

REPORT OF THE ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE INTER-NATIONAL CONSTITUTIONAL CHURCH, HELD NOVEMBER 19th, 1949, AT LOS ANGELES, CALIFORNIA

The Convention was a success, though the attendance was small, as was to be expected under the circumstances, still those, who were there, made up for their lack in numbers by their sincerity and enthusiasm.

Saturday, Nov. 19th, was given to registration, arrangements and getting acquainted. Sunday: A lovely Spiritual Service, conducted by Bishop Lettie Cassill, D.D. D.D.L., was had, attended by a fine congregation. Rev. Eduardo Leal of Kingsville, Texas, and Rev. Bessie Corder Loe of Portland, Oregon, were the guest speakers.

The remainder of the week was taken up with conferences and committee meetings and on the following Sunday a lovely concluding service was had.

Briefly the sense of the meeting was that all members be made acquainted with the facts about the Church; its problems, what it stands for and what the Church is trying to accomplish.

That the following facts should be emphasized:

That the Inter-National Constitutional Church is a Liberal Church with spiritual leanings, still it is different from all other Churches in that it welcomes all sincere persons, irrespective of their race, color or creed or religion. There is only one thing that the Church insists upon and that is that they must believe in God.

That this Church is a Church belonging to the entire membership, in toto and not to any one particular member; that the officers are the agents of the members, conducting the affairs of the Church as they are instructed.

That when a member does business with the Church, they are not dealing with an independent, commercial concern, but with themselves and with one another.

That, as we teach Love, Kindness, Unselfishness and Tolerance, we must practice them, at all times, in all of our dealings or relations with each other and with our fellow men.

That many members, in the past, have misunderstood the purpose, the functions and the realities of the Church and have regarded it as a mere licensing bureau, existing for the sole purpose of issuing them papers, to legalize their activities. THIS IS ERRONEOUS and such an idea must be CORRECTED AT ONCE.

That the ARTICLES OF FAITH contain the beliefs of the Church and that they should be read at all services, not as a chant or in a sing-song manner but in a solemn and sincere way.

That this Church to continue to grow and prosper, as it has in the past, necessitates that every member continue to support all of its activities to the fullest extent; to take an active interest in all of its affairs and to give as generously as the member can afford and give as much as they can and not as little as some members have done in the past.

That the Church is doing the work of the members and carrying out their mission to bring the TRUE word of the Master to the people and that it is the duty of every member to see that their CHURCH is properly financed so that the work can be done properly.

That the officers of the Church have conducted its affairs in as economical a manner as is possible and have done a very good work so that the Church has made wonderful progress considering the amount of money that has been available. They need the help and assistance of the members and this should be furnished.

That THIS CHURCH will, through the grace of GOD and with the help and co-operation of the members, continue to grow and prosper and that it will rise to the greatest of religious heights and will in time become the foremost agent for the doing of the Master's work here on Earth, among Men.

The following amendments to the By-Laws were suggested and adopted:

That a council of the Bishops be formed who shall act in an advisory capacity solely. That the first year's dues for all new applicants be raised from \$15.00 to \$25.00 starting on the first day of January, 1950.

Autobiography of an Active Member of the Church

May God Bless Her

Rev. Bishop Lillian B. Young, D.D., was born in Brooksville, Hernando County, Florida, which is just fifty miles north of Tampa, on the 10th day of December, 1895. Her parents were members of the Methodist Church. The father was a minister and the mother a practical nurse.

Bishop Young is the author of a pamphlet, "Spiritual Shadowers." She has lived in Tampa for over twenty-one years; has been engaged in Spiritual work for over eighteen years and taught in the public schools for eighteen years. She has traveled extensively in the interest of Spiritualism and was the featured guest speaker in 1942 at Boston at a Spiritual Convention.

Bishop Young states that as a child she was continually visited by spirit friends, whom she thought were natural people. Each night after her mother had kissed her good night, an elderly woman would always walk in and kiss her just like her mother did. This continued for a long time until she accidentally discovered that she was not a real human being by trying to touch her and finding there was nothing to touch. She would call and ask who was there and would receive no answer. This aroused her curiosity and she would call her mother who could not see or hear anything and consequently was indifferent.

All during the day she would hear voices and see spiritual beings that no one else could see or hear. This was very annoying for she did not understand.

Later, at the age of ten, she was converted and from that day on she has in her humble way tried to do all that she could for God and Humanity. These strange visions and powers have never left her and each day of her life they have grown more vivid. In the year 1925 while sitting quietly and alone, a voice spoke to her, as to John on the Isle of Patmos, saving "Write." This voice brought a prayer. She began to write and when she had finished writing the voice instructed her to p'ace the paper in her husband's pocket. She hesitated to do this but the voice instructed her that she would be sorry if she failed to do so. She looked into the Heavens and God gave her the courage to follow the instruction. She obeyed and when he was told about it, he smiled and said, "If it doesn't help me, it won't hurt me." He left at 5:00 a.m. and the Spirit continued to instruct her to warn him to be careful in his driving. At 8:00 o'clock the car skidded and turned over three times. The top of the car and steering wheel were tom off but he did not receive a scratch. Without any mechanical repairs being done, he drove over 150 miles to his destination. Upon his arrival he told a friend that he believed the prayer saved his life and from that day on he believed that the Spirit of God revealed this prayer to her and that it was his guide and protection.

During her school days, she tried to get away from it all by studying but nothing could eliminate these strange powers and feelings from her. This was, of course, a Divine power, yet she could not then understand it. Being intensely interested in the school work, she tried to ignore these messages brought to her by these spiritual beings. She did not know that there was a difference between spirit communication and common fortune telling. From that day on she has believed in Spiritual beings.

As she grew older and had finished her school training basic, she entered Florida A. and M. College with the thought that it might be a great help in putting all of it out of her mind. All went well until a spirit being entered her room and gave her a message to give to a girl who was visiting with her. Not desiring anyone to know that she could communicate with Spirit beings, she hesitated to give the message. The message was again delivered to her with such force that she had to deliver it and the message saved the girl's brother from serious trouble.

The girl was so awed by the message that she told others and soon various ones would call upon her for "Readings" of which she knew nothing. She refused to give the "Readings" and continued to refuse until finally one Sunday the Spirit came to her and said, "I have called you but you are too much concerned about public opinion but I am Alpha and Omega; you go and I will go with you and if you do as I command, I will bless you." Still she did not accept the call until the same spirit appeared the second time, annointing her with oil. It was then that she decided to go where the spirit desired her to go and do what he wanted her to do. She is now glad she accepted the call and now she says that she is on the battle field for the LORD.

Bishop Young, as we stated before, taught school for a number of years and really loved her work but now that she is engaged in Spiritual work, she states, "From the depth of my heart, I love this better.' Since I have accepted the call from the Master I have been ordained as a minister and advisor in the Inter-National Constitutional Church, have organized several centers which are doing very profitable work for the Master, have also achieved the certificate of Doctor of Mediumship from the Church College." She further states, "It is my sincere desire that in the future, I shall be of even more service to God, my Church and to Humanity."

In 1938 she was consecrated as Bishop of Florida for the CHURCH and appointed jointly over the 6th District. During her administration she has been happy to report progress and achievement each year.

In the early part of 1947 with the aid of her congregation, she began the building of a branch church known as "The Rose of Sharon Spiritual Center" and today with thanks to God and all the Spirit friends, she and the congregation are able to worship in this fine center, a picture of which will appear in a future number of the Culturist Magazine.

The Church has not been completed yet but it is so near completion that we know that God and all of the friends of the branch will help to complete it this year or the first of next year.

Bishop Young and her congregation have many times expressed their thanks and their gratitude to the Inter-National Constitutional Church for the encouragement and hedp that the CHURCH has given. Bishop Young says: "Although I must admit that this was a struggle, but I felt and knew that with God all things are possible, then too, if you give to the world the best you have, the best will come back to you."

CHAPTER ONE

"CHARLIE MASON'S RETURN"

"I am in the spirit world. I am happy and contented. I am with my father and mother and Mable and Jack. Your mother and father are also here with me and many others, both friends and relatives, all anxious to speak to you."

"I am in an advanced state of progression, thanks to our spiritual studies while I was on Earth: the good spiritual life, we led for so many years, all of these, together with our spiritual development and the experiences I had in previous re-incarnations has prepared me to advance faster in my progression in the Spirit World than I otherwise would have been able to do."

Jennie and Charlie Mason had been married for many years. They had enjoyed a happy, peaceful married life with the exception of the passing of their two children, Mable, at the age of three yars, and Jack, at the age of twenty-one. Mable through a childhood disease and Jack was killed in the war, in Europe.

They were very compatible and enjoyed the same things whether it was eating or other activities or amusements. They had attended many spiritual seances and development classes. They had read many spiritual books and were both far advanced mediumistically.

Jennie, for this reason, was not surprised at the return of Charlie, as had he not promised her that he would return. The scared look, on her face, disappeared and in its place beamed a look of infinite joy, pleasure and thankfulness.

Her attitude became one of rapt attention, she hung on every word he spoke. The phenomena, she was witnessing, was what she had become well acquainted with through her studies of the spiritual life.

Charlie continued: "I have the desire to advance in my progression for the benefit I can bring to Humanity. I want to co-operate in helping Man to awaken and to fulfill his obligation to the Creator by following His Laws and Commandments."

"I am a member of the White Brotherhood and we, of the order, are concerned with the general advancement of every individual whether on Earth or in the Spirit World."

"We understand that conditions on Earth are bad. For this reason, we desire to develop, mediumistically, as many with psychic talent, as is possible, so that communication between the Earth plane and the Spirit World will be facilitated and not be so difficult, as it is now. Through these blessed individuals to bring about such a spiritual condition on Earth that when a spirit re-incarnates, their progress will be ever upward on the ladder of progression."

We know that whenever a spirit re-incarnates and fails to make progress that that re-incarnation is a loss and waste and in reality amounts to taking a step backwards and this is what we desire to avoid, if we can."

"I was sitting beside you, holding your hand and trying to console you during the funeral service you held for my old body. I knew you knew that I was there."

"The funeral service was lovely and I enjoyed it very much, the music was the kind I liked to hear when I was on Earth, but I was not really interested in the disposal of that old covering. I did not go to the cemetery. I was only interested in you, my dear. Now please don't grieve for me. Remember

all you have been taught about Death. I have not gone from you except in physical companionship; remember, my dear, that the passing from the physical expression is but the exchange of one type of life for another; it is but the entrance into a new life and is but the passing through the doorway of one expression to another into a wonderful everlasting life."

I have discarded it and have no further interest in it."

"I will return to you and our friends within the year and will keep another promise I made of reporting about the Spirit World. In the meantime I wish that you would continue the development of your mediumistic talent, especially that phase of Trance Mediumship; arrange for a development circle and have it at least once or twice a week. Good-bye, my dear. Don't worry or grieve for me. I will help you in your development." The voice ceased.

Jennie knew that Charlie was gone but she had the consolation of knowing that he had come and had been with her and had talked to her. She knew that it was him, she recognized his voice and there was in what he had said a symbol of identification, previously agreed upon by them, many years before his passing. The above event took place in Buffalo, N. Y., at 7 a.m., just three days after his passing into the Spirit World.

Once the evidence of this survival is obtained, there is an expansion in the religious instict of man and Religion then becomes based upon a real solid foundation. FAITH has become FACT and this FACT then becomes knowledge.

The Human race was created on this Earth for a purpose and for a

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That all applications for admittance to the ministry of the Church shall require the completion of at least one of the subjects in the Seminary College of the Church.

That all members since 1945 shall be required to complete at least one subject in the Seminary College of the Church to become eligible for renewal of their papers.

That the length of membership before a member becomes eligible for the 2nd degree of the Church or the Doctor of Divinity is increased from six months to one year.

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That before a member can be elevated to the Bishopry of the Church they must have completed at least the entire Seminary Course of the College and have the Master degree of Doctor of Divine Law.

That the donation for the life membership of the first degree shall be increased from \$75.00 to \$100.00 and the application cannot be made until the member has been a member for over one year.

That the Church shall have each year an annual convention of the members and that the date shall be the week starting the 17th day of September in commemoration of the anniversary of the Founding of the Church by Dr. Kelso, and the celebration of National Constitutional Week.

That the Council of Bishops shall form a trial body to hear and pass upon any member who has been accused of any wrong-doing which has or could bring ignomy upon the Church and its membership.

That the Church shall not contract any indebtedness and in the event of dissolution for any cause, all property of the Church shall be sold and the proceeds shall be given to any worthy charity that the Council of Bishops might elect.

That this Church is not organized for profit but solely to carry out the word of God among men.

The Inter-National Constitutional Church has a Mission in this physical expression to fulfill. It was founded for this purpose and to teach Tolerance. This Mission is the direct adoration and worship of God and not through the intercession of any intermediaries. This appeal is made to the general public and especially those of higher independent thought or to those who have left, in disgust, the orthodox churches or those who have never accepted or been interested in religion. There is no desire to proselyte members of any church or to shake the faith of any individual who earnestly and sincerely believes in his or her religion and practices it.
