## The Birth and Growth of Uncle Sam.

One hundred and twenty-four years ago today, July 4, 1776, Old Liberty Bell, hanging in the dome of Independence Hall, in the city of Brotherly Love, Philadelphia, rang out the glad tidings of the birth of a new nation; a nation of states, a baker's dozen at first, taking the name of the United States of America, patronymical by Uncle Sam. On that memorable day the Declaration of Independence was signed, fifty-six patriots affixing their signatures thereto; Franklin the philosopher, remarking, "We must all hang together or we will all hang separately."

After a long and bloody war Uncle Sam gained his independence from his old father, John Bull.

Every school boy and girl should read carefully, every 4th of July, the Declaration of Independence.

Uncle Sam's family increased rapidly and prospered greatly, outgrowing the Articles of Confederation. On September 17, 1787, in the city of Brotherly Love, inspired by the grand principles of the Declaration of Independence, a working document named the Constitution of the United States was prepared, by delegates from each state, submitted to each state, ratified, and made the Magna Charta of the young, growing nation. The preamble of the Constitution should be memorized by the youths of the nation, and repeated daily. Every voter should be familiar with the Declara-

tion of independence, and the Constitution.

After Uncle Sam got the Constitution in good working order, the nation grew rapidly. A sister state ceded surplus lands to Uncle Sam, and under his wise and liberal management, lovers of liberty from other nations were invited and came to make permanent homes in Uncle Sam's domain.

Eight new states were formed out of the lands ceded by the states to Uncle Sam.

Seeing the advantage of having land for the children of the patriot fathers, as well as for the liberty-loving people of other nations, Thomas Jefferson, executive officer for Uncle Sam, secured in 1803 from France, a vast domain, from which have been formed twelve states and two territories.

In 1812, John Bull imposed upon Uncle Sam and got beautifully whipped.

In 1819, Florida was purchased from Spain.
In 1845, Texas, having gained her independence from Mexic, was admitted a member of the nation. Mexico got mad over this annexation, got to mistreating our citizens trading under treaty in her jurisdiction, and Uncle Sam gave her a good threshing, taking a slice of her territory to pay war expenses.

From this cession eight states and territories have been formed. The territory from which the states of Oregon and Washington have been formed was claimed by right of discovery, England and Spain each claiming a shadowy interest in this territory. Uncle Sam, by treaties, secured a clear title.

Our good and benevolent Uncle Sam, having such a vast expanse of unoccupied lands, composed and sent abroad to the oppressed and homeless of other nations a song; one verse I quote from memory:

Of all the mighty nations in the east or in the west.

This glorious Yankee nation is the greatest and
the best:

We have room for all creation—don't be alarmed— For Uncle Sam is rich enough to give us all a farm-

Then come along, come along, make no delay-Come from every nation, come from every way; Our lands, they are broad enough, don't be alarmed.

For Uncle Sam is rich enough to give you all a farm,

This invitation brought the lovers of liberty

protected by law when on our shores—from all parts of Europe.

Slavery of the sons of Ham, a domestic institution, was a bone of contention in the new states,
and the sonthern portion of Uncle Sam's family
tried to set up in business of government for themselves, but after four years of hard fighting returned to the fold. During this period, Uncle
Sam's commerce being greatly disturbed by privateers, he opened up manufactories, and made himself independent of other nations. With freedom
of thought, freedom in religion, free schools, press
meensored, education progressed very rapidly.

In 1867, Alaska was purchased from Russia, who sympathized with us in putting down the southern rebellion.

From the Atlantic to the Pacific, from the great lakes to the gulf, our land is gridironed with railroads. Our manufactured products having outgrown our home consumption, Uncle Sam has had to look up markets abroad for our surplus manufactured products, as well as surplus cereals, beef, latter, cheese and pork.

Cuba, the gem of the Antilles, struggling for the right of self government, and being cruelly treated by Spain, Uncle Sam warned Spain to let Cha go free, and when she refused, sunk her ships and drove her out of the western continent. Porto Rico and the Philipine Islands have come to us as legacy of the war with Spain. What to do with these islands is being debated. The patriotism and wisdom of Uncle Sam will solve this question correctly, in time. During the Spanish war, the Hawaiian Islands came into the fold by annexation. Uncle Sam and other great nations are at present having some trouble with China. ships and more men may be needed, but treaty sipulations on the part of China must be respected.

Uncle Sam is now a full grown nation.

Uncle Sam was born on July 4th, 1776, and the physicians who waited upon his mother, wh was Miss Human-Necessity, were a committee of patriots that were authorized to draft the immor tal "Declaration of Independence," which was the naval cord in this case. This committee be gan its work at 2 hours, 19 minutes, 31 seconds a. m., of the day in consideration. The immortal document was passed upon by congress at 2 p. m. and it was signed in the evening at 9 hours, 15 minutes p. m. Thus was the birth of Uncle Sam in the city of Philadeiphia, and state of Pennsyl vania, accomplished. Let us now see what the heavens say of the character of our immortal guardian of the nations welfare. On the back cover page you are given a typical picture of the personification, called Uncle Sam. He is shown in the background. Commencing in the center of the circle is shown the sun, and the planets, their orbits, and relative distance from the sun, on each
