An eminent psychiatrist writes more of a new angle on an old subject—

Religion-??

WHAT IS RELIGION? How did it originate? What is its purpose? These questions are pertinent to a study or discussion of religion.

Religion is not an "ism," a theory, nor a philosophy. In human consciousness, religion is an element, a factor, a principle, a psychic force. Religion is the sense of good and evil; it is the moral spark-plug controlling human behavior.

When God created man, He put into the organism many senses. For example, the physical senses of hearing, seeing, smelling, tasting, and feeling; the spiritual senses of good, evil, right, wrong, joy, grief, love, anger, affection, hate, passion, lust, regret, desire, worship, adoration, virtue, modesty—all of which create a knowing sense and sometimes common sense.

The sense of feeling is twofold, dual, involving both the psychic, or the emotional, and the physical phenomena.

The sense of good and evil, right and wrong, are to the spirit realm of human consciousness what the sense of hearing, seeing, tasting, smelling, and feeling are to the physical realm.

Religion is not man-made, it is

God-made; it is an essential part of the machinery God put in man when He created him. It is not a concoction, or material, prepared and doled out, at specified rates, by human organizations of any kind. It is an element inherent in the human creature from its beginning.

Religion is not something one gets after birth! It is one of the potentials at the time of adventinto earthly existence. One may befoul and defile their religion by the exercise of will and the right of choice. So-called conversion is not getting religion, but the act of changing the quality of one's religion from an evil manner of living to a good one.

God alone, except the individual himself, can know, estimate, and judge the quality of a man's religion, behavior, conduct, and character. Man knows and realizes the quality of his religion through the manifestation and communication of spirit. (John 16:7-13)

Religion is as essential to the moral life and development of character in the spiritual being as is the eating of food, the drinking of water, or the breathing of air to the physical being. It is an inherent attribute of life, a factor in man's moral concept, *Golden Raus* comparable with hunger and thirst. "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled."

Religion is the sense to conceive good and evil, to evaluate their significance. It is the aptitude, the faculty to discriminate, to judge and choose between them. When God created man, He made him a free moral agent, with the power of will, the right of choice, to decide the course of his moral conduct, without let or hindrance. He made man to have authority and dominion, to rule and govern the earth.

Man only is possessed of such faculties; animals are not so endowed. True, animals have the instinct to care for themselves and offspring with what nature provides; but not the instinct to create necessities that do not immediately exist, as man does.

God endowed man with every conceivable talent and gift of genius, with which to provide for and govern himself and the world, for human welfare, comfort, and happiness. The Hand of Providence is overflowing. The resources of nature are seemingly inexhaustable.

Scientists tell us that the state of Texas, if intensively cultivated, could feed all the people on the earth. A recent statement was that Texas could raise cotton enough to furnish the world. And still another, that a single county, in Illinois, could care for Golden Rays 15 million inhabitants, more than all the folks living in that State. (While its 40,000 mentally sick are crowded into hospitals with a capacity for 26,-000 patients.)

The mess, man, with all his genius, has made governing himself and the world, is enough to make the hardest of hearts shudder. Yet selfishness and greed roll blithely along, in their luxurious carriages, while poverty, want, destitution, and misery, grovel in their pathway.

However, neither physical substance nor material wealth, with all man's creations of towers of Babel, including inventions of war, with atomic bombs, cannot bring righteousness, peace, and happiness, to the earth, by shooting them into the human family. The more we try to coerce man, the more stubborn, unruly and unreasonable he becomes; and the further we are from the goal of righteousness and peace.

Witness the after-pains of World War Two with the nations carrying the dove of peace in one hand, and the sword of War Three in the other hand. All man's efforts to attain world peace, by other methods than by pure and undefiled religion, are bound to fail, for there can be no peace without righteousness. There can be no physical peace without spiritual peace. "Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the Lord of hosts." "Put up again thy sword into his place: for all they that take the sword shall perish with the sword."

God did not say, neither did He intend, that man should not know of, or about, evil; that he should not come in contact with, or touch, evil; for God deliberately told man about evil, and warned him against attaining an experimental knowledge of evil, by adding the realization of the effects of evil to his experience.

God told man he should not eat of the fruit of evil—to eat is to take food, masticate, assimilate, and incorporate it into the body. *Eat*, is here used in a symbolic sense; it means to accept, take in, assimilate, incorporate, and make evil a part of life.

He is here giving man of all time, all men, fair warning against such an experience. The Scriptural facts are man was to eat of the tree, or the fruit, of good and live; but to experience the knowledge of evil, by making it a part of life, meant death. Emphasis is here upon the importance in the sphere of knowledge of, whether it be merely intellectual, or has the added weight of experience.

For example, one may have an intellectual understanding of the effects of opium, whiskey, and deadly poisons, without an experimental realization which would necessitate taking them into the body, and the same may be said of evil, sin.

Jesus, the Christ, had intellectual knowledge of good and evil, right and wrong, sin, else how could He warn mankind of their danger? He was tempted in all points, like as we are, physically, mentally, and spiritually, yet without sin. Why? Because He did not, He would not, accept evil. (Eat evil, so to speak.) He would not make evil a part of His life and being.

Jesus could see the effects of evil, without experiencing them, and chose not to do so; thus exercising His religious sense, His right of choice. He could have sinned, had He wished to do so, the same as Adam and other men have done since Adam's day. We have the same facilities for resisting evil that Jesus had!

We know what Polio, Tuberculosis, and Cancer are, and their effects, but none are so foolish as to deliberately acquire these diseases as we do evil and sin that destroys many times more than all of these diseases put together.

Jesus came, primarily, to save man from sin; that is, to save, or keep man from becoming a sinner; to show man how to live without sinning, without accepting evil; secondarily, to redeem man, the sinner, from the sin committed, the one who had accepted evil, giving His life as a part of the redeeming act!

The Advance of the Healing Arts

THROUGHOUT THE AGES, sorely troubled by mental and physical disturbances, man has sought ways and means of cure. The code of Hammurabi, King of Babylon, in 2200 B. C., contained laws referring to the art of healing.

Three thousand six hundred and one years ago the Emperor Vespasian healed people of their diseases by the *laying on of hands*. From his work developed healing by the "royal touch." That it was effective we can have no doubt for many thousands have been cured by this method. This *laying on of hands* is the first healing agent of which we have any authentic record, and, we still use it successfully today.

Faith is necessary for a cure, no matter what kind of healing is used. Even Jesus could not heal without it. Different types of people need different types of healing to instill in them that necessary faith. And so there has developed many basic types of healing, all of which have been successful when properly used. However, it is interesting to note how frequently we go back to that first method of healing, the laying on of hands. Golden Rays Throughout Old Testament times we find evidence of various healing arts being practised. The early Greeks also combined religion and healing. They built many temples in honor of the Greek god of healing. These temples were in charge of priests who had knowledge of healing and of drugs.

All who were ill stayed at the temple until cured. The temples were located in light, airy, healthful places, and so to them we attribute the origination of the sanitorium of today.

However, until the time of Jesus Christ the healing arts were not so much in evidence, so prominent, except among the great Hindu mystics. Jesus visited one of these mystics, and from him learned of the Hindu art of healing which He incorporated in His own work.

In the New Testament you will find nearly sixty references to the wonderful feats of healing done by Jesus and His apostles. It is regrettable that most sects have seen fit to discard that noble, that divine profession of healing.

The Indian, as the Hindu, used as healing forces the various plants, herbs, roots, that were

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easily obtainable, easily used, and effective. The Indian also used the *laying on of hands*.

This type of healing, with which Jesus accomplished seeming miracles, was used by the Hindu, the Indian, and by nearly every branch of humankind. It is the one Universal type of healing that has withstood the test of time and the fancies of human nature.

The methods of healing by drugs and by surgery began their rise to prominence around the 16th century. Many were the great men, pioneers, leaders, who sacrificed self for the betterment of society.

The science of healing by the laying on of hands was brought to prominence, in modern times, by Mesmer. It was he who recognized, and brought to the attention of the scientific world the fact that there is a definite healing force that can be made to flow from the body of the healer, especially the palms and finger-tips, to the body of the patient.

His reward was ridicule, the same as was given Jesus, the same as is always given by mankind to anyone working for mankind.

Another type of healing, used almost as long as the *laying on* of hands, is that of prayer. Long sneered at, discarded, it is coming into prominence again, and in the last few years has been used with amazing results.

Modern science and medicine has given us different kinds of rays, surgery, pills, and all that, but, considering population increases, we don't cure any more people now than we did four thousand years ago. With sanitation, vaccination, isolation, we prevent disease, and in that we have made our advance.

If you are ill, you can be healed! All the modern drugs and instruments cannot heal you as quickly, as completely, and with less pain as you can be healed by *prayer* or the *laying* on of hands.

Never have we found a type of healing that could accomplish the amazing cures of these two, and until we do, we have not made any advance in the healing arts.

66 H who has not known discouragement at heart, has not lived!" That would seem a preposterous statement. It nevertheless is most true, for discouragement, when properly viewed, can have a most heartening and encouraging power. Discouragement can be the turning point to a better, fuller life, or by not getting the true perspective of its value, we can relinquish ourself to utter failure.

The greatest successes yet to be born and those whose birth we are aware of, have come out of discouragement. Such states of mind are the testing grounds of man's ability. Show me the man who has not met adversities and you will be showing me a man who has neither accomplished anything for himself, nor made any worthwhile contribution to life in general.

We are all on a path that leads upward through what experiences we may encounter. Man forgets that he is in a partnership with God. Of his own strength, he has, indeed, very little, and when he relies only on that Golden Rays which he has of himself, failure and discouragement are most likely.

RESEARCH SCIENTISTS have proven and accepted as positive fact that there is no actually solid object—that matter is composed of molecules in constant motion, vibration.

Professor Harold Higbie has used a scientific corollary to explain apport mediumship. "Apport mediumship operates through laws of vibration just as other mediumship does. It is much the same as the conditions which cause the cycle of water being drawn into the sky and then returned to the earth as rain. "We begin with water on earth, either in its liquid state, or solid as ice. Through application of heat, water is drawn into the sky as its rate of vibration is so raised that it becomes vapor. This vapor is invisible, like the steam at the spout of a tea kettle.

"The vapor pervades the atmosphere. Then, by the passage of magnetic currents through the ethers it is gathered into a more concentrated form which we see as clouds. The magnetic currents continue, the clouds become of greater density as the

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vapor is further solidified, and it finally comes to its original vibration as water and it falls to earth as rain."

In an apport demonstration, an object is selected some distance away from the seance room. This compares to the water on earth. The object's rate of vibration is changed so that it may be carried into the ethers in astral form, just as the water is changed to vapor. It is brought into the seance room and through the application of magnetic currents is changed back again to its former vibration, which may be compared to rain dropping from the skies.

Perhaps no one in America has demonstrated this rare phase of physical and psychical phenomena so unquestionably as Rev. John W. Bunker, of Eaton Rapids, Michigan, who, in the course of thirteen years, has given public and "mass" apport demonstrations before *thousands* of *people*—the largest group or mass demonstration was for a *congregation* of 1500!

Though the majority of witnesses have been from the United States, many have been citizen visitors from such places as Canada, Mexico, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, England, France, Germany, India, and China.

In Rev. Bunker's demonstrations articles such as Indian arrowheads, stones, jewels, crosses, cameos, and even pictures 12x18 inches have materialized in the darkened seance room for the public, or in the red light for the mass demonstration. Upon infrequent occasions apports have even manifested in the artificial light or even in the daylight!

During the public demonstrations or seances of apports Rev. Bunker is entranced by his spirit guide, Dr. Gonzales, and the circle is conducted by his beloved spirit Messenger Guide, Thistle. Thistle speaks independent of the medium as do many of the Orientals and loved ones, while the majority of Red Indian Guides use the trumpet or what is known as Direct Voice.

Neither the trumpet nor the body of the medium are used in these demonstrations for the rematerialization or manifestation of apports. Many have deduced that the apports are conveyed or pass through the body of the medium and that the apport is warm because of the body temperature.

Rather, we return to our scientific explanation as given at the beginning of this article the medium acts as one magnetic pole, and the sitters, the opposite magnetic pole, as in a battery, which, through the electrical current, transforms the objects back to their particular physical vibratory rate.

This is accomplished through the drawing of magnetic energy, by spirit, from the solar plexus of each of the group; and by relaxing and releasing the mental anxiety, one can *pull* the apport to them so that as the apport is released from the astral to the physical plane of expression, it can drop into your lap.

Rev. Bunker begins to release this energy several hours before a demonstration. Usually it is the late evening, before retiring, during which time the apports are selected by spirit and dematerialized, changed to the vapor or astral vibration. They are held in that state until eight o'clock in the morning when the seance convenes.

In a mass demonstration Rev. Bunker invites a lady and a gentleman, volunteers, to come forward and upon the platform. He then requests the lady to stand on his left side, and with both of her hands hold his left arm aloft so that his left hand is above their heads throughout the demonstration: the gentleman is asked to do likewise with his right arm. During one verse of the hymn, "In the Garden," he is entranced by Dr. Gonzales who then conducts the manifestation.

In the closing the mass apport demonstration at Chesterfield Camp, Indiana, on 24 July 1948, Thistle made the prophecy, through her medium, that she hoped, in a demonstration during the 1949 Camp Season, she would be able to bring into manifestation a shower of apports.

At a mass apport demonstration in the Chesterfield Auditor-Golden Rays ium given this year, on July 2nd, Dr. Gonzales spoke and gave identifying messages—told to whom the apport was coming, the spirit who was bringing it, and described the apport, as Thistle brought through seventeen apports in less than a halfhour.

Then, in an attempt to manifest the shower of apports, though climatic conditions seemed to be unfavorable, a storm was approaching and it was already thundering- and lightning, Dr. Gonzales counted the apports as he could see them in the shower, and there were fifty!

These apports fell in an area about twenty-four by five feet, the farthest being about thirtyfive feet from the medium. They were smaller in size than the usual, but were as distinctive with their individual cutting and hue, and their particular shape.

A Mrs. Lida Crain, who sat in the last row of the auditorium which was approximately one hundred and fifty feet distant from the medium, found and felt "sands of the sea" in the lap of the skirt of her dress!

Investigators many times shake their heads! Skeptics claim they can offer explanations—yet the friendly, unassuming, John W. Bunker is still eager to see each token after a demonstration with an unbounded interest and unlimited enthusiasm!

There have been many books which have attempted to gather together a convincing and authentic collection of typical incidents and occurrences of psychic phenomena. This book of Dr. Cross' is by all odds the most convincing and best presented of all these books.

It is not a large book, for Dr. Cross believes that one fully documented and unbreakable case is better that a crowd of doubtful or hearsay ones.

Dr. Cross is a Ph. D. and an electrical engineer, and he has traveled and worked in many out-of-the-way corners of the world. His book, however, proves him to be sincere and quite convinced, for it is obvious that he has spent a good deal of time and thought for some years on these, the strangest manifestations of the modern world. 
M EN are not made free by edict, but by the power of their own will over the conditions and circumstances which enslave their spirits and minds.
