The rosy down and splendors of the sinking sun; flowers drinking dew of heaven and exhaling sweetness gathered there; the wild rose thriving in the magrant hedge, and in the fields the ceaseless song of insect and of birds; the trackless air distanced in blue and arched with twinkling, jeweled worlds that leap for very joy and flash to us their word of Love; "All life is centered in The Life intense and hath a part in Being," all to show forth the Infinite and make men happy in the true knowledge. Let him who is dissatisfied study the ways of The Invisible Powers-through the apparent —and so find the true blessedness of this beautiful life."

HOW SHALL WE DO TO BE SAVED?

I take the following letter from among many, in order to answer a few questions raised by an article under the above heading in October Christian:

"My Dear Doctor Shelton: Will you kindly explain in Christian the following quotations from October number:

"'Sexual association is just as essential to health as sleeping and eating.' And again, 'If you crucify the flesh, if you repress natural desire, you are crucifying and repressing God.' Again, 'What are you to do with these desires? Satisfy them. Everything given from the Spirit is for your satisfaction. There is not anything that will satisfy Spirit except Spirit. For this reason none can satisfy you except your mate. All other associations are adultanced.

"According to this, one must either crucify the flesh, and thus crucify and repress God, or be adulterous in absence of one's mate. As you doubtless know, through your large correspondence, the majority of people have failed to find their mates. Which of the two evils would you recommend to such, repressing God or being adulterous? A sincere seeker for Truth,"

The writer of this letter is a woman. Her first name is Ruth, and she lives away out on the Pacific coast. She is as clean and pure and high-minded as any woman who ever lived. I have had several letters from sexual dyspeptics, who have abused me for everything they could think of, and some have stopped their subscriptions on account of that article. You know a sexual dyspeptic is like all other dyspeptics. They are ready to turn up their noses at everything, because

they have lost their own appetite. You may put before a dyspeptic the finest meal in the world and he will either go to work and gourmandize, or else will turn away in disgust. This is true of the sexual dyspeptic. I am writing for those who can understand. The ones who impeach my motives should stop Christian. If you have not confidence in my honesty, integrity and purity, you should not come to me for instruction. I am not writing for praise, neither am I courting censure. I am speaking as the Spirit of Truth gives me utterance.

Some have written to me, stating that God, the Spirit, does not enjoy anything. They tell me that God is not capable of any kind of sensation, whether of pleasure or pain. They affirm that all sensation is in matter, therefore the sexual appetite, as all other appetites, is of the flesh. This is an old lie. There is no kind of sensation in matter. All sensation is in Spirit. God not only does all of the suffering, all of the sorrowing, but enjoys all of the pleasure, all of the ecstacy of life. God is life. There is no life in matter. All life is in God, for God is everything that is substantial. Matter is a medium of Spirit, and when Spirit is withdrawn from matter, sensation ceases. 'The dead know not anything.' This old lie of all sensation being in the flesh is the cause of nearly all of the error on earth. Banish the idea from your mind! There is only God! Therefore, whatever you enjoy of pleasure or suffer as pain comes from the Spirit, while the flesh is only used as a medium. "To be carnally-minded is death; to be spirituallyminded is life and peace.' Why? Because the mind that is in you determines life or death, joy or sorrow.

In answer to Ruth, I will stand by what I have said. All associations that are not in accordance with the law of attraction are adulterous. There is no other law to determine the right except this law of attraction. There are more soul mates on earth than you think. In fact, I believe that the majority of people who come together are soul mates. Because there is a battle is no sign that you are not soul mates. Soul mates do not come together as so much slop in a bucket. They do not come together as two balls of putty. They come together as individuals by the law of attraction. I told you that before I saw my soul mate I knew there was going to be a battle between us. There was fierce warfare for the first forty days of our acquaintance. There has been many a battle since, but if we had not been mates, if we had been indifferent, it would have been only a skirmish and a separation. Because there was deep feeling, there was a flerce contention in our minds. It was a struggle of life and death. There was no power on earth or in hell that could have kept us from coming together. These are the questions you are to ask. If it is a contention of spirit against spirit, the wounds will hurt. But if your coming together is simply one of convenience, "a good match," a bargain you have made in a commercial way, then, of course, quarrels only deepen the gulf between you. You can't expect to find your soul mate as you get a roast at the butcher shop. Take the commercial idea into the matter and you are nearly sure to be cheated. Are you looking out for a bargain? Then go to the bargain counter. This is the reason you are not mated. You have been putting your best foot foremost, setting out to catch a man or woman. Of course, both of you will be disappointed, but if it is a coming together of two individuals who have been mated for all eternity, there will be considerable hell raised before the union is perfected. If She had been a wooden woman, she would not have been my mate, unless I myself had been a man of straw. The royal, dominant, individualistic spirit in me must also be found in her, or we are not mates. It is the coming together of two commanding forces. It is God meeting God!

The old lie that all of our sensations are of the flesh is the cause of the trouble. People are taught to sneak around and hide themselves. They are taught that it is wrong to gratify so-called desires of the flesh, when the facts are that the flesh never did have any kind of desire. It is God that desires, and it is God that we have been crucifying all of these years of mortal foolishness. It is God who is being trampled in the streets and slums and dives of our cities. It is God who is crying out in the agony of a despair born of man's errors. Not the error of feeling desire, but the error of condemning the one who feels desire. It is God who lives, and moves, and has being in us. Just as long as you call this sensation animal, beastly, devilish, etc., you are desecrating the Temple of the Living God by words -words full of the poison of your own foolish mind. The way out of this wilderness is the recognition that God is good and that God is all. Just as long as you are cross-eyed by trying to see two Principles of Being-one Evil and the other Good-you are between the Devil and the Deep Sea. There is only Good! You can not fail to find your soul mate when you find your soul. If you think your soul is lost in what is called animal nature, lost in the flesh, or lost in any other way, you are a fool for want of spiritual sense. Your soul is not lost, never was lost, and never can be lost. It is your own mind that has been made crazy by trying to see two Principles of Being. It is utterly impossible to have two Principles of Being in the Universe. Therefore, when the mortal mind tries to conceive an impossibillty, it goes crazy. This is the reason these fool mortals are a set of lunatics in their

Damn a hypocrite! Did you ever notice that Jesus Christ never condemned anyone but hypocrites? He spoke gently and lovingly to the woman taken in adultery. But he everlastingly damned the old hypocrites who dragged her into his presence. They sneaked out and went on praying, and preying. You need not be ashamed of your natural appetites and desires. They come up from the depths of your own Divinity. Praise all these desires, and their gratification will not hurt you! Condemn yourself and you will be condemned! Glorify the God within you, not by psalm singing, but by healthful, natural life. Glory to God in the highest and the lowest!

Never do what you would wish to undo to friend or foe.

Remember, the person who would ridicule you for reforming bad moral habits would be the first to blame you for the vices into which bad habits lead.

OFFENDING THE LITTLE ONES.

"But whose shall offend one of these little ones which believe in me, it were better for him that a mill-stone were hanged about his neck, and that he were drowned in the depths of the sea. We unto the world because of offences! For it must needs be that offences come, but we to that man by whom the offence cometh!"

I am not above criticism, but I am above taking offense at criticism. I am Love! "Love suffereth long and is kind. Love beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things." It is not because Love is afraid, for perfect love casteth out all fear. Hubbard is a humorist. I sent a copy of October Christian to a prominent Denver lawyer. This is the way he writes to me in a personal letter:

"The copy of the Christian which you kindly sent reached me, and I was very much interested in reading your comments on Hubbaru's article. Of course, it is not expected that I should understand all that you and Hubbard say, being an ordinary mortal; the best I can do is to gather up a few crumbs here and there. This much I do know, however, and that is, that very few people understand Hubbard. Most individuals in reading what he wrote with reference to you, would have been mad; they would not have appreciated the real good nature there is in the article, and in the man who wrote it. I can only commend you for having had sense enough to see that it was intended in a good-natured way, and that there was nothing to be mad about, and you have treated it as such, and I am glad to see it."

A few days after receiving this lawyer's letter, I received an autograph letter from Hubbard himself. This is the way he writes: "The Roycroft Shop,

"At East Aurora, New York,
"Makers of Hand-Printed Books and Things.
"Oct. 4, 1900.

"Dear Brother Shelton—The way you have taken your medicine proves you to be all you claim. All the rest, excepting our Brother Hugh, got right up and screamed in falsetto. You are what you are, and no man in East Aurora or anywhere else can harm you, and your virtue lies in the fact that you know it. So here's love all 'round, and I am ever your sincere Elbert Hubbard."

Fra Elbertus, you have borne witness to the truth. I am all I claim. No man in East Aurora or anywhere else can harm me. If I had been other than what I am, this scratch of your pen would have irritated me. But how can you irritate God? A fool mortal

claims to be Jesus Christ. You call him down and laugh at him for calling himself J. C. He gets angry. Why? Because he is not J. C. No one ever heard of Jesus Christ being flustrated because people called him by his name. I do not think J. C. will ever come back to this little dirt-dauber's nest again, but if he does He will not be ashamed of His name. I AM God, and when you apply to me all the ugly names of Myself, the only thing I can do is to say Amen! I am not ashamed of any of my names. Yet I AM One, and my Name is One. I AM Unity. There is no one beside Me. I AM the Whole and there are no parts, that is, no parts detached from the Whole. The individual is not all of Me, but I am all of the individual. From everlasting to everlasting I AM God. There is no place where I AM not; there is no being that is not Me. You cannot escape from my Presence. If you make your bed in hell, I AM there with you. If you take the wings of the morning and fly unto the uttermost parts of the earth, I will fly with you. I AM in all of the depths, and I AM in all of the heights. I Am the First and I Am the Last. I Am the Beginning and I Am the End. I Am the A and I Am the Z. And I Am all the letters between A and Z. What are you without Me? You are as stubble in the stubble field, seeming to be and yet having no stability. But when you recognize Me, thou art immortal, invincible, the only potentate, Lord of lords, and King of kings. Write My name on your forehead and on your thigh, and go forth conquering and to conquer. I Am the Resurrection, therefore in Me you can rise from any condition. I Am Life, and in Me you have the keys of Death and Hell.

INDIVIDUAL INDEPENDENCE.

"Is it the 'I' or the 'Not I' of me when I feel like renouncing my husband and demanding that he give me all or nothing? It seems to me I can not love him as I once did, as long as he shares his thoughts with another. At times I feel like telling him I can not be his wife any longer, and then I am not sure that it is the right thing to do, or whether I should do anything but wait. Will I receive the same results by silent demand or through spoken words?"

The above is a sample of questions coming to me from wives and husbands. You have a wrong conception of the whole matter. The word "wife" and the word "husband" have become symbols of bondage. A woman gets the legal title of wife, and then she begins to domineer over her husband and make demands. A man gets the legal title of husband and begins to lord it over the woman. These legal titles are often given through hypocrisy and deceit. The woman who marries a man knowing that she does not love him is a hypocrite and prostitute, and vice versa. No formulas of the church or the state can change the facts. All the prayers of all the priests and preachers on earth can not change the hypocrite and prostitute into an honest person. We make a great hue and cry against a woman who yields through love or passion without the marriage ceremony; but she is not to be compared to the one who deliberately plots and plans a marriage without love. Let us

understand that individuals are individuals, and not wives and husbands. You have no right to demand of your husband anything, either in the Silence or with your mouth. There is no kind of bondage in love. He is an individual and you are an individual. His life is independent and so is your life independent. What are you to do? Don't demand anything! Give! Give! Freely give from out of your own individual self. Give as a queen gives, royally and nobly, without thinking of any kind of returns! Give him to understand that you are absolutely independent of all other persons in the Universe. Give her to understand that the Divine Feminine is in you and with you and that the Divine is not dependent upon the human. Live a large and magnanimous life. This is the life of an individual and not the life of a mere "husband." You were individuals before that little ceremony was performed and before you received that little piece of paper. Retain your individuality! The so-called mating in this world is simply selfishness gone to seed. The woman gets her little piece of paper called the marriage certificate and begins to demand and command and claim her "rights." You have no rights save the right to live your own individual life. What we want to find out first of all is that we are individuals. There may be an association of individuals without destroying individuality. But just as soon as the association becomes an institution, the individual is in bondage. I vote with my own political party when it suits me to do so. If any of the party leaders undertook to whip me into the lines, there would be a rebellion. I hold certain thoughts in common with other people, and as long as my individuality is not encroached upon, I am willing to co-operate for the common good. There can be no good which does not recognize individuality. The principle of individuality holds good in all kinds of association. When two lovers are associated together they are very kind, respectful, and polite to each other. Why? Because they are not claiming any "rights." They are not making any demands. They do not own any property in each other. But just let a preacher say over a few words, and war begins at once. The woman begins to claim the "rights" of a wife and the man begins to claim the "rights" of a husband. They are no longer individuals. She has assumed a title and he has assumed a title. Therefore, by the hocus pocus of a preacher or priest, they have lost their individuality. The billing and cooing lovers have been turned into quarreling, snarling, snapping people, with the titles of husband and wife. It is a common joke in the comic papers that a man cares nothing for his wife and a woman pays no attention to her husband. You can tell a young married couple, because they have not ceased to be lovers. But after a while they simply tolerate each other, and that is all. Why? Because of that contemptible idea that a marriage ceremony can give them property rights in each other. Just as long as you recognize anything other than the individual, you will live in hell. As long as you think your happiness depends upon some other person, that your rights are invested in some other person, that you have a mortgage on some other individual, you are living an unscientific life.

You are an individual, and no manner of ceremonies or hoodoos can change the fact. The kingdom of your God is within you and you are not dependent upon your soul mate or anybody. If your husband divides his attention between you and another woman, then you have failed to command the whole of his love and attention. How are you to command it? By not demanding it! No man or woman has the right to lord it over another man or woman. There is no person on the face of this earth, or in the heavens, or in hell, who can keep one iota of your own from you! This is a wonderful sentence and I want you to let it sink down deep into your mind. No one can bring anything to you; no one can take anything from you! There is not any possible chance for any individual in the Universe to draw one penny of your own from the bank of Infinite Supply. It will remain there in that bank forever, unless you draw it out. No one can injure you, no one can rob you, no one can make you wealthy, no one can confer favors on you. You reign by the royal right of your own individuality. Don't get scared for fear you are going to lose something! Don't be alarmed at the attitude of any other person. All, all, and everything that is your own is within you! You are not dependent upon father, mother, brother, sister, wife, husband, anything or anybody in the whole Universe. Let every woman who reads this remember that she is an individual woman and the title of wife can not take away her individuality. Oh, the
