us on the return journey with an avalanche of water out of the mountains near Las Vegas which effectively stopped our progress and that of everyone by washing over the road at a height of five feet, overturning three cars which tried to pioneer their way through. Every one figured that it would be sometime the next day before we could get through but I just turned to the little "blue pal," noted the next Moon-Neptune aspect which occurred at 36 minutes after midnight and said, "We'll be able to pass through that stream and ford it safely at 36 minutes after midnight." They looked at me in amazement and then chuckled as I added, "Now let's turn back to that auto camp and get some dinner." Owing to the tie-up of the entire road the camp was full and we ate dinner in company with many other marooned drivers all of whom laughed at my assurance we could get through at midnight until a car came rushing back at a little after midnight to tell us that the waters were going down. We all rushed to our cars and drove back to the washout, arriving there at 12:30 a. m., just as the line of cars started to move through the waters, feeling their way as the stream subsided. The first car went through at exactly 36 minutes after midnight and we passed through safely a few minutes later, all eyes on the dashboard clock with its telltale hands confirming astrology. I never learned what the other skeptics thought or said when their cars forded that stream at the time I had predicted, thanks to the "Bulletina," but I do know that my companions on the trip are now confirmed students of astrology.

One of them said recently that when nature tells her plans for her future action, as she did in regard to that stream, he was ready to believe anything.

### REGARDING APPARENT DIFFERENCE BETWEEN "GUIDE" and "BULLETINA"

The planetary aspects as given in the "ASTROLOGICAL BULLETINA" show the time of their exact **culmination**, or the moment of **maximum intensity** and they are given in the order of their astronomical sequence without reference to any other aspect.

In the "PLANETARY DAILY GUIDE" the favorable and unfavorable days are indicated by the **combined** astrological influences of planetary aspects, just as the chemist finds that certain elements mixing make a compound; so that in reality there is no difference between the "Planetary Daily Guide" and the "Bulletina," yet it is improper to check the daily indications of the "Guide" against the "Bulletina" culminating aspects.

For instance, a certain kind of food may be good, but when combined with some other kinds of food, it might become indigestible and produce poisons in the system.

The aspects in the "Bulletina" might be said to represent **volts** in electricity, which stand for **force**; the aspects in the "Guide" might be compared to **amperes**, which represent **volume**. Volts and amperes are entirely different conditions of the same principle, and, therefore, although registering the same element, are not to be checked against each other.

## HOW TO USE THE PLANETARY TIME TABLES

In the back part of each "Bulletina," just before the advertising section, are several pages of symbols which show, IN PACIFIC TIME, exactly when every planetary aspect is **complete** in each day of the month.

At times stated, aspects are at maximum intensity.

For instance, suppose you receive a business proposition, or receive a letter stating someone has been taken ill: Turn to the table of Daily Aspects in "Bulletina," find the date and note the nature of the aspect which **NEXT** occurs after the time you received it. If it is beneficent in its nature it is a testimony that the matter will turn out beneficially, or that the sick will recover.

On the other hand, if the next aspect is of adverse nature it is an unfavorable indication for the matter.

In this, it should be clearly understood that the time taken must be when you **FIRST** hear the news, receive the proposition or **read** the letter. In other words, the **time of the birth** of the idea in your mind, will show by the next oncoming aspect what to expect of the outcome. Do not use an aspect that has **passed**.

Suppose that you receive a letter saying that someone was about to lose their business, and reference to the table of symbols showed that the next aspect after reading the letter was benign in its nature—you would have reason to believe that the matter would not turn out so badly as your correspondent expected and that there was a chance to avoid the difficulty. Whereas, if the next aspect had been of adverse nature it is quite likely the dire news would prove true. In either case the advance information thus gained might be made of immense value.

If you note the hour and date that you meet a person for the first time and look it up in the "Bulletina," you can tell how that acquaintanceship is going to result, by the nature of the **next oncoming aspect**.

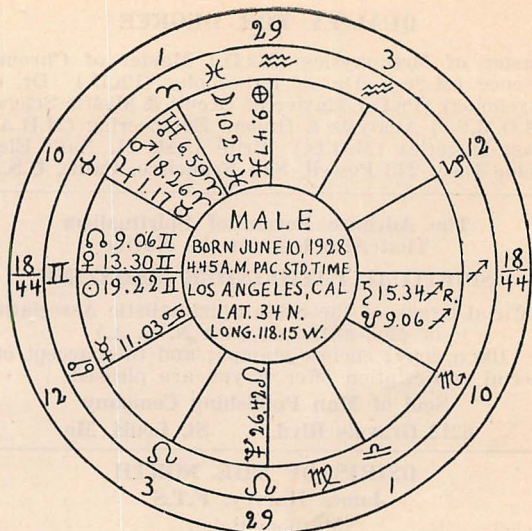


Chart of the Astrologer's younger Son.

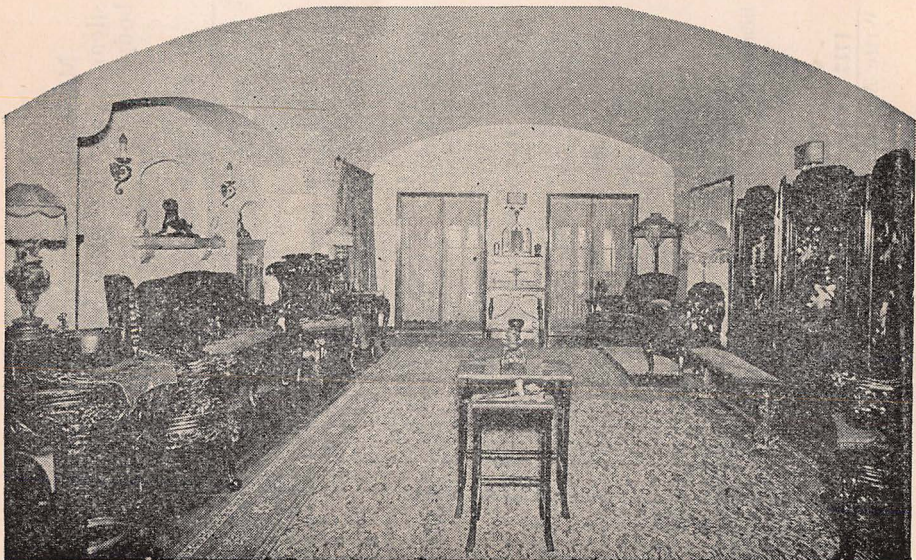

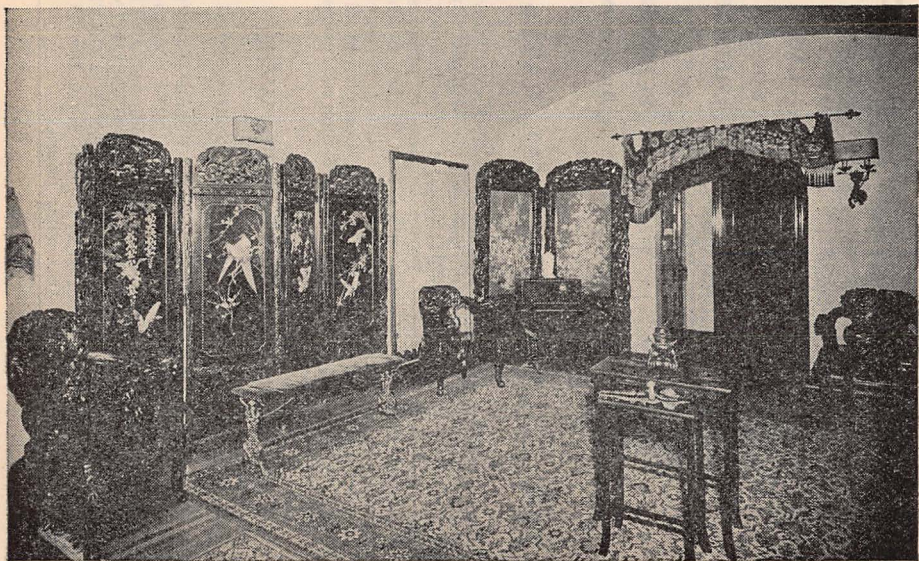

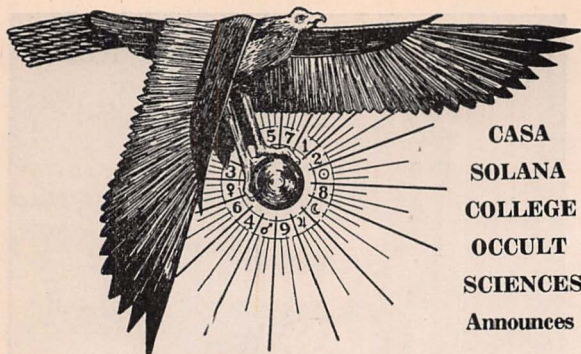
