When Benjamin Franklin wished to interest the people of Philadelphia in street lighting, he didn't try to persuade them by talking about it, instead, he hung a beautiful lantern on a long bracket before his own door. Then he kept the glass brightly polished, and carefully and religiously lit the wick every evening at the approach of dusk, so recounts Cole D. Robinson in World Horizons.



People wandering about on the dark street saw Franklin's light a long way off and came under the influence of its friendly glow with grateful hearts. To each one it seemed to say: "Come along, my friend! Here is a safe place to walk. See that cobblestone sticking up? Don't stumble over it! Good-bye! I shall be here to help you again tomorrow night, should you come this way."

It wasn't long before Franklin's neighbors began placing lights on brackets before their homes, and soon the entire city awoke to the value of street lighting by taking up the matter with interest and enthusiasm.

We too, can make our lights shine so brightly that they will attract others to our side. There is always a way to enlist volunteers for the great and beautiful work that needs to be done. We must open the portals of **Truth** and invite sincere, dedicated men, women and children to come in and assist us in this great work that **our Light may shine brighter and reach further.**

What is the cause of inactive Lyceum members, removal of names from the rolls, decaying Lyceum classes, and declining enrollment? We have the finest facilities, the most up-to-date curriculum, and the largest budgets of our history. But we are failing, as no other generation has to reach and reap the harvest. This is the greatest day in history to build lyceums (Sunday Schools) and churches. This is the easiest day since A.J. Davis visualized the rich harvest of youth. We say it's the hardest. but that's because our hearts are the coldest and we refuse to support the state lyceum superintendents, conductors and teachers in this great army of Truth.



The Mental Superlatives

States of the Mind

·Conscious ·Sub-conscious ·Super Conscious

by Rev. Marcia D. Hagopian In order to better understand the states of the mind, one must look at a broader picture than that which is represented through the confines of mortal man. The concept of mind can be more fully understood, when one looks into the realms of the Infinite and attempts to grasp the reality of the whote, after which we can place man and his states of the mind in their proper perspective.

The broad expanse of infinity contains various states and qualities of consciousness, many far beyond our limited ability of comprehension. In order to become aware of these mental states, one must first become attuned to them. Mind is the tuner for this attunemtent. In the Bible, St. John, Chapter 1, Verse 1, it is stated "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." For the purpose of broadening our understanding of this concept, let us consider man's definition of word. According to Webster, "word" is a "a sound that is made to express."

Spiritualists and non-spiritualists alike are aware that sound is a vibration. To draw a parallel, we could say, as a word is a sound made to express, it would also, in broader concept, be a vibration made to express, that would be perceived as sound only in the limited range of vibration which is perceptable through the physical organs of sense. In grasping this scientific fact, we then can gain a greater measure of understanding and insight to the meaning of this scripture. "In the beginning was the Word", man's defined concept of vibration, "and the Word was with God", the energy radiating from God thus producing a vibration, "and the Word was God", God being the radiant Essense and directive Force behind the vibration. With this concept in mind, we then observe that in the beginning was vibration made by God to express Himself--that vibration was the result of energy radiating from God, and was God in essense.

God-spirit, radiating energy and vibrations fills infinity with the pulsation of being. Under the governing influence of natural law, it narrows into the various stages and qualities of expression. Of all the evolutionary products which have resulted, man is the ultimate form of expression. Man alone has the unique ability to be consciously aware of consciousness itself. All which exists prior to, or beneath, the stage and quality of consciousness where man's conscious awareness of himself dawns into being, is that infinite realm of the sub-conscious to which man is linked by the mind channel. Through this channel, which is stained with failures, hued with successess, and filled with instincts, both physical and spiritual, man receives his heritage, and man's mind channel being attuned to this vast realm of the subconscious has allowed God, through natural law, to begin and complete the formation of his physical body--thus the sub-conscious state of the mind has provided God-spirit with a physical form of self-expression and allows man to draw upon that vast realm of essense and energy to sustain the formative, recreative, and supportive processes necessary to keep his body functioning and growing.

Being an individualized portion of God-spirit. man must then progress spiritually toward becoming one grand individualized reflection of the total, or whole, of the God qualities that can be reflected through his being. Through his physical body he may gain a fuller realization of the ultimate whole by perceiving, separately, the surrounding essenses or vibrations through the physical organs of sense. This gives him the material from which he may gain the knowledge he will use for his spiritual growth. We now must have a directing power with which to turn this passive possession of knowledge into the dynamic and active power of intelligence. As he slowly becomes consciously aware of himself, as an individual, he also develops an awareness of a directing power. This directive power, in its purest form is God, or Infinite Intelligence, and to be conscious of intelligence, or of a directivepower, links man, through the mind channel, 10 his god. When man is aware of that infinite realm of the dynamic and active power of Intelligence.. when man becomes aware of the Infinite which is revealed, not only through the intuitive processes within man, but also through all other forms of expression surrounding him. he begins operating in the conscious state of the mind and may use that all-powerful and mighty force under the direction of, and in accordance with, his own conscious will to expand and nourish that which he calls himself.

As it is foreordained that man will live and express throughout eternity, the physical body is then realized to be the training vehicle through which selfrealization may be achieved. The original impersonal Entity (God-spirit) becomes personalized through form, and he prepares for greater and finer forms of expression in the life hereafter, by consciously directing the divine flow of energy toward his spiritual growth.

The realm of infinity, wherein are living hosts of individual entities in various stages of progression following the death of the physical body, is that realm of the super conscious which vibrates at a higher rate of frequency than our own. Again, we turn to the Bible where Paul states in I Cor. 15:42, "So also is the resurrection of the dead" and in Verse 44, "It is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. There is a natural body, and there is a spiritual body." So man has a spiritual body which lives on, with all his memories, habits, and knowledge, yet it is

part of him while expressing through the physical form. Because of its higher rate of vibration, it forms the connecting link with the super conscious realm, and through the super conscious state of the mind, man is attuned to the mind channel through which he can tap his memories and the well-springs of knowledge, as well as, communicate with, and receive guidance and instruction from, those who are expressing in that infinite realm of consciousness.

The states of the mind are conditions in which man can attune to the various stages and qualities of consciousness in the realms of infinity. The sub-conscious state of the mind is man's attunement, through the mind channel, to all that which exists before he becomes consciously aware of himself. It provides him with a physical form of expression, the formative and re-creative forces to support its growth and development, and the instincts which push him into action. The conscious state of the mind is his attunement to Infinite Intelligence through his conscious awareness of the dynamic and active power of intelligence, through which he becomes aware of God-spirit in its myriad forms of expression, and through which he uses his conscious will to direct the divine flow of energy toward which he uses his conscious will to direct the divine flow of energy toward his spiritual growth. The super conscious state of the mind is his attunement, through the mind channel, to his knowledge and memories and the realm of consciousness wherein are living, those who have preceded him along the same path that he, too, must follow into the higher realms of expression.

The states of the mind--man's attunement, through the mind channel, to his God.. in the beginning... now... and forever.

An Interpretative Review of Swedenborg's Heaven and Hell

If Swedenborg's terminology in **Heaven and Hell** seem different from what we would use today, it may be due to this work being translated from his original Latin manuscript, and, or course, due to the passage of time.

Emanuel Swedenborg was born at Stockholm, Sweden, in 1688. He was of Lutheran background, and proved a well educated student of science and philosophy. He studied at various universities and spent considerable time in England. Swedenborg was the author of a number of scientific books. In 1744, at the age of 56, he had psychic experiences which caused him to investigate the nature of spirit. His aptitude was so great that he must have been chosen by the Spirit World.

While in a trance state it is believed that he was capable of making observations in the spiritual realms. This education covered a period of 13 years. It was at the completion of this that he gave of his learning to mankind.

Swedenborg's writing make it clear that angels are men. He tells us that the Bible is subject to interpretation and that "The coming of the Lord" as expressed means the enlightment of ignorance. Part of his work speaks of three heavens or kingdoms. They are named and described as follows: The Natural, a place for those who have not yet awakened to the necessity for spiritual progression; Spiritual, the heaven for those seeking progress in unfoldment; and the Celestial Heaven, a higher sphere for those who have progressed and merit higher development. He interpreted these spheres as being sub-divided into planes.

He claims that these heavens are separate; that communication between them is difficult because of the different state of consciousness of variance in vibration. To go for one to another, he implied, that the individual would lose some degree of energy and integrity of intellect unless a particular mission was prescribed. No other person is known to have recorded so much knowledge of the Spirit World for prosperity. In this respect, Swedenborg is a predecessor of Modern Spiritualism, which was to come into being nearly one hundred years later with the writing of A.J. Davis and the activities of the Fox sisters.

Though not of the cloth, Swedenborg was a religious man who held to some limiting ideas ingrained early in his life. He held to a personified deity who acts in a universal than personal manner. This is very similar to our understanding of Infinite Intelligence. Slight differences do not detract from the revelations of spirit life and their governing philosophy. Today, a difference in terminology might be expected. He would use angel in leu of spirit, interiors and exteriors for physical and spiritual consciousness, and Lord instead of Infinite Intelligence. His concept was different, but the underlying intelligence was evident.

Swedenborg emphasized that there was a corresponding state for all things in all three kingdoms and the earth plane. Though there were differences, they were relevant. This pertained even to the human body. Spirits, too, have bodies which eventually become more beautiful. The human body reflects the divine as a symbol, so man is not to hold to the false idea that Spirit is merely an intelligence without a body.

He makes note of a very interesting revelation pertaining to language. In the Spirit World there is a universal language which is instinctive. It can be spoken, but communication is also mental -- often transmitted in the form of ideas rather than words. Spirits communicate with natural man through his brain and by this means we can inter into his thoughts. Deception in the Spirit World is self revealing in the presence of developed spirits and the deceiver is expelled as unworthy.

(I would say that anyone who has a defective product should not wait to peddle it in heaven.)

It was made clear to Swedenborg that all spirituality hinges on a complete lack of selfishness. Most misery in our world is caused in one way or another by selfish ambition or just selfishness. Swedenborg has us believe that in the Spirit World a line is drawn right down the middle between the selfish and unselfish. The

selfish are self confined among their own kind because of their limitations. (You can't have love for others and be selfish. Without consideration for others you cannot be spiritual.)

This certainly is a basic idea which we should re-emphasize to ourselves daily. Are we being unselfish in our relationship to others? It is so easy to lose sight of this and consider our own desires without regard to others whom we are endebted. This is true to everyone we relate to each day even if the only obligation is courtesy, which is itself unselfish.

Swedenborg says that on earth we have the life giving rays of a distant sun which gives light, warmth and comfort. In heaven there is a correpsonding quality from the Divine. All things of heaven exist in a finer degree and quality than on earth.

Goodness and truth are the great virtues of heaven and they combine into love. With these qualities comes a great power, the strength of which is determined by the degree of these qualities evidenced by a particular spirit. This power is never used for selfish ends without loss to the perpetrator.

It is possible for good spirits to take a selfish false step in their own volition. For this they pay dearly, and if it is serious enough they may find themselves self exiled to be only among those others similarly moved.

Swedenborg leads us to believe that there are places or conditions in the Spirit World corresponding to the hell we seldom hear about through orthodox religion. He makes it clear that no spirit is condemed to hell. The spirit, by substituting selfishness in place of spirituality, segregates itself from the unselfish and good because he cannot endure the higher vibrations. He then unconciously condemns himself to be among those of a similar vibration which is a hellish state wherein the evil may only prey upon the evil and no longer harm the good.

Swedenborg said that the coordination of people in heaven is done through societies. People are joined to a society with which they are in harmony and therefore experience a happy relationship with their associates. The leaders of these societies have superior qualifications of wisdom and are chosen by a high source. Within each society there are ascending planes of spiritual conciousness.

Swedenborg tells us that an ancient race once living upon this planet communicated freely with angels (spirits) and that the Jehovah of the Old Testament who conversed with the prophets was a spirit or spirits. He said that when spirits enter our environment to communicate they take on our language as if it were their own and forget it as soon as they leave us. This accounts for the facility with which spirits whose earthly language was different from our own converse freely in English during a trumpet seance.

Swedenborg explains how during spirit contact with man an accidental influx from the spirits memory sometimes occurs and causes man to MAY 1977 take on an insight of that spirit's past. (This can impart the false conviction of a past memory of another life.)

He says, "this is the source of the belief held by some of the ancients that they had returned. This may be an important revelation by Swedenborg since it occured before the modern vogue of reincarnation doctrines. It would appear to be a plausable explanation of a noteworthy phenomena.

Swedenborg seems to assume that because obsession by corporeal spirits has been forbidden that it no longer occurs. However, we know that evil exists. Since he says that nothing, of consequence comes of ourselves alone, it may be assumed that this applies to the extremes of good and evil.

He speaks of innocence! In children it is external. They accept from their parents without question since they possess no wisdom of themselves. An adult is innocent spiritually if he has wisdom enough to act upon truth from his spiritual conciousness without question rather than storing it in memory for self consideration and decision. He is also innocent to the extent that he accepts and understands that all good and truth comes only from the devine source and not of himself. True innocence is the willingness to be led by Divine Guidance rather than by your own inclinations.

Swedenborg says it is impossible to experience "The Peace of Heaven" without withdrawing from the physical body and raising up the mind to a spiritual condition. Peace is a conjunction of Good and Truth, Innocense and Love. True peace is only attainable through Wisdom.

Understanding Prayer

Prayer is to the soul what food is to the body. No other factor in life is more potent. Prayer can touch universal knowledge and energy. It can change the rate of vibration of the soul's energies and cause growth of the soul. Prayer brings divine love to the soul. It opens the door to operate through one's mental self and helps raise one's ideals. In turn, this love brings about further growth of spiritual understanding.

Here are a few definitions of prayer: True prayer is the spontaneous outcry of a soul in need. Prayer is a desire to improve and to achieve harmony with Infinite Intelligence. It is a sincere desire, both when spoken and thought. Prayer is a sharing, a recognition of the Natural Law of Cooperation. It is a form of request.

Some prayers are acted out rather than spoken. Good deeds of kindness are often prayers. They are expressions of gratitude. Pain is prayer from a nerve in an impoverished condition. A drooping flower is praying for water. Since man is a very private creature he is sometimes unable to express to his fellowmen just how he feels. Prayer can come easily. It's a voice to the invisible world expressed in perfect freedom and faith. Man cannot grow without prayer. It may be poor in form, wrongly worded and crude, yet it is a call from the soul and thus all important.

Prayer is both cause and effect. It vitalizes our faith, love and hope, helps to make us more sincere, trusting and effective in receiving and in giving out the God power which comes through us.

Lack of prayer results in emaciated souls who lead aimless, colorless lives--existing--like driftwood. As the Spiritualist views it, prayerby-proxy is of dubious value. One example is the ancient use of the prayerwheel. Written prayers were attached to the wheel, then it was spun and allegedly stopped at a prayer favored by God. Another practice began centuries ago was that of making offerings to statues of mythological gods and saints. Joss sticks are still burned before images in China and in Japan. The Roman Catholic Church urges that babies be named after patron saints who then are expected in intercede with God in behalf of their namesakes. Protestants select Jesus, the Christ of Nazareth, Modern Spiritualism as their intercessor. believes that man does not need an intercessor. Continued on page 13

Believers of credal religions pray to a God who stands outside of Natural Law and outside their congregations. Modern Spiritualism joins with Jesus in believing God not to be outside but inside: "that still, small voice within" -- as Jesus said, "The kingdom of God is within".

To many people, prayer has a limited meaning, being little more than petitioning, begging, or asking. To some it is an even agonizing effort to persuade a personal God to rule in their favor. The Modern Spiritualist believes that great Infinite Intelligence cannot be personalized and does not suspend Natural Law so that it will allow an individual soul to override it.

Prayer, should not be mere supplication but an expression of gratitide for that received.

Follow no set form in prayer, instead "concentration" and think out your prayers- or say them in your own words. Of course, the Lord's Prayer is always appropriate.

The effectivness of any prayer improves when you think or talk in a natural, heartfelt way and strive to be yourself.

The Natural Law of Desire gives birth to prayer. The Law of Vibration sends positive vibrations into the ether. The Laws of Attraction and Passivity draw from the cosmic currents of wisdom, love and power the vibrations and energies which are appropriate to the prayer.

To what extent have we the right to expect that our prayers will be answered? We are all in one great family on earth and in the universe, and the head of the family could not permit an answer to a prayer that would be beneficial to one child and detrimental to others.

Hate defeats prayer and cancels any sought response. Sometimes one must change before his prayer can be answered. People pray many times for things they don't need and won't get. When one's prayers lack frequency or adequacy, a lack of spiritual progress results.

Prayer should never be thought of as a means of shifting responsibility. We need the responsibilities imposed upon us for experience and in turn, development. Prayer helps handle these responsibilities in the right ways.

Prayer is infinitely more complex than mortals can realize. It is both individual yet universal. It is a mystery because, being of the spirit, it can only be discerned spiritually. All is not known of the nature, power and possibilities of ether or magnetism or electricity, yet they serve us well. It is so with this force called prayer.

Prayers are sometimes answered in stages. The very word implies a broadcast signal. It puts the spirit world on alert. Our spirit helpers--"God's messengers, guarding angels"--hear and respond as they have through the ages. Many "angels" are former inhabitants of earth and with their combined experience can secure help MAY 1977 for us. But it's important that we speak in practical, sincere terms. Then answers will come in the ways we need, though not necessarily in the ways we want.

To pray is first to express gratitude. We are dependent and interdependent upon others, both here and in the spirit world. In order to receive, we must give out, and prayer is one of the best ways to do this.

Saul into Paul ...

PART II by Helene Gerling

A HEALER'S PSYCHIC EXPERIENCE

...And there was a certain disciple at Damascus, named Ananias; and to him said the Lord (Jesus) in a vision...

Acts 9:10

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: In the three day initial developing metamorphosis of Saul into Paul, a spiritual healer was directed through a clairvoyant experience - a vision - to go to Saul. This psychic mode of summoning an earthly healer, Ananias, extraordinary as it was, is identified in the above quotation, and by whom the psychic request was made is indicated in the following biblical account: "... even Jesus, that appeared unto thee (Saul) in the way as thou camest, hath sent me (Ananias)..." (Acts 9:17) The transitioned Jesus commissioned Ananias, an earthly healer, to go to Saul, to effect a goodness to him.

THE BALANCE OF THE PSYCHIC MESSAGE TO ANANIAS:

Arise, and go into the street which is called Straight, and inquire in the house of Judas for one called Saul, of Tarsus: for behold he prayeth:

...And hath seen in a vision a man named Ananias coming in, and putting his hand on him, that he might receive his sight.

Acts 9:11-12

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: This psychic informative transmission of Jesus to Ananias was not filled with generalities but replete with specific information... Information that told Ananias how to find the unknown Saul. Ananias knew Saul not, but had heard of his harshness toward the new cultists.

Look back to the bold face words. Each one is a "specific" and it was through these nine specifiecs, that Ananias found Saul. The validation of these guide posts promptly indicate the "transitioned Jesus" really communicated to Ananias, **information he did not have**, and which he needed, if the mission of healing was to be accomplished. "Note: This is the stamp of authentic inter-world communication required by psychical researchers.) Ananias found Saul by means of the specifics given by Jesus, a discarnate contact.

ANANIAS' RESPONSE TO THE PSYCHIC IMPACT:

...And Ananias went his way and entered into the house... And immediately there fell from his eyes as it had been scales.

Acts 9:17-18

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: The psychic im. pact upon Ananias does not reflect any hesitation to accept the vision and voice extraordinaire; "And Ananias went his way..."

A doubting person would have debated within himself; undoubtedly psychic visions and voices were not a first time experience for Ananias. He found Saul and when the healing treatment of "laying on of hands" had been completed, as requested by Jesus, Saul tells in graphic manner how the healing affected his eyes. He reported it was like scales falling from his eyes. It seems as though, at the end of the three day spiritual fast and healing, Saul completed the beginning metamorphosis of Saul into Paul.

PSYCHIC ENTRIES IN PAUL'S SCRIPTURAL JOURNAL

...Of the Jews five times received I forty stripes save one. Thrice was I beaten with rods, once was I stoned, thrice I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I have been in the deep;

In journeyings often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils by mine own countrymen, in perils by the heathen, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils among false brethern;

In weariness and painfulness, in watchings often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness.

2 Corinthians 11:25-27

What sustained Paul in these endless perils that assailed his life? What enabled him to go onward in the face of so many seeming insurmountable barriers? What source reassured him that he was not alone? It was the psychic rapport he had in the course of his Chrisitian ministry. While there may have been additional avenues of prayer and meditation, the psychic rapport is evidenced in an abundance of manifestations as a valued avenue of comfort, guidance, and protection.

With the beginning of the scriptural entries, objectivity will bring a recognition that, having these psychic phases actively pointed and explained, Paul's records seem much like reading a modern psychic journal because of psychic terminology, psychic messages of counsel, and psychic directives.

PSYCHIC VISION:

...And a vision appeared to Paul in the night; there stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, Come over into Macedonia, and help us.

Acts 16:9

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: A vision: a lairvoyant demonstration in psychic science, is a phase often experienced by sensitives. The parapsychologist links or premises the psychic manifestation as related to some unknown power or faculty of the so-called mind. The viewpoint, that seems closer to the truth, is that psychic seeing is the aftermath in the material level of consciousness of an intuitive seeing perception--a perception that begins in the intuitive organism and eventually delivers its "subtle gathered material" into the everyday consciousness, wherein it is voiced in physical words, understandable to others.

Paul, like Ananias, relied upon his psychic visions. This is significant in the scriptural verse: "And after he (Paul) had seen the vision, we (the group) endeavoured to go into Macedonia..." (Acts 16:10) Its significance lies in the reflection the words give of the feeling Paul had toward his own psychic risings-- he relied upon them in his every day life-and-living. He acted upon them without delay!

PHYSICAL PHENOMENA: TELEKINESIS

...And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisioners heard them.

And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed.

Acts 16: 25-26

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: Scripture heralds this event as a natural phenomenon - an earthquake. Possibly, this happening was more than a quake - it might have been a psychic demonstration of telekinesis, "supernormal movement".

The possibility is indicated in the spiritual vibratory responsiveness built in Paul and those of his group with him in prison through singing and praising God; they saturated the prison chamber with psychic power and spiritual aspiration. After that impregnation, the psychic demonstration occurred: "opening prison doors" and "freeing their hands". The scripture speaks of this happening only to Paul and the group, that there were "other" prisoners is indicated in the scripture statement "and the prisoners heard them". It would seem strange that an earthquake would only affect "some" of the prisoners and not the whole group in the prison.

Even in the most common of psychic phenomenon the principle of harmony is basic often achieved through (praise) meditation and (song) hymns. The knowing of the Christian Group how to "open the way" to Spirit and its manifestations has to be recognized, and while terminology might be different in wording, the purpose in the action is the very same in nature.

PSYCHIC FLIGHT:

I knew a man in Christ above fouteen years ago (whether in the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth)... 2 Corinthians 12:2

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: "Out of the body? Who in this twentieth century would imagine that in scripture there is a phrase equivalent to today's psychic experience of "supernormal flight travels", "astral flight", "projection of the double", and the like? But there it is, "out of the body"!

This biblical entry, upon examination, relates how Paul was in a state of confusion as to how he knew this specific man: did he meet him on earth fourteen years ago? Did he know him from flight travels, when in the night hours his double or counterpart was released temporarily from his physical body? This confusion is understandable to psychic sensitives. Many times the sensitive remembers the major event (as Paul - he knew the man), but the "how" of details was not brought back clearly. This experience indicates a possible "flight" experience, which also brings to a definiteness of understanding that flight travels were known to Paul, for he speaks of them.

SPEAKING IN TONGUES AND PROPHECY: And when Paul had laid his hands upon them (Disciples), the Holy Ghost came on them, and they spake with tongues, and prophesied.

Acts 19:6

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: Whether Paul himself joined the glossolalia demonstration ("speaking in tongues"), it is not indicated, but there is from this scriptural account, the knowing that Paul had served as an instrument in precipitating this kind of GROUP experience. The Holy Ghost phrase, when broken down in clarification, refers to a "Good Spirit".

Psychic "speaking in tongues" is not a meaningless muttering of strange sounds and ununderstandable words. This particular passage should be connected in meaning with the psychic speaking in Acts 2:9-11 wherein a GROUP of disciples also spoke in tongues. But in this passage there is a fuller description of what is meant: it was a speaking wherein homeland languages were spoken during the psychic demonstration; the wods spoken by the disciples were understood by the listening peoples, who came from these homelands: the Cretan un-

derstood the Cretan words spoken by a disciple while under the psychic influence of "speaking in tongues", the Parthian, the Mede, the Elamite, and the others - their words were also understood because the words were "real" words, not mutterings, that were spoken in their respective homelands. But the wonder of the speaking was that the disciples, when in their normal physical state, could not speak any of these languages. It was only possible when they were under the "influence of the Spirit". The people recognized this great and moving phenomenon, scripture tells it beautifully in a singular clearness: "And how hear we every man in our own tongue wherein we were born?" (Acts 2:8)



Book Review

Life and Matter

Published in 1905 Sir Oliver Lodge

by Rev. Marilyn Awtry

The book is a criticism of Professor Haeckel's Riddle of the Universe'' and is deep in theories. The basic intention of the author is to reformulate a certain doctrine concerning the nature of man and the interaction between mind and matter.

Chapter one introduces the Professor's theory d'monism' which applies to any philosophic system which assumes or tries to formulate an essential simplicity and 'oneness.' However, many theories of monism exist such as the hypothesis that everything is an aspect of some mown absolute reality; the fundamental reality sphysical, and consciousness is a by-product of me fundamental all embracing reality called matter, substance and energy.

This leads us to the natural law of substance or a kind of combination of the conservation of matter and the conservation of energy. The total discussion avoids any theory in regard to life and energy or life and the ether. However, we move m to find his view of life as it has arisen from norganic matter. Philosophers have various heories on this such as (1) the whole cosmos is an orderly system and every phenomena having an aim and purpose and (2) the mechanical heory, the universe is a monistic mechanical process with no aim or purpose. Materialists claim the universe and all its phenomena resolvable into matter and motion.

As to religion and philosophy, Professor Haeckel's attacks religion as peace between the church and the state and nothing much more han a suspension of hostilities. He says the hree great attributes are Truth, Goodness, and Beauty... and co-equal. Sir Oliver Lodge points at clearly that it appears the professor sees only ne side of the whole and therefore projects troneous theories. A scientist, he feels, should new those possibilities far beyond anything of thich he is positive. In these three attributes, he professor is limiting himself by specific tramples in the mind to which he relates.

Mind and matter are discussed in detail. The train is considered a complex piece of matter and whereby this mind is made manifest in the earth plane. We must note it is through ideas and the intervention of the mind that we hav become aware of the existence of matter. The author constantly contends that matter possesses energy in the form of persister motion, propelled by force.

Haeckel's formulative conjector as to the manner of the origin of life is expressed as hypothesis -- and to Lodge's thinking is extremely weak. Lodge feels he is dogmatic forceful and that his words exert undue influence and pressures on the uncultured.

Sir Oliver Lodge is explicit in his view that life is able to interact with the matter world for time, that it can also exist in some sense in dependently, and is subject to the law evolution. He maintains that in 1905, life could not be generated without action of antecede life or life must be pre-existent.

Physical science denys the possibility of an guidance or control but presses the laws physics to an ultimate conclusion. Lodge cotinually alludes to and finally states "it appear necessary to realize and admit that the laws physical science are incomplete in regard formulation and philosophical summary of the universe."

The book is a complexity of scientific theories and hypothesis, with which Lodge offedisagrees. He states again his purpose in the writing is to provide an antidote against the speculation and destructive portions Professor Haeckel's widely read works -- and realign the thinking mind to Truth.

The Crumbaughs of LeRoy, Ill., have a living memorial which each week extends the loving gift of Spiritualism to all those who pass through its doors. Few will ever know the silent benefactors, J.T. and E.J. Crumbaugh, who bequeathed their personal estate to a board of trustees charged with the construction and operation of a spiritualist church and library.

Beginning Monday, Dec. 13, 1976, Lucille and Gil Burke, signed a DAILY contract for additional broadcasts. These daily broadcasts are heard five days a week, Monday through Friday, fifteen minutes each day between 7:00-7:15 a.m.

The daily programs are called morning meditations, heavenly inspirations, and spiritual teachings. They are also broadcast from WVHI-FM.

The purpose of these six weekly radio programs is to teach and explain the Science. Philosophy, and Religion of Modern Spiritualism 30

as a wonderful way of life.

Lucille and Gil Burke record these six programs in their home studio. They then deliver them to the radio station ready to be aired.

One of the great blessings and benefits of this new venture is the wonderful attitude of spiritual friendliness and cooperation evident from the owners and staff of the station.

It is a real joy working with these wonderful people of this 24-hour station. This radio station has a coverage of 85 miles in all directions from Evansville. The signal reaches 63 counties in Southern Indiana, Western Kentucky and Southeastern Illinois. It has a potential listening audience of four million people. With an outside antenna, WVHI-FM, can be picked up even farther.

Letters from listeners as far as 90 miles away have been received.

Sometimes clear thinking and simplicity become muddled. And we take on more problems than a particular situation actually merits.
