Chats with the Editor

Astrologers Registration Act



IN previous issue of the Bulletina I described an Ordinance relating to a ban on Fortune-Telling known as Section 43.30 of Los Angeles Municipal Code, which stated as follows:

"No person shall carry on or engage in the business of fortune-telling, or in any manner advertise to tell fortunes."

This was passed by the City Council on November 13th, 1944, but later when it came up for final approval it was not affirmed. Therefore, it was not adopted as part of the Municipal Code. Inasmuch as the previous Ordinance had been declared invalid by the City Attorney's office, because it contained a clause exempting religious practitioners, there is at present no "fortune-telling" Ordinance in effect. The police are not idle, however, and are arresting those who appear to be "fortune-telling." Representatives of Educational Astrology Incorporated have been told by city officials that students, teachers of classes, and other qualified astrologers who practice ethically are not in the category of those susceptible to arrest.

"Educational Astrology Incorporated" is a group of qualified astrologers, teachers, lecturers and friends of astrology, the officers and members of which represent numerous other societies and classes. One of the purposes of the Corporation is to take necessary steps to protect the constitutional rights to teach and practice and do research work in the legitimate manner to which such people are accustomed. None of the members of "Educational Astrology Incorporated" have ever been arrested on a charge of fortune-telling for the good reason that they are not engaged in fortune-telling. We are therefore not opposed to a law against fortune-tellers; that is, those who pretend to have knowledge of Astrology and thereby abuse Astrology by violation of the code of public policy.

However, there is good reason to believe that the present quiescence regarding the City Ordinances will not long continue. Someone will present another Ordinance like its predecessors which indiscriminately classed all astrological activity as "fortune-telling." In that event we shall again be compelled to spend money, time and labor to prevent it becoming law, on the grounds of class legislation.

The Solution

In the minds of many who have been engaged with this problem, and others who have given the matter considerable thought, there seems to be one practical solution: Through State Legislation obtain the right for qualified astrologers to practice under license—the usual manner in which the exponents of other professions practice.

In fact, this was also the concensus of opinion expressed at astrological mass meetings two years ago resulting in a Bill being presented to the California Legislature at Sacramento seeking to set up a State Board of Astrological Examiners for the purpose of licensing qualified astrologers to practice. That Assembly Bill successfully passed through the Governmental Efficiency and Economy Committee and went on to the Ways and Means Committee. Here it was found that the cost of operating such a Board of Examiners would far exceed its income, and, as there were no State Appropriation Funds for such a purpose, there was no alternative but to withdraw the Bill. This we did, rather than have it come on the Committee floor and be killed. In withdrawing the Bill we did so with the understanding that the astrological fraternity would at the next Legislative Session in 1945 present a Bill simplified in the manner suggested, that is, void of the objectionable encumbrances. However, we learned a lot through that effort, and astrology thereby gained a lot of influential friends.

*

The California State Assembly convened in February this year to receive Bills, and, in accordance with its promise, the astrological fraternity presented a Bill. A simplified Bill, seeking only the right to give qualified astrologers State license to practice. This Astrologic Practice Bill No. 1804 has been assigned to the same Governmental Efficiency and Economy Committee. Some of its enemies were not re-elected; likewise some of its friends. Hence we will have to make another valiant effort to convince the new members of the need and merits of such a Bill so they will feel inclined to give it the green light, or the "do pass" in legislative terminology.

You Can Help

The State Assembly adjourned at the end of February until March 5th, 1945, when they reconvene to hear and act on the more than 3000 Bills presented. In the one month period of the adjournment the legislators are supposed to read, study and otherwise inform themselves about each Bill. The State Printing Department mailed each legislator a copy of all the Bills on or about February 15th, leaving very little time for them to be read and studied. Legislators do not have sufficient time to become thoroughly familiar with or understand all of them, consequently, they welcome letters from their constituents which will aid them to determine the importance, need or merit of a particular Bill and the number of people interested in it.

The most critical situation in the history of Astrology now faces California; and similar emergencies will arise in every other state of the Union unless those who love Astrology rise equal to the occasion and master the problem here and now.

It has been discovered that an organization in the field of science, which has long decried Astrology, has a concerted effort afoot to introduce legislation everywhere (California in particular) through State, County and Municipal laws which are intended not merely to curtail astrological activities, but to suppress them so drastically that they shall be entirely eliminated.

It is their intention to eliminate every phase of astrological work by law. This would include all societies, classes, schools, churches or other organizations which in any way include Astrology in their activities. This would affect teachers, lecturers, writers, ministers, astrologers, and any others who expound Astrology either for, or without, payment directly or indirectly. The penalty for the violation of such a law is by a heavy fine or imprisonment; or both.

It Can Be Defeated

There is a way to defeat that sinister movement, but it requires quick, energetic and positive action by every one who is in any way interested in Astrology.

You know that Astrology rightly understood and practiced is honorable, educational, uplifting, inspiring and exceedingly beneficial as a means of guidance; and, as such, it merits the support of every one interested in the progress of humanity. Astrology offers broad fields for research in the realms of psychology, healing, social-welfare, vocational guidance, etc., as related to Solar, Lunar and Planetary Vibrations: their influences and responses from the human, animal, vegetable and mineral kingdoms.

These features are too significant and too important to be ignored or neglected, or trampled down by certain "intellectuals" who, because they are unaware of these values, would legislate Astrology out of existence.

To forestall such inimical laws, we who are interested in Astrology must act quickly and present our own Bill to the Legislature.

Inform the State Legislature

If you live in California, you can greatly help this movement to protect and advance the interests of Astrology and astrological exponents by sending a SHORT letter to your Senators and Assemblymen at Sacramento.

Your Help is Important

This is vitally important, and we believe you will be glad to exert your very best effort at this time of great danger to a Noble Cause.

Your immediate action will be effective in the movement to give Astrology and astrologers a legal status and the right to demonstrate the values of Astro-Science without molestation.

Friends of Astrology

Speak to every one you know who may be interested in Astrology in any way: teachers, high-school and college students, magazine readers, professionals, business people, etc. Have them sign both of your letters and give their address. Then you mail the letters to your two Representatives in Sacramento.

Give Them a Shower

If the Senators and Assemblymen receive a great many letters of this kind, they will realize that an organized effort is being made by a large number of people and that the matter deserves attention: favorable attention, we hope, in the form of votes for the passage of the Bill.

Assembly Bill No. 1804 is a Splendid Bill

This is a good Bill. It has been carefully examined by a Judge and an Assemblyman, and other well-informed persons. All of them say it is excellently formulated. It is designed to advance the standard of Astrology by giving it legal recognition. It will create public respect for Astrology by assuring that only qualified astrologers shall be permitted to present it to the public. It protects Astrology; it protects the public. It is assurance that quacks, pretenders, fortune-tellers, etc., who heretofore have preyed upon the public in the guise of Astrology, can no longer do so.

Professional Dignity

On the other hand, astrologers and teachers who can properly erect and read a horoscope will be glad to have their work legally established and will be proud of their professional status which will be on a par with other professions. Every feature of the Bill was carefully examined and approved at a meeting of the officers, teachers and students representing various Societies, as well as by many others not particularly identified with any organization.

The time for every loyal advocate of Astrology to act is NOW.

Read the list of California Senators and Assemblymen. Choose those who represent your district and send them a letter with the signatures and addresses of your friends, students, clients, etc.

Simply address them (as for instance)—

Senator (John Doe), State Office Bldg., Sacramento, California.

or Assemblyman (John Doe), as the case may be.

Get students and friends to sign both of your letters. Typewrite the letter if possible, but in any event make it concise, friendly and legible. Get as many signatures as possible. Fill the space below the letter with signatures, and fill the other side also.

For instance, send one letter to the Senator whose address is in the city nearest yours. If you live in La Jolla, Oceanside, or Point Loma, or anywhere thereabouts, you should send one of the letters to the San Diego Senator, Edward R. Fletcher of District 40 (see Senators' list) but do not send the letter to his home address in San Diego. Address it to him as Senator Edward R. Fletcher, State Office Bldg., Sacramento, California.

This same rule applies to the Assemblymen. Examine the list and find the address of an Assemblyman nearest to your address and mail one of your typewritten letters to him, addressed as Assemblyman (his name) State Office Bldg., Sacramento, California.

INSTRUCTIONS

For Mailing Letters With Signatures of Yourself and Friends.

In this list of Senators and Assemblymen for the California State Legislature the figure before each name designates the political district from which that member was elected. The word (or words) at end of each line, after the colon (:), designates the counties represented by each member. This gives you two means of identifying your representatives. Large cities are, naturally, divided into several districts, so we have given such addresses as are available. Choose the name whose address is nearest your residence. If street address (in large cities) is not given, you may find it in your local telephone directory, and then proceed as beforementioned. There is one Senator and one Assemblyman from your district. This means that two letters are to be written by every one who is earnestly desirous of helping the Cause of Astrology. You have helped to elect these legislators by your supporting vote, which entitles you to reciprocal consideration from them, particularly as this is an educational movement designed to benefit the public at large.

A Cloud Over Europe

By Karleen S. Lyon



HE big summer eclipse, July 9, 1945, in Cancer 16° 57′, will be a matter of considerable interest to us for two reasons. First, it falls close to the Midheaven (Cancer 16° 45′) of the Hazelrigg chart of the Declaration of Independence in 1776. Second, it falls in the midst of an eclipse condition that has persisted over Europe for nearly a hundred years and will continue into the beginning of the twenty-first century.

The writer does not recall seeing any mention of the progressed primary direction eclipses of the great Mutation Conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn. Here the primary directions of Sun and Moon, both direct and converse, are falling so close to perfect oppositions in the European area as to form eclipse effects that are found nowhere else among the capitals of the world. They persist for so many years that I call them "creeping eclipses."

The handy rule for computing primary directions evolved by Sepharial in his "Primary Directions Made Easy" involves finding the polar elevations of the Sun and Moon in the radical map. He then considers these as the ascending latitudes (like the latitude of the place for which the map is set) and we have two extra maps with the Sun or Moon on either the Ascendant or Descendant, depending on whether it is on the eastern or western side of the original chart.

With these polar elevations pinch-hitting for latitudes, we enter the appropriate place in a Table of Houses and progress to the Ascendant, or Descendant, of the Solar and Lunar maps. It is the same old measure, one degree passing the Midheaven equals one year. This brings every point of the circle to the Sun and Moon under their proper polar elevations and you can progress easily and rapidly to the Midheaven, Ascendant, Sun and Moon of any chart you select. It is astonishingly easy, once you get the hang of it. And the results are surprising!*

^{*} To figure your primary directions, enter the Table of Houses for the latitude of the place in the usual way, taking out your M. C. and Asc. Find your radical M. C. and Asc. and this line is the year of the conjunction, 1842. The line above it will give the M. C. and Asc. for 1843, converse; and the line below gives the M. C. and Asc. for 1843, direct. You have only to follow them in this order, each line representing one year. For the Sun and Moon, take the polar elevations given and use them as you would a latitude, placing the Luminary on the Ascendant of a new circle if it is on the east side of the radical figure; or on the Descendant if you find it on the west side of the radix. Find the right latitude in the Table of Houses and then locate your Solar or Lunar place. If the Sun is on the east, look for Aquarius 5; if on the west side, for Leo 5; and then progress just as you did for the radical Ascendant. If the Moon is eastward in the chart, look for Cancer

In the radical map of the Mutation Conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn, January 26, 1842, we have a primary chart that will persist until these two planets have completed their conjunctions in the earthy trigon (Capricorn, Virgo and Taurus), and pass into the airy trigon about 2080 A. D.

When you have entered the Elements of the Horoscope into a blank you will note at once that the Moon in 28 degrees of Cancer is applying by 7 degrees to the opposition of the Sun in 5 of Aquarius. If the opposition had been exact, it would have formed a very good Lunar eclipse, which results when the Earth is just between the Sun and Moon.

The idea of progressed eclipse effects in radical charts is not new and striking effects can be counted on when one of the Luminaries moves opposite, or in conjunction with, the other by regular progressed directions. The result in this particular case, when the capitals of the various countries of both hemispheres were considered, proved rather breath-taking.

When examined, we find the two Luminaries moving at different rates of speed. This is on account of their places in the different maps, which in some cases gave them hardly any polar elevation and in others almost the latitude of the country. Also the signs of long and short ascension on the Midheavens retard or accelerate the Ascendants.

Berlin's progressed Ascendant direct: Gemini 27, close to 7th cusp, made an opposition to the radical Ascendants of London, Paris, and other capitals in that area, in 1939. Also note a creeping eclipse at this point in the London map. Berlin attacked Russia in 1941 (June 22) when her prog. M. C. direct in Aquarius 22 came into opposition with Russia's prog. M. C. converse in Leo 21.

Kyoto: Sun progressed converse is conjunct Moon progressed direct, a Solar eclipse. This point, Scorpio 2, was conjunct Ascendant of U. S. radical mutation chart in 1941.

Washington: M. C. progressed converse is conjunct Moon progressed converse. This point, Aries 29, is opposite the radical M. C. of London.

In our country, for example, by direct primary motion, the Sun (of the Mutation Chart) had progressed by 1941 from Aquarius through Pisces and Aries to Taurus 25. The Moon had gone from Cancer 28 through Leo, Virgo and Libra to Scorpio 19. It was then about 6 degrees from a perfect opposition or Lunar eclipse.

In middle Europe, on the contrary, the direct progressions moved more rapidly and showed the Luminaries in Cancer and Capricorn, close to the area of the Mutation Conjunction itself (Capricorn 8°),—about a full sign ahead of the Washington progressions. At London it was just entering Cancer and Capricorn. At Berlin a little farther advanced, and in Leningrad, where the Russian capital was situated at the time of the Mutation Conjunction, it was a perfect eclipse, with the Sun in Cancer 25 and the Moon in Capricorn 25. Farther east, at Peking and Tokio, the direct progressions are still in Taurus and Scorpio. Here they keep moving farther apart and will never make the close oppositions that are found in Europe. With a Table of Houses at hand you can easily follow these variations.

At Leningrad the progressions ran in the same degrees, Capricorn and Cancer 6 in 1916; 7 degrees in 1917-18; and 8 degrees in 1919, running far ahead of the positions in Berlin. History bears evidence of the grass root changes effected in the life and social outlook of Russia during those crucial years, which corresponds to the period now in operation in middle Europe; that is, the Lunar eclipse effect is on the position of the original conjunction in Capricorn 8. Still keeping close to the perfect opposition, this creeping eclipse will fall in Cancer-Capricorn 26 degrees in 1945 at Leningrad. This is in conjunction with the radical Venus that joins the Sun in the loose opposition to the radical Moon. The exact progressed conjunction with the Moon comes in 1948.

At this time the progressions show both a Solar and Lunar eclipse, since the progressed Sun is conjunct the radical Moon (a Solar eclipse) as well as in opposition to the progressed Moon. In 1960 the progressed Moon comes to the place of the radical Sun, again forming a so-called Solar eclipse as well as the creeping Lunar eclipse. These Solar eclipses, of course, do not persist, since one point is stationary and the other moving, but may be considered effective for about three years each.

At Kyoto, the capital of Japan at the time of the conjunction, the Sun does not reach Cancer 28 until the year 2000, when the Moon is in Sagittarius 21. As an eclipse effect it would be negligible. Washington reaches this critical area about 1990.

So we find on examining all of the capitals, omitted here for brevity, that roughly, London and Paris are now entering Capricorn and Cancer with their direct progressions of Sun and Moon, but have not yet reached the conjunction area in Capricorn 8. Berlin and middle

Europe are at about the crucial point. Russia leads in point of time, as well as closeness of aspect.

There is a second eclipse area, formed by the converse directions, in middle Europe that is now in the first decans of Taurus and Scorpio and close enough to make itself felt. Leningrad's converse eclipse formed in Scorpio 13 and Taurus 11 in 1938, a visit to Berlin's Midheaven (Scorpio 13) that was probably little appreciated. At Berlin it forms an exact square to the radical Sun in 1943-1948, the Moon making the square aspect first and then the Sun.

This second creeping eclipse will continue moving against the order of signs until it reaches radical Pluto in 19 degrees of Aries. This will be 1964-1969 in Berlin; 1949-1956 at Washington; and 1972-1975 for Russia. It is not close enough at Washington to count for much of an eclipse, but is very close for Russia and fairly so for Berlin.

While Washington was not particularly upset by these two eclipses that will affect Europe for so long, it stuck its fingers in the buzz saw when the Ascendant by direct progression (Capricorn 26 in 1943) came into conjunction with the radical Venus, a planet that is ruler of the Ascendant of our national chart. And late the following year it made the exact opposition of the radical Moon. It will catch up with the Sun's radical place in 1950. The converse Moon comes to Pluto in 1949, converse Midheaven in 1951, and converse Sun in 1956.

We have considerable reason to be interested in the directions to Pluto, since this planet has figured prominently in the history of Japanese aggression. In Aries 19, close to the Sagittarian decan, it is placed in Japan's 11th house, affecting the fifth by opposition. The country was opened to foreign trade by our Commodore Perry under strong Uranian aspects, the treaty being signed March 31, 1854.

At this time Pluto had not been affected by direct contact with the significators (Sun, Moon, M. C., and Asc.). The first came in 1880, when M. C. direct contacted Pluto. In 1879 Japan annexed the Loo Choo Islands. This was followed by a spirited policy in Korea, over Chinese protests, the reorganization of its army, and the creation of a strong navy,—or at least its beginnings. The next direct aspect was the Ascendant converse conjunct Pluto in 1902-03. It marked the Russo-Japanese war, with material gains as well as a clearer glimpse of Japanese ambitions.

The Sun, direct, formed the conjunction in 1917, when Japan laid the foundation for an armored line of defense around her empire by fortifying the islands she had received from the former German colonies after the first World War, contrary to the terms of her mandate. The Moon, converse, came to this point in 1941-42. These are all the direct contacts to be made with Pluto's radical place. Coming to the opposition point, Libra 19, 5th radical house, was the Moon direct in 1927. Universal manhood suffrage was adopted in 1925. By 1928 the

continued activity of the Communist elements caused severe action on the part of the government. The converse Sun contacts the point in 1952, direct Ascendant in 1971-72; and converse M. C. in 1984.

There is much food for thought in these sketchy figures and the whole subject richly repays careful study. The Sun, the great arbiter and source of power in the universal scheme, is found in the first decan of Aquarius in this powerful conjunction. Since we are within orbs of the Aquarian Age, we must consider this position in studying any great mutational changes in our civilization. Also the fact that the coming mutational conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn, early in the 21st century, opens in the Aquarian sign of the airy trigon.

It has probably been noted by astrological students that the aggressor nations are all in some way connected with Aquarius. Russia and Prussian Germany come under this rule. France and Italy are in the opposite sign of Leo, while Japan is in the geodetic area ruled by Leo.

We should study carefully and with sympathy the birth pangs of a new political Russia. The ominous European eclipses came to it early and hard. We cannot afford to take too seriously any experimental form of government that leans too far to the left, or that gives too little scope to individual opportunity and freedom of mind. After all, water finds its own level and Aquarius is an intellectual sign and one of brotherhood and good-will. Give them time. The war has already mellowed the first harsh outlines of government and given it a broader and more international outlook. Suffering is a hard schoolmaster, but a thorough one.

Japan, so recently out of the swaddling clothes of mediæval psychology, is also a subject for sympathy. We had no right to expect from her so high a standard of action as Germany should have given us,—but did not. Japan is said to be under the rulership of Aries (zodiacal) and in Aries at the time of its mutational conjunction we find Pluto. Taking Scorpio as its tentative sign, we expect to find politicians here who are deep and devious in their habits of thought. Deep schemes and far-reaching, since that planet is about to enter the expansive-minded Sagittarian decan of Aries. It is also a sign of regeneration, where the soul enters the higher worlds through the gates of death and passes on its way through Sagittarius, Capricorn and Aquarius. Then on to rebirth in Aries.

The United States made its contact with Pluto in 1907, when prog. Sun direct (of Mutation Chart) was conjunction Pluto; when Theodore Roosevelt did his best to lead us into more seemly political pastures. The prog. Moon's contact comes in 1949; the Midheaven's in 1951; and the Ascendant's in 1995. Pluto is in the Sixth House!

Truly, we are on the threshold of a great new era and we should tune our souls to its vibrations.

CANCER

DISEASE AND ZODIACAL SIGN

MAGINE for a moment you lived in the tropics and a vast army of ants paid your vicinity a visit at night. You would soon learn that wherever stinging and wandering ant armies go, they spread terror in the insect world, for their presence means sure death. Beetles, wasps, cockroaches, woodlice, centipedes are seized forthwith and torn to bits. You might think that at least grasshoppers could save themselves by

jumping away, but such is not the case; they seem to be paralyzed by fright. Their hind legs are amputated at once, and soon they are torn to bits.

As soon as the army reaches a bush, an alien ant-nest, a heap of leaves, or any other welcome booty, a large detachment led by officers advances to the attack. The insects which they pursue try to save themselves by climbing on twigs, stones or roots, but the Huns follow them everywhere. In bewilderment, the prey jump down into the midst of the black army.

The nest of Alien Ants is taken possession of at once. In most cases, every individual ant is torn to pieces and eaten, together with all the eggs and larvae. Stinging Ants are a hunting race, pursuing as they do all insects and living exclusively on their meat. Their brood is not fed from the crop, as is the case with other ants, but with raw meat. The booty is torn apart and the small bits are fed to the larvae. Their almost exclusive flesh diet explains the carrion-like odor of these ants. The stolen larvae and pupae of some species, such as the Sooty-haired Garden Ants, are never reared, but serve as food.

The difference between the lower and human kingdoms lies in the degree of consciousness involved and in the corresponding responsibility for misdeeds perpetrated. In man every act is linked with self-consciousness and with self-determining motives. In the animal kingdom, the governing natural impulses involved are unreasoning, instinctive and unvolitional. In man, however, negative emotional expressions and other destructive tendencies are capable of resistance and reasoned control. Human beings have the faculty of moral discernment, self-directing intelligence and freedom of choice.

The animal and human trait of hoarding, robbing, plundering or eating to excess is a half-breed made up of equal parts of greed and fear; indeed greed is the twin brother of fear. There is a little word

of three letters which stands for one of the most tremendous and important principles in the Universe; this little word is spelled U-S-E. Surfeit, hoarding, robbing, plundering and profiteering are the polar opposite of utility, and they are evil in exact proportion as utility is good. Intelligent utility is divine; while ignorant hoarding or surfeit, plundering, robbing or profiteering is nefarious. The spoils of the robber are invariably the surplus of the robbed.

The only permanent creation is that accomplished through the simultaneous and continuous equal action of the building and tearing down processes. All unhealthy conditions are caused by the unbalanced application of these two principles. Utility is natural; hoarding or surfeit, robbing or profiteering are unnatural and unbrotherly; the former complies with natural law, while the latter violates and opposes it.

The attraction or preponderance of too much unutilized building material in the organism will produce cell proliferation or cancer. It gives rise to erratic cell patterns of revolutionary design. Instead of healthy, upright cells in spaced regularity of rows, morbid cells pile up in crazy heaps, some unaccountable in direction, some huge, all disorderly, growing without apparent rhyme or reason. This violent deviation from the norm follows the law of parasitic growth, acquired without toil—a typical example of physiological "profiteering."

Thought is the creator; the destiny of each man is cast in the design he wills into his consciousness. Any perversion of the power of suggestion or negation of emotional generosities gives rise to chemical changes that definitely alter the organic states, and in time affect, even profoundly, the body's structural integrity.

If a certain mood is persisted in for long periods, a crystallization of mental attitude takes place. An organized group of these related ideas rises to considerable power, gradually acquiring a decisive, almost absolute control of consciousness, and silencing every thought in opposition. Psychic insurrection occurs when a group of adverse mental habits becomes so strongly entrenched as to be able to stamp its imprint on the body. This group seeks not only to free itself from the sovereignty of the will, but to eliminate it utterly, and to establish a tyrannical mastery over the cells. Seceding from the commonweath of consciousness, such a group of associated evil ideas assumes role of psychic dictator.

A psychic blueprint such as this may be examined as a possible unsuspected cause of the prevalent disease, cancer. The human network of cells, vast and co-operative, works in natural harmony under the supervision of the central intelligence. Suddenly there is mutiny; certain cells break loose from any control and, like anarchists, run amuck. Renouncing allegiance to physiological rhythms, they constitute themselves lawgivers; the cancerous result is chaos indescribable.

In the case of a quick, ambitious type of person who becomes cancerously infected, a critical scalpel will probe a ruinous direction of his life-energies. His desires are for personal possessions and self-aggrandizements—desires cumulative and never-satisfied. He creates a mental picture that flashes a corresponding message over the nerves; this blue-print of avarice influences every cell of his human edifice. When such a mental attitude attains a degree of permanence, the morbid cells so impressed invade by unlawful trespass the recesses of normal cells, and seize them by force. This rapacity is sufficient account for rapidity of their growth.

Like a class of men who seek only to outwit or despoil their brothers in the economic struggle, these morbit cells, following the pattern set in the transgressor's mind, experience little difficulty in asserting themselves vigorously over the devitalized and decomposing tissue upon which they locate. Here they may plunder and prosper at the expense of enfeebled cell neighbors. With cannibal-like propensity, their rapid multiplication is a reflection of the blueprint formed by the transgressor's greed, willed into his consciousness in the forms of bully and pirate, abetted by the cunnings drawn from psychic energies of selffishness.

It is common knowledge as well as an every day occurrence that fear of not getting enough causes people to hoard and unconsciously to overeat. The cells of the human edifice respond to the suggestion, and weave similar erratic tissue patterns, preponderating in nitrogen. Nitrogen is that dense form of matter which Nature uses for the elaboration of its proteins for tissue replenishment of human and animal organisms. When there is a great desire for security and fear of not having enough of the material goods of life, the cells also begin to hoard. This gives rise to a psychic appetite for a redundency of proteins, notably of the flesh varieties, as well as to increased absorption and assimilation of tissue-replenishing proteins from the blood, along with greater nitrogen (protein) retention by the cell.

Popular opinion assigns man's cell lives and behavior to blind, non-intelligent, mechanical physiological processes. Yet the fact remains that man is essentially a spiritual being, a living soul. He is not just physical matter, mechanistic force, or an automatic result of digestive organs, food combinations and physical breeding.

Indeed, biochemistry proves that certain mental states and emotions have an important bearing on the consumption, assimilation and distribution of special chemical elements. When a particular will impulse or emotion is unusually strong, a particular chemical element is selected by the body in greater proportions than other elements.

Succinctly, we attract to our cell lives only those elements or forces in foods which are identical in quality and character to our thoughts and emotions, i.e. which revolve at the same rate of speed

or vibration as those of our own cell world. Otherwise nutrients are refused by the tissues, for there is no magnetic attraction. Cell selectivity of nutrients from the blood is not a blind, mechanical process, but one based on moral as well as physical needs. The cells choose from the blood those nutrients which feed and sustain man's bodily, mental, moral, emotional and will impulses, and thus preserve his psychic as well as physical identity.

This explains increased nitrogen (protein) retention by the cell under the mind dominance of fear. Greed and acquisitiveness, too, send out a craving for more and more; the cells take up the suggestion, and the subconscious responds by sending out a call for material, substance, more goods, merchandise or protoplasm, giving rise to a craving or psychic appetite for nature's own merchandise, substance, nitrogen or tissue-building proteins. Hence greater cell selectivity from the blood of nitrogenous or protein foods ensues.

An uncongenial magnetic field or attraction center within the cell, dominated by greed, sends out a persistent call to the subconscious for a super-abundance of a nitrogenous (tissue-building) diet, and the appetite responds by seeking and craving proteins far in excess of physiological needs. But the thought vibration being one—not of aspiration and ambition for the greatest good, but one tinged with passion, desire or lust—flesh proteins, characteristic of the beast in man, are earnestly sought and craved by cells so impressed.

Not only fear of not accumulating things, and greed or the propensity to accumulate things, but covetousness or mentally robbing another of his merchandise, as well as jealousy or envying another's material goods—suggest hoarding and cause increased nitrogen retention in greedy cells. So too does an unconscious love for abundance or super-abundance cause cells, so greedily impressed, to become satiated with proteins. Avaricious thought impulses connect, by a vibratory circuit of exchange, with every mental energy that bears affinity to mental greed. This adds momentum to the destructiveness, and gives to those vibrating in that key the full impact of every psychic impulse tuned in on that particular tissue-replenishing wave length, or vibrating in the Cancer zodiacal Cosmic Current of Nitrogen—the Source of abundant supply of substance or material.

But alas! Too much protein retained unutilized by the cell magnetically attracts ethereal nitrogen in excess from the imponderable side of Nature, from the House of Cancer—the Great Cosmic Mother and Warehouse of Life's material forces. Food magnets of protein in excess open the door to the prolifically fertile side of Nature, as direct absorption from the etheric realms is denied the body. A terrific flood of this etheric force thus enters the astral or ethereal double of the physical body, which astral body serves in the capacity of the model

Astrology and the War

N the new Neptune Cycle chart, which is the Master Chart for the next few years, Neptune makes the trine with Uranus, the planet of agitation and radical change twice more. In the Winter Number of "The Astrological Bulletina" (#245) a brief review was given of the events coincident with the first of the three times Neptune forms this aspect. This first time was on October 27, 1944.

The second time the aspect is perfect will be on March 25, 1945. While it is a bit hazardous to forecast the details of what will happen under any aspect to erratic Uranus, it is quite certain great changes will take place in Europe the last of March and the first of April. That these changes will relate not merely to civil affairs, but will include those of a military nature is further indicated by Uranus in its cycle making the sesquisquare of Mars, the planet of war, on March 31.

As was anticipated in this column, the Nazis have been unable to stop the Allied drive on Berlin from the East, and they have not been able to stop the Allied drive on Berlin from the West. A vise is closing on Germany, and the changes indicated astrologically seem to show that by the last of March Germany will so largely be subjugated that what is left of military resistance will require little more than gigantic mopping up operations.

As the Nazi leaders have nothing whatever to gain through surrender, this does not necessarily mean that by the end of March the Nazis will formally surrender to the Allies. But it does indicate the probability that the major phase of the war in Europe will be over. Nazi leaders may be able to retire a sizable army and large amounts of supplies into the Alps, and continue to make a stand. There may be large scale guerrilla operations, and underground resistance for a long time to come. But Germany in general will come under Allied control not too long after the Ingress of March 20.

This Ingress chart also indicates great changes, changes which will commence before summer and which by the last of August will assume vast proportions. So far as the U. S. is concerned, the most important of these changes are indicated by the Sun in the 6th house, and the three planets in the 9th house.

The ninth house is the house of treaties and all diplomatic relations. Saturn and the Moon in the ninth house are conjunction the place of the President (M.C.) and part of a T-square with Neptune

and the Sun. This indicates an ultra-conservative block in our own country which will try to sabotage all efforts toward gaining the four freedoms for the world, and which will consistently oppose plans for co-operating with other countries. And it indicates the great difficulties to overcome, and the heartbreaking delays, in getting certain other nations to agree to pacts which will aid the four freedoms. It indicates at home and abroad the powerful influence of those who put selfish advantages ahead of world security and world prosperity.

But Uranus, the planet of things new and unusual, is also in the ninth house, trine Neptune, sextile Sun, sextile Mercury and sextile Pluto. It indicates those who will plan and work for the four freedoms. And as Uranus is closer to the cusp of the ninth than are Saturn and the Moon, some outstanding steps will be successfully taken in this direction in spite of the obstacles and delays.

But in addition to the great effort expended toward reaching satisfactory international agreements, we have the problem of the returning service man. The armed forces are indicated by the 6th house, which is also the house of labor. And in the Ingress chart the Sun is here located, part of a T-square, but also sextile Uranus in the house of sea travel (ninth) and trine Pluto in the house of Congress (eleventh). This indicates that vast numbers of soldiers will be coming home in 1945, that they will raise the problem of finding employment, that this will result in confusion (Sun is opposition Neptune), and that it will be subject to drastic legislation (Sun rules politics, and is trine Pluto, the drastic planet, in the house of Congress).

It is not to be expected, of course, that soldiers will begin to be sent home from Europe in numbers under the second trine of Neptune to Uranus in the Neptune cycle chart, perfect March 25. But by the time the aspect forms the third time, on August 29, there should be a decided move in this direction. As Neptune is the planet of liberation, we might look at it this way; that the final military offensive freeing the people of Europe started under the first of the three indicated aspects, that the second aspect the last of March will bring their freedom

from Nazi domination, and that the third aspect the last of August will bring major adjustments affecting the whole of Europe, and be coincident with the start of the trek home on the part of a great many U. S. soldiers now in Europe.

As to the Japs, which henceforth will be our major problem, they have no more intention of surrendering than do the Nazi leaders. Theirs also will be a last ditch fight.

As they are ruled by Neptune, they will be powerfully influenced by both the indicated trines of Neptune to Uranus in the Neptune cycle. We may look, therefore, for the last of March to bring some new major move against the Japs, in which U. S. forces will be highly successful.

Even the most casual reader of astrological literature is aware that when the Sun crosses the celestial equator from south declination to north declination each year that a chart erected for the time of this change of polarity—called the Ingress chart—portrays the general conditions during the coming year for the nation for the longitude and latitude of whose capital this chart is erected. And in like manner, whenever one of the other planets changes polarity by crossing the celestial equator from south to north declination, a chart erected for this time is indicative of conditions and events. But the conditions and events thus foreshown relate only to the influence the things have which are ruled by the planet thus commencing its new cycle.

Thus the cycle of Mars influences human life, and the life of a nation, only through the things Mars rules, that is, through manufacturing, through building, through strife, and through war.

Furthermore, whenever a new cycle starts, the activities ruled by the planet starting the cycle are always accentuated. Thus when Neptune started a new cycle in 1944 the move for the enfranchisement of mankind was accentuated, and will continue to get major public attention for some years to come. And as on May 6, 1945, a new Mars Cycle starts, we have a right to expect changes of magnitude relative to the war.

It will intensify the mop-up operations in Europe, and indicates a shift of both men and materiel from the European zone to the Pacific. Even before this date the Japanese homeland will be so unmercifully pounded from the air that the Japanese will be gradually moving their war production facilities to the mainland of Asia. It is on the mainland of Asia the Japs will make their last determined stand; although they will make a last ditch fight when the attempt is made to dislodge them from other positions near their homeland, and they will fight stubbornly and to the last in Japan proper.

Better Gardens

PEOPLE like squash! Judging by the letters which poured in upon my desk in response to the offer in preceding Bulletina. The supply of free squash seed was soon exhausted, and now we shall expect reports from those who are experimenting on their own with this "summer or winter" variety. Do not forget to keep a careful record of plantings and results obtained.

As the requests for seed came from all parts of the U. S., it will be interesting to learn how these seeds respond in different climates.

And now, a few words by way of reminder. Many of the letters I receive asking for information on "Moon planting" fail to give dates, Moon's sign and phase of planting the particular fruit, vegetable or flower in question. This lack of data is a handicap as I cannot determine the cause of your failure to obtain the desired results without knowing how and when you planted. Time is at such a premium that I cannot write an extra letter to you to obtain the required data. That is why some of you do not receive replies. I should also know something about the soil in which you are planting. And just one more reminder: Do not forget to enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope with your inquiry, if you wish me to reply personally. Here is a sample of the kind of letter referred to in the foregoing:

Dear Mr. Hook: Read your offer in Winter Bulletina and am interested in the squash seed. Also would like to ask a question. Last year I planted beans and cucumbers in (?) the Moon Sign Book. They bloomed and bloomed, but I had very little produce from either. What was wrong with the soil? Thanking you in advance, I am,—Mrs. W.

Of course it's taken for granted that you planted by the tables in the Moon Sign Book; but the fact that you gave us no datum whatsoever makes it impossible to give you the desired information.

However, this may be helpful to you next year, and to others as well. The Agricultural Map for your section gives the earliest safe dates as May 1st to 15th on which to plant beans. Cucumbers may be planted May 1st to June 1st. If your plantings were made on May 4th, 5th and 6th, the Moon would have been in Libra, a good sign for

flowers and cereals which would account for the blooms. Virgo is not considered a good sign for planting, and the Moon was in that sign on May 2nd and 3rd, 1944. Virgo usually produces a good showing of bloom, but poor seed and crop results from such plantings.

Cucumbers planted on May 7th and 8th, 1944, should have produced a good crop in your location, as the Moon was then in Scorpio; also a good sign for pole beans. The next good dates in May were the 24th, 25th, and part of the 26th; also June 3rd and 4th. The next good dates were part of the 20th, 21st and 22nd, but this is getting pretty late for cucumbers as they are apt to be caught in the dry spell of that locality.

Another thing to remember when writing for information is to name the variety of vegetable you inquire about, such as Kentucky Wonder Climbing or Tendergreen Bean Bush.

Here is another inquiry, whose name and address are withheld as we have no way of knowing if the writer likes to see his name in **PRINT LIKE THIS**, or whether he is the retiring kind who prefers to be as inconspicuous as possible. We do know that he is a retired army officer and like many another such, he is deriving genuine enjoyment from working with the soil. This is what he says.

January 20, 1945

Dear Mr. Hook:

Two years ago I turned my small front lawn into a Victory Garden. It being right on the main street, many were the exclamations and criticisms from passers-by.

"Oh, he'll get exercise!" and "It's a shame to spoil that beautiful lawn!" etc., etc., were samples of the one-sided conversation during the early stages of my front-yard gardening. However before many months had passed the remarks changed in character as well as in tone, and I heard daily, "How beautiful! Everything is arranged just right," and similar compliments.

People would gather in front of my place and discuss one vegetable after another. What is that one? and What is this? I heard on all sides. Such a lot of publicity came out of that 22 X 33 plot.

The first thing I had planted was the ever popular green onion and while doing so along came one who asked if the Moon was right. And then, in response to my puzzled look, he asked whether it was an up Moon or a down Moon. Then I must really have look startled, for he advised that I could get a calendar at the corner store which would explain everything. I lost no time getting to the corner store and hurried home with the calendar to discover to my great joy that I had planted my onions in the "down" Moon.* I recalled that my father

^{*} By the "down" Moon, we believe he means the decreasing or waning Moon, which is the correct time to plant seeds which produce their yield under the soil.

had always planted potatoes "by the Moon" and that was way back in the 1880's—and that he usually had a wonderful crop of Burbanks, and another variety with a red skin.†

I waited for my "down" onions to come up. They did!—and such a crop of foliage as I reaped that season! I decided to investigate and get at the truth, if there was anything to this planting by the Moon. I talked with people and finally I came upon one who mentioned a "Moon Sign Book" which he said showed the Moon's correct place daily by zodiacal sign. I gave him a dollar to order me a copy, but it was almost too late to be of any value that year.

P. S.: How about some squash seed?

This letter did not give dates of planting either, but evidently he chose the right ones!

The point we wish to emphasize is that of keeping exact records of the kind of seed used, dates of planting, kind of soil, etc., if you wish me to help you with your garden problems. Some even write their inquiries on postals!—overlooking the fact that your request for a reply must be accompanied by a self-addressed and fully stamped envelope.

One reader wrote from Oklahoma. He wanted to purchase a garden book. "Just a simple book," he wrote, "telling plainly how to do ordinary gardening and how to prune and what to prune." I directed him to a source from which he obtained what he needed for 15ϕ . Fungicides and insecticides occupy an important place in the gardener's mind; also fertilizers. I shall be glad to help you if you will bear in mind the foregoing and co-operate in the time-saving and energy-saving suggestions mentioned.

[§] The almanacs or calendars dispensed by drug stores are not reliable guides for planting, as they show the Moon's position by constellation which is not correct for astrological purposes. Another misleading fact about these almanacs is that they do not give the time when the Moon's phases begin. In this case it is likely that our friend planted his onions in the increasing Moon which is for things which produce their fruits above the soil, thus accounting for his "large crop of (onion) foliage"; although the calendar led him to believe it was decreasing or "going down." In the book, "Powerful Planets" (by Llewellyn George) one chapter is entitled "Signs and Constellations; their relation and difference." This information clarifies this point for beginner-students and the layman.

The U. S. Horoscope

APRIL 12th to May 11th, 1945: The New Moon of April 12th, at 7:21 a. m., mean time, Washington, D. C., occurs in Aries 22° 13′ in the seventh house of the U. S. radix chart. This is sextile Mars, sextile Moon, square Mercury and square Pluto of the radix. A seventh house lunation brings to focus matters relating to enemy countries. Important decisions are made for the operation of peace plans in the restoration of order in Europe, but not without much controversy and loud criticism of the President's activities from those who oppose him, particularly in our own land.

This lunation occurs in the first house of the U. S. progressed chart where it is trine the progressed Mercury and Sun, which are posited in the ninth house. The populace will be pleased with achievements in foreign lands because they relieve and benefit conditions here to some extent. However, from a political and religious standpoint considerable dissatisfaction will be expressed.

The progressed Moon is now in Aries 29° 33′ 45″ on April 4th and on April 15th it changes signs and enters Taurus. In other words, the martial influence and trend changes to that of Venusian nature, or attention to reconstruction and rehabilitation. The Moon forms its first aspects in Taurus in May.

Transits

Neptune is retrograding from a square to the radix Jupiter. This influence is not very noticeable at this time. It does not retrograde to the partile square of Venus.

Uranus is slightly beyond its radix place and is forming a trine to U. S. Saturn, indicating progress in the war against Japan, and practical adjustments and adaptation to changing conditions in our own land.

Saturn is between the U. S. radix Jupiter and Sun in ninth house where it has a deterring influence on some lines of business due to the condition of foreign affairs.

Jupiter is retrograde in Virgo from the 19th degree to the 17th, which leaves it still in the vicinity of the radix Neptune at cusp of the 12th house. Much under-cover diplomacy, complications in the medical profession and in religious affairs.

Mars moves through the radix sixth house denoting disturbance in Labor interests and considerable naval activity.



May 11th to June 9th, 1945: This New Moon occurs in Taurus 20° 44' in the eighth house of the U. S. radix chart. It is close to Pars Fortuna, sextile Mercury, trine Neptune and Pluto, but square to the Moon radix. These indices favor improvement in business conditions, but the public seems dissatisfied with regard to Government action on soldiers' rights and needs.

This lunation occurs in the second house of the progressed chart, in sextile to Jupiter, and trine to Neptune and Pluto. This is a good testimony for release from restrictions and the rigors of war. Good progress should be made in peace arrangements; improved business and labor outlook. It should also benefit crops. Some very good legislation may be enacted at this time.

The progressed Moon is now in Taurus 0° 45′ but it is still in the first house of the progressed chart,—a position which makes the public very sensitive and responsive to its influence in national affairs. The first aspect of the Moon in Taurus is a square to the progressed Venus which is in the eleventh house in Aquarius. Immediately afterward or perhaps simultaneously it comes into opposition with progressed Saturn in Scorpio in the seventh house. The indications are obvious: public sorrow through the demise of popular and important people related to legislative and administrative departments. Sorrow over losses we suffered in the war. Trouble regarding war settlements. Accounting the costs. A great deal of illness with high mortality.

The Moon is progressing through the seventh house of the radix. At this time it is not in aspect to radix planets.

Transits

Neptune transits the radix twelfth house in square to Jupiter and Venus in the ninth, denoting involved and troublesome overseas conditions.

Uranus is forming a trine to radix Saturn in the first house indicating practical public adjustments to new conditions of law and life as introduced through our foreign relations.

Saturn is approaching a conjunction with radix Sun, acting as a brake, thus preventing abnormal or "boom" conditions. Reactionaries hinder or delay needed legislation.

Jupiter in the radix twelfth is square radix Mars, denoting troublesome diplomatic and legal problems related to the war and to prisoners.

Mars will be partile opposition to the radix Saturn, May 21st; the orb of the aspect begins May 10th and ends May 30th. This denotes hostility by foreign powers, many accidents, and danger to officials.



June 9th to July 9th, 1945: This New Moon occurs in Gemini 18° 54' in the ninth house of the radix chart. Here it is seen to be in conjunction with radix Mars and square Neptune in the twelfth. This is indicative of trouble and excitement over foreign conditions, losses at sea, labor difficulties and much illness. However, the lunation is also in slightly good aspect to the radix Mercury and trine the radix Moon, meaning that despite disturbances the Government makes headway in matters of rehabilitation.

The lunation occurs in the third house of the progressed chart where it opposes the progressed Mercury and Sun. This indicates powerful dissensions over foreign arrangements, agreements and treaties, which involve our relations with neighboring and some South American countries. Airways, waterways and rights or privileges are concerned, including patents, formulas, religious and educational affairs.

The progressed Moon is traversing from 1° 56′ to 3° 08′ of Taurus still in the first house of the progressed chart. It forms no planetary aspect at this time, but its position shows public interest in all matters pertaining to peace. It is trine to the progressed Midheaven, indicating increase of Government prestige and public approval.

The Moon is progressing through the seventh house of the radix chart, denoting governmental activity in matters pertaining to peace. The Moon now has progressed to a partile sextile of radix Venus, indicating peace proposals from abroad which meet public approval. This aspect betokens favorable financial and business improvements which are indeed welcome; likewise release from some restrictions, and pleasure returning through better travel conditions.

Transits


Neptune becomes direct and forms a square of radix Jupiter, denoting political schemes to discredit the Administration; misunderstanding in regard to foreign ports of fortification; and in connection with oil. (Please turn to page 87.)

April 25th and San Francisco

CONFERENCE OF THE ALLIED NATIONS

Chart of San Francisco: Nov. 2, 1769 (after 10 a. m.).



Announcement of a conference of the Allied Leaders on April 25th, 1945, and several days subsequent thereto in San Francisco, draws the attention of the entire world to the City by the Golden Gate.

In Bulletina No. 206, issue of April-May-June 1935, was published a chart of San Francisco's discovery on November 2nd, 1769 (some time after 10 a. m.), and a few notes in connection with eventful dates since that time. In connection with this history making conference, students may wish to review the chart and

note the progressions for this year. The progressed date for 1945 is April 27th, 1770. Lest you may not have ephemerides at hand for those years, here are the main positions.

Midheaven pro.: 18 degrees of Aries. Sun: Taurus 9 degrees. Mercury: Taurus 2. Moon: Taurus 27. You will note at once that progressed Sun is conjunct radix Uranus and opposes the Mars-Sun conjunction in the radix.

The Lunation of April 12th falls in the 22nd degree of Aries, close to cusp of radix fourth house, and just past the conjunction of the promidheaven. Mercury in Aries 24 and Mars in the 28th degree of the same sign are likewise conjoined with the natal 4th, and prog. 10th cusps.

Transits on April 25th: Sun Taurus 5 degrees in opposition radix Mars-Sun, Moon approximately 17 degrees of Libra, Mercury 17 of Aries, Venus in 20 of Aries. Truly, this is a meaty morsel for serious students!

Infanticipating?

ASTRO NAME MYSTICISM

QUESTION: With a continent between us, how can we manage to have you work out an harmonious name for our expected baby (late April) when the hospital selected for accouchment demands an immediate name for all babies?—A. B. and K. C. B.

Question: We figured that after engaging reservations in ... Hospital for the arrival of our first-born (presumably first week in May), the next most important thing to assure it a good start was to have you select the correct name-vibration, but learn to our consternation that regulations require immediate naming of babies. You have our charts, and we do hope you have some method of handling this situation. Please?—H. C. and E. C.

Question: In reading "Bal-Lee-Ah," I am much enlightened and at the same time greatly troubled, so am asking your advice. I am well along in years, a fairly successful "Names-and-Numbers" teacher and analyst, using the same Hebraic system of letter evaluation which you employ, but find from your brochure that you base initial calculations upon the horoscope! Now I wish to give the best and most reliable service possible in the matter of naming babies, as well as making necessary adjustments for grown-ups, and having a fundamental knowledge of astrology, your teachings spur me on to a more serious study, but wish to know how far one must go: Must she toil through progressions and on into the higher calculations? And, if it is not encroaching upon your private trade-secrets, please do inform me how you manage to comply with regulations of metropolitan hospitals in supplying proper names for new-born babes in a matter of hours after birth?—N. and N.

Answer: Since various forms of these questions sweep across our desk on the rising tide of what Walter Winchell refers to as "infanticipating" couples, it might be best to pause for a moment's consideration of this vital (statistic!) subject.

But first of all dear N. and N. (which of course are not your initials, being merely a Names-and-Numbers substitute), may we commend your very intelligent decision to go in seriously for the study of astrology to supplement your professional knowledge. As for the depth of your study, while you would not of course require progressions for naming babes, you would find it quite essential for the best service in making name-adjustments for adults. The benign influence of a good

name, one in harmony with the natal chart, might be nullified if adopted while native were under the influence of an evil direction. Be assured, good friend, that the deeper you delve into the science, the richer the gems you discover for the adornment of names. For example, take the fixed stars and their symbology in relation to the natal chart and you have a wealth of poetry and romance, yet withal most practical material for weaving into nomenclature.

Astrology cannot be divorced from scientific name-analysis. Remember, zodiacal influence, stellar forces, alone give to letters and numbers their "peculiar quality."

To all three querents it may be said that you share with many others this problem of immediate name-selection, a problem that panics many expectant mothers. Particularly perturbed are the wives of service men whose problem is complicated not only by the time element, but frequently by distance as well, for many of them are isolated in remote locations where they will be deprived of the comfort and support of their husbands at the time of the blessed event; much less being able to consult with them in the matter of name-selection.

You know how it is in the navy, and perhaps recall the classic recently revived by "Readers Digest" which recounts the sailor asking for a furlough during the week his wife expected their baby. The C. O. refused the request in these words: "While I appreciate the necessity of your presence for the laying of the keel, I can see no reason why you must be there for the launching."

This problem of immediate name-selection has, like most baffling situations, a happy solution, if to you the meaning of life is service. But we give you fair warning, this emergency plan imposes a heavy and immediate burden of calculation and responsibility which, once assumed, must be seen through. You just cannot let down an expectant mother at the last minute because of pressure in other directions. Doc Stork doesn't wait. Especially not these days of increased production when he often arrives three jumps ahead of schedule. Probably has to, if he keeps up with deliveries!

Baptismal Handicaps and How to Avoid Them.

After accepting the commission of name selection, the very first thing to be done is to explain to expectant mothers the nature of the Vowel Vitality energising their family name, along with the necessity of choosing given names which harmonize therewith. The most important features to be incorporated in these names (and those to be omitted) are likewise designated, and after due consideration of these points, parents are asked to submit a list of names acceptable to both.

Sometimes instructions are blithely disregarded in the first rough draft of names sent in, but of course one must always co-operate with parents within safe limits. For example, while some especially desired name as submitted in its original form is strictly out, yet it may be adjusted to an entirely satisfactory proximation thereof, an instance of which recently came before us when a young A. A. F. commander was most insistent upon the name "Carol," but when it was explained that this was perhaps the least harmonious name possible to select, and the couple were asked to consider its action in the careers of King Carol and of Carole Lombard, they settled in advance for "Caryl" which, while preserving the form, eliminated the discord and enhanced the charm. (But it didn't matter in the long run. They drew a blue slip!)

"Joan" is another combination of this same discord, in reverse, which appears on many submitted lists. "Casualty-lists" we sometimes call these baleful combinations because of their catastrophic power. "Joan," by the way, often presages a Saturn affliction likely to appear when the chart is subsequently erected for the moment of birth.

"Joan" is a dual-center, charged with the vowel vitality of two directly antagonistic forces: a name simultaneously liberating the contractive, intropulsive force of one planet and the expansive, outrushing force of the other; the frigidity and centripetal action of one arrayed against the flaming, centrifugal power of the other: the urges of the introvert perpetually counteracted by those of the extrovert. Thus we have in "Joan" a life forever at variance with itself; its drive and direction always meeting a self-generated opposition, often ending in utter frustration. And if it triumphs, it is against tremendous odds, often only to plunge into disaster, outstandingly instanced in the tragic career of the Maid of Orleans, and traceable through the anglicized form of her name, Joan of Arc.

To realize something of the disunity the name "Joan" is capable of attracting when its separative force is directed against the marital status of its bearer, we have only to contemplate the experiences of these gifted and lovely cinemactresses: Joan Bennett, Joan Blondel, Joan Crawford, Joan Fontaine, aggregating a record in broken marriages.

But please do not assume that the names instanced are the chief culprits on the nomenclator's blacklist. Not at all! They serve merely as examples of one particular form of discord names may attract. Every submitted list has its own gremlins, eliminated at the outset, since, while some names are merely discordant only when combined with certain birth digits, others are "plain p'izen" to all alike.

Emergency Plan

But to get on with our emergency plan. Since births are fairly closely prefigured these days, it is possible to calculate with consider-

able accuracy the aspects which will operate between the major planets at the time, and to determine their approximate relation to the Sun on each of the probable days of birth. These aspects, along with zodiacal influences are tabulated with revised lists of names.

Since the actual birth-number is a feature of major importance in name selection, it is handled after this fashion. Since every birth-number is reducible to one of the nine digits, we work out nine lists of names for possible pink parcels, and nine similar lists for the blue slip-pers, blending previously tabulated information with the appropriate names for each day. Of course each group is largely supplemented by our own preferred selections. Any name is attuned to a great degree of harmony with three different birth digits, and a favored name may be adjusted to accord with a variety of days. The mother-to-be is supplied with these lists well in advance, so that she may immediately make selections and is thus prepared no matter on which of the given dates the birth actually occurs. And having thus chosen two names for each day, one for a boy and one for a girl, she is prepared when the doctor says: "It's a girl." And presto, up pops the right name!

But this, remember, is only our emergency plan, devised for the wife at a great distance, or where no communication facilities are available after she enters the hospital.

The ideal plan, however, utilizes the emergency phase only as a preliminary feature. When the exact time of birth along with sex is telegraphed, we erect a chart, select and tabulate the most fortunate aspects of the swiftly moving planets, the best ascendant and lunar rays, and with due regard to angles, etc., we scan the parental revision of preferences of names for the day (a copy of which has been returned for our files) and proceed to adjust a name to include letters channelizing the most benefic forces of the chart, tailor it to blend with the family name, keynote it to the day, and if well aspected, tinge the whole with the coloring of the babe's ruling planet, and immediately wire this name to the mother at her hospital.

Too complicated! Too much fuss and feathers for a mere name, you say? Not when you consider that an entire life time may be blest by your effort. Not when you consider how immensely thrilled the mother is when she receives the telegraphed name which is to start her baby in its life race freed of baptismal handicaps. And not when you consider dad ferrying that super-fortress, smirking covertly as he lands to pass the cigars for, well, after all, didn't he name their first-born? Partly, at least, for three letters of his original choice do appear in the final arrangement, don't they? And, any way, it sounds about the same, maybe a little better, if anything, different and sort o' distinctive. Just the way the kid is going to be. And those letters the Name-Mystic discarded, maybe they do tie in with falls, at that.

Heaven knows he has had enough of his own, especially that time he had to bail out when the 'chute didn't open until almost too late! Funny how those same discarded letters are peppered liberally enough through his name!

Recently one of "our" babies was named Harlyn: a perfect blend for its chart. A name fabricated from the parental names, Harvey and Evelyn. While the wee morsel's chart is good, it is such a tiny incubator mite that when word of its weight reached us we recalled what the husky though shellacked marine said to the also slightly swizzled twirp as they zigzagged along arm-in-arm:

"Lookit me now. Hefty, eh? An' when I was born I only weighed three pounds and four ounces!"

"Goo'ness! Didja live?"

"Did I? You oughtta see me now!"

Astrologising the Name

While space does not permit their recounting here, there appear in "Bal-Lee-Ah"* many helpful hints for selecting names astrologically. There are listed names under influence of each zodiacal sign, Planetary Names, Names under the Luminaries, Sun Syllables and Signatures of the Lady Luna, etc., also the following:

In Choosing a Name - Don't!

Don't drown the spirited fire native in a name dripping with water letters. He'll never generate steam that way. The spark of many a fire genius which might have flared into growing flame has been permanently wet-blanketed by a cold, damp name.

Don't, if the babe is an earthling, most particularly don't pin him up in some fancy, up-in-the-cloudsey, airy-fairy name, all gooed over with itsy bitsy Cupid-and-Psyche winglets. His small feet must keep solidly to the earth where all his lessons and contacts must center.

Don't shackle a fly-away-birdie-to-heaven air child with a rock-weighed earth name. The take-off is tricky enough at best. Let the child soar into the blue empyrean, his native element, with a buoyant, happy name. The life-flight of too many human butterflies and humming-birds is retarded by a cumbersome lead-and-granite name. No wonder they flop when they try to soar.

Don't, if the babe belongs to the watery trigon, keep the poor little fish floundering in hot water, perpetually wriggling through his life-swim with a pre-heated Mars, or other fire-name.

Astro-Economics and Markets

SECOND QUARTER OF 1945



NE of the most outworn of the more elementary philosophical excursions is the question of which came first, the chicken or the egg. Most discussions of the question invariably end in a draw; both sides of the issue are parallel. However, when we reframe the question and ask which comes first in power, man's freedom of will or his reaction to cosmic stimuli (planetary vibrations and electromagnetic radiation), then the storm

breaks loose. Based on some authority, usually political, ecclesiastical or a merely passing shibboleth, apparent evidence is piled up to assure us that man is a completely free entity. That each person may possess traits and reactions which are more or less different from anyone else, or that his life exhibits definite cyclical shifts, are casually labeled as signs of leaky valves controlling the juices of his glands or some possible hereditary throwback contained within his chemical combination. If such a line of commentary is urged further the inexplicable of the dead-end usually is eased off as beyond the comprehension of man to the realm of God.

It is usually very awesome to drag God into a philosophical excursion and often it affords a very dignified retreat for an impossible and dogmatic position. The facts are that no one has ever defined the term God to general satisfaction. Throughout the entire world every nation, tribe and clan recognizes a power greater than man who in some manner is worshipped and revered in love or in fear, or both, as God. It is an intangible power greater than man. Our Western culture has built up the science of theology to a system which defines man's relations to God and the existence, nature and attributes of God in a Trinitarian concept of Father, Son and Spirit. Until the European politico-economic revolt, which found its expression in the German Reformation under Luther, the Swiss Reformation under Zwingli, the French Reformation under Calvin, and the English Reformation under Cromwell, this theological system nurtured theocracy with its divine right of kings and the concept that a state was governed by the immediate direction of God. Concepts were definitely established as to the person of God. But after the stimulation of the Renaissance, science made far reaching discoveries which broke down many of these old established theological concepts. With the progress, and formidable results, of science, definitions of God became less and less personal and more and more pantheistic: the view that the universe in its totality is God; that natural laws of the universe are God; and

that man is of the universe and subject to all of its physical and spiritual (intellectual, intangible, etc.) laws.

This upsetting and exceedingly revolutionary impact of science to those tenets laid down by the Council of Nicea, which had held full sway in the Western World for almost fifteen centuries, was devastating. Whenever they had been disputed, all opposition, either by treaty or the sword, had been crushed; even the Reformation reiterated the Nicene agreement and usd it as its principal foundation. But this time, after the European revolts of the 1870's and the migrations launched by them, and the commercial discoveries of electricity and aircraft which began in the 1880's, scientific developments in the sphere of the unseen forces of the Universe aroused intense theological castigation of pantheistic concepts and even more fervent persistence in the Nicene formula of theology. That persistence continues today.

Decades ago it was established that education is the systematic training of the moral and intellectual faculties. Due to several complex intrusions however, in the past several decades education has been less and less the training of faculties but the stuffing of the rules of what majority opinion or authority presents as their version of the facts. Not to think, but to know all the accepted rules and believe them, has been the goal of modern education. In other words, each one quotes and depends on that authority to which he has been exposed and it forms the beginning and end of his world.

It is persistently repeated that most individuals should hold on tightly to the mental and intellectual moorings of the past; that research in the world of ideas, examination of new fields, discoveries and subjects should be avoided. This is good advice for those who dream of finding Magic Carpets, who hold illusions of grandeur, or who are obsessed with the idea they can dodge the Law of Karma (compensation); but it is petrifying to the sincere seeker for Truth. At least the attitude each one owes himself is a readiness to seek for himself and by himself the heretofore, to him, hidden factors operating in Universal Law; it is the road to "Know Thyself."

This demoralization in conceptual foundations of the past half a century has been apparent in the trends of modern thought, and it has been particularly obvious in the political and economic labyrinths of the last three decades. To further complicate what has approached an impasse in any hope of unanimity of concepts are the economic changes in recent years. For example, in 1900 the United States population was about 76 millions compared to about 137 millions now, with a national income of \$19 billions in 1900 and about \$147 billions this year. There were \$8½ billions of life insurance policies in force in 1900 compared to about \$139 billions in force today, with compar-


Zodiacause

Business Outlook for the Spring Season

From March 20th to June 21st, 1945.

LIBRA, the fourth degree, is ascending on the eastern horizon when the Sun indicates the beginning of the Spring Season by apparently ingressing the sign Aries on March 20th, at 6:30 p. m., mean time, Washington, D. C. This period of Spring prevails for three months during which time conditions are amplified or qualified by influences indicated by the three New Moons which occur in this quarter of the year. They are interpreted in the following pages under the title of Astrocause.

In a chart of the zodiac made for this datum the Sun is seen to be near the cusp of the seventh house, wherein Mercury is also posited. The seventh house has relation to foreign affairs, nature of relation with other countries whether friendly or hostile, political or commercial. War, peace, adjustments and pacts are associated with this house; also partnerships, marriage, divorce, lawsuits.

The Sun is in affliction with Saturn, as is the Moon also. The luminaries are afflicting Neptune, as is likewise Saturn. This combination of planetary configurations draws public attention to the things signified by the seventh house and causes considerable apprehension because matters abroad seem very much confused or involved; very undesirable and unsatisfactory.

The Sun and Moon adverse Saturn (which is on the cusp of the tenth house denoting heavy difficulties and problems for the Administration) may also indicate physical indisposition through overwork. The Administration incurs censure; obstacles develop and delays interfere with federal affairs and the passage of desired legislation. Under this aspect there usually arise differences between the President and statesmen, or between the upper and lower houses of Congress. It usually indicates the demise of a government official. Misfortunes

and gloom tend to overshadow social life. Trade and labor conditions

are unsatisfactory.

Saturn adverse to Neptune tends to bring delay and confusion into national affairs and there may be some serious loss or check experienced abroad. An important movement affecting the public may be thwarted. The populace feels nervous and discontented because their interests appear to suffer. Mysterious crimes; considerable illness.

Venus has a good aspect with the Moon while it retrogrades to a good aspect with Mars. In that Venus is ruler of the ascending sign, is in Taurus which is another of its signs and is in the eighth house, the aspects mentioned serve to sustain the public despite the other somber influences mentioned. It helps to maintain hope and confidence in the improvement of business and financial conditions, and the public

builds hopes for a pact which will assure peace abroad.

Mercury is in good aspect to Mars and the latter is in good aspect to Saturn. These are constructive aspects which defeat pessimism. They encourage intensive planning for increased building, industrial and business activity. They indicate activity in publishing, public meetings, speech-making; new movements connected with all means of transit and for conveying news or information. It is beneficial for education, science, travel and the Postal Department. It also denotes increase in the power, efficiency and success of the army, navy and police department.

The Sun is in good aspect to Uranus. This shows that despite adverse influences there is a progressive element at work, promoting great and useful changes, reforms and improvements favoring individual comfort, security and freedom. New inventions and new adap-

tations of energy and power are under way.

IMPORTANT NOTICE ON "WAR TIME"

The new Daylight Saving Time ruling went into effect February 9th, 1942, for the entire nation. It has been officially termed War Time and will remain in force for the duration. Clocks on that date were set ahead one hour at 2 a.m.

The Planetary Time Tables in this magazine record the daily aspects in terms of Pacific Standard Time, so if you live within the Pacific Time Zone and have set your clock ahead one hour to conform with the Government Ruling, the times stated in the Planetary Time Tables and Daily Delineations will be one hour slow of your War Time clock. In other words, if an aspect is recorded for 5:30 a. m. in the Planetary Time Tables, your clock will say 6:30 when that aspect culminates. If you live in the Mountain Time Zone your clock will say 7:30; in the Central Time Zone it will be 8:30 a. m. by the War Time clock; and in the Eastern Time Zone, 9:30 a. m. The aspects which are calculated by sidereal, or true time, remain the same, so we must make the adjustment to our clock which is artificial time. Merely add the extra hour to the times stated in the Bulletina.

At top of each Ephemeris page you will note that the Daily Positions of the Planets are given for 4 a. m., P. S. T. and Greenwich Noon. That remains Standard time. By Pacific War Time clock it is 5 a. m.

Astrocause

The chart for the Solar Ingress (delineated as Zodiacause) shows the predominating influence for this quarter of the year, while the three New Moons (Astrocause) interpolate the various changes and modifications during each month of this season, according to astrology.

Business Outlook

Indicated by the Influence of the New Moon

From April 12th to May 11th, 1945.

GEMINI, the first degree, is coming onto the ascendant or eastern horizon at moment of the New Moon, April 12th, at 7:21 a.m., mean time, Washington, D. C. This conjunction of the luminaries occurs in Aries 22° 13' in the twelfth house of a chart of the zodiac made for this datum.

This twelfth house space also contains Venus and Mercury, both retrograde. The four bodies are in the sign, Aries, which combination of influences tends to make the mind of the populace sensitive, nervous, critical and apprehensive. Much of this character of thought concerns employment, finances and health. There is likely to be a considerable amount of infantile sickness; criticism regarding the conduct of institutions or hospitals, and of health officials and of health insurance plans. Distressing news of enemy atrocities is uncovered, and regarding concentration camps in general; but we will also hear of acts of heroism, and of fortitude and endurance of those who were imprisoned. There may be revealed some plot or scheme to undermine Labor and Education.

Mars, ruler of the sign in which this lunation occurs, is posited in the eleventh house of the chart. This usually indicates a very aggressive and quarrelsome attitude in the conduct of congressional activities. Ill temper is likely to be vigorously displayed on the floor of one or both houses through jealousy and political rivalry. Unparliamentary scenes occur! A special Bill or member may be singled out for dispute in which party splits occur. The Government may be embarrassed by encounter with strong opposition. Mars here could also mean the sudden demise of a legislator, especially as that planet is also in opposition to Jupiter, ruler of the seventh and eighth houses.

Mars denotes likely dissension among the Allies from diplomatic and political procedures, in which commercial and industrial interests are not passed by unnoticed. The affairs of army and navy seem to be targets for acrimonious discussion, including the disposition and employment of discharged soldiers. As Mars rules this sixth house, the influence of Labor is strongly felt in Congress concerning industry and the use of capital.

Uranus is in the first house of this chart in good aspect to Pluto. This denotes liberation for the populace from some of the restrictions or rationing. Public fancy takes readily to progressive changes in governmental activities and to innovations affecting domestic environment, such as new style of dwellings, new gadgets, new and better means of transportation.

Saturn in the second house indicates retardation of financial and banking affairs, restriction of business progress. Capital and Labor still at odds concerning the fundamentals which make for harmonious co-operation.

Pluto in the fourth house has a good aspect from Uranus which probably indicates increased building activities and establishment of co-operative enterprises. It may also indicate trouble and damage through floods and earthquakes.

LIBRA, the sixth degree is crossing the eastern horizon at moment of New Moon, May 11th, at 3:13 p. m., mean time, Washington, D. C.

The conjunction of the Sun and Moon occurs in Taurus 20° 44′ in the eighth house of a chart made for this datum. This section of the ambient has reference to public mortality and the cause or nature of death; death duties; financial relations with foreign coun-

tries. Therefore, public attention is likely to focus on events and conditions related to the forementioned. Deaths among legislators and high officials attract public attention.

Neptune is retrograde near the ascending degree of this chart, denoting public uncertainty, confusion or bewilderment regarding strange and complicated conditions in political affairs at home, as well as in foreign lands where we are involved. Though the issues are vague or obscure, yet they appear momentous. One of the big problems of the people here relates to labor and employment.

Mars, Venus and Mercury occupy the seventh house. Mars, being square to Saturn, indicates troublesome situations causing strained relations with two nations which may be England and Italy or Spain and Argentina. Acrimonious controversies develop regarding peace conditions. Foreign criticism concerning our conduct of the war with Japan. An enemy may strike us a severe blow and cause us much disturbance. The President may be endangered. Japan makes a secret peace offer.

Saturn on the Midheaven indicates severely difficult conditions for the President and for our Government. Misfortune and discord strike at political and national affairs: loss of prestige abroad. A turbulent spirit is directed against those holding high office, supported by strong forces both here and abroad.

Jupiter, ruler of the third house, is retrograde in the twelfth: important visitors or ambassadors from abroad are received in the U.S.A., and we send official messengers to foreign countries. Considerable diplomatic activity which is not at present disclosed. The question of socialized medicine becomes considerably distorted or misrepresented.

Pluto is in the eleventh house, therefore Congress may exhibit a more progressive attitude than usual by considering legislation for better and more extensive social security; planning for greater amount of employment with better financial assurance to workers and to elders. Some huge projects are sponsored or condoned for an immense amount of commercial and manufacturing activity in relation to the rehabilitation of other nations,

Uranus is in the ninth house in good aspect to Mars and Pluto. This is a fortunate indice for new discoveries, for new applications of recent inventions, extension of air facilities, new features of aerial travel, new channels of commerce. Changes in international laws and their better or broader interpretation. Science, philosophy, religion and educational methods undergo revision and improvement.

AQUARIUS, the twenty-fourth degree, is ascending on the eastern horizon at moment of New Moon, June 9th, at 11:18 p. m., mean time, Washington, D. C. This conjunction of the luminaries occurs in Gemini 18° 54′ in the fourth house of a chart of the zodiac made for this datum.

The fourth section of the ambient is known to have relation with land, agriculture, crops, gardens, fields, pastures, orchards; buildings generally, including all kinds of residences, laundries, dairies, breweries; sheep-folds; cellars, mines, minerals; wells, water-tanks, rivers, lakes, dams, reservoirs. Those who are opposed to the President and administrative policies; general trend of the weather; indications as to tornadoes, great storms, tidal waves, floods and earthquakes. Therefore, matter pertaining to farming, land, housing and employment are very much in the public mind during the period of this lunation.

Considerable apprehension, uncertainty and nervousness are apt to prevail and may be worked upon by the opposition to check or thwart liberal and progressive movements of the Government intended as eventual public benefit. This is indicated by the proximity of Uranus to the luminaries, and their square aspect to Jupiter. Some extra heavy thunder and wind storms are likely and damage through tornadoes.

Mercury is also in the fourth house going to conjunction with Uranus and square to Jupiter. This may reveal some sort of radical effort to encourage a spirit of dissatisfaction and dissension, thereby creating animosity toward the Government in almost everything it proposes to do in relation to domestic problems or foreign affairs. Certain newspapers may openly encourage this dissension. However, this very effort may become a boomerang when Uranus transits over the place of Mars in the U. S. horoscope!—as it did in the period of the Civil War. Uranus will be transiting the same degrees from 1945 to 1947. Harmony and real co-operation are vastly to be desired and encouraged.

However, Venus is in its own sign, Taurus, and applying to a good aspect with Saturn, denoting that some friendly relations are established with other nations. Commercial treaties are promoted; ambassadors are received and sent. Diligent efforts are made towards establishing practical methods of peace enforcement. These activities meet considerable criticism and opposition mainly because it may seem that while the U. S. receives trade benefits, it is acting too generously or magnanimously in its aid to foreign countries. However, the traditional beneficent paternal spirit of the U. S. (indicated by its birth sign Cancer) will predominate and we will give of our abundant stores wisely and well to the unfortunate war sufferers abroad. Labor and business conditions show improvement.

It was our own philosopher, Ralph Waldo Emerson, descended from a long line of eminent clergymen, who said: "Astrology is Astronomy brought to earth and applied to the affairs of man." In that sense "The Astrological Bulletina" contains ideas for improving personal, business and social activities by working in conscious harmony with Natural Law. With the object in view of improvement on all planes of life—material, physical, mental and spiritual—readers are requested to make these four pages the groundwork for intelligent endeavor toward self-improvement. The information herein is to be correlated particularly to the chapters on DAILY INDICATIONS, and by frequent reference to the various sections of these four pages of "instructions," one is enabled to swing into the raythm of the Daily Aspects as recorded in the "Planetary Time Tables."

FIRST: Read the Quarterly Business Outlook (Zodiacause) and Monthly Outlook (Astrocause) wherein the editor deals with world conditions, according to astrology.

SECOND: Daily Indications showing the Favorable and Unfavorable Days in each month. These delineations may be applied to everyday affairs. Beside the interpretation of each day's indication, a Planetary Time Table is given, showing the aspects in their sequence, by which you may judge the outcome of personal situations or experiences, according to Astrology. By the column of symbols on next page you may see upon what elements the Daily Delineations are based, and may correlate the aspects to daily events.

THIRD: Chats with the Editor. Llewellyn George speaks directly to you in his editorials which are filled with human interest. In addition they contain astrological comments on current events, and the U. S. Horoscope.

FOURTH: Section I presents the findings of the world's best astrologians.

A Good Investment: Spend 15 minutes daily learning the signs, planets, aspects, and what they represent. It may aid your self-improvement. A little study of astrological fundamentals should enable anyone to judge the merits of planetary indications.

The Stars Incline; they Do Not Compel.

Planetary aspects should be regarded as sign-posts along the highway of life: So-called "adverse" aspects show when it is best to reduce speed, to retrench and safeguard one's interests; "good" aspects show when expansion and new ventures may be undertaken with better chance of success.

The Planetary Time Tables show in Pacific Standard Time exactly when every planetary aspect is complete each day. At times stated the aspects are at maximum intensity, or the peak of their strength, and after the time stated in Time Tables their influences decrease rapidly. Watch oncoming aspects. G or g, good; A or a, adverse.

Suppose you receive a business proposition, or a letter stating that someone is ill. You are anxious to know the outcome. Turn to "Planetary Time Tables" and note the nature of the aspect which occurs NEXT after the time you received it. If it is beneficent in nature it is an indication that the matter should terminate beneficially or the sick recover. But if the next aspect is of adverse nature it is an unfavorable indication for the matter.

It should be clearly understood that the time taken must be when you FIRST hear the news, receive the proposition or READ the letter. In other words, the time of the birth of the idea in your mind, will show by the next oncoming aspect what to expect of the outcome. Do not use an aspect that has passed. See next page.

.... And the Firmament Sheweth His Handiwork;"

Suppose you receive a letter saying that someone is about to lose their business, and reference to the Planetary Time Tables shows that the next aspect after reading the letter is benign in nature. You have reason to believe that the matter would not turn out so badly as your correspondent expected and that there is a chance to avoid the difficulty. Whereas, if the next aspect had been of adverse nature it is likely the news would prove true. In either case the advance information thus gained may be of immense value. Watch oncoming aspects.

In other words, inspect the aspects shown in the Planetary Time Tables for the date when you first hear of a matter, meet the person or receive news. If the aspect is favorable the news or friendship is likely to prove beneficial. But if the next aspect is adverse the matter, proposition, acquaintance, etc., is likely to prove undesirable, or different than it appears.

The planetary influences described in the Daily Indications are of interest to every one regardless of your birth month. They affect some persons more than others according to how the vibrations of the day do or do not coincide with the indications and operations in the birth horoscope.

It is not intended that matters mentioned in the Daily Indications should be the only ones considered, but rather that they be included in general consideration. From an astrological standpoint it is well to avoid adverse days and try to choose those which are favorable, in keeping with the old astrological axiom, "The better the day the better the deed."

Leo: Fixed, fiery, barren, masculine, ruled by the Sun. Governs heart, sides and upper portion of the back.

Libra: Movable, airy, semi-fruitful, masculine, ruled by Venus. Governs kidneys and loins.

Saturn "good": Deal with foregoing; advance your interests tactfully; organize, build for future or permanence. "Adverse," retrench, safeguard the material interests and protect health.

The Moon's position each day is its place at 4 a. m., Pacific Standard time, which is equivalent to 5 a. m., Mountain; 6 a. m., Central; 7 a. m., Eastern time. Another hour must be added where War Time is in use.

₩ Neptune rules detectives, mysteries, the deep sea, voyages, oil, fish, anæsthetics, drugs, chemicals, tobacco, perfume, delicatessen, high-grade canned foods, psychism, motion pictures; fraud and deception; perversion.

Neptune "good": Deal in foregoing. Develop artistic leanings and spirituality; photography, psychic research, investigation. "Adverse," discount promises and take nothing for granted. Beware of plots and schemes. Be alert to detect subterfuge and compromising situations. Avoid drugs and intoxicants.

Pluto denotes the subconscious mind, the conscience, metabolism, assimilation, alchemy, refining processes, lethal drugs. Taxes, inheritance, affairs of the dead.

Pluto "good": Attend to foregoing matters. Also such lines as dyeing, renovating, cauterizing, dehydration. Make effort to overcome bad habits and uncover errors. "Adverse," choose associates carefully; avoid running counter to law or public opinion.

TIME CHANGES

The time of day given is for Pacific Standard Time and should be changed by residents of other time zones to suit their location. Mountain, Central and Eastern time are one, two and three hours, respectively, in advance, that is, later in the day, as illustrated.

The Moon advances at the rate of approximately one degree in 2 hours. The nature of the sign occupied by the Moon from day to day is given under "Features of the Zodiacal Signs."

Daily Indications

"Forewarned is Forearmed"

By knowing the dates of favorable and unfavorable influences, it gives us the opportunity to think before it is time to act, and to select a day in advance, according to astrology.

The mathematical principles upon which astrology is based are scientific, but the delineations deduced therefrom are not always exact, due to insufficient knowledge concerning the planets and elements of the zodiacal signs, of which there is yet much to be discovered. Earnest researchers are devoting much thought to the perfection of Astro-Science.

The principal aspects of the planets are therefore interpreted here only for the purpose of aiding investigation, study and comparison of events or conditions as they transpire, in the hope that by such careful observation students may be enabled to work more in harmony with the laws of nature.

Planetary vibrations produce tendencies. "The stars incline; they do not compel." Daily Delineations describe the usual tendencies in advance so that you may exercise your knowledge toward improvement before it is time to act.

Refer to the IMPORTANT NOTICE each morning before making up your Daily Schedule according to astrology. See Contents, page 2, for page number of that notice.

The delineations for the three months covering the Spring Quarter can be made to serve a twofold purpose if you will treat pages 46-49 as an integral part of this department. Spend a few minutes daily familiarizing yourself with the information given there. This, of itself, constitutes a lesson in astrology as you will be taking the first step toward acquiring the fundamentals of astro-science. In turn, the knowledge thus gained will enable you to use the Daily Delineations to better advantage. For instance, in the Planetary Time Tables of April 6, you will see four A's and a G. By the Instructions (pages 46-49) you learn that G means "good,"; A adverse, and those planetary symbols show what kind of endeavors are favored or disfavored by the combination of planetary aspects in operation. "A" designates the square aspect which is symbolical of a problem to be met intelligently and with courage. Thus, knowledge of the nature of the aspect in operation, the planets involved, and the signs they occupy, forms your astrological blue print for the day's guidance. The ephemeris for this quarter of the year (which follows these delineations) shows the planetary positions by sign and degree.

Moon in Third Quarter.

Sunday, 1st: Moon 22° 26' in Scorpio; enters Sagittarius at 7:06 p. m.

Aside from the minor aspect which is complete 39 minutes past midnight, no others reach completion today, but two oncoming major squares should be taken into consideration, namely, Saturn-square-Neptune and Mars-square-Uranus on the 6th, and whose influence may be felt in the meantime, especially at times when the Moon activates any of the planets involved. Today suggests the usual Sunday interests with care to avoid hurts, physical and emotional, and damage to working equipment and fine fabrics.

Monday, 2nd: Moon 4° 28' in Sagittarius.

The outstanding influence emanates from Uranus prior to 2:59 p. m., and suggests calm, deliberate attitudes to avoid upsets and antagonism. This is one of the times when the square is provoked (Mars-Uranus) and the early morning hours may be subject to over-aggressiveness, harsh or rough attitudes, or pressure of circumstances against time. Remainder of day is better from the astrological standpoint, suggesting lines of Sun mainly.

Tuesday, 3rd: Moon 16° 38' in Sagittarius.

Although the Sun and Jupiter in parallel favor good-fellowship prior to 10:12 a. m., and is good for interchange of sociability and business matters, the square of Jupiter, which is operative at the same time, holds a caution against overoptimism, over-generosity, etc. This tends toward misjudgment in financial matters; toward mismanagement generally,—and considering the major aspects mentioned on the 1st, also loss or trouble in ventures started under its influence. So this day suggests attention to regular duties with more than the usual attention to system and order, to avoid costly errors. After 10:27 a. m. is not much better inasmuch as there's tendency toward impulsiveness and sudden, unpremeditated speech and action. This it not a time to make new plans, agreements; nor for risk of any kind. A good day for developing poise, tolerance and co-operation.

Wednesday, 4th: Moon 29° 02' in Sagittarius; enters Capricorn at 5:48 a.m.

Before 8:35 a. m. attend to things which must be executed, but as Moon today activates the Saturn-Neptune square, prior to 2:59 p. m., it is not a time to begin important new ventures nor for making decisions or committing yourself to responsibilities. After 2:59 p. m. the constructive sextile of Moon-Mars is helpful in many ways, particularly where in itiative, fearlessness and mechanical ingenuity are needed. The evening could be well devoted to special matters coming under the dominion of the planet Mars.

Fourth Lunar Quarter begins on 5th, at 11:18 a.m. Moon decreasing. Dark.

Between 11:18 a. m. (when the square of Moon-Sun reaches its maximum and then begins to decrease in power) and 6:47 p. m. the generous trine of Moon-Jupiter is helpful wherever good-fellowship, fraternal or professional connections may be used as an entering wedge to social or business matters. It is generally helpful in everyday matters for adjusting differences, ironing out misunderstandings and errors. After 6:47 p. m. the vibrations of oncoming squares call for extra care in all contacts and on the highway.

One of those days when an apparently small error may cause serious results. Be extra careful with details, figures, instructions. Very unfavorable for making new plans, arrangements, agreements; for courtship, marriage, new partnerships. Attend to necessary matters with determination to avoid argument, disputes and antagonism; and do not let unexpected situations upset you. Thursday, 7th: Moon 9° 35' in Taurus.

Between 2:04 a. m. and 6:20 p. m. the combined influences of the aspects in operation are expansive and generous. Good for general business and personal affairs, for formulating plans for improvement, either for self or for large numbers. Sun is forming square of Jupiter and reaches the peak of its influence at 10:19 a. m. on the 9th. This Jupiterian square inclines toward excess generally, over-generous and over-optimistic attitudes that usually manifest through misjudgment and over-estimation of values, thus bringing loss through paying or giving too much for too little. able differences in a multitude of other economic phases. The magnitude of the expansion and changes are virtually in direct proportion to the dissolution of conceptual unanimity.

It is apparent that a revolution of unprecedented proportions has been under way for several decades in society. Students of natural law long have recognized that from the late 1800's to about the 1950's marks a transition zone between two great ages of mankind; from the Piscean Age to the Aquarian Age. Also anticipated have been great wars, revolutionary processes, and all the devastating forces which contribute to tearing down the old in preparation for the new. It would seem that the events of the world between 1914 and 1945 would be sufficient to guarantee the attainment of stability by society and bring the realization of an era of post-war prosperity immediately; instead of waiting another eight or ten years. Yet there is nothing in the perspective of the scheme of things to justify the attainment of lasting foundations for the New Age in this decade. The second quarter of this year points to a wave of economic optimism which should be strong enough to carry into the third quarter, but major depression implications are very strong after early September of this year, extending to 1947 and 1948.

In the second quarter some very optimistic conditions are expected in early April with a cooling of enthusiasm after the 15th to the 23rd, some bullish revival from April 23rd to May 8th with uncertainty to the 17th followed by slightly increasing pessimism until mid-June. From the area of June 9th to 16th into early July optimism catches hold with prospects of a broad upward surge but July 1st to 5th can mark a very important top for some time to come.

They can marshall in the near future some four million troops in Asia, and they have the manpower to replenish great losses to these troops. To overcome this mighty army, it will be the policy of the U. S. and Britain to establish a bridgehead on the Chinese coast where immense quantities of arms can be landed, arms which can be furnished the Chinese troops. No doubt the invasion of Japan itself will be accomplished, in due time, by U. S. forces, and no doubt the major air offensive on the mainland of Asia will be carried out by U. S. flyers. But the crushing of the Jap land forces in Asia will greatly depend on the troops of the Chinese.

With the commencement of the new Mars cycle on May 6, the war in the Pacific will be markedly stepped up. The flow of war supplies into China, not merely over the Burma Road, but also by way of the Chinese Coast will not have long to wait. And as the summer advances the Japs will be harder and harder pressed.

As yet the part Russia will play where the Japs are concerned is not clear. But there is a concentration of astrological energy affecting Stalin, and affecting the Japs, the last of August, by which time the role of Russia, not merely in the Orient, but also in the West, will be apparent. Russia will move powerfully to secure new advantages.

But without clear knowledge of what Russia will do next fall, it is indicated astrologically that the setback Japan will receive under the second trine of Neptune to Uranus in its cycle, perfect on March 25, will be followed by even a more disastrous turn of affairs for her on the third trine perfect the last of August.

As pointed out in the last issue of this periodical, it is logical to expect the Japs to collapse under progressed Sun opposition Uranus in the Japanese chart. As the first time this aspect is complete is on September 12, 1946, it is unlikely Japan can be defeated before the summer of 1946. And without the aid of a united China, or the aid of Russia, it may take considerable longer to dispose of the Japanese troops on the mainland of Asia. The second and last opposition of the Sun to Uranus in the chart of Japan is perfect on August 18, 1848.

Should diplomatic events turn adverse to the U. S., the final defeat of the Japanese troops in Asia might have to wait for the second opposition to Uranus. The invasion of the Japanese homeland will not have to wait so long.

Although the indications are that U. S. losses will be high in May, and that stubborn resistance will be encountered, military successes will be pronounced for the U. S. throughout 1945. There will be steady advancement toward the complete defeat of Japan.

or pattern of the physical body. Too much nitrogen attracted to our ethereal astral design body will produce cell proliferation or cancer in the physical body, if uncontrolled by inhibiting higher mental and

spiritual energies.

ASSEMBLY BILL

No. 1804

INTRODUCED BY MR. BURKHALTER January 27, 1945

Referred to Committee on Governmental Efficiency and Economy

An act to add Chapter 17 to Division 3 of the Business and Professions Code consisting of Sections 9000 to 9123, inclusive, relating to practice of astrology.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 17 consisting of Sections 9000 to 9123, inclusive, is hereby added to Division 3 of the Business and Professions Code, as follows:

CHAPTER 17. ASTROLOGY Article 1. General Provisions

9000. This chapter of the Business and Professions Code constitutes the chapter on the practice of educational astrology. It may be cited as the Astrologers Registration Act.

9001. "Person" includes firms, associations, partnerships, and their agents or agencies and any combinations thereof.

9002. Astrology is the mathematical calculation of planetary positions and the interpretation of their influences upon terrestrial affairs.

9003. An astrologer is a person skilled in astrology and who to the people holds himself out as engaged in or so engages in the practice or teaching of astrology for a fee, compensation, reward or other consideration.

9004. The qualifications, examination, licensing, registration and discipline of Astrologers shall be under the supervision of the Director of the Department of

Professional and Vocational Standards of the State of California, herein referred to as the director. 9005. "Department" refers to the State Department of Professional and

Vocational Standards. 9006. "Secretary" refers to secretary of the department.

Article 2. Administration

9050. The Department of Professional and Vocational Standards established under Chapter 5 of Division 1 of this code is vested with power to administer the provisions and requirements of this chapter and to make and enforce such rules and regulations as may be necessary to carry out its provisions.

9051. The secretary of the department shall keep a complete record of all

applications for license and the department's action thereon.

He shall transmit to the county recorder of each county in the State lists of all licenses issued, suspended or revoked by the department since the date of preparation of the last preceding similar list. The list shall show the names and addresses of the licensees.

The county recorders shall keep full and complete records of all the licenses

and of all the suspensions and revocations.

9052. The department may employ such clerical assistance under civil service regulations as may be necessary properly to carry out and enforce the provisions

of this chapter.

Within 30 days prior to the meeting of the regular session of the Legislature, the department shall submit to the Governor a full and true report of its transactions during the preceding biennium including a complete statement of the receipts and expenditures of the department during that period. A copy of the report shall be filed with the Secretary of State.

Article 3. Licenses

9100. It is unlawful for any person to engage in the business or vocation regulated by this chapter unless he has first obtained the proper license as required hereunder.

9101. Licenses issued hereunder are not transferable, and each license issued

shall be exclusively for the person to whom it is issued.

9102. Every person holding himself out as an astrologer or as a teacher of astrology, or as a member of the faculty of any class or school of astrology, shall first obtain a license as required hereunder, and shall thereupon be entitled to engage in the business or vocation of astrology, without further restriction.

9103. Examinations for license as a practicing astrologer shall be held at least once each calendar year, and as often as may be justified in the opinion of

the department.

Such examinations may be given at such time and places as the department may determine, provided that 30 days' notice in advance of the examination shall

be afforded the applicants.

9104. Examinations shall be given by qualified persons appointed by the department. Any persons so appointed to give an examination shall not possess any qualifications less than those required in the case of an original applicant. Three such persons shall be appointed to give the examinations ordered by the department and shall be selected, one from the area commonly referred to as southern California, one from northern California, and one to be selected at large.

The persons so appointed shall serve at the pleasure of the department, and each or all of such persons appointed may be removed by the department at any

time without assignment of cause therefor.

Article 4. Qualifications

9110. Any person may apply for a license as an astrologer upon making written application therefor to the Department of Professional and Vocational Standards, provided the applicant possesses the following minimum qualifications:

a. He must be a resident of the State of California for five (5) years immed-

iately preceding the date of his application.

- b. The applicant must be a graduate of a school recognized for the teaching of astrology, which school has been established for a period of not less than five (5) years.
- c. The applicant must be of good character and shall have a record of conduct satisfactory to the department.
 - d. The applicant shall be at least twenty-one (21) years of age.
 - e. The applicant shall be a citizen of the United States of America.

Article 5. Fees

9120. Each application for a license shall be accompanied by an application fee of ten dollars (\$10), which fee shall be retained by the department except and unless the applicant does not possess the necessary qualifications required by this chapter. In such case the fee may be refunded. If the applicant is successful in the passage of an examination and a license is granted, he shall pay a license fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25). The renewal of all licenses shall be on a calendar year basis, and shall be due on or before January 1st of each year. The renewal fee shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25). Failure to renew the license on or before March 1st of each year shall ipso facto work a forfeiture of said license.

9121. Any license which has expired for nonpayment of the annual renewal fee fixed by this chapter may be restored within one year from its expiration

under rules and regulations prescribed by the department.

Article 6. Revenue

9122. The department shall receive and account for all income derived under the operation of this chapter.

At the end of each month, the department shall report the income to the State Controller and deposit it with the State Treasurer to the credit of the Educational Astrology Fund.

All necessary expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of this chapter, shall, in accordance with law, be paid from the Educational Astrology Fund.

Article 7. Disciplinary Proceedings

9123. Persons licensed under this chapter may, after proper notice and hearing, be cited by the department and if found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this chapter, may have their licenses suspended or permanently revoked.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fee of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25) nor more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) and not more than thirty (30) days in the county jail.
