



THAT is it that is ever lifting death into life, bringing order death into life, bringing order out of confusion, that brings the fragrance of the lily out of mind, color out of darkness? What is it that is at work? Everywhere and always this Power, call it what we may, is at work. Is it Nature? Who is it that controls Nature? Is it the power of the earth? Is it electricity? Whatever you say does it, you must define this power and put order and life, thought and beauty, consciousness and love into it before you can account for the results. fore you can account for the results.

E CONOMY no more means saving money than spending money. It means spending and saving, whether time or money, or anything else, to the best possible advantage.

THOUGHT, as I was taking a walk this fine Autumn morning, how true it is that our outlook is limited by our thoughts. We too often look upon the country, for instance, as a place where we may go for a stroll or a ride, without realizing that it is part of the One Great Life, and bears relationship with every other manifestation of Life, ourselves included. Surely, if we had sufficient humility, we should see Reality, and our point of view would be altogether changed. We may notice from this that both dying and death are necessary to Life; and if we apply these ideas to human life we shall have food for our souls beyond anything we have dreamed of before.

Autumn, then, should ever have a glad note for us, indicating not dying and death only, but also renewed Life.

LEASURE may attract and take its hold upon a man's life for an indefinite period of time, but if there is in him any force and strength of character it cannot satisfy the whole capabilities of his nature. For whether he will acknowledge it or not, there is something beyond his control, which lies outside the gratifying of his own personal desires. Pleasure may, and invariably does, blind a man when he is devoted to it; but within, the light of his mind shines through all errors of human life, that illimitable light which he may have so little perception of, but which marks to his inner consciousness the height to which he may climb, pointing out to him that life gives unreservedly of her richness to him who has kept and recognized her laws. It is only when a man is in harmony with his higher and deeper self that life begins to unfold to him. Only through the intelligence which awakens his higher powers does he come to understand and value the real pleasures of life.

A good man's life is laid in the loom of time to a pattern which he does not see, but God does; and his heart is a shuttle. On one side of the loom is sorrow, and on the other side is joy; the shuttle, struck alternately by each, flies back and forth, carrying the thread, which is white or black, as the pattern needs; and in the end, when God shall lift up the finished garment, and all its changing hues shall glance out, it will then appear that the deep and dark colors were just as needful to beauty as the bright and high colors.

Jewels, Their Value to Humanity

OW many of us stop to think when clers window what they cost of time, cutting and finish before they are the perfect and beauti-that scintilate light at every turn

First, the time—it has required eons of time to make the gorgeous diamond, ruby or emetald from certain crystallized elements of earth and washings of the water; some of these became the perfect specimens, while other less precious minerals are found in the quartz, as topaz, turquoise in Persia, and the beautiful sardonyx in its finest colors and quality.

Each one of these requires certain conditions of the chemicals of earth and each requires a certain length of that wonderful alchemist, Time.

Some of it hurts, too, but the polishing is the spiritual light we receive, which is so tenderly used as a buffer that we are afterward enabled to shed the lights we receive and make ourshed the lights we receive and make our-selves beloved. No wonder we are likened to jewels, for there is so much the same

process of working used.

As the gems of the earth are all the result of certain vibrations of the earth and velocity of movement, so their colors, which are only apparent to us through vibration.

We all learn that color is the result of certain lengths and velocity of vibration. Study your chemistry and your astronomy

for this knowledge. We see only through vibration; in fact,

we live through it.

The Stateswomen of Iceland In no country in the world do women possess greater political power than in Iceland. Under the new constitution, granted to the people of that island in 1903 by their sovereign lord, the King of Denmark, women may vote for members of the Althing—the Parliament of Iceland—on the same terms as men; and they may also be elected members of that body, and as local authorities. Several have gained seats in the Althing during the past five years, and have considerably influenced the debates and legislation of that assembly.

debates and legislation of that assembly.

Probably no people in Europe live in such a degraded condition as the Icelanders.
The 1903 constitution came into being because the men responsible for the country's government had made a ghastly mess of things. In place of enjoying complete home rule, as heretofore, the Althing was made directly responsible to the King of Denmark, through a resident Minister, for Iceland. And the Danish Parliament thought fit, at the same time, to give the colony a chance to produce stateswomen, if it could not produce statesmen. not produce statesmen.

The women have shown a keen interest in politics, but they do not appear to seek always to elect their own sex. They exact pledges from male candidates to support their favorite schemes of social reformespecially those dealing with the drink traffic. Drunkenness is one of the greatest

curses of Iceland.

Most of the people live on lonely farms. Until recent years the farmer went to Rek-javik, the capital, once a year, in early summer, to sell wool. He had a drunken bout there, lasting some days or weeks, and then came home—to keep sober until he came again next year. But now the he came again next year. But now the people go to the towns and villages much oftener, and they bring liquor back to the farms. The consumption of spirits per head of the population is enormous.

The women politicians have secured the passing of several very drastic laws for the restriction of the liquor traffic, but it is doubtful whether these measures have really decreased the sum total of the national drunkenness. The moral suasion

applied by the Salvation Army—which is very strong and popular in Iceland—has certainly done more in that direction.

Some women reformers in Rekjavik, headed by a well-known lady doctor, have tried hard to cure the insanitary habits which are the peculiar and unenviable characteristic of the Icelanders. Many sanitary laws and regulations have been passed; but it is still a common thing at the Hot Springs—which form a sort of public open air wash house for the people of Peliceit, to see a wayer scalable filling. of Rekjavik-to see a woman calmly filling her coffee pot from a small pool in which the dirty clothes of several families are steeping. Reformers in Iceland, like re-formers elsewhere, have discovered that it is one thing to pass a law and quite another thing to enforce it, in the teeth of deeprooted ignorance and ancient prejudice.

The women members of the Althing have own themselves much abler in debate and much more businesslike than the men. the old days the speeches were interminably long, and filled with turgid bombast, without the glimmer of a real idea. Whatever the subject under discussion, no member could get upon his feet without dilating on the ancient glories of Iceland—how she taught Columbus to discover America, how her literature was finer than anything Greece or Rome ever knew, her Vikings the greatest heroes the world ever saw, and so on. But the women are brief and to the point. When they are talking about the city sewerage, they don't find it necessary to go back to Columbus. They have certainly introduced a common sense tone into the debates which was sadly lacking

But the women reformers have much to do before they can bring the Icelanders up to the general level of the "Europeans," whom they ignorantly despise.

On the farms, the house and field servants, whose name is legion, sleep in a squalid dormitory, recking with dirt. There is hardly a farmhouse in which the windows will open. If you want a breath of fresh air, you must pull a wooden plug, about the size of a beer bottle cork, out of the centre of one of the windows!



A Glance at the Heavens

By SERVATOR

HE heavens declare the glory of the Lord. And a little talk about the wonders up above may enable many of my readers to gain a truer idea and grander conception of Deity than many now possess. So let us spend a few moments over this orbital. sess. So let this subject.

Our little earth is a star revolving in space with countless millions of other stars, and it fills the soul with awe to reflect upon the ghastly distances between the stars and the grandeur, glory and omnipotence of the Being who created and set these myriads of worlds in motion and brown them from colliding with each keeps them from colliding with each

The most familiar object in the night sky is the Moon, and also the closest to us, its distance being, approximately, 240,ooo miles.

Then there are the bright stars that change their positions, these being the planets revolving with our earth around our sun, and consisting of Mercury, Mars, Jupiter, Venus and Saturn, with Uranus and Neptune on the outer edge of the

Our distance from the sun is quite accurately fixed at ninety-three millions of miles, which, however, is so enormous a distance that the human mind cannot comprehend it.

Then we have all noticed the hundreds and thousands of stars in the background which never seem to change their positions

in regard to each other.

These stars shining in the background These stars shining in the background are suns far larger than our sun and with systems of stars revolving around them, compared with which our solar system is as a grain of sand would be to our earth. Our sun's nearest neighbor, Alpha Centauri, is 270,000 astronomical units distant from the sun, and an astronomical unit

is ninety-three million miles.

It takes some time for the light from these suns to reach us. We know that light travels at the rate of 186,000 miles per second, so the light of our sun travels from it to our earth in about eight minutes. Therefore by our knowledge of the velocity of light it takes several years for the light of the nearest fixed star to

meach us.

Mr. Edward Irving, trying to give an idea of what this distance means, said: "Some spider thread is so extremely fine and light that a single pound of it would and light that a single pound of it would be long enough to reach around the earth. To reach our moon would require nearly ten pounds of it. To go to the sun would take 3,712 pounds, but to reach the nearest fixed star would take 500,000 tons."

star in the sky, outshone only by Sirius. We know that it takes the light from Canopus 200 years to reach us and Canopus gives thousands of times as much light as our sun.

Simon Newcomb, the astronomer, says, "The light of the faintest stars the telescope can discover takes from 3,000 to 4,000 years to reach us."

That awe-inspiring arch called the Milky Way is now known to consist of a continuous stream or belt of stars, or to better express it, it is made up of clouds of suns, too far away to be distinguished separately, and is split with a cleft of considerable length through part of its course. The camera shows that at least there are one hundred million stars in the Milky Way.

I have given you some of these distances and magnitudes so as to let you have an idea of how our conception of Deity must enlarge and expand to even give us a remote conception of what the Omnipotent

If you were to sit alone in an astronomical observatory, as I have often done, with one of the enormous telescopes at your command and watched the planets of our own solar system swinging mysteriously through the air, you would there and then begin to adjust your notions and conceptions of God to something far nobler and grander than you have ever conceived

The old notions of Deity who was a petty tyrant with attributes of jealousy, murder and revenge would leave your mind for-

Verily, the diadem of the Lord is witnessed in the heavens, and as the constellations swing above us we can appreciate what the All-Father-Mother-God must be.
