OSES, in the later day, with his mind clouded by the reasoning of the human, and the weakness of the same, failed to perceive in all its fullness, the supporting power behind him. Still, he never forgot the wonderful demonstration of the awful words.

Remember I use the word "awful" not as something with terror in it, but with the awesomeness, the immensity of the potency that resides in those two words.

If the vibration of manifestation is strong enough, the vibration itself will convey a thousand-fold more than the thought force can. Even the words: "I A M" pronounced over and over again with due solemnity, will bring results you hardly dream of. Try it some time. Try it when you are in need of a friend as never needed before. As within all manifestation hid this difference at the first, as is ever held within the "I am," so within ourselves, as the "I am" of ourselves, the result of our sending, of our being commissigned tod o this, that, and the other. The very idea that the "I am hath sent" us, endows us with the power of the I am. Within lies the germ of all unfolding. manifestation, life, possibility, and probability. It depends upon us individually, to put our finger, so to speak, on the particular point we desire to develop, then there shall come to us, either the violet in all its beauty, the sunflower, or anything interme-

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diate. Whatever we dwell upon in the "I am" and with the "I am" feeling, will develop itself if we dwell upon it sufficiently long, and hence, that which has been developed by the pronunciation, the enunciation and the potency of the "I am," will move forward to accomplishment. I am as certain of it as I am of talking to you to-night.

How shall I prove the truth of what I say? There is but one place I know. Our Most Ancient Elder Brother of Galilee told us to go into our closets and when we had shut the door, to "talk with the Father" and the Father would answer; the Father who is the Silence; the Father who is the I AM from everlasting to everlasting. How shall we come into this Silence? How shall we come to the place where there shall be absolute stillness? If we could build for ourselves a closet even in the physical plane it would be better for many of us.

It was but a little while ago I read a description, or heard a description, of a closet used by a man, who is considered an authority as a scientist. It is separated from the outer world by three galleries, a room within a room. This room within a gallery, and the gallery held and surrounded by another gallery, so that absolutely every outside sound is cut off —nothing from the outer visible can reach him. Here, shut off from all distracting sounds and vibrations, he has learned to come to the place, where the stillness of the small voice that tells of the Unseen, the unpronounceable, the infinite and the Eternal, the Omnicient, the Omnipotent and the Omnipresent, tells over, and over, and over the things wonderful to hear. Things wonderful to experience and receive.

Those who have the ability to translate into common language, all that is thus heard are taken up into the third heaven. Whether in the body or out of the body, makes no difference. Inspired by the "I am" the words and credentials, bear the truth in the words expressed.

The absolute silence is not always the absence of sound, but it is the absence of vibration. When we cease to vibrate we disappear from personal sense. If every atom of the body could be held motionless, without a single fraction of motion of any kind, it would disappear from view as absolutely as did our Most Ancient Elder Brother of Galilee, time and time again. The old stories and legends in books of the Wise Ones, of those having a cloak, when they put it on, covered them entirely from the view of their fellows, is no myth. It is no idle tale. This cloak is the cloak of absolute stillness. It is this Silence in which the "I AM" dwells. There is no opposition, no conflict, no crossing of the wires, so to speak, in this stillness, not even a reflection of that which might have been at the time or previously.

In closing, I want to say to you something enforcing the idea, of the phrase "I AM." We have said, and heard it said, thousands of times: "He who knows the Father, he who lives close to the Father, He who lives in God hath all power." He who lives in God is commissioned by the "I AM." It is only when he is baptized by the fullness of the conception, that "I AM" exists, and the existence holds within itself everything else, that man has come to the place, where he can fully manifest his own unfolding and the search is finished. we become that which the Everlasting and Existent designed us to be, gods in our own right. minds the phrase: "I AM." My word for it, as it passes through your minds with a solemn tone of vibration, like the music of an organ in a great cathedral, your success will be assured. You will pass from the condition of timidity and fear, up, up into regions where you will grow sturdier and stronger; at the last to walk on thrones. Power lies beneath your feet. The declaration of power given into the hands of those who believe, will be verified in their own body, mentality and spirit. #### LIGHT ON THE SCIENCE OF ASTORLOGY.

#### (CONTINUED.)

W ITHIN our Circle of Twelve we build our Pyramid, symbol of the Universe; Fire, the Eternal Light and Almighty God; our Square, symbol of the Spirit of Love becoming manifest through the Soul; our Cross, symbol of the natural man, reaching out for experience; our five pointed star symbol of the intellectual man, reaching out for knowledge; and the six pointed star, symbol of the regenerate man Jesus; while the twelve pointed star signifies the Christ.

We may then demonstrate within the circle the fundaments of geometry, mathematics and number—for every known cube, every known angle; every know principle is therein contained.

Every circle, be it that which limits our comprehension of the Universe, or that which describes the atom in circumference is composed of 360°-the points 360°, 90°, 180° and 270°, let us form our square-then from the same angles let us make our Cross-this gives us our four prime angles for measurement of time and space; our points of compass-South, East West, and North; our mid-Heaven, Ascendant, Descendant and Nadir of our Horoscope; the four corners of the earth; the four seasons, and esoterically the four cherubims, the four scraphims; the four mighty elders; the four rivers that flowed from the garden of Eden, which may be found in the center of our square; the four great Kings, the four prophets of the Old Testament; the four gates of the city of New Jeru-

salem; the four signs  $\times + -$  multiplication, addition, division and subtraction and the four years of the moon, each year being 90° of the circle and marking one of her most subtle cycles wherein she intercepts and interpenetrates all the Fours and aids the human conception of the Natural Man to build up into realization the *Four Square City* spoken of in Revelations.

The number Four is the square. When the Cross of natural desire has been transmuted out of the four square city, and the soul has gained the requisite knowledge through its experience and intellectual comparison, upon the plane of the five pointed star, then regeneration and transmutation of the intellectual comprehension begins and the soul commands that higher understanding of spiritual accomplishment, by which every atom of the natural man is transformed into the spiritual consciousness, the symbol of which is the twelve pointed star, with every point turned upward making the Crown of Glory-the demonstration of which is Jesus the Christ. So the wise men of 1900 years ago wisely looked for a star in the East that should herald their new born king. Why in the East? Because that is the point geometrically where all birth takes place.

The upright line within our circle and square stands for the masculine, positive element of the natural man, that element which compels him to stand erect instead of on all fours like the animal; that impels him to look for something higher than the natural for guidance and enlightenment and that becomes the longitude of his physical birth.

The horizontal line forming the cross and the latitude of birth, gives indication of the negative feminine *Principle* actuating the soul of that natural man into a desire for knowledge. Therefore the fruit of the "Tree of Knowledge" was plucked first by the woman *Principle. Of course it was*, and rightly so, and that same woman *Principle*, that "Eve," that soil will enable it to pass triumphantly the angle of the Four Square City where stands the angel with the "flaming sword." THAT is the principle which is to transmute the intural man and all natural desires out of the crucible of experience into knowledge and realization.

The story of Adam, the natural man, and Eve, the soul or feminine principle, being expelled from the garden of Eden, the center of consciousness, unified in the circle and the cross, is repeated here in the geometrical basis of our Circle of Twelve—and so we may find the whole Bible reiterated.

Adam and Eve demonstrated the workings of that mighty Divinity through the masculine and feminine activities of natural forces, the great principles of all creation, dispersing through separate fornis, male and female, until, as separate individuals they shall each have attained their full measure of experience, and finally emerge one into the other, perfecting the masculine and feminine principles in one body and making of it in reality a Temple fit for the Living God.

From the Mid Heaven of our square and cross evolves the spiritual, moral and projective forces, because it is here that the Spirit of God "moves upon the face of the waters," and the fiat is uttered "Let there be—" From the eastern angle we get the vital, mental and reflective forces; because it is here that the soul is born into flesh.

These forces throw their polarity to the western angle and produce the emotional, conjugal, and receptive tendencies, because it is here that the soul expels itself from the higher consciousness into the realms of sense. Decending to the northern angle, from whence comes the material, physical and active forces, because it is here that the human soul dwells the longest in manifestation.

These angles are occupied successively by the three groups of signs called, fixed, cardinal, or movable, and dual, or "common." They change in position once in every 2,160 years, that being the time allotted by the precession of the equinoxes.

At the beginning of the christian era, the four cardinal signs, Aries  $\mathcal{P}$ , Cancer  $\mathfrak{D}_{A}$ , Libra  $\mathfrak{D}_{A}$ , and Capricorn  $\mathcal{V}_{J}$  occupied the angles of the Cross and Square. At the present time the dual signs, Pices  $\mathfrak{X}$ , Gemini II, Virgo  $\mathfrak{M}$ , and Sagitarius  $\mathfrak{f}$ , are upon these angles, and in another 2,000 years the fixed signs, Aquarius  $\mathfrak{M}$ , Taurus  $\mathfrak{H}$ , Leo  $\mathfrak{N}$ , and Scorpio  $\mathfrak{M}$ , will return in order.

These changes mark the nature and character of the cycles which bring into manifestation the grander principles of racial evolution just as the seasons and years mark the epochs of human development. These angles are the prime angles, but as our circle has twelve signs, so we must have three squares and three crosses, and while all may not be prime in their influence at one time, the relative conditions of their influence is always important to the whole. 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
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
