

Osteological Analysis of Structured Man and Cosmos.

Part VII.

IN THE consideration of the causes of the magnetic axis, north magnetic pole, and southern magnetic annulus, as defined in the foregoing paper, we will here urge the fact that the causes before noticed are only proximate; for the mind, situated in the brain, is the primary and remote cause of all the forms and motions existing in the alchemico-organic cosmos. The point in the earth described as the magnetic center or pole, is the correspondent of the crista galli. The co-ordinate point in the heavens is the north polar star, and corresponds to the pineal gland (conarium) in the microcosmic brain.

That point in the progress and life of any one of the seven primary personalities representing Deity, and from whose theocrasis the spiritual overflow and baptism proceed, comprises, in anthroposophy, the crista galli. As the fibres of the dura mater converge to the cock's crest (crista galli) and there emplace the substance of deposition conveyed by the electro-magnetic currents, so the lines of impulse from the spirit entities liberated from the material bodies in which they were previously environed, converge to the divine human personality and there constitute the apex, the framework of the resurrection.

The conarium is the apex of seven lines of fibre, or lines of fibre from seven encephalic areas. It therefore involves seven distinct principles of life, each one of which, in the aspect of time, is represented by its specific corresponding Avatar; as the Lord Jesus, Elias, Moses, and others. The theocrasis of a personality is the cock's crowing. As the chanticleer by its sharp, shrill, and penetrating voice awakes the sleeper, so the theocrasis of the Messianic Center awakens, by the pene-

trating echoes of the Holy Spirit thence proceeding, the denizens of the anthropostic grave.

The Messianic nucleus of this age is the apex of the seven areas converging through the dura mater to the electro-magnetic pole of the dural environment. In other words, as the Lord Christ, nineteen hundred years ago, was the polar point of all spiritual convergencies, so the Messianic Center of this age is the vorticle into which the subtensions of spiritual desire and natural propense converge. As every human thought is a spiritual entity, so the projection of aspiration to this apex of recurrent life involves the spirit entities which flow into, and through this pole emplace the framework of the new social fabric. As the energies from millions of stars may converge and flow into the one astral nucleus, thus rendering that stellar vorticle the recipient of every energy, so may the anthropostic Star be made the anthropostic stellar vorticle and receptacle of the millions of spirit and angelic entities which constitute its organic unity. As the stellar nucleus of the cosmic structure is the center of influx and emanation, so the central mind of men becomes the point of influx, metamorphosis, and emanation,—therefore the Messianic manifestation of the age.

While we have specifically considered the electromagnetic currents converging to and depositing the crista galli and ethmoid, we have said comparatively little of the counter flowing currents returning over the periosteal river, and radiating from the crista and converging again toward the annulus of the torcular. Before entering into the analysis of the reflex currents of the dura mater (hard mother—the mater presiding

over the hard or bony fabric), we will premise the following axioms which involve principles lying at the very foundation of knowledge:

Wheresoever there is a flow of an electric current of either an alkaline or acetic reaction, there is invariably a reverse or counter flow of a current of an opposite reaction. Wheresoever two electric reagents meet at resisting poles, there is a deposit of matter created from the alkalo-acetic reagency.

Counter-Currents Unknown to Electricians.

It is not generally known that electric currents of opposite reagencies move inversely over the same conductor. While the terms anode and cathode are employed by electricians to designate the flow of the electric fluid, they are almost, if not quite, invariably used to designate the opposite poles or ends of a single current flowing in one direction. The terms thus employed are strictly misnomers. Anode means upward way; cathode, downward way; and it is a fact, despite the ignorance of the ordinary "scientist," physicist, and electrician, that in every electric flow of a definite reagency in one direction over a conductor, there is a counter flow, a flow in the opposite direction, over the same conductor. This fact generally known and applied in practical and mechanical electricity, would very greatly simplify the efforts to utilize the electro-magnetic energies for the various mechanical and other purposes for which electricity is employed.

In every counter flow of the anodic and cathodic electric fluid, there is friction because of slight resistance of the two reagencies, and such friction invariably generates magnetic energy; but whensoever the fluid is conveyed over an uninsulated conductor, the magnetism is not polarized, hence it is unobserved. If resistance is offered to the escape of the magnetic force by the insulation of the conductor, the prime magnetic force is thrown in toward the axis of the electrical flow, and the counter magnetic radiation of a much finer quality is passed through the insulating or sheathing medium. The magnetism urged toward the axis of the conducting medium is elongated into a central current, moving also in counter directions, being of active and passive, or positive and negative, or anodic and cathodic qualities. Let us apply these principles of electro-magnetic activity to the currents traversing the fibres of the nervous system in general, and the dura mater in particular.

In considering the cerebro-spinal nervous system, we find a complex ganglion par excellence, the prime laboratory of the human organism; namely, the brain itself. It is the sovereign ganglionic structure, and possesses, supremely, the characteristics of not only every ganglion, but of every separate cell. Not only are neuro-electric energies generated in the brain, but

the cerebro-spinal and animal essences are elaborated and re-elaborated there; for nerve fluids and electromagnetic currents flow from, and return to this great center and origin of motion and form.

The fibres of the dura mater are insulated conductors of electro-magnetism. Their currents flow from pole to pole inversely, and as they converge and radiate over the encephalic dome, the energies obey the laws of electric and magnetic generation and action already described. The insulating sheaths of the nerve cables, in the interflow of the currents passing inversely along the course of the fibers, resist the outflowing magnetic energy, doubling it upon itself and reflecting and forcing it back into the axis of the electric motion; thence is generated the inductive reflex from the central axis toward and through the sheath. The pia mater receives this induction and communicates it to the cell. The spiral activity of the cell regenerates a counter action, for as the elongated conductor throws an elongated current along the axis of the conductor, so the cell, at the central pole of its activity, reflects and radiates an induction through the insulation of the cell, that is, through the cell wall, back to the fibre of the dura. The cortical area of the encephalic mass is therefore constantly exposed to the counter flowing magnetism between the cells of the cortical area and the dural fibre. Each cell marks a point of interruption of the current, and therefore a point of interflow between the fibre and the cell.

Specific Correspondential Analysis.

It will have been noticed by the critical student, that the ethmoid constitutes a point of meeting between that projection of the cerebrum called the olfactory nerve and bulbs, and that spine of the dura called the falx (sickle) cerebri. The olfactory bulbs are the projections of the pole of respiration. Through these bulbs and their tracts, toward and into the cells of the cortex to which they ramify, the brain is sensitive to the impressions called odors. In the delights originating in the odors which are agreeable, and in the disgust antithetically repulsive, is derived the function of expansion and contraction of the cell. Hence, through reflex action, may be found the primary source of the powers of discriminating between good and evil of the more subtle quality and character than that depending upon the ordinary powers of perception.

In locating the magnetic polar center of the spine of the dura mater, and establishing our knowledge of this apex as correspondential to the north terrestrial magnetic pole, we have laid the foundation for determining the location of the encephalic zodiac, and therefore of the zone of primary motion.

GERTAIN man had two sons; and he came to the first, and said, Son, go work today in my vineyard. He answered and said, I will not; but afterward he repented, and went. And he came to the second, and said likewise. And he answered and said, I go, sir; and went not."

The above Scriptural incident was taken as a text by a minister, on a recent occasion. The theme was, first, the great opportunities of the present to make what the world and the preachers call a success in life; and second, of being successful, as the speaker phrased it, in converting men to Christ. No former time, he averred, ever was so prolific in both these methods, as the present. Both were commendable and highly commended. To get rich was all right, and nothing was said as to the means of securing that result. True, it was said incidentally that a man should not use wealth to grind the face of the poor.

One of the men who has availed himself of those opportunities to get rich which are so much commoner now than ever before, millionaire ex-Congressman Tom L. Johnson, says: "So long as it is permitted to any man to take what doesn't belong to him, through monopolizing nature's resources and the private ownership of public utilities, plenty of men of my kind will always be ready to jump in and do the stealing. My mission is to show the people how it is done, and to show them how they can put an end to the system which enriches me and impoverishes them." No note of warning was sounded by the professed follower and preacher of Christ, against the opportunities to get rich (referred to by the ex-Congressman), which are substantially all there are now; in general terms, they were sanctioned and commended. It was with him a matter of rejoicing that they are as numerous as they are.

When a young man came to Jesus (whom this preacher professes to follow), He did not say to him, as this man evidently would have done, "You have done well in availing yourself of a good opportunity to get rich." Perhaps, being a young man, he had not stolen his wealth through monopoly, but had received it by what, in the eyes of men, seemed more innocent,—inheritance from one that did steal it. But, however acquired,

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Dualism in all its forms, is antagonistic to the true order of the Lord's appearing. Hence, whosoever teaches it must be denominated Antichrist.

Jesus told him to go sell all his riches and give the proceeds to feed the poor, and come and follow him if he would have everlasting life—be converted to Christ—be saved, have treasure in heaven. And this is in exact accord with all Jesus' teachings and his life. What right any man has to teach otherwise, speaking in His name, we fail to see. But other, perhaps greater, opportunities were to be found in

after the present fashion,—in which great work this preacher was engaged. Here, too, the ideas of Jesus differ toto cælo from those of the preacher: "Ye are my friends," says Jesus, "if ye do whatsoever I command you." How can a man be converted to Christ, so long as he disobeys His every word with regard to the possession of property, and the whole manner of life which he lived? Although conversion to Christ is a Scriptural thought, the modern theologian knows nothing either of the process or the result.

Whosoever is converted to Christ is a Christ, just as when starch is converted to sugar, it is sugar and no longer starch. When by the operation of the life principle of the wheat upon the inorganic substance of the soil it changes that substance to wheat substance, it is no longer soil substance but wheat substance. Inorganic substance, in the end of the wheat cycle, is converted to wheat. So when, in the time of sowing seed in the beginning of the age, the divine seed, which, as the Scriptures explain, is Christ, as Holy Ghost, fell into good ground—human hearts prepared to receive it, and formed conjunction with the sinful humanity, the same process began which we observed in the seed wheat. The higher—the divine—life began impregnating the lower, sinful, dying nature with its own higher, undying life, and the man-sinful man, began to be converted to Christ-to God.

Jesus plainly told us that the completion of that work required an age; that the harvest of that seed would be in the end of the Christian age, now at hand. At the end of the Christian age those who received that divine seed in the beginning of the age will be converted to Christ—to God, just as the inorganic substance which, in the beginning and throughout its cycle, is impregnated with the wheat life, is, converted in the end of it, to wheat. Any other conversion to Christ, as results always prove, is purely imaginary, the subject of it living, not the Christ life, but the selfish, devilish human life. Love to God and the neighbor are the sine qua non of that life, and both are entirely inconsistent with the pursuits of wealth under the hell-born competitive system and the gospel which justifies them.

An Open Letter to Members of the Society Arch-Triumphant and Friends of Koreshanity Throughout the World.

WE KNOW that the members of the Society Arch-Triumphant—the Investigative and Initiative Court of the Koreshan Unity, are as a rule deeply interested in all that pertains to the interests of the Koreshan System of science, in its application to life in the practical formation of Communistic and Co-operative groups. The primary nucleus of the ultimate grand unity is called the Guiding Star Assembly. This Assembly desires to keep in sympathetic touch with all its Camps, and the members of the Society scattered abroad.

The full value of any system of doctrine is realized only through its application to life. We wish we could take each member by the hand and speak to him the truth in love, concerning the quality of effort that should be made by each to extend the light which has illumined his own mind, to the darkened minds of others, that they too may become enlightened and awake to the duties of the hour.

A friend somewhat interested in the doctrines of Koreshanity, in a letter recently received by us, expresses herself as regarding them as "the treasures of wisdom," but reports her life as being "so full to overflowing" that she must "bury these treasures in the depths of her heart" until she has attended to "some of the pressing problems of to-day." This little remark leads us to deal forcibly with this query: What are the problems that may legitimately press hardest upon the heart and mind of every professed Christian or humanitarian today? The degree of discrimination that can determine the relative importance of life's many pressing problems, is a great attainment. The Lord Jesus, who alone possessed it in his day and generation, said: "Seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness."

Being sure of His own origin and destiny, in relation to that kingdom, Jesus spoke with authority and said: "Leave all and follow me." For one class of his hearers, those wise unto salvation, having the hearing ear, and understanding heart, there was just one paramount duty, in the doing of which was found the solution of all problems that can press upon and vex the human soul. From another class, His own to whom he came but to be rejected, those who had eyes but saw not, and ears but heard not, those whose lives were "so full to overflowing" that they had no room for Him, came these replies, to be recorded to their age-lasting shame: "I pray thee have me excused;" "I have bought a field;" "I have married me a wife;" "Suffer me first to go and bury my father."

Great Problems of the Hour Must be Solved.

There is certainly a present demand for the rational solution of scores of profound problems,—financial, social, religious, and scientific. That great harlot, the nominal Christian church, dominated by that hydraheaded serpent, "science falsely so called," has proved

The New Emancipation Proclamation.

WHEREAS, Divine Providence has so abundantly blessed and prospered this United States of America with vast areas of fertile soil, great riches of mineral wealth, and the brain and brawn of man, to apply them to the use and enjoyment of the Commonwealth, and has granted us liberty and independence from all foreign oppressors; and,

Whereas, the spoiler, in the most subtle manner, has beguiled our sons of freedom into paying millions for tribute, thus disregarding the policy of the fathers, enforcing idleness and creating want and crime in this fair land of ours; spreading abroad the seeds of anarchy and treason, and hastening the nation to the brink of destruction; and.

Whereas, it would behoove us, as a nation of honor, in consideration of these favors at the hand of the Almighty, and in remembrance of the blood of our patriotic fathers shed in the cause of freedom, to depart at once and forever from our present ruinous system of bondage—to undo the heavy burdens and let the oppressed go free.

THEREFORE, be it decreed, that in virtue of the power in Congress vested, the whole Revenue Department is hereby disbanded and dismissed as a piracy upon commerce, an obstruction to the normal pulse of trade, and that all laws and regulations regarding the same shall be null and void after the date of this proclamation.

It is further decreed that all railroads, canals, pipe lines, and every avenue of public transfer, either of goods or passengers, within the limits of the United States, are the property of the government: That telegraphs, and all lines for transmission of intelligence, shall be under control of the Mail Department.

It is further decreed, that the occupancy and use of real estate shall constitute the only legal title to the same, and that all unoccupied and unimproved lands shall be the property of the United States, under charge of the Agricultural Department. All able-bodied laborers, both men and women, applying to this department shall be employed by the government in developing unimproved territory at a uniform rate of remuneration, equal to eight bushels of wheat per day of eight hours. All minors and children, and all aged or disabled citizens, shall be provided for through the Pension Department.

It is further decreed, that every article of utility to man, and everything which has been regarded as legal for the contraction of debt, shall also be held as *legal tender* at appraisers' value, for the payment of the same, and that all contracts for the delivery of specified articles, such as gold, silver, or others not in the possession of the contracting parties, shall be held to be *option deals* not enforcible by law.

Whereas, great joy and festive demonstrations are sure to follow the issue of this proclamation among the great masses of our citizens everywhere; nevertheless, it must encounter desperate opposition from all classes of plunderers, because it will deprive them of the very basis of their operations:

THEREFORE, be it further decreed that a call be issued for volunteers, men of honor and courage, patriots who will dare to enforce the decrees herein set forth in the face of all resistance,—heroes who will storm the enemy's stronghold and set the oppressed nation free!

SO LONG as there is a starving child, or a woman forced to barter her virtue for a crust of bread, or willing men and women, haunted by the grim spectre of hunger, tramping the highway in a despairing search for work, the nation, within whose borders such events occur, can in no wise be said to be Christian or civilized, and the social reform or religious system incapable of formulating plans that will make such conditions impossible, is fit only for the crematory.

Spain has made peace with the United States, and our great dailies say that the Philippines and other Spanish concessions extend the *empire* of the United States, and add ten million souls to its population. The empire will come, and that much sooner than most people expect; and when it comes it will be an empire of righteousness. Just now, the acquisition of these islands means so much more territory to be pillaged, and the addition of ten million more vassals and serfs to the money power.

An exchange aptly illustrates the "freedom" of American workingmen as follows: "He's free to live in a tenement gay, if he's money to pay the rent: He's free to work for a dollar a day, till all his bones are bent. He's free to sing; 'God save the ring,' (that rules his death-like fate): And he's free to yell 'We have no king!' while brigands loot the state."

If press reports speak the truth, Mark Hanna wants the standing army kept up to the one hundred thousand mark. Rub off the whitewash and reduce the proposition to plain terms, and we find that Mark and his ilk want the public to support a standing army to shoot down the people who dare protest against the robberies of modern commercial pirates.

R. LYMAN ABBOTT, of the Plymouth church, New York, is endeavoring to revise the modern Christian religion, so as to make it palatable to all the world. When placed beside the Primitive Christian System, there is a startling contrast! The life and doctrines of Jesus were in unity in him. They were inseparable, because his doctrines were the doctrines of life he expressed the life of doctrine. Neither the life nor the truth of Jesus has been perpetuated as such throughout the age, because they constitute the essential elements of the seed sown in the race, and necessarily died as all seed must die when submitted to the factors of reproduction. The successive stages in the history of the church since the apostolic era have been so many steps in the descent, declination, and apostasy of the system founded nineteen hundred years ago. Different spheres in the spiritual world, ever lower and lower in the hells of humanity, have been opened up to the migration of Christian adherents from the natural world, until now to gain access to the orthodox heavens it is no longer necessary to believe in the divinity of Jesus. This is the declaration of Dr. Abbott. Assuming that the divine and natural planes are distinct and incapable of being united, he declares that it is impossible to know the divine, but only the human, and that the human claims of Jesus should prove no barrier to the fellowship of all people under the sun,whether Jew, Gentile, Mohammedan, or Buddhist, because they are all "Christians." The Doctor's assumption leads him to the conclusion that no man can follow God, because he is invisible and unknowable. It follows as his necessary conclusion, that the divine ideal is a myth, impossible of realization or attainment, and hence beyond our aspirations. Open the doors wider, in marked contrast with the narrow way which excludes the many and selects the few! Add a few fire-escapes, in case any one wishes to get out, for when all get in that are traveling the broad way, there'll be a hot time, remember!

The "race question" continues to agitate both the North and the South. Race wars, wholesale lynchings, and murder of the Negroes occur with startling frequency. In bondage, the Negro was worth hundreds of dollars; in freedom, he is "worth nothing" to the whites. In bondage, he was very much in evidence on the great plantations; in freedom, through petty jealousy and political hatred, he is forbidden to associate with the whites. The blacks must have separate churches, though there is acknowledged to be no distinction in their souls; separate schools, though the color line is not drawn in the mental world; separate railway coaches and different social privileges, though both enjoy equal rights as citizens! The will of the South was crossed in the freedom of the slave, and the pent up feelings of the defeated are expressed in the barbarous treatment of the Negro by the "civilized South." The social obstructions caused by the colored cuticle, may be taken as a penalty for enslaving a portion of

humanity through the greed of the southern planter. The persecutions and hardships endured by the Negro are fitting him for the greatest mental and physical activity in the dawning age, when science will place him in the scale of progress as one of the most important elements of human society and life.

The turning of attention of America to the tropics, is not without its profound significance. As the human world moves toward the possibilities of the Golden Age, the physical cosmos undergoes such changes as are compatible with the new order. The highest civilization of every age has found its suitable location in the world for its most external expression. Eclipses of Jovian Moons and Discovery of Neptune.

- (1) It is alleged by Copernican astronomers that when Jupiter is farthest from the earth, his satellites, when passing behind him, are occulted several minutes later than when he is nearest the earth; thus proving his great distance according to the known velocity of light. How do you account for this?
- (2) It is claimed that the planet Neptune was discovered by calculations based upon the aberrations of visible planets, before he had ever been seen; and that this is adduced as a proof that the weights and distances of the planets are accurately calculated by the Copernican astronomers. How do you account for this?—M. S., Editor Equity, Cal.
- (1) The phenomenon referred to above occurs about every 13 months, when Jupiter is in opposition to the sun, or near the time when Jupiter reaches his culmination at midnight. At such times, the eclipses of Jupiter's moons occur about 16 minutes behind the time indicated by the astronomical tables. The phenomenon indicates that there is a difference in the velocity of the transmitted energies, and not the vast difference in the distance of Jupiter from the earth, as in the old system. In the consideration of the subject, we have the question of the transmission of three distinct energies to deal with: The transmission of the levic energies from the Jovian mercurial disc in the earth's shell; the transmission of visual energy from the eye to the visible planet, and the transmission of light from the visible planet to the eye. Astronomers and physicists are amusingly mistaken concerning the transmission of light; it is not propagated at the rate of 192,000 miles per second! The tests applied by physicists are of the vital visual substance in the rapidity of its vibrations.

As the visual planet is derived from the mercurial disc in the earth's shell, so the rapidity of the transmission of the energies from the visible planet depends upon the impulses received from the disc; and the impulses from the disc vary with the different positions of the disc as related to the visible sun; hence, the difference in the time of implantation of the materializing pictures of the moving secondary disci in the shell, to the extent of 16 minutes behind the time calculated for the occultations, when Jupiter in the visible heavens is in closer proximity to the visible sun.

(2) The argument that the Copernican system must be true because a new planet was discovered in 1846, is on a par with

the argument that the old system must be true because eclipses are foretold. If the Ptolemaic system, or any other system, had been in vogue in 1846, Neptune would have been discovered by calculations founded upon well-known planetary perturbations. Every system of astronomy expresses in terms of its own, all of the visible relations, movements, perturbations, times, and seasons, upon which calculations are founded, with equal accu-The hypothesis of Copernicus served the purpose only as a skeleton containing tabulated figures; any other hypothesis would have answered if it embodied corresponding deductions; when transposed into the language of any other system, the values would remain the same, just as the result of a mathematical calculation would be exactly the same whether common fractions or decimals are employed; the operation would be different, the values the same. The supposition that perpendiculars constantly diverge into infinite space, adds no degrees to the circumference of the circle; it simply enlarges it in miles.

When Neptune was discovered it was at 325° 52' right ascension; Uranus was at 15° 17' 3" right ascension, making a difference of 49° 25' 3" in the astronomical longitude of the planets. Uranus was observed to be retarded in its orbit, and the existence of another planet beyond the orbit of Uranus was a necessary conclusion, founded upon tables of perturbations of Jupiter and Saturn; and its location, though yet undiscovered by means of the telescope, was but a matter of application of previous observations contained in the tables. Its probable distance, according to the scheme of Copernicus, was already indicated by the law of Titius, which, while designating the planetary progression, perverts the principle in the substitution of distance in miles for difference in qualities of planetary energies. The same conclusion would have been reached if the calculations had been made on the basis of the Ptolemaic epicycles, from the geocentric premise; or on the basis of the Tychonic system, or in accordance with the Koreshan Astronomy.

But with all the conveniences and valuable tables which would have enabled a Ptolemaic astronomer to reach a result consistent with his system, Le Verrier made a number of astronomical blunders while appropriating the honor of the discovery from Astronomer Adams, Prof. Challis, Dr. Galle, and others. Le Verrier's

planet was *not* Neptune; it has not yet materialized, and never will! He missed the mark of consistency with the Copernican system, overreaching the periodic time of Neptune 52 years; made it three times too large, and missed the distance, even from the Copernican basis, over 600,000,000 miles!

Mormonism a Modern Fallacy.

- (6) Does Koresh teach anything concerning "spiritual affinities"?—A READER OF THE SWORD.
- (1) Mormonism is one of the many phases of Antichrist appearing at the close of the Christian dispensation. The truth and life sown in humanity nineteen hundred years ago become involved again, when the cycle of regeneration nears completion; while the vitiated elements resolve themselves into so many perversions of truth. This provides for the manifestation of delusions contemporaneously with the manifestation of truth—in the harvest, when both truth and fallacy revive for combat. Mormonism is one of these counterfeits of truth. The doctrines of Joseph Smith sustain exactly the same relation to the doctrines of the primitive Christ system that darkness sustains to light. The relation exists, but they are antitheti-
- (2) Darkness is as energetic as light. Mormonism is organized, and employs a system of propaganda. The people are receptive to the influences of all kinds of frauds and fallacies, and humbugs thrive where truth cannot gain a foothold. Mormonism is a factor of disintegration of the old world, and will itself break into fragments.
 - (3) In consideration of the magnanimity

of the Koreshan System, involving as it does the science of the universe and its application to all phases of human thought and life, it would be odious to compare it with Mormonism, and beneath the dignity of truth to acknowledge Mormonism, a mere fragment of the world's fallacies, as our rival! Koreshanity is truth against the world, and will win against all fallacies combined.

(4) Polygamy has nothing to do with the gospel of Jesus. Polygamy is a necessity when the conserved energies of a race chosen as the channel of divine activities, are in the plane of sensualism. Life as expressed in the Tewish race had two poles: The sensual, in Solomon, and the virginal, in Jesus. After the sensual generation of Jesus, during the Jewish dispensation, came the spiritual generation for the salvation of the soul, to ultimate in the salvation of the body. Polygamy of Mormonism is an attempt to imitate the oriental harems, which served their purpose in the economy of ethnic progression thousands of years ago.

(5) The decline of the Shakers will continue until they are no more. The vitality of the Shaker body has been transposed to the Koreshan nucleus. The greater ingathering foreseen by Ann Lee is the coming great communistic and co-operative gathering of the people into the Koreshan Societies.

(6) Koresh teaches the science of spiritual unities. When Jesus baptized his disciples, his biune life was divided and disseminated. The males received female entities, and the females, masculine entities of the divine life in the sowing. Coordinated male and female entities received by two persons establish a spiritual affinity between the viduals which makes their destiny one, in the resurrection of the dead. It is the function of the Messiah to baptize and unite soul-mates; their union cannot obtain except through the laws of Messianic polarization; hence the necessity for a Messiah for each dispensation, and they have appeared at regular intervals from Adam to the present time. EDITOR FLAMING SWORD:-My first impressions of Koreshanity came with something of the compelling and instantaneous force of a galvanic battery, and my last impressions are that I cannot let go! Koreshanity found me away from my old moorings-the church; I was groping, sometimes hopefully, sometimes heartsick, longing for the truth. I never lost faith in God, but I felt that I was in darkness, and wanted light so intensely. Coming in contact with Koreshan claims of ability to prove truth by every rational process, I saw that if this claim be true it would give me the rest and peace I so greatly desired, for that peace could only be found in certainty. The exultant, eureka sort of feeling this gave was mixed with that of repulsion at the idea of following a mere man. This feeling I reasoned about, fought, and let alone; thinking if I could come into a perfect understanding of the doctrine I could surely then give unbounded reverence and love to the Messenger who brought the Truth and could personify the same.

Intuitively, I believe, I accepted all the doctrine; yet if I was sure its acceptance would save me from great suffering and danger without rationally understanding it, such acceptance would be reluctant. It seems that half my mind accepts, while the other half objects and criticises as harshly as the worst enemy might! This is the selfish half that cannot accept anything that militates against the old nature. Some of the truth I comprehend clearly, other portions I am not able to accept with unmixed pleasure, and some portions still seem contradictory.

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
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
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
