In consequence, he studied all the vagaries of the human mind, such as telepathy, hypnosis, sub-consciousness, etc.

Naturally when Professor Myers passed on, some of his friends who were left behind expected that he would communicate with them if he could possibly do so. Miss Dallas, a very honorable, conscientious and highly cultured Englishwoman, has just told the world of the results so far, and I will endeavor to give you a condensed idea of what hapto give you a condensed idea of what hap-

to give you a condensed idea of what happened in this connection.

The Society for Psychical Research of London supervised the attempt to communicate with Mr. Myers and three mediums were chosen, one of them being Mrs. Verrall, a well-known scholar of Cambridge University; Mrs. Piper, the celebrated American medium, and Mrs. Holland, an Engishwoman who had lived in India for some time.

Many tests were made, one of them being that a great Professor sent through Mrs. Piper a message to the supposed spirit of Myers, worded in rather obscure Latin phrases, inviting the spirit to send a message in different parts to each of the three mediums in such a way that the message could only be understood when all three parts were pieced together. The results were wonderful. The three different parts were duly given and formed a perfect message, this message being characteristic of Professor Myers himself.

Many other rigorous tests were made, all of them successful, and even to those who would still be skeptical and deny that it could be Myers speaking from another world, they are faced with a different kind of phenomena and just as wonderful. If the theory of Myers communicating be rejected we have to allow that three ladies, entirely cut off from one another, are, while wholly unconscious of what they are doing, writing on the same subject, of which (in the case of one at least of them) they have no normal knowledge at all and writing in a way highly characteristic of Mr. Myers when he was "alive."

A Vicar of the English church says: "I must own that I cannot help feeling that any Christian who uses the same pre-suppositions which he would naturally use in arguing of the truth of Our Lord's post-resurrection discourses, ought to come to the conclusion that we are listening to Myers speaking to his friends in this world, and that the arguments and pre-suppositions used for the most part by those who reject this theory would be equally fatal (I should say much more fatal) to belief in Our Lord's resurrection and His subsequent self-revelations.

If, for instance, any friend of ours were to pass out of this life, and a medium professed to have heard his spirit talking about gen-eral scientific subjects or Gothic Altars, I should feel a certain hesitation in believing the evidence, just because these are topics which any medium might be able to mention, but if the message were to mention some little trivial landmark or personal

incident, or were to make some small and casual remark on a matter of no importance in a manner peculiarly recognizable by his friends, the evidence would be much more cogent—and that just on account of its triviality.

Prohibition.—Amos F I have said, from time to time, that liquor is the worst curse of humanity—responsible for most of the crime, poverty, suffering and degeneracy of our day. That is to say, liquor selling is forbidden everywhere, but the Government makes exceptions in favor of individuals who will pay so much for the privilege of living lazily at the expense of their fellows and families. One of the strongest prohibition sentences I ever saw is this: "MY boys may go to ruin through the legalized saloon by YOUR consent, but YOUR boys never will by MY consent."

responsibility.

Mothers are always on duty and their unconscious and subconscious influence is more potent than they may often think. It is only a part of the great scheme of creation that children should partake freely of the desirable qualities of their mothers. These qualities are imparted to the child in two ways: By the impress of her life upon the child through heredity, and by association and education. The first is not always easy to remedy, although an adverse heredity. easy to remedy, although an adverse heredity may be overcome by persistent effort. In this connection here is a thought that should not be forgotten: people who are reasonably good and moral may have unwholesome fathers, but they never have bad mothers. Degenerate mothers always beget their kind.

fathers, but they never have bad mothers. Degenerate mothers always beget their kind. Through constant association every mother is exerting a marked influence over her child all the time. The child brain is a blank record which is ever being filled in little by little. Some of the impressions recorded may be ever so faint, but they remain, and these same impressions grow as he gradually comes into a fuller being and a larger self. Are these stimuli always the proper kind? Nearly every mother at some time is compelled to reprove her little one for untruthfulness. She is at a loss to know where he picked up all his diminutive wickedness. Self-study will usually reveal the answer. She will by keeping a line on herself perhaps find that she, too, handles the truth a trifle recklessly each day. The little tot takes her hyperboles for literal truths. She may also wonder why Lucille is so nervous and can not speak pieces and show off like the other little girls the age of Lucille. Perhaps she forgets that she is lacking in poise and nerve stability herself and that Lucille unconsciously absorbs a goodly share of it, besides the little girl has inherited a tendency toward nervousness. To crown her indiscretion the mother may remark to friends in the presence of her child: "Oh, dear, Lucille is such a nervous little body!" It requires much time and the implantation of many wholesome thoughts to offset the adverse suggestions of this kind given at so impressionable an age.



speech have been misinterpreted.
In the RUBAIVAT, the Persian writer likens the world unto a tavern and ourselves as travelers along the road of life. Taverns in Persia are resting places, coffee, food and sleep being their pur-Omar was a Sufi, the sect which religiously avoids alcoholic drinks just as do the Mohametans, who are expressly forbidden in the Koran to touch alcoholic beverages. True, Omar speaks of the stimulation of the senses, the intoxication of the imagination, the thrill of love and beauty and art. And what a dreary, drab old world it would be without them! be without them!

However, let us commence with the poem from which I will cite a few verses. It opens with a thrilling, clarion call to action. Life is short. The morning has dawned. Work for the night is coming when no one can work. Responsibility commences with consciousness of duty. In life's fair dawn, when we face the world, the hand of God is on the harp of spring, our ideals and our ambitions are pure and true. O friend, Omar, wisely and well spake ye!

With them the seed of Wisdom did I sow, And with mine own hand wrought to make it grow And this was all the harvest that I reap'd— "I came like Water, and like Wind I go."

The Sufi alludes to the same philosophy as the Yogis hold, our final absorption into union with Deity.
