

# Temporary Residents of Earth

Our time in the physical is limited like our residence on Earth. Too often we are concerned with the Now, instead of realizing that This temporary Earthly life is only the beginning. We have an eternity to grow, to achieve and to develop.

We are so concerned with our daily needs that we easily forget that we are preparing for a more spiritual way of life. We think of ourselves as human beings only, forgetting that we are truly spiritual beings who inhabit flesh bodies. We should always think first of the spiritual needs. Of course, we have to live as we are, but the spiritual should come first rather than last.

We think in brain-terms of national life and political emulations. We must think of daily life, but we can also think of spiritual facts and allow them to be spoken about ahead of all that the earth holds important. We should put spiritual thoughts first, even while we exhort our flesh-selves to greater successes. If nations really knew that the spiritual future is Truth, rather than only Faith or Belief, attitudes could be more factual than they are at present. We are unprepared for any future; we are content to live on this little planet, from day to day, without any thought of what we could be like when we leave our present bodies. We think too much of ourselves as PEOPLE rather than as SOULS.

Those of us who are Spiritualists know what is expected in the beyond, but there are many who follow blindly what other churches tell them. I realize some of the church people are very spiritual, in spite of their century-old words.

Funerals are still sad occasions, with mourners saying "Goodbye" to the one who has left Earth or been buried in its land. People weep by N. Cholmeley-Jones

because they are supposed to weep, and often it is because they are thinking of their own demise without knowing anything about it. Of course, suicide is wrong because it stops an earth-life before a Divine Plan is finished; and those who do end their flesh-lives expect OBLIVION but do not achieve it. Instead of sad processions and mourning, every thought should be for the one who has "passed on" for release from bodily ills and a new, firm understanding of purposes.

The Spiritualist Church tells of Spiritual living while here, and shows what is meant by purpose. Everyone should realize how important it is that everyone should understand that we should be thinking and what we should be accepting as tests of our mundane selves. Communication is only important for what it teaches. It is not important to hear from those who understand as little as they did on Earth. Only those who tell us about our Eternal Life, and all that we shall meet when we leave their bodies, after preparing for those future "days," are important to us. Those who ask for present facts are in the Kindergarten of Life and are not at all ready for eternal truths. Some are only concerned that those they love are alive! Why do not other churches teach what Spiritualism knows? Before Constantine, and the Council of Nicea in 325, the early Church was psychic, in that no leader could be chosen unless he was able to hear (Clairvoyant and

Clairaudiant) and see those who came to him from Beyond in order to tell his followers what was said to him. That Constantine and Paul both ritualized the Church was unfortunate, but the people demanded it.

May the Spiritualist Church assert itself now, as it is doing in many cases and in many places, and so lead people into a greater understanding of Truth which can only abolish WAR.

"God" is only with those who are spiritual, and there have been many names for the power of the universe. The spiritual universe is more important than the physical universe, and the planets have long ago been understood. Jesus said "In my Father's house are many mansions. If it were not so I would have told you," and he said "Ye shall know the Truth. And the Truth shall make you free." How seldom do we follow his own teachings! His "Miracles" and his death seem more important to his followers than all that he taught! As someone has said: "The world was inoculated with a mild form of Christianity, from which it has been practically immune ever since!"

Class Instructions In Healing

Saul into Paul: The initial Damascus three day period of mortal blindness opened the transformation process, but much time would elapse before the fullness of Saul into Paul was attained.

# THE PSYCHIC DEMONSTRATION: SPIRITUAL GIFT

... to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits, to another divers kinds of tongues... Corinthians 12:10

PHYSIC COMMENTARY: Spiritual Gifts! It took Paul to make the classification of Spiritual "gifts," no one else in teachings, biblically reported in the Old or in the New Testament, describe what might be considered spiritual gifts.

This excerpt from Corinthians speaks of three spiritual gifts included in the Pauline classification, and these three "psychic" talents are placed alongside of the other spiritual talents, being given the same recognition and the same origin, and the same purpose to them as are expected from all the other mentioned spiritual gifts. Paul recognized all the gifts as "diversities" of the Spirit. They originated from "the same God... worketh in all," their purpose was "given to every man to profit withal."

#### MAN, TWO BODIES:

There is a natural body and there is a spiritual body.

Corinthians 15:44

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: Paul - through his own psychic manifestations - postulates in concise language that every man has two bodies: a body of flesh and a spiritual body.

This spiritual body is within man during his earthly life, but its operative functioning is oftentimes perceivable in and during earth lifeand-living. In the psychic flight experience, it is not uncommon for sensitives to perceive these two bodies; oftentimes, at the physical death

scene of an individual the clairvoyant or psychically sensitive person perceives or feels the double or counterpart, that issues forth from the mortal shell.

It is my belief that it is this **spiritual** body (sometimes called the astral body, etheric body, psychic body) which is the common denominator between the so-called dead and the earth living. It is the "**spiritual**" body that permits psychic contact between individuals of the two worlds, for it is the body **COMMON** to both discarnate and incarnate individuals. It is through the activation of the super-normal sensory channels of the spiritual body that psychic gleanings can be gathered from those in the Beyond, and these gleanings, in turn, are processed or transposed into the material awareness of the earthly psychic sensitive, which are then voiced in ordinary manners of normal communication.

Paul, through his awareness of the spiritual body, enables a tentative comprehension of how psychic gleanings may be gathered.

PERSONAL PROOF:

Prove all things; hold fast to that which is good.

Thessalonians 5: 21

PSYCHIC COMMENTARY: Proof: Here is a valuable insight brought to the attention. Man should prove things to his self. Paul, in light of his words, does not hold "vicarious" knowing as the best kind of knowing -- it must be a "personal" knowing.

In the psychic sense of this instruction, each man should be to himself, as it were, a researcher, a prover to himself of his spiritual talents and psychic talents. There is no hint that this represents any offense to God, to the Supreme Laws of Truth, or that proving a principle to

# Spiritualism is different

Orthodox Christianity has regarded Spiritualism as something different and therefore worthy of opposition. The nature of this difference has been so little understood that it has often resulted in bigoted antagonism.

The Spiritualists assert that this difference is purely scientific and consequently has a substantial basis. For over one hundred years they have steadfastly asserted that in a nation purporting religious freedom, Spiritualism has a right to a place in the sun. In the past they have many times courageously defended this right in the face of religious persecution by bigoted clergymen or malevolent officials.

The time has come when Spiritualists, like other minority groups, feel that it is no longer necessary to fend for their constitutional rights and are entitled to have them without question or challenge. The rights of entitlement have been legally established but not predjudicially achieved.

Social and religious bigotry has not as of yet been wholly abolished because of ignorance and indifference to the truth by those individuals who are unwilling to inform themselves on what was once a forbidden subject. (Forbidden is an unfortunate connotation which has often been given to any religious concept that challenged or questioned a traditional orthodox idea.)

An individual's conscience plays more of a guiding role in Spiritualism than in any other religion.

A Spiritualist knows that there is no buying away his misdeeds by supplication, sacrament or any other human influence. He then is required to conduct his life in accordance with what is right, not because of decree, but for his own good.

Spiritualism is a different way of life because a Spiritualist's concept of himself is different. In his concept, man is primarily Spirit, first, last

and always. He does not change in nature at death, only in vibration. As with water, whether it is in the form of solid, liquid or vapor, the formula remains unchanged. Only the density and appearance undergoes a transformation. Likewise the formula for man is unchanged and remains as Spirit.

Spiritualism is different and unique in that it concerns the individual with the purpose of life and seeks scientific explanations for all of the mysteries of life. Where have we come from? Why are we here? Where are we going? What will happen?

Other religions reply to such questions by stating, "you are not supposed to know that." We were not supposed to know what was on the moon, but man has found out and is none the worse for it.

Spiritualism rejects as unscientific the concept that at death the human ego enters some mysterious existance of suspended animation and unconsciousness until the Hebrew tribal God Jehovah, who probably was an influential spirit, orders Gabriel to blow a horn. Then all of the dissolved hordes of past milleniums are to jump up out of the ground fully assembled to be judged by that one judiciary. Must an intelligent person believe this because it has been inferred from the Bible?

It is scientific to understand that nature decrees that the existence of matter continues regardless of whatever change it may make in apperance or association with other particles of matter.

Spiritualists are aware that the self consciousness of the individual is never lost and that the human ego survives the change called death. It retains form and density even though that density will be of a different degree than when in the physical body.

The physical body is not the spirit. The physical body is animated by the spirit. At death, the body is merely a residue, as are ashes of burned coal. The coal has gone on as invisible carbon dioxide and other gasses, which do not return to coal. Neither do the ashes return to coal. Likewise, as with elementary chemistry, corrupted flesh does not reform into a body. The physical body does not resurrect. The spirit goes on though invisible to the physical eye.

Spiritualism is different because it teaches that the entire cosmos functions under specific laws such as Natural Laws and that there is no force or power which can set aside any of these laws because they are wholly immutable. This concept is scientific.

Spiritualism contends that it is unscientific to imbue legendary individuals with powers to

suspend Natural Law. To accept it as factual merely because it is mentioned in the Bible is not

intellectual.

Spiritualism does however accept the fact that uncommon events in the art of healing do occur within the limits of Natural Law, even though they may have the impact of miracles. physical body can respond to the stimulus of spirit within certain limits of Natural Law, even when medication and surgery fail. Beyond these limits the body cannot respond.

Spiritualists know that nature does not reproduce the human organism without the union of the positive and negative principle as represented by male and female. Virgin birth is a myth which has been used to give mystical status to religious leaders since before the time

of Jesus.

Spiritualists are different in their evaluation of the Bible. They regard the Bible as a venerable treasure of religion. The Old Testament is a fine religious history of an ancient tribal people. It reveals the primitive life of the times and gives a biography of some of their remarkable leaders. The New Testament is a valuable legacy of a higher morality, as advocated by the divinely inspired man Jesus to advance the race of man spiritually. Spiritualists regard Jesus as having divine attributes but not as being a deity. When Peter called Jesus "The Christ of God," Jesus charged and commanded him to, "tell no man that thing," (Luke 9:20 & 21). Jesus obviously regarded the statement as untruthful and yet Christians deliberately disregard that command

Spiritualists reject idolatry of any kind including that of an individual or of the Bible. To regard the Bible as literally infallible is a form of idolatry. The Bible is variously inconsistant. It has been fallaciously translated from language to language, contemeliously edited by clergy of past centuries and improperly interpreted today.

Spiritualism is different in affirming that Nature is an ever continuing process and since man is a part of Nature he is governed by the same laws. Spiritualists know that the life of man goes ever onward without cease in the form of Spirit and refer to the process as Continuity of Life. Since man is Spirit to begin with there is no loss of awareness of identity during the transistion called death.

Spiritualism rejects the idea that you can be temporarily dead and return to life. It is con-

trary to every law of nature.

The Continuity of Life is proven through the condition called Mediumship, wherein a person having developed certain sensitivities can establish communication with the spirits of those who have passed through the transition called death. The methods of communication can vary according to a number of specific forms. A Particular medium may have developed one or more of them. They are generally classified in a broad sense as either mental or physical types of mediumship, it is possible at times to verify communications in a scientific manner.

The so-called dead have not lost interest in their families and friends. If they did they would not be worthy of being saved by Orthodox Christianity in the first place.

Orthodox Christianity does not accept these principles simply because it does not intend to put them to a test for fear of proving its own

antiquated theories wrong.

Spiritualism is different because it does not depend wholly upon an ancient book for its existence and teaching. Spiritualism would be just as self contained if the Bible had never existed even though the Bible supports mediumship and Spiritualism with equally as many incidents and passages as it does Orthodox Christianity, which can not exist without the Bible.

The reason Spiritualism is self contained without the need of man made books and stories is that Spiritualism is natural and can be personally experienced by any sincere person devoting both time and patience. There is no need for everyone to develop complete mediumship any more than it is essential to become a musician. Both require aptitude and application. Mediumship is not conferred. It is earned.

Spiritualists assert that anything in the nature of communication between two different dimensions as with spirit communication must be seriously respected and mediumship should be regarded as sacred. It is not to be flouted before doubters and assailants for amusement, as is often demanded.

Spiritualism is different because it teaches that the individual is totally responsible for himself. He is the master of his own destiny according to the degree of his conformance to the

Laws of Nature.

Spiritualism rejects the theory of original sin or any form of vindication of sin. Man commits his own sins and must inevitably reform in accord to his own will. He is his own savior. The goodwill of others can only inspire him to understand the necessity of reformation.

Spiritualism rejects the teaching of arbitrary limitations upon reformation. We teach that Natural Law permits reformation by any human soul by the chemistry of change. A change of thinking causes responses which bring about an alteration of conditions. This occurs without special dispensation of any kind specified by clergy.

Spiritualism is different because it gives recognition to Natural Laws as the laws of all existance. All other laws, doctrines, creeds and documents are creations of fallible man.

oneself is odious, sacrilegious, or profane. Proving a truth is recommended: Paul relied upon his psychic visions after he experienced them, listened to psychic instructions brought to him by angelic forces. Paul held to that which he proved "good" to his life and living ministry. Do likewise!

The subtleties of Spiritualism require a deep study. From a scientific standpoint there is chaff to be separated from the actual grain. If the investigator is unwilling to perform the necessary labor he will harvest less nutriment. The result will be riches lost. There is Nothing More Rewarding In All Life, Than To Know About The Certainty Of Continuous Life.

I submit to you a choice: What would you choose? To lie moldering in a grave for thousands of years waiting for a fellow to blow a horn, or to be vibrantly alive with greater awareness, perfect health and unlimited

freedom of action.

Orthodox religion does not acknowledge any greater freedom for the quiescent soul than they do to the moldering body. Theoretically it is lingering about the grave. Wouldn't you think the soul would get claustrophobia waiting for

ressurection day?

Would you not prefer to move about with the speed of thought as spirits are known to do? Spiritualism sets you free in all manner of ways.. What about those wasted centuries of waiting. It is not the nature of Divine Providence to be so profligate. All of that time can be used by the individual spirit for progression, gradually gaining untold wisdom in order to rise up higher in the heavenly world.

Spiritualism has far more to offer than any other religion, and, furthermore, it is the only religion that can prove what it has to offer. Spiritualism is not a theory, not a faith, nor a belief. Truth must be allowed to flow into your own mind from the World of Spirit with Infinite Intelligence, as the source of all that is good.

Spiritualism is highly rewarding here and now. Reconciliation comes with knowledge of the Law of Cause and Affect. Forwarned is to be forarmed. Amelioration of disease is a fact through spiritual healing. Loneliness is dispelled with the knowledge that we need never be alone when spirit is with us. Grief is controlled by knowledge that our loved ones live on in a better

condition.

Since man is inclined toward selfishness against nature, the greatest boon of all may be the aboliton of the fear of death. This is a fear that few reveal but that many possess. It is a

fear lurking deep in their very being.



A few years ago, Mother and I followed advice from Spirit (a trance reading) and lost a six-figure sum of money, which we have never recovered.

A few weeks ago, a very fine medium here gave financial advice over the radio which resulted in a loss of \$80,000 to the caller. She was removed from the air and we think a lawsuit is involved. Such a happening is detrimental, not only to the cause of Spiritualism, but also an embarrassment to her, for she is a dedicated worker - she does not belong to the National.

Taking these serious incidents into consideration, I feel the public ought to be cautioned against spiritual advice on business matters -- if the National could publish it.

I am enclosing an excerpt from the book by Professor W.L. Gladstone -- Spiritualism and a Guide to Mediumship -- which is excellent advice that I should like to pass around.

Excerpts from: SPIRITUALISM AND A GUIDE TO MEDIUMSHIP

by W.L. Gladstone

Spirit communication has not yet reached that stage in which mistakes are impossible: and besides, spirits are still human and consequently not infallible.

Many wise and enlightened spirits do not concern themselves about stocks, commerce or manufacturing. Probably they knew little about these things when here, and have no need for such knowledge in spirit land.

Bear in mind that a spirit is a human being, not of necessity better nor worse than yourself. When you remember that all sorts and conditions of people pass into spirit life, who are not transformed by death, but continue for a time at least, to be much the same sort of people that they were here, you will realize the unwisdom of self-surrender and unquestioning obedience to spirits who may seek to use you as their agent.



A small group of pioneer Spiritualists, with George William Way as medium, was granted a charter. After his ordination, Rev. Way served as Pastor from 1901 until his untimely passing to higher life in 1922. Under his leadership the present temple was built and dedicated in 1916. His desire for a Lyceum was fulfilled in January, 1913, and it grew into one of the largest Lyceums in the II.

in the United States.

# Life and All

The world is made up of a complex group of human beings; some are atheists, who assume that life of the individual is just the result of an accident; some are agnostics or doubters, who do not accept the opinions of others, but have failed to find any satisfactory cause for existence; and regular church goers who live a worthy life but who are content to accept the historical narratives in the Holy Books without seeking their deeper meanings and lessons.

Some matter-minded students become so absorbed in the studies of their material surroundings, that when something unknown comes before them, they look only for a material explanation. They wonder about creation of the celestial bodies and seek a material explanation, such as: that at one time all space was filled with primordial dust, and that gravity, an attraction of matter for matter, drew these dust particles together into masses, such as suns, earths and stars, which now make up the universe.

They ponder as to how life came into being in the material world and suggest that when the proper chemical substances came together under ideal conditions suitable for life, that primative life might come into being on this earth and possibly elsewhere, and that over infinite time, this primitive life might develop into existence as we know it.

I feel sorry for people who are satisfied to believe that life is just a chemical reaction and a lucky break of chance. Such an outlook proves that these people are waiting for an accidental flow of chemicals to do their thinking for them

and that they are not thinkers.

Because we are surrounded by material things, we should first give some thought to matter as a cause of life. A stone is matter and it has no life. It is unable to move by itself and is inert. To a boy, it is something to throw. To a builder it is an ingredient of building materials. The boy throws the stone, which travels through the air and finally falls to the ground, where it again lies inert. The stone is lifeless, and always was inert, even when moving through the air. The boy supplied the energy to set the stone in motion, and gravity caused the stone to fall, but neither of these forces are matter, although they controlled the movement of the stone which is matter. It should be noted here, that no matter how long the stone lies there, it cannot move without help, and it cannot grow by giving birth to additional matter.

We are seeking the meaning of life, because there must have been life before the existence of matter to create matter from non-existence. To start on the study of life, we can compare man, who is alive, with matter which has no life. Matter is inert and can do nothing of its own. Man is active, both physically and mentally, and man's mind controlls his physical activity. Therefore we should study mind. All that we know of ourselves and our surroundings, is told us by our minds, and the only activity possible to matter, is made possible by mind.

When you look at a stone you see the light reflected from the stone, this light is a form of energy from another source, which passes through your eyes, nerves and brain to your mind, and your mind creates a mental picture of the stone. Perhaps earlier you might have picked up the stone and other of your physical senses carried to your mind that the stone was heavy and hard. Your mind consolidated this information and created the mental picture, which was stored in your brain, which is a sort of filing cabinet, where your mind can look from time to time, when it wishes to remember some detail.

Man has lived in a material environment for thousands of years, and students of matter have accumulated many facts and theories about the physical and chemical make up of the human body, but all this knowledge is unfolded to man through the understanding of his mind.

Mind is an invisible (to human eyes), spiritual ability to think and have and create ideas. Alexander Graham Bell had an idea that he could talk a long distance over a wire. At that stage, his idea was a creation of mind, and later he used matter (copper wire) and energy (electric current) to carry a message to and through the ears and brain (both matter) to the

receiving mind.

Human mind can think and create mental pictures, dreams and ideas, which have substance to the creating mind, but which can not be visibly seen by a neighboring human mind. The human mental pictures do not have sufficient life energy to extend beyond the limit of the human mind creating them. Yet the human mind can contemplate the sun, a mass of energy 90,000,000 miles away. This visible energy must have been created and controlled by a SUPER MIND capable of creating such super energy or power. The deeper we think, the more we are aware that this SUPER MIND must be unlimited in every way. To distinguish between human and this SUPER MIND, we can refer to the SUPER MIND as DIVINE MIND.

This DIVINE MIND must always have existed because there was nothing else capable of creating or existing until it was created by this DIVINE MIND. Therefore DIVINE MIND was ALL, and human mind, man, must have been created by DIVINE MIND, ALL, and because nothing existed except ALL, out of the substance of part of ALL, better known today as GOD,

# He was one of the greatest pioneers ever:

His fame reached international acclaim. He was a man of ideals and action, whose fame grew to make him a legend within his own time. And this has always proved to be history's greatest tribute -- to acclaim a living man a legend. Even his written works continue to be legendary. Who has not read a book on the famous London detective Sherlock Holmes, or at least attended a play about this remarkable intellectual genius?

Born of Irish parents May 22, 1859, the child who would later be knighted as Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, was destined to spend his early years in Jesuit studies. He was born at Picardy Place, Edinburgh, Scotland. Arthur attended Jesuit schools for nine years. He was then transferred to Edinburgh University, where in 1881 he

received his degree in medicine.

One of the early characterizations about him which remained true throughout his life was written by Hesketh Pearson. He was cited as an individual filled with chivalry, pride, perseverance, who displayed a remarkable ability for stubborness and yet found time for good humor.

His father was the last of four sons, all Dublin born. They were James, Henry, Richard and Charles. All four seemed blessed with good and practical talents, and were destined to hold their

own in society.

James authored the Chronicles of England, and the Official Baronage of England. The second son, Henry, whose eye for detail brought him position and wealth, became an appraiser of old master pieces, and eventually assumed the post of manager of the National Gallery in Dublin. The talents of Richard's artistic hands were displayed through illustrations in the

Newcomes and one of England's most widely read publications Punch. The last born was Charles. He was the least prosperous, rising only to the position of government agent. His financial status and success in the business world was never an indication of his many and varied talents. Aside from his greatest love, painting, at which he spent many an evening hour, he was highly accomplished.

It was Charles, the fourth son, who, in time would meet and marry Mary Foley, the future mother of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. Her heritage dated back to the Plantagenets, an old and

established line.

Young Arthur's early childhood was typical of children raised under Jesuit teachings. He began school at seven. Later he attended Hodder, a Jesuit training school. And eventually it was off to Stonyhurst, a catholic camp. By sixteen, Arthur had achieved scholarly honors in the London Matric. He was a bright, intelligent and inquisitive youth who welcomed each new educational pursuit.

# Sir Arthur Conan Doyle



Although his schooling was directed along medical lines, it was five years after he attended a seminary in Feldkirch, Austria in 1876, that he opened his office in Southsea, England, to begin serving the public as an eye specialist. Patients were few from the community, and afforded Arthur a meager living. His specialty was proving to be anything but lucrative. This less than attractive status quo caused him to broaden his horizons through other talents. He turned to the pen. This new career began when he wrote "A Study in Scarlett," and gave life to the invincible character of Sherlock Holmes. Arthur modelled his "man" after Dr. Joseph Bell of the Edinburgh Infirmary. But to make the detective unique, he added a number of human weaknesses and idiosyncrasies, thus far surpassing the original model.

He sold this first book, but not without great effort. It seems that English publishers were lacking in foresight, unaware of the eventual fame this character would have internationally. The manuscript went for 25 pounds. At that time

the sum represented about \$125.

Arthur's writings reflected the influence of a number of men who also had gained fame through the pen. They included Sir Walter Scott, Charles Reade, MacCauley and Edgar Allen Poe.

He even wrote a romantic novel, "The White

Company."

The year 1894, was a memorable one for him. It was the occasion when he visited Rudyard Kipling in the U.S. Arthur toured (from Boston to Washington and New York to Chicago) giving forty readings of his works.

He played golf here when the game was virtually unknown. In 1894, he summered at Malaga and later journeyed to Davas where he introduced skiing to the Swiss. It quickly

became their favorite pastime.

Every major event from 1859 to 1930 occupied his attention as is evident in the precedence given in his stories.

In 1885, he married Louise Hawkins. About the same time his sister Annette died in Portugal. This marked the beginning of his belief in

Spiritualism.

One of his patients, General Drayson, an astronomer and mathematician, was the first to speak out of Arthur's interest in the subject. During a seance at the General's house, a dining room table rose in the air and demonstrated communication through raps. The table rappings spelled answered questions posed by members in the seance.

It was General Drayson's belief that ectoplasm (which surrounds a spirit) could actually be photographed. Another advocate, Sir Oliver Lodge, joined with him in sharing his interest in psychic phenomena. In 1905, Doyle received an L.L.D. from Edinburg University.

Lady Doyle passed away the morning of July 4, 1906. The following September 18, 1907, Arthur married Miss Jean Leckie in St. Margaret's

Church, Westminster.

He started his new lease of life by buying a home in Sussex to be near Jean's family.

By his first marriage he had two children, Kingsley and Mary. The second marriage produced three children, Dennis Percy Stewart Conan, Adrian Malcolm Leckie and Lena Jean.

In 1915, the International Psychic Gazette addressed the following question to a group of prominent men which included Sir Doyle. "What would you say in consolation to those in grief?"

Conan's reply was "I can say nothing worth

saying. Time is the only healer."

It was through Jean's best friend, Lily Loder, who shared the Doyle's home at Windlesham that Arthur's interest was really provoked into investigating occurrences by the psychic world. He claimed she received messages from her three brothers killed at Ypres, France, to his son Malcolm Leckie.

These messages convinced Doyle of her genuine ability. It is also the prime reason why he became an ardent Spiritualist. Among other gifts, she developed automatic writing, a gift which Jean and her children also shared.

Kingsley returned home from the war an invalid. The wounds he had received at Sommes, France, left him so weakened that he succumbed to influenza in 1918. Another death, February 1919, was that of Innes Doyle, Arthur's brother. He contracted pneumonia. The loss of these loved ones led Doyle on in his search for truth.

"The soul survives death," he claimed, "not as disembodied spirit, but in an etheric body which resembled the individual at the best period of one's earthly life. In this form the soul could return with the aid of a medium whose own personality left its body to make room for the visitor."

In London he opened a psychical bookshop with his daughter, Mary, and at the age of sixty, he gave up fiction and devoted himself exclusively to the cause of Spiritualism.

According to history, he appeared on the Public Platform in Great Britian, and Australia in 1930, America in 1922 and 1923 and in South Africa in 1928. His generous nature led him to deduct ravelling expenses but he contributed the

rest to the cause of Spiritualism.

A fighter from birth, he was attacked by scientists, Freethinkers, Catholics, Protestants, slavers and non-thinkers in his pursuit. In the month of March, 1930, an incident occurred which caused him to resign from the Society of Physical Research in England after a membership of thirty-six years. Earlier the society had refuted seances in Millesimo Castle, performed by an Italian Marquis medium.

On July first, Doyle reported to the Home secretary of England, M.J.R. Clyne, and made a speech urging the repeal of a law which punished mediums and their patrons with imprisonment.

It was his last act of justice.

After a trip to Copenhagen, he was taken to a hospital with a pain in his chest. He returned to Windlesham where he died on July 7, 1930 following an attack of angina.

A Memorial Service was conducted at London's Albert Hall and a burial service followed in the Rose Garden at Windlesham. His body was buried in the churchyard of All Saints at Minsted

in New Forest.

In his lifetime many notables favored him with their friendship. To name just a few, Villylmur Stefansson, Rudyard Kipling, William Burns of the U.S. Civil Service and from Allan Pinkerton's Detective Service Agency. He was knighted for his defense of the British cause in the Boer War in Africa.

His own epitaph is a simple tribute to the man.

"I have wrought my simple plan
If I gave one hour of joy
To the boy who's half a man
Or the man who's half a boy."



### "The Immortality of the Soul"

written by Sir Oliver Lodge

In reading this book, one must realize that the author was honored as a leader in the scientific world, and recognized as a schooled physicist. His accreditation as a psychologist was given equal recognition by England's Psychical Research Society.

Sir Oliver Lodge's opinions have long been respected by men from all levels of education. His continual zest for truth and firm explanation often led him into uncharted waters. In view of this, it is easy to understand why he took exception with Dr. M'Taggart's book, "Some Dogmas of Religion." Reading the book prompted him to write "The Immortality of the Soul."

He first challenges Dr. M'Taggart's statement that man is a soul. Then he deals with another question, "Is man immortal?" Sir Oliver Lodge points out that man is body and soul and that as an expression on this plane of existence he is not one without the other. In the book he expresses his belief that once the soul goes on to a higher expression of life, the body is no longer referred to as man. The body decays to the natural

elements of the universe while the soul goes on to new heights. Man, he says, is immortal, the soul definitely is immortal.

He explicitly points out the fallacy of the teaching of the Christian Church in regard to the ressurection. Scientifically, any attempt to believe that the same atoms of man (body and soul) will at some future date recollect and unite again constituting man as he once appeared, is

totally incorrect and unfortunate.

What is the soul? Sir Oliver Lodge declares the word, soul, is really ambiguous and includes the fact some refer to the 'mind' rather than soul and further clarifies that this expression is too narrow or exclusive for our understanding. In his words he defines the soul as "that controlling and guiding principle which is responsible for our personal expression and for the construction of the body under the restrictions of the physical condition and ancestry, and in its higher development it also includes feeling, intelligence and will and is the storehouse of mental experiences." The body is only an instrument or organ, and when it is destroyed the soul continues, for it is identical to the principle of life. Soul, then, is the link between Spirit and matter. How then does this relate to immortality?

Sir Oliver expresses the fact that everything in the universe is subject to change. Without death of the physical, the soul could not continue to elevate. It would be limited. It would be bound.

Immortality is the persistence of the essential and the real. We must attempt to understand that material is subordinate to the spiritual -- and, if the spiritual persists, it cannot be stationary, it must rise in the scale of existence. Actually, immortality is a special case of more of the general law of the Universe -- namely, that of all in the universe, nothing really perishes for once it is attained, it cannot be discarded. Man with his personality is one with the universe. To further explain this human personality of man he refers us to the book entitled "Human Personality" by F.W. Myers.

Sir Oliver further explains how the brain is the definite link between the physical and psychical. This is interesting. For it then can be understood why Andrew Jackson Davis so many years ago said "life ends when the brain ceases to function." It is wrong to believe death naturally stops a manifestation. And today science is now questioning "When is a man dead?" Is it when the brain ceases or the heart? We need only look back to our early pioneers for they gave us the

It is with this brain, this understanding that the function thereof and the great ether that we can realize there is a universal mind. This thought transference opens a new chapter in science called telepathy. Further, we know the method akin to telepathy is commonly called inspiration.

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
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#### The Immortality of the Soul, cont'd.

The medium is acted upon directly by the unintelligence oft times for purposes of writings, speeches, or relating to messages of necessity. Yet, we must understand that the difficulty encountered in this inter-communication is related usually to ourselves. We are responsible for our normal mundane affairs bearing too heavy a weight oft times preventing communication. Sir Oliver further points out that for man to suppose that he understands the universe is a demonstration of limited intelligence. Others remain confused for a period of time, but eventually enlightenment will come for we know the door is always open to expand our consciousness.
