In the same way, many of the so-called miracles of this world have transpired.

One is able to become a trumpet medium, levitating a trumpet and getting voices from it because it has been established that this is a Truth. Human Resurrection

HE RESURRECTION of Jesus, Lord of the True Light, is the infallible pledge of the resurrection of all mankind forever.

In keeping with this thought, we can more readily comprehend the significance of His words when He declared: "In the world ye shall have tribulations, but be of good cheer, I have overcome the world." Jesus did not come on earth to teach man to be content with misery, but to show him the way to life more abundant. In fact, the unspeakable misery of man before Jesus came was the foremost reason of His coming in the first place.

The resurrection brings us the message that after every Good Friday there is an Easter . . . after every heart pang, the joy of the Risen Lord.

The doctrine of Jesus, set as it is as a resplendent jewel in the ring of Oriental symbolism, has depths of meaning that unfold more and more beneath the scrutiny of psychic penetration. Where can we hope to get without such insight when considering abstract Truth? Without it we merely continue to see through a glass darkly... and what is life without including time for mystical considerations?

With all the volumes of mystical lore and explanation at our command, is it not pertinent to inquire whether or not, after all, mankind has come wide of the mark? Violence and crime are with us still, and all the wisdom of the ages has not prevented two world wars. Further than this - - as I now write, mankind sits on a powder keg of uncertainty and fear. Even the heads of the great powers - like chess players - are in the uncertainty of fear as to what move one may make against the other. Even the Scriptures of ten are used to uphold the avarice, lust for power, deceit, and inhumanity of man to man by certain clever orators and spokesmen for various groups. Here we have a demonstration of an age-old Truth: "The Devil can quote Scripture for his

purpose." Does this mean then that the teachings of Jesus - and all the great World Saviors - have failed? NO. Not any more than a man fails to be benefited by an inadequate intake of nourishing food and drink. the diet of the eleventh century has undergone changes adequate to the needs of modern man, however, so ancient mystical lore is in need of new interpretation in keeping with what many call The Aquarian Age. Some have also referred to it as The Age of Speed. Our highways do seem to give support to this appellation. If I were to name it, I would call it The Age of Tension. Neuro-mental disturbances seem to be stalking the land like Caesar's ghost. New interpretative effort - metaphysically enshrined - appears to be the modern resurrective promise for mankind.

Behind the thinking of gifted speakers, reachers, and writers bringing new illumination to man through modern metaphysics, the thrilling figure of the Galilean Lord looms up in the power and glory of reassurance to despairing humanity. In this connection, it is good to know that modern metaphysics in its mature status does not overlook the challenge and the value of psychic unfoldment. In fact, spiritual or psychic discernment was what Jesus was ever seeking in man as a ray of hope for his greater growing. This is clearly seen in the Lord's thrill of pleasure on Peter's declaring: "Thou art the Christ, the Son of the Living God." On this admission, the Lord placed His Divine Seal of approval in the words: "Blessed art thou, Simon Bar-Jona, for flesh and blood have not revealed it unto thee, but my Father, which is in Heaven." Here we have Divine sanction on psychic insight for all time.

Human resurrection involves the thought that man is not a body, but a Spirit in a body. It is with the spiritual man that metaphysical teachings are concerned in order that bodily he might live more effectively and abundantly. It is to the spiritual man, or to his chakras, that all Divine Healing is addressed primarily. This is one of the great discoveries of modern mystical inquiry. Other discoveries have brought us the value of visualization and affirmation - rightly understood and applied. The modern value of ancient rituals also has been placed at man's fingertips. Through the teachings of Jesus, Buddha, Confucius, Laotzu, Socrates, and many others among the great pioneer thinkers of mystical philosophy, the way to human happiness is no longer a mirage, but is a plateau of grandeur attainable now.

Man may have to try and try again to reach great illumination and the inner serenity that flows therefrom. However, self-mastery persists even when the external world is crumbling, and great cost is usually inherent in that which is infinitely valuable. Even the history of temporal greatness is along failure-strewn paths, but so long as man's spirit brightly shines, defeat is is doomed.

The Lord of the True Light came to instill in man a positive, cheerful and constructive approach to life - - for which repeated affirmations often have been found most helpful.

The words of Emil Coue, French philosopher of many years ago . . . "Every day in every way I am getting better and better," when repeated faithfully over a number of days and believed - actually produced phenomenal results in the lives of thousands of people. The words: "Arise, Shine, Thy light is come," truly bear the message of mystical philosophy to the world. And visualization . . . where can we get without that? Clearly envisioning what we hope to attain, all details etched into the consciousness, holding to this star of desire, Spirit speaking to Spirit, forms the mould for the living reality. This, and other great practical teachings, are lifted from the words of Him, who was ever the Master, who could say even to the raging waters of a storm, "Peace, be still," and obtain obedience.

The narrowness and the meanness of many souls remind me of plants and flowers lacking adequate sunlight and air. The Lord was ever liberal and understanding, however, for to those who were critical, selfish, and prejudiced, He was kind, unselfish, and impartial. In the midst of cruelty, tyranny, injustice, and shallow thinking, He brought the message of hope, comfort, inspiration, and a life rich and abundant . . . as well as a progressive understanding of the deep things of the Spirit and the glorious victory over error in all its forms.



WHAI DOES the Easter Message convey to each one of us? . . . and what spiritual benefit can we derive from it?

Let us first find out why and when the celebration of Easter began. Tradition would have us believe Sunday to be the exact day of Jesus' resurrection. Strange to say - most of us have followed this custom without realizing the inaccuracy of this belief, and where it originated.

Through much research and study, various Bible scholars discovered that the resurrection occurred late Saturday afternoon - - not on Sunday morning as many take for granted, thereby clarifying the controversy concerning the three days and nights Jesus spent in the tomb which was to be the only sign given as proof of the authenticity of His Messiahship.

In reality, the celebration commemorates the festival of Astarte, or Ishtar, (origin of the word Easter) who was the wife of Baal, the pagan sun-god. Emperor Constantine adopted the festival as a holiday and imposed it on the church people of that era. He also required them to observe Lent, borrowed from worshippers of the Babylonian goddess, establishing it as a yearly practice in the hope of drawing pagans into the fold.

Pondering on that astonishing discovery, and grateful to those courageous enough to reveal the truth about the matter, I asked for more light on the subject. I came to see the importance of understanding rightly the import and value of both the crucifixion and resurrection in their spiritual significance by pointing the way for us to experience our own resurrection from material bondage.

Indisputably, the cross symbolizes overcoming - - crucifying, so to speak, the flesh for the spirit. The following verses confirm this distinctly:

"For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die, but if ye, through the spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live." Rom. 8:13.
"Verily, verily, I say unto you,

On the other hand, if we accept the idea that each new human body is an instrument designed and occupied by a soul already "old," but needing new experiences for spiritual growth, we may wonder why the simplest activities, skills, and ideas have to be We are prolearned all over again. vided, however, with a reasonably plausible explanation of otherwise inexplicable handicaps, apparently misfortunes, and talents.

If we can be confident that nothing happens by chance, that every event of human experience, even in earliest childhood, is planned and directed, we may then indeed ask - - by whom?

Are we merely puppers - at least at first - subject to appetites and emotions of unknown origin, or to conflicting whims of discarnate entities? If so - when and how can we begin to exert some personal control over the type of influence we attract? Why could we not do so before? If we cannot do so from the beginning, who or what determines whether we are guided by good or evil entities, and is therefore responsible for our development in morality or im-What - where - and why is the so-called subconscious mind? How and why can it cause a person to do damaging to reputation, something position, interpersonal relationships, and even to health and safety? Why should something done or experienced in childhood be able to precipitate an apparent disaster in later life . . . despite all the growth and learning that

have occurred in the meantime?

Is our 'self' really a pair (or group) of 'selves' - - a lower animal self (though necessarily having a non-physical source) concerned only with gratification of physical appetites and desires, and a higher 'self' capable of directing energy and activity toward the accomplishment of unselfish, idealistic goals of a mental and spiritual nature? If a rational, morally responsible 'self' does not take over a creature of instinct and physical passions, a 'child of nature', until some years after its conception and birth, who or what is responsible for its creation, manifestation in the physical realm and guidance during the early years? How could the mature self be held responsible for the mistakes of such a predecessor? Is the concept of such a preceding creatorguardian-director even tenable when we consider the early appearance and persistence of some personality traits?

Or is the real 'self' of each of us much bigger, wiser, and more powerful than the fragment of which we are aware - - able to plan and direct the life experience from the beginning insuch a way that what seems to be our reaping of a tragic harvest from seed sown in ignorance and moral innocence is merely an illusion - - and the real instigator of the childhood experience was not ignorant or innocent at all, or the harvest tragic except from a severly limited point of view?

Is it not possible that we have always known who or what is responsible for our becoming what we are?

Note: The writer knows beyond doubt from personal experience that attunement with discarnate entities of highly evolved soul consciousness, proficient in the wise use of God-power, can lift one from the dismal swamps of ignorance and selfishness into the radiant light and warmth of the 'kingdom of heaven' within which we have only to claim.

"Evelyn is not going to die!" I told two of Evelyn's friends sitting with me in my prayer room. "I know she thinks she is, and I know all the medical reports say that she is dying, but from the first time I prayed for her, I felt she would recover."



Evelyn lived in a western state, a woman who had been happily married for twenty-five years, and who had never been ill until the day this serious affliction struck so suddenly. She made the rounds of all the doctors and hospitals in her small city - - but no help could be found. Her husband suffered deep distress having to watch her suffer week after week, helpless to obtain relief.

Her letters to me, and those she wrote to her friends, were heartbreaking. On the telephone she would weep and plead for healing and relief from her pain. When the friends who prayed

with her could no longer stand the strain and suspense, they made a trip to Tiffin to see me and ask that I put forth greater effort in prayer for Evelyn. Sitting with me that afternoon, they held in their hands some of Evelyn's letters to them which they read to me-asking what more could be done? It was difficult for them to understand why a good Christian woman like Evelyn had to suffer so long.

I could only try to strengthen their faith, and told them: "God will answer our prayers for Evelyn. I cannot explain the delay any more than you can, but I feel confident that God is not turning a deaf ear to all our earnest prayers. Neither can I explain my own feelings of confidence about her recovery. I only know that when I hold Evelyn's letters in prayer I feel a power and an assurance, a sort of mysterious inner peace."

This prayer effort by all of us went on for several months. There would be some slight evidence of improvement one week, then the trouble would flare up again the next. However, we held firm in our prayers, and would not yield to defeat. Most of Evelyn's friends stuck with me for they had entered into the battle to save her.

Then one day I received a letter from Evelyn. As I opened it, a color photo fell out. It was a picture of Evelyn standing between the rows of vegetables of her garden - - with a hoe in her hands . . . living proof of prayers that had been answered.

Most encouraging is the revival of interest in spiritual healing we have witnessed in recent years, especially within some orthodox churches. Not since the first century of the Christian church have people displayed such deep interest in the power of Spirit to heal the sick. Ministers and laymen are reexamining the New Testament teachings about healing by prayer and faith. I look back upon my own preparation for the Ministry, and I must say - - in all honesty - - that in none of my Seminary

courses did I receive one word of instruction or teaching of any kind about healing the sick by prayer or faith. Most of the ministers such as I who came up through orthodox denominations for ordination had to seek understanding of and belief in spirit healing by much prayer and effort. Sometimes we stumbled onto a healing victory while praying with the sick by their bedside. The church, however, provided us with no definite instructions for this important part of our pastoral duties. Certainly every pastor is expected to call upon the sick in his congregation and pray with them. Yet when the doctors told us they had reached their limits in some cases, we accepted it as a fact and felt that God also had given up on those cases. Now we know that beyond the skill of medical science there is the Great Physician with infinite power over mind and flesh.

What is spiritual healing? Is it a reality, or just a tool of the quacks? If it truly is a reality, why are there so many disappointments and failures? I think that much blame for the failures rests upon the misunderstanding of what spiritual healing really is. Often this misunderstanding comes when people think the healer has some magic power. This is never true; the healer can be no more than a channel. I would also add that a successful healer is also an instructor or teacher who guides the sick to reach out for themselves to grasp this power for healing.

To me, healing is a sacrament - - one that should be included with the other sacraments. The Lord's Supper and Baptism. As the word implies, a sacrament is something sacred - - a word which also expresses a meaning of some mystery. It comes from the old Latin word sacramentum, for truly - spiritual healing is something sacred and mysterious. A minister cannot accept The Lord's Supper for you. He can bring it to you, but you must reach out and accept it for yourself.

Both The Lord's Supper and Baptism are outward symbols of inner mysteries. The water in Baptism is part of the sacrament only as a symbol of what is going on spiritually within your soul. Any form of Baptism without that inner mystery or phenomenon is meaningless and worthless. Spiritual healing is also a sacrament. It must be a contact between you and God - not just between you and the healer - for the healer acts only as the Divine agent. You personally must accept healing as an inner mystery - - a sacred gift from God.

I do not think the time or place or even the conditions are important when the sick sincerely reach out to God for healing in full consecration. As I mentioned in a previous article appearing in Chimes, John Wesley, the founder of the Methodist Episcopal Church, tells of

VIFE IS a continuous unfoldment of the Truth which exists in the mind of God. It is the Universal Consciousness or Divine Presence which touches the heart and mind of all who will lis-

When Lindbergh was in his aeroplane over the ocean he tells us in his book that he saw spirit forms and heard spirit voices guiding him in his hour of need. I am sure he came through his experience with a greater sense of God's presence guiding the mind of man than ever he had before. It is experience that teaches us whatever it is we need to know, for it is God's way of directing our lives. In this age when outer space is being explored, man will learn there are still greater forces at work in his life if he will listen to the still small voice within him. Everyone knows the immense power our thoughts have on our future. Frequently, however, we forget. This is particularly true in regard to financial problems. It is so easy to fall into the habit of thinking of the things we lack, rather than of the things we have. Most of us are familiar with the results of harboring thoughts of lack or poverty. Yet there are few who do not occasionally indulge in these negative habits.

Regular reading of Mr. Trine's book will be of immense help to anyone who wishes to channel one's thoughts in the right direction, and keep them where they should be. Paragraphs like this are particularly helpful:

"If one holds himself in the thought of poverty, he will be poor, and the chances are that he will remain in poverty. If he holds himself - - whatever his present condition may be, continually in the thought of prosperity, he sets into operation forces that sooner or later bring him into prosperous conditions. The law of attraction works unceasingly throughout the universe, and the one great and never changing fact in connection with it is, as we have found, that like attracts like."

Remember that always . . . "like attracts like." Resolve henceforth to keep within your consciousness only constructive and progressive thoughts. When you succeed in doing that, you will discover - as thousands of others have - that carefully cultivated thoughts build a solid path that leads directly to the beautiful life you want to have.

Indulging in self-pity or regret is fatal, and few things will hinder you more than entertaining thoughts of despondency and hopelessness. When combined, every constructive effort you try to build up, they will tear down.

If you want to live a more satisfying life, accept this challenge of Mr. Trine's:

"Would you remain always young, and would you carry all the joyousness and buoyancy of youth into your maturer years? Then have care concerning but one thing - how you live in your thought world. This will determine all. It was the inspired one, Gautama, The Buddha, who said, 'The mind is everything; what you think you become.'"

Living in our modern atomic era is a difficult task. New and unexpected problems seem to develop overnight, and added to those we already have, the combination often becomes more than we can bear. Perhaps the best solution any of us can find is to learn to live one day at a time.

"Anyone can carry his burden, however heavy, 'til nightfall. Anyone can do his work, however hard, for one day. Anyone can live sweetly, patiently, lovingly, purely, 'til the sun goes down . . . and this is all that life ever means." Just try this for one day. Like thousands of others, you will find it immensely helpful.

Everyone needs to make decisions. Frequently some of our decisions are very far reaching. A single mistake can cause years of unhappiness. Mr. Trine gives us a method of making decisions which you may find very helpful. He says:

"When light or information is desired along any particular line - light or information you feel it is right and wise for you to have, as, for example.. light in regard to an uncertain course of action. then as you retire, first bring your mind into the attitude of peace and goodwill for all. In this way you bring yourself into an harmonious condition, and in turn attract to yourself these same peaceful conditions from without.

"Then, resting in this sense of peace, quietly and calmly send out your earnest desire for the needed light or information; cast out of your mind all fears, or forebodings lest it come not, for 'in quietness and in confidence shall be your strength.' Take the expectant attitude of mind, firmly believing and expecting that when you awake the desired results will be with you.

"Then, on awakening, before any thoughts or activities from the outside world come in to absorb the attention, remain for a little while receptive to the intuitions or the impressions that come. When they come, when they manifest themselves clearly, then act upon them without delay. In the degree that you do this, in that degree will the power of doing it even more effectively grow."

You do not need to wait for nighttime to come in order to take advantage of Mr. Trine's method. Often you can achieve the same excellent results after only a short nap, sometimes even better results.

Modern television programs, our movies and our radios have a tendency to show life very different from what it

actually is. A large percentage of today's entertainment features present a picture of daily living as though it were seen only through rose colored glasses. That is, of course, a mistake, for it tends to create a false sense of values. There is no denying that beauty and glamour are wonderful things. They are a deeply important part of our lives - - but they are not all of it. To achieve anything worthwhile in this world, hard work and earnest effort are absolute necessities. These are seldom glamorous activities. They cannot be. Moreover, as life unfolds, many hidden sorrows and changes appear which none of us can foresee or control. Most of us would be far happier if we learned to take a realistic view of life as it is, and not as we think it is.

"Life in no case is purely a bed of roses. There will always be the daily problems, there will be bread to get, or if it is not a bread problem, then there will be wisdom necessary, and perplexing problems to meet in the wise use of one's wealth. There will be disillusionment, there will be suffering, there will be death; but the great beauty is that for those who are in earnest and and those who build on the great realities of life, there will be a wisdom that will enable them to meet all these things with understanding and power, and always, therefore, with due compensation."

In those few lines of Mr. Trine's is a beautiful philosophy of faith; accept it and make it a part of your daily living.

Most of us have acquaintances who seem to take keen delight in ridiculing everything and everyone. To these people there is no such thing in this world as loyalty or devotion. To them nothing is ever serious or sacred. They seem to feel that any show of affection is childish and definitely old-fashioned. Heartwarming trust, hope and simplicity of manner seem to have vanished from their lives.

On the other hand, we often meet people who are keenly alert and conprogressing toward better things. They are the ones of whom Mr. Trine writes in his beautiful poem when he says:

> "There are loyal hearts, there are spirits brave, There are souls that are pure and true; Then give to the world the best you have, And the best will come back to you."


MHILE SITTING with a class of students one time for healing, Dr. Charles Mayo gave us a report of an operation he had performed with the help of Dr. Gaustopf of Spirit that would have been impossible for any surgeon on this plane to have performed successfully without the help of a Spirit doctor.

"A man came to our hospital in Rochester, Minnesota who, to all appearances, was in perfect health, except that he was getting very weak and could hardly move. My brother, Dr. William Mayo, and I gave him a thorough examination. There was nothing we could find wrong with him; every part of his body was perfect. This was a most baffling condition, for as a rule cases that came to us were already diagnosed and the complications were known to us before we decided to operate.

"We put the man to bed and decided to wait until morning to find the cause of his weakening condition. About three o'clock in the morning, our Spirit doctor, Dr. Gaustopf, awakened me saying that I should get up and put the man on the operating table, for he was weakening so fast he would not live until morning. He said he knew what was wrong with the man. I called my brother, William, and told him about the message from Dr. Gaustopf.

We placed the man on the operating table and Gaustopf said, 'Use this instrument, for we will cut the heart out.' If was a difficult thing to do, but I followed his advice and did as I was told. There was no alternative for the man was weakening fast.

HEALING IN ...

FOR THE last fifty years or so we have been witnessing the rediscovery, or resurrection, of the ancient method of healing. or curing disease. by non-clinical means called spiritual healing which was one of the main functions of the early Christian church.

Many thousands now receive such treatment daily by personal contact, and many more throughout the world receive what is termed absent healing treatment.

Today churches all over the world include healing as a part of their regular services... even those behind the Iron Curtain. Many medical men have come to believe in its efficacy and use it in their practice.

We know that life and health are maintained in the human body by certain natural processes - - by taking in from food the needed proteins, minerals, and vitamins, and from the air oxygen and life force - or spirit - or Mana as the Polynesian healers, the Kahunas, say as described by Max Freedom Long in his book, "The Secret Science Behind Miracles."

Mr. Long states that there are three forms, or grades, of Mana: one for the physical body, one for the psychic, and one for the spiritual - or low, middle and high self, as he calls them.

However, I believe there is only one, and after it is taken in to the body, it is modified by the seven nerve plexuses to fit the individual's needs.

So long as these processes are normal, there is life and health in the body. When these processes are hindered, altered, or blocked, disease or death results. The restoration of these processes to normalcy brings a cure. The use of a pain killer, with its temporary relief, never cures anything, and eventually makes matters worse.

When the restoration of these processes is brought about instantaneously we have what is called a miraculous cure, such as those witnessed at Lourdes in France, Tenos in Greece, and at many other shrines. Greece



The Healing Shepherd

Spiritual healing practised in church services of all denominations, as well as by prayer groups or individuals - for those present or not present - is also called Divine Healing. Among its many forms are spiritual mind treatment, prayer, the laying-on-of-hands, or the intercession of Spirit entities through an entranced medium or sensitive.

There are many healers of renown not affiliated with any church or movement, yet who are firm believers in a Supreme Being and in His love for humanity and the power flowing through their hands they know to be the power of God.

I have known many such healers, and last year spent some time with several while in Europe. Among them was one who is known as The Healing Shepherd of Athens, Greece.

Cases of arthritis, rheumatism, polio deformities and fractures are examples of the many types of cases he treats. He has been hailed to court repeatedly by the Medical Association with the request that he be stopped from practising, but the people that were cured always flocked to court in his defense. The judge - to satisfy the law and the people - ruled that he be allowed to practise, but that he must be supervised by an orthopedic medical doctor. From all parts of the world people have come to be treated by him . . . rich and poor, even royalty. While there I acted as an interpreter for two American ladies - -

one from the U.S. diplomatic corps, and the other a librarian from Connecticut. With the help of his son, fifty to sixty patients of all ages are treated daily.

A case that impressed me while there was one of a fractured arm. The medical doctor handling the case happened to be a relative of mine, so he showed me the x-ray that had been originally taken of it. It looked as if someone had pounded on it with a sledge hammer. The healer rubbed it lightly with his hands, using no anesthetic, the patient howling with pain. He then applied a paste of his own and wrapped it with gauze which, upon drying, acted as a cast. He then gave directions to the patient as to how to carry the arm, and instructions to return in thirty days.

Asking the doctor in charge of the case if he thought the arm would heal properly, he said, "It will. I have seen it happen time and time again, yet any doctor would amputate the arm."

So we find there are many forms of healing and many different types of healers doing their good in every part of the world . . . not concerned with a name the world chooses to give them . . . or with what their financial remuneration shall be . . . only that they are given the opportunity to witness the power of God flow through them to restore wholeness and perfection to suffermankind.

LESSONS FOR STUDENTS . . .

Concentration THE FIRST DISCIPLINE . . .

It is necessary to understand the meaning of this word in its truly mystical sense - - that it is the gathering together of the faculties of the mind - the achievement of one-pointedness of

How then shall we define concentration? Like every true discipline, its real meaning cannot be written. It must be perceived inwardly. It must be known because of the discipline having evolved within the disciple the understanding necessary to its practice.

Concentration is gentle, unstrained, effortless one-pointedness. It is grounded and founded in the realization of the Law. It may be interpreted as steadfastness of purpose. As a candle burning in a still night, so is realization burning steadfastly in the midst of concentration.

The simple practice of concentration is an entirely harmless discipline so long as false interpretation is prevented. But there is a great interval of understanding between the true practice of concentration and the popular misconceptions which have gained

widespread acceptance.

No occult discipline should be practised without adequate preparation. The first form is concerned with the general state of individual living. It is useless to attempt any occult exercises in a contradictory and chaotic environment. You must not develop the attitude of fleeing from worldliness into a spiritual condition. Concentration is not an oasis of spirituality in a desert of chaos.

So often people say: "My daily meditation gives me the strength to go on in a life that otherwise would be too difficult." With such a motivation. failure is inevitable. Concentration can not be an incident in the midst of contrary incidents. It must be intimately correlated to the whole pattern of living or it will not succeed, and the time devoted to the effort will be wasted.

In the life of man the power to concentrate, according to the mystical meaning of the word, is evidence of an increasing internal poise and the extension of soul power through life as it

is lived daily.

The second part of the preparation is that phase which immediately precedes the actual practice of the discipline. For a short time prior to a

period devoted to concentration, the mind should be in a condition of repose and there should be a complete physical relaxation . . . not necessarily idleness, but an entire absence of stress. To sit down in the midst of confusion and try suddenly and forcibly to block it out by means of an attitude is unreasonable and unphilosophical. It is for this reason that a master first "seats himself." These few words define a great mystery for those who can comprehend.

The practice of concentration should be limited to a brief period, with special attention to regularity and continuity. . . The disciple should concentrate for not more than five or ten minutes at any one time, once daily. Truth is timeless. The advisable daily period then, is five minutes, a number mystically associated with the control of the five sensory perceptions. Either mornings or evenings are suitable times. The middle of the day or night is less favorable, especially in the case of the novice . . but between them are suitable times.

The time and place having been selected, the mood itself must next be attained. The faculties of the attention must now be gathered up by a simple, direct, effortless technique. Under no conditions should the mind be made blank. Nor should one wait hopefully for thoughts to think themselves. It is too soon for the Law to flow in with the forms. The artist must paint his picture of the Law. Choose an appropriate symbol. . . Do not be discouraged if it takes many months to clarify this symbol. Do not change symbols frequently, and never give up one design for another until the Law has been found.

The symbol may be an object, an ideal, or a pattern, but it must be capable of some definition; that is, it must be perceptible to the mind if not to the senses themselves. Abstract virtues like goodness, kindness, or unselfishness are not suitable in themselves as concentration symbols. It is for this reason that in the Eastern schools all of the virtues are pictured.

Frequently it is advisable to derive the concentration pattern from some phase of life which is pictorially meaningful. It has been pointed out that men often find Truth according to the



inclination of their tastes. scholar his books are sacred. To the artist the laws and canons of art represent his natural approach to the discovery of the Law. The developed mathematician finds God in numbers, and the astronomer finds Truth in the

Choose, therefore, as the first pattern for concentration some form or device which already has proved to be an inspiration and has brought you some measure of realization. Thus through the gateway of the known you pass naturally and normally into the presence of the Knower.

Sometimes it is difficult to understand that concentration is not essentially an intellectual process. the mind is the instrument of concentration, occult exercises fail if they are regarded as directed toward mental

control through effort.

It also seems hard to understand that concentration involves the simultaneous activity of every part of the consciousness. There must be attention without tension. There must be feeling without emotion; visualization without fixation. All must be bound together by an inclusive one-pointedness of purpose which does not include any inference of limitation.

The process is more difficult to describe than it is to achieve, because it occurs simultaneously on different planes or levels. It depends for its success upon the capacity to realize the identity of the parts of one's own consciousness; for example, that feeling and thought are one, and that the things sensed are identical with the power to sense. There is no division between the flower and its beauty, the bird and its grace, or the river and its song.

Concentration is the power or discipline by which all these values become simultaneously accessible as spiritual power.





THE REALM OF SENSATION

I have been asked to explain my interpretation of the difference between the sensation of matter and the sensation of spirit.

There have been various explanations, but I feel that earthly existence comprises the realm of sensation - - including the octaves of the physical and the spiritual. Until you rise from the lower octaves of physical sensation to the higher octaves of spiritual sensation, you cannot find happiness of spirit or progression of the soul.

The octave of physical sensation comprises pain as well as pleasure. There are exciting sensations, such as: lust, gluttony, drugs, intoxication, etc., but which carry a later penalty of pain. There are the positive counterparts, however, which do not collect such a toll. These are: appeasement of hunger, love fulfillment through righteous marriage, recreation, sports, bathing and moderation in normal habits of stimulation.

Pain, illness, or mental distress are important parts of the sensation of of matter. Pain usually is the result of error in living, thinking or of an accident, and often is a sacrifice for others. As for the justice of such pain, no one

on earth can be a judge.

Progression of the soul often is brought about by pain. Some call it karma - - but who really knows? One thing is certain - - much pain can be prevented by intelligent living and

righteous thinking.

Of all the sensations of matter -the one of greatest danger seems to be
that which is the by-product of disobedience to God's law through lust of the
flesh. The Old Testament records this
as the cause of man's fall from the
higher octave of astral materialization
on Earth to that of the lower octave of
flesh materialization and decay. This
is verified more or less in a statement
I recorded some years ago from an independent voice identified as a Spirit
Master. Here is that statement:

"Verily I say unto you . . . pity the mortal who cannot rise above the earth-

bound level of lust. Such a mortal misses the tranquility and rapture of contact with spirit consciousness. Foolish is the mortal who thinks the pleasures of flesh can equal those of the spirit. Mansions of joy await those mortals who have won the victory over lust, while still in the flesh."

he Spirit was never born and will never die. Water wets it not, fire burns it not, wind blows it not away. Knowing these things to be true, we do not grieve nor mourn the so-called dead.

The life in man is God, and God cannot die. The mind is imperishable too, and all that it learns is imperishable also. Every end is a beginning. When something ends, something always begins. Death is more than an end; it is a new birthday in God. Life goes not backward nor tarries with yesterday. There are bodies celestial as well as terrestrial, so also is the resurrection of the dead. Death is a resurrection; it is newness, freedom, progress. The Law of Life is progression. The returning sun is a symbol of God's resurrection.

Let each of us realize that our loved ones who have passed on still live, and will live forever. They are functioning fourth dimensionally. Through love you are one with them. "The damsel is not dead!" "Maid, arise." "Lazarus come forth!" Jesus could not see the dead state; he could see only life there ... He gave Beauty for Ashes.

We must remember that our loved ones and all of those whom we knew on earth are still living in the next dimension. AM WRITING this because Easter soon will be here, and it makes me think of when I was seven years old and we lived in Belleville, Illinois. I had not started to school yet. All I did was read, draw animal pictures and play in the backyard where we had a pen for Fanny and Clara, our two hens.

There were just my father, mother, grandma, and me. I felt very close to grandma and could remember her holding me and rocking me even when I was a mere infant. She was tall, stern-faced, and dressed in black. Her hair was white and her eyes were grey. She didn't say much, but I knew she loved me. I suppose I reminded her of my father when he was small. She had heart trouble and the doctor often came to see her. She would be upstairs in her room after one of her spells, and when he came down, he and my father would discuss her condition.

My mother did not like grandma and hardly ever spoke to her, and was always complaining to my father about things she did to upset her. I think she was jealous because my father loved his mother instead of just her.

It was when Easter was near that she had a bad spell with her heart and could not come downstairs. My mother carried food up to her, then hurried right down, frowning as she always did when she had to be near grandma. I wanted to take the trays up, but she wouldn't let me. "Stay away from the old witch," she told me. "You'll carch her sickness." I didn't know that heart trouble was not catching . . . anyway, I wasn't afraid. So the day before Easter while my mother was out shopping, I went up to see her. I had some eggs with me that Fanny and Clara had laid that I was going to dye. Every Easter before that grandma had dyed the eggs for me.

She was lying in bed with her Bible in her hand - paler than I had ever seen her - and breathing quite fast. Her face still had that sternness about it. She was from Connecticut and had married my grandfather, Jack LeGros, who came from Calendar, Ontario, Canada. He was related to the Dionne quintuplets, whose mother's name was also LeGros. Grandma was English, but grandfather was French-Canadian - with a beard. He had been a shoe cobbler and died of pneumonia when my father was small.

"See, grandma," I said, showing her my eggs. "I'm going to dye them."

"Don't say 'dye'," she said with a strange expression in her eyes that I



had never seen there before. Her lips trembled and she reached out her hand and stroked my head, "Be a good boy," she said. Her voice was weak, and I had a most peculiar feeling about her. I remembered one time when she was going up stairs carrying her Bible when something fell out of it. I picked it up and gave it to her, but had time to see that it was an old faded letter dated fifty years before. It started out: "My darling sweetheart," and was signed by "Jack" who had to be my grandfather. It was about her beautiful eyes, and that he would always love her. It was a shock to me to think that she had once been a young girl in love - - when now she was wrinkled and withered like an old tree about to fall down. There was something terrible and frightening about how she could change from that lovely young girl into a withered old woman. I wondered which one was the real person, or if either one was, or if we weren't real at all.

That was the last time I saw my grandma alive. I went downstairs and my mother got home a little afterwards, never knowing that I had been upstairs to see her. Grandma died that night -the night before Easter. They had the casket in the front room, and the first night it was here, my father sat on a chair beside it with his face in his hands crying. I went over and stood by him, saying, "Don't cry, papa." He didn't look up, but put his hand on my shoulder, then raised his head and looked at the casket, his eyes red and running with tears, and said in a trembling voice, "She was my mother."

On the day of the funeral before they took the casket out, the neighbors came and sat around with my father and mother. My father told them all about grandma - how wonderful she had been, raising him all by herself after his father died - - and her heart trouble. Then he started crying again. My mother put a handkerchief to her face and seemed to cry too, but then I saw when she took it away she hadn't been crying at all. I suppose she must have thought it was necessary to pretend to the neighbors she was sorry grandma was dead . . . but I knew she wasn't.

I didn't like the funeral because there was such an awful gloom over everything - - especially when they lowered the casket into the ground and the preacher said the prayer with everybody looking solemn and staring at us. When we got back home I thought of the empty room upstairs, and how grandma had asked me not to say 'dye.' I wondered if all of her was really out there in the grave. It didn't seem possible that everything she had been could be buried down there.

Then a strange thing happened three days after the funeral while I was playing by the lawn swing in the backyard. It was a bright afternoon . . about four o'clock . . when as I happened to look over toward the swing, there was grandma sitting in it just like she always did for a little while every afternoon when the weather was mild. For a moment or two it didn't seem at all strange to me to see her sitting there. Then I realized that she had died and had been buried. Yet there she was just as plain as day. She didn't move and the swing didn't move; she just sat there looking straight ahead, with her hands in her lap, wearing the same black dress and cape she always wore outdoors and in which she had been buried. I didn't speak to her, but ran into the house to tell my mother about it. She came right out and looked about. "There's no one out there," she said. "You're just imagining things." But even while she looked and didn't see her, I still did .. just like before. She was still there, just as clear as ever. Then she seemed to rise up and move away from the swing, not as though she had been walking - but sort of floating with her skirt close to the ground. She moved across the lawn toward the pen where Fanny and Clara were, then seemed to grow fainter and fainter, until she just faded away.

My mother took me inside and didn't say any more about it -- not even to my father when he got home. Later on I told him about it myself, but he just looked at me and said nothing. When-I tried to talk about it again, my parents stopped me, saying that it never happened and that I had imagined the whole thing. But I KNEW I had seen her . . . there was no doubt about it in my mind. The day had been so bright and clear that it couldn't have been my imagination.

Since then I have told many people about this experience. Some have believed that it happened ... some said that it was grandma's ghost that I had seen ... and some said it was clair-voyance ... but often I have wondered why it happened only with grandma. It happened at Easter ... my seventh ... but to me every Easter - like grandma has a meaning of its own of something very special ... of great beauty.

I F GREATER faith and encouragement were ever needed by those who engage in what is termed by some as "the most challenging and rewarding work in the world" - - the Ministry - noted clergyman, Norman Vincent Peale, by the example of his own life and career shows how despair and discouragement, disappointment and frustration can result in even greater faith in God and in people in a moving, inspiring article appearing in the Saturday Evening Post of March 2, 1963 entitled "Why I Didn't Quit the Ministry."

To those of all creeds, sects, denominations and beliefs - - and particularly those accepting the reality of Spirit communication - - Dr. Peale touches upon a great Truth of unlimited sustaining strength when he remarks:

"Every minister, regardless of creed or denomination, has seen great things happen to people, things that in the last analysis can be explained only by the workings of the Holy Spirit."

Acknowledging three discouraging times when he nearly called it quits, still Dr. Peale's plea is that "...when we think of the opportunities a minister has, the problems and difficulties and irritations of his job shrivel down to nothing - - absolutely nothing. Consider what he is! He's a front-line fighter in the war against evil, where often the battleground is a human soul. In this endless struggle he has all the confidence and pride and sense of rightness that comes from being openly and unashamedly on God's side." (If only by our own example, we might inspire others to find the courage to stand by their convictions . . openly and un-ashamedly on God's side!) " . . His job is one of literally infinite importance because he is concerned, not just with the here-and-now problems of human beings, but with their destiny for all eternity.

To young ministers, Dr. Peale appeals for a more realistic attitude about their 'calling' and their 'flock,' reminding them that "there are few saints among us, even in the Ministry, and certainly no flocks of snow-white sheep" -- that the "failings of a few should not blind us to the virtues of the many." He exhorts all ministers to " . . . make Jesus Christ a living reality to people, for then you'll never have to worry about having a congregation. They'll come for miles, they'll break down the doors of the church to get in!" and to remember that the message of religion is the "good news that there is a God Who loves His people . . of the promise that there is forgiveness of sins . . and the

assurance that there is a life beyond the grave . . "

He reminds ministers that because "these ideas in themselves are so strong, so magnetic, so irresistibly appealing to people that if you can't get them across there must be something in you - - some impatience, some condescension, some hostility, some intellectual arrogance - - that is setting up a block. . . If there is such a block, the thing to do is search yourself for it, then pray and pry it out!"

Dr. Peale feels strongly that a minister just can't quit, for he has demanded too much of others, and this same courage he himself must display, though it takes many forms and "very often is simply the determination to keep going when the going gets tough."

How true it is that of the most frustrating experiences that can come to any leader, apathy might be considered the hardest to overcome. Dr.



Peale reminds us, however, that "it is better to light a candle than curse the darkness" and that . . "indeed, such cycles come to all creeds at times, but this is no cause for discouragement. Environments may change, but the gospel doesn't."

"All these things should be heartening to ministers who become discouraged at times, as all of us do. But in the last analysis, it's faith in God and faith in people that are the great sustaining forces. The God I believe in stands ready to help any discouraged person who turns to Him with humility and trust. . . Thus, as we view the world about us, we see mirrored therein that which is within ourselves . . . and how we may find constructive purpose, spiritual growth and Divine inspiration in a life of service to God and man - - whatever the expression of it may be - - and why a man such as Norman Vincent Peale - and countless courageous souls like him - - could never call it quits . . . and never will . . . knowing that "If I be lifted up, from the earth, I will draw all men unto me."

Whatever the test . . whatever the experience . . whatever the appearance may be, there is no turning back -- no quitting. There is only eternal progression . . . in this world, or in those beyond our present expression.
