

#### → Mind or Matter? or Neither? ←

All thinkers of note are aware that many Scientists now hold that all is Mind or Spirit, and that Matter is not at all, while other Scientists claim all that is, is Matter, and that Spirit is not at all. The general belief is, that there is both Mind and Matter.

I hold that but one exists. If Mind exists, Matter does not. If Matter exists Mind does not, but it is left to correct thought to choose which. If there is both Spirit and Matter, and they are distinct, or entirely opposite, then one came into existence before the other, and was the producer of the other. I ask this class of believers to tell which took existence first. Was Matter before Spirit, or Spirit before Matter? If Matter was first and is not Spirit, then Matter is self-producing, and self-existing. If then, in time past, Spirit came into being, it came from or by Matter, was made out of Matter, hence is Matter. Is Matter the real, or the potentiality? then it is life-producing, and independent of Spirit, having created it. What then is the use or office of Spirit? It is secondary, created by and out of Matter, and hence Matter is the Creator and Life of all. If Matter was the first, and only being, then it created Spirit from itself; and if Spirit was created out of Matter, it is Matter; hence all is Matter, and there is no Spirit.

If Spirit, or Mind, was first, it was the Life the potential, and being first and the only substance, it created Matter out of itself, as there was nothing else to create it from; hence if Matter was produced out of Spirit, it is Spirit, it is that out of which it is made; therefore, mistake, or error, named it wrong, when it in human blindness called it Matter. There is no second or opposite, there is but one. The Materialist or Agnostic who claims all is Matter has no difficulty to clear up from his standard, nor has the Spiritualist from his who holds all is Spirit, but any one who claims both exist, cannot consistently believe in the universal diffusion of Spirit. The only way the church can teach God is Spirit, and is omnipresent, or everywhere is to believe nothing else opposite from Spirit is anywhere. First settle what everywhere means. To me it means not to be absent from the finest needle point or smaller space in all the universe. Very well, if Spirit is thus present, or everywhere, please tell me how anything else can be anywhere. If Spirit is not everywhere, then Matter may be somewhere.

### -> What The Doctors Think. <-

In the last few years a great change has come over the minds of medical men in regard to the philosophy of healing. Once they thought that a disease was like an invading robber, who could be driven out of the body by a battle with pills and lancets.

Now, however, the most eminent physicians hold a widely different theory of cure. For they believe that the work of healing is done by the body itself, in all cases. They think that when any part of the body is diseased, the vital forces, which are inherent in that part, go to work to restore it to a condition of health. The power of healing is internal not external. And they think that all that any medicine or any course of treatment can do, is to give better conditions so that the vital powers can work to better advantage. "The word Cure itself is the same as the word Care, and this indicates the proper work of the physician."

In this country, Prof. Austin Flint, who occupies a most eminent rank as a physiologist, a medical practitioner, and an author, is fully committed to this theory of cure. And following him are the mul-

titude of lesser lights in the medical profession.

Prof. Wm. B. Richardson, in England, one of her foremost physiologists, is equally pronounced in favor of the new views. We could name many others if it were necessary.

We may inquire what has brought about this wide spread change of opinion on this subject. It has been partly the result of the rise of Hydropathy which wrought cures by simple water and diet, and partly the result of the extensive spread of Homepathy which cured by infinitesimal doses, and relied chiefly on the spiritual forces which the medicines contained, as the active curative agencies. causes, among others, led to a vigorous discussion of the whole process and theory of cure, and resulted in forcing the great leaders in the medical world to occupy new ground. Already it has extensively modified the actual practice of the doctors. In many cases where they once gave huge doses they now give nothing at all. Already they are everwhere saying "It is nature that cures, not the doctor." And they no longer conceal their views under the Latin phrase "Vis medicatrix natura."

All this change has prepared the way for the mind-Cure, for the theory that it

is the spiritual part of man's nature that is to be recognized in the future as the mighty instrument of healing. By taking this new attitude the physicians have removed a large obstacle which stood in the way of a popular acceptance of mind cure.

It must not be understood that the Doc-

tors were chiefly instrumental in either the discovery or the development of the mind cure method. But it is important to note that they have moved themselves out of the way, and that they can no longer make a logical war on the army of healers who are panoplied under the banners of spiritual light.

# ->- The Method of Jesus in Curing. -

Certain persons from the very "Hub of the Universe" claim that they are using the method of healing which was used by Jesus. And they claim that they alone have a right to be called "Christian Scientists," because they alone use the method of Jesus. They assure us that "it is not mesmerism, nor magnetic healing, nor anything like it. Because, they continue, the mesmerists and the magnetic healers lay their hands on the patients and come in physical contact with them. Whereas the Christian Scientists do not touch the patients at all, in fact it is wrong to do so.

Now in order to show how baseless and false is the above claim, let us take the cases of healing by Jesus, his Apostles, and the prophets. It will be seen that they healed both with and without actual contact. We will place the cases in two columns.

#### HEALING BY LAYING ON OF HANDS.

 And Jesus put forth his hand, and touched him, saying, I will; be thou clean. And immediately his leprosy was cleansed.—Matt. 8: 3.

2. For she said within herself, If I may but touch his garment, I shall be whole. But Jesus turned him about, and when he saw her he said. Daughter be of good comfort, thy faith hath made thee whole. And the woman was made whole from that hour.—Matt. 9: 21.

From the above passages it is evident that in the work of healing Jesus used The balance actual touching and contact twice as often as he healed without these. sheet is heavily on the side of the laying on of hands. And the same thing is true of the miracles of the greatest of the prophets and the apostles.
