It is gratifying to see her advancement and abilities emphasized by the character of the criticisms which have been freely made in regard to her advocacy. A careful analysis will disclose that it is broad as well as specific and logic-She has observed sufficient demonal. strated facts in Spiritism which have, to her, become efficient servants in deducing spiritual truth She is passing from conception to perception; from phenomena in physics to formulæ in psychics; from illusory form, to the eternal principles producing the form

Spiritual Evolution, or more strictly speaking in reference to man, Christian Evolution employs two principle agencies in its work, viz: Time and Decay. The progressive mind clings to the wings of Time; the inert mind lingers in the lap of Decay. The latter however, has its use in illustrating what was and still is, in regard to itself and what might and should have been in its relation to the other. Mrs. Richings and her critics beautifully illustrate and affirm the principle of Christian Evolution. Her reply to the criticism of her statement " that no one could see a spirit " was forceful in the extreme, and the modern effort in spiritual thought will have missed its important mission in failing to cancel the pagan and even Christian fallacies of form worship. Spirit is formless, and unless one can sense spirit and spiritual truth irrespective of form, such an one's education in the elements of spiritual truth is sadly deficient, scarcely better than the orthodoxy which it presumes to condemn.

The greatest offense of all seems to have been that Mrs Richings claimed to be the speaker. The claim of personality signifies nothing if through that organism approximate wisdom flows to intensify and enrich human consciousness. At best the human organism is but a vibratory machine for the transmission of intelligence and fortunate indeed is he or she whose spiritual consciousness is so in touch with the higher intelligence that the human may remain in an apparently normal state to aid, as it were, in materializing and making *practical* the higher spiritual thought. Mrs Richings is a power and in the right direction.
