### Osteological Analysis of Structured Man and Cosmos. Part VI.

WE WISH here to reiterate the statement that all electrical and magnetic energy is, veritably, substance in solution. The electro-magnetism distributed mainly from the torcular Herophili through the fibres of the dura mater and converging to the ethmoid pole, is principled substantially in the basic elements of the osseous fabric. We do not mean by this that other substances are not also held in solution, or, more strictly speaking, that the electro-magnetism is not composed of other substantial solutions.

We cannot too often urge and emphasize the fact that every energy is but the solution of what has been matter, and that every form of energy may be materialized to matter again. In other words, the law of transmutation is the fundamental law of all activity, and the law of the correlation of the two co-ordinate substances, energy and matter, is as absolutely a law as that of the correlation of energy.

It has been previously stated that the apex of the vertical ethmoid plate is the pole of that axis which represents the cerebral zodiac. To comprehend this subject fully, the reader is called upon to analogically transpose the thought from the domain of the encephalon of the vidual microcosm to the alchemico-organic cosmos. The brain has an equatorial circle corresponding to the equator of the alchemico-organic cosmos, or, as the physicist of the recidivating school would say, the equatorial circle of the earth. It has also another circle corresponding to the zodiacal belt, the median line of which is the ecliptic. These two encephalic circles are relatively oblique, corresponding to the obliquity of the ecliptic.

The plane of the ecliptic, in the alchemico-organic cosmos, is twenty-three and one half degrees oblique to the *plane* of the equator. The axes of these planes are necessarily correspondingly oblique to each other. The axis of the equatorial plane or circle terminates in the two terrestrial poles. These we will call the poles of the normal axis of the cosmos. The axis of the circle of the ecliptic is an electro-magnetic axis, and terminates north in the magnetic center or pole, and is eccentric, south in the south magnetic zone. The zodiacal circuit, or the circle of the ecliptic, constitutes the zone of motion. All along the line of the ecliptic is the heaping up or conservation of energy, and all eclipses are merely the methods of transposing energy through the projectory momentum upon which depend perpetuity of motion and organic form as well.

#### The Causes of the Magnetic Poles.

The causes of the electro-magnetic axis, with its south polar zone and north polar apex, may be found in the reciprocal relation of the astral nucleus and peripherical zone as related to the ecliptical circuit and associate plane. The astral nucleus revolves upon its axis. This motion generates magnetic energy, the positive direction determining toward and meeting at the axis of the stellar center, thus shooting out at the poles of this axis of motion. This nucleus is slightly eccentric, for reasons given in other publications of Koreshan literature. The orbital motion is around a negative center. The orbital motion also generates a magnetic flow. The orbital motion is spiral, the spiral axis being nearly vertical to the plane of the zodiac or circle of the ecliptic. It is this relation of motions that not only generates the celestial electro-magnetic energy, but so determines the flow of the energy as to form the magnetic zone at the south, and the magnetic pole or apex at the north.

Motion, with its concomitant and consequent friction of the atoms of matter to which the motion is related, and the destruction of those atoms and their transmutation to energy, cause the magnetic axis, its southern zone, and northern pole or apex. Upon these two extremities co-ordinating and continuing the electromagnetic currents, largely depends the deposition of the mineral and metallic planes of the earth's circumference or shell, and especially does the series of mineral deposits derive its emplacements and perpetuity.

The mineral deposits correspond to the bones of the human body. Comparison may assist the student to comprehend this law and fact. The crust or shell of the egg, before the chick is incubated, comprises the basis of the bone of the chick. The process of incubation displaces the relation of the shell to the contents of the egg, and the mineral base becomes the framework of the chick. As the earth represents a higher development, there is still another crust outside the mineral; this crust is metallic. At the center of the cosmic cell, the motion engendered constantly destroys matter as molecular and atomic substance. This destruction of material substance produces magnetic substance, or the substance of energy. It is thrown upon the axilary center, and rushes out toward the zone and pole of the magnetic cone, whence it is deposited as matter through diverse currents, one flowing toward the southern zone, the other toward the northern apex, or magnetic polar center. These currents emplace the matter of the framework of the alchemico-organic cosmos, as the corresponding encephalic and systemic currents deposit the osseous fabric of the microcosmic structure,

### Koreshan Socialism Founded Upon the Science of Universal Form and Function.

THE PAGE of an English barrister went to Court to inform the Bench that his master could not be present at the appointed hour, and proceeded to enumerate seventeen reasons for the barrister's absence. After recounting the list of reasons for the delinquency, he wound up with the statement that his master died that morning. It is easy enough to be seen that had the report been made, "my master is dead," the Court would have comprehended the situation.

By the most simple mechanical process, we have demonstrated the overwhelming truth that the world in which we live has a *concave*, not a convex surface, and that consequently we are dwelling on the inner rind of a shell. Our demonstrations prove the surface to be about 25,000 miles, and therefore the diameter to approximate 8,000 miles. Now, we find men attempting to compel us to discuss a catalogue of propositions irrelevant to this fundamental premise of the Cellular Cosmogony,—questions predicated upon the mere assumption that the earth's surface is convex, that if possible they may divert our attention and that of the public from the investigation of this simple fact.

We have employed the plumb-line to place the vertical point of a perpendicular post; from this point we have forced a right-angle line, extending it into the water at a distance of about four miles, starting from a perpendicular altitude of about ten feet. It settles the whole question at issue between the benighted Copernicus and his blind followers, and the Koreshan claim. If the so called astronomers were honest in their investigations for astronomical knowledge, they would not only notice a survey and demonstration like the one conducted by the Koreshan Geodetic Staff on the Gulf coast of Florida, but they would hasten to institute radical measures to either confirm or refute the results of our experiments.

The foundation for all astronomical investigation and discovery is the surface of the earth. There is no way to determine the contour of this surface but by mechanical geometry, independently of optics and the great law of analogy. The Author of the Cellular Cosmogony (KORESH) discovered the true contour of the surface of the earth in 1870, by the application of this great and unerring law. The world is not able to embrace the idea either from analogy or the true application of the principles of optics; therefore, we recently instituted a geodetic mensuration founded upon the simple principles of mechanics.

Is the surface upon which we live concave or convex? The plumb-line and right angle will determine this question. The Rectilineator is absolute as a mechanical device for geodetic mensuration. If the earth be concave, the right-angle line will extend into the water; if it be convex, the right angle from a specified perpendicular will be tangent to the curvature. The line *must* determine the fact. Behold the line extended into the water! Modern astronomy is false; Koreshanity—the truth, has triumphed, and the world is mad.

"But," says the man who runs his head against the

mural structure of Koreshan Science, and who heretofore wanted to believe the Copernican fallacy, "What does it signify, any way? What has it to do with my bread and butter? What the world needs is something to eat. If you would confine your efforts to social economics and solve the problem of human wants and woes, you would be accomplishing something commendable for the world. As it is, you are wasting your energies, spoiling a good socialist to make a poor scientist." (This *sounds* well from a narrow and contracted standpoint.)

A socialism which can meet the present demands of the aggregate humanity must conform, in its arrangement, to the inexorable laws of order. A structureless socialism, whether it be called Christian or Pagan, is merely the effete product of human disintegration. Given a knowledge of the laws of the forms and motions of the cosmogonic structure, we know the laws of the forms and functions of social order; for the one must and does conform to the other. The Grand Man in social construction is like the structure of the alchemicoorganic macrocosm, and also like the structure of the microcosm—the individual man.

The universe, as its name implies, is a unit. It has an absolute center, and a corresponding and co-ordinate circumference. The center is the pole and nucleus of every influx and every emanation. Upon it depends the co-ordination of form and motion. It is the imperial center of activity, and from it are controlled the laws of formate and functate order. The man who possesses the knowledge of universal form and function, possesses the key to the construction of social order. This man will build the city and lay the foundation of the temple. The "bread and butter question" will be settled upon the basis of that social construction predicated upon a knowledge of cosmic construction and order.

The Lord Christ, the great Socialist, the man whose first public contact with men was to feed the multitude, was related to two things;—a description of the order and form of creation given in Genesis, and to the culmination of events prophesied in Revelation. So in the summing up of the dispensation specifically regarding man's relation to God and the relations of men to one another, the laws, forms, and functions of the cosmic structure are co-equally concerned. We know the structure of the universe, because this knowledge must comprise the foundation for the perfection of that organic unity upon which humanity depends for its release from the hells of the present church and state delusions. The nations will be ruled with a rod of iron, in the supreme and divine literal significance of that phrase.

### The Womanhood of God.

#### "She Shall be Called the Lord Our Righteousness." Jer. xxxiii:16.

BOTH NATURE and the Scriptures declare this fundamental truth of being, namely, that there resides in Deity, as an essential energy and attribute of life, the principle of femininity. Everything bears upon its face the unmistakable evidence that maternity has at least as much to corroborate its claim to attention, as the masculine force, which the world has endowed with the attribute of Father, as the comprehensive term of devotion and aspiration. The world has been taught to say, "Our Father which art in heaven," but it by no means follows, that while during a given age of the world the Father principle and attribute have been the prominent and dominating conceptions of the "unknown," that in the further revelation of divine mysteries, the Motherhood of God should not also be revealed.

"Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honor to him: for the marriage of the Lamb is come, and his *wife* hath made herself ready." The Lord Christ was Bride and Bridegroom. In him dwelt all fulness; but in his descent into the race, the woman was taken from him, as spirits gathered from those who have died during the dark ages, and have been aggregated with the New Jerusalem. As the heavens are rolled together as a scroll, the Jerusalem is involved in one personality, Elijah the Prophet; but Elijah does not complete in himself, in the most external form and attribute of his being, the ultimate divine Personality. There must preside some person of his choice whose characteristics conform to the will of God, as the matrix of that final gestation productive of the externals of the sons of God. Some woman chosen of God and endowed with *aspirations* and *powers* of receptivity, must stand related to Elijah, the Father, and the sons of God, who shall reach their materialization through her, as Elisha stood to Elijah and to the children of Israel.

This woman has had her incarnations down through the ages in a multitude of embodiments. At one time she was the daughter of Potipherah, the High Priest of Heliopolis, Asenath, Neith, Minerva, whom Joseph took to be his wife, and the mother of Manasseh and Ephraim.

As Abraham, and the prophets, and the priests of Israel arose in their perfection in the Lord, so this woman must arise in a final womanhood, to be baptized for her final great work, by Elijah the Prophet. She was reflected, but not perfected in Anu Lee. As Emanuel Swedenborg was the immediate precursor of Cyrus, so Ann Lee was the immediate precursor of the woman who, in an external form, must be specifically the absorber of the Elijah when, as the Rider on the White Horse, he passes through his theocrasis. His absorption into the humanity raised up to receive him, is through numerous specific channels, one of which is the woman prepared. A principal preparation is her subservience to his will. She thus becomes the external Bride, through whom the projection of the sons of God is accomplished.

A knowledge of these principles is a matter of education, which belongs exclusively to the Lord's anointed to communicate. His doctrines must be taken literally, and through the means of verbal, oral, and written communication. They cannot come through any occult, or esoteric way to those for whom the Anointed brings the message. He comes literally in the literal (external) degree of the Word, to impart the Science of the Gospel of the New Age.

Koresh teaches that there is one woman to be bap-

tized who shall stand out prominently before the world as the Empress of the Lord's external Kingdom, and that through her the sons of God shall mature, that they will be projected through processes of materialization known only to him and such as receive his word. She must become the external and central pole of influx for as many males and females as shall enter the conflagration, become spiritual energy, and flow into her as their center of rest and metamorphosis.

There will be *no* immaculate conceptions in this age of the world. Elijah the Prophet, the Messenger of the Covenant, the Lord's Anointed, was born in sin and shapen in iniquity like all other men. When he was born, the Tabernacle was manifest in its polluted state. From that time forward it has been the province of the High Priest to purify that Tabernacle, and thus far the doctrines of Life have been brought forth and formulated. Thus far the Tabernacle has been perfected, or cleansed from its pollution. The next step is the cleansing of the life; that accomplished, the kingdom of God is established, and the prayer of the Lord fulfilled: "Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven."

### Love the Basis of Communism.

**"B**ELOVED, let us love one another." It is the disciple whom Jesus loved who is speaking, and the words flow naturally from lips that had drunk from the fountain of divine tenderness as it welled fresh and pure from the heart of the Lord. Love is his constant theme, the burden of his message, the greatest thing in the world, the fulfilling of the law.

There is an inner sphere where love rules eternally, and this fair world was pivoted in the brain of the Lord Christ, his outer nature, the external mind, being in perfect rapport with its interior harmonies. The Word which was Love was made flesh and dwelt among us. It was the introduction of a new principle.

"See how those Christians love one another!" was the wondering tribute of the pagan world compelled to recognize this new principle and admit its force. These people had all things in common, yet was there no lack among them. Slander, and evil-speaking, and criticism were unknown, for love thinketh no evil, and every heart was chaste.

Petty personal grievances melted away, for were they not enjoined to be kind one to another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake, had forgiven them? Envy and jealousy could not disrupt their fraternal bonds, for did they not prefer the neighbor in honor?

Such was early Christianity in its pristine beauty, after the church was baptized by the Holy Spirit—the product of the Lord's translation. For over twelve centuries the Fathers of the church, with few exceptions, proclaimed communism as the only Christian state of

society. It is said that Saint Augustine would never admit a man to the church who owned private property, and St. Anselm antedated the theories of Henry George, declaring that God created the earth and its natural resources for the children of men to have in common, but usurpation, fraud, and force created a private right. So there was, in those days, but one ideal for public and private life. They loved one another, *therefore* they had all things in common, with no lack to any. There is no enduring basis for communism save in that love, wholly foreign to natural humanity, which went out as cherubic spirits when the body of Jesus was converted to energy.

Why, then, could not that communism endure until the present? Why is the state of the church today, such that Goldwin Smith, writing in the October North American, boldly declares: "The Christian ideal, however sublime and beneficent, is imperfect. It involves an impracticable secession from the world and disregard of all worldly interests. Christianity has had little influence on industrial, still less on public life. Has not 'To hell with Spain! Remember the Maine!' been the cry of the most church-going of communities?"

Yes, the natural inference would be that the Christian ideal is a failure; but beyond natural inference is scientific truth—the science of religion as revealed by Koreshanity. Hence, we learn that divine love, the basis of communism, was planted as seed in the early church, and in conformity to law must decay before it can spring up and bear fruit an hundred-fold in the harvest at the end of the age. Every organism disintegrates to give place to the new. Goldwin Smith says that faith in God and a future life, is apparently losing its hold, and its departure is attended by heavings of social discontent and disaffection. These are hopeful signs that a new religion is coming, to revive the ideal of righteousness,—right living,—and extend the spirit of communistic love to transform industrial and public life.

"We know that we have passed from death unto life because we love the brethern." As in the days of early Christianity, the supreme test of this new religion will be, love toward one another. This is the test of progression toward holiness,—wholeness or organic unity in the body social, when all shall be with one accord, of one mind.

"Little children love one another." It is the same

message that we hear today from the lips of our Leader; this, the distinctive mark that he would desire presented to the world by his people. "The love that proceeds from the Infinite Mind," he writes, "melts to tenderness the hearts prepared by divine chastenings for its appropriation." ### In the Editorial Perspective.

#### THE EDITOR.

THE SCENES of America's civil war left their prophetic impress upon two great men of the hour, victims of political conspiracy and tragedy of assassination upon the same night—President Lincoln and Secretary Seward. After nearly thirty-five years, the quasi-prophetic declarations of these two men concerning the destiny of America are quoted by political parties of radically different views. Lincoln saw America in bondage to the millionaire,—enslaved to the money power. The spectre of a worse form of slavery than that which required the army of the Union to destroy, appeared at the vanishing point of Lincoln's vision. It has even come to pass, with worse yet before us. Seward saw American expansion, the great western imperialism, absorbing Canada, Central America, and the West Indies. He saw the great humanitarian hand of America driving tyranny from the new world. We have some of this fulfilled also, and will see more powers forced to relinquish the possession of American territory. Can these views be harmonized? How can the pessimism of Lincoln be harmonized with the optimism of Seward? They harmonize in the vortex of destiny; factors of destiny converge for the creation of the new *regime* of order. Helpless in chaos, America succumbs to the intrigue of hell, and the octopi of greed and selfishness fasten themselves upon her resources until, through the factors of revolution and the application of scientific laws of order, the West becomes the great Pan-American Empire, the gigantic System of Koreshan Imperialism, in the establishment of which pessimism dies and optimism becomes resurrected as the golden dawn of the New Age.

Everything that is made, first existed in the mind. The concept must first obtain before the tangible can be formed.

That which is manufactured by man, obviously comes into existence from the mental world. Every act and work of man originates in the mind, even the finest details, and may materialize by more or less direct agencies. Likewise, the physical universe is the constant expression of man in his perfect state. Every material form in the universe has its correlate in the spheres and laboratories of thought. The idea is prevalent in modern metaphysics, that every man has the kingdom of God within him. This fallacy grows out of a simple statement of a truth uttered nineteen hundred years ago; then the kingdom was subjective in the only man it could be in until, through incorruptible dissolution, that kingdom became subjective in the minds of a chosen people, for a specific purpose. As there can be no subjective without a consequent objective, it follows that the kingdom of God must be expressed in the natural world as a natural kingdom, when the subjective kingdom in Jesus expresses itself in ultimates. The seed of that kingdom was sown in the race at the beginning of the dispensation, so that in the harvest it might come as a natural kingdom, headed by a divine Theocracy, and consisting of perfect men, immortal in the flesh and biune in nature, ruling the world.

An exchange has the following contradictory statements in a single issue. The first item asserts positively that God is not man, and the second, that God is man. In one there is the idea of God being the soul of the entire universe, which we suppose means that earth, sea, grass, insects, vultures, devil-fish, swine, and even the most degraded human beings and the natural and spiritual devils, possess divine life. In the other item, we find the idea expressed that God is entirely human, and that God and man are alike unknown quantities! "God is not a person, but a vast, Infinite Consciousness containing the universe, and contained in every particle of the universe, animating the whole. God cannot be limited, but a portion of this divine life descends into each soul and brings to it power and wisdom. \* \* \* Man is an unknown quantity. There is only one spirit in the universe,-the holy spirit of man. What we call God is the top or apex of that distant mountain-man. We now see only the top, and even it is partially obscured by dark clouds. As we approach nearer, we find that the bottom or base is composed of man. The more human we are the nearer we are to God. God is human in the first degree." Now, what is the next lesson?

The Chicago Tribune is deploring the existence of trusts; it says that "the sowing is tremendous, and the reaping is likely to be momentous and disastrous. Competition is being crushed out on every hand by these lawless robber trusts." The sowing is tremendous, the legitimate seed of competism itself, to begin with-the right to defraud the neighbor, and to obtain and control as much of the wealth belonging to others as is possible. Trusts are the simple evolution of the competitive planting, fostered by the money power which has gained control of the world through competitive methods. The daily press should not complain, since it has helped to build up, through the great political parties, the very conditions that are likely to swallow up all small concerns in the formation of syndicates. The centralization of capital is demonstrative of the remarkable success that must attend the monopoly of labor, the only true capital, when the gigantic Koreshan trust for the benefit of the wealth-producer instead of the wealth-stealer, is inaugurated. Then, truly, competition will be crushed out, and every man will enjoy the fruits of his labor.

Keely, the Philadelphia man who thought he had discovered a new universal force and its application to machinery, will still find the problem a mystery in the spiritual world which has recently received him. The science of all energy and matter is external truth, and belongs to the external rational mind. In the only world where such problems can be solved, Keely failed; he did not possess the missing link—what to do and how to do it—necessary to complete his motor. He spent a lifetime experimenting on the basis of a vague hypothesis, a mere suggestion which he could never clearly define. There is no such thing as a mysterious universal force, and Keely never discovered any; what he did was to accidentally create a vibratory force, an energy hitherto unknown; by means of physical apparatus he converted the energies of sound to energies of motion. It is the system of propagation of the highest qualities of the life of humanity. Its laws are the laws of seed-sowing and harvest; it is in fact, the sowing of man and reaping men. The great organic system of the Golden Age, now about to be established, necessarily involves the knowledge of all phases of life, and the application of the knowledges to life in the attainment of perfection and immortality in the flesh, and in the institution of an organic social system for the happiness of the entire world. The Rings and Satellites of Saturn.

Would you please answer this question, if possible: Why are there rings around Saturn?—Anna L. W., Muscatine, Ia.

We take it that perhaps our correspondent desires an explanation of Saturn's rings from the standpoint of Koreshan Astronomy, though the language might indicate the inquiry to be concerning the use of the rings of Saturn in the planetary economy. We will briefly touch both points.

Those who have studied Koreshan Astronomy to any considerable extent, are familiar with the Koreshan Planetology, that the real planets are the mercurial disci moving slowly between the metallic plates of the earth's environ, through the impulses of the peristaltic action of the solar energies. The seven mercurial disci are the generators of seven planetary energies, which levitate to seven corresponding planes of force in the physical heavens, forming, through laws of materialization of energy, the planetary visible spheres. The rings of Saturn are reflections from rings of mercury, and the satellites are reflections from smaller disci moving about the larger one, each ring and disc being separate because amalgamating different substances, and consequently generating different energies which have different degrees of impulsion. Thus the planet Saturn, its rings, and satellites revolve in different times.

Necessarily, the mercurial planet and rings and satellites move in the same plane, because they are between two metallic layers. The plane of revolution of the reflected planet in the physical heavens sustains an angle of obliquity to the plane of the ecliptic of about 28°, because of the refraction of energies through the superimposed shells and strata, and because of the direction of the rotary motion in the physical heavens, which is determined by the relation of the Saturnian sphere of force to the solar gyre and the lunar equator. Thus the rings and satellites move behind the planet as well as in front of it at periodic times, in the reflection which is visible to the eye.

The rings and satellites of Saturn are the factors of generation of the complex Saturnian energies, as a result of the complex amalgamations. Saturn is the most complex planet, because it is the ul-

#### timate of planetary progression, belonging to the superior division of the great alimentary canal or the zodiacal tract of the physical universe. Saturn represents ultimates. It is the royal planet, with its attendants and three planes of environment. It is the "golden planet," the product of the amalgamations of the gold and silver strata; and represents the ultimates of life and truth;—the government and the glory of the Golden Age.

#### Koreshan Astro-Anthroposophy and Modern Astrology.

The astrological predictions for the future seem ominous for the next ten years. I am a reader of THE FLAMING SWORD, and almost a believer in its teachings. It likewise predicts changes of times and rapid approach of evils to mankind and the world in general. Now, believing you can give me positive answers, I will venture to ask a few questions in sincerity and good faith:

(1) Is there any truth in astrology? and how does it agree with the CELLULAR COSMOGONY?

(2) Do the planets of the Concave System influence the inhabitants and tides?
(3) When the several planets are all in conjunction on December 2, 1899, in the sign Sagittarius, what will be the result?
(4) Why does not KORESH come to Pitts-

(4) willy does not KORESH come to Pittsburg some time?—J. W. S., Pittsburg, Pa. (1 and 2) Yes, there is truth in astrol-

ogy, but it is perverted; it takes for its astronomical basis the old systems, and consequently its conclusions are the opposite of truth. For instance; astrology teaches that the physical planets influence the mind of man; the latest fads claim that planetary vibrations are received directly by individuals born under certain "planetary conditions." The truth is, that the mind of man influences the planets; the mental world is superior and rules the material. The planetary and human cycles correspond, and consequently events in humanity find correspondential expression in the physical heavens, and also in the physical elements,-air, earth, and sea. Koreshan Astro-Anthroposophy, or Bio-Astronomy, defines all these relations specifically. It revolutionizes modern astrology, just as it revolutionizes modern astronomy and other fallacies.

(3) Near the first of December, 1899, six planets group about the vicinity of Libra's quarter of the Zodiac—in Libra, Scorpio, and Sagittarius, while Neptune will be in Taurus. We consider specifically the relations of constellations in the physical heavens and the signs in the earth, in their relation to the anthropostic world. The precession of the equinoxes moves the signs through the constellations. We consider both the esoteric and exoteric signs and constellations. KORESH was born in Libra in the esoteric, and in Virgo in the exoteric—the signs of liberty and

virginity. 1899 is the sixtieth year of KORESH, the end of the second period of 30 years in his career. The grouping of the planets about these constellations the coming year, denotes a rallying of the forces of communism about the Koreshan nucleus, and a corresponding seeming success of all the antithetical movements in lines of co-operation and colonization. The forces of the world are accelerating; there will be aggregations of forces in the anthropostic world simultaneously with the conjunctions in 1899. ### First Impressions of Investigators of Koreshan Universology.

#### Koreshanity one Continuous Page of Wonders. Interesting Experience in Questioning Koresh Twelve Years Ago.

Like all others who have to seek before they find, I chanced to meet Koresh, and through curiosity, began to investigate his System of Cult. I was hunting for that which would satisfy me.

At the age of 16, I was baptized in ice water, after a hole had been cut in the ice. I was cared for, in a sense, by the Methodists until I was nearly 26 years old. I did much work for them, but grew too radical. In 1883, I moved to Chicago and began the study of spiritualism. I very soon became convinced that a man is alive after he is dead, and I was as strongly convinced that he is just as ignorant in the spirit as he was in the flesh. Also, that he will lie and deceive, even more in the spirit than while in the flesh. This satanic doctrine gave me no satisfaction, save in the fact of the intercommunication of the two states of life,-the spiritual and natural. I then began the study of Theosophy, Rosicrucianism, and modern Mental Science. Swedenborg's books began to attract me about the same time, but I could get very little out of them; they were too deep for me. I also read Dr. Evan's works on mental healing. I had not been able to discover any science or sense in "Mental Science;" but Dr. Evans seemed to be near some truth. I felt that if the brain could be understood, there would be found the key to mental healing.

It was in September, 1886, on Washington Boulevard, Chicago, at a convention of "Mental Scientists" from all parts of the U.S., that I first heard DR. TEED. He was there with his charts illustrating the brain, and in his lecture to that convention he proved to me to be the first and only speaker present who knew what he was talking about. The knowledge he possessed of the brain centers as related to specific bodily organs and functions, was the very food I craved, and the one thing that made me a most rabid seeker after all I could get from him. Never once did I fail to get the answer that satisfied me fully. He well remembers how my questions bothered the ladies who had his lectures in charge, but I well remember how little I bothered him! Before I met him, there were none I could not confound; him never! I have met many teachers, and could always confuse anyone I ever met except Koresh.

At the close of his course of lectures in the Sherman House, and after I had been floored for the third time by complete answers to all my most knotty questions, I felt as though I was the most ignorant man in earth! He had demolished the accumulated knowledge of my years of effort; he destroyed my own ideas. My head was perfectly bald on the inside. When I retired at night my head felt as if two icicles extended through it and came out at my eyes. I knew my name, but I knew little else! Then I became thirsty for truth, and for the remainder of that course of lectures I asked questions to learn, not to "down" him. Near the end of the course. a friend came to me and revealed two things: that DR. TEED is the Messenger of the Covenant, and that he teaches the Hollow Globe Astronomy. I was quite floored again; but as I never was afraid to ask questions, nor to tell what I think I know, I sought him and boldly attacked the Astronomy. In less than thirty minutes he proved to me, by geometry, that the Copernican theory is not true. If it were true, then the earth has millions of centers, and this I knew could not be; but it may not be to my credit to admit that the old theory, in its basic fact, was demolished in thirty minutes!

I began a study of the subject, and in less than six months I was wholly converted to the Concave System. I found things as he stated them; each thing proven, strengthened my mind in the doctrine of Koreshan Universology. In 1888, I published a booklet that contained some few ideas. It did others a little good; it did me a world of good, for it helped me to formulate my ideas. In 1889, my booklet on the "Hollow Globe Astronomy" was published. It has done much, in its way, to help many people repudiate the Copernican system of astronomy.

From May, 1887, right down to the present day, I have never ceased learning what I could of Koreshanity. It has never failed in always satisfying the deepest desires or the most searching questions I could ask. It has unfolded the marvels of God, the wonders of nature, and the truths of the Bible. I got my Bible down and began to study it. I found its pages the very acme of wisdom,—a statement of how all things come forth, develop, and deteriorate. I have had my own fights and troubles with this hot flame he gave me. It has driven me first one way, then the other. It has created some clouds, but they always pass away. #### A Journalist Investigates Koreshan Science.

EDITOR FLAMING SWORD :-- For some time I have been a reader of your able and scientific weekly publication entitled THE FLAMING SWORD. I have learned to like it, and an appetite for more of it has been created, so that I now feel converted to the teachings of its conductors. I am not educated up to the point of understanding the many scientific points it explains with the use of scientific and technical terms. #### Formation of Clubs for the Study of Koreshan Universology.

#### Victoria Gratia Stipulates Conditions of Organization of Initiatory Councils.

As our work develops, inquiries are constantly being made regarding the organization of Clubs for the purpose of discussing and disseminating the gospel of Koreshanity. In reply to such inquiries we extend the privilege of organizing Initiatory Councils as preliminary to the regular organization of Camps of the Society Arch Triumphant.

Every Initiatory Club should have a President, Vice President, and Secretary; and the meetings of the Club conducted according to Roberts' Rules of Order. All meetings should be held strictly according to rules and discussion of questions regulated through the office of the Presiding Chairman of the Club. No person should be allowed to take part in discussions who doubts or opposes Koreshan Science. What we mean by discussion involves questions of differences in opinion regarding the true interpretation of that which is taught in Koreshanity and Koreshan literature.

If those interested in the subject of Koreshan Universology will be painstaking in the acquisition of the fundamental principles of our System, they will not get very far away from the main line of Koreshan Gospel. To acquire this knowledge it is essentially important that the literature of Koreshanity be read thoroughly, and whensoever there is a question of uncertainty regarding a matter of doctrine, the President should communicate at once with Rev. Berthaldine, Matrona, Honorable President of the Society Arch Triumphant, Beth Ophrah, Cor. 99th St., & Oak ave., Chicago, Ill., Substation 48, when the point in question will be elucidated.

Any person may become a member of the Investigating, or First Degree of the Club, —for the general division of the Club into two degrees must conform to the general division of the Society Arch Triumphant but no member shall be permitted to vote who is not a member of the Second Degree.

No person can be a member of the Second Degree who uses tobacco, profanity, or intoxicants. Moral character must be a prerequisite to membership to the Second Degree. Whiskey, beer, wine, tobacco, opium, profanity, and vulgarity favor sensuality, and militate against any successful effort to reform the character. When a Club is sufficiently advanced to appeal for entrance to the Orders of the Koreshan System, it may apply to Rev. Berthaldine, Matrona, Honorable President of the Society Arch Triumphant.

Halls, or parlors occupied for the convening of Clubs, should be so seated as to demark the members of the two degrees. The Club has no jurisdiction over the habits of those in the First Degree, which is merely investigative. It has, however, absolute control of the conduct of the meetings, and no tobacco or intoxicants shall ever be tolerated during any of the sessions of the Clubs. When convenient, the line of demarkation of members of the two degrees shall be from front to rear of the room occupied; the members of the First (lower) Degree sitting at the left, and the members of the Second (higher) Degree at the right.

These are merely general principles for the conduct of meetings by such as desire to enter upon the great work of re-formation, which will only come, in its ultimate fulness, through the impending revolution.


