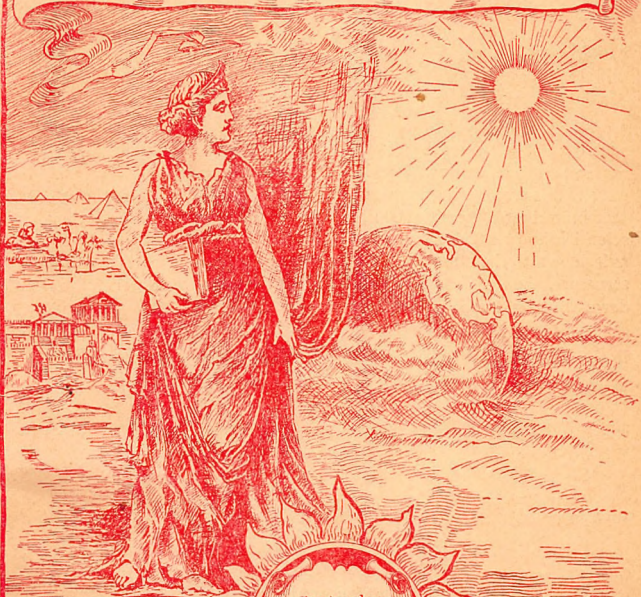

KNOWLEDGE OF THE TRUTH

DURING the many years of our work there has been an opening up before the people's minds of a fountain of truth that had been sealed. We read in the book of Revelation, in chapters v to viii, of a book that was sealed with seven seals; that the angel of the Lord opened one after the other of these seals, and that certain results followed the opening of each seal.

It is unquestionable that a book is a symbol of certain knowledges. According to the vision given to John on Patmos, and also according to Ezekiel's prophecies, the angel held in his hand a book and Ezekiel and John were told to take the book that was in the angel's hand and to "eat it up" (Ezek. iii 1-3; Rev. x 9).

As everyone in sympathy with Revelation must perceive, this implies to take a concentrated form of thought of some kind into one's organism. We often say, "I read and thoroly digested the contents of a certain work." Divine symbolism is not unlike the symbolism of the language of modern times.

The book being sealed with seven seals implies that

there are seven vital truths involved; and as all vitality has in it mind, thought, consciousness, therefore the opening of the seven seals is the opening of the seven vital truths to the consciousness of the people.

We have been engaged many years in writing and in giving to the world vital truths. Many of the people have taken up these truths and have expanded and incorporated them in what they term "Mental Science" and "New Thought" in all the varied forms. The truths have even been taken up by Spiritualists; in fact, by every class of thinkers, and the magazines and books that convey these truths in detached form, mixed, of course, with error, are multifarious. But the truths are being spread broadcast, and it seems plain to us that the book with the seven seals has been opened, and that you, our Readers, have it at your command; and shall we attempt to make another book?

The book contains a complete plan of salvation. This is a theological expression, is it not? But when we say that it contains a complete plan of salvation, we mean more than the Church means. We mean that there was a purpose in the creation of the world, which we have ever tried to keep before your mind, and that that purpose comprised the plan or embodied the methods by which, if followed, one may attain to immortality, to eternal consciousness, to an undying state. Immortality or an undying state implies a continued life of perfect health and the consequent peace and happiness.

Has all this been given to you?—Yes, it has all been materialized from the spiritual book to the material books and placed at your disposal. What more can we do? What more is there to be done? As we sit in our quiet retreat and center our mind upon God and the spirit of life that animates his people, and inquire, What more do they need? the only response that seems to be given to us is: "Practice; they need practice; they need to take up these great truths and to incorporate them into their lives."

Every individual who would attain immortality must take the little book from the hand of the angel (the messenger of God) and must eat it up. While digesting the thought it may prove bitter, because of your love for the world as it is, for the old order of life, embodying generation, labor, sorrow and death, yet it will not be bitter to you if you have grown up to that standard where you love God, Spirit, and the laws of rightness, more than all else in the world. To whatever extent this is true, the book will be sweet to you. As it was said in the Revelation, "In thy mouth it shall be sweet as honey," that is, the reception of it is beautiful, and this has been the case with the multitude that have received it during these many years, but the practice ("it shall make thy belly bitter") has been bitterness.

You do not like the bitter, do you? But you cannot have the sweet unless you have the bitter. You cannot have immortality and conscious unity with God without subjugating and bringing under control all animal desires and passions, and subordinating every faculty of the animal nature, with the appetites and passions which we all possess, to the mind of the spiritual nature. Therefore the book becomes bitter in the bowels of many, but it is the way of salvation; it is the light of life to all who receive and follow it.

Again we ask: What more can we do? As we look over the volumes that have been written, the words, words, words (not empty words, however, but words of truth) that have been sent out to the world, we feel like being silent and waiting for you to put into practice the truths that have been given to you, and to attain the consciousness that has been active in us all these years.

Therefore we simply present to your minds the necessity of an absolute consecration of your life to God, and not only the necessity, but the wisdom and desirability of so doing. For, if you will but reason intelligently, correctly, you will discover that, as Jesus said, "You have

no life in yourselves;" that all the life or mind or consciousness that you possess is inspired from the spirit of the mundane, and if you would have life in yourself, you must obtain it from the Cause. Turn your mind away from the mere effects, the material world, and reach out beyond to the Cause, to the God of the universe, and desire above all things to begin to know and even to live from the Spirit of Life that originated the world.

Please stop here to think: The world was made by the *word* of God. The world is a phenomenon; the effect; the externality; but he that spoke the *word* is the cause, the fountain, the source of all that is, and the source of your life. What is necessary is to leave the shadows. A shadow is the effect of a substance. (There is so much that is worthy of your thought in regard to this word "shadow" in connection with this thought.) If you desire above all things to leave the shadows and to enter the cause, to become one with the cause, then the full sunlight of Divine wisdom, knowledge, understanding and power will begin to vibrate thru your entire organism.

This seems to us to be the point where the only work in and for the people can be accomplished, and this depends wholly upon you; all that is possible for us to do is to try to "stir up your pure minds by putting you in remembrance" (II Peter iii 1), and to try to impress upon your consciousness the reality of your existence and your relatedness to spirit; also the possibility that you possess, to become, not only one with the Spirit, but conscious of the Spirit; and in that consciousness of the Spirit will come peace, joy, rest and immortality. For in an immortal state, suffering is impossible, anxiety cannot enter, fear is a myth of long ago, and love, knowledge and power become the substance of existence.

WHAT THE BIBLE TEACHES

(QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS)

A JEALOUS GOD

Question.—I have often wondered about the statement that "God is a jealous God." I wish you would give us your understanding of what this means, for certainly we may not think of God as having the weaknesses common to all men.

Answer.—Our understanding of these words is that they express a law. If you want the sun to shine on you, you must go out into the sunlight. For the sun will not shine around a corner, it is jealous of its straight-line action and will not change for you.

There is a law of mind that by desire we receive into ourselves from that upon which our attention is fixed. We are informed that God is formless life, and gives us that which we may need. If we turn to that formless life with desire, a measure of that formless life enters into us in accord with the thought in mind, in answer to that desire. While your desire will draw to you the substance of that which is held in mind, if the attention is fixed upon that formless life, yet if fixed upon a form, there is little or nothing to be received. For this reason the worshipping of idols is condemned, for the form defeats the prayer.

RESULTS OF RETAINING THE SEED

Question.—Your statements about retaining the seed seem to indicate that you think it is always good to do so, but at times I doubt it. Is it always good?

Answer.—To retain the seed gives added ability in whatever direction the efforts are turned, in that it is always good. It may increase the ability to do wrong, in that case a good thing is put to a bad use. Added life improves the health, but because to maintain health one must be positive and active, and because if one does not

use his vitality something else will use it for him and to his detriment, there are some who become diseased. The added ability and clearness of mind, if the brain is not used, may be replaced by a mental stupor.

One reason for these results is that added life makes one more sensitive to and affected by surrounding influences. Since the world-life is filled with all manner of influences, mostly bad, the more sensitive one is the more positive one must be to maintain health of body and mind.

LYING

Question.—We read that “all liars shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone.” What I should like to know is just how does this apply? For everybody is more or less untruthful.

Answer.—We believe that it is at least unwise under ordinary circumstances to tell a lie, that is, to make a false statement with the intent to deceive. That lying builds a weakness in the character we believe. But we are of the opinion that to deceive oneself is a grave matter. In the story where the Pharisee prayed, he lied to himself, and he but increased his self-righteousness, which kept him in spiritual darkness.

So common is a person's ignorance of himself that the old Greek philosopher emphasized the words, “Know thyself.” They who observe themselves carefully see how easy it is to justify and deceive oneself. And we are inclined to believe that self-deception based upon self-justification does more to hinder our advancement than anything else. Observe the person who justifies his mistakes and you will note that he does not advance. Self-justification hides from him his own character.

There is one reason for this self-deception that is not commonly recognized, it is that when other souls in the body impel one to act there seems but little realization of the moral quality of the act. Few persons realize the Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde role they are playing. But one

who because of a lack of careful self-analysis deceives himself as to his real objects and character becomes hopelessly involved in the spirit of this world, and need not hope for a spiritual consciousness and eternal life.

POWERS

Question.—If Jesus gives to his disciples authority over unclean spirits, so that they may drive them out and away from the sick, the diseased and the troubled, and thus heal them, why is it we cannot heal the sick by a touch or by a word, even as he did?

Answer.—According to our understanding, when one reaches that state of discipleship implied, one has gained the essential knowledge, and has awakened the faculties of the soul, and thru training has developed the ability to do these things. For these things are done in accord with natural law.

You may have granted to you certain rights and privileges, and you may have certain inherent powers, but if you do not assert those rights and claim those privileges and train yourself in the use of those powers, you are no better off than those who are not so favored.

If you retain the life for a time you will awaken certain soul-powers, but the use and development of these is your task.

HOLDING TO THE PAST

Question.—I find great difficulty in my efforts to forgive and drop the past. It is true that all thru the Bible there is a constant urge to forgive. And we are admonished that unless we forgive we shall not be forgiven. I wish you would explain this matter to me.

Answer.—So long as you do not forgive a wrong, just so long you are carrying that evil, poisonous thing with you as a part of your life and consciousness like a sore that will not heal. To forgive or to be forgiven a wrong is to drop it out of mind, and so, its effects out of the life;

so long as it is held in mind it remains an evil in the life. You are not admonished to forgive for your enemy's sake but for your own sake, so that you may get rid of the evil, for without forgiveness you cannot get rid of it.

As we go on in this life and gain a consciousness of the Spirit-world and its inhabitants, they will come and associate with us in proportion as we drop out of our life and consciousness the evils. Jesus said, "The clean in heart shall see God." So make up your mind, if you have not seen God, your heart is not clean. As you begin to associate with the inhabitants of heaven, you are entering in to heaven.

THE LAW OF SIN AND DEATH

Question.—What do you understand to be "the law of sin and death," as mentioned in the Bible?

Answer.—In the first place, what is sin? The Greek word translated "sin" is "to miss the mark," as one who would shoot at a mark and miss it. The same is true, so we understand, of that word as used in the Hebrew. So we see that to sin means to miss the mark aimed at, to fail to accomplish the desired end. It does not of itself imply any evil intent, but inability, simply failure to accomplish.

Man was placed on this earth with the understanding that if he did no wrong he would not die. And the Psalmist echoed this thought, saying, "In the way of righteousness is life, and in the pathway thereof there is no death." Here then we have the thought, always to do right, and you will not die.

But the wording of the story of Eden gives the impression that Adam failed in one certain particular, failed because he did one forbidden thing.

The Bible declares that Adam was a son of God, that is, he had attained to that degree of spiritual consciousness called Divine sonship. In I John iii x it is declared that the sons of God, having overcome the generative

urge, do not lose their seed. It is said in Gen. vi 2, "The sons of God looked upon the daughters of men, and behold they were fair, and they took of them wives." And the account goes on to state that children were born to them. In other words, of those who had overcome generation, and attained to a spiritual consciousness and eternal life, some returned to generation, and with the loss of their seed they lost their spiritual consciousness with their hold on eternal life, and the sentence of death was passed upon them, even as it was upon Adam. For this reason, because she lost of her store of life in doing so, the Psalmist said, "By sinning my mother conceived me."

All thru the Bible the thought appears to be that to lose the seed is to incur the sentence of death.

ELEMENTS

Question.—In occult literature the term "Elements" is used in a way that is not at all scientific. This term is applied to air, earth, fire and water, and is not correct. For these are not elements. Why continue to use them, knowing, as you must, that these terms are not correct?

Answer.—We know that the term "element" as used in chemistry refers to those substances which cannot under ordinary condition, be reduced to anything else. But the term "elements" as used in occultism commonly refers not to chemical substances, but to the different life-qualities.

THE COMING KINGDOM

Question.—When will the kingdom of God come?

Answer.—The kingdom of God, so far as its personalities are concerned, will be a gathering of a body of persons who have learned the laws of their own life, and, as well, have learned in great measure to control their own life and to know the natural laws pertaining to all that they do. These laws they must learn and keep. In other words, they who will compose the

kingdom of God must know right from wrong, and must always do the right—right in view of natural law. This will constitute the preparation for those who are to form the personnel of that kingdom.

To pray, "Let thy kingdom come," will not bring it until those who pray want to know and do the right more than they want anything else.

THE SUBSTANCE OF IT ALL

Question.—I am not a religious man, but I have read and heard a lot about religious and spiritual things, in the past. I wish you would give me something definite, some foundation thoughts as it were, to build upon.

Answer.—As we understand the matter, we are here in this world, for a time. Some persons get along all right, and seem satisfied with this world and life as they are. These need nothing that we have to give. But there are many who do not find life so desirable. They desire something better. It is true that all the good things of life are spread abroad for all to take, but all do not have the same ability to take.

But the great teachers of the past have claimed that satisfaction should not be sought in great possessions, nor in the constant experiences of pleasurable sensations, but, rather, in the heart and in the mind are to be found those things which make life a satisfaction.

Some of these great teachers have tried to show men how to act so that their associate relations could be made more satisfactory. But another class of teachers came, teaching that there is another, higher, and in every way better, world than this one. That this superior world is not cognizable by man's present crude physical senses, but that man can, by a certain manner of living, awaken another set of senses, now dormant in himself, by means of which he can become cognizant of and in that superior world. To teach men how to live so that they would awaken these dormant senses which would make one con-

scious of and in that superior world was the effort of all the prophets of Israel, and of the Lord Christ and his disciples.

To teach men the manner of living that would give them a consciousness of and in that superior world is all clearly written in the Bible for those who desire to learn and know. Therefore the question is, Have you the ability to take up the moral teachings of the Bible? Have you mind enough to understand them? Have you the strength and integrity of character to live in accord with them? If you have you can enter into that superior world. But if you have not, then that world is not for you.

## GOD AND MAN

BY ENOCH PENN

WHILE Moses was tending his father-in-law's sheep on Horeb, he gained a certain knowledge and understanding of the one great Power, the highest power that man can contact.

After this, he went down to Egypt, and by the use of that Power, he delivered the children of Israel from the Egyptians, and led them into the desert north of the Red Sea. There on mount Sinai the people were given a wonderful demonstration by and of Him, or That, which they were informed is their God, that is, is a Power which they may learn to use to make life in every way better worth living. And it was this Power who gave to them the Ten Commandments, which commandments are the ten conditions which, if complied with, will enable them to lay hold of and use that Power. And it will be observed that these ten conditions stipulated are relative to one's attitudes toward his fellows and toward that Power of which they were informed "He [It] is thy life."

But the question arises, Why were those commandments given? and for what purpose? In general the idea of the Christian people appears to be that they are simply certain things demanded of them arbitrarily, and for no apparent reason. But the fact is, living in harmony with those ten conditions enables one, in harmony with natural law, to lay hold of and use that Power wherewith to accomplish his purposes, in accord with the words, "I will be thy Power." Those things which were forbidden are all of them things that bring harm to self and others, while those things enjoined bring good when obeyed.

At one time Moses called the attention of the people to the fact that when that Power manifested itself to them on the Mount, "Ye saw no similitude." And he seemed insistent in impressing upon their minds the idea that that Power is formless. Nevertheless, all thru the Bible God is referred to as tho he were in the form of a

man. And this, in spite of the fact that they were commanded not to make any form, not even in thought, to say or to think of it, "This is like that Power," to give it form being to violate one of the rules that make It one's power, and if they did so It would not be to them a Power. But when Paul spoke to the Athenians, to men of deep thought, he declared that this Power which he called God, is not like anything that has form, for It is formless. It is formless life in which we live and which makes us and all things live and breathe. And Jesus said to the woman at the well of Samaria, "God is Spirit," is formless life. Thus we have on the authority of Moses, of Jesus and of Paul, that this greatest of all Powers which offers Itself to those who comply with the ten stipulated conditions announced, is formless life.

The Bible declares that the Elohim, the Gods, created the world, that these Gods are the Creator and the Father of mankind. Their statement "Let us make man in OUR image, after OUR likeness, and let them have dominion over all the earth," and after man fell, "The man has become as one of us, to know good and evil," show that they once were men. And the descriptions of these Gods given in the Bible declares them to be in the form of men, and their declaration that the man is to become as they are show us that life is endless and that growth and development into higher states of consciousness is without limit. One upon whose consciousness dawned the realization of man's eternal evolvement to higher and yet higher states exclaimed, "Gabriel! One day I shall stand where you now stand."

We are informed that God created the world and all things in it by a word. A word is an expression of a thought. In other words, God thought the world and it was. For when the Creator forms a thought it becomes a thing in nature. As He said, "As I have thought, so shall it come to pass. And as I have purposed, so shall it stand." Here we have the thought that everything that

was created is a thought formed in the mind of the Creator, that that thought itself becomes the thing. Because of this, in the account of creation it is written that God created [formed the thought of] every plant before it grew in the ground."

We are informed that man was made in the image of his Creator, and we know that according to the form is its function; therefore as the Creator can think, so can the man think. When a man thinks, by his imagination he causes a portion of his life to take form. Observation shows that whatever thought man may form its influence and effect are according to its form, plus the intensity of the impulse while forming it. We know that one may form a thought, and then laugh with glee because of its effect upon him, or he may form a thought and curse with anger, or he may form a thought and tremble with fear because of it. It requires but little observation to show that every thought affects the consciousness, in fact is the cause of sensation and consciousness, that one's consciousness is wholly in accord with the thoughts he has formed. Does not the face scowl because of the kind of thought behind it? Is not the smiling face because of the thoughts behind it? Therefore we say that it is by our thoughts that we have made ourselves what we are. In that sense we are our own creators. We were made a living soul, a something that can think, and since our thoughts have made us what we are, shall it not be ever so? Shall we not suffer the torments of the lost, or enjoy the delights of the saved, as the result of our own thinking?

The prophet makes God to say, "My thoughts are not like your thoughts." And then goes on to say that man's thoughts are of little strength to bring about results, but God's thoughts become facts in nature. But tho man's thoughts are not strong like God's thoughts yet in the aggregate they are strong enough to bring about evils in nature; sorrows and sicknesses in the bod-

ies of men, and even to disease vegetable life. Relative to the many evils that afflict man we have the threat, "I will bring evil upon this people, even the results of their thoughts." And the fact that the Ten Commandments forbid us to think any evil thought about another, shows that even as man is in the image of God, that image is partly in the fact that his thoughts affect not only the life in his own body, but also affect the life about him and the life in the bodies of those about him, and even affect the processes of nature.

Because the life in which we live is affected by the thoughts and feelings of men even as they themselves are affected, the thoughts of men being more or less evil, we see why the prophet makes God to say, "Thou hast made me to serve with thy sins," and "I create evil." Thus the good that God sends to earth becomes evil because the evil thoughts of men have perverted the life in which they live, and this in spite of the fact that God designs good for mankind. This is why in so many places in the Bible men are warned that if they continue in their evil ways diseases, sorrows, wars and famines will be visited upon them as the natural results of their evil thoughts.

At times men pray to escape from the evil effects of their wrong thinking, but when we consider that these evils are the simple results in accord with natural law of the things they are doing, of their thoughts and emotions, we can easily see the futility of such prayer unless the cause of these evils is removed. Of those who persist in their wrongdoing God said, "Mine eye shall not spare, neither will I have pity; and tho they cry in mine ears with a loud voice, yet I will not hear them." That is, when the evils of man's own creation come upon him he must bear them.

Here we see the reason for the commandments forbidding man to form a thought of evil about another. Since everything that lives, lives in and from the Creator's life, so long as that life is kept disturbed by evil

thoughts and conflicting emotions man can have but little peace. This is why Jesus said, "Blessed are the peace-makers."

Israel was informed, that if they would live together in peace, goodwill and helpfulness, they and their children would be healthy and happy, and their cattle prolific, and their crops abundant. Why?—Because the life in which they live and which makes them live is then not disturbed in its normal operations. And it is promised to such people, "All things shall work together for your good."

That this life in which we live reflects back to us that which we are, the prophet declared when he said, "To the merciful thou wilt show thyself merciful, and to the upright thou wilt show thyself upright. With the pure thou wilt show thyself pure, and to the perverse thou wilt show thyself unsavory."

## PLANETARY INFLUENCES FOR SEPTEMBER

HELIOCENTRIC POSITIONS ARE USED THRUOUT

There is necessarily considerable repetition in stating the planetary influences from month to month, as the larger planets remain in a sign of the zodiac for a considerable time.

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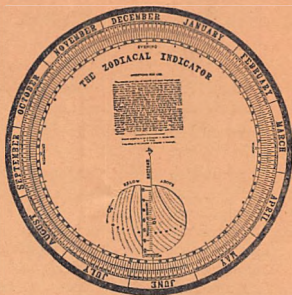
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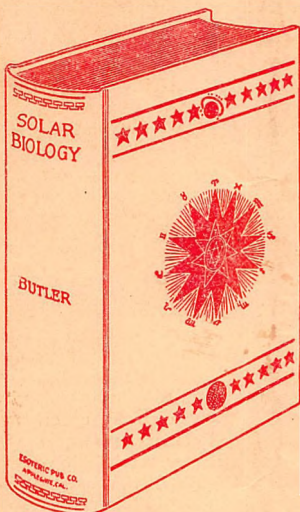
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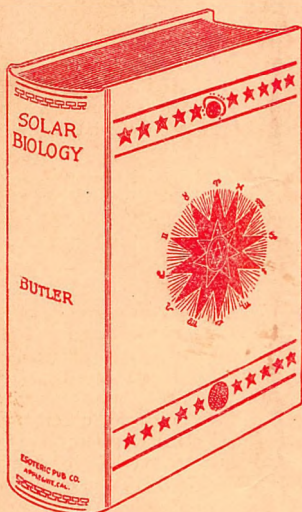
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
