The Plumb-line of Commercial Integrity.

NO REASONABLE man would regard a conclusion satisfactory, that was founded upon a premise not demonstrated. The genuine reasoner will prove his first step—his premise: the premise taken out of the field of assumption and doubt, becomes the foundation of a train of sequences which leads to a legitimate conclusion. If the premise be demonstrated, and the train of deductive reasoning is perfect, then the conclusion is reliable. No scientific man lives who dares announce the premise of the Copernican system proven. All so called scientists who are honest, declare the premise of the Copernican system an assumption. As Professor Harkness of the United States Naval Observatory said to us personally, "We have to assume something," when in conversation regarding the Koreshan Cosmogony and the uncertainty of the Copernican system of astronomy. When a "scientific" man is forced to confess that his pretended scientific acquisitions are mere assumptions, he certainly is not entitled to the dignified appellation of scientist.

We have taken the question of *science* (knowledge) entirely out of the domain of assumption into the field of absolute certainty, the first step being the collocation of the plumb-line, chord, and arc, mechanically and geometrically applied, as the most simple element in the establishment of a premise of application and argument. We are enabled, therefore, to predicate, upon the principles and laws of cosmic construction, our system of spirito-natural religion, and thence our system of social science, involving in a grand incorporation of organic order the all-embracing field of universal unity, couched in the comprehensive term of Universology.

The man who assumes that the true system of astronomy can be separated from the true religion and a co-ordinate social science, is a fool;—but as he cannot help it, we commiserate him. There can be no system of lasting social science not predicated upon the *knowledge* of the laws and principles of cosmic construction and order; nor can there be any system of social organic unity not established in and predicated upon the principle of centralization,—Imperio-Democracy, an imperialistic Republicanism, not of the devil, as are the republicanisms and democracies of the present world and time, but of God.

All the relations of the cosmic structure and the activities of its functions co-ordinately harmonize, because there is a central source of form and motion. The system is a universal unity, because regulated from and by the co-ordinate power of a central point of unity. In fact, that which is called the physical universe (the alchemico-organic world) is an imperial structure with imperialistic functions, its only democracy residing in the freedom of its motions in harmonization with all other motions; its liberties directed by the all-pervading co-ordinations which preclude encroachment, obstruction, and chaos, and its perpetuity engendered through its powers of restraint, liberty, adjustment, and appropriation, subject to the imperial nucleus of its governing energy.

The cause of being is one; therefore all its departments of structural distinction are cognate and supremely co-ordinate. The form is one, universal and limited. Given a knowledge of this form with its function, we possess a knowledge of the pattern after which the organic unity of society shall be structured, to embrace the laws of structured social perfection and perpetuity. Our point of rational deduction is the plumbline, our logical conclusion the Cellular Cosmogony, and our social fabric must conform in function to this alchemico-organic pattern. As the plumb-line is the starting point of geometric perfection, so the moral plumb-line must constitute the basis of an organically perfect social fabric.

Our knowledge of the geometric figure upon which all

accurate earth measurements are instituted, and consequently our knowledge of the construction and laws of order in the alchemico-organic cosmos, must determine our comprehension of the laws of God, our relation to him and his relation to us, and therefore the relation of man to man.

Manifestation and Destiny of the "Man of Sin."

I am at a loss to understand what Paul means when he says: "Then shall that Wicked be revealed, whom the Lord shall consume with the spirit of his mouth, and shall destroy with the brightness of his coming: even him, whose coming is after the working of Satan, with all power, and signs, and lying wonders." Can it be possible that he refers to the "man of sin" in this statement? And if so, what does it all mean? -* *

'HE LORD descended into the race and took upon himself the sins of the world; therefore he became the "Man of Sin." Is this understood? His coming is the process of regeneration in which is involved all the powers of Antichrist, for the Christ, in his descent into the hells, assumes all the conditions of the hells. He becomes wicked because he is made to be sin, who in his personality nineteen hundred years ago knew (had) no sin. His coming down through the Christian age is after the working of Satan, because he became Satan, with all power, and signs, and lying wonders. The Lord Christ becomes Antichrist, but when born at the end of the appointed time, born in sin and shapen in iniquity, the Truth destroys his wickedness by the brightness of its coming, and that which is wicked is transformed to righteousness. See Zechariah, third chapter.

"And he showed me Joshua [Saviour] the high priest standing before the angel of the Lord, and Satan standing at his right hand to resist him. And the Lord said unto Satan, the Lord rebuke thee, O Satan; even the Lord that hath chosen Jerusalem, rebuke thee: is not this a brand plucked cut of the fire? Now Joshua [Saviour] was clothed with filthy garments [sin, unrighteousness, having become 'the man of sin' whose coming was after the working of Satan, because Satan is an essential factor in spiritual progression], and stood before the angel. And he answered and spake unto those that stood before him, saying, take away the filthy garments from him. And unto him he said, behold, I have caused thine iniquity to pass from thee, and I will clothe thee with change of raiment."

Let the inquirer read the entire chapter, and know that the Branch that is brought forth, the *Stone* upon which are seven eyes, the seven Spirits of God, is the man Joshua (Saviour), who stood before the angel in filthy garments, and whose iniquity was changed to righteousness by the brightness of the Lord's manifestation *in* the "man of sin."

This is our God and our Lord, and we honor and glorify his name. Potentates Sniff the Wind.

Fears the United States.-Writer in a Russian Paper Says all Monarchies are in Danger.

Moscow, Nov. 22.—M. Prawdin, of St. Petersburg, has an article in the *Messenger*, in which, under the title, "American Messianism," he warns the monarchies of Europe that they must at all costs check the United States' dangerous influence. Under the guise, he says, of a mission of liberation, the American republic conceals an itching desire to create republics where monarchies now exist. With the success of this policy, M. Prawdin declares, may be expected the disappearance of the potentates of the universe, and the placing in the hands of the United States, of a world-wide commercial monopoly and political dictatorship.—Arnold Lewis Gillan, in *Chicago Record*.

All monarchies throughout the world will yield to the divine Kingdom to arise from, and have its nucleus in what is now the United States. Like all other governments, the United States will yield to the inevitable and succumb to the Kingdom of righteousness about to be established, and in which will be fulfilled the prediction of the Lord's coming. THE ABOVE is a sample of the shallow apologies for wrong, that are now common. How could the fact that the "western cow boy and college athlete and millionaire" fell in the ranks fighting on the same battle-field, as stated, prove that the government is not run in the interests of the few and against those of the many?

Just before his assassination, Lincoln wrote the following: "I see in the near future, a crisis arising that unnerves me, and causes me to tremble for the safety of my country. As a result of the war, corporations have been enthroned, and an era of corruption in high places will follow, and the money power of the country will endeavor to prolong its reign by working upon the prej. udices of the people, until all wealth is aggregated in a few hands, and the republic is destroyed. I feel, at this point, more anxiety for the safety of my country than ever before, even in the midst of the war."

So prophetic have been those gloomy forebodings, that today we find several millions of a once well-to-do and prosperous people, transformed to tramps and beggars by that relentless power. In the Editorial Perspective.

THE EDITOR.

O-OPERATION is becoming popular, and many prominent men are advocating the principle of co-operation against that of competism. Thirty years ago, the man who suggested co-operation was tabooed as a social fanatic; there has been quite a change. Now, it is the foremost question in all social reform circles. Even the Chicago University club favors cooperation! In a recent meeting, it was said that co-operative evolution must correct modern evils, or disastrous revolution would follow. Such an announcement evinces ignorance of the law of dispensational progress and the revolutionary vortices necessary to break up, instead of reform, old institutions. The kind of co-operation advocated on the popular platform will never reform anything. It is not enough to use the word cooperation. The root of the difficulty must be found and eradicated; and this root resides in the deep recesses of the human mind and heart, and the work must begin there! The fact that co-operation, when pregnant with the spirit of commercial activity, headed by competent leadership and direction, is successful, may be seen in all the great corporations and systems where thousands of men co-operate to enrich the few. This is cooperation filled with the spirit of competism; it is the co-operation of hell. Genuine co-operation for the benefit of humanity demands the love of the neighbor; the system that will save the world will not grow out of ignorance, sensuality, and selfishness. Purity of mind and purpose alone can focalize and utilize the highest, finest, and most potent energies of man for the noble work of establishing the universal Co-operation and Communism of the Christ.

The Geodetic Survey conducted by the Koreshan Scientific Staff on the Gulf coast of Florida, fulfils the demands of rational mental activity in the consideration of the subject of a test of the earth's true contour. Fifteen years ago he pointed to the small village of Tampa, Fla., and said: "There we will have a city; there, across the river, I will build one of the greatest hotels of the world." Since that time, through the manipulation of the wealth produced by his 12,000 employes in the construction of converging railways and the plying of steamers from various points to the port of Tampa, he has fulfiled his own prophecy. Five years ago the Founder of Koreshanity pointed to a small tract of land by the Estero river and said: "There I will build the greatest city of the world, the cosmopolitan City of the Golden Age." Koreshanity involves far more superior motives than the Plant System; involves possibilities a million-fold greater, and will produce corresponding results, through the institution of righteous communism and cooperation, as the result of which, the wealth of the world will yield its highest products for the blessing of humanity.

Thousands of people witnessed the usual November meteoric showers this year. A particular fact was observed to which we desire to call attention, which is not at all compatible with the idea of the earth revolving through space like a gigantic cannon ball. Astronomers suggest that the earth runs into the orbit of meteors once a year; the stream strikes our atmosphere, friction fuses the flying missiles, and the flashes result. If the earth were whirling rapidly, revolving its atmosphere with it, is it likely that the meteoric stream would pour down into the atmosphere at one point only? The fact observed in all these November showers, and especially every cycle of thirty-three years, is that the meteors pour down from the constellation Leo. This year, four nights in succession, the leonids were visible. They did constitute a meteoric stream; but that stream had its source. and it empties into the gulf of our atmosphere. Leo is the funnel of descent of surplus energies which produce the display.

America is the racial focus of the world. In the new world there are peoples from every nation, representing all principal religions and languages. America is the nation of destiny, the nation in which freedom is born, to flow out to all the world. It contains the site of the New Jerusalem, the city of the Messiah of the new dispensation. In *Judge*, of November 26, we see a striking cartoon, "Uncle Sam's Strong Face," made up of characters of all nations arranged in the form of a human face. In Chicago alone, over fifty different languages are spoken by people from every principal geographical division of the world. The new man involved in America will be the *composite* man. Evolution and involution are co-ordinates in the propagation of life. The Almighty makes of *one blood* all nations of the earth; then, as he did nineteen hundred years ago, he makes *one man* of *all bloods* of the world.

A modern writer has said that "fifty years hence the professors of theological colleges will be endeavoring to prove, not transubstantiation, but the existence of God." These words are uttered in the hopelessness of the condition of the modern church. The work of disintegration of modern religious institutions is progressing rapidly. The leaders of the Protestant world today are becoming skeptical of the Bible, and are demanding that the existence of God be scientifically demonstrated. The modern clergy are forming a gigantic syndicate of "higher criticism" of the Bible, on the ground that modern science is true. If modern science cannot demonstrate the existence of the kind of a god they desire, they do not want the demonstration !

The world is surprised at the rapid acceleration of all forces in the United States of America. The spirit of supremacy is manifest in a marked degree, ready to compete with the world. Diplomatic circles everywhere are engaged in the discussion of the "United States as a great sea power." First Impressions of Investigators of Koreshan Universology.

Confronts an Array of Puzzling Questions.

Editor FLAMING SWORD: The "First Impressions" of the CELLULAR COSMOGONY so far published, are all favorable. I want to hear unfavorable ones; for only those will draw out new truths or further explanations. A friend of mine in a distant state, who edits a magazine and has published several philosophical books, and to whom I sent a copy of the CELLULAR COS-MOGONY, writes me a few of his impressions:

"On page 15, the author formulates an axiom. The same axiom can be made as to time and space as well as form; and yet no intelligent man can think of a limit of time or space. Again, if the earth is a hollow sphere, what is there outside of the crust? Is it a hollow globe floating in space, and has space limitation? The mind of man cannot think of limitation, for a limit is limited by something, either by a solid, or by space. So that the argument that the universe has limitation is false, whether the earth is a *solid* globe floating through space, or a *hollow* globe floating through space, or a *hollow* within an enclosed solid mass.

"Probably, however, the best proof that his theory is not correct, is that for several hundred years all geographical and astronomical calculations have been made upon the theory that the sun, moon, and stars have weight and motion, and that these calculations prove in the main correct. When astronomers find perturbations in the march of planets, and calculate that they are due to attraction of other planets. yet undiscovered; and when with better instruments they do discover the planet they had located by its influence upon others, to me it is strong proof that they are right. Again, I see nothing in the book to account for the ice at the poles, or the heat at the equator.

"I never deny anything; but for my part, I will wait to even take such a theory into consideration, till I am satisfied that a man standing on the shore of the sea can be made to see with a strong telescope, the sea-shore one hundred miles away, and that to see it he will have to raise, and not lower his telescope."

As it is the continual dropping that wears away the stone, perhaps you will be willing to again answer these objections. While you have clearly demonstrated to my mind that we are inside a sphere, there necessarily arise many puzzling questions, which I trust you will sometime find time to answer,-if you think the questions of general interest. For instance: What causes volcanoes? What keeps up the heat in the crust, that is manifested by volcanoes in different parts of of the crust, for so long a period of years. or from eternity, if that crust is but 100 miles thick, and composed mostly of metals? We are told that it is a fact that the temperature increases about one degree for every sixty feet that we go into the earth's crust. At what depth does this increase cease, and how do you know it? How have men determined that the curvature of the earth is about eight inches to the mile, with their false idea as to which side of the curve we are on? Your method would seem to me to be the only obviously correct one. But evidently it has never been used before.

I briefly stated your proposition to one of the brainiest, brightest mechanics and inventors I ever met, and he said there was "no gainsaying your demonstration, providing your Rectilineator was correct." And when I outlined to him your System of Reversals he said: "That ought to settle it. That every mechanic must admit that your method must force a straight line."

The diagram on page 56 is the clearest illustration I ever saw, why the hull of a vessel disappears before the mast; and I always use that illustration now in my arguments with people,—and I have them daily.—D. EDSON SMITH, Cal.

DEAR BRO. WILL:—We are now in the city I never expected to see taken so easily. I never dreamed of such fortifications; the wall around the city is something immense, and mounted by guns of very large calibre. The forts were poorly manned, and they were not effective against such gunners as the Americans have proved themselves to be, on both sea and land. Our regiment of 600 men fought 5,000 Spaniards and defeated them; our loss was 6 killed and 26 wounded, while their loss, killed and wounded, was over 1,000. So you can see the superiority of the American both on land and sea, as demonstrated by Dewey, Sampson, and Schley in Cuba and the Philippines.

Dr. Teed's prophecies are all coming true, if I can figure this thing out right. I thought at first it was going to be a great war, but it looks now very much as if there was going to be an alliance of the great nations of the earth,—England, America, and Japan will go hand in hand, and in the end will have to fight the entire world.

When I get home my first visit will be to Chicago; and if I do not change my mind soon, I shall probably stay there, and be contented for once in my life. I have had enough of war.—N. O. MacDONALD, Manila.

Dr. Teed's Scientific Religion and Philanthrophy

Some weeks ago I alluded to the great work carried on in America by the famous Dr. Cyrus R. Teed, of Chicago. Since then I have had sent me a supply of his literature, which has now become somewhat voluminous. Dr. Teed's system of scientific religion and philanthrophy is called Koreshanity, derived from Koresh, which is the Hebrew word for Cyrus, or at any rate an equivalent. Dr. Teed was born in 1839, and began his present mission when thirty years of age. The work has since

gone on and prospered, and branches of the Society are to be found in various parts of the United States. In Chicago they publish a large sixteen-page weekly journal called THE FLAMING SWORD, which is edited by that distinguished scientist, Professor U. G. Morrow, assisted by the Revs. E. M. Castle, B. S. Boomer, Prof. L'Amoreaux, A. M., Ph. D., and other popu-lar scholars and writers. It is impossible in a newspaper paragraph to furnish any details of this System. 


