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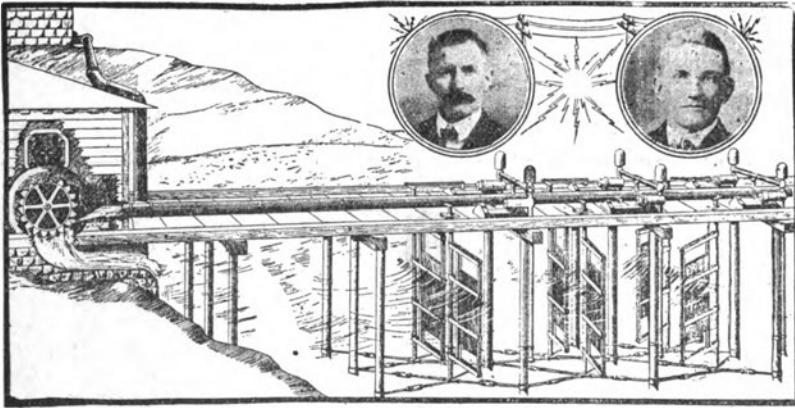
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peach brandy, or even old corn whisky. MUST ABANDON REASON

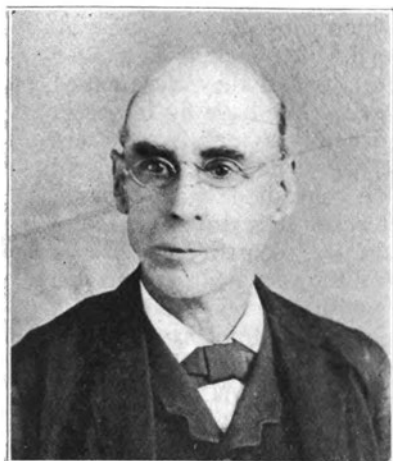
In an article on Thot Transference in the *Live Forever Magazine* it says:
