

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## Spiritualism and the Resurrection

The gospel story of the resurrection has been related so often and commented upon that one can hardly hope to add anything enlighting to the discussion. Yet with the whole of Christendom considering the subject, I feel compelled to speak out.

It has been said that Jesus was the first fruits of them that slept, that he brought **immortality** to light. This statement is not exactly true -- for running like a thread of gold down through the pages of history one finds entwined a belief in the immortality of the human soul. It has been shared by people of many nations in many ages.

The concept of immortality is clearly set forth in the Egyptian Book of the Dead. Five thousand years ago, on the banks of the Nile, the belief in a future life was so strong that inhabitants would loan each other money to be paid back in its equivalent in the other world.

Egyptians of this period were organized into different sects -- one group believed in a literal resurrection of both body and soul, a belief which led to the custom of embalming their dead. (Historians have often noted and credited the Egyptians with great skill and proficiency because of the remarkable condition in which mummies have been preserved.)

Today, hardly anyone believes in a literal resurrection of the physical body. This is due to the progress made by science. The advances in physiology have destroyed any possible belief in a physical resurrection. And what if it were possible? Who would desire immortality bestowed upon their aged body?

Science tells us that our physical bodies are constantly changing. The individual who lives to

be three-score years has been in possession of numerous bodies, a condition that continues throughout life in the physical and spiritual.

The narrative of the gospel is a strange one. We are told that Jesus was crucified and died; that his body was taken down from the cross and laid in a tomb; that a stone was rolled into the opening of his sepulchre, and that a guard of Roman soldiers were set before it. It is also said that there appeared two angels who rolled away the stone. When Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to the tomb in the morning of the third day they found the stone rolled away and the sepulchre empty -- the body of Jesus was gone. Further, that one of the angels present inquired whom the women sought. declared that they were seeking for the body of their master. They were told that he was gone. And then we are told that Mary was walking through the garden when she saw a man she took for the gardener, and she spoke to him for some time before recognizing him as Jesus.

We are told that Jesus appeared to his disciples in a closed room in Jerusalem where the group had previously met. Because of their fear of the people, they barred the windows and bolted the doors. Jesus appeared in spite of these restrictions. The Master later presented himself to a multitude of five hundred and spoke to them.

Our orthodox friends will tell us that this must have been Jesus, and that the body which he wore must have been his own physical body -that which he had apparently departed from when they took it down from the cross. However, nowhere in the gospels, in Matthew, Mark, Luke or **John** will you find a declaration that this body in which Jesus appeared to his disciples was his physical one. Pauls tells us that flesh and blood can not enter into the Kingdom of Heaven. Do you really believe that the flesh and blood body of Jesus ascended into heaven? If you do, you confess yourself very uninformed, for scientists will tell you that it would be impossible for an organized body like this to exist outside the atmosphere of the earth.

Do you believe, then, that the physical body of Jesus was resurrected? Well, what was it that Mary saw? What was it that the disciples saw? What was it that spoke to the two disciples at Emmaus? Here Modern Spiritualism comes in to interpret this phenomena. The skeptics have denied the reality of these occurrences, they have declared that this was a fairy story, concocted by wily priests to impose on credulous people. Modern Spiritualism sees nothing rare

## SUNFLOWER BANNER

What began as an idea in 1962, when Rev. Ernie Schoenfeld appeared before the National Spiritualist Convention of Churches in Denver recently reached completion. It was then that Rev. Schoenfeld presented the board with two drawings of a proposed church banner. He recommended at that time that a standard banner be adopted. Rev. Schoenfeld delivered a strong argument for this cause, saying that a display of the Christian flag in a Spiritualist Church is like substituting the Apostles Creed for our Declaration of Principles. He won his case.

When the board members expressed a preference for one of the drawings, The Church of The Spirit, Chicago, Illinois, engaged the Republic Flag Co. to make the flag according to specifications, and was the first Church to display the Sunflower Banner.

In 1965, Rev. Schoenfeld arranged to have the Sunflower Banner displayed at the National Convention, in Detroit, Michigan. It was there that the delegates voted to accept the Sunflower Banner as the Official Flag of the National Spiritualist Association of Churches. It was further voted to have the Banner displayed at all

subsequent Conventions along with the Stars and Stripes.

When it was placed on display at the 1976 Convention, in Phoenix, the Banner created much interest. Several delegates were ready then to purchase one for their home church.

You can now order a Sunflower Banner, for your church from the office of the National Secretary, Cassadage, Florida.

The banner displayed at the Phoenix Convention was paid for and presented to the N.S.A.C. out of a donation made by Rev. Janice R. Baynes, at the Convention in Detroit, in 1965. The Puritan Church, in Burnham, Illinois was the second Church to purchase this Official Banner.

The time has come for all churches to display their banner proudly. It is different, it is original and it symbolizes Spiritualism.



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## **International Invitation**

Dear Friends:

The International Spiritualist Federation, (I.S.F.) which came into being in the 1920's largely owing to the devoted efforts of the Spiritualists National Union, (S.N.U.) does not seem to be well-known to many churches and class "B" members. Yet the S.N.U. has always played an important part in the organization; many wellknown members of the S.N.U. having held office throughout the years. The I.S.F. has an international Executive covering representatives from eight different countries.

Since taking over the post of Secretary General in 1972, it has been my aim to bring in as many people as possible from overseas, since facilities in this country are rightly the envy of people in other countries. From 1972, therefore, have organized an annual week's conference at Stansted, amongst other activities. Each year this has proved highly successful and this May our week welcomed visitors from eleven countries. Many new friends were made between visitors and English Spiritualists.

It is our aim to further possible interesting contacts and to bring to British Spiritualists a knowledge of the need for help in many other countries. Spiritualism is not to be considered a parochial interest but a world-wide philosophy to be shared with all. We have national societies, individual societies and many members in many countries, a great many of whom would welcome contact with English Spiritualists.

We already have the S.N.U. and a certain number of churches and a large number of members in this country and feel sure there are others who could play an important part in the international liaison we are planning. Many possibilities have been discussed in the Executive and sub-committee meetings and a special sub-committee has been set up in this country to further the work of propaganda, general publicity and special liaison. Here are some of the matters under consideration:

1) To find helpers with a good grounding in foreign languages.

2) To further friendship links by arranging the twinning of British churches with those in other countries.

3) To arrange visits to and from overseas contacts.

 To set up a special liaision for those wishing to correspond with members in other countries.

5) To facilitate visits to churches by V.I.P.s and others coming to England for a few days,

who would welcome contact with well organized churches.

6) To set up a file of interested persons so as to offer hospitality to friends from overseas.

7) To arrange seminars, day meetings, etc. in churches in this country, sometimes with overseas visitors to demonstrate.

There are many other possibilities but if your church wishes to join us as an individual society, then it would command one vote and have a voice in the organization of international Spiritualism. Individuals are welcome as inmembers, commanding one-tenth of a vote at the Triennial Congresses, which are held in various countries as decided by the Executive from invitations from national organizations. In these days when the I.S.F. looks to England for a lead and when it is an economic advantage for people to visit this country, it seems an ideal opportunity for you all to help extend the influence of Spiritualist teachings.

## "And I will do my part...!"

These words are part of the prayer for spiritual healing which we use in our healing services and have been recited as much as the declaration of principles.

And yet, do we do our part!

In St. John verses one, two and three, we find Jesus healing a man blind from birth... and the disciples asking him, "Master, who did sin, this man, or his parents, that he was born blind...? And Jesus answered, "Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents, but that the works of God should be made manifest in him...!"

In all of his healings, the Master admonished the recipient to go and sin no more... implying that sin, or wrong thinking and acting, was the

cause of the infirmity.

The man was required to do his part... to live according to natural law... to put into practice that type of thinking which would cause good health to continue to manifest in his life...

I can find only two 'sins' for man to worry about... not the hundreds of ideas which have been taught in the name of religion, but two simple human misconceptions which have bound man to mortal instead of spiritual awareness.

The first is in thinking that man is the body. Spiritualism, almost exclusively among religions, has proven that man is not the body. It has demonstrated that this body is the vehicle of the spirit. That it serves as an instrument of

expression upon the physical plane.

The second is probably overlooked more often than the first. The second is to disobey or disregard the impressions which come to us from the **still small voice** within. This voice within is our real saviour, which Jesus spent his life trying to demonstrate to his followers. Here was the voice of God within the human frame, nearer than hands and feet, closer than breathing. This voice of inspiration has been denied over the centuries by selfish, power-

minded ecclesiatics who endeavored to impose their own ideas of religion and salvation upon the will of man. How well they succeeded is quite evident from a review of history over the past 1800 years.

Today, we tell people to believe in themselves... have confidence in their own ability to accomplish what they will. Spirit tells us the same thing... have confidence and know that

they are with us in our endeavors.

When Jesus was talking to his followers, he was telling them to believe him when he told them that the power of God was within them as it was within him. It was not a case of believing in Jesus, nor believing that he was their personal saviour or that he was going to do everything for them.

As Spiritualists, we do not look upon Jesus, the man, as our personal saviour. We say he showed us how to contact that personal saviour within our own selves, exactly as he had contact with

that personal saviour within him.

If we would do our part in retaining health, or healing, of whatever kind, and the sense of togetherness with spirit and the God of our hearts, we must begin by examining our thinking. What is our attitude? How do we think? What is our concern for our brother? Have we put aside those real primary diseases of thought which have infected the race of man? These primary diseases of thought are pride, cruelty, hate, self-love, ignorance, jealousy, and greed.

As long as these terrors of the mind are allowed to run rampant in the mind of man, he invites into his life all the diseases to which his

flesh is heir.

Great strides have been made in medical research. Dread diseases of the past have long since ceased to be a concern of man. But newer and ever newer diseases seem to rise up to confront and challenge the human mind, because man is treating the effect and not the cause of the diseases.

We have long taught the Axiom, "Thoughts are things..." As a man thinketh in his heart so he is..." These are among the natural laws we expound from the church platform. That which man persistently thinks, he builds into his life, and all the treatments of the medical profession avail little in dissipating the results. Only the medicine of right thinking can strike at diseased roots.

The work of God (the God within the individual) is that we reap exactly that which we have sown, nothing more, and nothing less, be it

good or bad; for it is our own creation which we must experience. That which comes into our lives is that which we have created and not the actions of another. We cannot reap where we have not sown. Nor can we reap that which another has sown. We must reap, and today we reap that which we have carved out of the eternal essence.

The power to create, the power to carve out one's own destiny, has been given unto man so that he will earn his way by the sweat of his own brow and then, by divine law, or divine command, he is to experience the results of what he

That which is our lives today is the result of that sown earlier. When we look back and fail to see the cause of that which we face today, fear not that we don't deserve it, or that it was caused by another. It is the Will of the God within you that you be in that place, and with those people, and amid those circumstances which you have brought into being by your actions of the past even though those actions be veiled from your conscious mind.

To do our part in healing we must put into practice the truths represented by our religion. We must recognize ourselves as spirits dwelling in earthly bodies, that we are divine beings, not creatures of dust, and that God's voice, or God's will is heard in the stillness and quietness within the self.

We must recognize that God's power resides in, and the whole energy of God is in our every thought, word, and action, bringing into our lives results in exact measure to the energy we imparted into it.

We must recognize that all men, and all things, and all creation, are all parts of that which we term INFINITE INTELLIGENCE. We must walk in continuous conscious awareness of the divinity in all men, not just a few or just those we like, but all men everywhere.

We may justifiably hate those things which some people do, but we must not hate the person, only their actions, and we are justified in raising our hand that they do not harm us. We have the right to defend ourselves.

As we walk in conscious awareness of the kingdom of God all around us, we become better channels through which truth, light, love, and understanding will become more manifest upon the earth.

The works of God manifest continuously in our lives. As we do our part in working with spirit, and as we respond properly to the inspiration within our hearts, then our thinking comes into

conscious oneness with the purposes of the soul and in that instant the kingdom of God becomes manifest upon the earth. Then we will know that we have done our part.

or unusual in these experiences of Jesus. We can speak knowingly of resurrections, as we can explain and account for them in a natural way, and perfectly in line with all the phenomena which occurred in connection with the

resurrection of Jesus.

What was it that Mary saw? In all probability Mary saw a materialized spirit. materialized a form that was sufficiently tangible and real to the disciples to enable him to talk with them. Now, when we Spiritualists say these things the orthodox laugh at us. They declare that we are very foolish to believe these strange things. Yet it is not half as strange for us to believe in the materialization of spirit forms as it is to believe that Jesus was literally translated -- flesh and blood and body and soul -- to

the Kingdom of Heaven.

Paul tells us that there is a natural body and a spiritual one. The spiritual body to which he refers is that which the spirit is clothed after it has severed itself from its temple of clay. It is the instrument through which the spirit manifests itself. You must remember that this is a higher relation, it is a relationship with nature wherein the spirit acquires experiences that cannot possibly be acquired through the instrumentality of the physical body alone. This physical form is the instrument through which it 18 possible for the spirit to relate itself to the physical plane of nature. The spiritual body to which St. Paul refers, the body to which we have often referred, is the ethereal body. It is fine and more adapted to the needs of the spirit within its temple of clay.

Here you are in bondage. You are afflicted by various diseases which are the result of inharmonious relations; but with the spiritual or ethereal body it is different. There are no ulseases, and therefore it was perfectly natural that when Jesus appeared to Mary she could not

recognize him at first.

Mary Magdalene, we are told, was last at the cross and first at the tomb. Three days had scarcely elapsed since she looked on the form of her master, and yet she had apparently forgotten him, as she did not recognize him when he appeared to her. If it has been the old body which she had seen often, she would have recognized him immediately. The two bodies are slightly different. His new one was finer. It was the body which Jesus had been able to materialize for the occasion, and therefore at first she did not know him. The same rule would apply to the disciples on their way to Emmaus. They did not recognize him either. They supposed that it was a stranger. Why else would they have started to tell him of the incidents that had occurred at Jerusalem, and how Jesus had been brought before Pilate and had been crucified?

The whole Christian world feels that it has cause to rejoice on Easter morning. It feels that there is something in the resurrection of Jesus in which it can find a source of consolation and strength. Paul declares that "If Jesus is not arisen, then our preaching is in vain," and all the Christian teachers, from Paul down to the present day, have harped upon this fact of the

resurrection of Jesus of Nazareth.

And yet, if we are to grant that Jesus rose from the dead as claimed, if we are to accept the orthodox view of God and Jesus, if we are to believe that Jesus was the very God, that He was the Creator of the universe -- then there is no justification for our belief that we shall enjoy the same experience. If Jesus was more than human, if Jesus was God incarnate in a different sense from what you and I are God incarnate, we have no assurance that we shall enjoy the same experience that he enjoyed. But we, as Spiritualists stand on firm ground. We are not dependent on this faint hope; we can readily believe that Jesus arose from the dead two thousand years ago, because we know our own loved ones have arisen from the dead and we have been privileged to hold communion with

We want to say to you that resurrection is a fact, that just as sure as the flowers come forth in the springtime, rising up apparently out of the dead earth, just as surely will you arise from the physical form which you now bear in bondage. We want to assure you that the soul, which is really you, never had a beginning and therefore is not likely to have an end. We want to assure you that thoughts can never die, that whatever there is of good will survive the external change; that there is that within you which will live when the material form about you has changed. We want to assure you that you are immortal souls -not because Jesus arose two thousand years ago

but you are immortal because you are sons and daughters of God; the question "to be or not to be" is no longer the question. You cannot help but be, you must be, therefore, you cannot ever be destroyed. The real question for you to consider now is not "will you be?" but "what will you be?"

The question of Job has been satisfactorily answered--If a man die, shall he live again?" He shall. The only change is in the outer form, the only difference is that you enter another sphere.

We want to rise higher and higher. We want to ascend the ladder of progression. There is no such thing as death in God's wide world. That which is spiritual, within, survivies the shock of the change which is called death, and we live on and on and on after all material forms have changed or passed into a state of decay.

Do you think, that we, as Spiritualists are trying to deprive our orthodox friends of any of the comfort that is possible for them to derive out of the fact of the resurrection of Jesus. We would not take away joy that they feel on Easter morning after His resurrection. We would not take from them any comfort to be derived from any book or any teaching that would help to make the hearts glad, that would lift the heavy burden from their hearts, that would bring joy and happiness into their lives. We want to add something to that which they already have. We want to bring them a clearer knowledge, that they may become sure of the fact that they are sons and daughters of the living God. Jesus, who experienced the change called death is living today. The sages, prophets, heroes and martyrs, who looked upon death are living today, your loved ones -- mother, father, sisters, brothers, husband and wife, are living and watching over you; the men who have established this republic have not forgotten it. The father and mother who have brought you to birth in this world have not forgotten you. The sons and daughters you loved and who were taken from your side by the Angel of Death have not forgotten you; they are all waiting to establish closer companionship, they want to inspire your mind with thoughts, born of a larger experience; they are trying to make you feel that you are a citizen of a larger world, that brotherhood includes within it every individual man and woman in the physical world, and that it includes the denizens of the universe. Believing in this larger brotherhood we recognize that there are hosts of ministering angels, who are further advanced in the realms, in progress, who are striving hard to instill into our minds thoughts of freedom and goodness.

They are trying to inspire us to become nobler men and women. Too often, though, our ears are closed so that we listen not to them, our eyes are shut so that we behold not the radiant forms that would lead us into peace and righteousness.

If it were possible for you to have relationships with those who have passed beyond the field of shadows, if your heart were attuned to the melodies of nature, if you would listen to hear sweet songs, if you could catch inspirations that come from her shoes you would be nobler and better men and women.

Resurrection! Why you don't have to wait until some distant future. You are being resurrected out of some condition every day. You are evolving out of the old into the new every day.

And so, your friends who have passed through the change called death are not sleeping. They are not remaining in a state of idleness, waiting for the sound of the great trumpet. They are today suffering the consequences of their transgressions, or they are enjoying the harvest of a well spent life.

We want to inspire you with a realization of the naturalness of the world that lies just beyond the domain of sense, and then you will not have to wait until Easter morning to rejoice over the fact of the resurrection. You do not have to wait a year before you can sing your glad songs. You will realize that every morning is an Easter morning, as it brings to birth some new flower, some new inspiration, some new thought. It will help to make you newer and better men and women and nobler sons and daughters of God.

We trust that you will make every day an Easter day, every day a day for rejoicing, every day a day for happiness and song, every day a day for exchange of loving thoughts and noble deeds. If you do this, the future life can have nothing but good in store for you.

## **Healers**

A gifted few are especially suited to the task of healing. These rare individuals should be afforded the instruction and opportunity to learn and do their great work. Love, patience and practice can, in time, enable most of us to demonstrate any talent. But when someone is born with a great gift, it should be developed to its fullest degree and not held back. Perfection is seldom given! To become a master, one must strive long and hard. Then proof comes in accomplishment, the kind of self-satisfaction that breeds confidence and personal achievement.

In view of this, let us now examine some of the questions which often follow any discussion on healing:

What is the source of the healer's power?

Why does it differ in individuals?

How can it be accommodated to varying circumstances?

Can a healer's power be effective with all diseases?

Health can only be established and maintained when the Triune Man -- body, soul and spirit -- functions as a composite whole. Spirit is the permanent factor, the energizing center from which all power is drawn. The etheric and physical bodies act as receivers and transmitters.

Good health is man's natural heritage. Disease is not natural because the human body is a self-healing instrument. The chief business of a physician rests in his ability to supply deficiencies and remove obstructions occurring abnormally in growth.



### SAUL INTO PAUL

(A study of Paul's psychic demonstrations through Biblical documentation with accompanying psychic commentary.) King James Version.

#### Foreward

Theologians and religious scholars have stressed through a picture painting portrait of words the personailty of Paul: Paul, a spiritual student of the famed Jewish Doctor of Law, Gamaliel; Paul, the youngest Sanhedrin Officer of the Jewish Tribunal; Paul, a disciple of Jesus; and Paul, a builder of the Christian Message.

Acts 9:5

psychic commentative while saul was stunned with the cataclystic event, he was not devoid of some mental acuteness, for Saul expressed his desire to know who was the speaker, that he could not see with mortal eyes, "Who art thou, Lord?" The voice "in the atmosphere" answered in concise language, "I am Jesus" (Acts 9:5).

Pause and reflect ... Jesus? Why Jesus had been crucified on a wooden cross, that is the **physical** Jesus. Then, this speaking Jesus was a "transitioned" Jesus, a Jesus in the Beyond. One in the Beyond speaking to one on the Earth in a new communication method, why this is the premise of interworld communication!

## THE PSYCHIC MESSAGE

... It is hard for thee to kick against the pricks.

Acts 9:5

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: This part of the inter-world communication reveals the intimate knowledge of Saul's inner feelings about all this destroying and imprisoning orders. The invisible communicant Jesus gleaned this knowledge, not through worldly men but from his psychic nearness to Saul, he recognized Saul's militant front, and as well, the tender prickings wihin Saul.

## THE INSTRUCTION OF THE PSYCHIC MESSAGE:

... Arise, and go into the city, and it shall be told what thou must do.

Acts 9: 6

The psychic encounter caused Saul to speak much like a child to an elder, "What wilt thou have me to do?" rather than a Saul, fearless, Romanesque in arrogance, imperially proud of ability to handle matters of import. The instruction, as indicated, was to go into the Damascus city and wait.

During this whole psychic converse Saul had remained in his fallen position on the earth, upon his rising Saul required the assisting hands of those near him -- he could not see. His soldiers brought him into the city where a spiritual fast was observed by Saul "Neither did eat nor drink" for three days.

**MULTI-CERTIFYING TESTIMONY:** 

... And the men which journeyed with him (Saul) stood speechless, hearing a voice, but seeing no man.

Acts 9: 7

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: Researchers and men of psychic science hold to the testimony of others as a certifying step of authenticating a psychic event. Documentation in the scripture of the "many" report the hearing of the voice, "but seeing no man". The often raised explanation of a hallucination on the part of Paul is refuted by the multi-hearing of the voice by his group.

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
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## **Through Time Unerring**

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## John Slater, Pioneer

Philadelphia, Pennsylvania was the birthplace of many great and noble achievements for the freedom of our progressive country. It also gave to the Spiritualist Movement one of its most illustrious pioneer champions, who labored long and assiduously for religious freedom in its all encompassing expression.

It was here on September 24, 1867, that John Slater was born of Irish parents. His Baptist Mother was Mary Killen and his Catholic Father

was named Michael.

At the age of four, John Slater first experienced communication with the spirit-world. He saw and talked with his little play-mate, Mary Powers, whose funeral he had attended a few hours earlier.

During the ensuing years, he was to witness countless spirit manifestations. They brought strength and purpose into his life. For despite his parent's lack of sympathy and faith in his beliefs, he remained active in the Spiritualist Movement -- active even in the face of sneers, jibes and insults.

At 21 he made a decision which was to affect the balance of his life. He left home and began the endless task of devoting the rest of his life to advancing the Cause. The decision had not come easily. The question of whether to make it weighed heavily on him, though, and it was a time when he, too, needed encouragement. John received it during a sitting with Mrs. Leah Fox Underhill. He and his friend, Mrs. Elizabeth Holmes, one of Spiritualism's early workers in Brooklyn, New York, sought her counsel in weighing the question. The occasion gave him his answer. In fact, the loud raps which corrobrated Mrs. Underhill's remarks made it difficult to think anything else.

Mr. Slater had been told that he had been "born to do the work of the spirit world." As he left Mrs. Underhill, who was standing as one Inspired, he said to his friend, Mrs. Holmes: "I shall put my shoulder to the wheel; I shall go on and do the work and I shall always remember Mrs. Underhill and be, as she advised, — a Man." Thus -- he set out to travel under foretold "spirit-protection" always — the many miles

over land and sea.

In 1889, San Francisco beckoned him. Then, it was the Hawaiian Islands, where Honolulu received him most graciously.

San Francisco, California was to be known as his home, for he settled in that beautiful city by

the Golden Gate upon his marriage to Eugenie Browell in 1890.

Mr. Slater's wonderful work for the promulgation of Spiritualism was carried on in many places, giving him little time to spend at home, where he enjoyed good reading, the opera, movies, baseball and boxing.

John Slater's outstanding Sealed-Billet-Mediumship and his noted Trance-lectures made him a renowned public worker for over fifty

years.

His spirit-control was his Uncle William

Killen, a brother of his Mother.

His first Spiritualist Camp work was at Lake Pleasant, Mass. Thereafter he seldom missed a season at Camp Lily Dale in New York State. Its beauty enthralled him, and here he greeted his dear old friends and made new ones.

Perhaps his most remarkable Mediumship lay in his greetings from spirit people to loved ones here, which had to be authenticated later through investigation of records by those receiving the messages, and they always were. This was undeniable proof of intelligent communication with the spirit world and the continuity of life.

A now familiar story told of one of his experiences at Camp Lily Dale attests to his remarkable ability: As he stood near a group of young people, he overheard them laughing and jesting about Spiritualism. The story goes that he called to one of them, something perhaps like this, "young man, you there, standing near the young lady in the yellow dress! -- be sure and stay clear of the lake today." Later when the boy went rowing, he apparently lost control of the boat and it capsized. It was evidently some time later when the boy's body was found floating in the reeds and rushes near the shore. John Slater's accuracy was often remarkable.

His son, John Slater, Jr., a resident of Santa Clara, California, often spoke of his father's careful tutorship of him. "He taught me that all actions are seen from the spirit side by dear helpers and guides." Young Slater tested the lesson, he recalled, by burying a potato next to the back stoop steps of their San Francisco home. His father, who was away on a trip, wrote him to ask why his son had put a potato in the ground. His son never again doubted the closeness of the spirit-entities nor their power.

His Father took him to the California State Spiritualists' Association Convention in

the nineteen-twenties. Here he saw a medium who was entranced by a Fire Worshipper of Ancient Persia, who spoke through her in that language. She gathered handfuls of Flames from a punch-bowl-sized container of inflammable substance, burning brightly, and covered her face, her hair and her neck, smearing the flames all over her head. Two thousand people witnessed this amazing phenomenon and saw the medium emerge from this entrancement without a burn or sear of any nature, yet, she had literally bathed her head in fire.

This writer recently learned from an aunt in New York City that in 1910, she and two friends visited John Slater and were astounded when he detailed an account of a train wreck, one in which they had just survived. The three ladies had journeyed from Bradford, Pennsylvania to Buffalo, N.Y., to see this great demonstrator of Spiritualist phenomena.

John Slater gave his last earthly services for Spiritualism at the C.S.S.A. Convention at Los Angeles, California in June, 1932. Upon his return to his San Francisco home, this famous medium traveled to the spirit side of life to continue along his pathway of progression.

Let us remember his indomitable will to "carry-on" and labor ceaselessly for Spiritualism, undaunted by the bigotry and the ridicule of ignorance. Let us ever be grateful to him for his unflinching loyalty to this Truth.

John Slater has left a worthy pattern for us to follow in the dissemination of "Spiritualism, the Light of the World."

Hannen Swaffer answers this question by turning to the "word of men who could not lie."



"Yet anyone who inquires into Spiritualism starts like a child in an infant class. He will accept Lodge on physics, but not on Spiritualism. He will accept Crookes on chemistry but not on psychic phenomena.

"And so we have to waste our time in our perpetual kindergarten, teaching the ABC's to every bewiskered scientist who believes all he is told about Mars--though he has never seen it, and would not recognize it (if someone showed him a sample of its soil.)

"He accepts nearly everything that any other scientist tells him--unless it is about survival. Psychical researchers, instead of investigating professional mediums in circumstances in which the best results are almost impossible, should do as I did--form a home circle.

Millions (of people) belonging to many races and all the creeds (of the world) have testified to (the truth of Spiritualism) after a personal investigation. For over a century their testimony and statements by hundreds of scientists, not only in this country and the United States but throughout the world, has been endorsed and confirmed. Today that evidence still stands."
