

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
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

Another occasion the subject was to touch a certain gas jet in the room, and, on entering, he walked directly across the room, touched the particular jet, although there were four jets in the room. Two of the class decided to send a message to one another on a certain day at a given hour with the following results: Miss B. received, "Will see you to-morrow." The complete message was, "Will see you to-morrow afternoon." The last word, however, was not clear, as Miss J. on sending the message to Miss B, was somewhat dubious about whether it would be afternoon or evening, hence the subjective mind caught the doubt and Miss B. did not receive the last word, as Miss J. had not concentrated on it positively as she had the first of the message, which admitted of no doubt in her mind.

Surely this was a convincing instance of the power of the clairyoyant.

The boy Ted had been constantly hypnotized for three years, and, at that time, showed no trace of breaking in any way. He was a particularly bright, active, healthy boy, more advanced at school than most boys of his age, and seemed to take a keen delight in the notoriety he was gaining as a clair-voyant. The hindrance to the more thorough i

the fear that most people entertain with regard to hypnotism, for even while many can be hypnotized, we have found that only about one in ten has clairvoyant power, and when you realize how difficult it is to find ten people who are willing to submit to even the simple tests in mind influence, you will readily see that but little development along this line can be made. Probably the next decade will bring about some interesting experience in this profound phase of psychic phenomena.

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


