



SIZE OF THE SUN.

T HERE are perhaps few of us who realize the immense size of the sun (174^*) or perhaps that have ever undertaken to contemplate it. Even in these modern times with ocean greyhounds and lightning express trains, there are comparatively few who during their lives, make the trip around our earth, a distance of 24,000 miles. Those who do can realize its great size. Now if we should travel around the earth ten times, we would only have traveled as far as from the earth to the moon. Let us, then, in our minds, set the sun with its center at the center of the earth.

And we find that the sun not only fills the moon's orbit around the earth, but that its surface is nearly twice as far away from us as the moon. Can we realize the immensity of such a body? And yet it is but a speck, compared with some of the other great suns, as the earth is a speck when compared with it. How much less are we able then to comprehend the size of a being, large enough to create a god, big enough to create such immense bodies in less than a day. No wonder the sun is able to keep the solar system filled with the gas of expanded matter from its great undying fires, when we remember that solid matter is always falling back into it from every direction and being disintegrated or exploded into gas of thousands of times its bulk. As a matter of fact the whole solar system is a part of and belongs to the sun the same as the atmosphere and rain and hail and snow are a part of the earth. The gas which the heat of the sun makes and which is swelled up in every direction from the sun, is only a part of the sun, which, when it turns back into fine dust, by extreme cold, falls back as the rain falls to the earth.

THE RESISTING MEDIUM.

Since it has been proven beyond doubt that some of the comets, notably Enkes and Fayes, our own moon, the Rings of Saturn and the planet Mercury, are actually shortening their orbits, a great real has been said about "the resisting medium." The truth seems to have been gradually dawning upon real astronomers for two or three centuries, that heavenly bodies do not forever follow the same path and therefore they are busy looking for a "resisting medium," with which to check the advance of heavenly bodies, so that they will travel more slowly and be allowed to fall towards the center of their orbit. When Newton discovered the force of gravity, he discovered the resisting medium which shortens every orbit of every heavenly body, from an atom of crystalized dust, to the sun which would fill our solar system with its immense bulk. Gravity is a drawing or conracting power which holds or draws a body towards a center and it should not take much of a philosopher to understand what "medium" of resistance shortens an orbit, now that they know that orbits do shorten. With this immense power or gravity pulling against the earth and attempting to pull it to the sun, what equally great power pulls it, or keeps it away from the sun? They say the speed of a heavenly body keeps it away by overcoming the force of gravity. On the face of it, this is a fallacy. What great power then, keeps up the speed? There must be a constant power applied to overcome a constant pulling power towards the sun. Not only this, but the speed constantly increases and the nearer a planet is to the sun or the nearer a moon to its planet, the faster it travels. How then does it get and continually increase this speed or power? Simply by falling — the power is the force of gravity, which gives every heavenly body its speed and its ever increasing speed, as it nears its center. Astronomers have been in the habit of speaking of and thinking of the speed of a heavenly body as being imparted to it by the immense hand of a god, giving it a mighty push or throw and they let it go at that. Now if they will drop this idea of a first great push, and remember that it would not last if it had such a push - but that it must be a continual

push, and even stronger and stronger as it continually gains speed. Can we not understand that something has pushed Mercury a great deal harder than it pushed Mars, when we notice that Mercury travels 2,500,000 miles per day and Mars but 1,100,000? We cannot deny that the same power is applied to both. What then is that power, but the weight of falling (253). The difference is that it has operated longer on Mercury. When the gas is expanded at the sun, the weight of these great planets is lifted by heat (in expansion) and when it falls it is simply a giving back of the same power, by returning weight. See Law XXXIII, October issue of this magazine, p. 5. It is, in the end, a question of weights. Whatever power or energy (heat) it required to raise matter to the immense height of Neptune's orbit, will be regenerated when it returns to the sun (7).

PROOF OF EARTH'S ROTATION

Camille Flammarion, the eminent astronomer, in the presence of 5000 persons, including representatives of the Government and the most prominent scientists, renewed at the Pantheon in Paris, France, on Oct. 22, 1902, in the afternoon, the only visible proof ever given since Foucauld's original experiment in 1851.

From the Pantheon dome a weight of sixty-two pounds was suspended by a wire 234 feet in length. The pendulum was started by Flammarion and each double beat of sixteen seconds showed an apparent deviation of one-tenth inch in a direction contrary to the earth's real rotation. With successive beats the deviation became clearly perceptible and a cry of enthusiasm escaped the spectators. Flammarion said afterward:

"The experiment is the grandest lesson ever given in popular astronomy, and we know with our own eyes that we inhabit a moving planet."

ORIGIN OF PETROLEUM, COAL, AND OTHER CAR-BONACEOUS PRODUCTS.

In beginning this article I want to qualify as to the term origin. As geologically, no step or condition in the transformation of carbon from one form to another can strictly be called an origin, and in attempting to account for the wonderful natural phenomena around us we must look at each object or form as merely a link in the endless processes of nature, and not regard any thing as having a definite origin or of being a finished product, and we must bear in mind that nature does not halt when the stored up carbonaceous products are denuded of their covering, but disintegrates them by erosion like all other strata that are in a state of emergence from the heated depths below, until no visible trace of them remains. If this were not so, the price of fuel oil would be even cheaper than it now is, and my critics would not be saying that my theory accounted for more of such products than were apparent.

We have all read a number of theories to account for the presence of deposits of petroleum and coal, nearly all of which are very absurd, inasmuch as they require fabulous conditions which in themselves are more difficult to account for than the first. The truth is our brains have been so crammed with the fabulous in childhood that our reasoning powers are defective, and it is difficult to theorize correctly. One of the most popular of these theories is that immense quantities of fish or other animals drifted or were stormdriven into inlets. Sandbars formed in such manner as to retain them. The water evaporated causing the oil from their putrid bodies to seep into the sand, which afterward became covered (with strata) thru which we drill in our quest for petroleum.

In an early number of this magazine, the editor in reply to the query as to what made coal said, mud. And he was right, and mud is the parent of petroleum and all other carbonaceous products, and in pointing out the transformation from mud to petroleum, etc., I am not going to call to my aid any fabulous conditions or monsters or miracles, for their formation is still going on and the process can be demonstrated in all its essentials by artificial methods, conducted on the lines of the conditions that are known to exist in the crust of the earth.

Most people who observe tilted and contorted strata seem to think that it was disturbed by sudden upheavals, but we have no warrant for such a belief. This earth movement is going on all the time and is more active now than formerly, on account of the increasing firmness of the earth's crust. As the crust becomes thicker and harder the surface is corrugated on a greater scale by the compression.

This buckling of the earth's crust has caused a considerable change in climate since the first growth of vegetation. so that only some few parts of the earth are now suitable for the first stages of the formation of petroleum and coal on any considerable scale.

This change has been caused by the buckling crust deepening the ocean in places, thereby contracting their area and forming mountains, consequently causing the rainfall to become less and intermittent in many localities. Less rain means less growth, and intermittent rainfall means the destruction of much carbonaceous matter by fires, since those pesky all-destroying creatures called men became cunning enough to create fire.

The basis of my theory is the fact that all the detritus that is washed into oceans and is constantly building layers of mud, sand, etc, which form into shales, sandstones and other harder strata, contains more or less unconsumed carbon, and it is known that regions hundreds of miles in extent gradually rise while other equally large areas are depressed, sometimes many miles vertically during long ages of sub-But altho detritus from the upheaved portions is sidence. being continually washed into the depressions, readjustments often change, subsiding into emerging areas. Now it is an established scientific fact that a few miles down in the crust the heat is sufficient to vaporize the carbonaceous matter and drive it upward, allowing the attenuated product of thousands of cubic miles to concentrate and condense into comparatively small bodies.

The valley of the Amazon in South America has conditions suitable for the formation of carbonaceous products in their first stages. A damp, warm climate favoring a prolific vegetation, and a minimum of forest fires. The seaboard is in a state of subsidence, and the ocean is deep, favoring rapid deposition. The sediment that is swept out by the immense river contains a large per cent. of carbonaceous matter in the form of leaves, bits of wood and even whole trees, but by far the larger part is finely incorporated in the gray mud that is deposited on the ocean bottom in layers with each recurring maximum stage of the current.

If the subsidence of the ocean floor continues until say, six miles or more of this carbon-containing mud is laid down and then emerges or remains stationary until the sandy beach recedes or encroaches over the deposits or a portion of them, leaving large beds or strata of sand (beach sand is always porous because the surf washes the finer particles constantly into deep water), then if the subsidence again occurs, until a few miles of additional deposits cover the sand, the conditions will be ideal for the formation and retention of petroleum and probably also other carbon products.

The carbonaceous matter ceases to decay as soon as it is deposited on the ocean floor and the deposits under the pressure of the constantly added material, becomes mainly shale rock, of which a large part of the earth's crust is composed, and if it did not become covered sufficiently deep to cause the heat to drive the carbon out in the form of gas, it would remain unchanged until it was in its turn eroded away.

Downward in the earth's crust the heat increases at the rate of about one degree to every fifty feet, or about 100 degrees per mile. About two and a half miles would be sufficient to drive the sea water out of the sand, upward in the form of steam, to condense in higher strata. Six miles below the surface the carbonic matter would all turn to gases that would percolate upward as long as the subsidence continued. Within about three miles of the surface the gases would condense into petroleum, coal or bitumen, having local characteristics imparted to them more by the heat, environments and time occupied in the process, than by any variations in composition of the mud from which it was formed. Let us now suppose the subsidence of this region to have reached its maximum, and emergence to begin. The ocean recedes and what has been a waste of water for ages becomes land. And if the rate of emergence exceeds the weathering, or erosion of the elements, it may become elevated thousands of feet above the ocean. Later this erosion will have thinned down the covering in some localities to within a few hundreds of feet, perhaps exposed some indications of them to view, when the most dominant animals, if there be any on the earth having sufficient intelligence, may extract them for their benefit as we are doing today with the coal and petroleum that are being denuded of their covering.

Coal is found in the same series of rocks of the same ages as those in which petroleum is found, and the observing person who is acquainted with the conditions in which both occur must be impressed with the similarity. Petroleum is usually found in porous sand rock, which acted as a reservoir to receive and retain it, and would be the best means of preserving it the longest. It is highly probable, however, that the property of accretion by affinity, that carbon has in common with all minerals, and which is strongest when the mineral is nearest its pure state, had much potency in securing its concentration.

In the formation of coal strata, however, this property of matter gives us one of its best examples, for coal is not found in any reservoir except such as it forced for itself by accretion of its particles in the soft shales in which it is found. The arbitrary limitations of temperature also may have much to do with the evenness in which coal is found in place. I will not attempt to explain why carbonic gases sometimes condense into coal and at other times into petroleum, or into intermediate products, as that is the special province of chemistry, with which I have but a superficial acquaintance, and this article is already too long. A significent fact, however, is that when petroleum and coal both occur in the same locality, the coal is invariably above the petroleum, usually 1500 to 2000 feet.

The petroleum of California, the occurring in younger strata than the great oil fields of Pennsylvania, was condensed from gases that came from a greater depth, where the heat was greater, as is evidenced by the greater proportion of basic substance which it contains, and probably most of the variations in the products we are considering occur from this cause.

There is a movement on foot in this city to organize a large stock company with sufficient capital to start an institution where people will be cured and kept in good health at so much per month, or year. When they are sick they will not pay, but when they are well they will pay their regular dues, have their pulse felt and take whatever warning may be necessary from the examining board to secure health for the next month. This is one of the greatest steps forward which could possibly be taken. The good people of advance thot in Los Angeles, should not leave a stone unturned to bring this about. The practice of medicine has always been an enormous fraud. It is practiced on the wrong basis, like religion and a great many other things. The very fact that if a patient gets well the doctor's pay stops, compels the doctor to either be a fraud or a pauper. He must keep the patient sick or he does not get his money. China is far ahead of this country in respect to the practice of medicine. The people are so poor there that it does not pay a doctor to rob them and they simply pay a small regular fee to be kept well. It is true enough that it only requires about one doctor to where there are now ten, but it shows also what a useless swarm of parasites they are now, keeping us sick to get our money. Think of the innumerable hoard of preachers and priests in the world, living off of the charity of poor women and children. They are also as useless as ninetenths of the M. D.'s. Let all of them go to work and earn an honest living the same as the poor sick women and tender little children do, whom they rob by prayers and pills. The time is coming when it will be a disgrace to live by charity and especially upon the hard-earned pennies of women and children, as priests and preachers live, and the time is also coming when it will be a disgrace to be sick or intoxicated. Men are ashamed to be sick now. They realize that it is a

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disgrace and the result of laziness, gluttony or filthy habits. This is almost always the cause of sickness, except when an M. D. gets a chance to work in his pill or dose, and so keeps you going. It will be a grand thing for humanity when doctors are paid to keep you well, instead of sick. A NEW DISCIPLE.

Clarence C. Gates criticises Judge Tenney's Theory of the Solar System, in Oct. *Freethought Magazine*, of which the following are extracts, showing that he is ready to accept the Procession Theory. Light, heat, thought, sound, etc., are simply motions of the gas of expanded matter which fill the spaces of the universe, but electricity is a part of expanded matter. It is a fluid which can be collected, stored and used later.

* * * * * * * * *

"It is now a well-established fact that there is a thin, or rare substance, filling all space, unoccupied by denser and heavier matter. This rare substance is called ether. * * *

"Light and electricity are motions of ether, and of nothing else. Heat moves or passes through the ether, too, as you can easily prove, by standing near a hot fire or stove. This is a scientific fact, of which physics fully treats. Heat can pass from the sun to the earth, as heat. It has a very slight resistance in the ether, for which reason it is so cold in the space beyond the air.

"Now, if the sun was a globe, not molten, and like the earth, as Mr. Tenney believes, then the earth must be heated by electric currents from the sun, as Mr. Tenney says. These currents would be caused by the rapid motion of the sun through the ether. Friction, magnets, and chemical action will produce electricity. Friction with the ether, caused by the sun passing through the ether, would produce electricity. A loss of motion would result; a dimunition of the sun's speed through space. If the sun and earth were considered as magnets; the magnet, earth, revolving around the magnet, sun, there would still be a loss of motion. What is true of the sun would be true of the earth. Finally the earth and sun must clash; it would be inevitable. Under such conditions it would be illogical to say the earth has always existed in the same shape or globe, as it exists now.

"I understand, from quotations Mr. Tenney has made, that he wishes to demonstrate that the supposed electric currents turn into heat, upon passing through the air. If that were so, the further they pass through the air the more heat they would produce. The present zones would be reversed —the frigid zones becoming the torrid and the torrid becoming the temperate or frigid zones. Or, why should not these electric currents make a temperate climate all over the earth? The quotations that Mr. Tenney makes, to support his theory, are on pages 30 and 31, 'The Earth Not Created.' It seems to me that Dr. Rogers is as mistaken as Mr. Tenney.

"This is a serious mistake that Mr. Tenney has made. He is required to assume that there is friction, or a loss of motion to the sun and earth, to develop the electric currents. For perpetual motion is an impossibility, as much with the sun and earth as it is here upon the earth. Although there is a very, very slight resistance to the earth from the ether, still, some day, this resistance must throw the earth into the sun.

"Although I do not believe as Laplace believed, I cannot accept Mr. Tenney's theory that the earth has always existed as the globe, upon which we live. We have no reason to doubt that motion is eternal, and is the inevitable and necessary result of the universal diffusion of matter, possessing force."

PROCESSION.

An interesting article in Harbers by Professor Snyder opens guite a new view of life possibilities to the layman. The professor holds that ferments are not caused by bacteria except in so far as the chemical products of these are present, and that these chemical products without the living bacteria will produce the same chemical actions as with them. Certain bacteria squeezed to death in a sand press resulted, he says, in a juice that placed in the proper medium produced the ferment just as the bacteria had done. He thinks that everything in the universe is active on this line of ferment. The interesting suggestion is, however, that these ferment processes can be reversed. Thus the ferment exhibiting itself in man's life and normally ending in old age and death, reversed at the proper time, would lead back to youth and babyhood. Some call it Electricity, the ignorant call it god.'



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
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
