GENERAL MUNDANE FORECASTS.

This year our spring season begins at the meridian of Washington, D. C., at 3:03 a. m., local mean time at this place (this being the local time of the nearest lunation to the first point of bries, which marks the vernal or spring equinox) on March 16. The astronomical year begins March 20, 8:47 p. m., Washington local mean time. The planet Mars bears chief rule for the coming year, which will deceive many.

The heat in summer shall be increased; the cold in winter will diminish, and spring and autumn will incline to heat rather than cold. There will be much snow and rain in the months of March and April in our northern states, with rain in our southern states. There will be destruction of fish, of which men shall catch many; danger of assassination to great men; a scarcity of the fruits of the earth; danger of rot by hot and sultry winds; many caterpillars and locusts in places of their abode; and troubles for servants. This will hold more or less for the year, but especially for the first half of the spring, and comes from Mars being lord of the year, in the tenth house at the full moon of the 16th, and in the sign Pisces, together with his position in the fourth house, at the vernal equinox for Washington, at which time Libra will be seen rising in the eastern horizon at this place, and as its ruling planet is Venus, and is weak, there will be troubles fall on women during the coming quarter, and misfortunes will fall on the borders of the Caspian sea. A part of Thibet, China, parts of India near China, Japan, Austria, Bactrianna, Savoy, Upper Egypt, Ancient Libya, Antwerp, Charlestown, Frankfort and Lisbon will also have misfortunes.

There will be great devotion to the arts and Soldiers and sailors of the United States will be rather fortunate and victorious over their enemies. During the early spring the common people will be rather prosperous and things will promise to be plentiful, temperate and healthy. But on May 28 there will be a conjunction of the Sun and Moon in the shape of a total eclipse of the Sun, visible in America; seen as a total eclipse at Norfolk and New Orleans and places in and near an air line location between them, and westward across the northern part of Mexico. It will be almost total at Washington, beginning at forty-five minutes after noon at Washington and lasting for two hours and thirtythree minutes. The longitude will be in Gemini, six degrees and forty minutes. From the relative positions of the planets to the Washington meridian, we find that Mars is in dominion, and the combined effects will continue for two or three years, during which there will be dissensions between priests of all orders; sedition and law breaking: kings and rulers will be assassinated; mighty winds and pestilences will prevail and there will be danger of earthquake shocks, and mischief and destruction will result. At the time of the eclipse Mars stands in aries and portends a dry, hot air during the remainder of the quarter. The snow of the mountains will melt and the rivers will be flooded.

Foreign wars will be excited among mankind, accompanied with intestine divisions, captivity, insurrestion of the people and wrath of princes and rulers against their subjects, together with sudden and untimely deaths, the consequence of these disorders.

Feverish disorders, testian agues and hemorrhages will take place and will be rapidly followed by painful death, carrying off chiefly young persons, and there will be conflagrations, murder, impiety, infractions of the laws, robberies and all kinds of violence will happen.

The atmosphere will be parched by bad, pesti-

lential and blasting winds, accompanied by drought, lightnings and fires emitted from the sky. At sea ships will be suddenly wrecked by the turbulence of the winds and strokes of lightning. All the creatures and productions of the earth adopted to the use of man, whether hearts, grain or fruit, will be damaged or destroyed by excessive heat, by storms of thunder and lightning, or by violent winds. The waters of the earth will evaporate and in the Southern State; the air will be like a steam bath. There is danger of whatever is deposited in store being bestroyed by fire or heat, and destruction of such flying fowls as men eat.

Jupiter will be forming a conjunction with Uranus in Sagittarius and in opposition to the ecliped luminaries and threatens severe epidemics to Spain, West England, the United States, the northeast coast of Africa, Lower Egypt, Flanders, Lombardy, Braland, Belgium and Bavaria will be most affected by this eclipse as it will occur in their ruling sign.

Astrologers wishing the basis of these calculations, please calculate the angles of the heavens for the time and place given and then use the helliocentric positions of the planets, with volume two of "Pierce's Text Book of Astrology" as a guide.

AN EXPERT'S OPINION.

Among the noted physicians of the last half century is Dr. L. D. Broughton, late of New York. Both himself and ancestors for some two or three generations back have ranked among the leading botanic medical men of England. He is also an astrologer of fame. He published Broughton's Monthly Planet Reader and Astrological Journal, at Philadelphia, from 1860 to 1870. From Vol. 1, No. 1, of April 1, 1860, we quote the following as a proper presentation of the claims made in behalf of the stary science:

Truth, says, says the philosophic Locke, scarcely ever carried new doctrines by vote anywhere after its first appearance. New opinions are always suspected, and usually opposed, without any other reason but because they are not already common. But truth, like gold, is not the

less so for being newly out of the mine. 'Tis trial and examination must give it price; yet it may, for all that, be as old as nature, and is certainly not the less genuine.

Facts that will be found in this work will astound many of those men who stand high in science; and the higher a man's rank and supposed knowledge of scientific truths are, the greater degree of degradation he feels, and therefore the greater degree of difficulty in admitting that there are things in this world not dreamt of by his philosophy. To these men we can only say, examine for yourselves. Do not be misled by your nursery stories and grandmother's dogmas that astrology is all false, and you will then discover that there is no mysticisms in the pure doctrines of Claudius Ptolemy, who in his day (near 2,000 years ago) declared that it was a common practice with the vulgar to slander everything which is difficult of attainment.

We grant that it is difficult for those persons who have not given attention to the subject, to conceive how the heavenly bodies can influence the minds and bodies of men, when we take into account the small size of a man's body and the great distance that the planets are from our Earth; but everyone must admit that attraction and gravitation, or the common tendency of bodies towards the Earth's center (the Sun's center and the center of the universe), is equally difficult to comprehend. (But none can disprove their facts.) Nay (to the outward sense) the well known principles of chemical affinity cannot be explained. We may prove that sulphur and iron have an affinity and do readily combine, but we cannot go further, or explain why, or how this fact exists in nature, save as we can adduce a rational theory, though a suspician is abroad that these things depend upon some peculiar electrical (or magnetic) action, which is also believed to be the foundation of astral influence. In every branch of natural philosophy there is much to learn, but science will never progress if we allow astrology to decide upon chemical phenomena, or take for granted the opinion of the chemists as to astrological truths. Neither can the allopathic physician decide the merits of the psychopathic healer, and vica versa. If we seek advice as to the merits

of a pice of leather we go to a tanner, or some one who knows leather.

That the Sun, Moon, planets and stars have an effect upon the Earth and its inhabitants is as self-evident a truth as that they have an existence. The ebbing and flowing of the tides prove this, as well as the periodical returns of heat and cold, light and darkness. These are the most prominent parts of judicial astrology, for their planetary influence is universally felt and admitted and its periods are accurately known. Thus far, at least, all men are astrologers, though most of them have not, it seems, sense sufficient to discover it. Changes of the weather and all the various conditions of the atmosphere, as shown by the thermometer and barometer, proceed from the same cause, namely, the various positions of the stars and sun's relation to them in his apparent tour of the ecliptic or zodiac, although the manner in which they effect these changes cannot (or has not been set forth) be explained. But an attentive observer will perceive them more particularly at the first and last quarters of the moon. Every sub-lunary has its origin in planetary influx and, as Locke justly observes, "the change or removal of any orb, although incomprehensibly distant, would cause things to put on a very different appearance."

The dispositions, habits and fortunes, not only of men, but of every organized being that lives or can exist, are derived from the same cause. The more immediate of these causes are the planets, owing to their proximity, rapid motion and frequent combinations with each other, as well as with the fixed stars which enables them to produce and convey a variety of different inflences. Of these, the luminaries (Sun and Moon) are the greatest in influence—the Moon by her nearness to our Earth and the Sun from his immense magnitude and peculiar conformation.

We will try to show facts and foretell their influence beforehand and trust in the common sense and honesty of our readers to decide whether or not they demonstrate the truth of these celestial influences for which we sincerely contend. There are six branches of astrological art, each of which, while distinct in its special sphere, is related to the other. (First) Judicial astrology

relates to seasons, weather, storms, crops, famines, epidemics and all things connected with life and growth and influenced by the condition of soils, waters and the atmosphere. (Second) Mundane or state astrology relates to city, state and national affairs in general, such as wars, commerce, prosperity, adversity, political, social, religious and moral conditions in their relation to public institutions. (Third) Genethliacal astrology relates to the conditions of an individual from birth; his various traits of character, his chances in life, his good and evil periods, etc. (Fourth) Elective astrology relates to the selecting of favorable times for the beginning of any all important undertakings. (Fifth) Hoary astrology relates to the nature and outcome of important matters that may arise in the various hours of life. (Sixth) Medical astrology relates to the successful diagnosis and prognosis of disease, either physical or mental, as well as the proper medicines to give, the times to give them and when to change them. The selection of proper times for performing indespensible surgical operations, etc. The healer who employs medicines in his work without a thorough knowledge of this branch of astrology is like a ship at sea without either sail or rudder. He or she simply goes by chance and experiment. Let them study this art and conform to God's divine laws. The mental and magnetic healer can gain increased power by a knowledge of this art, for he can determine the real causes of disease, its liable outcome, the time it may take to cure, whether he can help him without doing himself an injury and when he should treat, etc.

Man cannot overcome the seasons and ininfluences that judicial astrology deal with, but he can become a conscious factor and master of his own being and destiny if he will only learn, for in his life the heavens arge, predispose and incline, but do not compel him to any action, if he only understands the law of his being.

One may be predisposed to rheumatism and if he does not know it, some time in life he will run into environments that will lay him up with it. If he knew he was predisposed to it he could avoid all the things that cause and accelerate it, and if he knew enough, or could get sound astrological advice, he could know just when he ought to be more careful than ever.
