

### Victims of "Death"

The strangeness of this title is not nearly so strange as how most of us view the end of this physical life. One of the best examples I can recall

appeared in the news recently.

"As Jack Cassidy's family remains in shock over this death (resulting) from a fire which gutted his Hollywood apartment, his friends report that his passing seems doubly tragic-coming when he had finally achieved a sense of inner peace. The 49-year old actor had been terribly bitter and depressed for a long time following his divorce from Shirley Jones. That down mood had finally passed and he recently claimed he had never been happier."

Would his friends have felt better if he had died while feeling better and depressed? No, of course not. And few of us would ever entertain thoughts of death about our friends, regardless of their mood. But if his passing had to come, then was it not better for him to have entered the next life with "inner peace"? Again, let's refer to a recent news item. Remember the depressing personal conditions surrounding the passing of Freddie Prinze, the rising star who lost control of the simplest things and sought relief from the mental agony through suicide. In Freddie's case, some of his friends might have concluded that he was "dead" anyway. But how can anyone who believes in life everlasting conceive that these conditions of remorse and mental depression are somehow erased and replaced with joy and well being simply because life has changed its form? The concept of life everlasting and the achievement of instant wonderment make for little or no sense, and lack all logical reasoning.

My husband is always saying, "You can't take it with you." No, not the material side of life. But every lesson learned, every facet of our mental makeup accompanies each of us at the time of transition. And that becomes either a burden or a joy, from which springs new growth and new

opportunity in a new life.

If we go in bitterness, unhappiness, or depression, it goes right along with us and we have to work ourselves out of it, just as we do here. If we go in inner peace, that goes with us also.

All religions teach eternal life. All members of these religions accept the teaching of eternal life-and discuss eternal life-and marvel over it. But, that does not necessarily mean these members believe in it. Do you know why? I have a few ideas.

One is that most religions put too many "conditions" on eternal life. If you are good-IF you go to church-IF you support your church- IF you tithe. Okay, you have done all these things, fine-you are hereby granted eternal life-to do what? Some believe you sit on Cloud Nine and there spend eternity-Lord have mercy, how boring. I have a Methodist friend who believes her son is a flower in God's garden. That sounds more boring than riding a cloud. . . . especially for a 15 year old boy. Others believe you sleep in darkness until Christ comes again and wakes everyone up. A good nap is refreshing, but since no one knows when the second coming is supposed to be, that could be an eternity in itself. Of course we musn't forget the eternal Hell if you haven't mended the ifs mentioned before. No wonder people don't really believe in "life" after death. I certainly would not call any of those conditions "life" after death. I certainly would not call any of those conditions"life". Death is perhaps the most feared happening, and I can see why.

I work with a woman whose husband died suddenly of a heart attack. Do you know that the only reason she can accept his death without worry over where he is and what is happening to him in the "great unknown" is because just hours before he died, he had been to church and had taken communion. Her exact words to me were "if a man was ready to die, he was". This is a great consolation to her. What if he had not gone to church that evening? What if he had not had communion? What if he had gone bowling or, horrors, upon horrors, what if he had had a beer? Wouldn't that have been disasterous? Yes! For her! Nothing would be different for him. But instead of being a well adjusted widow, which she is, and forging ahead in her life knowing he died in the good graces of God, she would be worried and miserable wondering what fate had befallen him.

Some friends of ours who are Catholic, have a daughter who married a Jew. They love their daughter and their son-in-law and their grandson, who are all fine upstanding individuals, but they are worried sick about them because they do not attend church. They fear for their daughter's future, her eternal future. They wouldn't tell us of their fears because, knowing we are Spiritualists, I'm sure they have the same (or worse) fears for us. Isn't it a shame to burn up good energy in worrying needlessly over this fine girl's future, and ours too for that matter, when they could be

putting that energy into something worthwhile?

A true Spiritualist does not fear death. A couple of years ago, my daughter, who is truly a Spiritualist, was in a very bad automobile accident. . . . . she tangled with a cement truck. As her car was flipping over, she said her only thought was "Oh, boy, now I'm going to get to see the Spirit World". Even when face to face with death, most people don't exactly look forward to it. A neighbor of ours, who I know is taught eternal life in his church says "You're a long time dead!" The way he says it, it somehow comes out as unpleasant -something to dread. Someone back in time said the only things that are certain are death and taxes. Taxes are constant, but so-called death is only once and since it is certain-I'm glad I'm a Spiritualist and can look forward to it without fear. Franklin Roosevelt said "There is nothing to fear but fear itself". Marie Curie said "Nothing in life is to be feared. It is only to be understood". Same thing-different words. That also applies to death-if it was understood, no one would fear it.

Have you ever known anyone who is ready to die? I don't mean someone with an incurable disease who wants to put an end to his and his family's suffering--and I don't mean people contemplating suicide. They are not ready for death either, they are just trying to escape. The answer is-no one is ready- why? Because everyone is busy doing something, and everyone has something he still wants to do-or wants to see-or wants to finish. If death waited for everyone to see everything, do everything, and finish everything, we would have to find another world to inhabit. Isn't that exactly what we have? There is no such thing as death! People are inhabiting another world and doing, and seeing, and finishing! It seems to be an impossible thing for people to accept as a reality, only as a fantasy. You've heard people say: "How sad, he never lived to see his grandchild." Why, we know he can spend more time with that grandchild now than he could have if he were still on the earth plane. He can help mold that child and protect him in a way he could never do here. How about "One more month and he would have received his masters degree in education". Do people think his education is wasted now? He still has it! Think how many more students he might impress now with his knowledge than he could teaching in just one college. Here is another-"He just retired a year ago-they had such wonderful plans to travel." This is a very common one and sad for the one remaining here. But remember that word eternity-it won't be too long before they are together and can pick up their plans and carry on-AND, they won't have to put up with gas

shortages, flight schedules, and traffic jams.

Here is a good one-"He was on the verge of a great discovery in cancer research." Do people really think that research stops? Don't they know that when that discovery is made, he will have been the key? When my husband and I were in Rochester, Minnesota, we took a tour through the Mayo Clinic. Our guide kept talking about the famous brothers Mayo, their accomplishments and their dreams. Several times she mentioned how they never lived to see their different projects and dreams come true. People in the group would shake their heads and tut, tut with their tongues. Jim and I would just look at each other in disbelief. Don't they know that those brothers had a hand in finishing those projects and completing those dreams? I know you have heard the same words about Walt Disney never seeing his great dream come true. Rubbish! Where do they think Walt Disney is, anyway? I'm willing to bet he leads that parade down Main Street every single day! Here are some more I know you've heard: "She always wanted a brand new car. Now she'll never know he bought one for her birthday." I'll bet, once again, that she sat in that new car and took a good big whiff of that "new car smell" she dreamed about. Here's another: "She had so much to live for-she had intelligence, personality, beauty-what a waste." What on earth do they think she did with it? - lose it? - or forget to take it along? Here is a sad one: "He was killed on his way to school and his mother had just spanked him." How many mothers are living in torture thinking that that spanking was the last thing that child knew? Horrors! Is it possible to convince these people that their child knows they are loved? Is with them? What a shame for people to waste their lives living in guilt.....for no reason. Can these people be consoled? Not too many of them can. This also happens to husbands and wives. Everyone is always doing something-or planning something-you can't depend on perfect conditions when you pass out of this body-and personally, I would not call doing nothing, or planning nothing, perfect. Most deaths are unexpected and while living on this earth plane there are going to be unpleasant moments. How else could you reprimand, punish or blow off steam. You can't live with someone, be it parents, spouse, or child, in perfect harmony at all times.

In this month's Reader's Digest, there is an article titled "Down a Dark Hall at 185 M.P.H." The very first paragraph reads: "The 24-hour race at LeMans is a monument to the idea that life goes on. It is a French national institution dating back more than half a century, with a quarter million

### The Fine Art of Listening

Listening is one of the greatest arts in the world. Nothing beckons friendship sooner than good listening by a new acquaintance. People feel drawn to someone who listens and shows interest in their ideas and comments. Loneliness often sidelines the chatterer. He is in love with his own voice, his own ideas, and interests, an outlook which isolates him from others. A wise man once said, "When I talk, I know what I am going to say, but when I listen I learn something new."

Man is endowed with speech, but speech should evidence reason. The ability to listen and respond favorably to another's viewpoint and ideas

is one way to grow and expand.

This art of listening is not confined to the physical ear. It is also the art of listening to that still, small voice within. We need to practice the art of listening. It truly is an art to recognize this voice and follow its instructions. Become adept in this art and take a giant step forward in your spiritual

progression.

This inner voice is your hot line to heaven. It can be your guidepost, your benefactor, your communication system to your higher self. When the line is fuzzy or indistinct, it's because you have not learned the fine art of listening. We are constantly interrupting the messages trying to come through with our chatter from the conscious mind. Chatter can be worthless energy, resentment against a wrong, debates on whether to clean the garage or take a nap, or frivolous thinking. If we stop to consider how often we actually use our mind for constructive thinking, the kind that stands scrutiny, we come up with an embarrassing small percentage of usage.

When we have a problem we pray for direction. The still, small voice speaks to us, but sometimes the answer is less than we had hoped, so we ignore it. We need to recognize and fully realize that all through our lifetime from the cradle to the grave we are living with two warring factors, the physical and spiritual bodies and their minds. There is the struggle for supremacy up to that very last breath when the soul is ready to leave the physical. The last battle is heard in the death rattle, but it is nothing more than the physical trying to retain, hold and keep captive the spiritual essence within.

We must accept the fact that life at its best is uncertain. We cannot predict with any certainty what tomorrow will bring, or even be sure of what the next moment might produce. God in His mercy gave us this hot line to guidance and protection. Even when we have little knowledge of this inner voice and help, it can work for us and guide us. Many listen to their ego. It is the fall from grace over and over again. It takes courage and know-how to cope with this resistance. It also takes character and strength. This is why it is so important to tune in to your inner guidance. It will never lead you down a blind alley. In the Bible we are told, "If you ask in prayer for a loaf of bread, God will not give you a stone." Egotistical pride more often than not hinders change, or keeps us from admitting we are wrong. We hang onto our idiosyncracies, faults and shortcomings as though they were virtues. It takes courage to face yourself and admit you need to change, and it takes even more daring and stick-to-it-ness to root out these faults and replace them with positive traits. Having the boldness to face yourself head on and admit your shortcomings is the first step in not only ridding yourself of these problems, but lets you enjoy greater freedom from stress and strain.

You can seek help by asking for guidance in everyday living with prayer therapy. You cannot change the world until you change yourself. If you do not like yourself or your world, then tune into your pipeline to heaven and listen for instructions. Be not afraid to follow those divine instructions. We all need human companionship, but we also need the companionship of spirit. Learn to enjoy this companionship through the fine art of listening. It may prove the measure of your listening power.

Quinn, Kelley, of Beverly Hills, California, passed into the higher expression of life, April 26th, 1978, at age 35 years, after a long illness.



Ethel Post Parrish was Hoosier born of Quaker parents. Her husband was Myron Post, president of Camp Chesterfield. Always beautifully dressed, she could easily have been a model.

Dr. Banks was the main control in her trumpet seances. As private trumpet was common at that time, I asked for an appointment and enjoyed excellent results. I wanted to hear from a brother of mine who had never communicated with me. Ethel said, "Think of him by name and we will try to get him here to talk to you."

I began to think of my brother's name as given to him at birth which has never been given through any medium. To my surprise a voice, at first weak, then normal said, "Happy, Happy." Happy was the nickname given to him at the Bedford, Indiana stone quarry where he worked during his years before an early death.

Ethel's work was outstanding as botha message medium and a materialization medium. Silverbelle, her child guide, materialized in a test seance for the PSYCHIC NEWS. Our clear photographs showed the build up. Silverbelle was at least four feet from

Ethel, who was plainly visible seated in the cabinet.

Mrs. Parrish was the founder of Camp Ephrata in Pennsylvania which is still in operation. She sat often for Psychic research societies. I visited with her on one such occasion in Los Angeles. The pictures of Silverbelle's materialization are very clear, separate and distinct. I liked them much better than those taken of Katie King. They show distance between her and Ethel and the formations of ectoplasm as the materializations took place. Mr. Parrish became her second husband.

Nellie Curry was married to Harvey Blair Curry. I remember her as a red head who like to play euchre.

Nellie was very good with names in her message demonstrations. Her phases of mediumship were trance, clairvoyance and clairaudience.

She was born in Covington, Kentucky and reared by a grandmother. She developed mediumship during World Was I while raising five children.

She especially liked to demonstrate mediumship for beginners and skeptics. She did work for Psychic Research societies and passed many of their special tests. She spent much time in St. Louis and later in Florida.

Nellie was probably called a full name test medium because of her demonstrations at Chesterfield and elsewhere. This phase of mediumship was much needed at the time.

### Creation

Part III of a continuing series
Taken from An Encyclopedia on the
Evidences or Masterpieses of Many Minds

Greation--The Bible does not talk to us like Plato, of the hyle, the mother of matter, the substance that has none of the properties of matter, yet is capable of receiving them all, of matter itself as something distinct from body; it does not speak to us in the language of Aristotle about the first motion, the first mover, and the first moved, not does it, after the more modern manner, have much to say of the first cause and the first causation, throwing all causality after it into the inferior

place, or burying it in a godless nature.

On the other hand, its high design is to impress us with the superior greatness of this latter outbuilding (Ephe. III: 9; Heb.XI: 3) as the peculiar work of the Logos, or Word, which gives form and life, and, in this sense, its higher or more real being, to this conceptionless first matter, or first force. This was the great work, if we may judge by the importance the Scripture attaches to it; this was pre-eminently the work of creation as carried on by the artistic Wisdom (Prov. VIII: 22-32), and to this well corresponds what is said (John I:3,4) according to the old patristic division and interpretation of the passage "that which was made (or originated) in Him was life" because life was in Him. It is easy to see what is prominent in the Bible. It is not God the first motion, or the first force, or the first cause, or even as the originator of force and matter, but God the Great Architect; this is the idea which the Scripture language aims to impress so as to make it a living and controlling power in the soul, giving life and value to the other ideas, and preventing them from becoming mere scientific abstractions, on the one hand, or dead naturalistic or pantheistic notions on the other. The abstract notion is ever assumed in the Bible as included in its creative representations, whilst it makes vivid the other and greater thought as the quickening power of all personal theistic conceptions.

Our Only Notion of Matter-The only notion we can form of matter in its lowest or primal entity is that of resistance in space, or the furnishing sensation to a supposed sentiency, without anything beyond it, either as form for the intellect, or as qualifying variety for the sense. The manner of putting this forth, we may not know, but that does not give it the higher rank. Taken as a fact, it is the lowest thing in the scale of the divine works, if we may be allowed to make any relative comparisons among them. It is simply an exercise of the divine strength. On the other hand, the giving form to matter, which is so clearly and sublimely revealed as the true creative stage, is the work of the Divine Wisdom, and might be supposed worthy of God, as an exercise of His Infinite Intelligence, even if it had no other than an artistic end.

The carrying these forms into the region of the moral, or the impressing moral designs upon them--in other words, building the world as the abode of life and the residence of moral and spiritual beings capable of witnessing and declaring the glory of the Creator--is the work of the Divine love.

In reversing this scale of dimities, the actually lower work comes to be regarded as the higher and the greater, merely because it is the more remote from us. Nothing but some such feeling as this could have led to the strong desire, in modern times, of finding here a revelation of the metaphysical, as though this alone were creation proper, or as though the Divine power and wisdom were not even more sublimely manifested in the creative evolution and formation of the physical. The painting is a much greater and higher creation than the canvas, even though the making of both were admitted as belonging to the same artist.

Prof. Tayler Lewis: Lange's Commentary of Genesis

What Happened After A Lapse of Time--"And the earth had become a waste and a void, and darkness was upon the face of the deep; and the Spirit of God was brooding upon the face of the water." After the undefined lapse of time from the first grand act of creation, the present verse describes the state of things on the land immediately antecedent to the creation of a new system of vegetable and animal life, and, in particular, of man, the intelligent inhabitant, for whom this fair scene was not to be fitted up and replenished.

Passing now from the subject to the verb in this sentence, we observe it is in the perfect state, and, therefore, denotes that the condition of confusion and emptiness was not in progress, but had run its course and become a settled thing, at least at the time of the next recorded event. If the verb had been absent in Hebrew, the sentence would have been still complete, and the meaning as

### Michael DE Nostradame: Future events were his to see

Nostradamus foresaw the downfall of Charles I of England and the rise of Cromwell. He prophesied that Cromwell would fall to Elizabeth I, the rejected one and said she "shall accede to the throne." Following her, he said, shall come the son of Mary Stuart, James I of England (VI of Scotland)—which today locks the two countries together.

Concerning Napoleon, Nostradamus noted, "The man with the short hair will assume absolute power for 14 years." Napoleon, born in Corsica, was fated to be emperor until his abdication in 1814. His escape from Elba, his landing near Nice were foretold, as well as his unhappy end on St.

Helena.

He described the submarine and the airplane. "Living fire and death hidden in globes will be loosed, horrible, terrible. By night forces will reduce the city to powder that is already on fire (incendiaries) will be favorable to the enemy." He saw war. "A leader of the Germans will extend his territory to Belgium and Bologne." Here Nostradamus alluded to the treaty of Hitler and Mussolini.

### What of the future (18 pt)

So successful was Nostradamus in cloaking his predictions of the future that only time can unravel what lies ahead. Much has been made of the one verse prepared for 1999. Many believe that Nostradamus saw this as the year for the coming of the anti-Christ, whose reign Nostradamus said

would last 27 years.

" The yellow race will overrun Europe and Paris will be destroyed by aerial attack." Those who place great credence on Nostradamus' works fear he foresaw this as "Armaggedon." Perhaps so, the stage in Africa is certainly being set with the introduction of the Soviets looking down the throat of the OPEC nations. But comfort also comes from Nostradamus whose mystical quatrains continue past the year 3,000.

Astrology alone could not have supplied the names written into his many quatrains. The personages he foresaw appeared and perhaps many more still to be counted appeared, but how?

The true question of his gifts may never be answered, for he did not regard himself as a prophet. And in his own words recorded for his son Cesar he holds that inspired revelation is "a participation of the Eternal Divinity." He suggests that his son eschew the study of future astrological signs, and that he avoid magic, as prohibited by the church and scripture. Nostradamus himself had burnt some books that taught the art of prophesying. complimes It's so has 15 uniters

### What of the man (18 pt)

Nostradamus stood of robust build, though undersize. He was sprightly and vigorous. His forehead was broad. His nose was straight and even; and his grey eyes shown with kindly expression. But, the man was capable of flashing fire. The initial impression was somewhat severe, though pleasant, enough that his humanity was evident through his seriousness.

Even with age his cheeks remained rosy. He had a long thick beard; and aside from bouts of arthritic gout in his latter years, his health was excellent. Reports passed on by his sons say that he had his senses up to the very last moment.

His wit was lively. And the man lacked not for quick comprehension, which no doubt carried over to his penetrating judgement. He had a sharp, retentive memory; he was tacitum, he thought much and spoke little unless the occasion called for a discourse of which he was ready and able.

He was easily provoked to anger, but on the other hand often patient. He seldom slept for more than four or five hours a night. His manner was cheerful, though it could easily turn bitter in jesting.

follows: "And the land was waste and void." With the verb present, therefore, it must denote something more. The verb (be) has here, we conceive, the meaning (become); and the import of the sentence is this: "And the land had become waste and void." This affords the presumption that the part at least of the surface of our globe which fell within the cognizance of primeval man, and first received the name of land, may not have been always a scene of desolation or a sea of turbid waters, but may have met with some catastrophe by which its order and fruitfulness had been marred or prevented.

### DEFINITION OF SPIRITUAL HEALING, ETC.

Adopted by N.S.A. (now N.S.A.C.) Convention, Rochester, N.Y. 1909

1. It is the sense of this convention that Spiritual Healing is a gift possessed by certain Spiritualist mediums, and that this gift is exercised by and through the direction and influence of excarnate spiritual beings for the relief, cure and healing of both mental and physical diseases of humankind; and that the results of spiritual healing are produced in several ways, to-wit:

(a) By the spiritual influences working through the body of the medium and thus infusing curative, stimulating and vitalizing fluids and energy into the

diseased parts of the patient's body.

(b) By the spiritual influences illuminating the brain of the healing medium and thereby intensifying the perception of the medium so that the cause, nature and seat of the disease in the patient become known to the medium.

(c) Through the application of absent treatments whereby spiritual beings combine their own healing forces with the magnetism and vitalizing energy of the medium and convey them to the patient who is distant from the medium and cause them to be absorbed by the system of the patient.

2. It is further the sense of this convention that Spiritual Healing is recognized by the New Testament Scriptures and that it has been and is now a tenet of the religion of Spiritualism and is practiced by and among Spiritualists in conformity with their religious belief and knowledge of the power of spiritual agencies.

3. It is further the sense of this convention that great care and caution should be exercised in determining whether an applicant for a Healer's Commission really possesses any of the phases of the gift of Spiritual Healing to a sufficient degree to warrant the issuance of a commission.

4. That no person to whom a Spiritual Healer's Commission may be issued shall advertise other than as a "Spiritual Healer," unless legally entitled to do so.

5. That is is further the sense of this convention that any statute or ordinance which tends to resist or forbid the exercise of Spiritual Healing is an invasion of the religious rights, privileges and guarantees contained in the Federal Constitution.






