O In a few days we will have in Mexico an important color film on Parapsychology showing the extraordinary work of the "Phenomenon of Brazil," or the "Arigo Case" (Jose Pedro de Freitas, nick named Jose Arigo), as it is now known in the scientific world.

This film lasts thirty minutes; up to now it has been exhibited all over Brazil and Argentina. It has been made available in this country by the Argentina Institute of Parapsychology. In Brazil it has been shown on television and spoken of in all the newspapers, radio, etc. The film shows the extraordinary surgical operations done by a man who can hardly write, Jose Arigo, who, controlled by the spirit of a discarnate German, Dr. Fritz, known to many important political people of Brazil, and such doctors as Dr. Andrija Puharich of the United States, to Catholic priests, and many outstanding intellectual persons. These operations were done with scissors and kitchen knives without using any anesthetics of antiseptics, using the right hand and the left hand equally well.

This film is solid proof of survival of the spirit, and can demolish the cold and critical looks of the most skeptical scientist or materialist. Moreover, at this time, the medium is in prison, accused of illegally practicing medicine, condemned for eighteen months, this being the second time he has been prosecuted. The first time he was pardoned by President Kubitschek of Brazil for having saved his daughter who had been given up by medical doctors. He has operated on about two million people.

We are writing to find out if you are interested in the possibilities of having this film shown on TV, or excerpts from it printed in scientific and/or cultural journals in your city. If discussions should arise in this connection, they would be attended by Brazilian writer and journalist, Sr. Jorge Rizzini, owner of the film who exhibits it personally.

I hope you will be able to join in making this matter known to the scientific world, and will appreciate your letting me know immediately so as to make up a program that would cover Mexico, Puerto Rico, the United States, etc. Yours sincerely.

With a cheery smile, and a wave of the hand


He has wandered off into an unknown land

ODAY WE HAVE a strange paradox existing in our world, especially in America where the basic concept of political government is to give its citizens more security than ever has been known in the history of any nation previous to these times.

We have security in so many various ways, yet people are turning to the path of God despite the fact that more comforts are given to the body, pleasures for the mind, and succor for the soul in such quantities that it sometimes overwhelms the individual.

It is this search for ever greater security that eventually turns one inwardly to seek the spiritual kingdom. Usually it is not the desire for perfection that starts the seeking, but the soul seeking its own in the world of Spirit from which it came originally.

Bilocation can be the way and means of understanding how anyone may find the procedures of reaching that security. Bilocation is exactly what the name implies: being in two places at the same time. Bi means two, and location means place—hence Bilocation. It is a study of the separation of the spirit from the body, also known by various other names, such as: exteriorization, projection, out-of-thebody experiences, spiritual traveling, and astral walking, to name a few. Some are able to Bilocate consciously at will, while others find themselves at varied times out-of-the-body without having consciously willed it.

Bilocation is the main key for unlocking the secrets of the spiritual

universe, although for many it does not give the same degree of satisfaction and confidence in seeking out the hidden mysteries of the Spirit. Much of the problem, however, lies in semantics - or the language used to describe it. Those who can travel into the far worlds beyond this plane are not able to give us an accounting of their experiences for the reason that spiritual semantics have not yet been developed to the point that we can understand what they are saying. It is like the Buddhist monks who speak to one another by signs because words are inadequate to describe their experiences of the wonders of God they beheld while outside-of-the-body.

Man's development in consciousness since ancient days had been somewhat slow up until the birth of Christ, then the pace quickened until the Renaissance, and after that the consciousness of man unfolded quickly. The nineteenth century saw the development of so many things for his higher consciousness that we have become dizzy with inventions and creations from our mental realm.

After a long study of spiritual wisdoms, I came up with the conclusion that the cardinal metaphysical systems could be placed in three simple, basic classifications: The Intellectual or Mind theory, the Cosmic Consciousness theory, and the Bilocation theory. The Intellectual or Mind theory is that which is built upon the principle that all is Mind, that the divine source of the Mind is God, that all begins here and ends here, and that we must be

prepared to receive all here and now, instead of having to wait for a life in the hereafter. The Chou dynasty of China was responsible for Mind development a few hundred years before Christ. A mentalism was brought into maturity then far in advance of later western thinkers. The Cosmic Conscious theory is that which is the basis of the Hindu religion and several other faiths in the Orient, and makes up the warp and fiber of East Indian life. The Hindu's religious mind is deep and complicated; he sees every problem as the whole and must work from the whole into its parts so that he can understand better that with which he The Vedas, source of the is faced. sacred scriptures for the Cosmic Conscious theory, are the first known records of religious writing, estimated to be at least ten thousand years old. Cosmic Consciousness is known to the westerner more simply as union with God, or Oneness. It gives one the realization that we live in a brotherhood with all peoples and all things here and beyond, and that God is with us everywhere. The Bilocation theory-also known under some of the names previously mentioned - has had quite a dubbing from the followers of the Mind theory and modern psychology, and those who are disciples of the Cosmic Consciousness theory have not received it with open arms. Despite these differences, the growth in the field of Bilocation has been rapid. Bilocation should not have any particular reason for being affiliated with the astral plane only, as many spiritual students are led to believe. It is actually a way of being able to travel freely through all spiritual planes up to the Ultimate, or to what we call God, certainly not be be localized in one particular plane for the sake of itself.


Those who are able to leave their bodies at will and travel through the heavenly worlds are called spiritual travelers. They are the explorers of those vast spiritual continents, far beyond the astral world, who have brought back records of what is be-

The sources, the substances, of these experiences are the same, of course. They arise from the infinite intelligence of God, but the many expressions of His ways are wonderful. Some subconscious perceptions come from other minds, some from a concrete "other" thing, or from events not of the present, those which have past or future reality. Commonly, these three forms are called: telepathy, clairvoyance, and pre or post-cog-These are artificial terms, nition. slightly arbitrary and misleading words, since the substance of these experiences is universal and all inclusive.

Man's biological limitations repudiate the Divine Mind, prevent spiritual solidarity, hamstring spontaneous expression. This pattern can be seen in the development of the child from infancy through the stages to becoming an adult. First the child is dependent upon the family constellation for security and reassurances. It needs the physical help and loving care of its elders. It trusts the superior knowledge and worldly - wiseness of its parents. As it grows, it sees itself as a separate and unique entity. The child becomes a person apart from them, dependent less on their supply of security and knowledge. The child asserts its freedom, and in doing so looks for new ways to find security and knowledge of the world. It replaces the lost security of the family with new love, a new attitude, and a new relationship with the vastness of its own world. While the child is undergoing this re-evaluation of itself and the world, finding its place in the sun, as it were, it is guided to some extent by an educated hunch or psychic intuition. However, it is dif-

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ficult for a child to understand this, and it is difficult to incorporate it into the ordinary conscious range of experience which has been learned from its elders as verifying reality.

Thus we strain to seek the freedom which Psychic Presence brings. We cause estrangement from the sources of reassurance and security formerly known to us. Before integration of the mind forces takes place, there is a clear death of the former self. It is an agonizing death, and the same aloneness that childhood maturation evidences comes again as freedom and the fear of that freedom - takes shape within. It is the casting out of the old relatedness to the world in favor of a new, wider, more frightening maturity—a larger selfhood, one without the old security. Freedom from the old meanings leaves the student temporarily in a vast wasteland of uncertainty and doubt, but this doubt about himself lays the cornerstone for new wisdom and selfunderstanding, new affirmation, happiness and growth. Insignificance and aloneness are overcome by the sheer penetration of inner knowledge. The former attempts to overcome the sense of powerlessness through the thirst for new excitement, thrills, manipulation of people and events through language no longer is meaningful, no longer has the force to satisfy our true hunger for meaning, freedom, and at-one-ment with God.

When we still the conscious demands of our minds and body, visualizing the continuing, flowing Psychic Presence within us, feel those: connections between the subconscious and the central mind powers, the wisdom of perfection becomes active within our lives. We are children of God's presence, we love His messengers of grace and love, we sense His intervention in our personal lives. We are protected, sustained, and blessed by the flame from the core of life, the principles of natural law and evolution. Many students attest to the sudden removal of discordant activity and conditions which give way to perfect balance and harmony with the Divine energy through the Psychic Presence mediator.



CAN ESP AND SCIENCE ...

AN HAS PUZZLED over and wondered about psychical phenomena for untold centuries. It has been only comparatively recently—within the last eighty years or so—that scientifically trained investigators have attempted systematically to study, analyze, classify, and validate the myriad forms of activity which seem to operate independently of space, time, and matter, and which therefore have been termed paranormal, supernatural, or psychical.

As a result of the efforts of numerous psychical researchers, great quantities of evidence have been amassed which point with telling authority to the reality of such phenomena as clairvoyance, precognition, psychokinesis, reincarnation, and discarnate entities or "spirits". This evidence may be found, examined, and critically evaluated in the innumerable pages of various parapsychological journals, and in the writings of such distinguished investigators as F.W.H. Myers, William James, J.B. Rhine, and J.G. Pratt.

If there is so much evidence on hand in favor of the psychic, why is it, one may justifiably ask, that the field of the paranormal enjoys, at best, a kind of nebulous and parasitic existence outside the realm of accepted scientific orthodoxy?

One of the chief factors militating against the acceptance of the psychic is the materialism of our age. In scientific circles this could be termed materialistic monism. This viewpoint does not allow for the existence of the supernatural. It simply cannot be, by definition, that there are phenomena which transcend the limitations imposed by the temporal, spatial, and material universe in which we live. Thus there can be no God, no soul, no life after death, no clairvoyance, MAY 1965 CHIMES

no mental telepathy—none of the things, in short, with which psychical researchers have been dealing (either directly or indirectly) for many decades.

However, even the most hardened skeptic will be "converted" if he is exposed to enough evidence in support of the psychic. Thus the attempt is made to avoid assiduously anything having to do with the paranormal, although, interestingly enough, the skeptic exhibits no apparent aversion to listening to or reading about the discrediting of parapsychology and psychical research.

Another reason why the orthodox scientist avoids evidence which is propsychic is resistance to change. To accept the conclusions which the field of the psychic forces upon one is to change one's value orientation 180 degrees. Many people are not ready for such a radical shifting of mental gears, least of all someone who is already committed to the materialistic viewpoint.

Even the most die-hard anti-psychic cannot be absolutely certain that, in point of fact, psychical phenomena are non-existent, for he is well aware that definite proof of the non-existence of the paranormal is a logical impossibility.

Subconsciously the skeptic knows there is a world of experience beyond the ordinary reach of our senses and this subconscious knowledge, for one reason or another, establishes a reaction formation which drives orthodox opinion to the extremes of skepticism.

The orthodox scientist has heard about the will to believe and therefore has determined within himself to believe, as it were, *nothing* he hears and only half of what he sees. By virtue of this position, it is little wonder that he does not accept the reality of phenomena which, under normal circumstances, he neither can see nor hear, neither smell nor taste, neither put under a microscope nor weigh on a scale. Psychical phenomena are not part of his psychological environment, and thus he tends to assume that they do not exist. They may not exist for him personally, but that they do not exist at all is quite another matter.

It is granted, of course, that any scientist worth his salt is, of necessity, to some degree skeptical. That is all well and good. When he is skeptical to the point of ignoring valid evidence, a change definitely is needed. Usually the orthodox scientist is seldom aware of his own personal biases and prejudices in the area of the He honestly believes the psychic. paranormal has been laid to rest along with such kindred phenomena as ghosts, witches, and hobgoblins. He is only dimly aware that psychical research is a flourishing, ongoing enterprise (although in relative isolation from the main stream of scientific research), and he is usually totally unaware of the fact that psychical research is continually dragging old skeletons out of closets, as well as resurrecting and revivifying theories which orthodox criticism has buried time and again, but which, like a jack-in-the-box, keep popping up afresh. This "unawareness" (one hesitates to use the word "ignorance") being the case, orthodox opinion rejects-in good conscience-the paranormal with the pious feeling that it has done another good turn for humanity.

NEW "EYELESS VISION" CASE

She believes it is with the right side of her nose that she "sees." One eye test she took baffled an oculist who prescribed glasses to correct her nearsightedness. She said she showed him she could read his entire chart, but only while masked.

"It is quite possible to use such physiological tools as electroencephalography (EEG) and the rapid eye movement (REM) technique in the search for data of psychological significance such as selective memory, or of parapsychological (ESP) significance, such as telepathic or even precognitive content," states Dr. Inge Strauch, scientific collaborator of the Institute for Psychology and Characterology of the University of Freiburg, Germany, in The Parapsychology Foundation News-letter. Dr. Strauch is an advocate of more dream research to advance telepathic studies.

Spiritual Healing in the Philippines

N THE PHILIPPINES there is an organization well known to Chimes readers...the Union Espiritista Cristiana de Filipinas, Inc., with more than half a million members in some four hundred centers. This group has become the coordinating force for the spiritual endeavors of all those in that part of the world who have developed the gifts of the Spirit.

Healing by union members takes many forms, including the laying on of hands, healing by prayer, absent healing (which they refer to as telepathic healing), and spirit surgery which is the main undertaking of Eleuterio Terte. Their youngest healer is Nellie Purganan, a student nurse in the University at Manila who has been responsible for thousands of cures. My friends in the Union, however, are very careful to refer to the fact repeatedly that "Spirit does the miraculous healing," and mention the name of healer involved only when it is necessary to do so for the purpose of the records. Even then, it is made clear that they are Divinely gifted, for Spirit, indeed, is the real preacher, healer, guide, protector and comforter. None of these Union spirit mediums, it is stressed, is used by what are termed familiar or elemental entities.

Bro. Guillermo E. Tolentino, Vice President of the Union who handles most of the correspondence for the healers, with whom I have corresponded frequently, has many carefully prepared records and photographs of these healings. In addition to his deep interest in the Union's spiritual activities, Bro. Tolentino is himself a great humanitarian, and is classed among the immortals in the field of sculpture.

Among some of the conditions he has recorded which have been healed are the extraction of tumors, gallbladder, bladder and kidney cures, elimination of appendicitis, stomach or intestinal ulcers, as well as cancer from varied parts of the body. Even decayed teeth literally have "dropped out" without pain or the shedding of blood after receiving Spirit healing.

"I have witnessed thousands of such healings since 1950," Bro. Tolentino wrote me, "and I know that there has never been a single casualty. A lady physician who submitted herself for healing of a diseased heart in the presence of a well known Judge stated that she was one hundred per cent safer than if she had been under treatment by her own profession."

Bro. Tolentino has many photographs of Spirit healings, including a colored photograph taken of the removal of a goiter which Harry Edwards, prominent English spiritual healer, described as the "Spirit dispersal of matter." These photographs, taken in the presence of trustworthy observers, are sufficient to confound the doubts of any skeptic. They are, however, merely a photographic registration of the healing wonders which are taking place daily in almost every part of the world. These healings, although not always performed in a manner so spectacular, are not confined to the Philippines, as I can quote similar cases from many countries.

A few years ago I attended a healing demonstration in Chatham, Kent, England. A nurse in attendance approached a local healer and said, "Can

anything be done with my wrist? It is locked with arthritis." "Yes," said the healer, as she took hold of the hand and moved it around without causing pain. The joint was unlocked in a matter of seconds, and the healer went her way without further comment.

Hundreds who have read of these Spirit healings in the United States in various psychic publications, as well as in various corners of the world, either have received healing by writing for assistance, traveled to the Philippines and received healing in person, and later even become members of the Union in order to assist with the work. Spiritual healing can take place in any country, with or without medical, church, or state sanction, in spite of opposition to it, and in spite of the efforts of science to "nail it down" as to how it takes place or label with a misnomer. Its wonderful mystery and frequency of occurrence continues to The Spirit of God moves increase. through His people universally, proclaiming to all that He is the healer and in no way limited in any of His works. Who can doubt the universality of such healing when so many are possessed of this Divine gift...one that no external power can take away, diminish, or alter in any way.



ANY HAVE sent in some splendid letters and have given Margie some very thought-provoking questions. Yet, by far, the great marjoity of questions are sent in by women. Why is this? Is it because women are more spiritually and psychically developed than men? Or is it just that most men's interests lie elsewhere? In any case, the young man who sent in a somewhat lengthy letter proposing this question deserves recognition since he has departed from the general tone of most questions we receive. To condense his discussion, he asks:

• Is it possible that psychics and scientists could cooperate in their work to the mutual benefit of both fields of endeavor?

On several occasions I have heard Margie discuss matters pertaining to this, so I would like to summarize her discussions on the subject as it would be extremely difficult to give direct quotations.


I believe every man who is interested in psychic phenomena dreams of a day when what is called "exact science" and what is called "occult science" will somehow walk hand in hand. This day has not yet come to pass, but there is evidence that it will. Notable, of course, is the work of Dr. J.B. Rhine on ESP(extrasensory perception). Every dabbler in the occult knows that extrasensory perception is an established and demonstrable fact. I, myself, can say safely that I have seen it demonstrated hundreds of times. "exact scientists" still are fighting a

vigorous rear-guard action. There are guarded rumors (I got my information from a very secret source) that some weather forecasters are using something resembling astrology to "tie down" their long-range forecasts. Cursed be he, however, who admits to, or even intimates, such a thing. Astrology, palmistry and prophecy are still strictly "taboo" and will remain so in respectable scientific circles for some time to come.

There is, however, a very practical way in which psychic tools can be used to facilitate scientific research. This is in the fields of history and archaeology, both subjects in which a great deal remains to be learned and, in which great gaps in the continuity of knowledge are observed constantly. This can be accomplished by the use of "psychometry." This is the faculty which has gained Peter Hurkos so much publicity, but which is possessed to a greater or lesser degree by many others as a natural faculty. . . not a natural gift, because, according to Margie, there is no such thing as a gift or talent. No one ever possesses what he has not earned and does not deserve. It is well known and frequently demonstrated that this ability does exist - the ability to take in one's hands an object, and, from its vibration tell a great deal about the wearer, the former owner, or the area where it was found.


It is perfectly possible for such psychics to cooperate with teams of archaeologists, and, by using their psychic faculties, identify and tell us what they can about disputed artifacts, and thereby add immensely to the knowledge to be gained from them. It does not follow that the scientist need surrender any of his capacity to back up his conclusions by recognized scientific methods, only that he be open minded enough to accept the fact that a trained psychic can give him valuable clues as to the background or origin of an object under study, and a willingness to consider seriously, eliminate or accept these clues on the basis of developed evidence.

This was demonstrated to me in a personal and unique manner. I had purchased two matched scarabs, but having traveled in Egypt and seen many genuine scarabs, I was not satisfied with these. There was no real reason to doubt their genuineness and, in fact, when I purchased them I was assured they were real. I handed them to Rev. Zenor, the intermediary through whom Margie speaks, one evening just before one of .our sessions. Rev. Zenor has highly developed psychic faculties, although he seldom displays them. He handled the questioned objects a few moments and gave me the answer. Yes, they had been made in Egypt (which gave them their authentic look). No, they were not made in ancient times as religious symbols, but very recently for reasons of sale to tourists (which accounted for their not looking quite "right"). He told me they were of alabaster, a stone plentiful in Egypt and soft enough to be worked easily (which accounted for their unusual appear-Most scarabs I had seen ance).

VISIONS IN THE SKY

UPPOSE YOU looked up into the sky and saw a city...or marching troops...or tropical islands... or a battle between Indians and early white settlers? Fantastic as it sounds, there are numerous such cases on record.

Charles Fort was a man interested in strange-but-true data, and he spent a lifetime collecting it—from newspapers, old records, museums, personal interviews, anywhere he could find it.

Fort told of strange objects which had fallen from the sky, of freak winds that lifted vessels into the air, of baffling lights, strange sightings on the moon. . . but nothing was more puzzling that the aerial mirages.

At about the turn of the century, many such sightings were reported. At Ashland, Ohio a large, unknown city appeared in the sky. By some persons it was supposed to be a mirage of Mansfield, thirty miles away. Others thought they recognized Sandusky, sixty miles away. "The more superstitious declared that it was a vision of the New Jerusalem."

A mirage appeared in the sky over Lewiston, Montana, and puzzled citizens witnessed "Indians and hunters alternately charging and retreating. The Indians were in superior numbers and captured the hunters. Then hunters were tied to the stakes as Indians piled faggots and set fire to them..."

Near Warasdin, Hungary, several divisions of infantry were sighted in the sky, led by a chief who waved a flaming sword. This apparition was seen by thousands for three consecutive nights.

Scotland also was the scene of a peculiar sighting when the sky suddenly turned dark at Quigley's Point and an opening appeared. The opening was reddish and in this area appeared a regiment of soldiers. . . Then followed an appearance that looked like war vessels under full sail.

Over Lake Orsa, Sweden, residents looked into the sky and saw representations of steamships and then "islands covered with vegetation."

A mirage of an entire city was seen for about an hour at Merexull, a Russian town on the Baltic Sea. Citizens recognized some of the buildings and identified the city as St. Petersburg, about two hundred miles from the Baltic.

Also during that period, people in Liverpool, England were startled to see a city in the sky. This mirage was said to have been the city of Edinburgh, Scotland. Fort said this "identification" might have been a product of suggestion—since, at the time, a panorama of Edinburgh was on exhibit in Liverpool.

An unknown aerial city was sighted for more than an hour by residents of Youghal, County Cork, Ireland. This mirage included mansions, surrounded by shrubbery and white palings, against a forest background. Previously a walled town had been seen at Youghal.

In the United States, simultaneously newspapers of three states. Delaware, Virginia and Maryland, reported strange figures were seen in the sky during September and October 1881. In Warrentown, Va., many persons said they saw white-robed figures in the sky at night. In Richmond, many thought they saw a vast number of armed, uniformed soldiers marching in the clouds. Then came a dispatch from Wilmington, Delaware, with citizens of that city willing to swear on the Bible they had seen platoons of angels marching and counter-marching in the sky, their white robes and helmets gleaming.

Undoubtedly there is a plausible explanation for such phenomena. We know it exists. . . but, as with a good many other psychic occurrences, we do not know yet how or why.

STUDYING THE AURA

(continued)

It is important to master the faculty of seeing the magnetic aura in the daylight, because more complete details thus can be obtained eventually than in the dark.

This is the only way to learn how to perceive the human aura.

For the purpose of trying one's vision in broad daylight, take a good horseshoe magnet and hold it perpendicularly in front of you - either against the background of an open outside light, such as can be obtained from looking out from the inside of a room through an open window, or against a near inside background. For instance, use a white or dark wall, according to the nature of the light. Then look at the edge of the magnet with one eye only and gradually approach it or slide it away from you, until you obtain the best focus of vision. Look steadily along the same point, until it dawns on you that a kind of a quivering, narrow band of mistor vapor is flowing from the metal and prevents your sight from freely perceiving the object back of it, producing, in fact, a sort of bending of your visual rays. As soon as you realize the presence on the edge of the magnet of this current of vaporous mist-which may be compared to the appearance of the heated air which arises in summertime from hot fields - the first psychic visual victory has been obtained, and the perception of the other phenomena connected with the aura will need only time, perseverance and practice. Once the magnet is conquered, one may expect to obtain speedily the sight of the beautiful and intricate currents on the human body.

THE STRUCTURE OF THE AURA

After the aura has been perceived, and its general layers distinguished, the student must turn his attention to its structure and color variations. If the structure or composition of the aura be studied carefully, it will be found that it is composed in a great variety of different ways, according to the object or person emitting it. Thus, the aura of flowers is very different to that of magnets or human beings.

THE AURA OF FLOWERS

It is a very interesting study to try to perceive psychically the composition of the aura of various flowers. For instance, that of the violet is about one-eighth of an inch in thickness, and is composed first of a bright light, then a line of dark blue, shading away into a very light blue, all these following the contour of the edge of the leaf. Above these lines is a scalloped or semi-linear string or border of two rows of little purplish-red figures, diamond shaped, very regularly distributed, so as to form two sets of fourteen little diamonds over the space of each small lobe of the leaf. Then, above these is a wave of dark blue mist in crescent form, shading off into light blue.

This is only a sample reading of one flower. Each flower has its own particular aura (some of them being very complex). It will serve to show the student how interesting a study this can be made. The study of the aura of plants alone, carefully undertaken, would occupy considerable time.

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

ever, is by no means entirely the fault of scientific orthodoxy. Psychical researchers themselves do not appear averse to proceeding outside the pale of accepted scientific circles. situation is similar to that which existed, until recently, between psychology and psychoanalysis. Analysts have contented themselves with building up a discipline almost totally independent of academic psychology. Yet the subject matter of the two disciplines overlaps in a great many areas. Today there are attempts on both sides to effect a reconciliation, to come to terms on many basic issues. However, such a reconciliation apparently is not being attempted between the field of the psychic and scientific orthodoxy. Psychical researchers seem quite willing to continue amassing evidence supporting the reality of the paranormal, to continue, some would maintain, proving the obvious. However, they do not seem nearly as willing to attempt to integrate parapsychology with other disciplines, especially with the fields which would benefit most from such an integration - namely, academic and clinical psychology, and psychiatry-areas where it is sorely needed.

The field of the psychic awaits "discovery" and acceptance into orthodox scientific circles. There is no question but that such discovery and acceptance one day will come about; the day it happens will surely be a great one. It is the writer's feeling that this can be brought about more readily if everyone concerned is aware of the forces working to oppose it. For, as it is with most marriages, when individual differences can be aired without emotional blindspots, greater understanding and tolerance of the other's individuality make reconciliation the natural outcome between two who finally realized their deep need for each other overcame all obstacles that stood between them.



OTWO GOOD EYES ARE BETTER

yond this physical plane so that man will have knowledge of what he will find when he passes beyond the veil of death.

The Bilocation system was initiated, or was first known in our records of spiritual travels, by Zoroaster, the Persian avatar, some few hundred years before the coming of Christ. There are scattered records of Bilocation experiences that go back for many centuries prior to the Persian mystics, however they are lost in the dim, misty past, and we cannot separate legend from truth in some reports. Most of the teachings of the magian mystics developed out of the tenets laid down by this Persian (Iranian) sage. They were the original magi, ancestors of the Sufi mystics, and it was from among these magi groups that the messengers came who went to see Jesus at the time of His birth. Where we find security and union in Cosmic Consciousness, we find individualization and freedom in Bilocation. What could be more free than being able to leave your body and travel to another plane, by choice, in those far heavens to study under some great spiritual master who left this or higher planes centuries ago? Bilocation can give you this freedom. If one has a spiritual traveler, or a guide, to take him on journeys into the other worlds, he is better equipped than trying to go it alone. Going alone may bring mistakes and suffering. You learn alright, just as in this life, but self-education is not easy until you get past the trial-and-error period.

To study the lives of saints in the various religious organizations of the world, past and present, will give one some idea of the number of successful techniques used to develop the ability to leave the body and explore the vast worlds beyond this earth plane. You may find also, as I did, that many writers, painters, and others in the arts practiced Bilocation. Jack London, L. Adam Beck, Harriet Beecher Stowe, Elizabeth Barrett Browning, Lord Byron, Shelley, Marie Corelli, George Du Maurier, and Balzac are among those too numerous to mention.

Being two places at one time is nothing new. It is just a question as to when the individual soul is READY to choose how fast it will travel in its eternal spiritual progression.

HERE BEING MANY methods whereby we of earth may communicate with the world of Spirit, I wonder if we have not overlooked one-well known—that of table levitation, for some that are possibly more dramatic, and more readily acceptable to public opinion and those who research and evaluate extrasensory phenomena not yet accounted for scientifically by natural law.

Actually my husband, who is 75, recently developed this gift while awaiting another he was seeking. It is easier for us to communicate by this means than it is to do so over the tele-It operates at once, in full sunlight or in electric light, anywhere.

Right after the devastating earthquake and tidal wave that hit Alaska and Crescent City, California in 1964, we thought we should try to find out if Eureka and nearby areas might also be affecting by flooding, and if so, when it would occur. The replies to our questions came as the front legs of the card table levitated, tapping the floor once for "yes" and twice for "no." What I saw clairvoyantly when viewing that region, with astonishing accuracy, confirmed the answers received from the table, although the flooding was not to come from the sea but from heavy rains and swollenrivers. The exact date, with time the fullest impact would be felt, as well as areas affected by the flood, were clearly revealed. I warned quite a few people I knew about this who lived near the rivers and on the bay. Some believed me, and some didn't. However, I did not try to make it public generally as I learned long ago the uselessness of doing so. After the flood occurred, a direct voice medium friend, formerly of Eureka, California who had moved to North Carolina, telephoned his parents to warn them of another disaster expected to hit California...an earthquake that would occur in the later part of July, 1965. My husband and I decided we should see whether this message would be confirmed via the media of our own psychic gifts, not only because of the accuracy of the flood forecast, but be-

A DAY TO REMEMBER

Ordinarily when a publication receives material the author admits having submitted to several others, it is not likely to be printed because of the chance that it will appear first somewhere else, or that simultaneously several will carry the same feature material.

If a prediction is pinned down to a specific time and day, either it could instill unreasoning fear and panic, or it could give people a chance to take reasonable precautions and prepare themselves to meet such a shock...physically, mentally, and spiritually. In numerous ways, having such advance information could—if events prove it to be correct-bless and help many, but it could also be a curse... depending on how it is utilized.

Jeane Dixon, known as the Washington, D.C. "Capital Secress" is quoted in Fate Magazine as saying that "in June or July of either 1965 or 1966 screaming headlines will report a major catastrophy on the West Coast," and that "in her crystal ball she saw the earth trembling and quantities of water" which she interprets to mean an earthquake with inundation.

We agree with Rev. Conrad. We hope her prediction is WRONG...as well as all others of this nature. Yet if Spirit can inspire and enlighten those on the Earth Plane, can it not also guide and protect us?

cause of other accurate forecasts received. Understand that I do not guarantee anything. All may regard the information I give herein any manner they wish. I have written to the Sheriff of my county—and received no answer from him—and had thought of writing to other Sheriffs along the West Coast. Some might believe me and be prepared it it happens, while others would just laugh at me. . . and I guess nobody likes that. The newspapers

probably would not print a prediction given out by means of a "filling table," or possibly any other psychic demonstration, and if they did, it would be mostly to ridicule. However, if I don't give it out, many lives may be lost, particularly along our beaches, that might otherwise be saved. So, I might help, but I might also be laughed at. It has been my experience that a good laugh doesn't hurt anyone, but I know that high waves hitting a crowded

beach or houses located near the ocean still occupied with unsuspecting individuals, could do a lot of harm.

But just in case we are right, withhold your judgment until after Wednesday, July 21, 1965, for on that day at 1 p.m. there is to be a severe earthquake, similar to the 1906 earthquake, that will center off the coast of Southern It will hit the hardest California. from Southern California to San Francisco, but will be felt from Mexico to Alaska along the coast. It will cause a severe tidal wave, similar to the one that hit Alaska, thus the "monitor" of the table recommended that people stay away from the ocean. It was also recommended that all breakable objects, such as glass pieces, mirrors, pictures, etc. be placed on the floor. There is no need for people to panic if they will just be careful. Those in buildings known to be unsafe should go elsewhere if possible for the day. Californians have lived through many earthquakes, so there is no cause to panic about one more. It may not happen on the day or at the hour given, but the flood did. Too much has been proven to have been completely accurate. If more people caught in the flood could have believed in the wonderful power of Spirit and the Angel world to intercede for good in their lives, many might have been spared that experience.

For many years now, in visions I have seen windstorms, unusual summer rains, and other damaging weather phenomena. 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



When the "Isles of Langerhans" in the pancreas fail to secrete enough natural insulin to burn up or absorb the sugar content of the food instead of being digested and assimilated, the sugar goes into the urine and eventually into the blood-stream.

Medically, the only expedient known to help is injection into the blood of additional insulin derived from other sources. This is recognized only as a means of keeping the patient going and alive, not as a cure. Younger people, in whom the ravages of diabetes are more marked, often develop it because of some great disappointment, such as having to give up a college education. Occasionally it is brought on by the death of a close friend or relative, a love affair gone on the rocks, family misfortune that changes the course of one's future life or career, even failure to get a "bid" from a college fraternity.

In diabetes insipidus, the pituitary gland seems to be involved through injury. Even in this case, however, it must be recognized that glands, metaphysically, relate to talents, individuality and potential prowess. Deprivation of opportunity to develop along these lines, rather than an actual happening, takes the sweetness from life.

the gate. The nonchalance of my fellow passengers inspired confidence. Still, it must be admitted, the question of how they would react in an emergency did present itself to me.

Once on the luxurious airliner, I settled back and struggled with visions of planes that had struck high tension wires, that had lost their landing gear, or that had dropped into the bay. Then it happened. The motors started and the propellers whirled, then stopped. It was announced that our flight was to be delayed until one motor could be replaced. My forebodings, it seemed, had some foundation. I'm sure, though, foundation or not, the same forebodings would have held sway.

After an interminable wait, our jet taxied to the runway, accelerated motion, then left the ground. This happened so gently that it was almost a surprise. One sudden lurch was a real tingler producer, however, but everyone else seemed complacent, so I relaxed again and reached for the literature provided for passengers. In it I found this lurch described as the moment when the engines cease operation and jet power is in control.

How so much tension could be contained within this small human frame is still a mystery. How was it possible to reach for the utensils during the meal and to handle the cup of liquid with hands that were almost palsied?

We were traveling along quite smoothly when, quite by accident, my glance turned toward the window. To my surprise I didn't have the anticipated dizziness. There we were, suspended in space between the clear blue above and the earth we had left but a short while ago. The real live map below showed squared off meadows, rivers and ribbons of roads crossing each other, disappearing behind clumps of trees and reappearing again. The jet was still climbing, and I didn't mind any more. Whisps of white floated by. Busy watching

then, I hadn't noticed the ground disappearing. In its place was a fluffy cotton wadding floor.

"Behold one edge of the universe," "How wonderful this I thought. glimpse of eternal beauty!" The fascination of it held me spellbound. Phoebus rode his chariot across the sky much as we were riding.

With an overwhelming desire to capture this moment, I reached for my notebook and the following poem flowed from my pen:

As I gaze from the stratosphere, No view of earth I see, But in its stead, a sea of air Where whispy clouds float free.

Cloud islands in the sky abound With sunshine everywhere. And on them live the queerest things I've e'er seen anywhere.

Some wigwams tower fathoms tall And kittens nine feet high But elephants are really small, While camels ride the sky.

When the poem was finished I realized what had happened to me. All fear was gone completely. I had been at the edge of the universe. In viewing my fears from such a vantage point - so close to the infinite - it made them seem very small indeed. I saw instead the awe-inspiring magnificence of God's world and where my true security lies.

ask me to do something for him, and that the following day Mr. B. would come before 2 o'clock.

I sat in meditation the next morning about thirty minutes thinking about her brother. At the end of that time, I saw him pass by on the street, then turn and come up the steps of my studio. He stood there a few minutes, looked up the steps, then walked back out. In a few minutes he turned in again, and this time came up the steps to the studio. His sister, amazed to see him, said, "What are you doing here?" He sat on the edge of the table, turning his hat around in his hands, and finally answered, "Well, I hardly know, but I had some trouble last night at the shop, and well, you've been telling me so much about Mr. Cayce, I just wondered if he couldn't help me out." His sister almost fainted.

The next day I took my seat in the same chair at eleven o'clock. The girl said, "I guess you can work it on Mr. B. if you worked it on my brother." I told her that I wouldn't be in when he came, because he disliked me so, and that he wouldn't know why he was there. Afterwards she told me that he came in about twelve-thirty, when I had gone out. When she asked if she could do anything-for him, he said, "No, I don't know what I'm doing here. I just came up," then walked out.

Now, to my mind, that is mental telepathy, mind power, but it is forcing yourself on someone else. It is dangerous business. It is one of those things none of us have the right to do, unless we are very sure of what we are doing. It might be well for us to control our children that way, but even that might be dangerous, for anyone who would force another to submit to his will is a tyrant. God does not force His will upon us. We either make our will one with His, or we are opposed to Him, but we have individual choice in the matter. Then if mental telepathy should not be used to force our own will on people, what part may it play

in our lives?

We might use our mind on other people so that they may do God's bidding, or we might try to influence them mentally just as we would in their presence so that they may know the light and the truth. Did you ever try to pray for somebody? Did you ever get down on your knees and pray to God for someone that their lives might be changed? That is using mind power properly, for the force which changes must be of the Divine source.

Any of you who want to control other individuals with the power of your mind can do it, but beware, for the very thing you would control in the other individual will be the thing that will destroy you. It will become your Frankenstein. Many of you who have studied something of the history of Atlantis know that these mental forces were highly developed there. Many individuals were able to think with such concentration that they brought material things into existence by the mere power of their thought. To use such a force as they did for selfish interests can result only in evil. The greatest sin in the world today is selfishness, and the domination of one individual will by another.

The force of mind still exists just as it did in ancient Atlantis. But what happened to the Atlanteans when they used that force selfishly? Destruction! We all have this mental ability; we all can train ourselves to use it so that we can force others to our will, but we have no moral right to do this. We have a right to tell people of our own personal experiences and let them decide for themselves, but we have no right to bend their wills to ours. If we can use the forces within us to minister to the creative forces and God, then we are using them correctly. But if we use them for our own selfish interests, we are abusing them.
