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

CAUSE OF SUN SPOTS.

Those readers of this magazine who have studied the theory of a procession of planets and become interested, are familiar with the cause of sun spots (162*) as taught and proven by the theory, but as time goes on and astronomers are investigating and keeping records with the new theory in view, they are piling up evidence which is establishing the theory beyond question. It is now proved beyond doubt that comets, the rings of Saturn, our moon (158) and Mercury are shortening their orbits. This shows that all solid matter in the solar system is gradually approaching the sun and finally falls into it (23). It has been and still is a mystery, that great black spots should appear on the sun's surface. According to this new theory, however, it is very simple. (See "Mystery of the Sun," Vol. I, No. 10, p. 10), and easily explained. The sun is so many times hotter than any heat which can be produced on earth, that it is no wonder philosophers have stumbled in solving the mystery. Even the they could conceive that a chunk of matter should be permitted (by god) to fall into the sun, they would fail to perceive that such an immense explosion must take place, as does take place, because they overlook the fact that such great heat must almost instantly change solid matter into thousands of times greater bulk, as gas. The change from solid matter to gas, where the heat is so great, comes with the suddenness of the changing of giant powder into gas, and it should not be a hard matter to understand how these great holes can be torn in the body of the sun's surface, when we now know that matter does return to the sun. As solid matter falls back to the sun in an orbit (Law IX, Vol. I, No. 12, p. 2) it increases its speed according to the law of falling bodies, but as it is falling in an

orbit, the speed it gains adds to the centrifugal force which has a tendency to throw it away again, but when it does finally reach the sun, it is traveling at not much less than ten million miles per day (163). This great speed would bury it thousands of miles in the soft body of the sun, even if it exploded into gas within a quarter of a minute after it touched the sun's Suppose this chunk of matter was ten miles in diameter; when it disappeared in the fiery surface of the sun, the hole it left would be insignificant and entirely invisible from the earth, but a moment later when it is changed to a bulk of 11,000,000 cubic miles, there could be but one result, and that is what is happening continually at the sun. An enormous explosion from the sun upward throwing heated matter and flames thousands of miles high and leaving great dark holes, perhaps much larger than the bulk of gas which caused it. The proofs of this condition are so many that there can be no more well founded objection to it. I have shown you what causes light and heat (Vol. I, No. 1, pp. 1 to 4), and how the motion travels thru the gas of expanded matter to the earth, or how the sensation, motion, jar or vibration of light or heat is transmitted by motion. The fact then that an extra number of sun spots and unusual number of explosions on the sun adds to the heat of the weather at the earth, is sufficient proof that falling matter has added to the heat of the sun, and that the motion has been transmitted to the earth with the speed of light (Law XVII., Vol. I, No. 12, p. 3). more matter that falls into the sun, the more heat is created and the more gas is expanded; therefore the more rapid the jars or vibrations which cause the impulse motion of light. The more rapid this motion is at the sun, the more rapid it is at the earth, and the more heat is caused by this increased vibration, which is friction; thus the additional heat of the sun is transmitted to the earth's atmosphere with the speed of light. The Zodical light is a vast body of matter surrounding the sun, which is too small to be seen as individual bodies, but which travels in orbits and is always on its way, and the closest, always falling to the sun. This matter is probably composed principally of the remnants of the millions of comets which have distributed themselves in the past, as Enkes, Fayes and others are known to be doing at the present time. The

immense explosions at the sun, very often jars the gas of expanded matter, which surrounds the sun, to such an extent that it moves sensitive magnetic needles and magnets at the These delicate instruments are always hung so as to faithfully detect and record any disturbance at the sun (165) which happens day or night. Every considerable piece of matter which falls to the sun is faithfully marked in ink on paper, and can be depended upon as correct. While god is idling away his time, counting the hairs on dogs, recording the falling of sparrows and murdering millions of first-born infants by smashing their brains out on the door posts of their homes, Nature is doing and undoing the useful work, thru all the universe, by the expanding and contracting of matter by heat and cold without anger, jealousy, curses or repentance, and men hang up little instruments by delicate threads which count, weigh, number, measure and record all her progress, whether they are waking or sleeping.

EXPANDED MATTER.

Heat expanded matter fills all the universe of endless space, and there is no vacuum in nature. There are centers of matter, but out from these centers the surrounding gases simply become less dense and more sensitive, but never disappear. They could not because, like dividing ten by three. there is always a remainder. If there was no gas of expanded matter filling the entire space of the universe, the motion of light could not reach us from the sun or from the stars which are trillions of times as far away. There must be a substance for this motion, jar or vibration to agitate, in order to transmit light, heat or motion. Neither light nor heat can pass thru an artificial vacuum, provided it is an absolute vacuum. In experimenting with liquid air, it is found that by placing it inside of a glass bottle which is double with a vacuum between the two bottles, almost no heat can reach it, and it can be kept in a liquid state as many days, as hours formerly. At the surface of the earth where expanded air has a pressure of 14 pounds per square inch at sea level, one cubic foot of liquid water will make 1730 cubic feet of expanded gas of water or

vapor. This is caused, of course, by heat. The more specific gravity an element has, the more heat it takes to expand it into gas, and the more space its gas occupies. Gold is many times heavier than water, and the bulk of a cubic foot of gold when changed into gas by heat, would be just as many times as great as a cubic foot of water changed into gas or vapor by heat. The less heat it requires to change matter into expanded gas, the less cooling or pressure it requires to change it back again into solid or liquid matter. It takes but a few degrees of heat to expand water into vapor, and it likewise requires but a few degrees of cold to contract it back into liquid and allow it to fall to the earth as rain. As long as enough heat remains in it to keep it expanded it can not return thru itself, because it is more dense, the nearer we approach the earth. This same law or condition must and does hold good with all matter. Matter expanded by the immense heat of the sun which is 146 times hotter than the Drummond light is the gas of a complete admixture of all the elements of matter in nature and requires the immense cold of the region beyond Neptune to reduce or condense it back into crystals of solid matter. There is, of course, still a remainder, and there is always a remainder as we know that light could not travel from distant suns thru space if there was not the gas of expanded matter to transmit its motion. It may, of course, be possible that some of the gas expanded at the sun condenses at a much higher temperature than others, and it would certainly appear to be the case when we remember that beyond Neptune in the region of Nebulous clouds which surround the ecliptic of the solar system, is the distance at which the majority of matter apparently changes or condenses by cold into solid matter, yet there are still finer gases remaining which reach on and on thru trillions of miles of cold and dark space, which, perhaps, never crystalizes. Many scientists have the belief that when matter condenses in the region where the new worlds are formed, the heat or electric energy is pressed out of it, and that it returns to the sun as currents of electricity or heat; but allow me to call your attention to the impossibilities of this action in nature. In the first place, if it did not enter and become a part of solid matter it would still be expanded and could not return towards the sun because the

expanded matter (down) towards the sun is more and more dense, the same as air around the earth. Again we can take solid matter here at the earth, and by proper combinations cause a uniting which creates heat, light, electricity and energy, showing and proving that the force was stored in the solid matter. If some gases do not change back into crystals of solid matter in the region of Nebulae beyond Neptune, then it is reasonable that some may condense into solid or liquid at a less distance from the sun. We know that all space thru which our earth travels is pregnant with matter of all dimensions, from unmeasurably fine dust, to chunks of matter several miles in diameter. Undoubtedly there are millions of times as much matter returning to the sun in this independent shape, than returns in the form of planets. Being so small and so much more easily attracted they make their return journey in much less time. A great source of this matter is the ever-scattering of comets (See "Orbits of Comets," Vol. I. No. o), leaving longer and longer streams of meteors until they finally disappear, having no longer solid body enough left to create the friction of light by their rapid fall around the sun.

LIFE.

So long as people imagine there is what is called a soul in the human body, just so long will there be superstition and error, and as long as there are men who have no more honor than to live upon the charity of credulous women, so long will they attempt to keep this false doctrin established in the minds of the ignorant and intellectually dependent. past few years science has made such strides of advancement that there is no excuse for even a woman to believe it possible for a dead person to still exist in what is called a "spirit" or "soul." which is in the form and shape of nothing. hundred years ago the church did not consider that a woman had a soul; forty years ago they did not consider that a negro had a soul; and today they do not consider that any animal, plant or life below the human being has a soul. When we come to draw the line, however, between the human being and the animal, we find there is no such a line, and that the

human is an animal. We find human beings in the woods and jungles of Africa and South America, with less intelligence than the highest and most intelligent apes and animals. find insects who live in the highest orders of socialism, carrying on business, agriculture, conquest, slavery, etc., and showing occult powers and intelligence far superior to the lowest orders of men whom religion admits are provided with a soul by an alwise creator, whose origin they consider it a crime to question. Religion says there could be no earth without a god to create it, but when you ask "who created god?" they simply cry, "Shame," "You are a blasphemer," God's ways are past finding out," etc., always failing to show why nature must have a creator, whilst god needs no creator. Their childish and silly logic would not stand for an instant, even in the mind of a woman, negro or child, if they were allowed and were not too indolent to think. If it is admitted by religion, and it is, that the ignorant savage who lives in the treetops of the jungle, and holds the bible with which the missionary presents him, in his hind foot, has a soul which never dies, even when plunged into the christian lake of burning brimstone; what are you going to say of the ant or bee who shows a hundred times as much intelligence, purpose and industry? Have they also souls?

What is mistaken for a soul is a force produced in the nervous system by the expanding power of heat and the contracting power of cold or lack of heat. This force is the consciousness of the mind or nervous system, and the forces which produce it and all its effects are becoming well known to science. There is no other motion possible in nature than that made by either the expanding or contracting of matter, and these two motions are the result of heating and cooling. Heat expands matter from 1,730 to 11,000 times its bulk, when it was solid, thus lifting its weight away from its center: and when it is thus expanded into gas, it again cools and crystalizes into solid matter, when it immediately begins to fall back to the center from which it came. It falls faster and faster, and at last, when it again reaches the center, the collision of its fall and the chemical friction of its disintegration developes exactly the same heat which was expended in expanding it into gas. Every life form must have a nerve center, and a nervous system according to its intelligence. The human brain is the center of the nervous system of the human being, and from the brain center it reaches every part and particle and atom of the human body. In order to keep the force of consciousness alive or in action in the human brain and body, we are compelled to develop the force of heat in our bodies by taking into our stomachs such matter as will create the friction of heat by its disintegration or rotting. This is a chemical process by which different elements of matter in changing their form or uniting with each other create friction. Let us take notice here that heat, light, electricity, power and energy are all, but different manifestations of heat, and that either can be readily changed into either of the others. The nervous system consists of a soft, collidial substance called pro-to-plasm, and is made of atoms composed of ions or infinitesimally small globules which lie loosely together while this matter is kept warm and life exists. Sensations or consciousness travels thru it exactly as the motion of light travels thru the gas of expanded matter, or as the impulse of motion travels thru the line of bullets in a gun barrel. If we have a gun barrel 25 inches long filled with 100 bullets, and we push one more bullet in at the breech, the one at the muzzle instantly drops out. Each bullet traveled but one-fourth of one inch, and yet the impulse motion traveled 25 inches. If some one sticks a pin in your toe the consciousness of pain travels to your brain in exactly this way; one ion jars its neighbors, and the jar or vibration or sensation, which is motion, jars the next, and thus travels. As long as we have fuel in our stomachs to keep our blood warm, and air in our lungs to burn the refuse dead matter which the blood brings to that crematory, we should be in a condition to live. The time comes, however, when for some cause our supply of heat is stopped and death or rigor mortes takes place. There is no more consciousness. The immediate cause of this stopping of consciousness is that the protoplasm has crystalized, and there is no more motion in it, and at that instant consciousness (which is mistaken for soul) ceases to exist and death takes There can be no life or consciousness without this force or motion jarring or vibrating upon the collidial ions of this protoplasm, and there can be no light or heat passing thru a vacuum where there is no gas of expanded matter for it to iar or vibrate. Prof. Loeb has shown that poison causes death in this same way, and that consciousness ceases at the instant the ions of protoplasm solidifies. Consciousness or life being but a motion or force, having its beginning in the nervous system, ceases when it can no longer be transmitted thru the nervous system, therefore it is impossible that it could exist outside of a nervous system where there is no protoplasm or force, or anything to be made conscious. scious life is simply force, and we are forced to do whatsoever When the worm is hatched at the foot of the tree, he feels the force of contraction; that is, he is getting colder and the pain of hunger forces him to move; he feels the direction of the warm sunshine and crawls up. As he goes up, this pain of contracting or force compels his mouth to try everything he passes, and when he reaches the soft bud he eats it. Some time ago I mentioned the fact that the pain caused by pinching the extreme end of a cat's tail causes an action of the jaws. It is in the same effect, force of pain or of contracting which forces the worm to eat the bud. When the worm has eaten the bud and it begins the friction of rotting in his stomach, he at once becomes too warm in the sunshine and he is forced to crawl back, where he lies in the shade until empty, and is again forced by pain to crawl up for another bud. see, therefore, that there is nothing in nature but force, energy or motion, and that all motion is caused by heating or cooling Matter is never at rest, and is either heating and expanding, which is a force that raises matter up from a center, or else it is cooling and falling back to the center from which it came. There is absolutely no motion or force made in any other way, and mind is only a force or motion of Many people would rather not believe this to be true, on account of its interference with their religious belief, but let me beg of you to believe nothing but the truth, and assure you that what is true can never harm, even the tenderest and most delicate combination in nature. Truth can not do us harm, because it is true, but superstition and beliefs which are not true, can harm us, and do harm us, by keeping newly discovered truth away from us. It is true that there is no such a thing as a soul, to go on living after we are dead, but if we believe there is, we loose the opportunity to evolve to that perfection, where the inherent desire for betterment (which is evolution) is rapidly leading us, when our youth will again be renewed by nature at second childhood. We have a great deal to learn, and still more to forget, however, before we reach that stage of evolution, and we never can reach it while we believe in the ridiculous superstitions prevailing, which are contrary to nature.

WHY THE NATIONS OF THE EARTH ARE NOT CHRISTIAN NATIONS.

Is it not a pertinent question for a philanthropist to ask: "Can a Christian fight?" As my subject will tend towards analyzing what I believe to be true Christianity, I shall take my text from the 20th chapter of Genesis and 11th verse, which was said to be a command of god through Moses on Mt. Sinai. This command was to the children of Israel, and it was this: "Thou shalt not kill."

It is my purpose to show how that command has been obeyed by Christian nations. This command was sublime in its conception, and foreshadowing the universal brotherhood of man. It was as binding upon nations as individuals. Yet the history of the world shows emphatically that no nation has ever yet been established but by bloodshed and the power of the sword. The empires of the Eastern and Western continents have been obtained and sustained only by rivers of blood and wholesale slaughter too horrible to contemplate, and yet they assumed the name of Christian nations.

On the subject of religion, we might divide the people into four classes: First, popular Christians who let others think for them; second, ignorant Christians who never think; third, don't-care Christians, who are indifferent and, fourth, intelligent thinkers who think for themselves. In a former paper before this club, I stated that for 300 years after the advent of Jesus, the christian policy was peace, and not war, and no christian could be forced or persuaded by the Roman

consul to take up arms. Constantine, the first christian emperor, reigned from 306 to 337. This same christian emperor fearing the rivalry of Lucinius, murdered him in cold blood. His wife, Fausta, he put to death in a tank of boiling water; he beheaded his eldest son and murdered the husbands of his two sisters, and also a nephew of 12 years. These were the acts of the first christian emperor, and since then the christian (?) nations of the earth have followed along on that line, ignoring the doctrine taught by the founder of the christian religion.

Scotland was in continual war until she united with Great Britain, and Britain has thrived upon carnage until the sun never sets upon her dominions. The history of her Sepoy conquest, where scores of her victims were put into the cannon's mouth and blown to the four winds of heaven, will ever remain as a dark stain upon her history. Spain, in her conquest of Mexico and the adjacent islands, for over a century subjected the natives to wholesale butchery in the name of the Holy Catholic church. I may say truthfully that the whole civilized world has been a continual battlefield, where the shrieks of the dying have scarcely ever been silent. or national murder, may be divided under three heads: Conquest, religious aggrandisement, and in the name of liberty. The watchword of nations has been and still is "Conquest," and the man who has been the most successful in destroying life has been the hero of the age in which he lived.

There never was a good war or a bad peace. There never has been a war in which there was not finally a settlement. Had the settlement been first, there would have been no widows and orphans left to weep, mourn and suffer. How many soldiers' homes, filled with cripples and broken-down constitutions, think you, would exist today in our country, had the settlement come first? The enormous expense of our government alone for our navy and army purposes, as reported by the committees on appropriations, according to their respective reports, amount to \$344,924,508.96, which is nearly \$50 per capita for every man, woman and child in the United States, and the recommendations of the official head of our national fighting department suggests that we are still short of ironclads to make us the boss fighting nation of the world.

And yet, we are a christian (?) nation, sending out missionaries to all parts of the world to convert the heathen. What a sad comment upon the doctrines of Jesus, who, it is said, suggested that if a man strike thee on one cheek, to turn to him the other also.

Was the philanthropic George Peabody, who bound up the wounds and filled the stomachs of starving humanity elevated to the highest and most honored gift of the people? Can we honestly claim to have outgrown the customs of our barbaric forefathers? The proud boast of a typical American citizen is, my grandfather fought in the Revolution, instead of "my grandfather devoted his life to the cause of suffering humanity and in doing good to his fellow men." Where do you place today the memory of the 500,000 brothers who left their homes and their families, and their bones to bleach upon our battle fields? We see only an occasional monument ornamenting some public square, erected to their memory. Their names are forgotten, their history unwritten, and thousands of their widows and orphans struggled in poverty, while the leaders who snuffed the battles from afar, received the credit and were clothed in purple and fine linen. Nations delight to honor the genius of war, but the men who give up their lives at their officers' command, rest under a slab on which is marked the name and number of his regiment, and is soon forgotten.

The man who originates the most destructive weapon to human life is better paid and honored than he who discovers a remedy which is the greatest saving of human life. Is war, then, the highest type of civilization, and the result of the teachings of the gospel of "Peace on earth and good will towards man?" It is a historical fact that more blood has been shed in the name of religion than from any other cause, yet Jesus, over 1800 years ago, said: "These things I command you, that ye love one another." Will love towards our fellow man prompt us to take his life? Can a man fight and be a true follower of Christ? Are we a christian nation, and is there a nation upon the face of the earth which is truly a christian nation? Even the President of this great republic, which is filled with thousands of churches and christian organizations, remarks that a good soldier ought to be not only

willing, but anxious to fight. If that is christianity, then it would seem that to be a typical christian, one must be not only willing but anxious to become a murderer and a despoiler of his fellow man at the beck and nod of official authority for some supposed offence, or for the increase of more square miles of territory. Are we not yet wearing the swaddling clothes of barbarism, and should we not hope for the time when national difficulties should be settled by arbitration instead of the sword? Elihu Burrett, the learned blacksmith. some half a century ago, proposed the only feasible solution of this problem. His plan was to form a congress of nations, composed of representatives from every government, and when differences arose on national issues, to let the matter be amicably adjusted by arbitration. Greece long preserved peace by that method, and the German Diet was a court of arbitration to more than thirty free states and cities. Cantons of Switzerland, differing in language, religion and intelligence, lived in peace under a similar compact. united provinces of Holland maintained peace by such methods for 200 years. Our government received fifteen and one-half millions by the Geneva award for damage to our commerce by England, which would have cost us millions had it been settled by force of arms. An able writer says: "That it is high time for the followers of the meek and lowly Jesus to study the genius of their religion." A hatred of war is an essential feature of practical christianity, and it is a shame upon what is called the christian world that it has not long since borne universal testimony against this enormous evil which still rages, not merely among savages, but among scholars, philosophers, christians and divines. Dr. Edward Payson, a graduate of Harvard, and an eminent divine, says: "War is surrounded by a deceitful lustre. The monster, unveiled in all its deformity, is seen steeped from head to foot in human gore, gorging its insatiable maw with the quivering limbs of its mangled victims, and feasting its ears with the wailings of disconsolate widows and helpless orphans, while the flash of the cannon, the glare of the bombs, and the red blaze of cities wrapt in conflagration, furnish the only light which illuminates its horrid banquet. Such is the idol whom the votaries of war adore, and such is the Moloch on whose altars men have exultingly sacrificed millions of their fellow men, on whose bloodthirsty worshippers beauty has lavished her smile, genius its eulogies, and whose horrid triumphs fit only to be celebrated in the infernal world which painters, sculptors, poets and historians have combined to surround with a blaze of immortal glory." The very things, says Seneca, which, if men had done in their private capacity, they would expiate with their lives, we extol when perpetrated in regimentals at the bidding of a general. War makes villains, and peace brings them to the gallows. Louis Bonaparte said: "That even the sight of a battlefield not only struck me with horror, but turned me sick." Jerrold, upon this subject, says: "What a fine looking thing is war, dress it as we may, feather and daub it with gold, huzza it, and sing swaggering songs about it; what is it nine times out of the ten, but murder in uniform. War impoverishes the world, ruins commerce, degrades society, fills our asylums with cripplies which the people must support, makes widows and orphans, physically disables our best citizens, and inculcates idleness and profligacy, and cultivates the animal instead of the spiritual nature of man." Let us look a little into the cost of war.

The following letter is from our well-known Los Angeles painter, F. E. Sturgis:


Mr. F. H. Heald: After re-reading much of the December Higher Science, I heartily concur in Prof. Jamieson's appreciative remarks in November "H. Is not a proposition that force is inherent in all matter from molecules to universe, and is as science demonstrates, capable of dissipating, reorganizing and operating all matter through eternity just as comprehensive to the mind as the theory of a God personality, whose origin, location quantities and character are absolutely unknown and so admitted by the sworn defenders of the doctrine?

This is a statement of a truth self-evident which, beyond observation, requires no other proof to enable the mind to grasp and retain without volition.
