The Parable of the Sower and the Seed



"But blessed are your eyes, for they see; and your ears. for they bear."

T ODAY, IF A SPEAKER wishes to make a point clear, he will illustrate his meaning by telling a story; in fact, it is said that "illustrations are the windows of a discourse." The greatest of all great storytellers was Jesus, and His parables are still considered as beautiful examples of the art of storytelling.

A favorite with me is the Parable of the Sower and the Seed.

Jesus was again by the Sea of Gallilee where He loved to sit and talk with His Disciples and others, perhaps this is why He is often referred to as "The Man of Gallilee." We are told in the 13th Chapter of the Gospel according to Matthew, that great multitudes came to listen to Him. Although later in the Chapter Jesus gives a general interpretation, it seems to me that verses three to eight inclusive, have a hidden message to Spiritualists, for many of us do not follow the admonition given us in verse nine: "He who hath ears to hear, let him hear."

When we study the Bible deeply, we cannot help but compare the philosophy that Jesus taught with the philosophy that is taught in our Spiritualist churches and classes today. There is much similarity. To use this parable, so many times we are disappointed when someone to whom we have introduced the philosophy which has so satisfied us, shows one of the following reactions: Let us compare these reactions with the Parable Jesus told.

First: Our friend pays little or no attention, or listens to us with an amused smile. Could this be what Jesus meant when He said in Verse 4: "And when he sowed, some seeds fell by the wayside, and the fowls came and devoured them up."

Second: Perhaps our friend became very enthusiastic, button-holing everyone he meets to talk about his experiences.

ANY OF THE GREAT MYSTICS agree with the poet Browning who writes of the Imprisoned Splendor which is hidden within every one of us. He says, "There is an inmost center of us all, where truth abides in fullness."

Very often we find great souls agreeing in essence with the conclusions of others, though each will use his own words to express the same truth. For example, how beautifully Evelyn Underhill expresses it when she says, "There are in His universe no fences between the natural and supernatural worlds," and "there is no level on which the mystic experience is not possible." In other words, we can express here and now something of the wonders of our own God Self while living on this earth plane.

In his informative and thought provoking book, which he called "The Imprisoned Splendour," Raynor C. Johnson has some interesting ideas on this subject. He says, "All men think they are free. At the lowest level of self-development man is completely slave, but does not know it. At the highest level of his self-development when he becomes sage and saint, then only is he completely free and knows it. Most men are found between these two extremes, and according to the use made by the surface self of the little area of freedom it possesses, it achieves more." Many books have been written to show how this surface self or conscious mind can be trained in such a way that one can experience more freedom. They teach the use of right ideas as one way to obtain this freedom. However helpful such a course may be, one reaches the point where further light is needed on such a boundless subject.

The words "highest" or "lowest," when used with reference to self-development, signify different degrees of consciousness or different aspects of the one Perfect God Consciousness. As God IS all encompassing LOVE, when one focuses his attention on the infinite Love of God, one does not try to think certain right thoughts, or depend upon them to heal a situation, for true thoughts will spring spontaneously from the heart as the result of an awareness of God's ever present Love. To depend solely upon God as the Source of all right ideas, one begins to express his own divinity.

World events show that former President Kennedy was used as an instrument of God's Love, to sound a warning to the world that future progress for mankind can never be built upon hate of one nation for another. It has helped many individuals realize they must eliminate hate from

their own thinking and acting. It has brought about a change in the thinking of many people, and there is an increased interest in healing being manifest in different churches. Remarkable healings are now taking place, and we see what some call miracles happening every day because of the consecrated efforts of those who have purified their minds and bodies to such an extent they have become good instruments for Divine Love to manifest through them.

When Peter and John were threatened by the scribes because of their preaching and healing in the name of Jesus Christ, their fervent prayer was that they might speak the word in all boldness, and stretch forth their hands in healing of the sick. When they prayed, the place was shaken where they assembled, and after that many signs and wonders were wrought by the hands of the disciples. Although the high priests had them put in prison, it could not hold them, for the Angel of the Lord came in the night and set them free, and they continued preaching in the temple. Even as prison bars could not hold the disciples, because their inner spirit was one with the Father, no human beliefs can ever hold or limit anyone who refuses to be bound by them. Sickness being the result of man-made theories which have increased with the passage of time, it takes the very Spirit of God to allay the fear and despair which darkens the lives of so many people.

It is heartening to see how healing is finding its place in more churches today. In all healing it is necessary to bring the mind into a sense of unity with God. Jesus accomplished this through the spoken word and the laying on of hands. In the case of the man sick of palsy He spoke the word, and the man was healed. When two blind men came to Him for healing, He touched their eyes, knowing their faith, and they were healed. The Master taught that we are not to judge according to appearances, but judge righteous judgment. Jesus saw man not as a physical identity, but as a spiritual being, and His clear realization of the divine nature of man healed the sick. He was not deceived by appearances, for He knew they were the effects of mortal thinking and race concepts. His Love was so great it transcended the Law of Cause and Effect. Samuel said, "The Lord seeth not as man seeth, for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart."

The Imprisoned Splendor, or the glory of God, which the poet writes about has been released to some extent in many hearts and minds where a better understanding of their own divine nature has prepared them as instruments for the Christ. Writing in The Astrological Magazine of India, Douglas Hunt quotes a European writer, Eberhard Maria Koerner, on what she has to say about "pseudo-prophets and the subconscious lust for self-destruction which induces a certain type of predictor always to foretell the worst, however often he proves wrong." Every year a certain number of 'leading statesmen' depart this life, a certain number of planes crash and ships sink, there is always an earthquake or flood somewhere, famine or pestilence . . . with moralists, preachers, writers, and even educators fulminating about the wickedness and degeneracy of the present generation-indeed, any generation younger than they are. So did their parents, their grandparents, ad infinitum. These people do the world no good, says Mr. Hunt, for the world can very well see for itself what is rotten . . . it loves to do this. He believes, as we do, that every American esotericist, every occulist, every truth student and metaphysician should make the popular American song, "Accentuate the Positive," their theme song, seeking out and blazoning abroad the many divinely beautiful actions which human beings perform every day. We should forget the evil, for by concentrating on it we do but give it strength. (Amen to that!) There are plenty who will rub our noses in it, claims the author, and it is only the few who can be wise enough to accentuate the positive, watering with their praises and attention the seeds of human goodness, that will leave it to others to pluck the motes from the eyes of their neighbors.

GROWING CROPS WITH MUSIC

"During the past few years Professor T. C. N. Singh of India has found that broadcasting certain types of music daily to growing crops actually increases growth, and an electric bell can so excite seeds that they spring up rapidly," so reports the new English magazine, Light Within. They report that Indian agriculturalists have tested these theories upon paddies finding the yield up to seventy-five per cent higher. Also mentioned is Professor Haas and his wife who, in underwater tests, found fish respond to music amazingly, even presenting a film with the outstanding spectacle of a school of fish solemnly and rhythmically circling in pairs round a radio set playing "The Blue Danube" waltz. It is easy to understand from these findings how music can be used to heal the sick.

LONG AHEAD OF HIS TIME

Francis Bacon (1561-1626), intellectual English genius and ancestor of psychical research, in his posthumous book, Sylva Sylvarum, reports the International Journal



of Parapsychology, anticipated the work of present-day psychic research societies and groups and presented several proposals himself for psychical research. He was particularly interested in healing by imagination, noting that not only diseases, but emotions, such as fear, are "infective." He was skeptical about witchcraft and ghosts, but kept an open mind about paranormal phenomena in these words: "We have set it down as a law to ourselves to examine things to the bottom, and not to receive upon credit, or reject upon improbabilities, until there has passed a due examination." This side of Bacon's genius long went unheeded, but time has shown how right he was in many of his disclosures.

SOUL MATES DEFINED

Through the channel, Zelrun, received inspirationally from St. Germain, The Voice of Universarius attempts to clear up some of the misunderstanding that exists about soul mates. A soul mate may be either masculine or feminine, or of the same gender, not necessarily a man and woman brought together in marriage, or close association, working together in perfect harmony. This just may be good karma these individuals have earned, having been brought together to fulfill a specific mission on earth. Soul mates do not necessarily dwell on the same plane, we are told, for one may be in the etheric and one on earth. One may have met one's soul mate here, or may not do so for many lifetimes hereafter, then perhaps both will go on to other planes. Some may never meet their soul mate on earth, for he or she already may have gone on to other planes. Some are living with their soul mates now and do not know it. Two women may be soul mates, or two men may be also. There being a strong heart-bond between soul mates, it is most reasurring for one to know the identity or whereabouts of the other.

HOW WELL DO YOU "TASTE"?

Writing in the Monthly Seich-No-le of Japan, Dr. Masaharu Taniguchi tells us that "those who are always aware of the beauty of heaven and earth are living in a heavenly paradise. One who sees the beauty in a single weed growing in the yard, or in the voice of a small insect, or in a white cloud floating by, is truly rich. One who has more money than he can spend, and without knowing how to use his money, only wishes to increase its sum, is nothing but a collector. One must not become like an ant and only store things," he admonishes. "To truly receive a thing is to 'taste' that thing. No matter how much a person may possess, if he does not know how to 'taste' his possessions, he cannot truly receive them, so it must be said that he is a poor man. Although one's monetary wealth may be meager, if he is able to fully 'taste' (or experience) the goodness, dignity, and beauty in all things, he is already a *rich* man."

PHILOSOPHERS WILL BE KINGS

Writing in The Voice Universal of England, Marjorie Cooke Artus tells us that "we are approaching the time when 'philosophers will be kings,' when not only the intellectual leaders, but the wise men of each nation, the kingly of spirit, selflessly dedicated to world service in every field of life, will meet together to ensure the wellbeing of the human family." Quoting the Master Djwhal Khul in various Alice A. Bailey books, we find that he has used the phrase scientific brotherhood. He tells us that an attitude of comparatively vague good will is not enough . . . that we have, instead, deliberately to invoke into our daily consciousness and (still more important) into our daily activities, a mental attitude of spiritual will-to-good and positive "harmlessness" towards all with whom we have relations. How well we know now that unless we develop the art and science of right human relationships in word and deed . . . we shall perish.

CHRISTIAN EXORCISM ARRIVES?

William Standish Reed, M.D., in his column, "Family Doctor," for Christian Life magazine, replies to a letter from some bewildered parents asking advice about their daughter whom they have learned has become involved in a homosexual relationship while away at college. In attempting to explain the bizarre mores of our times, two of his statements strike quite a familiar, though perhaps quite different interpretative, ring of truth: "The only answer to this problem is a true conversion or born-again experience," he says ... and further that "serious consideration should be given to the Christian ministry of exorcism," which he follows with the Biblican quotation of Mark 16:17. Shades of Dr. Carl Wickland and his wife, Anna, and their long years of working on the spiritual planes with obsession cases described in "Thirty Years Among the Dead!" Are we finally beginning to see all illness as having a spiritual solution . . . first healing the spiritual body?

Spiritual Healing in

S PIRITUAL HEALING is generally associated with a religious conviction which is not necessarily that of the Christian doctrine.

All kinds of mythical and invented stories have accompanied religious doctrine down the ages. Many of these have taken the form of a fabulous statement or narrative conveying an important truth. Many have been symbolical in so far as they have been a sign or representation of something moral or intellectual by the images or properties of natural things. Shintoism, which is the national religion of Japan, and means, "The Way of the Gods," has been no exception to these "holy myths." It is necessary to see the origin, rather than to reject the inherited myth.

Some time ago a correspondent in Japan sent me a very small plastic hammer, which contained in the head a miniature brass molding of Buddha. It is a symbol of spiritual healing. I have no means of knowing why this small symbol contained the image of Buddha because the "hammer" is essentially of Shinto origin. Centuries ago a pious Shinto priest tramped through the country carrying a small hammer with which he "tapped the diseased parts" of "the many ailing human bodies he encountered." Invariably they were healed. We can reject immediately the hammer as an instrument of healing, but records show that this priest was, indeed, a healer, and there is little doubt that the cause of his healing success was his innermost intercession to Spirit.

Another healing ceremony of Shinto origin which is still practised is that of "driving out the devil" or "evil spirits" with the use of a heating contraption in which rice is boiled. Illness which is considered to be the work of evil spirits is claimed to be removed in consequence of this ceremony, which is conducted with in Jadan



deep religious conviction.

Here again we are confronted with a symbolic ceremony, which must of necessity have an origin associated with after life and the realm of Spirit. There is a recital of prayer associated with the ceremony, and from which we can draw the conclusion that some form of intercession is made. If this intercession is not made to living people, it must be made to the dead. Therein lies the similarity between all forms of spiritual healing.

Japan is still a nation of Shintoists. European Christians have expended enormous sums of money in their endeavor to spread Christianity, but the majority of those who have been baptized Christians abandon this faith when they are freed from the care of their "missionary benefactors." The influence of materialistic and anti-religious ideas from the West have left the people of Japan in the main, with a feeling that they cannot improve upon the spiritual ways of their ancestors.

From the times of the hammer and the rice boiling container, healing has made progress in Japan on lines similar to those universally accepted and embodied in the basic principles of the English National Federation of Spiritual Healers. Healing is a gift of Spirit, and that is the basic principle of healing officially accepted by the Japan Psychic Science Association, with Mr. Shoichi Yoshida as the President, and Professor Shoju Itaya of the Tokyo Institute of Technology as its General Secretary.

The "Psychic Study Group" is a part of the Association and undertakes the responsibility for healing development and the publication of works of a spiritual character. It has recently published in two parts, "A Guide to Spiritual Healing Development" by an English writer. The principal healer of the Association is Mrs. Yoshida, wife of the President, but I know of many others who have developed their spiritual gift sufficiently to obtain outstanding healing successes.

One of the earliest Shinto conceptions of death still lingers, amongst a very large majority of their ninety million population, and it is that death is considered a great misfortune. It was a practice amongst the ancients to arrange special festivals to console the spirits of those who had "left their physical body." For several days the family would engage in dancing, song and feasting, and when the body finally was buried, it was with a hope that it would not return to haunt its former home. We can readily realize why spirit manifestations were misunderstood.

Another relic of the ancient myths, for which no definite origin has been found, is the firm belief that if you die in pain, the pain will remain with your spirit for all eternity. It is an appalling thought, and I have devoted many hours of correspondence with the slender hope of discrediting this worthless theory. This ideological battle is being fought strenuously by the Japan Association, and there is some indication that their efforts are meeting with a degree of success.

My long list of healing successes by Japanese healers includes practically every known ill condition. Cases can be quoted of the restoration of sight, dispersal of growths, freedom from pain, and the unlocking of joints. One Japanese nurse who had some doubts concerning her own medical qualifications, and, believing in the greater power of Spirit, turned her attention to spiritual healing. She was astonished at her Amazing success with this newfound therapy. "I now believe in the power of spirit," she informed me.

A group of healers in the City of Kyoto are worthy of consideration, and my informant is most emphatic in assuring me that they are being helped by the spirit of a Japanese doctor "long gone from this planet." Amongst this group is Tomasiro Nakao. "On the guidance we have received from England." states Tomasiro, "we are now giving spiritual healing every day in this part of the world."

Another oustanding success was that of Yoshino Sekine of Tokyo, who, in January 1962, gave healing to a patient suffering from cerebral hemorrhage of a complicated character. The patient recovered so promptly that Yoshino himself was astounded. Four healers about two hundred miles from Tokyo have successfully given treatment to cases which were medically incurable. Their home healing Sanctuary receives about thirty patients each week, and under the able leadership of Shiro Kanaya, this number is gradually increasing.

During August 1961, the only national broadcasting system took up the subject of spiritual healing as a theme in their program. Mrs. Keiko Hayashi had demonstrated an almost miraculous cure from a serious disease. In this program she was able to relate her experiences to millions of listeners, and her own doctor expressed his amazement at her complete recovery.

Once again we are able to demonstrate the universality of spiritual healing. We are able to show that the gift of healing is not the prerogative of any particular religion or nation of people. We have exemplified the fact that the power to heal is latent within us, and that our friends in Spirit are always ready to help when attunement with them has been achieved. The myths and fables of the past and present cannot prevent the flow of healing power when the dynamic force of love takes possession of a human soul.

N BEGINNING THIS column this month I feel something like the college professor who prefaces his discussion of seventeenth century ecclesiastical architecture with a comment that the campus library will not be open from four to five because it is being painted, and that basketball practice will take place as scheduled in the east gym. I am going to begin Margie's words with a repeat of a previous request. Please write us. We want your questions. However, those pertaining to your own personal affairs, or what is going to happen to you in the near future, we cannot answer. For one reason, California law forbids what could be considered "fortune-telling," and some would consider this such. For another, there is not possibly time for us to deal with individual questions about personal affairs, much as we would like to do so. Margie reiterates that there is no such thing as time or spacewhich is true. But we in this physical world are bound by bonds of time and space, and we must abide by the rules they impose, whether we like it or not.

By coincidence, the first question Margie answers for us deals with this very subject of time. It deals with the very puzzling aspect of prophecies made by Spirit lecturers, some of which seem to come true exactly as they are supposed to do, others seeming not to happen at all, thus leaving an apparent impression of inconsistency. This has puzzled many. However, as Spirit guides are fond of repeating, there is an explanation for all things.

• There is much evidence of thing's happening on earth that have been prophesied by Spirit. They happened a year or more later than it was thought they were going to happen. Why is this?

Very often this is the case. Time is very difficult. We do not go by time or its equivalent in Spirit—we couldn't possibly —for we are far removed from the earth plane and can travel anywhere in the twinkling of an eye; therefore, time is overcome in the ethereal world. We have to come and go by vibration. So when a vision is seen by a Spirit, he will approximate the time he believes it is going to happen. It is very difficult, however, to give the exact time in the overall picture by prophecy. It has been done by Agasha, (a master teacher who speaks through Reverend Zenor) many times, and it has been done by others; and the times were almost "pinpointed." However, often the happening will be found to be months later than it had been foretold.

We don't go by the clock. We don't go by the sun. You people do, but we are vibrating at a higher rate of speed than you are in our ethereal world.

Another question often asked is:

• If I travel, for example, to England, would it be possible for me to talk to my loved ones with whom I converse here in Los Angeles by an English medium?

Yes ... It is possible for you to contact your loved ones, whether here or in England. It is possible for you to contact your Uncle Joe here, and, if the conditions are right, it is possible for you to contact Uncle Joe in England.

• Do you have automobiles in the astralworld, or do you have other mechanical means of transportation there?

No . . . There is no necessity for any artificial means of transportation, as we travel by the projection of the body. This is soon learned. We are going at a higher rate of speed than you on earth, therefore automobiles are unnecessary. From one given point on the astral plane to another is the same distance as here on earth, provided you were to walk it. This you would do if it were not a great distance. You would walk at about the same rate, roughly, as here on earth, and it would take you about the same time to reach a point as it would here on carth. In the astral we can, if we wish, glide or project from one place to another; therefore, it is as though space does not exist.

With reference to the automobile, and with reference to other mechanical devices, there are those who are constantly developing them. They do send back impressions and messages to inventors on the earth plane, telling them how to invent or what to complete. As far as using them on the astral plane, no, we do not.

• What do you mean by a "haven?" Are there locations in the astral world that are like cities or villages? Are they lighted in the same way that cities are lighted here?

The question is: "What is a haven?" A haven is a common word used to indicate a particular location created by a collective group, people of like mind and of the same caliber who live there. If one asks: "Do we have communities in the astr.il world?" We certainly do have communities. Communities that are created the groups of those who have the same thoughts and emotions and desires. So an astral region can be pointed out as having been created and possessed by those who inhabit it, and who are of a certain degree of consciousness in relation to the overall picture of humanity.

There certainly are dwelling places, and beautiful surroundings and countryside. There is no commercial activity in the sense that you see on earth, no tall buildings, and no groups of skyscrapers or industrial areas. It is more like a series of residential areas where everyone lives in surroundings that are to their own liking.

You must consider that when it comes to living conditions, the Eskimo feels more at home in an atmosphere that, to us, would seem almost unbearably cold. Likewise, the South Sea Islander would desire a tropical atmosphere. The Indian wants to sojourn in what he knows as the "Happy Hunting Grounds." In other words, the ideal varies from race to race; each seeks the climate and surroundings that most suits him.

With reference to what lights a community, light is there; but we do not de-(Concluded on Page 24)

GYPSIES AT WORK

ONE SELDOM HEARS of gypsies anymore, but they still carry on their strange, nomadic ways in many parts of the world. The name "gypsy" is still associated with fortune-telling, clairvoyance, psychic phenomena, prophecy and the "gypsy curse."

No doubt, some of the gypsies were fakes as fortune-tellers, but there is plenty of evidence that some gypsies had the rare ability to peer into the future. There is similar evidence that the "gypsy curse" was not to be taken lightly.

This is the strange story of such a curse. Was it the curse at work, was it prophecy — or both? Read and decide for yourself.

About 150 years ago, the churchyard in Odstock, a remote village in Wiltshire, England, was the scene of burial of a gypsy named Josiah Scamp. This would not have created more than passing interest if the deceased had not been a man of some notoriety.

He had been hanged for the crime of horse-stealing, although he was innocent. It was later discovered that he had taken the blame to shield his daughter's husband.

The gypsies gave him an elaborate funeral, and every year after that the anniversary of his death, they made a pilgrimage to the grave. This, in time, seems to have degenerated into a somewhat rowdy affair — the "pilgrims" having refreshed themselves at the nearby "pub" or tavern.

The rector of the church determined to put a stop to it, What he did was to call a parish meeting and authorized the church wardens to tidy up the grave, which meant uprooting a wild-rose tree which the gypsies had planted.

Unfortunately, the next anniversary of the death fell on a Sunday, and parson and congregation were assembling for the service when the gypsies arrived. When they saw the way in which their grave had been "tidied up," their rage knew no bounds.

They stormed into the church, smashing whatever they could and cutting the bell rope so that no bell could be rung for the service. Soon the gypsy queen arrived. Mounting the churchyard wall, and supported by her tribe, she pronounced her curses. Addressing the rector first, she informed him that he would not be preaching there at that time next year.

Then, wheeling around upon the churchwarden, who had been seen tidying up the grave, she shrieked: "I curse thee, Farmer Hodding, I curse thee. Bad luck shall attend thee from now on for two years ..."

Then, fixing the sexton with her wild eye, she continued: "I curse thee John Hackett, I curse thee. Afore I come again, thou shalt be in thy grave, and another shall tend it."

The church door, which had by now been locked to prevent further desecration, called forth more denunciation. "I lay a curse on this church door," she cried. "From this time on, whoever do lock it shall lie in his grave afore the passing of a year."

And so it came to pass. Trouble upon trouble visited Farmer Hodding. Anthrax destroyed his herd of cows, then his crops failed, his sons died, and finally he left the parish a ruined man.

The rector did not die, but he had a stroke within the year which deprived him of his speech.

The sexton was found dead by the roadside one day, victim of heart failure. Two half-gypsies, brothers named Batchelor, who had incurred the wrath of the gypsy queen by taking the rector's part and trying to restrain the mob, disappeared soon after and were never seen alive again. Their skeletons were later found.

Years passed, and the church door remained unlocked, for none dared to lock it. But, years later, when the door needed repairs, a young carpenter from another village was sent for. When the job was finished, the sexton warned him not to lock the door, but the young man thought it was a great joke.

"Here goes," he cried. "You'll see I won't die." But he did . . . before the year was out.

Later still, when the rector of Odstock was on a holiday, the substitute who was doing his duty learned that the church was never locked. "How is this?" he exclaimed. "This is most careless."

The sexton implored him not to lock the door, telling him of the gypsy curse.

"I never heard such rubbish in my life," the clergyman replied. "I'm responsible for the safekeeping of this church in your rector's absence and I shall certainly lock it." He did and he, too, died before the year was over.

Was the gypsy clairvoyant? Did she foresee these events and use her knowledge to her own purpose, or did she really have the power to curse? Who can say? The fact remains that she uttered the curses, and they came to pass.

It is good to know that the Odstock Curse will operate no more, for a recent rector put an end to it by throwing the key to the church in the river.

LESSONS FOR STUDENTS . . .

WHY IS IT SO , DIFFICULT TO COMMUNICATE?

Part I.

THE PROCESS OF COMMUNICATION is doubtless far more difficult and complicated than the average person believes, and is even more complicated than most Spiritualists believe. The reason consists partly in the fact that "good communicators" are comparatively rare, and that there is necessarily a peculiar psychical condition which enables them to communicate through mediums. In addition to this, a medium must be present at the time that an effort to communicate is being made, and in many cases the recipient of the message also must be reaching out to receive it before it can be given satisfactorily. In other words, the sender and receiver of the message must stretch out their "mental arms," so to speak, at the same moment before they can shake hands across the Great Gulf; if only one does so, the one on the other side is not reached.

WHAT AFFECTS COMMUNICATION

It has been pointed out frequently by scientific investigators that only after the reality of the facts has been proved does a detailed study begin. For example: Supposing that a spirit can write through an entranced medium, giving messages in automatic writing. The fact once admitted, scientific study of the case will only have begun, and such questions as these would then have to be answered: To what extent is the medium's spirit disconnected from the body while the communication is taking place? What is the degree of mental activity of the medium's spirit during communication? Does the communicating intelligence act directly on the brain and nervous centers of the medium, or in a more roundabout manner, and if the former, upon what brain centers does the intelligence act, and how?

If a communicator was in life a good visualizer or had a good memory, would these factors assist in facilitating the process of communication? and if so, how?

It is upon questions such as these that many psychical researchers have bent their energies for some time past. It is probable that several hundred years will have to elapse before these questions can be answered fully, and the facts explained in detail.

SPIRIT DIFFICULTIES

Let us enumerate some of the difficulties with which a communicating spirit probably has to contend in sending messages through mediums to the living. There is much evidence to show that the process of communication is a very difficult one, for, as soon as a spirit gets in contact with a medium and begins to transmit messages, he becomes more or less exhausted and suffocated, so to speak, by the dense aura or atmosphere with which he is called upon to come into contact. In many instances we read that spirits have to go away several times during the course of a seance to revive themselves, and afterwards return, refreshed and clear-brained to continue the communications. They experience great difficulty in holding their thoughts together connectedly during the process of communication. This does not mean that they are ordinarily in this confused state, but very often as soon as they come into contact with the medium's psychic atmosphere and magnetism, they become confused and their minds tend to wander as they would in delirium or a state of trance. It is because of this that many messages we receive commence well, but afterwards dwindle off into incoherence and triviality.

WHY SO MUCH TRIVIALITY?

This question of "triviality" is often misunderstood. The objection is raised that spirits, if they really communicate, would tell us something more important than they usually do. As a matter of fact, however, this is only true in a certain sense. The ordinary social conversation between "spirits in the flesh" is not as serious as it might be, and it has been shown by actual experiment that human beings, when called fipon to prove their own identity to another do deliberately choose trivial incidents by means of which to identify themselves.

Another point is that trivial incidents serve best to prove identity, as some great philosophical discourse might be given by any intelligence, either in or out of the body, and would prove nothing to one longing to hear from his own dear one. In such a case personal, detailed and trivial messages often are the most striking and most convincing. The very triviality of many messages received through mediums is, therefore, their strongest point, not their weakest.

In addition to this there are, as we know, innumerable books written by spirits containing philosophical, scientific and religious truths of great value and importance.

INFLUENCE OF THE MEDIUM

Another reason why communication doubtless is difficult is that the communicating spirit is unused to the bodily organism of the medium. All of us have certain mental and physical habits which we form, and it is easier for us to do certain things in certain ways after we have done them in that manner a few times. If you were suddenly transplanted into the body of another person (say one of the opposite sex), you would find great difficulty in manipulating that body so as to extract from it the best results-to think clearly and to speak and write clearly when expressing your thoughts. It is precisely this difficulty which the communicating intelligence experiences in trying to communicate with us through unfamiliar bodies. Many of the habits and "tricks" of the medium creep into the messages, which consequently are often more or less similar to the language employed by the medium. This proves only that the spirit has to employ the medium's mental and bodily habits as best it can during the process of communication, and that it is not as easy and concise as many. persons imagine.

SYMBOLISM NECESSARY

Another difficulty presented is that the conditions on the "other side" are doubtless so different from those which exist here that they have to be explained in roundabout or symbolic language. If you had to explain color to a blind man you would have great difficulty in doing so. If you had to explain the feelings experienced while giving psychometric tests to one who had never experienced them, you would also find considerable difficulty. Thus you can see that symbolism, and what would to us would be a vague language, often must be used on the other side of life to describe conditions which prevail therein.

When Will You Take The Bait?

People throughout the world who are anxious to unfold the deep knowing of the Eternal Self through the control and elucidation of the mind will want to know more about the "wheel of karma" that binds them to endless experiences of suffering.

HAVE YOU EVER GONE to an aquarium and observed the fish swimming along in their tank, back and forth, up and down, around and around, but quite content and happy in being fish, quite content with the world in which they find themselves? It is the same in the ocean, thousands, millions of fish swimming, unaware that there is any more to the universe than the water in which they swim. Many fish never even come to the surface to have a look around. Some fish never leave the murky depths of the ocean floor.

Doesn't this remind you of people? You can observe people in the same way, swimming around and around, alternately happy or unhappy with what they are doing, but rarely coming to the surface of their own selves to ask what it is all about. Very few of these swimming people ever stop to reflect upon what motivates their individual mind or body. Suppose that one of these fish spys what he thinks is a worm and bites upon it, only to discover it is a hook and line. He has connected himself up, through the process of an endless chain of causes and effects, with a fisherman upon the surface of the water. Then he begins to struggle, flip, flop, flip, flop. If the fisherman is lazy and the fish tenacious, he will flip flop at the end of the line underneath the water for a long time, but a determined fisherman will quickly bring the fish out of the water to the surface, where the fish suddenly finds there is something more besides his own watery environment.

GRASPING THE BAIT

We may call the water mind, or the ego; the ordinary comfortable circumstances with which man chooses to identify. The fisherman represents the soul or the superconscious mind of the fish. If the line is sturdy, if the will is strong, the fish comes quickly to the light on the surface, leaving the waters of ego behind. The bait is the fish's intuitive grasp of such scriptural truths as "God is within you; God is not mind; God is beyond the mind. Mind is form functioning in time. Mind creates. God is formless, timeless, causeless. Man is mind. God Is."

A person has only to hear these truths for a profound inner change to begin taking place. Even if he is paying little attention, an impression is made upon him. He is hooked to life's highest knowledge and goal. He may spend a long time flipping and flopping around, but he will never again be able to forget the statement that "God is within man." He may try to forget this notion, but the mere fact that he has heard it indicates he is evolved to the understanding and working out of it. Then he must consciously go through the stages of concentration, meditation, and contemplation to become what he is, to realize God, to fulfill the destiny of his evolution.

CAUSE AND EFFECT

The story of the fish is no accident. The worm and the hook are created by the fish's own swimming and searching and hunger. This is the law of karma, or cause and effect. Every action, every effect in the universe has been preceded by a specific cause. That cause is in itself an effect of prior causes. The law of karma is the law of cause and effect, or action and reaction.

Every action that man performs in life, every thought that he thinks has its reaction. He may or may not be conscious of the reactions to what he is doing or thinking. Many people spend a great deal of time acting only with the purpose of covering up the reactions to prior unsatisfactory actions of their own making. Were they to become enlightened and find the ability to live in their own intuitive, superconscious

mind, they would see in that expanded state of consciousness all of the ingredients that came together out of the past to create the conditions through which they are passing in the Now. This intuitive knowledge is not arrived at through analyzing, or through the ordinary processes of the lower states of mind. It simply presents itself as a picture of what it is.

THE LAW OF ATTRACTION

Thus the wheel of karma continues on and on and on, creating and recreating. The wheel of karma is simply the mechanism of the mind's action; your mindeveryone's mind. Through the study of the wheel of karma, of cause and effect, which is a meditative study, you realize that you have created everything that is happening or has happened to you. Everything that is coming your way in the future you will have created. Everything you will acquire, your own wants, will have been brought into being. You are right now a sum total of millions of thoughts, feelings, desires, and actions; all of them yours. Circumstance is not responsible for your condition, for you have made your circumstances, consciously or unconsciously. There are no outside forces imposing themselves upon you. Whatever you attract to yourself of the world which seems to be external, is but a manifestation of your own inner nature. You are the author of all of your creations, and yet in the inner recesses of your Being you are already the finished product at the same time.

Many people today are trying too hard to be someone or something which they are not. By turning their backs on what is natural to their own individuality they become copies or duplicate impressions of images that other people have imposed upon their minds. The present frenzied concern for popularity as a form of security covers up any form of individual expression, much less any spiritual expression that a person would otherwise have. Many people in a group are often little more



than surface copies of one another.

A WAY OUT

You may meet in your own subconscious, as soon as you sit down to practice meditation, all of the worldly desires latent within you, including several of which you perhaps have no conscious idea. If your meditation is successful, you will be able to throw out the unnecessary experiences or desires which are consuming your mind. When you do this, and you travel past the world of desire, you will begin to break the wheel of karma which binds you to the specific reaction which must follow every action. To break this wheel of karma, you must have a good hold on that fishhook; you must have a strong mind attuned and attached to it. Your only key to help you attain this one pointedness, this steadfastness, is your devotion to God, or your devotion to the Realization of Truth. Few people remain steadfast enough under all these circumstances and tests that life offers to realize the many causes and effects that are linked together in their lives. It is easy to study the law of karma and to appreciate it philosophically, but to realize it, to apply it to everything that happens to you, to understand the workings of it as the day goes by, requires an ability to which you must awaken.

RELEASE FROM BONDAGE

Attachment, desire, craving, fear of loss, these are the self-created ropes that hold man in bondage to his lower states of mind. It is because man chooses to live in the ignorance of unfulfilled craving and unsatisfied, desire that he suffers. How, many of you have suffered over something that was anticipated and may never have taken place? You will remember then waking up out of the dream of your suffering and finding that things were alright after all, and that through your experience sometbing within you remained the same.

Somewhere the idea was born that man should live in states of happiness and joy all of the time; but in the first place, happiness and joy depend upon unhappiness and sorrow even to be recognized or appreciated. If man would only know that whatever emotion transpires within him, its opposite is foreshadowed.

Secondly, suffering is a greater intensity, a higher vibration than happiness. You do not learn from your happiness; you learn from the states of suffering which awaken the higher consciousness of your soul. But suffering has no value for its own sake. When the mind recognizes it is suffering over something or other, it is time to practice meditation, to see into the causes; to expand your consciousness a little bit more so that you will grasp the workings of life and its karmic laws. Then you will attain to a greater intensity than either joy or suffering has to offer. You will view the wheel of life, of cause and effect, objectively. You will not so quickly identify yourself with the lower emotions or the objects of your own mind's creation.

Then there are the people who grasp on to the hook, who step on the spiritual path, but spend their time flip flopping in the water, tugging at the line, swimming first one way and then the other, never really approaching the surface. Why? They live in their ego, that's all. Their consciousness is limited. The ego is just a triffe dumb. Have you observed an egotistical person? He is just a little dumb, isn't he? Not aware of the layers and layers of wisdom within him.

TAKE CONTROL

It is the wise man who recognizes the importance of controlling the forces of his mind. His life is a struggle to make his philosophy real, to gain control of the cycles of experience which have impaled him on the wheel of karma. You don't escape the chain of cause and effect by sitting with your eyes closed, trying to keep awake. Diligent concentration, however, will definitely change you from the inside out. You will begin to realize more and more that you are the creator of your life and every aspect of it.

Your incarnation on this planet is not complete until you have exhausted the wheel of karma. It will not exhaust itself unless you gain control of it. The wheel of karma, of cause and effect, the world of form, is apparent only when you look at it. You only attain the natural state of your radiant Inner Being when you step off the wheel of karma. It is not natural for man to live bound to the lower states of mind, ignorant of the fact that God dwells within. But the hearing and understanding of this truth is only the first glimmer of the dawn, a preliminary awakening. The rest, the final realization is up to you. It is up to you and you alone to penetrate the veil of illusion and realize the Self, the Absolute, beyond desire, beyond the experiences of the mind. It is up to you to realize God.

MEDITATION

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N THE VICTORIAN ERA, religious teaching for children presented no problems to the teacher, but in many, many cases filled the small victims with terror. Today many parents go to the opposite extreme. They are so anxious not to teach anything which is untrue, anything about which they are not sure that they push the matter to one side and say, 'Oh, when he is older he can decide for himself.' Some parents are so anxious to give their children truth and reality that they will not tell them the story of Father Christmas, robbing them of some of the magic of childhood in their efforts to save them from later disillusion.

But magic and mystery is an essential part of early childhood. It is during this period that the foundations of all spiritual understanding are laid. If parents or guardians of young children miss this opportunity, it is difficult later to give them that mystical faith and understanding which is the basis of true religion.

In early childhood, the lower mind with its destructive doubts and criticisms is still dormant, and memories of the heavenly home, the 'Land of Light,' are still very close.

A FANTASY WORLD

A child naturally accepts the fact of an inner, or real world, peopled with angels, fairies, and loving friends, because the physical world is still rather shadowy and unreal. In fact, if he is not given positive, happy ideas the child will produce images of his own, some of which can be quite terrifying. For this reason it is wise to avoid fairy stories with frightening images of wolves, giants, ogres, and witches, until the reasoning mind is sufficiently developed to cope with them. The first ideas that should be given to tiny children are those of love and protection. Mommy and Daddy (or his guardians) are there to look after him, and even when they are not present, God always sends a guardian angel, such a beautiful person, with shining golden wings, to be in charge. This lovely angel can be seen, but only with the inside eyes, which see better when the outside eyes are closed.

GOD IN OUR AGE

Before writing this article I asked my

daughter, now nearly seventeen, if she found her early religious teaching satisfactory, and what she remembered about it. She replied that she remembered most clearly the shining angels and the fairies, who were very real to her. She also remembered having a most happy and comforting feeling about Jesus. The knowledge that God was everywhere and in everything, and not just a remote person above the bright blue sky had proved entirely satisfactory; whereas many of her friends had been confused by the idea of a personal God 'above the bright blue sky.' In these days of space travel they felt that such a conception was ridiculous. What then are the basic ideas that we must try to convey to our children while they are completely receptive and trusting?

1. The Ancient Wisdom teaches that man's truest sign and symbol of God is the Sun, which is the source of all life on the earth. Behind the physical Sun is a glorious, spiritual Being, a part of which is in every living thing. Let the children look at the Sun and love it; then explain that a little spark of the Sun is inside them; and is inside everyone. It is inside puppies, kittens, birds and flowers. This spark of God inside them helps them to grow, and teaches them what they should do. When they are kind, loving and obedient the little light within them grows bright and strong, and it makes them feel happy. When they are cross, unkind, and disobedient, the little light grows dim. Everybody has to try to make their inner light brighter and brighter until one day they become like Jesus.

2. Jesni is a most wonderful person, whom we call a Master. He has made his inner light so bright that it shines right through his body, and when we see him with our inside eyes he looks rather like the Sun. His light is much, much brighter than ours, because He has lived on earth many, many times, and learned how to use life fully. We can gradually grow like him if we try to live as he showed us when he lived in Palestine, the land where He was born. He came specially to teach people how they too could make their inside light so bright, that they could heal sick people, and feed those who are hungry, and make the spirits of the wind and waves be still at their command. Jesus loves all children, and because he is such a wonderful person he understands how to be in many places at once. As soon as we call to him he either comes himself, or sends a shining angel to give the help we need.

3. Of Fairies and Angels. It is possible to see Jesus, also fairies and angels, but only when we learn to use our 'inside eyes.' Everybody has 'inside eyes,' but they have to learn to use them, and it is usually easier to do this when the outside eyes are closed. We learn to use our 'inside eyes' by picturing things — imagining them — for in this way we build a little bridge, rather like a rainbow across which fairies and angels and people who live in 'The Land of Light' can come to us.

The fairies are the little spirits of the flowers, the grass, the trees-the spirits of nature. They are tiny creatures, full of fun, who love to play with small children. But as soon as the earths mind begins to grow strong they withdraw, and will only appear at times to those who love and understand them. As children grow older, if they are familiar with the idea of fairies and angels, they will be most interested in deeper teaching about the work of the angels and the different types of nature spirits, but when they are tiny they will easily accept the idea that the fairies and gnomes look after the flowers and plants; while angels, who are older fairies, look after people and animals. Simple acceptance of the existence and work of fairies and angels is as natural to little children as breathing, and if these ideas are conveyed in a loving and very practical way they will give a valuable foundation for future knowledge and faith.

4. Of Birth and Death. Often quite early in life children have to learn about the death of the physical body. This again should be taught in a practical loving way. Often the first introduction to death will be the sight of the dead body of an animal or insect, giving the parent or guardian the opportunity to say, "Look, this little bird has left its body behind and flown off into "The Land of Light.' It has finished its work on earth for the time being, and is now living happily until it is time to come back in a new body."

ACCEPTING LIFE AND DEATH

Let the children grow thoroughly accustomed to the realization that the physical body is only like a coat—a 'coat of flesh.' Teach them that when they go to sleep at night they leave their body on the bed with an angel watching over it, and they go into the 'Land of Light' or 'Summerland,' and

OVERCOMING THE PRE-NATAL INFLUENCE OF PARENTS

Here is a typical letter coming over my desk from someone I have never seen or known, living in a distant city:

"Dear Dr. Smith:

"Can you help me absently with my multifold problems? I have consulted many specialists with only brief and indifferent success.

"My hair is falling out almost by handfuls, which is very distressing to a young unmarried woman. I have had chronic stomach difficulties ever since I was thirteen or fourteen. There is a constant threat of aching although I seldom experience violent pain. I am almost stone deaf in one ear which makes my employment difficult.

"As a result of these conditions I find myself more and more withdrawing from society, living to myself as much as possible. Like the famous movie star, 'I vant to be alone.'

"Please write me if you can make heads or tails of these problems and, if possible, what might I do to help myself while you are working for me through absent treatment.

"(Signed) Mary Van Deventery"

. This was my reply:

"Dear Miss Van Deventery:

"Yes, I can help you, but do not expect instantaneous healing of any or all these conditions. It is plain that most of these ailments go back into the deep subconsciousness, requiring patient metaphysical effort to dig out the causes of each, and to proceed to their individual and collective destruction. However, you should begin to feel better and more encouraged from the time you receive this letter, since I always begin with fear, which is an element of

all disease tending to keep one in bondage to the pictures he makes of symptoms becoming aggravated and conditions getting worse.

"No better prescription for overcoming fear exists than the Bible pronouncement, 'There is no fear in Love.' Hence, if you have any enemies or unfriendly associates, try to love them, not as people, since even God cannot do that, but as His children, made in His image, whether they act the part or not. Remember that 'He is of purer eyes than to behold evil' hence He 'sends rain upon the just and upon the unjust.' You must be equally impersonal; 'Love your enemies.'

"There is a relationship between the conditions of falling hair and chronic stomach trouble. The key to the latter is its inception at the time of adolescence. Physical or mental manifestations occurring at the period of puberty almost always relate to prenatal conditions. The mental reactions of your mother during her pregnancy to conditions in her environment were passed on to you subconsciously, to pop out at the time when you yourself were capable of conception. Offhand, I would infer that your father did quite a little anticipatory 'bellyaching' about the expense and responsibility of another (?) child. This had a depressing effect upon your mother; the joy of motherhood lost its inspiration; and her sensitive nature wilted under the blame the husband placed upon her for becoming pregnant. Thousands of people suffer all kinds of difficulties throughout their entire lives because of being unwanted.

"To offset this subconscious influence, you must try to realize that God is omnipresent and therefore was governing all

situations connected with your advent into the world. He knew Himself as your Father-Mother and therefore knew no violation of this perfect relationship on the part of those selected to 'play the role' of His parenthood with respect to you. He was in charge of conception, fertilization, gestation and development. No prenatal influence other than His was present at any time in spite of human beliefs about it. Your subconsciousness was therefore not impregnated by your mother's state of mind, her environment or any law of heredity. Any appearance in your experience at adolescence of stomach weakness, falling hair (symbolic of the happiness of life disappearing because of economic or selfish influences), or difficulty in maintaining your position in society (because of being unwanted) has no divine authority to sustain itself in the face of these denials of a selfhood or power apart from God. You cannot, as His offspring, be self-depreciative because of hirsute difficulties or a tendency toward inferiority complex.

"The deafness and inclination to withdraw from association with people might go even farther back than this prenatal condition. Sometimes such withdrawal is the result of preincarnate experience, from unfulfilled desire in your previous existence to be free from the many demands made on you which kept 'your nose to the grindstone' of humdrum routine when you cried out for release to express your latent talents. It is even possible, according to Edgar Cayce, that you suicided from that plane to this, which he declared 'to be the precursor of isolation here.' The fact that you were required to 'turn a deaf ear' to your innate demand for freedom in your previous incarnation might be linked to your present tendency to disregard opportunities to cultivate friendships on this plane. This attitude of 'wanting to be alone' would naturally hinder you from seeking companionships or a marriage partner.

"To negate these assumptions, you will need to understand that pre-existence is merely like a grade in school from which one 'graduates' into our present state of consciousness. Humans are in the fourth grade of evolution just where they left the third, and will enter the fifth just where they leave the fourth. Like the child having to solve arithmetic problems in one grade because he did not do so in the preceding one, we have to work out here what we failed to work out in previous incarnations. However, development from one stage to another, considered spiritually, is subject to the fact that 'progress is the law of God.' Merely to recognize that we

cannot be handicapped by failure or procrastination in previous incarnations is one way of overcoming any sense of futility regarding the situation. Such tendencies can be destroyed such as the abnormal inclination toward isolation, or deafness resulting from failure 'there' or here to 'listen to the still, small voice of God, our real Parent, constantly telling us we are subject only to His law. 'Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father in Heaven is perfect.' This understanding nullifies all laws associated with human birth, heredity, astrology, prenatalism, preincarnation or perpetuation of evil influences of any name or nature.

"In regard to anything that transpired in the past, remember that the Bible says one day is with the Lord as a thousand years'; hence time is unknown to Omnipresence. Try to realize that God knows neither past nor future, that 'Now is the accepted time; now is the day of salvation.' Deny any reality in preincarnation or prenatalism on the basis that 'Now are we the Sons of God.' This applies also to all those who may have contributed in any way to your difficulties, then or now. Take these problems, as you did in arithmetic, merely as examples whereby in the solving of them you become master of mathematical principles. Similarly, through the application of God's laws you gain a measure of that dominion which was His first gift to man.

"Try to make these explanations and declarations a part of your life, realizing that on them rests the assurance of the promise: 'Ye shall know the Truth, (both about your real self and the error to be overcome) and the Truth shall make you free.

pend on artificial lighting as you do on the earth plane. Nor do we have day and night in the true sense of the word. Light is supplied in a community in a very wonderful way. Darkness is only present, or gloominess exists, when the collective group thinks that way or carries on activity that results in darkness. The light depends upon the individuals, their development and their "brightness," their illumination. So if you ask if we have night and day, we do not, but we do have light, though we do not depend upon artificial light, since it is not necessary.

• W hat is a nightmare, and what causes it?

A nightmare can seem so real that oftentimes someone has mistaken it for an actual physical experience. It has nothing, however, to do with mischievous spirits or astral experiences. In fact, it is just what the name implies. A nightmare is the overlapping and the using of the subjective portion of the brain by the conscious or objective mind. Sometimes these subjective experiences are so startlingly real that they seem actual experiences. They occur when an individual is "on the threshold," and just before the objective or actual senses begin to give way in favor of the subjective during sleep.

It is at times like these that the dreamer sometimes thinks a mischievous spirit is shaking the bed, or tantalizing him, or otherwise appearing to him. This is not true. It is caused by over-activeness of the subjective portion of the brain. It has nothing to do with a spiritual experience in any way, although some people will swear up and down that it did.

It is an experience of this kind which has resulted in some people believing they have gone out into space in spacecraft and have come back. It is so realistic to them that they cannot be convinced that they had not actually done so.

(continued from page 20) have a lovely time with all the friends they knew before they were born again to do some more work on the earth. When the leaves fall in the Autumn, stress the fact that the spirit of the tree has gone inwards, has withdrawn into the 'Land of Light'--a place we cannot see with our outside eyes, but which is there nevertheless. As the children grow older they will learn scientific facts about vibrations of sound and light, which can only be picked up by instruments, and this will in no way conflict with their early teaching about the inner worlds which can only be seen when the instrument of their own body is tuned in to ultra-fine vibrations, when they have learned to use their 'inside eyes.'

Should they have to face the death of someone dear to them this teaching will help them greatly. Assure them that although invisible to the outside eyes, the person they love still loves them more than ever, and is very close to them. Explain that as soon as they fall asleep they are together in 'The Land of Light,' and that even when awake they can talk to each other through their thoughts. Assure them that the person in spirit will look after them and find all sorts of ways of helping them. When children are taught from the beginningato regard death in this practical way, the Veil between the outer and the inner world becomes very thin.

ANOTHER LIFE

When babies are born, either human or animal babies, the idea can be stressed that the new baby has come back from the inner world, or 'The Land of Light' to do some more work. It can be especially comforting to children mourning the loss of pets to tell them that it is guite likely that the little spirit they love will return to them before long in another body, after it has had a holiday in 'The Land of Light.' Love, whether it is for humans or animals, knows no separation. The love of a human being for an animal helps that little soul on the path of individualisation. What could be more natural than for the little soul to return again and again to the one who loves it, and for that mutual love to grow eternally, thus enriching the whole of life.

Growing knowledge of the wonderful plan behind evolution will fill the child with a sense of reverence and worship of the Great White Spirit—God—which is the basis of faith.

The Process of Dying



THE PHENOMENON of clairvoyants witnessing the release of the soul body from a dying person is well known. Signor Ernesto Bozzano, the famous Italian psychic researcher, referred to evidence from savage tribes and reproduced the following report by a missionary from the archipelago of Tahiti (Polynesia) nearly a century ago:

"Prophets were supposed to speak under the influence of departed spirits, and these were thought still to retain the human form. At death the soul was believed to be drawn out of the head, whence it was borne away to be slowly and gradually united to the god from whom it emanated. It had to pass through nine conditions in order to reach the tenth—everlasting rest.

"It is most interesting to know that the Tahitians had concluded that a substance, taking human form, issued from the head of the corpse, because among the privilleged few who have the blessed gift of clairvoyance, some affirm that, shortly after a human body ceases to breathe, a vapor arises from the head, hovering a little way above it, but attached by a vapory cord. The substance, it is said, gradually increases in bulk and assumes the form of the inert body. When this has become quite cold, the connecting cord disappears and the disentangled soul-form floats away as if borne by invisible carriers."

Bozzano comments: "Here we have a description which corresponds in the minutest particulars with those narrated by present-day clairvoyants. Having stated this, it does not seem logical or reasonable to attempt to explain such a startling agreement by referring to the hypothesis of 'coincidence.' On the other hand, since " the Tahitians cannot have drawn their beliefs from civilized peoples, and these cannot have drawn theirs from the Tahitians, it must perforce be recognized that from such comparison there emerges a strong presumption in support of the objectivity of this phenomenon observed by clairvoyants of all times and among all peoples.

"The phenomena of bilocation (leaving the body), in general, but especially those in which the consciousness is transferred to the phantasm (soul body), occur inmany graduations during states of weakening of vitality in individuals, such as physiological sleep and that induced by anesthetics, swooning, coma, the crises of convalescence, nervous exhaustion, or moral depression. They rarely occur in physiologically and physically normal conditions; in such cases they take place in circumstances of absolute bodily repose, more especially in the period that precedes or follows sleep.

"Psychologically speaking, the fact of feeling oneself existing personally, in the fullness of sentient and conscious faculties, outside the body and contemplating the body, is a fact worthy of profound meditation."
