#### Rose Dawn's Own

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Piece by piece, a mysterious giant puzzle falls into place as archaeologists dig in many locations around the world and scientists probe for answers. One of the latest such pieces may be the answer to the riddle of Britain's Stonehenge advanced by Boston University Astronomy Pro-

fessor Gerald Hawkins.

Stonehenge, many of you will recall, is the ruin of a 97-foot circle comprised of 25-ton uprights and horizontal slabs surrounding five huge archways. Through the centuries, people have believed that Merlin transported the stones from Ireland or that Stonehenge was the work of a mystic priesthood known as the Druids constructed for ceremonial worship. It must have been important for the early people who built it to have brought the huge stones at least 20 miles and placed them as they Gid. Still, until now no answers as to its purpose and builders, other than legend or conjecture, have been given

In our day, by radio-active carbon tests it has been estimated that the age of Stonehenge is 3,500 years. Recently, Professor Hawkins used another modern method and fed information concerning the ruin into a large computer — and the result was an amazingly reasonable answer for its

purpose.

A report of his work has been published and in a review by Time magazine the computer answer is given - that the alignments between the center point of the circle and each significant archway, hole, and mound show it to be an instrument to accurately predict solar occurrences, including the first day of spring and fall and eclipses of the sun and moon. Stonehenge, according to the professor, was the focal point of the civilization who built it and the calendar from which crops were planted and harvested.

It is interesting to recall the importance of the observatory to the ancient Maya. The Maya knew the world was round centuries ago when others still thought it to be flat. Their calendar was more accurate than the one we use today. The Maya had a decimal system long before the Europeans, who got it from the Hindus. Maya Gurus (teachers) went to India and various other parts of

the world.

Is it odd coincidence that almong the clippings on my desk today are several sent by Companion William Conroy, two of which are "Stonehenge Still Remains a Mystery" and "Ancient Atlantis Was Merely a Myth"?

Is Professor Hawkins' answer to Stonehenge another piece of the puzzle to link the ancient world together? What will that puzzle show as the pieces are added and will it be completed in our time? I hope so, don't you?



Another clipping tells of the challenge to Mexico's national institute of anthropology by one of the Mexico City newspapers. Two sets of photographs were published in El Universal, one set twenty years old and a new one showing how fast the famous frescoes of Bonampak are fading. "It is incredible," the newspaperman observes, "that the Bonampak frescoes were preserved while they were lost in the jungle, yet their destruction began from the time they were discovered," and obviously hopes by such publicity to stir up sufficient interest to preserve the priceless treasures left by the ancient 'Maya'.

Thank you. Companion Mary Thompson of Illinois, for this clipping from your paper. And our thanks also to our other Companions reporting so faithfully the Mayan publicity in your

areas.

Heartening is the news of a movement in California, reported by Companion Daniel F. McLaughlin, to advance the knowledge of ancient Mayan history and culture. 



# What do YOU have in the house?

WHEN we lived in the country, after working out in the garden my father invariably came to the back door and inquired of my mother, "Dear, I'm thirsty. What do you have in the house?" It is interesting to note that through the ages one's personal needs are fulfilled according to varying and proper replies to this question.

Elisha, Israel's prophet, was approached one day by the widow of Obadiah whose creditors had collected nearly everything she owned except her two sons, and they were about to collect them. Elisha, who represents the God of Deliverance, the riches and the supply of God, takes inventory and asks the widow the question, "What have you in the house?" "Nothing . . except a jar of oil," she replied.

Elisha then instructed her.
"Go outside, borrow vessels
... and not too few. Then go

in, and shut the door upon yourself and your sons, and pour into all these vessels, and when one is full set it aside.' So she went from him and shut the door upon herself and her sons; and as she poured they brought the vessels to her. When the vessels were full, she said to her son, Bring me another vessel.' And he said to her, There is not another. Then the oil stopped flowing. She came and told the man of God, and he said, 'Go, sell the oil and pay your debts, and you and your sons can live on the rest." (II Kings 4:1-7 RSV)

THIS parable and miracle of truth, love and supply happens to us in our spiritual beings. Our inner being is the

house of God. There are times in our lives when our house is stocked with scant supplies of those things that are of vital necessity to progressive, illuminating and prosperous living. The oil of life has then run low.

We had at home a threeburner oil cooking stove called a coal oil stove. From a gallon glass container on one end the oil drained to the three wicks. At times we failed to refill the container and the light on the wicks went out. In a similar way, when we spend ourselves, our spiritual energy becomes depleted. Spiritual qualities cease to function. The transforming, renewing, revitalizing and replenishing power of our entire beings ceases to promote the good of life. The vessels of the spirit are empty because of adverse use of the substance of life. With proper stewardship, the substance is self-replenishing; negative or ill use has the opposite effect.

The story of the widow and her children is a situation in life. Our concern is to know how to replenish our house with life, light and joy. The three important vessels within our spiritual being that need to be refilled are the heart, mind and soul. The substances of oil necessary for harmonious operations of life's activities are faith for the vessel of the heart; prayer for the vessel of the mind; and love for the vessel of the soul.

FIRST, we must exercise Faith in God, our Supplier. Why do we say we need faith in God when we admit that He freely bestows His good upon us? Because our faith in Him provides the impetus with which the good comes. Faith recognizes God's good. Faith has eyes that see the resource, while unfaith and doubt are powerlessly blind.

While Abraham does not represent the fullest expression of faith, that quality within him is indicated by his willingness to obey the Voice of the Infinite. He is willing to follow the guiding hand of God when he is asked to enter into a new land. Obedience brings fulfillment, progress, abundance; life becomes a living stream of prosperity. Abraham's faith keeps bringing in the empty vessels to be filled with God's blessings.

"Now Faith," asserts the writer of Hebrews, "is the assurance of things hoped for the conviction of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1) Faith brings the substance into view. The quantity of faith is irrelevant to the quality, which is of chief importance.

SECOND, the oil that needs to be replenished is Prayer. Prayer is conversation and communion of the heart with God. We meet God in the union of prayer with an affirmation of truth. Spirit mind unites with Divine mind. To

borrow a new figure of speech from the space age, we rendezyous as two space ships, so as to unite with each other in the realm of divine existence, with the harmonious intent of uniting with the main Source of Being. who is God. Prayer is looking closer at the beauty of God with spiritual eyes. It is a kind of magnifying glass, which enlarges and enhances the supply of God in a permanent state of increase. It is the act of replenishing the body, mind and soul with spiritual power. When we become one with God, the stream of divine substance, the oil of life pours forth into our beings and creates new vitality and blessings fo: regeneration.

A lady with apparent little means explained the continuous supply with which she was blessed. "Whenever I feel I am in need of blessings. I begin blessing what I have, believing that I have what I need. Seems funny to say it this way," she explained, "but I have never lacked for food or other supplies. In my mind I see God's assembly line moving toward me, like a stream filling my life with His good."

We must establish the fact that prayer is not the drama of seeking selfishly or begging God for unmerited rewards, but chiefly wholehearted recognition of God, the Eternal Good. It is the affirmation of God's eternal and divine presence and Total Constitution of the Constitution of the

existence. Prayer declares. "God is!"

THE THIRD oil is Love — love occupying the soul. Said Paul, at the close of his famous love chapter, "The greatest is love." In the Old Testament the Hebrews were instructed through the Shema, to love:

"Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God is one Lord; and you shall love the Lord your God with all your soul, and with all your might. And these words which I command you this day shall be upon your heart; and you shall teach them diligently to your children . . ."
(Deuteronomy 6:4-7a)

Jesus said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This, is the great and first commandment. You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

(Matthew 22:37-39)

As Paul stated, "love is the greatest," so countless authorities in all fields have since echoed his banner line. Psychologist Smiley Blanton has said while "hate blinds our view and warps our talents. love releases our energies for the creative action that sustains mankind." Thus love is like a great river being poured out upon a thirsty land so plants can grow. Life re-enters the body and mind when love flows abundantly to irrigate the spiritual and mental processes. Love puts the whole being of man into a positive condition.

I OVE pours in and out, ever L refilling the reservoir of life. This is the nature of the spiritual containers of our divine temples. Thus they are not only containers, but living dispensers of the oil of life. As they function in this dramatic state of out-pouring (expressing) good and virtue to others, they are in the state of being continually filled. In a sense of the word, new vessels are incessantly being brought in. When the faith-prayer-love triangle are in full function and operation, the flow of oil (life) does not cease, but is enjoyed to the brim by the one who lives in the house.

There is no danger of a condition of poverty or spiritual foreclosure as long as right use is being made of the substance. The three activities work hand in hand with each other faithfully, prayerfully, lovingly. As these activities are in continual living rehearsal, they are being spent for benevolent reasons and the returns are inevitable.

Faithfulness, prayerful living and loving-kindness pay life's debts. One need not know any creditor. Or, in the case where debts accumulated, following forgiveness through faith, prayer and love, they are dissolved. Life is then lived in atone-ment on the remainder of the spiritual substance which knows no end.

ARE YOU down to the last? Well, what do you have in your house? What have you in your spiritual being? The answer is that you do possess a portion of the oil of life. Gather your vessels — have faith, pray, and love, Keep pouring and pouring! Keep blessing and blessing! Keep living and living! Behold, the daily miracle in your life and your affairs!



# Prayer

Pathway

Out of the stillness comes the power of achievement.

WHEN we walk down the highway to visit a friend, we know the condition and requirements of such a journey. A similar method of procedure is necessary when we travel along the pathway of prayer.

At first, there must be stated periods of prayer. This is training that helps us to grow. As our prayers become personal conversations with God, we feel His nearness, and this brings joy and happiness, Our time of labor can also be a prayer time. Faith helps us to relax and our thoughts are then in tune with God, we cease speaking and feel the Love that pervades all. With Him is wisdom and strength. He hath counsel and understanding.



super market who always rested one hand on the scale while weighing the meat for his customers. Their deceit was not confined to the heart. It couldn't stay inside where it got its start, but was revealed in a telltale/sullen face.

YOU don't have to boast of your goodness, your sacrifice, your contributions to charity — your radiant face will reveal the motivating force of your generosity, for God will show in your face.

We know you will be blessed, and join your D.M. staff in welcoming Mrs. Sharland to our "family".

THE minute Lou put her head around the kitchen door and called, "Yoo - hoo! Anybody home?" I could see she was bubbling over with news, "It's Will," she told me excitedly. "They've made him an Area Manager!"

"Why, that's wonderful!" I exclaimed.

"It sure is," she said. "It means we can have all the things we've only dreamed about. A decent car instead of that old heap, a good school for Bobby, a new television set.

Later we can even move to a better house, and Will can join the Country Club."

Truly glad for my neighbours' good fortune, the day Will drove up in his shiny new monster of a car, I was out there along with everyone else admiring its gleaming perfection. But that night over supper I remarked a little wistfully, "Our old jalopy's going to look pretty beat-up next to the Allen's, John. Couldn't we...?"

"No," said my husband firmly. "We couldn't." Then, seeing my crestfallen look, he added, "There are riches and riches, Sal. Ours are right here, around this table."

Looking at my bright-eyed, tousle-haired brood, I knew that John was right. Maybe we'd never have the material things that Will and Lou would enjoy, but in the five

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little souls God had placed in our care we had something that no amount of money could buy.

MOST of us can number an IVI Allen family among our acquaintances - people who believe that marriage was ordained for the procreation of bigger and better possessions than those owned by the folks next door. Usually the Allens" are childless. They have been too busy becoming Somebody in the neighbourhood to take time off for becoming parents. Sometimes, however, they have one child. Often he is spoiled; occasionally he is precocious: always he is lonely and shut out, an adult before his time. His parents are too preoccupied with the business of success to observe the meaning of simplicity.

These are the glaring examples of all-out One-Upmanship. But how many of us, at some time or another, have not been quilty of this failing in greater

or lesser degree?

You, Mrs. A. Didn't you talk your husband into buying that dish-washer he couldn't really afford, for no better reason than to impress that snooty woman up the road? And how about you, Mrs. B.? Did you really need a fur stole for Mary's graduation, or did you get it because Mary is always saying how Janie's Mom looks like a million dollars? The menfolk, too, are by no means guiltless in this respect. You and I both

can recall instances when we knew a man was browbeaten into joining an expensive club or otherwise putting on a front beyond his means — simply by his own inability to frankly admit he couldn't afford it. Oh, what foolish pride!

PRIDE of this sort is never a pretty thing, but if our vanity stopped short at the type of self-indulgence mentioned, little harm would have been done — except, perhaps, to ourselves. Sadly, however, we sometimes fall prey to a more vicious kind of pride — a subtler, crueller kind, and infinitely more dangerous.

That "dull slightly-stupid" junior in your department how often have you humiliated him with a deliberate showing off of your superior knowledge and efficiency? That rather unattractive girl who never seems able to get, let alone keep, a boy friend. How many times have you flaunted your conquests or flashed your engagement ring in the face of her wordless misery? Conversely, how many people have been driven through jealousy - which, after all, is only another form of pride - to lie, cheat, steal, and even kill, in their determination to be as good as, or better, than the next man?

It was pride that brought about the fall of Lucifer, and from that moment on, Lucifer has never ceased to play on this most human of our weaknesses. Even Iesus was not permitted to escape the temptation of material gain. The devil, we are told, took Him up into a high mountain and showed Him the world and all the treasures thereof: and all these things Satan offered to Him as a reward for His submission. Few of us can honestly say that there has never been a moment in our lives when we could not have done well to remember Christ's reply - "What doth it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and suffers the loss of his own soul?'

IT WOULD obviously be a I generalisation verging on the ridiculous to suggest that we are heading for eternal damnation each time we try to go one better than our neighbour. But make no mistake, there is danger in the distorted perspectives that set material gain above spiritual values. One-Upmanship is a pernicious social disease of a highly contagious nature. It can, and does, spread from individuals to communities, from communities to nations. The echoes of war still linger to remind us of the hideous depths to which mankind may be dragged by national greed and the lust for gain.

It doesn't matter at all if Mrs. Jones has a new mink coat and two cars in the garage, while we are still wearing last year's tweed and driving the old family runabout. It doesn't even matter if we have our own private dreams of prosperity and success. What does matter is that we do not allow our dreams to carry us beyond the limits of reality.

The warmth of a home where love is, the bonds of sympathy and understanding that go to make up a happy family life, the respect and affection of our loved ones—these are the things that count, the true values that make life worth the living. When God dwells in our hearts and in our homes, then we are indeed rich beyond the dreams of avarice.

BLESSED are the poor in spirit," says the Beatitude, and what a blessed place this world would be if there were no room in it for greed or covetousness. Such, unfortunately, is a counsel of perfection, and mankind has a long road to travel before it achieves this goal.

But, individually, it is within our power to root out from our minds and hearts the gnawing canker of envy. With just a little more humility, more words of thankfulness, a recounting of our blessings, each of us can make our own little corner of the world a happier

#### Righteous Christians

IF SOME time in the near future revised editions of our dictionary include the word Kedoshim, we will find its derivation is from the Hebrew word kadosh, meaning holy or righteous. A common connotation of the word at that time will probably be its reference to the righteous Christians who, during the dark days of anti-semitic rule risked their own safety and lives by saving untold numbers of Jews.

Every now and then, an item in a newspaper tells of a European coming to the United States as the guest of an individual or a group of people who owe their lives to him. When financial help is needed by this benefactor of over a quarter of a century ago, the recipients of his selflessness are only too eager to extend such help. The span of years cannot dim the sense of appreciation.

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Six million were lost, but thousands owe their lives to the efforts of Christians, neighbors and friends and sometimes only strangers, who at the time of their action had no thought of reward. Great attempts are constantly being made by grateful individuals and by groups to single out these people, and recognition comes to them in various ways.

RECENTLY in London two spinster sisters were given recognition for their efforts. Under the guise of opera lovers, traveling from London to Germany to hear the operas, they helped twenty-six Germans to escape from the Nazis.

During the Nazi occupation of France, more than four hundred Jews were able to escape before being deported to concentration camps through official papers supplied by a

clerk in the Limoges municipal office. Placing herself in even further danger, it has been revealed, she concealed many

Jews in her home.

A Catholic buggy-maker in Poland hid and saved thirty-two Jews. One of the women so concealed gave birth to a baby. Today, the buggy-maker lives in Buenos Aires, but he and his family will soon come to the United States because of the successful efforts to obtain permanent visas for them by some of the people he saved years ago.

IN THE Holy Land, in the city of Jerusalem, there is an Avenue of Righteous Gentiles. Three trees were planted in this Avenue to onor the heads of an organization which rescued Jews in Holland.

A medallion was recently created on which is inscribed: "Appreciation of the Jewish People." These medallions are awarded to Christians whose deeds are the rays of sunshine that filtered through the dark days of sorrow and martyrdom. The recipients of these medallions are called Kedoshim.

CEVERAL years after Thack-D eray's death, when Boston publisher James T. Fields sat down to write his reminiscences of the great English novelist, his feelings got the best of him. A flood of tender memories tugged at his heartstrings and. as he recalled all the happy times they had had together. the very first words Mr. Fields put down were "Dear old Thackeray!"

How deeply the writer was loved by his friends! Thackeray was like an exuberant, highspirited boy and Mr. Fields. like all his other acquaintances. fell a slave to the whims and capers of his rollicking good nature. However, the novelist's motto. "Never do today what can be put off till tomorrow," often got him into hot water with his publishers. Again and again, he would wait till the last minute to write the chapter for which thousands of magazine readers were waiting. The result was that printers were about driven frantic by his lastminute scrambles.

Thackeray once invited a large company to dinner. They were told to meet at a certain hotel where the writer said he would join them at six o'clock sharp. When the time came, the guests were all there, but their hest hadn't shown up. As the crowd were all strangers to each other, an awkward and embarrassing silence prevailed.

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# "Dear Old Thackeray"

TIALF AN HOUR passed no Thackeray, Another half-hour slipped by; still, no Thackeray. The hotel manager, the head chef and the waiters rushed in and out, crying for the host. A hungry fat man in a whisper loud enough for everybody to hear, commented that the dinner had been spoiled twenty minutes ago.

Then a merry shout was heard. It was Thackeray! He bounded in, still dressed in his morning clothes and with ink stains all over his fingers, Clapping his hands and pirouetting upon one foot, he gleefully cried. "The last page of The

Virginians has just gone to the printer!" His delight over finishing the novel was so great that the guests forgot their annoyance and turned in and made merry with him.

Like Dickens, the creator of Henry Esmond wrote nearly all his novels in monthly installments for magazines. He once confessed to Mr. Fields that, when he began a novel, he seldom knew how many persons were to figure in it, and he hadn't the slightest idea as to whether his characters would turn out good or bad. If he had been dining late and did not feel in a pleasant humor the next morning, he was inclined to make his characters villainously wicked. But if he rose serene and with an unclouded brain, there would be no end to the lovely actions he would make his men and women perform.

Once, Mr. Fields was led by Thackeray on a tour of all the houses in London where his novels had been written. The publisher never forgot that outing. When they came to a house in Young Street. Kensington, the writer spoke up in a make-believe, very solemn voice, "Down on your knees, my friend, for here Vanity Fair was penned! And I will go down with you, for I have a high opinion of that little production myself."

m HACKERAY}$  made his first visit to America during the

winter of 1852. One day, when the snow lay deep on the ground. Mr. Fields saw him plowing his way down Beacon Street in Boston, with a copy of Henry Esmond (the English edition had just been issued) under his arm.

Seeing his friend some way off. Thackeray held aloft the book and began to shout in great glee. When Mr. Fields came up, he cried, "Here is the very best I can do. I am carrying it to Prescott as a reward for having given me my first dinner in America. I stand by this book, and am willing to leave it, when I go, as my card."

When Thackeray came to America on his second and last visit, his object, as he put it, was to "lay up a pot of money" for his two daughters through a lecture tour. He was in a fair way of securing it when one evening he picked up a newspaper in which a steamer was advertised to sail the next morning for England. A wave of homesickness swept over him.

Without saying good-bye to anyone and with half his lecture engagements unfulfilled, he was gone. The first word Mr. Fields had of his sailing was the card Thackeray had hastily scribbled and left behind: "Good-bye, Fields; good-bye, Mrs. Fields: God bless everybody, says W.M.T."

Thackeray's fun-loving nature was known to all his friends, but they rarely caught a glimpse of his intense spiritual side. One person who did was the Scottish writer, Dr. John Brown, the author of Rab and His Friends, Dr. Brown never forgot what happened when the famous novelist came on a visit to Edinburgh, and he put the incident down in his own words:

ONE SUNDAY evening in December, Thackeray was walking with two friends along the Dean Road, to the west of Edinburgh. It was a lovely evening; such a sunset as one never forgets; a rich dark bar of cloud hovered over the sun. going down behind the Highland hills, lying bathed in amethystine bloom: hetween this cloud and the hills there was a narrow slip of the pure ether, of a tender, cowslip color, lucid, and as if it were the very body of heaven in its clearness; every object standing out as if etched upon the sky.

"The northwest end of Corstorphine Hill, with its trees and rocks, lay in the heart of this pure radiance; and there a wooden crane, used in the granary below, was so placed as to assume the figure of a cross. There it was, unmistakable, lifted up against the crystalline sky. All three gazed at it silently. As they gazed Thackeray gave utterance in a tremulous, gentle, and rapid voice to what all were feeling, in the word 'Calvary'! All that evening he was very gentle and serious, speaking, as he seldom did, of divine things - of death, of sin, of eternity, of salvation, expressing his simple faith in God and in his Saviour."

## CAST YOUR BREAD

#### UPON THE WATERS

NOWN on the shore of our quiet little harbor, the incoming tide brings in tiny little fish. My cat will sit down on the beach, at the edge of the water, watching these little minnows swimming back and forth and just slightly disturbing the water. The cat wants to catch them, but the idea of using bait to lure them in is out of the realm of cat-thinking. She reaches in gets a wet paw, but no fish. Cats have great patience so she will sit by the hour and keep trying.

She has the desire. She makes the effort, and she has the patience sometimes needed when we wish to bring about a manifestation of our desires; but

where does it get her?

When children come to visit us, they throw bread crumbs in the water and watch the fish nibble at them. The fish could be caught easily in a net, if the children so desired. The children know they must use something as bait, such as bread, in order to attract the fish.

WE CAN make an allegory or parable out of this. We are told to "cast thy bread upon the waters" and if we do so, it will come back to us multiplied.

The bait (bread) attracts the fish (ideas). So we cast our bread (gift, tithe, good deed, loving thought or prayer) upon the water of eternal life and we catch a fish — a God-given idea.

Now, to go back to the fisherman, who cast his bait, lowered his nets and caught fish. The fish removed from the hook or net has to be "accepted" by the fisherman. If he does not follow through after catching the fish, they are useless and wasted. He has gone out with the expectation of catching the fish so that he may put them to use.

After he accepts the fish, he has to work them over. Some are too small, some useless and must be discarded. The fisherman must know which is for his use and which to discard. We must know which thought ideas are given us by the Father, and which are useless, transient ideas.

OUR fisherman has "accepted" and culled; however, he still has work to do. He must prepare the fish—clean, scale, and trim them. We must accept and work over the idea that has been given us by God. The fish are cleaned and scaled and ready for use. Now comes the cooking and eating; the complete acceptance and proper use of the original fish.

To elaborate upon the symbology, after we have good thoughts, have prayed and done our good deeds, we must have patience and be very still—so still that we know God. Then when God, in the silence, lets us in on His secrets, we must have patience and dis-

cernment to know which part of His secret we are to use in order to bring about the particular manifestation we desire. Having culled out this idea and knowing it is right, we must then work over it and let it work for us.

When we look for the answer to the promise regarding the command to "cast thy bread upon the waters", we have to realize that truly to cast, we must do so with the knowledge that we are casting in God's waters of life. But, after casting, it is up to us to accept and use the fish our bait has been cast for.

WE MAY have been casting for a large sum of money — and if we have cast with true faith, we shall receive that money. However, it is up to us to recognize it when we first receive it. Faith is the substance of things hoped for. We have to go to Him so He may bless us with the proper ingredients for us to use to bring our dream into fulfillment. Unless we accept this gift with a spirit of thankfulness and use it, we are not letting God manifest the good He has already given us.

The artist who makes rough sketches of ideas as he receives them, has caught his fish. But it will not bring him real satisfaction, nor do the world appreciable good, unless he works over the sketches to find out which are good and should be

developed.

THE author receives ideas, but unless he gets them down on paper, works them into usable form and submits them to a publisher, they are useless,

The researcher, manufacturer, architect, and the designer — each has to accept and use his ideas to get the

desired results.

The housewife who gets up in the morning will not accomplish anything as long as she spends her time worrying about what to do first. God has given her the day, and the knowledge of how to use her time, if she

will quiet her mind and tune in to Him. A few minutes of silent prayer will be her way of casting in her waters for the right idea, a work schedule. After that, all she has to do is to start working according to her planned schedule and wonders will happen, because God is working through her to make her day an easy and worthwhile one.

If we wish to accomplish anything, there is a good or God-way to do it. Cast, accept, meditate as to the true good in our catch — then work on it

and use it!

# God Speaks to Me

THERE are times in the lives of all of us when the Higher Mind, which functions above our conscious intellect, speaks to men and women, I do not know your experiences in this way, although I am sure you have them, but I know mine.

Sometimes He speaks to me at moments when I least expect to hear Him. It could be in the midst of a pushing crowd or walking in the woods with the gentle swish of brown pine needles the only sound under my feet. Or standing under wide, limb-reaching arms, peering up at openings of blue sky through green leaves. It could be looking up at the stars on a full-moon night and feeling the infinity of God's space world. Yes. His words reach me in strange and surprising places and they come in different guises.

OFTEN 1 hear Him through the voice of another person, February-March 1966 particularly a very close friend. Somehow what the friend says strikes me with such impact and meaning that I know it is God speaking to me through the friend.

Once a very dear friend said, "Better go ahead and enroll in that correspondence course in writing. It's what you need." This ended my uncertainty, for I felt through her God was counseling me.

One reason His speaking reaches me so forcibly is the variety of ways He makes it known to me. If it were always in the same manner, I might not catch the full impact of the message.

There are times when He communicates with me by the "still, small Voice" deep inside. Some call this the subconscious mind; others call it conscience. But whatever the name or from whatever source it comes, I know, distinctly and without doubt, it is God contacting me.

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As a writer, I am constantly in search of ideas and whether God puts them into the subconscious, where they pop up at unexpected times, or whether He utters them right at the moment. I do not know. My most creative ideas come from God's direct suggestions. The suddenness of it may bring me up short when this is my first meeting with the new idea.

GOD speaks to me through the printed word. He understands how much I love words! My beloved medium of fulfillment. Reading others words, thrilling to a new concept or meaning, lighting up my mind, enlarging my thought world!

Especially through His printed word does He speak to me. "Why are ye fearful, oh ye of little faith . . . With God all things are possible . . . Peace be still . . . Be not afraid . . . Consider the lilies how they grow . . . Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these . . . As many as believed to them gave He power to become . . . As thou hast believed, so be it done unto thee . . . It is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom" and many, many other passages at different readings spark into living meaning. They stand out with far more brilliance than a neon sign, glowing before me, lighting up my spirit with a magnificence unequalled. With great clarity of mind I can feel the beat of response in my heart.

In my pursuit of the "how" of writing, learning to more effectively bring out the thought, feeling, experiences through the magic of written words, which I humbly and thankfully use as tools, I ask Gcd to teach me, guide me, how to write. The response in learning has been breath-taking and exciting. At different times, various points in the technique of writing come to me very suddenly. I call these illuminations.

DEGARDLESS of what me-A dium God uses to speak to me. I have found that the character of the message is the same - short, to the point. never any doubt about understanding it. The words are brief, the meaning clear and easily remembered. It is so plain that the message alerts me instantly to catch its full impact. It is so simple and concise. I can easily repeat it until it is recorded in my memory. This I do, fixing it in mind until I am sure not a word will be changed or escape me. Then I write it on some kind of pad, kept at

I am always amazed when God chooses me to receive His wonderful words. How blessed to know that He is this interested in my affairs. Once in one of the messages He called me daughter, I was moved to greater belief and effort by the loving term.

Many times I wonder how I can create a more receptive climate for His words. Is there any way I can tune up my spirit-receiving set to a higher wave length to hear Him more often? It is true I pray in the most communicative way I know. I seldom worry, but there are times when anxiety presses me. I try to put this away as I listen for His voice, and wait calmly for His answer.

At night, after I have made my last prayer of the day. I try to clear my mind, to shut out my earth world and its activities, which crowd my thinking. I picture the word, "God" Waiting, I listen, wondering if now is His chosen time. Sometimes He speaks, many times not, but who knows when those times will be? So I must be ready. I must invite Him by the proper conditioning, as far as I know. If He chooses some other time, then I will grasp His words at whatever time or under whatever circumstances.

I CANNOT report a dramatic time when God spoke to me warning of danger, as some of His children state He has done for them. There has been no such emergency. But I do not doubt that if I needed instant direction He would give it.

THERE was an instance once when my whole way of living was threatened and it seemed I could not continue. This happened so suddenly that I went into a room alone, closed the door and sank down in a big chair, groping, insecure, in shock, unable to think of a way out.

Suddenly there was a Presence. Although the lights were on and my eyes wide open, I could not see it, yet I recognized it with as sure a knowledge as I have ever had. I could sense its comforting nearness and feel its loving benediction. Then the Voice spoke — not out of the Presence, but inside me, "Don't worry, everything will be all right." And it was.

WHENEVER He speaks to me, I am filled with indescribable radiance and great joy. In this sharp moment of awareness I know truth, even though it be only a fragment. It is mine forever to keep, to treasure, to follow, to give out. In the reality of my being I know, This is the way, walk ye in it.

Nor will things ever be the same as they were before; for I am in a new dimension. I have taken a giant step forward in living, learning, growth and creativity.

TO A deeply endowed mystic, death is simply a passing from one plane to another; a lifting of the psychic through the various degrees of evolvement from the earth plane on toward the highest form of celestial adaptation. Through the ages, some great poets have been our truest mystics and seers. An "inner sight" allowed them to vision and understand phenomena ordinary mortals never perceive.

This faculty is especially significant when one of these mystical poets has written of the Spiritual Universe and of Immortality. The worldly and materialistically minded have not the desire nor the faculty to understand the poets' prophetic meanings, nor the metaphysical truths presented. The seen, not the unseen, is all that causes any concern for many people.

IT WOULD seem the poet's spirit, in his silent hours of meditation, frequently crosses the borderland of higher vibrations and is moved to express ultimate truths in his verse. But anyone who has enjoyed even a moment of divine perception of Universal Power has

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touched the edge of a higher vibration and had a glimpse of the Eternal,

As Lowell sat playing an organ, his music produced a mood that caused an inspired conception of his immortal poem. The Vision of Sir Launfal. "First guessed by faint auroral vista of his dream," he let his thoughts grow into a poem, revealing truths from the Infinite Realm where all great creations start.

WHO CAN doubt Wordsworth's mystical soulawakening insight into the world of things Invisible before he wrote his marvelous poem. Ode on Intimations of Immortality? How reverent but satisfying are his answers to questions that often pervade thoughtful minds above the inevitables of our immortality. He believed the soul existed in another life form before its birth into a physical body form on earth.

Wordsworth speaks of birth as an awakening of the soul from a sleep of forgetfulness of all that had gone on before and that it left "trailing clouds of glory" to enter earth life. Yet, he does say that often in early childhood some children do show they still have traces of a consciousness of another existence. This consciousness fades away as they grow older. "Heaven". Wordsworth wrote, "lies about us in our infancy" and "be these dreams what

they may, they are yet the fountain light of all our days."

John Stuart Mills is credited as saying the reading of Wordsworth's poems saved his reason and restored its balance when other means failed.

CERTAIN of Longfellow's poems disclose his unshakable belief in life hereafter and in the visitations of spirit forms to those whom they have loved on earth. Some of his lyrics are so rhythmical and hauntingly beautiful they have led composers to set them to music. Spirit-minded lovers of his poetry will recall a poem with this beginning, "When the hours of days are numbered." It is sung as a hymn in many churches.

The tragic death of the poet's beloved wife, no doubt, brought him to think most profoundly about life hereafter. When the so-called death of a loved one comes to us, it often seems that the passing of the physical contact is the most utter loss. At the time, it is hard to realize a psychical transition through which each must pass is a part of the drama of life. Longfellow truly believed in survival on another plane of existence and it must have appeared very real to him.

Spiritually, he was at his best in his lyrical poems and some of his finest works are in longer, ballad forms. His Psalm of Life is a paean of his faith in immortality and it is exult-

ant, too, in inspiration for living a good life on earth. If you haven't read this poem lately, why not read it now and feel the spiritual uplift it will give

you?

What a veritable triumph over the futility of death is recorded in his poem, Inspiria. How true Longfellow is to our human living in his poem, Resignation, where he says, There is no Death! What seems so is transition." Again, in The Building of the Ship. he said, "And in the wreck of noble lives, Something immortal still survives," for memory is part of immortality.

In another of his lovely poems, Nature, Longfellow described passing from this life to the next, and the soul's recep-

tion where it goes.

IT A POET achieves some-I thing above human comprehension, that is greatness, we say. Yet "e need not depend on our p 3 to teach us belief in the hereafter. Once we break down the wall of ignorance, built up by our hates and fears, we, too, may have flashes of divine inspiration that bring illumination and understanding of life, the interlude on earth, before transition to a higher plane. Most of the unseen becomes the seen.

Along with many great poets, we must believe that love and tenderness do endure beyond this life and.

That the tidal wave of deeper souls, Into our innermost being rolls And lifts us unawares

Out of all meaner cares."

BOUT 150 B.C., a small A company of men withdrew to a sparsely settled area near Bethlehem where they could be free to study and live simply and according to the Laws of Moses. In Wady Qumran, on the northwest end of the Sea of the Plains, later called the Dead Sea, they constructed a monastery of large square stones. The building was at least two stories high and 111 feet long by 90 feet wide, with a watch tower at each corner. On the second floor was the Scriptorium and ink from the inkwells. when tested, has proved to be the same as used in copying the Dead Sea Scrolls.

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"Holy Ones" they were called by outsiders, but the Essenes referred to themselves as Brothers. The older men were revered as Fathers or Prophets. and the young men were known as Sons or Sons of Prophets. They renounced marriage, so it was only through the admission of others who chose their life of austerity that depletion by death of the elders was offset - and yet their number grew. It is thought that at times there may have been as many as 400 Brothers living in the monastery.

THEY were a solitary Order who distinguished themselves by earnest desire for

ideal purification rather than through any social doctrine. Through study of the Scriptures, their only guide being God and the Laws of Moses, they attained the joys of mystic asceticism. One who desired to become a member must first prove his worthiness during a period of probation — living in a small hut on the grounds of the monastery and daily joining the Fathers in study, contemplation and labor.

From a common storehouse into which the fruits of their labors were gathered, their needs were supplied. The Sabbath was strictly kept. Blasphemy against God or Moses was cause for immediate capital punishment. They taught that the soul is immortal; and, when death came, they rejoiced that they were delivered from all bondage and could mount upward to their rewards.

CACH shared in the work L that made them self-sustaining. Before entering the dining hall at mealtime, they bathed and changed from their work clothes into white robes, for meals were like a sacrament, to be enjoyed quietly and reverently. Prayers were said before and after meals. When the meal and second prayer was finished, they again put on their work clothes and returned to their labor. It is believed that because of their simple vegetarian diet, and simple life, many attained great age.

Theirs was a gospel of peace and freedom: their lives a dedication to conformity with God's will. Wayfarers found refuge at their monastery, and needy children found a home within its walls, for their doors were open to all who came their way. Some of the Holy Ones went to live in the villages where it was their appointed work to care for strangers and supply food and clothing to the needy. They also supported the aged and infirm by working at some trade or agricultural pursuit.

The area of Wady Qumran shows evidence of cataclysmic upheavals. A short distance from the monastery ruins are bluffs of weird shapes and colors, pocked with large and small holes leading into caves. It was in these caves that the Dead Sea Scrolls were found. In another, tragedy was discovered - the skeletons of a man, woman and two children, who were living there during the Roman invasion of 70 A.D., it is believed. Their cave was well furnished for comfortable living, but apparently they did not dare venture outside for food when their supply was depleted, and so they perished.

ONE of the mysteries of Qumran was solved about two years ago, when what might be called a worksheet was found. It shows a map of a series of cliffs across a camel trail from the monastery and

another cliff area about a mile beyond. Between these two ranges was a fertile garden spot where the Brothers grew all sorts of vegetables and fruit. Also, two pipelines from springs were traced to the monastery — one, it is thought, from a hot spring and the other from one of cold water. On the rock wall along the trail are messages carved into the wall, some of which have not yet been deciphered.

Legends are told about John the Baptist being brought up in this monastery. His mother, Elizabeth, must have taken her little son into hiding to escape Herod's slaughter of the innocents, and the Scriptures tell us that John was brought up in the wilderness (Luke 1:80). It must be that Elizabeth and her baby were able to find refuge or they would have fallen prey to the wild dogs and jackals and other hazards present in the desert. Also, legend has it that Elizabeth died forty days after leaving her home - you remember that she was "well stricken in years" when her baby was born. If such is true, who took care of the baby in his early years? Could it be that the kind Brothers of Qumran raised John to maturity?

DETHLEHEM is less than D 15 miles from Qumran. Could it be that Jesus spent those "hidden years" at Qumran? Dr. Christian D. Ginsberg, in his "The Essenes, their History and Doctrine" - London, 1864, says: "Jesus, who in all things conformed to the Jewish law and who was Holy, harmless, undefiled and separate from sinners, would therefore naturally associate Himself with that order of Judaism which was most congenial to His Holy Nature. Moreover, the fact that Christ, with one exception, was not heard of in public until His thirtieth year, implies that He lived in seclusion with this Fraternity (the Essenes) and that, though He frequently rebuked the Scribes. Pharisees and Sadducees. He never denounced the Essenes, strongly confirms this decision."

Will archaeologists in their continuing search among the caves find the answers to these mysteries that have puzzled scholars through the ages? Per-

haps in our time?

WHEN I was a little girl, I delighted in summer visits with my grandmother on her Georgia farm. But one year as I entered my teens, my visit extended into the school year and my delight turned to misery. To vent the misery, I complained about everything.

Grandmother always listened to my complaints without comment, but one morning when I let loose a tirade of dissatisfaction, she abandoned her usual

restraint.

"Instead of complaining all the time," she said, "why don't you pray? Pray your complaints away."

"Grandmother." I pleaded.

"No. I mean it," my grandmother said. "Pray it all away. Stop complaining and pray. Pray that you can go home or be contented here."

GRANDMOTHER must have already been praying Page 50

to that effect, for that very night my parents telephoned the news that we were to be reunited. I had few complaints after that. Not until I was a young wife with two very small children and a Cocker puppy did I need my grandmother's advice acutely enough to remember it, or put it to use.

That happened when my husband's job enforced a sixmonth separation of our family. and we decided it would be more practical for the children and me to live in an apartment during his absence than to occupy the house we'd been renting. After my husband left town. I discovered our practicality had drawbacks. One of the worst was that we no longer had a safely fenced yard in which the children could play and the dog exercise. When Rebel wanted out, I had to walk him on a leash.

It was he, in fact, who

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sparked my loudest complaint. In his zest to protect us, having appointed himself our guardian when my husband went away, he began to growl at the rustle of a breeze against a drapery, or the shadow of a speck of dust beneath the apartment door.

I had always been slightly uneasy when night came, Now, Rebel's watchfulness became my undoing. By time for his last excursion each night, I was almost too terrified to open the door. The walks on the dimly lighted outskirts of the apartment building were so frightening to me that for hours afterwards I was too tense for sleep.

ONE night, I began to confess my fright in detail in a letter to my husband. As I wrote, the memory of my grandmother's voice came to me suddenly. "Instead of complaining," I seemed to hear her say, "why don't you pray? Pray your fear away."

On impulse. I tore up the half-finished letter and began to try to pray my fear away.

First, I prayed that God would protect our small family from danger and my fear of it. Later, as I walked out with Rebel, I prayed again. On previous nights, for comfort I'd gripped the handstrap on Rebel's leash as hard as I could. That night, I held the lead lightly and prayed.

Within a very few nights, I had developed a regimen that

eased my fear. Immediately after my babies had been put to bed. I sat down with my Bible, seeking and finding passages in which I seemed to find my own fear mirrored and comforted. Psalms 28 and 91 were among the many I found help-

Afterwards, freed from much of the nervousness that had previously hampered my evenings, I was able to catch up with the household tasks that couldn't be accomplished while the children were awake. Finished, I turned to the letterwriting, handwork, and reading that provided my recreation.

ALWAYS before time to walk Rebel, I prayed again. Sometimes I read from a book of prayers I had acquired. Then, as we walked, I made a concentrated effort to remember either the exact words of a prayer I had read or a Bible verse I found sustaining.

As I let myself back into the apartment after Rebel's walk one night and prepared to say my usual thanksgiving for my safe return from the excursion, the words I'd planned to say seemed insufficient. For I realized the walk had been far more than a "safe excursion". I had felt no fear at all as I left the apartment. I remembered. In fact, I'd set forth for the walk eagerly.

It was Fall. The apartment was stuffy from central heating, and I'd looked forward to a brisk walk in the fresh air. But once outside, the walk hadn't been brisk at all. I'd strolled, enjoying the sound of the crisp leaves beneath my feet, and the scent of wood smoke that came from a row of houses that bordered the apartment grounds.

Rebel became so impatient with my sauntering steps that, in pity for him and selfishness to prolong my enjoyment. I had dared to unclasp his leash and let him run free, He'd bounded ahead while I lingered counting stars, courting the slightly pleasant chill I felt between my shoulders.

NO WONDER the prayer I had intended to say seemed scanty as the full significance of the walk emerged in my mind. Freed from my fear of the dark for the first time in my life, I had seen and felt the full measure of the night God created.

I have since had many occasions to re-use and re-examine my grandmother's advice. There was one just the other day. In the night, our hotwater heater had burst, dampening the hall carpet and our family plans for a weekend vacation.

Frustration filled me as I telephoned a plumber, ordered a new heater, and cancelled our motel reservations. "Something

like this always happens when we get a little ahead." I grumbled childishly. As if to spite the house, I left the beds unmade, the dishes unwashed, and the living room untidied and sat brooding until I realized how foolish I was acting. When I did, I prayed.

WHEN I'd finished, I felt much better. As I began my household chores. I no longer rued the unexpected expense or the lost weekend. My world was suddenly too filled with other things that absorbed my attention.

As I waxed my kitchen floor, I played tag with a shaft of sunlight. While making the beds, I eavesdropped on the gossipy birds as they visited in the Mulberry tree outside the window. Dusting the living room furniture, I loitered, marveling at the grace with which a cat can occupy a hard, brick hearth.

But then, everything is marvelous after I have prayed away the fear that clouds my view of God and all His Glory. I'm sure my grandmother knew that when she told me to stop complaining and pray. For it is only when I do, that I fully comprehend the pettiness of the things I pray away, and the greatness of the gratitude and praise I want to give.

Allow it to go out, then upward into the Source of your sure deliverance.

# We Are Not Alone

"There is a mystery in human hearts ... And though we be encircled by a host ... Of those who love us well and are beloved ... To every one of us, from time to time ... There comes a sense of utter loneliness ... But those who walk with Him from day to day ... Can never know a solitary way.

- Author Unknown



HOW many of us have not at some time in our lives been touched by the cold hand of loneliness. by the bleak feeling that we were cut off from the understanding love and companionship that seems so necessary to human happiness? Few, indeed!

A sense of isolation is not always brought on by one's being separated from other people. Some will tell us that the worst feelings of lone-liness they have ever experienced occurred while they were surrounded by crowds of people. This shows that it is not proximity with others that feeds the human heart with its rightful nutriment, but a closeness to Spirit.

Someone has said that Page 54 "Loneliness is the worst disease known to man, and can, if indulged in, lead him into the most acute trouble and pain." Those who are alone and have not learned how to be happy and content, may be led into unwise thoughts and actions in their search for companionship, consequently their lives are in constant turmoil.

AFTER her husband passed on, an acquaintance of mine who had taken some interest in the study of Truth almost wrecked the good marriage of her only child before she learned how to cope with personal loneliness. I asked her recently to tell me about it, and she said:

"I simply couldn't bear to stay in my home alone for any length of time right after my husband passed on. My daughter, Grace, her husband, Jim, and their little four-year-old girl lived two blocks down the street from me. I made a habit of going to their home as soon as I thought they were up in the morning. I would have breakfast with them and often

stay until noon. Then, I would go home, generally taking my granddaughter with me for company, to rush through the little housework I bothered with and get back to Grace's where I would remain until bedtime.

"This went on for six months before I was made to realize what I was doing to my own child. One morning I arrived at my daughter's home even earlier than was my custom. The windows in the house were up, and as I neared the front steps I heard my son-in-law's voice raised in anger. Automatically, I stopped.

"I can't help it if she is lonely," Jim was almost shouting, she has no right to move in on us like this. I hardly get a minute alone with you. I can't discuss any of our personal affairs at all any more. Now, either she stays home where she belongs once in a while, or I'm getting out."

BLINDED by tears I crept back home. As I sat sobbing in a big chair in the silence of my living room, I thought my heart would break. I felt completely and utterly alone, and terribly afraid. Then, because I seemed to have nowhere else to turn for comfort, I closed my eyes and prayed, 'O God, help me!'

"Immediately, my emotions began to quiet. I reached for my Bible that lay on a nearby table; and, as if the hand of God was guiding mine, I leafed through it at random, turning to and reading these passages:

"I will not leave you desolate: I come unto you.' (John 14:18\*) 'Peace I leave with you; my peace I give unto you; not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be fearful.' (John 14:27\*)

"You will forget your misery; you will remember it as waters that have passed away.

"And your life will be brighter than the noonday; its darkness will be like the morning.

"And you will have confidence, because there is hope; you will be protected and take your rest in safety."

[10b 11:16-18\*)

"The sudden peace that flooded my heart was almost unbelievable. With that last sentence from Job lingering in my mind, I sat looking around the room. My gaze went to a small bookshelf. On it was a stack of dusty Truth literature. I went over and picked up several of the periodicals and sat down to read them, looking up from their pages only when I heard my telephone ring. It was my daughter, asking why I hadn't come down that morning. With a joyful heart I cheerfully told her that I had many duties around the house that I had neglected too long and that I was now ready to start living my own life again.

"'Mother!' Grace said, puzzled. 'Is anything wrong? You sound so different.'

"No, darling," I assured her, nothing is wrong. Everything is all right again. I've found the best companion there is—God."

"Oh, Mother," Grace said, half laughing, half crying, 'I knew you would. I knew you couldn't have forgotten all the things you taught me about God's being able to help us in any kind of trouble."

FROM that day on, I rarely visited my daughter and her family unless I was invited, but that was quite often, My son-in-law, now comfortable and relaxed in my more poised and cheerful presence, often drops in to chat with me and has assured me that he is always happy to have me in their home. Friends, who I realized had been avoiding me because of my morbid attitude, also started visiting me again.

'Isn't it wonderful how when we turn to God for comfort and companionship in the spiritual realm, 'all these things' are added to us on the material plane? Faithfully studying Truth and daily practicing the realization of God's omnipresence have brought me an increasing awareness that I am never really alone. Whatever my need, God not only fulfills that need. God is the fulfillment of that need. Whenever I feel the old sense of loneliness trying to claim my attention, I affirm: God is all things to all men; God is all things to me; He is my father, mother, sister, brother, friend — yes, even my husband, 'Thy Maker is thine husband.' (Isaiah 54:5) God is my strong protection, and the supply of all my material needs, and He loves me with a love more infinitely tender and true than that of which any human being is capable."

THERE are other wonderful I experiences of how people have overcome loneliness by turning to God for company and companionship. An elderly mother who found it necessary to enter a home for the aged, told me that the sense of lonely exile experienced the first few days of her stay there was too agonizing for words. Then, turning to God for relief, she suddenly realized that she could think of her new home - where she was free of any responsibility for others - as a quiet sanctuary, as a place to do something she had always wished she had the time for, an extended study of the Bible and other religious works. Through her new realization, she has opened up for herself a whole new realm of thought and a beautiful new life in which all sense of loneliness has faded like mist before the morning sun.

Perhaps no one has ever believed himself to be more completely alone than did the great explorer Richard E. Byrd, author of the book Alone. Terribly ill, constantly fighting off complete despair, he spent many, many months cut off from the rest of humanity. locked in the vast dark "refrigerator" called the Ross Ice Barrier, between Little America and the South Pole. Then, at his mind's and body's lowest ebb, in a moment when he was convinced that he had no chance of survival, he found that man is never alone. He wrote: "There is an Intelligence . . . and it is all pervading . . . Though I am cut off from human beings. I am not alone."

Perceiving these great truths, feeling the harmonizing presence of God, surely saved this great man's reason and gave him the ability to sleep and the strength to hold out until he was rescued and brought back to civilization with the valuable data he had set out to obtain.

TO COMPANION with God, to abide in a consciousness that holds steadfastly to the beautiful, the good, and the true is to live with peace and joy, is not only to welcome human love and friendship with more open arms but to bid them good-bye with the same unclinging poise. Yes, truly — "Those who walk with Him from day to day . . . Can never know a solitary way."

No human counsel can compare with that which comes when we rely wholly upon the true Self, when we ask for guidance from the Divine presence and follow It without question. We can claim this Divine Guidance every hour and thus meet all responsibilities with courage and intelligence. There is no darkness in which His light does not shine and no knowledge that He does not possess. Let us trust ourselves fully to this Divine Guidance.

Psalms 107:20

THERE IS A Healing Presence within each one, but the only way this Healing Presence can create for us is through the images of our thought, through the beliefs which we entertain. The time is coming when we shall be embarrassed to admit sickness or poverty, for we shall have learned that the false condition of body or affairs is but an effect, the visible evidence that we have held false ideas about being. If, in ignorance, we have believed that we are bound by external conditions, we need but to remember who we are and declare that we will this day move into our rightful inheritance, our legacy of health, abundance and harmony. Our companionship with the Great Physician within us is sufficient to heal any belief that we might experience, physical inharmony or limitation in our affairs.

It is BY MEANS of prayer and meditation that we become attuned to the power and love of God. By these means, we put aside that which does not allow the free flow of the Power of God through us, because we establish the perfect faith that knows that God always hears the voice of His children. We learn to become of the radiance and the wholeness of Spirit and know that the Intelligence within us will always bring to pass that for which we pray when unhampered by thoughts of personal weakness. It is only when we cut ourselves off from the inflow of power through lack of faith, that we experience moments of separateness. When we recognize our complete unity with the Father in quiet confidence, we come to say, as did Jesus, "Father, I thank Thee that Thou hast heard me."

Psalms 119:2

WE HAVE BEEN taught to believe that "they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength." Now, we understand that we are keeping His testimonies and seeking Him with our whole heart when we affirm that the law of our life is a law of freedom. This Law, which is the very center of our being, is creative. When we become completely unified with the nature of God, it becomes possible for us to unconsciously express Goodness. To affirm the presence of His good is to use the law within ourselves for the creation of the good which we affirm. God is the Divine Urge within each one, compelling us to strive for greater understanding of our Creator. Insofar as our word is that of Truth, our word becomes His word. The Spirit working through each one is the Presence of Peace and manifests joy in all that we do.

THE WORD, CHRIST, is an occult term meaning one's awareness of himself as a definite part of the Universal. Jesus referred to this when He said, "I and My Father are one." Since there is but one Mind, then our minds must be part of this one Mind; and since this one Mind is the only intelligence, within us we contact the Source of all knowledge. We can use this knowledge for guidance in whatever problems confront us. Every problem has a correct solution and, as we are one with all the Intelligence there is, we know this solution is now manifesting in and through us in the perfect action. The Christ Mind is sufficient to meet every need and this intelligence of the Christ Mind in each of us solves every problem before us, so there need never be any confusion or uncertainty.

SINCE GOD KNOWS only perfection, then we should know that His will can be only the best of everything for His children. When we experience inharmony, it is the result of our wrong thinking. Realizing this, we should then endeavor to align ourselves with the only reality, perfect harmony. When we see suffering and inharmony, we must realize that these conditions are not the result of the Father's will and should set to work to change them by speaking the word of truth. Then, we change our minds from apparent inharmony to peace, health and plenty, and these will become objectified in our lives and conditions. How grateful we should be for the knowledge that the Father, Creative Mind, wills only the good for all of His creatures. Let us never fear to pray, "Thy will be done," for "Thy will" is only the perfect will.

Proverbs 13:21

If WE WOULD have good come to us we must exercise care that nothing but good goes from us. Before a workman is worthy of increase in pay, he must increase the quality of his workmanship. If we would have love extended to us, we must give more love. If we receive, we must give, for by giving we make ourselves open and receptive to more good. If we find, at times, that we seem to attract unwanted situations, our first step is to discover the reason. The reason is always within ourselves, for whatever comes to us is indicative of that which we send out. So, in order to receive the highest good, let us give the very best that is within us. When we have become a good giver, we must become a channel for good receiving. When we learn how to give, we learn how to receive.

AFFIRMATION: I Give And Receive Only That Which Is Good.

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Daily Meditation

Execute the judgment of truth and peace in your gates.

Zechariah 8:16

THE GATES HERE referred to represent the place in our consciousness where the Divine flows into the human. The light which the artists of old sometimes painted around people represents the lifting up of these gates. Illumination is a reality and is what Jesus meant when He said, "Let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father which is in heaven." We today may lift up our consciousness, may open these gates and know that the King of Glory will come in. We can keep this inner light trimmed and burning so that the Christ, our true selves, will enter these gates. We will find a divine light radiating from everything. In this light which arises from the center of everything, there is no darkness and in this light we shall see only light.

AFFIRMATION: I Open The Gates Of My Consciousness To The Christ Light.

March 3, 1966

There shall no evil befall thee.

Psalms 91:10

OUR ONLY PLACE of security from evil is under the shadow of God's love. We find this place by refusing to see evil, by looking for and finding only the good which is the Real. It is up to each individual whether he will live under the protection of God or be conscious of the negative side of life, the evil. Whenever there is the thought of the reality of evil in our minds, the unrealities of the world seem just as real as the true. When our eye becomes single to the truth, we are able to look beyond the false and unreal into the realm of Spirit, the real and lasting. With the coming of Truth, we discover our power to create only the good and that our thought is the foundation of everything that appears in our scope of experience. Then, we arrive at the place where no evil can befall us and we are secure.

AFFIRMATION: I Am Safe In The Reality Of God's Goodness.

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So God created man in His own image.

THROUGH OUR IMAGING faculty, we have the power to behold our true selves and see ourselves as sons of God created in the image of the Father. This power of visualizing may be used constructively or destructively. We may picture failure and disease, or success and health. We may see ourselves as bound by race thought to weakness and poverty, or we may behold ourselves as we are in Truth, victors over every limitation. The eye of the mind, this visional sense, must be kept free from any cloud of error. The lens of the mind's eye must be kept clear as we would keep the lens of a field glass. To demonstrate perfection, we must think perfection and see perfection. We must keep the eye single to the truth of our own innate perfection as a child of the Father who is always perfect.

AFFIRMATION: I See Myself As The Image Of God, Whole And Perfect.

Meditation Lesson

March 5, 1966

A faithful man shall abound with blessings.

Proverbs 28:20

SOME PERSONS HAVE the erroneous idea that faith has to do only with one's religious experience. Faith is a faculty of the mind that finds the fullest expression in one's spiritual life; yet, it should be developed in all phases of man's experience. In order that conditions may change in our lives, it is necessary that we have faith in the Law of Mind. We must have faith in ourselves if we hope to achieve our desires. With Truth as a basis, we do not have a blind faith, but a faith founded upon a knowledge which comes from experience. We know that the Creator's attitude toward us is always beneficent. He can know us only as an integral part of His own perfection. Therefore, we may expect wholeness in our bodies, harmony in all our affairs. Then may we refuse to allow any suggestion of negative feeling to come to us from any source.

AFFIRMATION: I Perceive Wholeness And Harmony In My Body And Affairs. KNOWING THE SOURCE of our life is God, we divest ourselves of the belief that life can diminish or become lost. The life of God, which is our life, never decreases or changes. It is deathless and eternal. To enjoy greater expansion of life, we must build into our consciousness the belief in the more abundant life. All thought of limitation, for either ourselves or others, must be erased from the mind. When we think of any person's failure to demonstrate the good, we turn the vision from abundance to failure. When one loses hold on life and allows his vision to be directed away from life, he makes a break between mind and body and the higher forces are shut off. In Truth, we give much thought to life and to the spiritualizing of the body, thus manifesting daily more and more of the Christ life.

AFFIRMATION: God In The Midst Of Me Is Eternal Life.

Meditation Lesson

March 7, 1966

Casting all your care upon Him.

I Peter 5:7

WE SOMETIMES FIND our mental burdens heavier and harder to carry than our physical burdens. The sad thing about this is that the things we carry about are imaginary ones and seldom come to pass. There is only one way in which we can become free from sorrow and anxiety and that is by breaking the habit of letting the mind run in those channels. Worry is a habit and it often becomes such a master that we worry over every situation that comes to hand. When we discipline our minds so that we give no thought to this habit of worry, we feel the peace and assurance of Spirit. With this peace established in our lives, we no longer feel inclined to fear things, people or conditions which once filled our minds with anxiety. As worry became a habit through negative thinking, so that habit may be broken through positive and constructive thinking.

AFFIRMATION: I Cast All My Burdens Upon The Lord And Am At Peace.

I will show thee my faith by my works.

UNLESS TRUTH is a demonstrable science, having definite and accurate principle which can be applied when the need arises, it is of little use. Scme, when coming into the understanding of Spirit, feel that it is their duty to convert others to their way of thinking. But they can do more to spread the beauty of Truth by avoiding argument and by letting their own actions stand forth as the best proponent of their understanding. By demonstrating health, harmony and abundance in our own lives, others will be drawn to that way of life, for it is innate in every person to long for the good. In time, others will be led to seek this understanding. It is far better for us to wait until others come to us of their own free will than it is to try to force upon them what we may know is for their greater advancement.

TRUTH BRINGS into our lives an entirely new outlook. We come to see everything in a new light and life takes on a more vital meaning. Instead of seeing the limitations of others, we set out to inspire them to a nobler way of living. Once having glimpsed this new vision, let us never drop back into the habit of thinking of ourselves or others in the light of human short-comings. Our divine heritage gives to all the limitless power of the Spirit, but we must be true to the high vision of Spirit and behold the Christ in all men. As we develop this higher way of life, we will find that others come to look upon us as friends and brothers.

March 10, 1966 III John, 2nd vs.

THERE ARE MANY who think of Christianity as applying solely to the affairs of spirit. They fail to understand that mental peace, health and success have any relation to Spirit and its application. Truth teaches the threefold development of man; in fact, there can be no complete wholeness of man if one or two of these phases of development should be neglected. Order and prosperity in outward affairs are necessary if we show that we have worked out certain principles in our relation to external conditions and to people. When we demonstrate prosperity without having attained mental peace or bodily health, we have only made part of our demonstration. Real demonstration comes when we express ourselves on every phase of being. Only as we develop a well-rounded state of being, do we give God full expression in and through us, for God expresses Himself through our threefold expression of Himself.

AFFIRMATION: In Body, Mind And Spirit I Strive To Express

Meditation Lesson

March 11, 1966

A sower went out to sow his seed.

Luke 8:5

THE SEED REFERRED to here is man's thoughts and his spoken word. We are constantly sowing seeds, speaking the word, sending forth thoughts which may bring peace and happiness, or unrest and sorrow, to someone. Many times, our word of Truth may enter a mind not yet ready to receive it and lie dormant until it seems that it had fallen on barren ground. But the ray of Truth, feeble though it may be, grows brighter and, after a time, the mind of that one opens to receive the Christ Spirit within himself. Gradually, the light becomes stronger and the seeker's understanding unfolds so that he catches the vision of his mission in life, that he is a sower in the vineyard of God's kingdom and must scatter forth his seed into the minds of others that they, too, may discern their Christ Spirit and become sowers of the good seed.

Those people are just as disloyal to themselves and to the Christ as they are when they speak destructively of others. Truth is impersonal and applies to all alike who seek to greater understanding.

March 13, 1966 John 12:32

INTIL WE HAVE uplifted ourselves, we cannot uplift others. Before we can become a teacher or a leader, we must have shown by our lives that we are worthy to become a "fisher of men." When we have done this work in our own lives, we will not need to exert ourselves to help others, for they will follow readily that one who lives what he preaches. If we would become leaders of others, we must first find the Christ within ourselves. We must know that Christ is really within us before we are ready to point the way for others to find the Christ within themselves. Through being lifted up, Jesus exerted a strong drawing power upon others. They were drawn from earthly things to spiritual things. Their consciousness became changed from limitation and disease to abundance and health. He had shown the way for others through the drawing power of His own life. AFFIRMATION: I Work To Become A Way Of Truth For Others To Follow.

WHEN WE WITHDRAW our thoughts from the confusion of the world and realize that in the One Universal Mind there is peace, order and joy, then we find Reality. Here, in the consciousness of Reality, is the supply for our every need, physical, mental and spiritual and we accept that supply with loving gratitude. This is the way life fulfills our needs, through the doorway of our inner selves. Each of us may come to this Fountain of Supply, which is the very center of our being, and we may absorb that which we need as we become filled with the sense of the Reality of that which we desire. Filled with the knowledge of this Reality, we permit It to flow into our world of thought and action, knowing that it brings peace and harmony to those around us. It flows from us into all the lives we touch and they, too, become filled.

AFFIRMATION: Through The Christ I Enter The Realm Of Reality.

Meditation Lesson
I will not leave you comfortless.

March 15, 1966 John 14:18

WHEN WE HAVE once learned to rely upon the presence of God, we can no longer feel alone. We sense this presence of God by first having sensed a great peace. All mental tension is relaxed and every care seems to have passed away. We come to feel joy by reversing the adverse thought. Sorrow becomes changed to joy; depression is changed to exhilaration. These changes come through our change of thought. Nothing outside can give us happiness if our minds are closed to the thought of joy. Many people lack this joy because they look to external conditions to bring it; yet, joy is from within and each must look within to find the source of real happiness. When Jesus said He would not leave us desolate, He referred to the Presence of the Father within, for, once having sensed that Presence, He knew that we could never again feel desolate and alone.

AFFIRMATION: The Presence Of The Christ Within Is My Joy And Comfort.

Job 22:25

T IS WITHIN the power of each one to manifest supply whenever he may need it. We have but to turn to God within us and realize that He is our supply and our support, the substance of our substance. When we learn to look to Him for the necessities and comforts of life, poverty disappears and we come into the way of life for which God created us. Truth reveals to us His gift to man — God, Himself, in whatever form He can best serve His children. We are no nearer God when we are poor and suffering. Famines and panics do not work for the spiritual outpouring, for these are not of the Spirit, but man's own limited and wrong understanding. We attain God's ideal for us only when we are able to live fully and completely on all planes of existence. Poverty and suffering have no place in the fullness of God's perfect world.

Matthew 13:16

WHEN WE FEEL the need for a treatment for the eyes, we should relax and know the truth about our eyes. We should meditate upon the truth that Spirit within has power to see all things clearly and perfectly. When the sight seems clouded, we need a clearer understanding of the true nature of sight. Our eyes supply our contact with the world about us. They must be healthy and strong in order to give us true impressions. We should always think of our eyes as able to see clearly and distinctly without any strain on our part. We must look at things with the assurance that we can see them through the perfect eyes of Spirit. Let us never have any thought of condemnation for our eyes, but bless them for the perfect service they give us. Let us learn to think of them as God's eyes seeing the world of Reality through us.

T IS WELL that we often stop and think what our Divine inheritance means. It is the certainty that God is our life, our supply and our protection. When we doubt our divine heritage, we cut ourselves off from that which is our Father's. Looking upon our inheritance as coming from God, our thought is turned away from the appearance of so-called evil and placed upon the All Good. Nothing of evil can come from Him, so we can inherit only good. We know that the success which we need is ours because God is the source of all success. As Law and Order, system and accuracy are a part of the kingdom of God, our success includes all of these. Being joint-heirs with Christ, the God in us, the God as us, is Success. There is no failure of any good desire in the Mind of the Infinite.

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AVING ONCE discovered Truth, our next step is to use it as the disciplinary principle to control our thoughts, words and deeds. When we have learned the truth about health, there need be no excuse for thinking disease. That within man which often causes him to "about face" is known by various names. Some call it "that something," some speak of it as "conscience," while others speak of it as "the Spirit of God." It is only when we have learned the importance of a standard for what we do that we are ready to be governed by divine principle. Our thoughts and words have such a far-reaching effect upon our lives for establishing either evil or good that it is essential to conform to a standard which brings forth only the good. There is an absolute truth about man which does not change. The principle of truth is always the same.

PROSPERITY IS increased by blessing it. There is a mystical force in blessing which causes those we have to be increased and multiplied. The consciousness which is opened to express appreciation for a blessing is also opened and ready to receive more blessings. More blessings come to us when we believe the promises that He will pour out more blessings to those who believe. Our prosperity is limited only by our limited thought and vision. Through limited thought and vision, we have the power to shut off the flow of good into our daily lives. As like attracts like, so blessings attract blessings. The good which we already have acts as a magnet for other good. When prosperity begins to come, we find many avenues for greater prosperity opening. The one who entertains those negative thoughts has but himself to blame, for he alone decides whether his thought shall be for good or evil. Some may feel that God tempts them in order to test them as to their strength, but God does not work in that way. God never tempts any one to sin. In no way could the principle of Truth be responsible for deviation from that principle. The principle of Truth can never cause anyone to be involved in error. Our thought must always be of God as our standard for righteousness and never as in any way the cause of evil. We should ever seek to live so that the Christ within may come forth in our lives and, in that way, are we masters over self.

## The Greatest Life

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
