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

# The Helper By Your Side

"Please come, Rev. Chaney! We need you!"

The woman's voice was full of pleading, and so weak that it faded out before the statement, "We need you", was finished.

My bedroom clock showed fif-

My bedroom clock showed fifteen minutes after twelve, midnight. I had been in bed about one half hour when this *message* roused me from a sound sleep. I was now wide awake, and remembered clearly seeing a woman lying prostrate on the floor by a bed. Strangely, the bed seemed to have fallen apart, but I did not see that it was occupied

This Spirit Message came while I was pastor of the Forest Methodist Church, and in this parish lived more than one thousand people. While I was dressing, I was trying to determine who in all that number was sending out such a call of distress in the middle of the night. I went over, in my mind, every home that I had visited where there was sickness, without being able to identify the voice or the woman. But, I continued to dress and prepare to respond to this call for help, believing that the same Spirit Messenger who had awakened me, would reveal the home to which I was to go.

As I put the key into the car door, and looked toward the starry sky with a prayer, I heard one word spoken, *Harper!* 

The Harpers lived near the edge of town and until recently had operated a dairy business. They did not attend my church, but I knew of them, although I had never called at their home.

The main street of the town of Forest was deserted when I drove through, but I did see the night marshal and pulled to the curb to ask him if he had any report of trouble at the Harper home that night. He had none, and could throw no light on this mysterious message.

The entire downstairs of the Harper home was lighted up when I parked in the drive, but no one came out to greet me, and I could see no one moving about in the house. Pushing open the front door, I walked through the lighted house. Unmistakably, I heard someone moaning and I walked into the bedroom from which these sounds came. The foot board was off the bed, lying flat on the floor. Mr. Harper was in the partly wrecked bed, still moaning and calling for help. I walked around to the other side, and saw Mrs. Harper lying on the floor, fully dressed, but unconscious.

My first efforts were to arouse her and bring her back to consciousness, and I picked her up and placed her on a couch in the same room. Mr. Harper was trying to tell me something, but his words were so jumbled that I was unable to understand him. When the wife revived, I got the whole story.

She had started to phone me shortly after twelve o'clock, but collapsed and fell before she got to the telephone. Hence, the phone call to the parsonage was not made, but God, through His Spirit Messengers, delivered her message to me.

While we put the bed back together, with Mr. Harper lying in it, she told me the sad story. Their son, who is a physician practicing in another state, had left for his home that afternoon, thinking that his father's condition was greatly improved.

He had come three weeks before, because the father was critically ill, and upon arrival, ordered his father moved to a hospital. The right leg was already gangrenous. Without informing his father of the real condition of his affliction, the son and another surgeon decided to amputate the right leg near the hip.

When the father came out of the drugs, and realized he had lost his leg, he begged to die. He was indeed a broken hearted man, without any fighting desire to live and get well.

About three o'clock in the afternoon, before the Spirit Messenger had called me to the Harper home, the Doctor-son saw that his father was resting comfortably, and started for his home about two hundred miles away. But, early that evening, the father began to suffer much pain from the severed nerves in his amputated leg. These so-called phantom pains are well known to every amputee. To the sufferer, it feels as though the leg and foot are still there, and the suffering is beyond description. In this agony, Mr. Harper began to kick with his sound leg and his strength was such that he knocked the footboard off the bed. It was then that Mrs. Harper put through a long distance call to the son, who had reached his office and home. When she told the son that the strongest drugs had not quieted the father, he advised her to phone me, and have me come over.

I should explain here that Mrs. Harper was not a strong woman physically, and all she had gone through the past weeks of her husband's illness had exhausted her, and before she could reach me by telephone, she had collapsed on the floor beside the bed.

All of us have heard the statement that "when man can go no farther, God takes over." That was actually demonstrated that night, because I received her message, and saw her lying on the floor beside her husband's bed, as clearly as on a television screen. We can put worry out of our lives when we put complete trust in God and His multitude of Spirit Helpers. We cannot too often remind ourselves that the very word Christ used when He promised His disciples that He would return to them in Spirit is Paraclete, (John 14:16 and 26). Paraclete is formed by two Greek words meaning Helper By Your Side.

These Spirit Helpers are more numerous than we imagine. Once,

Christ assured His disciples that If He wanted to call Spirit Helpers, He could summon twelve legions of angels. Since a Roman legion was 6,000, Christ impressed His disciples with the promise that 72,000 Spirit Helpers would respond if He asked for them. (Matthew 26:53-54).

I will give you my own recipe for freedom from anxiety, and peace of mind. When I put my head on the pillow at night, I say: "Dear Lord, I have done my best for you today, now the Spirit Helpers will have to work the night shift."

With God's Healing Forces, I was able to obtain relief for Mr. Harper and within an hour he was sleeping. Mrs. Harper assured me that she could finish the night all right, and I returned to the parsonage, and to my bed.

However, the spiritual battle to rehabilitate Mr. Harper was to be a long one, requiring great faith, and frequent calls for help from the Spirit World. Besides healing for the stub, it was necessary to restore his interest in living, and to prove to him that God would help him to walk again. I knew I was part of a remarkable demonstration of the power of spirit healing of mind and body.

Daily, I visited the Harpers. I should say nightly, because my visits were often at midnight. Mr. Harper would cry, and tell me, "I will never walk again! I will never drive my car again!"

And, each time, I would grasp his hand, and assure him that he would walk again, and he would drive his car through the streets of Forest. All the neighborhood would witness this wonderful work of God. A hundred times I quoted to him the Scripture:

"Everything is possible for one who has faith", Mark 9:23.

The leg healed beautifully, and

Mr. Harper began to have some faith. I remembered his broad smile the night he showed me that the healing was perfect. This was the day I had prayed for so fervently, and had asked for Spirit Guidance from the highest source for the next step in helping him to walk. I told Mrs. Harper to phone the son next day and tell him to personally consult a designer of artifical limbs, and to insist that it be lined with the pelt of a sheep, or the hairside of deer hide. This had been impressed upon me strongly by Spirit Guides. Any reader of this article who may have to nurse people with bedsores should make note of the healing quality of these pelts. Scores of people have found bene-ficial results. I learned later, while talking with a leather manufacturer that he had used hundreds of deer hides in making pads for horses, to heal their sore necks. These are worn under the horse collar with hair side next to the sore. So many people were advised to try these for human needs that I frequently went to this manufacturer for pieces of deer hide.

It was a day of thanksgiving when the new leg came, and I helped fit it to his stub. Spirit Forces were with the designer and maker

The study of fairies is a fascinating one that has occupied the attention, recently, of some of our scientists and investigators. Some of these scientists call "the little people" the "mind of the atoms"a part of the mind that is the governing power of all life. In England, Scotland, Ireland, and Wales, it is the most highly educated who believe in the wee folk and who have demonstrated their presence. Both adults and children in Ireland declare that they see the fairies and little gnomes swarming over the bogs and marshes. They often see them dance in glee. There, there are millions and millions of water fairies all moving in the same direction, each carrying a bucket of golden mist. - These are facts, if testimonies have any weight at all. Science recognizes observation and experience as methods of the discovery of truth. Evans Wentz received his Master's Degree from Oxford University for the publishing of a book entitled Fairy Faith In Celtic Lands, an investigation in which he collected one hundred and two cases of people now living, who asserted that they had seen fairies in Ireland, Scotland, and in the north of France.

Important situations in living often arise in which the fairies are concerned, and their desires are observed; for example, the Dublin Evening Mail reports that in South Wexford, Ireland, there are numer-'fairy raths" and the tradition is that they belong to the "little people" and should not be disturbed by humans. People observe this. Another report says that on the farm of a Mr. J. Whitty, Wilkinstown, there happens to be a pole used to carry an electric cable. This pole, unfortunately, was erected on a large "fairy rath", perhaps by mistake. However, the next morning after its erection, the pole which had been solidly placed, was found to be loose in the ground and lean-

ing over dangerously. So the hole was sunk to seven feet, the pole being erected and packed tightly. Next morning, it was again loose. This was repeated for several days. Eventually, the pole had to be removed from the "rath". This time, it stayed properly and solidly where placed and there has been no trouble since. There are numerous in-stances of this kind, concerning which, some Government officials have advised the people not to trouble the fairies or their abodes.

Fairies have been photographed by several investigators, and plaster

easts have been made of fairy hands and feet. They have been seen by hosts of reputable people. Perhaps the most convincing investigation, from a scientific point of view, is the case of the two children, Elsie and her cousin Frances, of England. These girls, who constantly went into the woods to play with fairies, were members of a family in Bradford. Their parents were skeptics who "had no sympathy with any nonsense connected with fairies", as they expressed it. Little Elsie, however, wanted to take a picture of the tiny beings they played with in the woods, and after repeated refusals, managed to secure a camera from her father, "Midg", loaded with one plate. She and Frances ran into the woods to a waterfall. Little Frances "ticed" the fairies, as Elsie expressed it, while she stood ready with the camera. Soon, three fairies appear-

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ed, and one pixie danced in Frances' aura. Elsie snapped the camera, hoping she had secured a picture of their little playmates. It was, though, a long time before the father could be persuaded to de-velop the plate. Finally, when he did get around to it, "to his great amazement, the four sweet little figures came out beautifully." This figures came out beautifully." and other fairy pictures are shown in the book *Fairies*, by E. L. Gardner, price \$2.60, *Chimes*, Brea, Calif. This first picture was taken on a sunny day, July, 1917, at a distance of four feet from the subjects. Frances, with her chin resting on her right hand, stands against the bank of Cottingley Beck. The waterfall and rocks are some twenty feet behind her - the four fairies are disporting themselves in front of her, and a fifth may be discerned between and some way behind the two fairies on the right. The girls described the coloring of these tiny beings as "very pale pink, green, lavender, and mauve-most marked in the wings, and fading to almost pure white in the limbs and

drapery Little Frances took a second photograph on a fairly bright day in September, 1917, with the same length of exposure as before, but with the "Midg" camera eight feet distant. The result shows Elsie at play with a gnome which she is beckoning to, in order to get him to hop onto her hand. Fortunately, Frances snapped the shutter at the very instant the little fellow skipped into the child's hand. His wings show as if downy and mothlike. The children declare that gnomes are of a neutral tint. Some pipes are held in the left hand of the gnome in the picture. The girls state that a faint musical tinkling sound may be heard when all is still. A successful, but less striking, photograph was taken by Elsie with a Cameo camera in August, 1920. The picture indicates a fairy leaping up from the foliage below and hovering close to Frances' head. This fairy had a close-fitting la-vender costume. The camera plate was previously and secretly marked by the investigator to make everything scientific, as a number of scientists and writers became interested in these beautiful and authentic photographs of fairies taken by the children, among whom was Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. He secured the negatives and took them to Mr. A. Snelling, one of England's great photographic experts, of whom it was said that no one could ever fool with a faked photograph. After exhaustive tests, he was willing to risk his professional reputation that the pictures were

absolutely genuine, that the photographs were single exposures, that all the figures of the fairies had actually moved during the exposure, which was "instantaneous".

Sir Arthur continued further investigations with experts, with the same results. Both in England and in America, photographic experts claimed they were real pictures of fairies, and in every way genuine. Later, Conan Doyle, who realized the truth of the existence of fairies, wrote his book, The Coming Of The Fairies. He has talked several times to the present writer from the other side of life, and is of the same opinion regarding fairies as when he was here - they are real and with a very important work to perform. His book is now out of print, but Edward L. Gardner's book Fairies can be obtained. Gardner was present when some of Sir Arthur's pictures were taken and he includes these with some of his own in his book.

Air Chief Marshal Lord Dowding also knows the truth about the fairies, which has been discussed learnedly at meetings of the British Association for the Advancement of Science. He has lectured on fairies and angels many times. Speaking some years ago on the existence of fairies to the members of the Marylebonne Spiritualist Association, he declared that he "no knowledge of gremlins whatever, and that the activities ascribed to them in the R.A.F. are purely the results of poor or lazy mechanics", but he went on to say that the "fairies exist and can be classified into broad divisions-the flower and nature spirits that are associated with earth, water, and The water spirits are called "naiads", the air spirits are called "sylphs", and the fire spirits are called "salamanders". The naiads kelpies, and other water spirits live in waterfalls and sea-pools and are thought to have some function in connection with aquatic life. The slyphs rise into the air and have something to do with the brewing of storms. The salamanders are scavenger spirits and are responsible for the decay of matter from which life has departed. Lord Dowding definitely asserts, time and time again, that fairies exist, just as angels also exist, and that they have three main forms. There is, first, the non-human angel who has never existed on earth. Second. the angel that was once human and has lived on earth-these are often thought of as perfected beings, men and women still interested in earth affairs, who still endeavor to help humanity. The third kind of angel, he tells us, is the non-human being who has lived on earth, and in this latter category is the link between the angel and the fairy kingdoms.

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

# RESURRECTION OF THE BODY

Here is a question that deserves attention. "Dear Mr. Bodin: I have been having a friendly argument with a Roman Catholic neighbor on various matters, but we both seem mixed up on the Resurrection of the Body question. Can you tell me the difference between the Catholic and Spiritualist versions?'

According to the Roman Catholic Catechism, here is the Catholic version: "By the Resurrection of the Body, it was meant that at the end of the world the bodies of all men will rise from the earth and be united again to their souls, never to be separated." And the Catechism also adds: "Those who Catechism also adds: "Those who died in mortal sin will suffer terribly for all eternity" (evidently flesh pains.) Of course, Christ being Divine, resurrected on the first Easter, but there was one human exception according to the Catechism. It was "the Blessed Virgin whose body was raised from the dead and taken into Heaven. This was due to her Immaculate Conception proclaimed by the Catholic Church about 400 years

But, according to certain Spiritualists, the mortal flesh body of man and woman ever since the fall of Adam and Eve, is a punishment and is not a holy thing, just an imperfect covering for the spirit. Only the original perfect immortal materialized body which was created in the image of God — is holy. The mortal body of imperfect flesh and blood cannot enter Heaven as Saint Paul insisted. Therefore, the resurrection of the body means resurrection of the spirit body as the new creation of materialization of the spirit - not the old flesh and blood body, but a body like Christ's after his death, capable of appearing and disappearing to mortal eyes as Christ did to His Disciples. But, His resurrected body was not of mortal substance as was His old body. It could not die.

Catholics and Spiritualists are miles apart, for it seems the Catholic consciousness is flesh-andblood-minded, rather than the image of God or undying spirit minded. Even in the Holy Communion, the Catholics are conscious of flesh and blood, whereas Christ, in explaining the bread and wine symbolizing His body, said in John 6:63: "It is the spirit that quickeneth; the flesh profiteth nothing. The words that I speak unto you, they are spirit.

Thus, the difference might be explained like this: the Catholics see the mortal matter of man, instead of the resurrected immortal radiant energy of spirit which has no desire to return to its corrupt mortal body after the atomic explosion of death, but to manifest in perfect materialization as originally created in the Garden of Eden before the Fall and punishment to the imperfect body and earthly death.

Naturally, the Catholic consciousness was conceived before the understanding of nuclear science; so the clergy are stuck with the flesh and blood idea, just as many who heard Christ explain the Communion, could not stomach the eating of His flesh, and turned away. But, spirit truth will make you free and revise old ideas which were based on old scientific examples. There is no use arguing with your friendly Catholic neighbor. His church will not let him change, just as the church once persecuted those who dared to believe the earth was not flat. Until they see Christ as Spiritualists see Him, they have to stick to their story, until their younger scientific members force the new frontier consciousness. Be patient that Christ was right when He said: "Ye shall see the Son of man ascend up where he was before ... as spirit, not flesh. (John 6:62).

# A OUESTION TO ED BODIN

Meetings will be held in Hotel Texas, Longhorn Room, and will feature many well known lecturers and mediums from all parts of the United States. All are cordially invited to attend.


Rev. William H. Du Bois, well known healer, speaker and worker from New York City, New York, began his summer tour with an en-

# Psychic Phenomena-Genuine or Fraud?

by Willis E. Hutchinson

Beyond doubt, psychic phenomena, trumpet, materialization, etc., are the most controversial subjects in the field of Spiritualism. The fact that these demonstrations are conducted either in total darkness, or under dim red light lend themselves to fraudulent practices by so-called mediums. That there is much of this kind of thing going on in every part of the world is well known. Millions of dollars are taken from the unsuspecting public each year.

However, I am sure there are many genuine demonstrations of this amazing phenomena to be found, and I shall tell you why I believe this to be true.

Some years ago, I came to the city of Los Angeles to live. Being alone, and having not much else to do, I frequently browsed through the city library. One evening, I found myself in the section con-

taining books and magazines of a religious nature. Leisurely wandering around this room, I noticed a row of shelves upon which rested a hundred or more books under the heading, "Spiritualism".

The thought came into my mind, how can so many books be written on a subject that does not exist? At that time, I considered "ghosts' to be only imaginary things used to frighten children, or if believed in by adults, a sure sign of insanity. Curiosity prompted me to take several books from the shelves, and read the names of their authors. Much to my surprise, these books were written by well educated men. They were scholars, doctors, and scientists, all men with letters after their names. As I continued to look through these books, I discovered that, almost without exception, the writers were by no means a bunch of morons.

Then came another question. Why would a respectable serious minded man write such a book? Why would he risk ridicule, and perhaps be ostracized by his fellow scientists?

So, I began to read. Every evening for weeks, I continued to read. After summing up the results of all this study. I found one thing that was conceded by every author. All agreed that while much fraud was being practiced, there was also a certain percentage of demonstrations for which there was no logical explanation.

Despite rigorous controls, in the form of mechanical devices used to detect fraud in any form, these demonstrations continued. They all agreed that things happen that are in defiance of our physical laws. But, what this strange power is, and how it works, they did not know.

All this prompted my curiosity.

What was this thing? Was it good or evil? Could it be developed by anyone?

To these questions, I must have an answer. So, I began a long and fruitful search. I read a mountain of books. I joined every development class, every scance, and every Spiritualist meeting I could find. I did not realize at the time just what surprising effect all this was to have on me, for by continuing this investigation, I was unconsciously developing mediumship within myself!

As time went on, I accumulated a mass of information, all sorted and filed away in my mind. I was becoming a believer. Little by little, all doubts were being dispelled, as many things had happened to convince me that there was a spirit world as real as our own. That there was a means of communication between these two worlds became increasingly evident.

Many times, I have heard the remark that Harry Houdini, the greatest magician of all time, did produce the illusion of psychic phenomena with such skill that it had the apearance of the real thing. With the aid of elaborate equipment and many rehearsals, the performance must have been amazingly similar to what takes place in the seance room. However, when you reverse the situation, and ask yourself, how could an ordinary housewife, using a room in her home to give her demonstrations, duplicate the tricks of the world's greatest magician, the comparison becomes rather foolish!

Probably once in a lifetime a person will experience an event that will change their entire way of thinking, consequently, their philosophy of life will be on a much higher plane. Such an experience happened several years ago, and I consider this unexplainable event to be the turning point of my life.

This remarkable demonstration took place in a small room in a private home. The medium, whom I had never seen before, was a mild mannered, timid little woman. Her outward appearance gave no hint as to her great psychic powers.

I introduced myself, giving my name only. The medium could not have possibly known any details of my past life. The information I received at this sitting could not have been taken from my subconscious mind, because it pertained to future events which were to take place within the coming year.

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It took me a few moments to recover from this unexpected event. My mother took hold of my arm. She was as solid as a living person. 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
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# Faith In Father Saved Son's Life

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

Man can do nothing to change the law of progression and retrogression. As soon as he finds himself caught up in the great forward movement, he becomes one with it, and can never doubt its reality or ultimate goal. His own selfishness or even fiendishness can allow him to fall backward, away from the stream of life. In such a state of mind he becomes a physical man who does not cooperate with society or who works against it; as a disembodied spirit he can often be directed to the right course, or he may be confined so that he cannot work harm on others until he can be turned in the upward movement of spirits in general.

Progress, in any form, finds many examples in the earthly society, such as education of all kinds. Yet much of it is felt, especially by

"It will not last." We very often hear this remark from skeptics when a successful healing has taken place. It is the last resort of disbelief when the skeptic is faced with positive healing results. Even with Spiritual healing, there are many cases of the ill-condition returning, but so it is with any therapy, whether it be medical, herbal or physiotherapy.

In our world of nervous tension, which, in the main, is caused by man sponsored inconsistencies, we are faced with illnesses which have their origin in fear. A particular therapy may remove the illness, but the world stress remains to again reproduce the ill-condition in a never ending cycle of events.

In spite of this appalling result of human delinquency, Spiritual healing, in many cases, achieves something which even medical science cannot produce, for it brings about a completely changed attitude towards human living; it produces cures which will stand the test of even the most critical medical analysis. One such case was recently recorded in The Spiritual Healer; a British magazine which is free from all forms of religious bias and prejudice.

It was in September, 1954 at a public Healing Demonstration, when Mr. Harry Edwards and Mr. and Mrs. Burton appeared at the Royal Albert Hall, London, before an audience of 6,000 people that I witnessed a spiritual healing, which has stood the test for seven years. The first patient was Mr. Harms, who was suffering from chronic arthritis. He made his way, painfully, to the platform and had to be half carried up the steps.

Mr. C. Harms had spent the previous two years in five hospitals and was finally discharged as "incurable". His spine was rigid, and the shoulder and hip joints were severely locked. He was then 64 years of age. At this demonstration, Mr. Edwards unlocked his arm and leg joints without causing pain. He left the Royal Albert Hall without the aid of his sticks. The day following, he walked three miles without any sticks. Nothing was afterwards heard of Mr. Harms until six years later, in January, 1960. Whatever may be said concerning the permanency of Spiritual healing, this case proves that the power of Spirit is greater than man. I give, below, the report from Mr. Harms himself. The letter, to-

gether with a recent photograph of himself riding a horse, was re-ceived by Mr. Edwards in January, 1960, and came from Durban,

South Africa. Mr. Harms is now 71 and looks a picture of health. His letter says:-

"I had to retire in 1952 owing to rheumatoid arthritis. I spent two years in five hospitals. I was discharged as incurable, and could only hobble about on two sticks. I got interested in healing, and attended several of vour demonstrations, hoping to be called, but this was not so. Then came the meeting in the Royal Albert Hall, and I had a feeling I would be called. I was no. 1, and my case was reported in the press.

"I have been out here now for two years. It's been wonderful, and my life has been renewed. I am only 70 years of age and I have not had any pain whatsoever for the past four years."

Surely, here is incontrovertible evidence of the permanence that can come with healing. Thousands of cases of this kind can be recorded. In the field of Absent and Contact healing alike, the compassionate work of Spirit proceeds relentlessly. There is no known disease or ill-condition which has defied the Gift of Spirit. Only the man-administered therapies are restricted by human knowledge, experience and skill. Spiritual Healing is not in conflict with medical science, but when medical science fails, Spiritual healing often produces lasting results which are beyond the comprehension of man.

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

Within a month, she wrote that he was greatly improved and did not bring liquor home. When I saw him, a few months later, he looked like a new man, and told me that he had "cut out booze", and had always known he could do so if he thought it necessary, but that it was only when the doctor had thrown a scare into him that he began to think that, perhaps, he had allowed it to get out of hand, so he had just quit.

This was in the days of wideopen saloons and, although he went to many drinking places with friends, where drinking was rampant, he had no further desire for it. Others asked him what he had done to himself and he answered, "just quit".

Tom was a dear, kind-hearted old Irishman, whose only real fault was his periodical debauches. He had been working for us for several years, and one day as he was helping me in my flower garden, I asked him if he wanted to quit drinking — I had overheard some of the men say he was due for another trip to town.

An appealing, pitiful look came over his kind, old, weatherbeaten face and his eyes filled with tears as he strove to control his emotions. "Oh, Missus, if I only could! But, I have taken all kinds of cures and nothing ever lasts. It's got me, and it'll always have me, as long as I live! I'd like to quit, but I can't."

I smiled reassuringly, as I patted his work-worn hand, and said, 'Don't say that, Tom, don't ever give up. The men agreed that his money was piling up, and he was anxious to put it into circulation through some of the saloonmen in town. It was undoubtedly true that he wanted to put it into circulation, for he was the most generous person I had ever known, and seemed to feel that the best use for money was to make other people happy.

He was back in a week and, instead of the wreck we had been used to seeing upon such occasions, we were surprised at his alert appearance. He came into the office, smiling and handing out little gifts, right and left, as he said, "Boys, believe it or not, but I've had the time of my life and I didn't drink a drop, not even a tree one."

Even though they joked him, we knew by his appearance that he was telling the truth. He constantly assured me he cared nothing for it — he was really free. I did not work on this case alone, as a mutual friend constantly encouraged him and kept him away from his old associates when he was in town, as much as possible. As his faith grew in himself, the cure was completed.

Intemperance has a cause lying much deeper than mere appetite. The soul longs for "something" and the craving will not cease until it is satisfied. Back of a man's brain, body and faculties is this "something" that is greater than all of these — a "something" that is master and which must, eventually, be recognized.

When the time comes for this recognition, an unrest will manifest in some way, and happiness and contentment will never again be experienced until the "master" comes into its own.

You, who have a dear one who is a slave to some devastating habit will want to know more about the method you can use in freeing them from it. Our heritage is to create, through the use of words, both spoken and unexpressed, and many are held in bondage to vices and habits by those who greatly desire to free them, because of an ignorant use of this Power.

Our dominant thoughts determine our own physical condition and environment, and largely in-

fluence those with whom we associate. We never come in close contact with others without it making some change in us and in them. Each one radiates what he is, no matter how much he may try to conceal it, and the more sensitive anyone is, the more clearly they feel this radiation.

A man may desire to quit drinking, and he may be making strenuous efforts to do so, but the destructive, mental influences brought to bear upon him, unconsciously, by his family and friends, may prove too much for him. Each relapse weakens his will-power and faith in himself, until he finally becomes convinced that he is bevond help. One who is quite alone in the world will find it easier to free himself from vices and undesirable habits than one who has deeply interested friends, because no one cares very much about him, and his actions and habits cause little comment, or interest his burden rests almost wholly upon his own mental state, while another will be burdened, not alone by his own thoughts, but by those his family and friends are heaping upon him.

Public opinion has been strongly focussed upon the drink-habit in recent years, and this has caused it to become more wide-spread. The more the public centers its attention upon *anything*, the more powerful it becomes, and as soon as they lose interest and cease to discuss it, or think of it, it loses power.

The epidemic of flu which reaped such a grim harvest a number of years ago is proof of this. Many, in isolated localities, who were never exposed to it, died of it — fear killed them. In like manner, fear is causing untold misery at the present time.

Because of this wide-spread attention, the drink-habit has become more powerful than ever before, and many new victims have become enmeshed in its chains. People who never thought of using it before "thou shalt not" was flaunted before them, now do so. In their attempt to assert their freedom, they have lost it instead.

Before we can hope to accomplish much, we must learn to concede the possibilities in the man back of appearances and recognize his oneness with Universal Life. This is not always easy to do, for we have lived so long in the world of appearances, but it is essential to a realization of a sense of freedom, not only from the drink-habit, but from every other form of inharmony. No one is freed until they have lost all desire.

After your own vision has cleared, you will then be able to see others in their true light, and you will, unconsciously, lighten their burdens. If they do not wish to be

To explain the allusion to the cards, with which the message opened: When the brothers Borgia arrived back at their rooms in Adelphi, they found a small package of visiting cards had been placed on a table in the center of the room. The cards, in the box containing them, had been removed and carried from the drawer, where they were always kept, the lid of the box removed, and was close by, while half were taken out of the box and tumbled around the table.

In addition to the many hundreds of spirit communications received by the Borgias, there were also many years of psychical phenomena which many years of research have proven to be genuine. There were spirit rappings on wood that sounded as though they were being made with a sledge hammer, materialization, wherein the spirit entity became entirely visible, levitation or the lifting of either the medium or an inanimate object, and telekinesis, an example of which is described above. They were also gifted with clairvoyance which enabled them to accurately foresee the future in a great many cases, clairaudience, or ability to hear entities in the world of spirit, and clairsentience or sensing of spiritual moods or "hunches".

Mr. Borgia's actual writing mediumship began in 1928, at the age of thirty-two. The first messages were largely personal, except for frequent reference made to a future work, though no specific mention was made. Eventually he was informed through other mediums that he would be asked to undertake a job of writing. It seemed that one Monsignor Robert Hugh Benson, well known author and former prelate in the Roman Catholic Church, had died on October 19th, 1914, and was now trying to contact him. The Monsignor was the son of the late Archbishop Benson, a former Archbishop of Canter-

Many years ago, Monsignor Benson had authored a book, there were twenty-four in all, called "The Necromancers". This gained considerable fame although it was purported to have given a distorted view of spirit communication, as the good Monsignor later revealed through a seance to Anthony Borgia. Anthony later indicated in the preface of his first book, "Life In The World Unseen", that Monsignor had learned posthumously that many of the views expressed in "The Necromancers" were incorrect. Naturally, one of his ardent desires in the sphere of existence he now found himself, was to correct the erroneous impressions given in that work. His great desire in preparing the spirit messages was to help remove the fear of death from people's minds through the recounting of his own experiences, together with the imparting of his newly found "spirit knowledge".

Indeed, it is precisely at this point that the psychic mediumship of Anthony Borgia differs so much from other and more famous mediums. He is one of the very few who has had the courage to let the spirit communicator speak for himself. There has been no gentle inserting of any earthly philosophy, however good or true. Neither has there been an attempt to "tone down" the messages in order to make them more acceptable, thereby easing the difficulty of getting the work published in media more apt to be read by the average person. As a result, the messages are uplifting in the extreme and so positive in content that their message instantly

transmits a ring of truth. They deal almost entirely with what happens to the soul, providing it has lived a life of good purpose here on earth, although no attempt is made to cover up the existence of the "dark realms" or spheres of low order or selfish spirits. On the contrary, these realms are discussed with the same incisive truth as the rest of the disclosures. The reader is no more persuaded to swallow a fanciful idealogy than if he were reading a telephone directory. The statements are made quite in a "matter-of-fact" vein, which naturally delivers much more information.

That our life in the World to Come is many times richer and fuller in all respects than anything we have ever known on earth, is the supreme message as revealed through the mediumship of Anthony Borgia. And perhaps more than anything else is the certain assurance, to all who can recognize its truth, that all of us will, at some time, no matter how distant, be included in what is now known to be the true "Kingdom of God".

Geoffrey Hodson, known for his books and research into fairylore (especially Fairies At Work And At Play\*\*\*), suggests that these normal invisible entities that are a part of the mysterious forces of nature around us, may be semiangelic beings, in an ever moving. rising process, working their way upward from the half-way plane of fairy probation to that of the higher angel form. Bishop Charles W. Leadbeater, author of the Hidden Side Of Christian Festivals, writes much about this also, considering the possibility that fairy entities may be the etheric evolution of the small creatures of nature who have died - the birds and butterflies.

Annie Besant, speaking of the reality, place, and work of fairies in her book A Study In Consciousness, says that the development of a tree is quickened when a nature spirit takes charge of it, and that then the tree may be regarded as having a soul, because a portion of the monad-bearing life-wave pervades it and evolves it by means of the incarnation within it. The first effect is the dawning consciousness of the tree, its becoming sensitive from impacts from without. The nature spirit, being so

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much more highly evolved, appears also to act as a link or channel for energies from higher levels of consciousness, and so fulfill a function which is a faint reflection of that of the ego of man.

The late renowned Edgar Cavce, even when in his sixties, could see the gnomes and fairies and has described some of them to the writer. He told of a little gnome that he saw standing out at the edge of his garden, a little fellow with a round head, slender legs and distended abdomen. He was about two feet tall and was clad in a little green jacket and breeches. Likewise, Shaw Desmond, the famous English writer, distinctly sees the "little people", says they are sub-human and elemental, and often 'poltergeistish". They are said to live about a thousand years in their etheric bodies; they can always see us, but we cannot often see them. They can lower or heighten their vibration and can communicate by speech. Desmond tells about his friend Ella Young, the Irish poetess, and her personal experiences with the "little people". When she was living in a lonely cottage outside Dublin, the "little people" would call for her in the afternoon, and lead her up and down the garden to look at the hills with them. She would speak to them in their natural tongue. Many of the children nearby shared her experiences.

The researches at Dungeness, includes those made by the "Fairy Investigation Society", founded by Captain C. A. Quentin and R. N. Craufurd, the president of which was the Viscountess Molesworth. The marsh fairies were the subject of study. The secretary of the Society wrote to Desmond to say, "I have very interesting results with my camera which undoubtedly prove the existence of the fairy folk." Then he tells of a snapshot, taken quite by accident, by a lady in a garden near London, who was taking a picture of her garden. When developed, it showed a tiny fairy, exactly like those of the "little people" taken by the girls at Cottingley Beck.

One of the strangest cases of fairies is that reported by a tourist party, near the Black Forest, Germany. None of them believed in fairies. While they were resting at the entrance to a glade in the Forest, they heard the faint sound of piping. They investigated and found no human being. When they returned to their former resting places, out of the woods came a tiny man, not up to their knees in height. He wore a small hooded cap and jerkin and played the same tune they had heard piped before. He marched past them without taking any notice of them. This was their experience and the facts as they related them.

The present writer has talked

to children about the fairies that they tell her they see. A very good and brilliant boy, George, about six, living on a beautiful farm in North Carolina, where I stayed for several days, described the fairies he saw at work. He said they had little buckets filled with different colors of paint and they were painting the flowers. The leaves they painted green. Sometimes, the fairies got tired and rested, many of them together. They were tiny, some were three inches tall and others were smaller. They were very pretty and had a star or light in the middle of their foreheads. In some places, where we looked, there did not seem to be any fairies, but in other places there were a great many, and they were very busy working.

Another little boy by the name of Wells, in watching the fairies, says that he can see them best on rainy days. It was then that they seemed to be busily engaged. As Wells grew older, he declared that the "little people" directed the electric and magnetic force which drew the atoms together. He noted that the fairies varied in size, some being but three or four inches tall. while others were as large as human beings. They had their kings and queens, who reigned in Fairyland. The boy declared that he could see the fairies cuddled in their flower homes sometimes, and that there are blossoms that appear to be occupied by just one family, or perhaps a collection of families of one variety of fairy. Each petal of the larger flowers, such as the Easter Lily, is occupied by an entirely different form of fairy.

When a new variety of blossom is produced, there is great agitation in the world of fairies. One little being will be appointed "official Registrar" of that flower's growth. Every little band of fairies, led by its king and queen, is deeply interested. From the time the appointment is made until that variety of flower dies out of existence, that group of fairies are its attendants. The lad thinks the work of the fairies is to quicken the growing power of the plant. He declared found the elves and brownies of lower rank than the fairies. Whereas the fairies have pink and white skins and are exceedingly beautiful and graceful, the elves are more of the color of the bark of the tree and their costumes are a shade of gray brown. They sometimes wear little scarlet caps, and possess the same power of changing colors as does the chameleon. The boy, Wells, found the fairies always busy. He saw some of them producing perfume in the flowers. Everybody knows that if he takes a bunch of violets that are laden with fragrance and holds it in his hands, and keeps smelling them, the violets will soon lose their fragrance. It seems that the fairies

or the spirits of the flowers, become frightened at the nearness of human beings, and close their avenues of communication, one of

which is perfume.

Another little friend of the writer's is a little girl who tells of a tiny fairy she visits in an apple tree. The color of the fairy's drapery differs at various times of the year. In winter, it takes on the color of the branches and wood of the trunk. In the spring, the color about the fairy is the shade of the apple blossoms, and in the fall it is the color of the rosy apples. The fairy and the tree seem to be very closely associated. It helps tend the tree, gives perfume to the opening buds, and furnishes energy when the leaves wilt in the hot sunshine of summer. Out of the atmosphere, the fairy seems to draw light and life. The child sees her settle down on a branch of the tree and observes the little golden lines of light that radiate from her. Then she hovers over the blossoms as if she were encouraging each one to open wider.

Those who study the fairies, as did Marjorie Johnson, Brooklands Road, Carlton, Nottingham, England, understand the reality and the purpose of fairies in the work of Mother Nature. As Secretary of the Fairy Investigating Society, she received in one mail, letters from clergymen, gypsies, doctors of music and philosophy, and from a naval commander, all of whom told her about fairies they had seen. She, herself, has seen fairies since she was six years of age, and since nineteen, has collected stories about them. She reports on hundreds of different kinds of fairies, and says, "They are really the forces of nature. Without fairies there would be no nature. They are like atomic power."

The work of the fairies among plants and seeds is a marvel to behold. Spiritualists know there is no dead matter anywhere in God's universe - that all thrills with life. Take for example, bulbs growing in a bowl. There are small submicroscopic etheric creatures moving about it and around the growing plants. They are visible etherically as points of light, playing around the stems, and passing in and out of the growing plant. These tiny beings rise and absorb something from the atmosphere, then re-enter the tissue of the plant and discharge it. This continues with the plant that the tiny worker considers his charge.

The call of the plant to the fairy helpers in the spring is equally marvelous. At the heart of every seed is a living center containing stored up results of previous seasons or lives as a vibratory possibility. The stirring of life in due season seems to produce a sound which is heard throughout the elemental regions where the builders

answer the call to labor. Each stem, each shoot, each leaf has its own note and its nature spirit builder, who responds to the call to build the plant according to the etheric pattern. Each plant knows what color of blossoms it is to produce. Each change in structure and color calls for a new set of builders. When the work is finished, a chord is struck which we contact as scent. Actually, we smell the sound!

This nature work is organized under a voluntary hierarchial system, with seven divisions, each division having a leader. The higher fairies, sylphs and salamanders have their center of consciousness at the astral level, and dip down into the physical plane chiefly to stimulate the life of trees and larger plants. They may live as the ensouling life of a tree, or group of trees. The magnetism of their bodies stimulates the far slower activity of the tree, the circulation of the sap, and so forth. Or, they may ray strong influences to "magnetic centers" put under their charge.

With the increased materialism of our world, many have lost the child like ability to understand the real universe in which all is life and intelligence, and in which the greatest of all powers and forces are the invisible. Many have forgotten that the spiritual side of life possesses powers and potencies greater than the mental, physical or animal world. Many have become like creatures living on the first plane, totally incapable of appreciating the joys and possibilities of one living on the second plane; just as a one dimensional being would know nothing of a second dimension. It would afford them a great surprise if they could awaken and see the intelligences that surround them!

In the subtle substance of ether there is room for many complete worlds, with various types of beings in the same space and at the same time, each continuing at its own rate of vibration, and not interfering with the activities of beings of other rates of vibration.

Some do have an awareness of the unknown dimensions, and have an incomplete knowledge of unharnessed wave-lengths around us, which may be compared to the normally undetected communications which some people are able to receive with the recognized discoveries of telegraph, telephone, radio and television. These we have harnessed from the unseen powers of nature in the universe. The "magic" of these things all emenates out of the immaterial, unsubstantial and unseen air.

The field of the psychic and the spiritual, a field relatively, as yet, untapped, because of our modern materialistic civilization, can be as real a source of knowledge as any other. The potentialities of this

field, however, were once better known, yet they are known and accepted by many primitive human beings, as well as among those of learning and culture who have passed beyond the "half-way house", as the writer knows from her own experiences among both primitive and advanced groups throughout the world. As Paul says, "By Him (God) were all things created that are in heaven and that are in earth, visible and invisible."

Those who have the greatest opportunities to know the most about life, tell us there are facts, similar to those of the fairies, that are stranger than fiction and that as the race develops new powers and regains many of the senses it has lost through gross materialism, it will understand why children especially, all through the ages, have believed in fairies, and why "a little child shall lead them."

free, much as we may deplore their condition, we have no right to rob them of their experiences, for it is only through experience that we can develop. Life is a school, and the better we master each grade, the easier the next one becomes.

We will suppose Mrs. X..... has asked me to help free her husband, George, from the drinkhabit. I will advise her to immediately cease fault-finding and condemnation. If he comes home under the influence of liquor, she must pay as little attention to it as possible, and at all times, she must treat him - as nearly as she can - as though he was already freed. She must not discuss his weakness with him, nor must she discuss the method she is using to aid him with anyone, no matter how vitally they may be interested in him. This is very important. A discouraging remark from a thoughtless, but perhaps well-meaning friend, might undo many hours of patient endeavor.

She must make herself and her home as attractive as possible, and she must make him believe — at all times — that her faith in him is undiminished. Never mind if she is compelled to do things that seem untrue to her conscious mind. She is now dealing with forces that are not dependent upon reason, but which transcends it, and for the time being, she must accept the methods that others have proven.

She should select a definite time (late at night and very early morning are best) when she will not be disturbed, and at this time, she will repeat, over and over, a constructive affirmation. The following one will be effective, if used persistently: "Mr. X......., you are no longer in bondage to a desire for liquor of any kind. You are Now established in the Power and Mastery and Dominion of Divine Love. You are free with the freedom of your true Self."

If Mr. X...... is asleep at this time, so much the better, as she will be endeavoring to impress this statement upon his subconscious mind and oust the destructive thoughts that are entrenched there. When she has accomplished this, the desire will have left him.

At first, this proceedure may cause her to be wakeful, but as she forms the habit, her rest will become more peaceful than before, for we cannot try to help another without receiving benefit, ourselves. The thoughts that flow through her mind to her husband will clear it of many ideas that have been distressing her. She is also to repeat this affirmation during the day, whenever a thought of his weakness enters her mind.

One woman wrote me that she thought she had repeated this af-

Another woman, who lived in what is termed the "moonshine" country, and whose husband had used liquor ever since he was a little boy, used a similar affirmation. He became so opposed to liquor that he refused to associate with anyone who used it.

Remember, there is no space in mind and it is just as easy for one to reach a person three thousand miles away, or even ten thousand, as it would be in the next room. The radio has proven this. I have always, personally, preferred absent treatment, as one is not confronted by unpleasant appearances which must be cleared out of mind before one can secure satisfying results.

The terrifying things a man sees when in the grasp of delirium tremens are not more unreal than the false appetites and ideas that are dominant all over the world today. As everyone is in a different state of unfoldment, it is difficult to foretell just how anyone will react to the new ideas that are presented to his subconscious mind, so when treating, do not be discouraged by appearances, for any change will be a proof that the patient has been reached. Expect good results, and insist that they are his right. Before you can bring your ideals into the "real", you must keep your mind filled with constructive thoughts, speak constructive words, and act in a constructive manner.

If your thoughts are right, your subconscious mind will be given a clear picture of the condition desired. You must always remember that this mind is impersonal — a good servant. It does not reason, but obeys implicitly, and it cannot do otherwise than create conditions that are in keeping with the orders it has received from the conscious mind.

If you continually picture your dear one as a slave to this pernicious habit and are persistent in holding this in ideal, you are largely responsible for keeping him in the mire of degradation, and have no great cause for condemning him for his failure to overcome it. If you are willing to make the effort, you can help him to rise out of any unhappy condition, and remember, we never help another without helping ourself in even a greater degree — for "as we sow, so shall we reap". across the illumined stage and makes his final exit through the doorway of "death". Yet, such an exit is not final, for there are other plays, each with its entrance and exit, and all must be viewed as a continuous experience, necessarv to the development of the individual. With this in view, death ceases to be either dreaded or disturbing, and right living becomes the important concern of the individual. So, we find that there is no death; rather in dying, we find a life that is yet to be lived.

# THE HOLY GRAIL by Edward Koch

No doubt, everyone who has heard of the Holy Grail, has formulated some kind of an opinion as to what it is, and what it really looks like. For over fifty years, I had pictured it as a kind of bowl that contained something undescribable called the "Elixir of Life". But, last week, when my mind held not

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even a thought about the Holy Grail, the following came to me, and has been difficult to shake off.

The story of Jesus and of His partaking of the Cup is well known, but there is much confusion as to its deeper meaning.
