Let Us Fill the Hungry Hearts

RELIGION WAS NOT produced by proofs of God's existence, and will not be destroyed by the insufficiency of such proof to some minds. We must remember religion existed before argument; in fact, it is its preciousness that leads us_to seek for all possible confirmations of the reality of God and His ministering angels.

Man, from the very dawn of his beginning has taught and accepted the belief in a Supreme Being. This universal belief in God is perhaps the greatest evidence that God is. Of all the peoples of the earth, none can be found lacking some concept of God. Granted such concepts may be crudely, even grotesquely stated and manifested, but the reality of the fact is no more invalidated by such crudeness than the existence of a father is invalidated by the crude attempts of a child to draw a picture of its father.

Even the scriptures begin with the sublime statement: "In the beginning God." (Gen.1:1) There is no effort made to prove that God is. Everywhere and at all times it is a fact taken for granted. A God capable of proof would be no God at all. He is the self-existent One, and the source and sustainer of all life. There are, of course, those who claim not to believe in God. But often such people are not altogether honest with themselves. This reminds me of the words once spoken by an avowed atheist to a group of so-called nonbelievers: "I have gotten rid of the idea of a Supreme Being, and I thank God for it."

It is from this common belief in God that man has evolved the various religions of the world. Certainly if God planted the idea of Himself in the fabric of man's thought, He would, of necessity, have instituted means whereby man could arrive at some knowledge of Him. and His purpose to the hungry hearts of the people of the Earth. In Bible days such chosen vessels were referred to as prophets and seers men who were capable of giving some sign or demonstration of God's interest in man, men who produced the unusual and caused people to sit up and take notice, that caused their minds to be conscious of God's purpose for them while here on Earth. These great revelations produced through such demonstrations brought new hope and meaning into the lives of all who were prepared to receive them. From these believers sprang all known religions of today.

Unfortunately the prophets of yesterday were faced with much the same problem as our present day mediums. When some great truth was given, men sought to place their own interpretation on it. They would immediately formulate their dogmas and creeds around this definition they had arrived at, and thus choke off the flow of Divine revelation. On more than one occasion Jesus had to rebuke even His own disciples for misunderstanding His teachings and demonstrations. When on the mount of transfiguration we read how Peter, James and John witnessed Jesus communicating with the departed spirits of Moses and Elijah, and right away - with no further knowledge than what they had seen - they were ready to establish three churches, one to the honor of Jesus, one for Moses, and one for Elijah. They were restrained from doing this and told to listen to Jesus who, in time, would reveal a greater and more encompassing plan and purpose for spiritual progression. Crystalization of religion invariably will quench the manifestation of revelation into the world.

Up until the last century man was confronted with the never-ending cycle of beginning a religion on the basis of some revealed truth . . . a religion soon to be inhibited by manmade laws that curtailed its usefulness. We see the evidence of this statement on every hand in large organizations void of any spirituallife. Paul described such groups in this way: ". . . having a form of Godliness, but denying the power thereof." (II Tim.3:5)

It was during the last century that God sent a deluge of revelation so farreaching in its scope that no man or group of men could ever again cap the fountainhead of divine wisdom flowing from Heaven to Earth. From this great downpouring were born courageous men and women who would never again be satisfied with a mere partial revelation of God and His universe. To have once tasted of the spiritual manna of God brings to its recipient an unquenchable hunger for more. These men and women were and are ready at any cost to achieve the spiritual growth God intends for them to have. Let the critics howl and the skeptics deny what they will, these fearless pioneers of Truth have set their faces like a flint toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God,

and no one can turn this great tide of revelation.

The inability of many who entered the Spiritualist religion to crystalize it with dogmas and creeds has reresulted in their leaving the ranks to begin religions of their own - religions based on the principles of Spiritualism, but which deny that God's revelation is continually flowing through His instruments of Truth. While these off-shoots have accomplished much good with the Truth they gleaned, they are not meeting the sincere longings of their followers. This is highly evident by the exodus of their adherents, who yearly are streaming into Spiritualist churches all over the world, seeking greater enlightenment, and finding it.

It is only through the development of mediumship that our religion is kept alive and vital. It is the realization of every true Spiritualist that God has even more beautiful and majestic truths to be given to us when we are mentally and spiritually capacitated to receive them. To recognize this stirring fact, is constantly to transform ourselves by the renewing of our minds that we might prove what is that good and acceptwill of God. There can be no stagnation in genuine Spiritualism. Its life flow is the evermoving tide of God's power in and through those who love Him and seek to know the riches of His grace.

Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us." (Heb. 12:1) Who are these witnesses who cheer us on in our race for spiritual attainment? "Are they not all ministering spirits, sent forth to minister for them who shall be heirs of salvation?" (Heb. 1:14)

Jesus said, "Ye shall know the Truth and the Truth shall set you free." This is our religion. The relationship we experience with God through His ministering angels is the greatest heritage God could give to the people of the Earth. What shall we do with it? There is something about this wonderful knowledge that compels us to share it with others, to tell it to all who are openminded enough to listen, and thus 'hasten God's kingdom on Earth.

Not All Parting is Sweet Sorrow

TO PART FROM EVIL WAYS is not sweet sorrow; it is sweet joy. Particularly not in the category of sweet sorrow is parting from fear of the future. Fear of the future indicates a lack of faith in the all-wise provisions of our Heavenly Father, and it indicates only a remote connection with Him.

The future, like the past, may bring apparently difficult situations, but their adverse effects will be nullified by the love and merey of God through Spirit at work within us. Look back and see if this has not been so in former difficulties. A God who can part the Red Seas of Trouble for us once can do it twice.

Think of man's intelligence, native, acquired, and illumined from on high. Is it not a wonderful magic wand to dispel groundless fears? Even those fears that are based on negative suggestions of thoughtless older folk while we are yet in the difficult years of youth. I can remember that for years I held back from attempting anything big because a dear aunt of mine had once remarked: "You are too easily discouraged." Then there was a good friend of mine who ordinarily would never have run afoul of the law except that his uncle, trying to scare him into walking the chalk line in his total behavior, one fine day announced to him: "If they want you; they'll get you." Here was implanted in the sub-conscious a needless fear of police activity that never would have taken root except for this unfortunate remark. The trouble is that we are all too prone to let others be lamps unto us, instead of following the good advice given to his monks by the Lord Buddha from his death bed: "Be a lamp unto yourselves." In other words, let us use the intelligence God gave us to draw from Universal Consciousness the means whereby we can overcome all problems. Knowing that we have

this vast power at our beck and call should cause fear to fear itself and "silently steal away."

Echoing Buddha's advice for one to be a "lamp unto himself," we have Judge Troward's words: "You must always be determined to do your own thinking." We do not want others to establish for us external things and conditions out of their thinking, unless, of course, they are as we would have thought of them ourselves, for God has devised this world as a very definite individual one.

All that we see about us is the result of thought, of the prime moving of Universal Mind, and of the reciprocal action of individual and Universal Mind. The big note of cheer is struck in the fact that we can control our own thinking, our rainbow-tinted birth-right. If you want to know what sweet sorrow truly is you will find it in one who has parted from the control of his own thinking.

The power of bringing external things out of the internal power of controlled thinking is an inexhaustible one. Many use it without knowing they possess it, and, sad to say, many knowing that they possess it and even how it works, fail to apply it. A steadfast use of this power, unconsciously or consciously, brings about the desired ends. What we habitually think gravitates to the World of Form. "Therefore", writes Troward, "when you believe a situation is beyond your control, so it is."

Positive, sustained thinking in a given direction, together with seeing what is sought as already realized, brings fulfillment. This is sobecause of the interplay of Universal Intelligence with individual intelligence, the self-same waters intermingling. Although we may be little drops or globules of water, we are all part of the same vast ocean.

In connection with this observation, I feel moved to leave with you the following affirmation from the writings of Judge Troward: "The Life in me is inseverably connected with all the life that exists, and it is entirely devoted to my personal advancement."

IS THERE A POWER that can be tapped that will work its way into every area of human experience and help us solve our problems, clear our thinking and enable us to possess the full, rich relationships we deserve? Thankfully, we know there is. Additional thousands feel there must be, and are seeking this contact.

Most of you have made your contact to some degree. To make contact with this power will solve all problems, and even show you the way to go in life. It will lead you into the deep silences and give you guidance so that you might come to know yourself . . . your true spiritual identity. It will clear the mystery from the mind and put things in proper perspective. It will bring you to the place where you learn to lose your desires, suspicions, fears and limitations . . . the wishes and vain imaginings, the struggles and the strains . . . so you can find yourself in the larger Life.

To renounce the effort-way to experiences does not renounce the methods by which experiences are brought into manifestation. We should learn the value of sustaining the proper imagery in mind so that it reflects as our environment. This is not a matter of will-power, but it is a matter of controlled attention, keeping the attention on what is desired and off that which, is not wanted. Emerson said, "A man is what he thinks about all day long." We become what we contemplate. This is the secret of controlled life experience.

In most cases, the subconscious level of mind is loaded with memories of pain, fear and rejection. These patterns must be revised and erased if we are to be free of them. As long as you maintain mental picfures at any level, you have the possibility of a corresponding or matching situation in your environment. Dr. Penfield, a Canadian neurosurgeon, found that by stimulating certain brain centers of patients, he could enable them to re-live past experiences . . . proving that memories are re-JUNE 1964 CHIMES tained even after consciously we forget them.

THE CHALLENGE TO THINK STRAIGHT

One of our major challenges is to learn to think straight . . . to get rid of false ideas and erroneous concepts. Otherwise, if we don't, it is like trying to use an adding machine with the wrong button held down, even though in orderly fashion, the answer will be wrong. Human beings, failing to think clearly and use facts, draw wrong conclusions about life. This is why I suggest constant recalling of the basic facts of life.

What are these basic facts? The first is that consciousness is the only reality. There is nothing else. Everything we appear to see is merely consciousness appearing as that which we behold. Consciousness has taken on shading, coloring and form to appear as creation. Consciousness is being remolded constantly to fit our idea of it. It is fluid and flows before us to take the impress of our mind.

So, our world precedes us according to our sustained mental attitude. Literally we "go to prepare a place" for *ourselves* when we sustain the right attitude in mind. As human beings we are in tune on another level, whether we are aware of it or not. The One Life, working through us, sees to it that we are used as instruments through which It works Its own good will.

Eight years ago when I left California to go to the East Coast to lecture, I held in my mind's eye the picture of returning to California to a large, responsive audience. I stayed away for five years, lecturing in every major eastern and mid-western city, and writing three books. Then, I got the impression to return to California. Without doing anything about it, except check on lecture halls, suddenly I received a letter from the Hollywood Science of Mind Church which meets in Grauman's Chinese Theater, asking if I would consent to speak for their Sunday morning service two times in the coming summer. I agreed to do so. This invitation matched perfectly my own travel plans. While visiting Hollywood, speaking for this church, and doing some radio and television work there, I also met for the first time the Editors of Chimes. They agreed to advertise some of my books and did so later that year.

Six months later, while lecturing in Daytona Beach, Florida I met a lady who came up to me and told me that she was recently from Detroit. A friend of hers had given her a copy of Chimes with an excerpt of the book published in it. She had a problem or two and decided to use the technique suggested in the article to see if she could solve them. Within three weeks, ac-

cording to her own testimony, she had solved the problem, sold her property in Michigan, moved to Florida, and was doing very nicely. The reason she came to the lecture that evening was that a friend brought her. She didn't know until I was introduced that I was the author of the article she had read in Chimes. So, an article published in California found its way to Michigan . . . to a woman who was not at that time a subscriber . . . who used the advice and changed her life . . . then moved to Florida where we were brought together by a friend who knew nothing of the situation. Yes . . . I believe in guid-.mce.' I believe that the Universal Intelligence is running things, and that when we are in tune and open to worthwhile experiences, we find our place in life and experience fulfillment.

Life is not static . . . it is dynamic! You should not stand still. You should be involved. You should be expanding, increasing in wisdom and stature. It is contrary to the law of nature to stand still.

"Look within," said Marcus Aurelius, "for within is the fountain of all good. Such a fountain, where springing waters cannot fail, do thou dig deeper and deeper."

What Is Our Capacity To Know God?

As we evolve in our spiritual understanding, so does our capacity to receive from the spiritual plane increase

N W. STAINTON MOSES' interesting and informative book, "Spirit Teachings," we find his control, Imperator, often repeating the idea that "God's revelation is correlative with man's spiritual development, and He is revealed in proportion to man's capacity."

Here we have the key to the perplexing question as to why there are so many contrary reports coming through different human mediums. The universally loved guide, Silver Birch, gives us some idea of the way the Invisibles work with mediums, when he says this: "We take the knowledge already existing in the mind, refine and spiritualize it, and build upon it as a foundation, only rejecting that which is noxious and untrue." From that we must assume that the condition and state of mind of the medium has much to do with the quality of whatever comes through from higher realms of living, just as the quality and condition of a radio will determine whether one has good or poor reception.

The Master Jesus taught that we must seek first the kingdom of Heaven. Christ knew the importance of purifying the human channel through which God could speak to the people. Seeking God first in all our ways results in opening up many channels of influence, for the Light of Christ permeates our world, and that Light reaches us through innumerable links connecting in one vast chain of influence. For this reason, prayers which go out to the . Father may be answered by one of His messengers, even as cries of the Israelites in bondage to Egypt were heard and answered through those instruments God could use to guide the people. .

In the early days of our world's history, man pictured a God who was a man in every respect. He took the highest ideal of humanity, and added to it certain qualities; the result he called Deity. This is what man is still doing, with the result that his ideas of God are limited and clouded with mortal mist. In view of this, we can understand why the Old Testament is filled with accounts of slaughter and vengeance, and much that is unpleasant to read. The knowledge of God being progressive, acting as it does from an Infinite Source, man gradually is losing some of his fancied ideas about his Creator, and his conceptions are undergoing continued change. Thus we see why in Biblical times God used as His messengers those who could teach the truth needed in that particular age. The Bible records reveal the experiences of many who were instruments of the Father's guidance for mankind. Prophets of old were chosen because of their particular make-up, suited to the task of teaching and guiding the people into better ways of living. Paul was a "chosen vessel."

Lena Barnes Jefts, in writing of biblical mysteries, says this: "We believe that some of the so-called miracles of the Bible were meant to be symbolical, while others were brought about by the action of a law not then understood by the people. We must also realize that the priests of this early age believed that the more mysterious and incomprehensible the rites of the church were, the more interested the people became, and thus they strengthened their hold over them. This is still true in our present day and age, for there are many who would rather believe the religion that is incomprehensible to them than to believe in one that is logical and in harmony with nature's laws." .

When we consider how the walls of Jericho fell when the people shouted and the priests blew on the trumpets, and how today certain tones of a singer will break a glass, we know there must be some law back of these things which operates when conditions are right to bring them about. Thus it is today with human mediums who act as channels for the invisible Spirit world to communicate with this earth plane. When conditions are right, certain phenomena take place, and the result is good. Without proper conditions, there is a noticeable lowering of the quality of phenomena which comes through at the time, or there are no phenomena at all:

According to the Spirit guide, Silver Birch, experience with his own medium demonstrated that revelation from God comes in proportion to man's capacity to receive it. He tells us . . . "I am sometimes limited by your language, and by my instrument. If we fail to agree, then it is either because the souls in your world are not yet evolved to an understanding of greater truths, or because I cannot express all that is within my soul which is greater than your earthly language allows me to interpret." Then, as if to make his point still clearer, he continues: "No limits can be set to the great Infinite Spirit, to the wisdom, to the inspiration, to the truth that can be showered upon your world. There are no restrictions to the mighty power of Spirit waiting to fill your world, when your instruments can provide the right channels for us to use."

All this clearly indicates that revelation from God comes in proportion to our capacity to receive it. As we become increasingly aware of our relationship to God, we have a better comprehension of His laws and how to use them. No longer do we permit ourselves to be deceived or limited by external appearances, for we shift our attention to the inner man. No longer do we regard our lives from the human standpoint, for that would limit our capacity to receive more of divine wisdom which only awaits our recognition and acceptance. Even as an iceberg exposes only one seventh of its entire size, the greater part being hidden from view, we know that individual earth experience itself is but one small part of our whole life in God.

Jesus said: "There is nothing covered that shall not be revealed, and hid that shall not be known." Therefore, let us continue our quest for increased understanding of God, confident our search for Infinite Truth will bring us nearer that day predicted in Hebrews, when . . . "they shall teach every man his neighbor, and every man his brother, saying, "Know the Lord, for ALL SHALL KNOW" ME FROM THE LEAST TO THE GREAT-EST."

U.F.O.'S OVER BRAZIL

Lecturer and researcher in the field of U.F.O. phenomena, Dr. Joseph Hansell of Albuquerque, New Mexico addressed an Inglewood, California group, reports Understanding bulletin, claiming that in his travels he has found proof, as well as legend, of unusual people, and active civilizations where great lighted ships and other unusual phenomenal lights in the sky, as well as aerial ships of unusual design, have been observed frequently and plainly. He also told of how Brasilia, the new and somewhat fabulous capital of Brazil, experienced a grand display of aerial phenomena during the days of its initial celebration as a new type "city of the future." Dr. Hansell states that a great space ship appeared over the city in full view of thousands of people who attended the great fete . . . something you wouldn't hear much about in this country.

GREEK KING A SPIRITUALIST

King Paul of the Hellenes, who died in March, was a convinced Spiritualist because of his many seances with Estelle Roberts. British medium, states the Psychic Neuv of England. His brother, King George II, also a Spiritualist, was responsible for taking him to Miss Roberts during the years when both brothers were exiled. Her Spirit guide, Red Cloud, is said to have predicted George's return to the throne - which did occur - and for eleven years sent messages to him in the official diplomatic bag. Both brothers told Miss Roberts, says the News, that they had no real obstacle in accepting Spiritualism, because they realized the psychic nature of the famed Delphic Oracle of their beloved country, Greece. The pseudonym used by King Paul when he visited the British medium was "Mr. Constantine," which is the name of his son who now has succeeded him. However, the fact that he was a Spiritualist could not be concealed even in his own country . . . one where the orthodox church is very strong. King Paul was a great-grandson of Britain's most famous royal Spiritualist, Queen Victoria, who had frequent seances at Buckingham Palace.

PSYCHIC BOOM RAGING

Science Publications, in a reprint from the Santa Ana, California Register by Norma Lee Browning, reports that a "psychic boom is on." Describing the rising prominence of Peter Hurkos, Jean Dixon, Ted Serios, Gerard Croiset, and the work of Dr. Joseph B. Rhine of Duke University, she says, "you're simply not on the



beam if you don't have ESP or PSI," and that it is "far more fashionable now to be psychic than psychotic . . . and that people are taking their problems to psychics instead of psychoanalysts." In describing its place in our time, she tells us: "Each age has had its fads, but it was left to the Space Age, a period of reason, enlightenment, scientific miracles . . . and the Beatles ... to usher in the Golden Age of PSI. There are even rumors floating around." she states, "to the effect that the United States government is spending taxpayers money for research in table-tipping and, levitation for the training of astronauts." Her summary of the situation is that "in the current universal enthrallment with the world beyond-or within-the five senses has reached cosmic proportions." She sees Russia's experiments in telepathy as having sparked what may turn out to be the PSIhappiest heyday of all time. With all the advances being made, however, what puzzles Miss Browning is why such psychics---if they are as good as they claim--don't clean up in the stock market. Obviously she is among the great majority who don't yet realize what man's higher potentials are supposed to be used for.

THE GHOST OF BRAZORIA COUNTY

Leslie Rich, writing for the Ford Times, gives an interesting account of the Brazoria County, Texas famous one-ghost welcoming committee, old Brit Bailey, who has been haunting visitors and residents for almost one hundred thirty years. Describing their celebrity as having been a well-to-do but disreputable planter of the frontier days, it seems that, after his passing, his presence began to become known after a storm uprooted the trees marking the site of his grave, one in which he was buried standing up, facing west; with his gun by his side . . . his deathbed instructions for burial. In the early days after his death, Brit was known to return in human form to make things uncomfortable for the new owners-of his plantation. Beginning in the nineteenth century, however, he was detected only through the light which was thought to represent the lantern that accompanied him in his grave. Bailey has been known to have shaken up many a strong frontiersman, driven livestock to stampede, led determined horsemen on

wild, futile chases through the woods, astounded and confused many a motorist streaking down the highway, and has been accused of causing one of the worst oil well blowups of the decade. It would be a shame to miss the experience of seeing Bailey's Light, says the author, and even suggests the possibility that someone-during a trip through the heavy-scented woods and prairies of Brazoria County-will even see Old Brit himself again!

HEALERS WAGE BATTLE

A vigorous campaign for the freedom of healers throughout Brazil and other South American countries currently is being waged, writes Phenomonist in The Greater World, English publication. Despite testimony, photographic, and first-hand evidence given by a panel of nineteen doctors investigating materializations, spirit operations, and dramatic healing cures that have occurred for years in more than thirty Spiritualist hospitals in Brazil, Roman Catholic authorities still rule that spiritual healing when not done under medical supervision-is illegal. Brazil's outstanding healer, Jose Arigo, Roman Catholic, civil servant, and father of six, has made headlines throughout South America and Europe for his trance operations, with doctors from all parts of the world, as well as a group of sixty doctors and professors from the University of Sao Paulo having studied him and invited him to demonstrate at their university. In 1958, accused of treating patients without being a qualified practitioner, he was arrested and sentenced, but received a pardon from President Kubitschek. Facing a similar charge again now, Arigo's fight has set off a campaign throughout the entire Southern Hemisphere to champion the rights of all who would engage in spiritual healing.

HOW MUCH DO WE CHANGE?

"Uninformed piety habitually exacts too much from death," says the Rev. Charles A. Hall in his article, Salute to Death, from Tomorrou' magazine. "It demands that it should be the revealer of mysteries, the solver of problems, the settler of doubts. Death no more introduces the atheist to the vision of God than the hypocritical religionist to the ways of sincerity. Our life is continued in a practical work-aday world under human conditions similar to those we at present experience. There, as here, the vision of God depends upon the state of our spiritual culture; the discovery of secrets follows intellectual discipline and earnest research, and happiness depends upon loving and faithful obedience to the laws of life." Still a do-it-yourself project.

Spiritual Healing in

THE NASIKVALA CIRCLE is one of the foremost healing groups in India. It had its beginnings in 1938 after Dr. Fram D. Nasikvala.attended a scance with the express purpose of "exposing the charlatans who were believed to be deceiving the credulous." It was the forerunner of the Healing Circle of Bombay.

It is well to remember that India is the birthplace of Hinduism, a religion which goes back over 3,000 years. It is essentially a religion of the Indian. Hinduism attaches a greater importance to a true spiritual life than it does to any dogma or doctrine. It is an essential condition of true Hinduism that all must respect and revere the good men of all beliefs, whether they be atheists, Moslems, Jews or Gentiles. It is a profound theory of toleration and good will towards all other human beings.

"There is no duty or law that is higher than Truth." That is a well known concept of Hindu philosophy, and there is little wonder that we can find now in India the prerequisites for a glorious rebirth making spiritual healing an acceptable therapy. Whatever the Christian world may think of Hinduism, there is one basic factor quite certain; it has never erred about the nature of God. It is just as easy for Hinduism to accept the divine origin of healing as it is for the Christian to accept the Hindu "absolute Being of God." There is a degree of synonymy between these convictions.

The basic philosophy of modern spiritual healing, with its firm belief in help from our spirit friends, was first taken to India by Mr. V. D. Rishi and his wife. Mr. Rishi is the President of the Spiritual Centre of Bombay. He commenced his pioneer work with the certain knowledge that "the dead are alive," and that this belief "is somewhere and in some way ingrained' among the Hindus." This declaration was

India

made in 1956 by Mr. K. S. D. Alyer, Secrétary of the Spiritual Centre of Coimbatore, S. India.

Dr. Nasikvala originally was an expert magician and was well acquainted with the tricks of the "make belief trade." He attended his first circle with the belief that at these circles the same tricks would be employed. We are informed by the Secretary, however, that the doctor was the one who "stayed to pray." He was convinced of the genuineness of the spirit manifestations and immediately became an active member of the "group." So commenced the healing, research and spiritual activities of the Bombay Healing Circle.

It was not until 1949 that Dr. Nasikvala himself commenced to give spiritual healing, and by 1950 the Circle was so developed that it was able to hold special healing sessions twice weekly. By 1956 over six hundred patients had found relief through healing. Dr. Nasikvala was assisted by Miss Sheroo Peddar who gradually developed into a remarkable healer. Miss Peddar successfully treated many patients with physical conditions which had not responded to medical treatment.

The news of healing successes spread rapidly, and by 1952 another healing sanctuary was opened at Bangalore. The new sanctuary, together with the Bombay Healing Circle, and the Coimbatore Healing Circle conducted by Mr. K. S. D. Aiyer, became the three main centers for healing which all had come into existence within a few years.

It is worthwhile to record a few facts concerning the healing guides in spirit /who are beloved by all associated with the healing movement in India. The first was a powerful guide who originally was known as Silver Birch, and later became known by the revered name of Ashoka, a great Indian ruler. (He is NOT the Silver Birch associated with the mediumship of Maurice Barbanell of England.) Rishi Ram Ram also is a beloved guide who has the special distinction of being associated with both the Bombay Circle and the Circle at Coimbatore.

Rishi Ram Ram, in his life on this earth, was a physician to the Court of Ashoka, and it will be readily understood why he has taken on his lifetime profession in the realm of Spirit to heal the suffering on this physical plane. We cannot accept the continuity of Spirit without a full realization of a life of eternal usefulness. The very basis of spiritual healing is a sure knowledge that by the grace of God the two worlds can become attuned for preventative and curative bealing purposes.

The gift of healing is now, slowly but surely, being developed in India on a much larger scale. Many who possess a high degree of love and compassion for their fellow man have turned their attention to spiritual endeavors in order to bring easement of pain and comfort of mind to those who suffer from bodily ills and the stress of modern life. They have found a ready response from Spirit.

As in all countries, healing has its uneven development in India. It is a natural law associated with cause and effect. Many of the unknown healers in India are playing their part in bringing enlightenment to those who, due to the influence of Western materialism during the hundred years of military occupation, had developed a Godless philosophy. The reality of our existence as Spirit and the continuity of life

Under the able leadership of such highly spiritual men as Mr. Rishi, Mr. Aiyer and Dr. Nasikvala, and supported by the many who desire to render service to mankind, the healing movement in India is sure to go forward with increasing strength and volume. The universality of the divine power ultimately will carry its influence to all corners of our planet. inner world from which everything may be received.

It is being demonstrated more fully every day that all things pertaining to the life of man come from the within . . . not only great things, but all things. From the within comes all wisdom, and the mind that has awakened the largest measure of the within has the greatest wisdom.

LET US START OFF with a question pertaining to the very nature of Spiritualism itself, and some of the things that perplex newcomers.

• Regarding Spirit communication, (asks a reader) my mother, who has been raised in the strict orthodox Jewish fashion, violently rejects Spirit communication, it being a terrible sin to disturb the Spirits. I waved this .tside, since my mother has other ideas which I consider ontmoded. But in reading the book. "A Dweller on Two Planets." I came across the very same thing. The author says:

The sect known as Spiritualists are in error when they speak of Spirit communication and regard it as they do. For no ego returns out of Devachan except it be forced, and this is harmful, and vastly unjust to the ego. The astral soul and animal principle may thus return, but the I AM, never. For the latter there is no past earth state . . . for it has no consciousness of anything earthly, or of anything occurring on this earth. We can go to them, but they cannot come to us.

This all confuses me, yet I very much want to do the right thing. I have had a few very interesting experiences with a medium, but I do not want to continue if this would harm anyone who has passed on.

This is a misconception if I have, ever heard one. I'll try not to make the story too long, and be as brief as I possibly can in giving the answer. First, as to her concern that we do not call back the so-called dead. The so-called dead are all round about us, and necessarily so, as we can understand when we go into the subject more deeply. It is that the Spirit returns, and once it does, it tells us that we live again, and what we have encountered.

For show me, and truly, a man who was a good father, who does not want to return to let his wife and children know that he still lives. He will be a good father until the end, although he be out of the flesh. He may find it very difficult to communicate with his wife and children, but he must understand that communication is very proper. To communicate with Spirit is as natural as the air you breathe.

On the other hand, the quality of the instrumentality sought for the manifestation, or communication, varies, and can be determined by the individual as a session is being carried on.

Now some people say you must not call back the dead. You don't call back the dead! Nor is it true that a medium can call anyone back from the Spirit world to communicate. This is a false statement. A medium does not bring your loved ones, to you, but rather you bring your loved ones with you to the seance room. Your sympathetic relationship becomes manifest and known to you.

It is said that we are not to disturb the dead. We do not disturb the dead. Rather it can be said that ofttimes the dead disturb the living, for various reasons. In stepping out of the physical body into the world of Spirit — a dimension removed from the dimension of humanity—we must understand one thing'... that it is natural for the Spirit to speak. It is just as natural for the Spirit to come back and appear as the same identical individual that he was before he left the flesh. He, or she, can be a progressive, or a non-progressive entity, just as he chooses.

So therefore it cannot be said that the ego or soul cannot come back to communicate. This would be rather silly . . . foolish . . . asinine . . . in these days when we have so much proof in society and in science that will well authenticate all these manifestations when catalogued and presented in the right and proper manner. The Spirits manifest because they want to let the people know that they still live. Ofttimes people do not seek the Spirit, but the Spirit seeks them, and they have the apparitions, materializations, etherializations, premonitions and various other phenomena they did not ask for, but were given by Spirit. This is proof to you that you do not necessarily call back the dead. They come because they want to let you know that they still live.

• Margie, what is the difference between a psychic and a medium?

A psychic is one who is able to tune in on the psychic realm, a realm so constituted by the mind of the individual. Through the actions of the individual, he has produced a result that is seen in the psychic atmosphere that is peculiar to him. This therefore casts a shadow of his thought, which is a result. These things are seen by psychics. A psychic is a clairvoyant. A clairvoyant has "second sight," or what we call the "sixth sense." This was a common thing at one time in our evolution, but has been lying dormant because we no longer depend on it.

On the other hand, a medium is one who is worked upon or played upon by Spirits, be they good or bad.

• Can anyone who altempts to unfold bis mediumistic powers become a medium?

Absolutely not. Only a very small percentage of those who are desirous of becoming mediums ever fully develop or achieve their desire. This is the unfortunate thing you find among professional mediums today, assuming they themselves are fully developed. They hold classes for unfoldment to have mediumship, but very few ever develop it. This is a great disappointment to those whom the medium's guides often have unduly encouraged to sit for development, indicating that they would become a trumpet medium or have physical mediumship. A very small percentage, in proportion to those who sit for development, ever get it.

• Margie, what quality characterizes the successful psychic?

To begin with, the faculty of clairvoy-(Continued on Page 24)

# ARE PSYCHIC WARNINGS SO RARE?

STRANGE WARNINGS have been given —just in the nick of time — to save many persons from disaster. There are countless cases in psychic literature of individuals who owed their lives to some mysterious warning.

For example, movie actor James Cagney once wrote in a film magazine that his life was saved because of a spirit warning from his dead father.

Cagney and his wife, Billie, were driving to San Francisco at speeds up to 85 miles an hour—they wanted to arrive in that city at a certain time. As the car raced along, he had nothing particularly in mind but reaching his destination and having a good dinner.

Suddenly, he heard a voice in his car say, "Take it easy, kid."

He took his foot off the accelerator and glanced at his wife, thinking at first that she had spoken. But she appeared puzzled and asked if he had heard another person's voice.

Cagney admitted he had, but he stepped on the gas again. As the speedometer needle again hit 85, Cagney heard the mysterious voice shout, "Take it easy, kid."

Amazed, Cagney told his wife he recognized the voice as that of his dead father. She replied that she had recognized it also.

Cagney related that he was driving slowly, heeding the spirit warning, when he saw—lying across the road ahead—a house trailer that evidently had broken loose from a car a short time before.

The movie star saw the obstruction in time to avoid a collision—something he could not have done had his speed been 85 miles per hour.

A more famous instance concerns Britain's beloved Queen Victoria and how she

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was saved by a quirk of fate.

She was on a train speeding through a thick fog. The queen was anxious to return to Buckingham Palace at the earliest possible moment, for affairs of state had taken a turn for the worse.

The engineer was driving the train as fast as he could, consistent with safety, but it was a dangerous trip at best. Patches of fog cropped up in glare of the headlight fog which replaced the drižzling rain that marked most of the trip.

Back in her coach, Queen Victoria was holding an emergency session with two of her advisors who had brought her news of the latest development in Parliament.

Suddenly, the engineer was startled to see ahead of him in the fog a black figure waving its arms frantically in the white funnel of light from the train's headlight.

He slammed on the brakes and brought the train to a shrieking halt. What was wrong? The queen's armed guards checked their guns and took their positions. A steel shutter dropped into place at the window of her coach. Every precaution to prevent an ambush took place in seconds.

The trainmen scrambled down to determine the nature of the emergency. Who was flagging them so frantically — and why? The signaler had vanished . . .

The conductor walked ahead a couple of hundred yards and discovered the danger a railroad bridge had collapsed into a

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swollen stream. Death had waited for the queen's train about six hundred feet from where it had screeched to a halt.

No trace was found of the strange figure in black who had prevented the disaster ... until a member of the train crew was startled to see a moving black shadow in the headlight beam.

He climbed up to check the headlight itself and found the answer—or part of it. A giant moth was flattened out over the headlamp, its outstretched wings still moving feebly with the last of its strength.

The flapping of the moth's wings had cast the shadow that alerted the engineer and stopped the train on the brink of disaster.

It can still be seen in a London museum ---the moth that saved the queen.

A weird story of three young men being saved from death in mysterious fashion was reported in a Scotland newspaper on April 16, 1961.

The trio told the Glasgow Sunday Mail they were driving home to Hamilton from a village dance when they saw a "tall, ghostly figure" appear in middle of the lonely country road. Its arms were outstretched, as if signalling the car to stop.

The driver, Edward McDonald, explained that he and his two companions had tried a shortcut home and lost their way. As the road was too narrow to permit the car to turn—and trees were on either side of the road—they were forced to go on.

McDonald said he had just slowed down when a huge phantom figure appeared in front of the headlights. He noted the lights seemed to shine through the figure.

Terrified, McDonald tried to drive through the figure, but it glided alongside the car. Then, the car engine stalled mysteriously and the driver braked to a stop. The figure then "seemed to melt away."

The three young men peered out the car windows and saw the reason for the ghostly warning . . . if they had traveled another two yards, the vehicle would have plunged down a 150-foot ravine into the Clyde River.

Many have received such mysterious warnings of impending danger. One wonders if they served to make the recipient become more aware that there is a world beyond our five physical senses, one even more real than might at first be suspected.

HOW SELF-PROJECTION MAY BE ACCOMPLISHED

**R ECALLING FROM** our last discussion that "thoughts are things" ... that they have a definite shape and color the more advanced student can see clearly as any object, it begins to make sense why it behooves us to project the type of thought-self of which we would not be ashamed.

The reader doubtless will recall the case of "Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde" by Robert Louis Stevenson, (a most important case for all students to study). Here, as we know, the original individual finally became two. Dr. Jekyll developed another self, calling himself Mr. Hyde. Dr. Jekyll was kindly, helpful and sympathetic; Hyde was evil, malicious and wholly repulsive.

These two selves were developed in the original person, and the split between them became greater and greater as the months went by. Finally Mr. Hyde assumed complete supremacy and Dr. Jekyll vanished forever. In this case it was not a mere change of personality which could be accounted for on any psychological grounds; it was an actual identical transformation. Apparently there were two separate bodies which were transformed one into the other.

Suppose now, that the good self, Dr. Jekyll, also the bad self, Mr. Hyde, existed as separate, mental beings, each with the power of selfprojection. They would each create, by their own thoughts, a separate body, and this being would resemble, in outward appearance, the thoughts which created it. Cases of this character might, therefore, exist, and might conceivably be explained on scientific principles.

We must be careful, then, of the character of the thought-self which we build up, for if this resembles outwardly its inner structure, we may (many of us) come to resemble monstrosities rather than human beings, at some stage of our development, when the plane is reached where thoughts predominate and shape the expression of the self.

# PRACTICAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR SELF-PROJECTION

This inner, etheric body, which is expelled to a distance by the power of will, in cases of self-projection, may be released and projected by the student after a certain amount of practice. He should go about this cautiously, feeling his way, as itwere, but proceeding more or less along the following lines:

Place yourself in a perfectly composed attitude, either on a couch or in a large chair. Close the eyes and breathe deeply for a few minutes, all the time holding the mind on a central point of concentration. Travel over your body in thought, and at each point or spôt dwelt upon by you, will that your etheric body becomes detached or loosened from its connection with the physical body. As you begin to gain control of this process, you may hear or rather "sense" a process of separation taking place, resembling a "click," and inwardly feeling like the disconnection of an electric current. When this has been completed at one point, travel to another. Do not try too many on any one occasion, and always be sure to restore by an effort of will the original connected condition before you terminate the experiment.

After you have gone round your body in this way, and have succeeded in disconnecting it more or less completely, you should then call up before you, in space, a certain distant locality, such as the room of a friend, and, throwing the whole force of your being into a single determined effort of will, force yourself mentally to leave your body and travel to the locality before you. If you feel that you are losing consciousness, or that everything is "going black" before you, discontinue the experiment at once and return to your physical body. If you can keep your selfconsciousness active, you may safely travel to any distance – feeling assured that you will be able to reThe optimist is right . . . and the pessimist is right. Hour by hour we are making our own heaven or our own hell, and in the degree that we are making the one or the other for ourselves, are we not helping to make it for all the world besides?

turn whenever you want to and reanimate your own physical frame. All this, of course, takes time and persistence of development, and cannot be acquired in a few days. 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MY SON'S WARNING OF THE ALASKAN QUAKE

It had been Christmas eve since hearing from my son, Larrie, by phone at that time when he was in Washington, D.C. As he travels a lot, in February I heard from him next via airmail from Houston. Texas. At the time 1 wondered . . . where shall I hear from him next?

Beginning seven weeks before Alaska's carthquake of March 28th, I started to receive warnings of some type. After staying up to watch the late, late show on TV one Saturday, having said my nightly prayers and read my Bible, I prepared for sleep. Just as I snuggled up to my pillow, I heard a very hard knock at our door. Thinking that I had awakened my husband as I had retired so late, I asked him if he would see what was at the door. Before getting up, he turned over in bed to listen for another knock . . . but there was none. So we decided that it might have been a warning that his father had passed over, having been quite ill. Just as we had adjusted ourselves to settle down to a good night's sleep, the telephone rang loud and clear. I answered it on the first ring as it was by my side of the bed, and I was facing it. When I picked it up, the line was dead . . . no answer. So we assumed by that time that our angelic spirit friends were just preparing us for news of the passing by telephone or telegraphic notification. Then the exact same thing happened every night for seven consecutive weeks, always between 2:30 and 3:30 in the morning . . . one loud knock, and one ring on the telephone. By that time we had given up wondering what it was all about. When the twenty-first day came along, I had given no more thought to the knocks and the rings, and was going about my usual housework when I happened to look out one of the windows. Directly across the street, standing on a sidewalk, was a boy that looked like my son. Living near a park, I thought it might be one of the children who played there, and dismissed the impression of the likeness from my mind. I turned back to my work, and in doing so, there flashed across my mind the thought

that it was my son, but that it was his spirit body standing out there. Quickly I went back to the window and looked to see if he was still standing there, and sure enough, he was. There were no others in sight, so I just stood there watching the boy to see what he would do. I must have stood there a half hour just watching him, and as he made no move to cross the street and come home, I thought he must be trying to out-wait me, trying to show me what strength and power he could maintain, since he was very good in many phases of spiritual unfoldment, Then I thought . . . maybe he's lonely and just needed to see me. So I went to the front door and stood there in full view. For a long time he didn't move a muscle. When he did, he made a quarter turn, a half turn, then a turn in the military manner, returning to his original position, only this time he held his two hands together as though he were cradling something in them, with his head slightly bowed and his eyes looking upward. About that time I became real concerned as to his physical welfare, and I called out to him to ask if there were anything he wanted. But I received no answer or gesture in reply, so I called out again, and asked that he come across the street if I could help him in any way. I must have scared him off with that, for suddenly he turned to the north and walked away, looking back at me for as long as he was able until disappearing midst the bushes and the house next door. After that I didn't see anything further of him.

Being a Spiritualist by faith and religion, I knew my spirit friends were trying to tell me something by the knocks and the rings, as well as with the appearance of my boy, but I couldn't be sure of what it was. My thought was that possibly he had been in an accident and had returned to me in his etheric body, though it never entered my mind that he had passed on. In talking with a few friends who share my beliefs, they concurred with what my own appraisal of the phenomenon had been.

Then what should the 5:30 p.m. news-

cast bring but news of the Alaskan earthquake! It had been about 4 p.m., Minneapolis time, that I had seen my son clearly, though 1 had no inkling whatever where he was at that time. Immediately I thought he must have been in that quake, so I called a friend in this work, and she agreed with me. She suggested that if I did not receive any news of him within three days to submit his name to missing persons to see if they could locate him. However, there was no need to do this, for in the meantime my son telephoned, and as I wasn't home, talked to my daughter. He wanted to let us know that he was okay in case we worried about him. Where did he call from? Alaska, of course. He had not been in the area where the worst damage had been done, but he had been quite hadly shaken up. How long had he been there? Seven weeks right to the day from the time my warnings began and the quake occurred.

# BOUND TO THE EARTH

When I was a very small girl I had this dream . . . or was it a dream?

I was with Jesus, and we were standing on the ground a few feet apart. Then Jesus said to me: "I must go now." I asked Him if I could go with Him. He said, "If you can make it, come." He started upward, and I started too, but my feet became entangled in the telephone wires, and I watched Him until He was out of sight.

Through the years this vision has always been fresh in my mind. I wondered why I had been stopped from going with Him. Recently I was told in the inner ear . . . "Now-you see why you had to wait. The telephone wires are instruments of communication. Your feet were held for this purpose, and you have brought the Divine-Message to all the earth. Many have come to Jesus by your ministry and love. God has chosen you for this work, and now He says, Well done, faithful one, you shall soon rest from your labors."" I thank God for the privilege and blessing of serving in His work.

A PROBLEM THAT we hear a great deal about these days is the unreasonable psychic influence of one person over another.

We know definitely that psychic influence can exist, and we know also that in the vibratory life of man, this influence seemingly can be transferred from one person to another. We can send negative or destructive thoughts to each other, or be the recipient of negative or destructive thoughts of other people.

However, this situation has been greatly exaggerated in the public mind. The fact is that nature has given us, from the beginning, the instruments necessary to protect against such a situation. The moment man was individualized as a self-conscious being, nature had to provide the means for the preservation of self-consciousness. The moment the individual's destiny was placed in his own hands by the development of his own powers and faculties, nature had to assure that this power could be preserved and that the individual could not be subjectively deprived of this authority by deceit. Nature, therefore, does not offer any machinery by means of which one person can truly take over the life of anyone else. What appears to be this process, is usually a series of psychological circumstances, but these psychological circumstances also have their vibratory equivalents, because every psychological mood is itself a rate of vibration, and every psychological image, including a dream image, is also a vibratory entity; and every vibratory entity comes into existence around a core or center of conditioned energy.

Let us assume for a moment, then, that a situation arises in which it would seem that one person is attempting to control, dominate, or overwhelm another. Usually such domination has to originate in a comparative difference in the energy strength of two persons. The dominant individual seems to be more aggressive, more positive, more active in terms of vibration. The dominated person is more receptive, more negative, and more easily influenced. This in itself does not necessarily mean that domination is inevitable, but it means that the weaker person has poorer' fortifications with which to defend himself against attack. Actually, it does not require as much strength to defend a situation as to assail it. In other words, if you have a couple of hundred faithful soldiers inside the castle, you can hold it for a long time against an enemy of maybe ten, fifty, or a hundred thousand. It has been known to happen that a castle has been defended successfully against an opposing army of a hundred times its own strength, because the defender has every advantage of location and

is in the best position to protect his own goods. The assailant must always, to a measure, come out into the open, go across dangerous terrain, or find some way to breach the walls—all of this under the fire of the defender.

In a psychic situation you have the same condition in substance. It does not require as much strength to protect the person as it does to assail him. The real problem that arises is the same as in the military situation, as explained by von Klauswitz, and that is that if the opposing army can intimidate the defender, this is one way to destroy him. Therefore, the opposing army may send a messenger to state its strength and say that it is not possible for the defender to defeat it, and hope in this way to avoid the entire conflict and take the city. This is a common occurrence in thinking also, taking the form, in mental or psychic malpractice, that some individual claiming to be able to practice it issues his ultimatum and starts to terrify negative people. The moment we become afraid of anything, our defenses begin to crumble. Almost immediately our vibratory energy is reduced. Fear causes that which we fear to come upon us. Therefore, the first thing we have to do if we want to impose on someone else is to frighten that person; and the most common way we can get into trouble is to allow ourselves to become frightened.

In psychic problems, there is always a fear factor due to the unknown. It has not occurred to us that the unknown is actually one name for God. We always tend to associate it with mystery or terror. Actually, we are living in a universe of immutable laws, whether we know them or not, and the unknown is just as lawful as the known; but we have to believe this; and somebody else has to shatter our belief in order to hurt us. So the person who thinks that he might be in danger of psychic malpractice of some kind must have certain attitudes. First, he must believe that this malpractice is possible. Second, he must believe that the particular adversary at the moment is capable of doing it. These are not the same thing, by the way. And the *ibird* important point is that this belief must weaken the individual to the degree that he is no longer able to orient his own thinking and emotions. If he is no longer able to have faith in those values which are real, he opens himself to this influence.

When a person opens himself to this influence, what really happens? Nature does not normally permit this condition that we commonly call psychic malpractice, and in my own experience, this problem has nearly always summed itself up in a very simple pattern. The individual who would

like to be so strong and dominating as to work malpractice on another, is most likely incapable of anything but a bad idea. Instead of being a black magician who can raise spirits at the crossroads at midnight, he is just a foolish little individual who has read two or three books on black magic and is out to conquer the universe. In almost every instance, the so-called evil agent is pitifully ignorant and weak himself. He is very stupid or he would not want to do it in the first place. Having started from a wrong premise, actually he has very little energy with which to vitalize his project. This, however, may not be known to the victim. The victim, seeing this image of terror rising before him, immediately begins to abdicate leadership over his own life. In a little while, imagination steps in and endows the sorcerer with every power conceivable, until the victim actually bewitches himself. He creates an image of his adversary within his own consciousness, endows this adversary with every attribute of Svengali and Dracula, and proceeds to be frightened out of his wits. He then sets up a whole series of psychic processes within his own nature, resulting in the appearance of all kinds of apparently phenomenal conditions. He has visions and dréams. He feels presences. He is continually disturbed and annoyed, and is quite convinced that the other person is a great success at plaguing him.

Such persecution is possible only because it consists of a subjective domination by a pattern set up within the victim, a subconscious situation in which the victim has gradually built up a negative controlling factor. It is the exact reverse of what might be termed the development of religious insight. Whereas religious insight continually builds up a constructive or idealistic pattern to life, the so-called blackmagic attitude is forever building up a negative pattern, gradually creating a personification or embodiment of evil within the subconscious of the person. This, once reaching a certain degree, becomes a psychologically obsessing situation, and it is almost impossible to tell this person that he is not the victim of somebody elseespecially if he has evidence that the other person wants to do it. The combination is almost beyond calculation.

It is also quite possible that the psychic pattern of an individual may reach us sub-

consciously, that this individual's thoughts or feelings may gradually and slowly work into us, but this operation in itself is not too serious or too important unless we have nothing with whicle to meet the invasion. If the individual has a reasonably strong character, if he knows what he believes and his thoughts are clear, the pressures of other people around him may reach but will not markedly alter him. He will immediately draw upon his own resources to counteract the situation. In other words, he has his own psychic self-defenses by means . of which he is immune to practically any negative or evil force that can reach him.

In various fields of psychotherapy, there are persons whose energy fields have been so carefully and really remarkably trained that these people can do extensive and valuable healing work. They can voluntarily release certain parts of their own energy fields to help others in trouble temporarily. This field of therapy should not. however, be regarded as hypnotic. There is no hypnotic factor actually. It is simply the possibility of a psychic transfusion-much in the same way that we may have a physical transfusion of blood-but this transfusion is not permanent. It can only assist the individual by sharing energy. We also have a tendency, unconsciously or subconsciously, to share energy with those whom we love and respect, or with causes for which we have great enthusiasm. We can unite energies in various ways, and such a union of energy is behind the idea of public prayer. We know that Mesmer, working with the healing problem, would have groups of persons form chains and unite their energies to help someone ill.

These types of energy exchanges do exist and can have constructive value, but for the most part, the individual's energy field is up to himself to take care of. It is up to him to protect it in every possible way, realizing that it is his protection not only against physical problems, but also against the invasion of the mass mind, which to us today is particularly important. We have a highly disturbed world-a world of people whose thoughts are of varying degrees of intensity, but who, in desperation, find tremendous intensification of their psychic energies. This desperation is not true strength; it is a kind of strange toxic pressure. In a world in which maybe two or three billion persons are greatly disturbed at one time, where the securities and values of life become undermined more rapidly than we are able to build defenses within ourselves, it is true that sometimes the individual is very close to drowning in a common sea of negative energy.

Nature tells us that this is not necessary. Like most of the results of laziness, indifference, or carelessness, it is simply one of the more common symptoms of things. The individual today must therefore realize that unless his energies move from himself to form a circle or aura around him, he will find a constant inflowing of pressures from situations around him. He must either be strong as a unit within a situation, or the situation will likely seem to drown him. It will not actually do so, but he will pass through all the discomforts and misfortunes of feeling that this is occurring. So it is very important, wherever world disturbances or world pressures exist, for the individual to preserve and maintain, so far as is possible, the source of his own psychic strength. It is necessary for him to do what has always been done in this area

namely, to confront all negation with a positive value. Unless he does so, he cannot defend himself adequately. He will be demoralized, and the more he is demoralized, the more he will be receptive to common trouble. He becomes a participant in a general negation, and the more he permits his own nature to become negative, the more fearful he becomes, the more disgruntled and anxious he becomes, and the more likely he is to impair his own energy fields.

If we want to stay as well as possible, we have to preserve the vibratory integrity of our own lives, and we must do this in the same way, perhaps, that we keep a good television set in order. If it gives us trouble, we have to do something about it. If a tube burns out, we have to put in a new one, and we have to make sure that it tunes in properly, that the images are clear, and that we are getting the program that was intended. If we do not like the program, we also have the glorious privilege of turning it off-ā privilege that we do not exercise as generously as we should. This is also true of ourselves. If we find ourselves getting into a mood, if outside pressures seem to be moving into us in an unfortunate or dangerous way, if it looks as though we are headed directly into trouble, we always have the glorious possibility of turning the situation off. It is not inevitable that any individual has to be demoralized by the fears of others. It is not inevitable that we have to expect the worst because someone else does. It is not inevitable that we have to sit around and more or less terrify ourselves by a constant negative approach to world affairs, to news, to local conditions, or to the delinquencies of our politicians.

A problem involving psychic energy does arise when fatigue enters in. Wherever this symptom of the inability to meet situations and circumstances arises, the individual may be frustrated rather than exhausted. He may be locked within a pattern that is not giving him opportunity for psychic integration. Every one of these energy problems finally reveals that nature is in a benevolent conspiracy to provide us with all the energy necessary for what we need to do, what we should do, and what will contribute to our proper growth; but finding us doing things that are not good -failing to make decisions that should be made, failing to correct situations that must be corrected-nature then seems to withdraw energy and create a fatigue syndrome. The individual becomes tired. He loses the dynamic desire to do the thing that he should not do. If he has no other outlets, he is blocked. If, however, he transforms his own patterns of life, even to a small degree, calling upon new energy resources, he is often greatly surprised at the benevolent results that follow.

Above all other psychic factors, we must realize that the individual is created as a complete energy unit. For various reasons, things can happen to this energy unit, just as the body can be afflicted by accidents, but nature itself is exceedingly watchful and careful and does everything possible to restore damage if it is at all possible. Nature, however, does demand that this energy field be used properly. It demands that the individual shall live in accordance with the laws governing the constructive expression of energy. If he will do this, nature will support him to the very last, and probably extend his life more than might otherwise be expected.

In every case we have to realize that clear, constructive, creative thinking, thinking in terms of solving rather than excusing, thinking which in itself injures no one, thinking that is free from vengeance or hate or any negative implication—this type of thinking is the greatest protector of mental energy. It prevents the individual from gradually losing control of his mental faculties. It prevents the appearance of violent and destructive prejudices.

If the individual will truly follow the principles of right character—if he will keep his philosophy, his faith, and his ideals clear—one of the inevitable results is the abundance of the magnetic field in his own personality. If he is at peace with himself, if he is in a sympathetic under-

# How Can the Power of Sound Affect You?

THERE ARE MANY laws in life that man does not understand. If he did understand, he would not do many of the things that he now does.

Have you not noticed how you react to sound, or sound affects you? If you study the process of physiological events taking place when you hear, it is no less complicated than that occurring when you see. It is most interesting to trace how sound waves in the air become converted into the vibrations of the eardrums, then into movements of levers in the middleear, then into waves of fluid in the inner ear, and finally into neural impulses in the phonoreceptor elements from which the neural impulses reach the brain.

From all this you will see that it is vibrations that play the important role, and everytime you speak you set in motion these vibrations which we call sound. These sounds are picked up as symbols for words, and in this manner we are able to communicate with one another.

In a way it would be true to say that we feel, as well as hear, sounds. If you are listening to someone speaking in a foreign language, you can be affected by the sound of the voice even if you do not understand a word they are saying. So it is not only the spoken word that can hurt or delight us, but all sounds. Take, for example, a dog barking at night, or perhaps when you are feeling particularly sensitive. Doesn't the noise seem as if it is actually hurting you? In fact you may even say, "I will go mad in a minute if that dog does not stop." If you had extra-sensory perception and could see these vibrations you would find that the 'yap, yap' of a high-pitched bark actually forms in the atmosphere as it shoots forth well defined sharp-pointed projectiles which strike with a severe shock upon the fine astral (feeling) bodies of those in their neighborhood. This is the reason for the extreme nervous irritation which this constantly repeated sound often produces in sensitive persons.

It is the sharp-edged sounds that seem to affect us the most, because we do not react so strongly to the more rounded

sounds, such as the deep bay of the bloodhound which throws off beads like ostricheggs or footballs. These being slower in motion are far less calculated to injure. A flock of sheep frequently surrounds itself with a many-pointed yet amorphous cloud of sound which is by no means unlike the dust-cloud which it raises as it moves along. The cooing of a pair of doves throws off a constant succession of graceful curve-like forms which resemble the letter 'S' reversed.

Some people may wonder what we mean when we talk about the astral or feeling bodies. Perhaps you can see by the analogy of what the scientists today call the "Van Allen' radiation belt that surrounds the earth, and how atomic explosions cause holes to be torn in it. We have a similar radiation belt, or zone, around us. Some call it the human aura, and in a like manner indentations can be made in it too. Fortunately this aura is made of fluid-like etheric substance and can restore the shattered parts, without permanent damage, but every act of restoration depletes us of some of our vital life force. Bombardments of sound that come from other people and objects really affect our radiation belt, particularly if they are harsh, sharp or heavy, and many people are suffering from this nervous depletion without being aware of it.

The tones of the human voice also produce their results—results which often endure long after the sounds which made them have died away. An angry ejaculation throws itself forth like a scarlet spear, and many a woman surrounds herself with an intricate network of hard, brown-gray metallic lines by the stream of silly meaningless chatter which she ceaselessly babbles forth. Such a network permits the passage of the vibration only at its own low level; it is an almost perfect barrier against the impact of any of the higher and more beautiful thoughts and feelings.

Another instructive comparison is that

between the forms produced by different kinds of laughter. The happy laughter of a child bubbles forth in rosy curves, making a sort of scalloped balloon shape of mirth. The ceaseless guffaw of the emptyminded causes an explosive effect in an irregular mass. The sneering laugh throws out a shapeless projectile of dull red color usually flecked with brownish-green and bristling with thorny-looking points. The constantly repeated loud laughter of the self-conscious ones creates a very unpleasant result, surrounding them with what in appearance and color resembles the surface of a pool of boiling water. The nervous giggles of a school girl often involve her in an unpleasant seaweed-like tangle of lines of brown and dull yellow; while the jolly-hearted, kindly laugh of genuine amusement usually billows out in rounded domes of gold and green.

It must not be forgotten, however, that there is the more beautiful side to sound also, as we all know who love to listen to music. Let me quote now from a brilliant clairvoyant, the late C. W. Leadbeater, whom I had the pleasure of meeting when I was a girl.

"Let us take, for example, the hidden side of the playing of a voluntary upon a church organ. This has its effect in the physical world upon those of the worshippers who have an ear for music-who have educated themselves to understand it, have no technical knowledge of the subject, yet are conscious of a very decided effect which it produces upon them. The clairvoyant student is in no way surprised at this, for he sees that each piece of music, as it is performed upon the organ, builds up gradually an enormous edifice in the etheric, astral and mental matter, extending away above the organ and far through the roof of the church like a kind of cattelated mountain range, all composed of glorious flash-colors, coruscating and blazing in a most marvelous manner, like the Aurora Borealis in the Arctic regions. The nature of this differs very much in the case of the

Question: Although I have lived formany years and have read all kinds of explanations about the "hereafter," I still quake with fear whenever I think of what may happen to me in years to come. Can this fear be eliminated?

Answer: No one knows how many years of mortal life he will go through, although he usually hopes that they will be many. Some persons believe that they can expect to live for threescore years and ten, because the Bible says that is man's span of life. Others work diligently in controlling body habits, hoping to extend their years beyond one hundred. Some believe it is possible to refine flesh cells until the cells become spiritual, undying substance, and thereby live as long as they desire. Some metaphysical students believe that it is possible for the mortal to "put on immortality" through eliminating human desires; others believe that man, created by God as an eternal, immortal being with an eternal, immortal, spiritual body, can live in any place of life he desires, being superior to earth, air, fire, and water.

Many persons have written books expressing their personal opinions about life hereafter. Many religions have come into being on earth, purporting to teach what should or should not be done to have a life of harmony and peace here or hereafter.

Jesus Christ instructed His hearers about life in the invisible realm, as well as the necessity of each person's learning more of Truth while living in a body of flesh here in this world.

"Flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God." This is a statement that often is ignored and seldom explained by metaphysical teachers.

Each person who is sincerely interested in having revealed to him the truth about life and death can learn from the Spirit within himself what is true if he will follow Hosea's instructions to Israel: "Take with you words, and return unto Jehovah."

As a favorite Truth writer, Zelia M. Walters, has put it: "Of one thing we feel

**F AT IS NATURE'S** protective blanket against heat and cold, since one of its components will not freeze at 32° and others will not decompose at 107°, the critical temperature of fever in the body.

Too much fat, called obesity, therefore, may indicate a desire for too much coddling in one form or another; while abnormal leaness may represent undue independence of any form of wise protection. To overlook these mental proclivities and place all one's faith in physical diet is merely to subject oneself to dieting for the rest of his days, since the underlying mental habits continue to add bodily bulk or to subtract it.

Nowadays the problem usually is how to keep fat down rather than to add more to the body. Fat is unformed, resulting frequently from lazy thought, which does not analyze, plan or prepare systematically. Excess fat is a burden to the body, frequently representing the carrying of unnecessary mental burdens of worry and anxiety, or applying unnecessary seriousness to simple situations. Conscientious persons are more likely to have problems of obesity than those who dodge responsibility and yet are not actually lazy in temperament. In the former case a slight meal may increase body weight, while in the latter a banquet every day will have little effect, unless the fear of getting fat takes over. Setting a standard of weight for certain heights is puerile, since the beauty of form, outline and color of the body depends not on poundage, but on spiritual thinking.

# Treatment

Obesity is not part of the law of God, nor can the material concept of the body weigh heavily with Him. The body or temple as it is known by Him, is sightly

and beautiful because that is true of all His creations. To put my body on the scales and weigh it is only to measure the pull of the earth's attractions upon my consciousness; in other words, the degree to which I am attracted toward matter and away from Spirit, God. The earthward gravitation of the senses is what I need to watch, rather than my diet, since God's sense of gravity draws me more and more to Him. It is written: "The body is more than a mere furnace to be fed proper fuel."

I intend to watch fatty thinking, sloth, laziness, self-indulgence and overconscientiousness as much as I do fatty foods. I can manifest physical beauty and proportion, knowing that both of these come from the Divine Principle, Love. As I put down unlovely traits of disposition I shall get rid of unlovely fat in my body. And that I intend to do - to fast from indulgence in false beliefs and desires, rather than merely to fast by avoiding certain foods.

God's sense of fat must be good; therefore, I can manifest just the right degree of it to externalize the beautiful form, outline, color and grace of my body. I shall eventually evidence the fact that as God's child I am not carrying unnecessary burdens, mentally or physically.

ance, or the psychic faculty is one that exists within each one of us. In practically all cases, however, it is lying dormant because it has never been used. The successful psychic is a person who tells only what he sees. Nothing more. The natural tendency is, especially in the beginning, for a person with this ability to elaborate or to be carried away, even to the point where what he sees becomes meaningless. If he can refrain from overdramatizing, or being overcolorful, the person receiving the message will understand the message carried in the impression.

• Is it necessary for a medium to be in a darkened room for physical phenomena to unfold? Is it necessary to have a circle of three people or more?

It is necessary, especially at the beginning of one's unfoldment, to have at least three to sit if it is desired to produce physical phenomena, such as the moving of physical objects, rapping, or the levitation of a trumpet. The question was asked, is it necessary to be in total darkness. This is preferred by the entities of the astral world, since light dissipates their energy and they have to build it up. Since they have to draw from the vibrations of the sitters, this concentrated energy must be utilized to the fullest extent in producing sound, or in activating the voice box, or in doing whatever they are supposed to do for the occasion. If there is any light leaking into the room, the Spirits often will seal it off themselves for the reason that it dissipates their energy. Yes, it is necessary to begin one's mediumship in total darkness.

However, after one is full-fledged, so to speak, it is possible for levitation of the trumpet to be done in subdued light, or even in bright sunlight. Materialization, however, requires a red light, which is usually controlled by the Spirits themselves, who may lower it or make it brighter. Red seems to help keep the ectoplasm together, so that they may have more power.

different composers. An overture by Wagner always makes a magnificent whole with splendid splashes of vivid colors, as though he builds with a mountain of flame of stones; one of Bach's figures builds up a mighty ordered form, bold yet precise, rug. ged but symmetrical, with parallel rivulets of silver or gold or ruby running through it, marking the successive appearances of motif; one of Mendelssohn's Lioder Ohne Worto makes a lovely airy crection, a sort of castle of filigree work in frosted silver. (C. W. Leadbeater, *The Hidden Side of Things*, Page 197, S4.15 from Chimes.)

Now let us see what support we have for all this in our world today. Our medical leaders are saying that the noise of the large cities is having detrimental effects on people. Doctors tell many patients that they must be quiet. You see they have empirical knowledge of the effects of noise on the nervous system; they may not know how or why, but at least they see the results. It is the metaphysician or occultist that desires to go beyond this and find the true reason.

It often makes me wonder how the shop assistants can put up with the constant repetition of the Christmas music, especially when they are so busy. Of course, like everything else, it all depends on the sensitiveness of the person concerned. I guess many of the girls become immune to it, in which case it would have no effect on them. Then, too, some music is stimulating; I believe in factories there is greater output when music is tuned on while they work. We all know how an army, tired and exhausted, can march that extra mile while the band is playing. Not only does the regular beat of the undulations tend to strengthen the astral bodies of the soldiers, thus training them to move more strongly and in unison, but the very forms which are created themselves radiate strength and courage and martial ardor, so that a body of men, which before seemed hopelessly disorganized by fatigue, may in this way be pulled together again and endowed with a considerable accession of strength.

So you see how important sound or noise is in our life. Like so many other things it can be used to build up and beautify, or it can break down and destroy. Surely it is up to each one of us to watch what we say, how we laugh, and see that we are using constructively this wonderful power. If you know how to live in solitude and silence for a few hours each day, you will know what it is to be relaxed and happy.

standing with life, if he is simply and naturally growing and unfolding his proper potentials, the vibratory field of his body is in a very happy condition. It is functioning according to its own laws, and it will not permit itself to be damaged from anything on the outside because it has not been weakened by anything on the inside. To be able to realize this and apply it to life, gives us a new reason to be religious and philosophical people. We realize that among the rewards of good thinking and right living are some that are immediate. Our ancestors used to believe that their conduct in this world bore only upon their state after death; that if they were good, pious people, they would pass from this veil of tears immediately into a heavenly rest. All rewards were to come afterwards. It did not seem to appeal to anybody that anything very good could happen to us in this world. Actually, the rewards of spiritual integrity are not reserved for an after-death state. The individual who is right begins to have the rewards immediately. He experiences them in a better relation with life, in new degrees of friendship, new elements of appreciation in his own affairs. He experiences a greater security, freedom from fear and the pressures and anxieties of his own negative life. Whatever happens to him, for woe or weal, he is able to carry it with greater personal dignity immediately. He senses values and he lives according to them, and the rewards, of course, are a very positive state of psychic self-defense.

The beginning and end of the whole problem is that constructive vibration preserves life, and will continue to preserve life unless man himself, by some action, injures this vibratory rate. If he takes the energy in himself and wastes it or destroys it or pollutes it in some way, then it cannot protect him; but if he guards it and defends it and lives according to a code of right and truth, he has very little to fear either in this world or in the world to come.
