

Once this consciousness of Spirit is awakened, then there is surety of Supply in all the lines of human desire. "The Lord is my shepherd." But that shepherding is ever spiritual. Not till one reaches spiritual discernment can he affirm this truthfully. Until then it is but a vainless repetition.

"Put yourself in the midst of the stream of power!" says Emerson. That Power is the Infinite. That stream is one's own individual life flowing from the Divine Center, in limitless quantity. "All the Father hath is mine!" I am to claim my inheritance, and to claim and use it now and here.

The seers and teachers of all ages have seen the need of help from human ills. They have ever righteously sought the way out of them. Financial Healing may be described as the coming into that mental condition where it is possible for the Spiritual Vibrations governing material pleuty to flow into consciousness, and from thence outward to environment.

On the physical plane of consciousness, we know that a full, unimpeded circulation of pure, rich blood through the veins and arteries means robust health and a strong, vigorous body; on the mental plane we know that the uninterrupted flow of strong, bright, cheerful, and sensible thoughts through the consciousness produces happiness: in like manner, the smooth-flowing of certain

Spiritual Vibrations through consciousness will bring the material symbols of prosperity to the environment. What these Vibrations are, and how may one attain to the all important mental condition in which the Vibrations flow freely through one's being will be considered in this and in the following lessons.

I go out into the sunlight and walk along the street; what is it that goes with me as I move along? What is it that dogs my very steps so that I cannot shake it off? Why, my shadow, of course! Currency, that material medium of exchange called money, is merely a shadow of which the Real Substance is Vibratory Power of Spirit! That oft-repeated phrase, "Money is power," should be turned squarely about and read, POWER IS MONEY!

The money you can see and hold in your hand has no real power in itself; it is merely the outward manifestation or negative end of an INVISIBLE power which I AM and YOU ARE! Can the shadow be separated from the physical shape or substance which casts it? NO! Neither can money, the shadow, be separated from the substance

which causes it to be.

I AM the substance of money, and so are YOU; and as the visible dollar is merely the negative end of this substance or power, I AM that also, because the shadow cannot exist apart from the substance which casts it.

But, supposing my purse is empty of visible dollars, doesn't that disprove this logic and argue poverty? No! a thousand times NO! Listen:

The light of the sun may be obscured by thick clouds, and the shadow of my physical shape no longer visible as t walk abroad, and yet, I KNOW the substance that casts the shadow is there all the time, and the shadow of it will become visible again as soon as the clouds have vanished.

Money, the shadow, may become invisible, and my purse may sag with emptiness, but I KNOW that the SUB-STANCE of WEALTH is not and cannot be destroyed, and, as the Sunlight of Truth which, perhaps, has become obscured by clouds of doubt or ignorance, shall shine again, money, the shadow, will become visible again, and my purse be filled to the brim.

I am careless, and really "take thought" for the shadow cast by my bodily shape; sometimes it is short, or diminutive and squatty, and then, again, it is immense, according to the relative position of my body towards the light. The shadow is of no particular importance to me: the body is! And so I am care-LESS, that is, without care or worry regarding money, the shadow; that shadow may be LARGE or small according to the attitude of MYSELF towards the Light of Truth; but the changes or fluctuations concern me little or not at all, for I AM the Substance of money or wealth, and that fact alone is of importance to me. When I want the shadow of my physical self to be large, I simply change the position of my body to the sunlight. And when I want the money-shadow to be Lance. I readjust MYSELF, the Substance, to the Light of Truth, so that the monetary shadow becomes LARGE.

When the consciousness is adjusted to the reception of the Vibrations of Universal Prosperity, then these Vibrations flow through and supply the "counting,

planting man" with all that he may need, and things the symbols of prosperity to his environment.

As these Vibrations flow into your consciousness, they fill you with a CARE-LESS-NESS for dollars and supply! This does not mean the foolishness of the profligate spendthrift, but the Vibrations of ABSOLUTE FEARLESS-NESS regarding supply; and you tread the earth like a Prince of Wealth, as indeed YOU ARE! You have no desire to "waste your substance" in any foolish manner, but you spend freely and fearlessly, without a care, for whatever you FEEL will add to your comfort or advance you along the upward road! You FEEL your supply to be LIMITLESS! You question no more, where your supply is to come from, or how it wil come, for you come to KNOW that IT is already with YOU; that YOU are the SUBSTANCE or your own SUPPLY, and you grow to be quite careless as to the "How, When, or Where of it."

You FEEL that YOU are SECURE, and you exclaim, "That which the Father hath given ME," no man can take or keep from me! You no longer place your reliance for your supply upon persons in particular, or corporations, or even upon the successful issue of your own "plans." The promises of wealth or position from others no longer elate you, and when others, as it were, "turn you down" you no longer feel any discouragement!

EXTERNAL wealth, position and influence, you hold very lightly in your hand, and this you can afford to do, because they are only shadows, and one simply plays with shadows.

Go right on playing with the shadows, as long as you choose but let them no longer deceive you as to their real nature; they are shadows, and shadows only! When you tire of the old shadows make new ones, and when you are wholly weary of this play of making shadows, let them ALL go and give

your attention to the SUBSTANCE from which they take their shapes. Let the shadows go flitting about, growing now short and now long as they will, while you REST in the SUBSTANCE, and in the knowledge that as long as the Substance exists, the Shadows are bound to BE.

Then drop your fears and doubts regarding your monetary, as well as other, supply; they are the clouds and mists which prevent the Shadow or Symbol of Prosperity from forming and becoming visible to your senses.

THE REAL 'I' AND THE POTENTIAL 'I.'

I am! But what am I? Certainly I am more than this present consciousness. Once I could not say "I AM!" because I did not know enough! But enough of what? There is but one answer—Enough of myself!

Then "I" and that which I know are That which knows is the not identical. "Real I." That which I know is but the expression of that which says-I AM! and is the conscious self-the "I" that knows itself by my name. Then I must ever keep distinct that which thinks-that which is conscious, and that which is thought. I am to distinguish between this I AM that knows, when I say, "I AM!" and the I AM: itself. The I AM -the Real "I"-is the Real Something which is called Soul, Spirit, Ego, and Self. It is an expression of that which fills all space and endures through ail time—The Power which is behind all phenomena—called, in Christian lands, God. Metaphysically we say—Mind.

Scientifically we say-Energy. sophically we may term it Spirit. what do we know of this IT, which is behind all phenomena? which manifests to the consciousness as Thought? This "I" which individualized is my conscious self to it I apply the word "I"! It is not thought, but it is that which thinks. When I say "I am Spirit," what do I mean? Of Spirit Emerson says, in "Nature"-"Of that ineffable essence which we call Spirit he that thinks most will say the least. We can foresee God in the coarse and, as it were, distant phenomena of matter, but when we try to define him, both language and thought desert us, and we are left as helpless as fools and savages. That essence refuses to be recorded in propositions."

It is enough then for us to simply affirm—I AM MIND or I AM SPIRIT! and merely state what we each know of ourself through the study of that phenomenon which each of us is.

This I have learned: I can learn only of my Self, and only through expression of the Self. Since God is the Power behind all phenomena, he is the power behind all that I do. He is the Cause and this conscious "I" is the effect.

This "Real I" is perfect. Perfect Health! Perfect Happiness! Perfect Supply! Perfect Peace! In this thought we are to say with Emerson—"I THE IMPERFECT ADORE MY PERFECT!"

The difference between the "Real I" and the "Potential I" is the Real I is perfect and the Potential I is developing this Indwelling Perfection into Consciousness. The "I" which is Henry Harrison is coming to know itself as an evolving expression of the Perfect Indwelling The awakening of this consciousness of the Present Reality of the characterizes Indwelling the Thought Movement. It is the Great Fact that characterized Jesus, and differentiated him from all other prophets. "God IS!" and "He is within!" were

the thoughts which expressed his conscicusness of the Indwelling.

The Indwelling is the Absolute. Thus each person can affirm: "Whatever I am it is God; but, I am only a partial expression of God. God is Infinite, Omnipresent and Absolute, while I am but a partial but ever expanding expression of that Omnipresent and Absolute. But all that I am and all that I do, is of and by the One.

That which I am conscious of as Myself is the unfoldment which the Absolute has attained through its thinking as Henry Harrison. God knows as much mere of Himself as he has learned of Himself through my feeling and my thought. Thus each person adds to the God-consciousness his own personal experience. Thus the Race-consciousness expands. For this reason every generation grows wiser. No development of the God-consciousness can ever be lost. The universe is changed by every human experience. The sum total of the human consciousness is the present Godconsciousness. Even as the sum total of the unfoldment of the Power behind phenomena is expressed in the evolutionary forms from protoplasm to Man, so the sum total of the human consciousness is represented in the development of Man from pre-cave life to the pres-The accumulating expressions of the race will necessarily result in daily increased expression of the latent Cosmic Consciousness.

Realizing this Law of Cumulative Evolution, we can see now, as well as we can in future years, the benefits the race will receive from the present war experiences. The One Mind will have evolved out of the necessity of like experiences, just as it evolved from the mammoth and cave bear when it had developed to an expression in later and more complex and sensitive forms of life.

In this thought we can read the wisdom in Tennyson when he said: "I the heir

of all the ages in the foremost files of time!" He expressed the real Law of Evolution from the Cause side, as Darwin did on the material—the effect side, when he said:—

"Yet I doubt not through the ages one increasing purpose runs,

And the thoughts of men are widened with the process of the suns."

Note the expressive "Thoughts of men!" In thought the One Mind manifests Its evolution in the consciousness of the race. Whitman saw the same when he so expressively and beautifully said:—
"I am the acme of things accomplished! And I am the encloser of things to be!"

This is the Ideal each person must hold would he or she know the bliss of living.

We are to realize that each day we are but coming into a larger consciousness of that Divine Reality-that Divine Perfection which each of us is in the Subconscious. The development of the Subconsciousness into Consciousness is as much a process of evolution as was the development of the Sub-conscious in the plant into the sub-conscious in the bird The Law is one. The Sub-conscious Perfection of God has been unfolding all the way until it reached the Selfconscious as Man. Man has been on the way from the first union of any two primal units in space millions of eons ago.

Thus is it true that "Before Abraham was I am!" But I was only potentially. I have ever been a potentiality, a possibility, in the One Mind. Even as the present auto and aeroplane were, from the earliest eternity, possibilities in the One Mind. They were not there as actualities but as possibilities under the Laws of Mind.

Perhaps I may help some to understand this fact which has ever puzzled philosophers and divines.

The universe is like a solution. So was the earth before any thing had crystallized. All earth was one gaseous mass within which was held in solution all the elements which later crystallized

as rock, vegetable and animal. The Law of Crystallization is at the base of all forms of expressions. Things are but the crystallizations from the One Mind. We are never to forget that the methods of Nature are simple and few. Think again what Tennyson means when he says to the "Flower in the crannied wall":

"Could I know what you are, root in all, and all in all,

I should know what God and man is!" Apply this to the crystallization of ideas. Every particle of the solid world was once held in solution "in the measureless oceans of antiquity." Every atom of iron, gold and all minerals have been deposited from water. The ocean contains in solution every mineral of earth. We realize that salt is there. We cause it to be deposited. Parties have wasted thousands of dollars in endeavors economically to obtain the gold in sea water.

Mineral springs bring to the surface the minerals through which the water flows. Even the star-beams bring the mineral elements of the suns from which they come.

In like manner all possible things, all possible forms, lie in the one Mind. There they are Ideas. From that Mind they crystallize in Man as Ideals. inventions of Man from bow and arrow to the wireless; from war hoop to drama; from tribal tyranny to democracy; were all once held in solution in that One Mind, ready to crystallize, as stars have crystallized. Under Law these human expressions have come. We term their spiritual birth "Inspiration." Their birth into the sense-world we term "Invention." Inventon is a process of reasoning upon and building from Di-Ideas are eternal: Ideals vine Ideas. human creation from them.

Emerson has understood the fact. In "History" he tells us that all any nation accomplished still lives in the present. Greece lives in all its artistic expression in the art possibilities of the race today.

As in the ocean all elements exist in solution so in Mind exist all possibilities of Divinity. As in mineral spring there are special elements broughts to the surface, so in the Human lines of heredity there are special lines of mental possibilities. Each individual inherits all the evolution of the race. Were it not so then the heads of today would be as slight in frontal development and faces lack the jaw, as did those of our ancestors of the caves of Europe. Because India, Egypt, Greece and Rome had thinkers, we have an intellectual sensitiveness which we would not have had had these not been. So each individual being is an expression of the Wholeness of God. Each inherits the results of every thought and action of the race. No matter where or who the thinker, he lived, wrought and died for me. This thought I expressed in a poem printed in March, 1913:

Truth is our element of life, yet if a man fasten his attention on a single aspect of truth and apply himself to that a long time, the truth become distorted and not itself but falsehood; herein resembling the air, which is our natural element and breath of our nostrils, but if a stream of the same be directed on the body for a time, it causes cold, fever, and even death. How wearisome any possessed mortal whose balance is lost by the exaggeration of any single topic. It is incipient insanity. Every thought is a prison also. I cannot see what you see, because I am caught up by a strong wind and blown so far, in one direction, that I am out of your horizon.-Emerson, in "Intellect."

I am led to write upon this theme by the fact that so many New Thought teachers and authors seem, in their words and articles, to have little conception that there is any field outside that in which they are thinking. This to me is a mistake.

But I have a deeper reason—I have patients almost every week who come to me in an unbalanced mental state by over concentration upon some one phase of truth to the neglect of all others.

There lies a letter before me in which the gentleman says:—"I studied so closely and concentrated so much that I lost control of myself. My advisor told me to quit reading anything upon metaphysics and take up other lines." He did so and even stopped NOW.

This unbalanced condition we find in the convert of any system of theology; in the political crank; in the devotee of patent medicine and doctors; in the novel reader; the newspaper gourmand; the bargain hunter; the constant attendant of the movies; the New Thoughter who will read nothing else or attend no other meeting except some metaphysical one.

But we find it still more strongly in the and unbalanced reasoning, statements and beliefs, of all those cults and pseudo-sciences that place man under control of some power not-himself, like gods, spirits, stars, karma, lines on hands, numbers, personal magnetism, hypnotism, heredity, environment, pecuniary or economical or marital conditions. Each and all of these are giving up their individuality and control of life to externals, and though they differ in degree, it is in all cases a kind of Carried to its extreme it monomania. leads to insanity. Read carefully the sane and wise words of Emerson with which I begin this essay.

Recently a lady came to me for help. She had studied along certain lines; supposed she understood "Vibration" and had gotten the idea that she was controlled "by vibrations of two persons." They interfered with her work and especially when she would sleep at night. It was becoming so that all the time they were sending "Vibrations" to her. She had been a pupil of those who taught her that people could send "Vibrations" to hold and to influence others. In vain I tried to show her the impossibility of such a condition. Tried to convince her that she had little conception of Vbration. A true conception

would show her that unless there was a receptive condition, a union of key, between transmitters and receivers, be these instrumentalities either telegraphic, wireless, or human, no vibration could be recognized. All the answer was, "O, but there can be. I DO it! I know it!" "Well," said I, "while you think that you are!" Determined to have her way she will probably end in an aslum, where so many go in the belief that they are influenced by something not of the present, not of earth, or not of themselves.

These persons have not learned to render to Caesar his portion. Have devoted themselves too entirely to their study of some one phase of Truth. Instead of realizing that what they hold is only a part and not the whole, they have given to it the attention they should have given to matters of daily concern. The metaphysican should keep posted upon what physical science is doing. All is mind and mind in the scientist and the inventor; the navigator and the astronomer, is as necessary for us to recognize as the Mind in Jesus, Mrs. Eddy, or Emerson.

Above all there is need of instruction in the Law of Suggestion. Be what you think. Be universal. along universal lines. Know what you mean when you say "Mind, God, Nature, Life, Vibration," etc., etc. Always keep beside your New Thought book and your Bible and metaphysical magazine, some book dealing with the external world; some good novel; some travels: scientific work or some Balance vourself every biography. night by getting hold of some truth belong to the Caesar-world—the world of Nature; of that manifestation of Mind called Nature.

At the head of my bed always lies a book of poems, some essays of Emerson, some novel, and always, until read, the Youth's Companion. Rarely do I read any metaphysics but Emerson at night

He is the sanest of all writers and will keep his students balanced. Hear him in "Self Reliance" or in "Over Soul" or in any of his over eighty-five published addresses and essays; in his first book, "Nature"; in "English Traits"; in his "Poems"; or in the ten volumes of his "Journals," and vou shall always hear the echo of that wonderful statement with which he opens his essay on "History" in his "First Series":-"THERE IS ONE MIND COMMON TO ALL INDIVIDUAL MEN. EACH MAN IS AN INLET TO THE SAME AND ALL OF THE SAME."

With the consciousness that I am an inlet to all of the One Mind, what has any other inlet to do with me? I came from the One Mind! I am doing the work of the One Mind only when I do what I think. And when I am working in the ground; with wood and stone or electricity; selling goods or printing the daily press; sailing the sea, or flying in the air; investigating the lives of plants, or inventing the new auto; writing the sermon or the novel; preparing the meal or comforting the mourner; I, as an Inlet of the One Mind, am doing the work of that Mind. If I neglect the physical I am refusing to render to Caesar that which the One Mind demands in me that it may have a sane and well balanced expression.

It is the purpose of NOW to keep on the "ground floor" and avoid skyrocket flights. To say only what not only myself but others have demonstrated to be not only Metaphysical, but Universal Truth. I will always find my base in the Laws as demonstrated by Science first; Logic next; Reason next; but always do I test these by Experience. Demonstration is the only proof.

When I am told that I cannot act of myself because of previous births, I say, "Prove my previous existence!" All you offer me are speculations. Your explanation of phenomena needs explaining, and you pile Pelion on Ossa in ex-

plaining your explanations, even as commentators comment upon commentators. Tell me stars control me, and I ask evidence that stars have intellect. Can I as an Inlet of the One Mind with Thought as my power, be under the control of any inanimate thing? Rocks and trees may control me if I elect them as my guardians, but not otherwise.

"Thought of others control you?" Is not my thought the same as others in potency? When my mind is full of my thought how can another get in? If my head is empty, blessed is he that fills it for me.

"But telepathy teaches that?" You are mistaken. I know as much about telepathy as any one, and am myself a good operator and receiver, and I know that any claim a person may have toward the control of another through the power of their thought is as false as the old doctrine of total depravity. We have just passed the 500 mark and wish to double our membership by the first of September, and will ask the co-operation of all our members and of all who are interested in the New Thought work.

The goal to which we are working is the 1916 Congress which will convene in Chicago, September 17-24, at the Congress Hotel.

Harry Gaze and Charles Wesley Kyle have been teaching in Chicago. Perry Joseph Green will be in Chicago to assist Mrs. Morse in arranging for the September Congress.

Many Conferences have been held during May, by the Vice-Presidents of the various Districts,

A Conference will be held in Chicago and one in Minneapolis during this month.

A New Thought Forum has been opened in Denver at 1437 Glenarm St. This is head-quarters for the I. N. T. A. "Every Truth Seeker, whatever his creed, is welcomed to this New Thought forum." (It seems more of a "Liberal" forum than of New Thought. Editor of NOW.)

The first general meeting of the League for the Larger Life, which is the Metaphysical Federation of New York City, was held at the 48th Street Theatre, Sunday, May 21st, and had as its guest the New York-New Jersey Conference of the International New Thought Alliance. Dr. Orison Swett Marden, President of the League, presided. President James Edgerton spoke for the Alliance. Mr. Edgerton reports it was quite the most en-

thusiastic New Thought meeting he has ever attended.

Word has been received at the Headquarters of a large New Thought Society in Brazil, founded in 1907 by Antonio Olivio Rodriques. A magazine, O Pensamento, has a large circulation in all states of Brazil and abroad. This society has a membership of seven thousand, with lifty separate centers.

The 1916 Congress of the International New Thought Alliance will be held in Chicago September 17-24. The local arrangements for this Congress are in the hands of Mrs. Sarah C. Morse, 1045 East 47th Street, Chicago, Vice-President for the Illinois-Wisconsin District of the Alliance. This Congress will cover a period of seven days and the program for each day will be replete with interest. All of the leading New Thought teachers and speakers will be present and take part in the activities of this Congress. The daily sessions will be open to the public, but only members of the Alliance will be admitted and permitted to take part in the business sessions of the Alliance.

News Bulletin.

Larger postal savings deposits will now he accepted at the post office. This is made possible by an important amendment to the Postal Savings Act just approved by President Wilson. A postal savings depositor may now have an account amounting to \$1,000 upon which interest will be paid. Formerly \$500 was the maximum amount he could have to his credit. This enlargement of postal savings facilities will be very gratifying to thousands of depositors who have already reached the old \$500 limit and are anxious to entrust more of their savings to Uncle Sam. Another feature of the amendment that will avoid further embarrassment to the public and to postal officials is the doing away with the limit on the amount that could be accepted from a depositor monthly. Under the old law only \$100 could be deposited in a calendar month. The amendment abolishes this restriction. While the Postal Savings System has already proved a signal success as is shown by the fact that more than half-a-million depositors have over eighty million dollars standing to their credit, still it has fallen short of meeting the full demands of the public because of the restrictions which have now been eliminated. Postmaster General Burleson and Third Assistant Postmaster General Dockery have been tireless in their efforts to secure a modification of the limitations and the new liberalizing legislation is particularly gratifying to them.

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
