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

EDITORIAL

SPIRITUALISM A RELIGION

Whether Spiritualism is a religion or not is a matter that has been much discussed, and the answer must be a matter of definitions of what constitutes religion, and this must be left for each to decide for himself.

There are many and diverse religious systems in the world, but Spiritualism is the basis of them all, the course from which all of them arise. As many learned men have said—there has been no entirely new religion since the beginning of the world.

Viewing religion in a broad sense, Spiritualism may be called the root religion from which all diversified systems spring, and thus it may be termed the only really universal religion. Though its offshoots may be dwarfed and misshapen, or abnormal growths, they may have primarily started as pure and healthy stocks, but on them were engrafted false and superstitious notions or inhuman dogmas, the offspring of fetishism, ignorance and priestly schemes to enchain and enslave the minds of men. From each of these engrafted falsities, rather than from the original natural truth have many judged and condemned religion to be wholly evil. Spiritualism is a natural religion, not a system of unnatural dogmas.

Spiritualism has its origin in the very foundations of the Universe, in the infinite realm of pure spiritual energy, whence all existence flows. Spiritualism teaches that we are spirits here and now, and that we are fashioning our character as spirits day by day as we pass along

our endless journey.

If there is that in Spiritualism which induces spiritual aspiration towards higher ideals of thought and life, and so tends to upliftment to higher planes of spirituality, it is, in so far a religion. In this sense Spiritualism embraces within itself the really essental principle of all religions, and is, in fact, the one and only universal religion. While its feet so to say, are planted on the firm foundation of science, its head is amid the starry heavens of ideal spiritual truths that call forth the soul's loving admiration, and aspiration, and this is religion in its highest and purest sense and expression.

As a religion, Spiritualism is the binding and rebinding of all, with the strong cords of loving attraction, drawing the heart to the pure spiritual ideals on which our vision rests.

It seems that this is the really valuable and most essential principle of Spiritualism. It is this that constitutes its flower and ripe fruitage—that gives its pure rich aroma that appeals to the spiritual senses of spirits in the flesh and in the higher spheres.

It is not a religion binding one to the corpes of old faiths and dogmas; it is a religion of endless living growth and progression in spiritual knowledge, expansion and attainment.

As we advance, our ideals advance, so that there is ever ahead of us, above and beyond us, ideals ever more fair and increasingly beautiful; thus it is and thus it ever will be.

Time will come when our highest present ideals will seem as the ideals of babyhood, as we look back on them, faint, dimly conceived, like unripe fruit, or the mere incipient buds of the beautiful flowers that are to be. In the Great Forever—the endless NOW—there is unlimited time to grow and expand—the limit of the spirit is only in itself, in its present, at any point in the duration of its being.

The essence of religion is the spiritual aspiration after the perfect. In the deep soul ex-

PSYCHIC PHENOMENA OR MEDIUMSHIP

When thinking or speaking of psychic phenomena most people have the idea that it is something extraordinary eerie, to be held at bay, produced by some super-human force. There is absolutely nothing supernatural about any psychic phenomena. Every phase of it is caused by the Natural Laws of God. Anyone who has some knowledge of science or physics know that what appears to be solid is

but the result of many degrees of vibrating molecular activity, corresponding to its electromagnetic wave field, either attracting or repelling. If your own physical body could be magnified sufficiently, it would look just like the night sky, which is composed of trillions of stars, solar systems, the Milky Way, et cetra; with space between every atom, proton, electron and molecule. Your body would appear to be anything but solid, just a lot of vibrating molecules. In order to understand psychic phenomena, it is necessary to understand the composition of our bodies, the earth, our solar system and interstellar space. A solar system or galaxy is as great a phenomena as mental telepathy or table tipping, and far more awesome.

All phases of psychic phenomena or mediumship are controlled by the Natural Law of vibration. Webster defines Vibration as a periodic motion of the particles of an elastic body or medium in alternately opposite directions from the point of equilibrium, a pulsing effect. Many years ago, a noted physicist and scientist, Sir William Crookes, of England, coined the term "Psychic Force" to describe the power used in psychic phenomena or mediumship, and said it operates somewhat in the same nature as electricity, being connected with the vital or nervous force of the individual, and it diminishes according to the amount of power used; this fact accounting for the fatigue and sometimes illness felt by the psychic or medium after demonstrating the phenomena.

There are people who believe psychic phenomena is produced only by a person's mentality and there are those who believe it is caused by discarnate entities, commonly called ghosts or apparitions. It is produced both ways. Through concentration of will, phenomena has been produced, such as in the case of the young man who bends nails and metals by directing his thought upon the object. Also, if I direct my thought into a person's aura, I will read their vibrations of my own volition. However, if I choose to attune to those who live in another dimension of life, the reading will be based on the impressions they impinge upon

my mentality.

Most people prefer to think all phenomena is of a psychic origin, produced by the mentality of the individual, not having any connection with what is called spirit communication, as ascribed to by most mediums. This is because they do not understand how such communication can take place when the physical body expires. The life force which activates the physical body is referred to as spirit, soul or mind. I will use the term spirit body or soul, for the sake of simplicity. When the physical body dies, the soul, which contains the mental consciousness, is released into another dimention of life, quite invisible to the average person. All memcry, ideas, emotions, thoughts, that which is of a mental nature, remains in the soul or spirit body. If this were not true, how else could those who have gone on before, recognize those who pass on years later, and vice versa. We're all familiar with this idea. Now, since the thought faculties are not destroyed, these can and do continue to express in another form, which is just as real to the spirit entity as was their earth body. It is with the mental thought body that psychics and mediums make contact. If mind to mind contact is posible among people on earth, why not with those in another dimension of life. Thought knows no barrier in time and space. Because the spirit of man is of a higher vibration, it appears invisible, yet quite real. Take for example, a rotary fan. If not in operation, its blades appear quite solid, but when put into motion, its vibratory rate increased, the blades become almost, if not completely, invisible, and you can see through them -yet you know they are solid opaque blades. And so it is, with the physical body and the spirit body. Another fitting example is watercomposed of hydrogen and oxygen, you can touch water, its real; boil it, and as steam it becomes invisible vapor in the atmosphere but still hydrogen and oxygen. All things follow this principle of existence. Never destroyed, just changed.

To understand how mental telepathy, ESP, or spirit communication works, we turn to science again, using the radio and television for examples. We do not hear the sound waves passing through the air from transmitter to station to radio or television set-nor do we see the picture images as they are transmitted from the original station to our radios and televisions. Yet, they are in the air, all around us,

but in order to see or hear, we must turn on our receiving set, and tune into the proper frequency. A psychic or medium does this very same thing. They tune into the mental images and thought impressions from another dimension or frequency of life, and if the instrument (psychic or medium) is in good physical condition and attuned accurately, the reception is excellent. We know what happens when a station has transmitting difficulties—no sound, or no picture—maybe static. This happens with psychic phenomena, and the demonstrator can't always be at fault for inaccuracies.

Psychic Phenomena is not something that can be understood or learned in an hour, a week, or even a year, and certainly not unfolded sufficiently in a short period. To say I am a well developed or unfolded medium would be a gross mis-statement. Unfoldment is an eternal process. True, some are born psychics, others unfold rapidly, others more slowly, still it is a

continuous process.

With such a brief resume, we now move to the explanation of some of the phases of psychic phenomena. It is divided into two phases: Mental and Physical. Mental mediumship is subjective to the mentality of the medium or psychic, and consists of Clairvoyance, Clairaudience, Clairsentience, Inspirational Writing and Speaking, Trance, Psychometry and Mental Healing. Sometimes these overlap each other.

Clairvoyance is divided into three phases and is called clear seeing or soul-seeing, this being the ability to see into another dimension of life with the spiritual eye or Third Eye. Objective Clairvoyance is the ability to see what is going on in other locations, to see forms build around other people, or visions, when the physical eyes are opened, yet no one else sees. X-Ray vision is the ability to see through opaque objects. Subjective or Impressionable Clairvoyance occurs within the mind of the medium; similar to thoughts. This occurs when the spirit entities are en rapport with the person, and through activating the thought processes, are able to impinge upon the mind thought pictures which can be interpreted or described. Clairsentience is another form of Impressional Clairvoyance; it is clear-sensing of the spirit entities, and a feeling of their personality, health conditions or physical structure, when they were embodied on earth.

Clairaudience is clear hearing with the spiritual ear of the soul, those who are in another dimension of life, being both objective, seeming to come from outside the ear, or subjective, being heard within the mind, as sound or as a

thought impression.

Inspirational Writing and Speaking-is when the manifesting entity is able to impinge upon the psychic or medium, ideas or basic thoughts to be woven into poems, books, lectures, even into art work.

Trance is divided into three phases. In Conscious Trance, the medium is conscious of all that transpires, although the will is inactive, the voice and bodily movements being controlled by the spirit operator. The medium has no control over the flow of words. In Semi-Trance, the condition of the medium is that of deeper control, a sort of dreamy consciousness of what is transpiring, and little is remembered later. Unconscious or Deep Trance—is when the spirit entity holds control over the entire physical and mental faculties of the medium and directs all actions and voice. Upon regaining consciousness, the medium remembers nothing.

Psychometry, is the ability to read the auric emanations of an object or of a surrounding area. It is called soul-measuring. All things are composed of energy, vibrating at different rates of speed, inter-blending with other vibrations, through the Law of Attractions. Auras, are the magnetic-force field surrounding a person, being a vibrating energy, and contains the life history of the soul, and since these vibrations are ever in motion, they extend outward to be absorbed to a degree by other objects and surroundings of the individual. A sensitive can make contact with such and by tuning in on the vibratory rate, give information about the owner, or persons connected with the area.

Physical Phenomena is called objective mediumship, taking place outside the physical body, and depending largely upon a superabundance of chemicals within the medium's body, chemicals that make up the substance called ectoplasm, which is needed to produce the physical manifestations. Ectoplasm is a whitish, sticky substance (looks like fog) that exudes from the body through any and all natural orifices and is said to be moldable under the will and concentration of the thought of the spirit operators. Light dissipates ectoplasm, therefore it is necessary to produce this type phenomena in darkness or a very dim red light.

Some phases of Physical Phenomena are Trumpet, Levitation, Materialization, Apports, and Healing.

Levitation is produced by spirit operators through the use of rods and masses of ectoplasm drawn from the body of the medium and through magnetic currents. There have been rare cases of levitation in light. Rev. Phelp, M.D. who experienced levitation in his home, explained that when the magnetism of a medium's body outweighed electricity, objects flew towards the person, and when the electricity outweighed the magnetism objects were repelled. He went on to explain Spirit Raps were produced by discharges of vital electricity from the medium's body. These are also caused by the altered rate of the entity's vibration which

causes the equivalent of an electrical short, hence an arcing or static condition producing

a cracking or rapping sound.

Trumpet, in which levitation is often used is mainly employed to amplify the spirit voices, and is used as a cabinet in which ectoplasm is gathered to mold vocal cords for the entities to use. Ectoplasmic rods extend from the trumpet to the medium's throat, and the spirit operators convert thought waves into sound vibrations, having drawn sound waves from the mediums vocal cords, by changing the physical vibratory force into a rate of psycho-electric pulsation.

Apportism occurs when an object is transported through another solid object, such as into a seance room. The rate of vibration is changed in order to draw it through the vortex. meaning whirlpool, of psychic force. It becomes invisible or dematerialized, as the vibratory rate is increased, making it possible for the atoms and molecules to move between the atoms and molecules of another solid object or wall, then its vibrations are decreased so that it becomes visible or materializes again. This is similiar to the action of the fan blades. A better example is that of an ice cube—melted to boiling point, becoming steam or vapor—invisible, then condensing again as rain, capable of being frozen as an ice cube.

Materialization can be divided into four phases: (1.) Transfiguration, in which, because of too little ectoplasm, only the face of the medium is covered to resemble the facial features of the manifesting spirit entity. (2.) Etherealization occurs when the vibrations are not slowed enough to appear dense or solid when attempting to produce a materialized form. There can be movement, but seldom sound. This is often termed "apparition". (3.) Impersonation is when the body of the medium is draped with ectoplasm to resemble the former earth body and the medium acts out former characteristics and mannerisms of the manifesting entity. (4.) Full Form Materialization—occurs when there is an abundance of ectoplasm to build a complete replica of the entity's former earth body, and the vibrations are sufficiently slowed to produce a dense, solid form. This replica is connected to the medium by a rod of ectoplasm, even when seen to move about and heard to speak. A cabinet is used to conserve the ectoplasm until a replica is molded, much as a dark room is needed for developing film. The spirit operators must know how to raise and lower the vibrations through act of will and concentration. The elements of vitality and magnetic auras drawn from the medium and sitters are necessary in the chemical processes for altering the vibratory rates.

I've placed **Healing** in a class all by itself, although there are mental and physical phases of it. While not really associated as psychic phenomena, it definitely is a form of medium-

ship. Mental healing is done through prayer, suggestion, and mental therapeutics, as employed by Christian Scientists, Unity, and many other forms of absent healing. Through the process of thought transferrence, the healer endeavors to change the vibratory rate of the patient's mentality, which in turn alters the chemistry in the body, thus bringing about results of a curative nature.

Physical Healing is the term used to denote "Laying on of hands" and is sub-divided into Magnetic and Spiritual Healing. In Magnetic healing, the chemicals of the healer are transmitted to the patient through the hands, in an effort to effect a cure. Because of the attracting ability of the aura—it is important that a magnetic healer be physically, mentally and morally clean, lest impurities be transmitted to the patient, who is in a weakened condition, already. Spiritual Healing is when, the spirit healers, those in the spirit side of life, move into the aura of the medium to transmit through the healer those curative forces needed by the patient, using the healer-medium, as a channel through which to direct the healing currents, much as a pipe is used to channel water to various places. It is said that the left hand is magnetic, and the right hand is healing; the right side of the brain is magnetic and the left side electrical. The best points of contact are the forehead and the nape of the neck, since the spinal cord is the best conductor of the healing current. Healers must be careful how they display their healing techniques lest they be accused of making immoral passes. A good healer does not really need to touch the body, as long as the hands are within the auric emanations of the patient. Spirit Healing occures when the spirit healer (entity) entrances the healer and does the healing, simply using the medium, as is used for other forms of trance work, and the spirit healer uses their own chemicals, not necessarily those of the medium.

THE CHEMISTRY OF THOUGHT

By Lena Barnes Jefts

In her book—THE CHEMISTRY OF THOUGHT—Lena Barnes Jefts tells us that every change of thought causes a change in

the physical body.

We all live under the mandates of Natural Law—the God law of the Universe—and Mental Science operates within this law. This is a scientific process of thought, both constructive and destructive, which is now coming into its own. Many scientists of today are striving to explore the mind and its possibilities.

With this in mind Sir Joseph Banks—Spirit teacher and Guide of Ethel Post-Parrish—has inspirationally given Mrs. Jefts twelve lectures for progress both physically and spiritually.

Here it is necessary to explain that man is an individualized soul, a spark of the great Over-Soul—God; that man is a triune being, activated by Spirit working through man's mind as it controls his physical body. And this material body is composed of atoms of almost a hundred known chemical elements, such as: iron, oxygen, hydrogen, sulphur, carbon, magnesium, etc., etc. ever operating through Natural Law. In every form of nature is a negative and positive force, writes Mrs. Jefts, and the law of Cause and Effect shows creative power in action.

Using the vital power of Mental Energy every day, every minute, we are morally responsible for how we think. Through constructive thought we overcome the negative, and attain material and spiritual progression. Self-control is a prerequisite for harmonious conditions. We must determine to use our own will-power to control our thoughts. And as Andrew Jackson Davis said, "Under all circumstances keep an even mind." Positive thinking of a normal mind means good physical condition with good digestion, whereas negative thinking brings distress, and even serious illness to the physical body at times.

In extreme anger or great fear a chemical change takes place in the blood upsetting normal bodily functions. Temporary paralysis of stomach and intestines may impede digestion, and even cause a fatal stroke. By such mental action an overabundance of adrenalen is generated by the adrenal glands, increasing muscular power sufficient to rescue the drowning person or to run beyond normal endurance. But when anger builds up adrenalen and it is not expended physically, the chemical change causes great physical harm. It can even bring on a heart attack. Today, Medical Doctors realize that constructive thinking strengthens the possibility of the patient's recovery, that the

power of the mind for helping is paramount.

Thought is the power behind all things. It is tangible energy. Individual thought is to the mind what the individual atom is to the body, and the strength of the mind, like the body, depends upon the health and vigor of its component parts. Therefore, choosing mental food is as necessary as proper selection of material sustenance.

The brain is not the mind. It is the instrument through which mind expresses thought. Nerves are the conductors of thought energy to all parts of the body, where molecular and chemical change is in constant action. Through the law of Attraction our vibrations of thought, passing out into the ether of space, contact others on the same constructive or negative thought vibration. These return to us augmented by all they have touched on passing through this ether—the conductor of light, heat, electricity, etc. In this manner all people contribute to conditions of the world. The sumtotal of all thinking makes it what it is today.

Infinite Intelligence is the God-Mind. Finite

Intelligence is the mind of man.

Man's mind functions through three parts or phases: conscious mind, subconscious mind, and superconscious mind. The conscious mind uses direct impulses from one or more of the five physical senses; subconscious mind stores all memories of the conscious mind, plus all inherited impetus transmitted from generation to generation from all original impulses imparted by the Primal Cause or God; superconscious mind selects the better, the higher experiences for the conscious mind to use or not as decided by the individual. The superconscious mind also develops the Spiritual qualities of the Ego or Real Self, and is the spirit link with the Spirit World for communication. In our spiritual evolution the superconscious mind has been man's source of illumination, and enlightenment, and inspiration.

Through desire and constructive thinking we can bring into reality our highest ideals and aspirations. Being a part of God, we, ourselves, create through the power of thought, and attain mental control through self-discipline. Because of this training we live more abundantly with wider understanding of the Fatherhood of God, and the Brotherhood of man. Through right thinking man achieves his best.

This study of Mental Science brings a message of freedom to all mankind. Even national problems—sociological, moral, ethical, and otherwise must find their analysis in mental culture, for each and every one of the great questions of the day has its origin in habits of thought. In time the philosophy of constructive thinking will form the basis for systems of education designed to benefit the human race.

Mind is made up of thought-elements, substance, atoms, cells, and mental electrons, to the extent that it is weak or strong according to the nature of the material used or the intensity of its vibratery energy.

tensity of its vibratory energy.

And composed of the same chemical elements, but in different ratio to each other, people may present dissimilar appearance. Never-the-less, they are all governed by the same Law with its many branches. Hence, Natural Law controls in the realm of mind as in the material state.

And where there is constructive thinking by people on the same vibration, there is a strong possibility for mental communication. This is telepathy. Although thousands of miles apart, people can pick up each others thoughts. Among the centers studying mental telepathy is the Psychical Research Foundation, Inc. at Durham, North Carolina, headed by the illustrious Dr. Joseph Banks Rhine.

In our own philosophic study in Spiritualism, however, we are more interested in the human mind picking up thought vibrations sent out by the mind of a person living on the spirit side of life, in the Spirit-world. The earth dweller is able to attune his superconscious faculties

to vibrations from the world beyond.

Mental telepathy through a psychic may be called mind-reading, however, never should it be confused with Clairvoyance through a Medium, sensitive to higher vibrations, receiving thoughts and mental pictures from the mind of a spirit person. When such communication is verified after investigation (being unknown by one receiving the evidence), this precludes any idea of mind-reading on the part of the Medium. The mental current between two minds receptive to each other is the line of communication for Telepathy.

Through the CHEMISTRY OF THOUGHT, mental science healing methods, from the time of an Egyptian Healer-Medium Rama, were traced by the author, Mrs. Jefts. Rama was psychically told by a spirit-person to use mistletoe berries to cure his people of a plague raging throughout his Country. Rama called this Spirit-Doctor, Aesculapius a genius of Medicine. In 1846 the American Medical Association was formed. Although its methods of healing are through medicine and surgery only, Medical Doctors today realize the value of Spiritual Healing, Osteopathy, Chiropractic, and Mental Science. For many years Spiritual Healing seemed a lost art, then Dr. Phineas Quimby rediscovered it, and called it a Science. Today we have our Spiritual Healing in Spiritualism, Christian Science, Divine Science, and Unity. Although each has its own method of treatment, the same law is called upon—the power of Mind over matter. While Christian Science forbids use of medicine or medical advice, Spiritualism contends there are times when medicine and even an operation are necessary to create harmony within the patient's body.

Spirit-Doctor Banks explained to Mrs. Jefts that there is no mystery about Spirit Healing. It is done along subconscious lines through physical nerve centers, and the sympathetic nervous system. It is like an electric current sent through the body from that great dynamo, the brain. This electrical, vital force vitalizes the diseased organ and sends an increased circulation of blood to it. Nature builds up bodies by means of the blood flowing through the arteries. Carrying liquid nourishment to every part of the body, it replenishes and restores. On its return journey to the heart, through the veins, the blood carries with it the poison and waste which are destroyed, burned up by the oxygen in the lungs to which the blood is exposed. Everyone should have knowledge of the physical body, its function, and its care. Speaking of the various glands: in man's earlier development the Pineal Gland was called the Third Eye, having cells similar to the retina of the eye, and so thought to be the Psychic eye; the Pituitary Gland seems to be the master Gland influencing the entire endocrine system of the Thyroid, Adrenal. Cortex, Gonads or sex glands, and the Thymus among others. This Pituitary Gland can even produce Giantism or Dwarfism.

Finally, says Mrs. Jefts, in pursuing Mental Science as a light along our pathway of experiences for soul-growth, we will become aware of something beyond and above this physical existence. We will realize the importance of attaining a higher selfhood using spiritual attributes lying dormant within the soul. It is this unfolded consciousness which can intelligently link itself with Superconsciousness. In this manner only can greater demonstration of psychic power be reached to prove the continuity of life, the existence of the Spirit-World, and communication with that world factual.

To the Officers, Trustees and Delegates of the Eighty First Convention of the National Spiritualist Association of Churches Assembled, Greetings:

It is indeed my pleasure to be with you in the great city of Los Angeles. My purpose this day is to give you an outline of the direction the Bureau of Lyceums is taking in an effort to provide an adequate training ground for our youth and interested adults.

First, some facts and figures: At the date of this report, I have mailed Report Forms to 47 Lyceums of whose existence I am aware. So far 24 of these forms have been completed and returned to my office.* In all fairness, I must admit that 10 of these contacted groups did not have sufficient time to complete and return their report blanks. I was not aware of these particular groups in time to mail their blanks to them until a very late date.

From the data acquired by these forms, it seems that we have 21 known active Lyceums and 1 Sunday School in the United States. We show a total of 60 teachers. This figure does not include assistant and substitute teachers. "Enrolled students number as follows: Primary 112, Juvenile 80, Junior 70, Adult 241; making an estimated total of 563 Lyceumists, with an average attendance of 443 per meeting.

The above figures are not very impressive, especially when we consider that according to the 1973 N.S.A.C. Yearbook, we have 164 chartered churches and 16 camp associations. I must repeat, however, that these figures are subject to increase upon receipt of the outstanding reports.

I must admit that I do not have an accurate record of letters written by myself between October 1972 and June 1973, but I can assure you they have been numerous. Since National Lyceum Conference in Lily Dale, New York, July 13, 14 and 15, 1973, I have written in excess of 250 pages. This includes letters, reports, and monthly articles for the Summit and Spotlight magazines. I have copies of this correspondence with me and I will be happy to let you peruse its contents upon request and selection of a mutually convenient time.

Among my activities during the preceding year, I visited Lyceums in Royal Oak, South Branch and Leslie, Michigan; Wheeling, West Virginia; Ashley, Ohio; and Fort Wayne, Indiana. I attended the National Lyceum Conference in Lily Dale, New York, and the Michigan Lyceum Retreat, in South Branch, Michigan. I conducted a teachers meeting in Fort Wayne, Indiana, while visiting there, and plans are being made to participate in a Regional Lyceum Rally in Fort Wayne on April 26, 27 and 28, 1974. This will cover a four and possibly five state area: Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio and Missouri. It must be emphasized that these teachers meetings are not designed to conflict with or operate in competition to the Annual Lyceum Conference. We intend these teachers meetings to give impetus to the Regional Rallys, which will in turn generate interest in the Conference. Our goal for the 1974 Conference is to have at least one, and hopefully more, representative from each Lyceum/Church/Camp/ Auxiliary, attend these meetings. Conference is a pleasant mixture of work and play and is an experience that can benefit all. I also addressed a group of students of Jackson Community College, Jackson, Michigan.

Work is underway to conduct more teachers meetings and regional rallys in the New York and Texas areas, as well as West Virginia and some of the other eastern and western states. Limited funds do not allow too much travel, and whereas the Bureau of Lyceums gained slightly over \$1,000 through offerings and donations and Founders Day and Conference Bazaar, during the last year, it is far short of the sum necessary to do a truly efficient job for the Lyceum movement and Spiritualism as a whole.

We are in the process of preparing a slide and flip chart presentation that can be used when meeting with the various groups throughout the country. We had hoped to have it ready for showing to the delegates of the 81st Convention of the N.S.A.C., but unfortunately, Ed Kilmer, the gentleman preparing it had an accident and suffered a broken leg and arm. I have traveled to Chicago to review the work that has been done as well as help to plan the final touches, and before too long it should be ready for viewing.

We are now the proud possessors of new

New lessons are constantly being prepared, and older ones updated to assure a sufficient flow of material into the hands of our teachers. We have committees working on teachers guides and others working in the area of related crafts to be presented to our younger members to help enlarge the limited attention

span of this age group.

We are instituting a monthly "Newsletter" that will be directed to interested Spiritualists, that will outline presently available teaching materials, and will serve to advise as new lessons are printed and ready for distribution and use. If you would like to receive this information please leave your name and address with any of the Lyceumists present, and we will get

you on the mailing list.

We are trying to set up a Lyceum Teachers/interested persons meeting while at convention to allow an interchange of ideas. Please take a moment to stop by the Lyceum Information Table. It has been prepared for you and is designed to give information pertaining to the Lyceum as well as an opportunity to look at and purchase some of the lessons we are using. Take time also to look at the posters and photograph album. Our youth are doing something, and would like you to be aware of it.

We are trying to do a job. Many thanks and sincere appreciation go out to the Lyceum Assistants, teachers, leaders and students throughout the country for being interested enough in their religion to want to take the time to study, learn and share their under-

standing with others.

Special mention must be made, at this time, of our Lyceum paper, the Spotlight, and its Editor, Mrs. Audra Cutlip. This is a fine publication and contains articles and lessons for all age groups. Avail yourselves of a copy and consider a yearly subscription. It will make an excellent addition to your supply of Spiritualist literature.

The Lyceum Department is not me. Norma Whiting is merely a small cog in a great wheel. Lyceum is for all Spiritualists, young and old alike and it is a mutual effort to help enflame the student in the glorious truths we teach and practice.

2. If there is not an active Lyceum group in your church, help to form one. It is an integral


part of our organization and religion.

Perhaps even frightening when you first perceive the canoe in which you have been drifting. "Not the way I wish to be, but the way I am is truth to me".* Call forth the first atom of spiritual courage, cling to it tightly and begin your inspection. Has your canoe become battered by the unkind thoughts and actions you have been sending forth, only to return to bruise the vehicle of your soul? How many wrong actions have weakened your oars of endeavor? Would you accept that canoe from a salesman, voluntarily, knowing it was meant to take you to the end of a long journey?

The soul was given you by God, it is perfect. Now, today, its expression through form, may be far from perfect; it may even be too fragile to withstand the rapids of life's experiences—or so you think when you first begin your inspection. Don't panic. You have called forth your first awareness of spiritual courage—remember there is more where that came from

and the supply is unlimited.

Let us imagine you have spotted a large hole near the waterline, the oars are weak, and the rapids of turmoil are surrounding you. The responsibility of repairing that hole is yours and yours alone. What to do? Why you call for help, of course. In vain, though, do you call "somebody, anybody, please come and fix my canoe". A prayer such as that will not be answered, but don't blame God because you didn't experience instant reformation! Look to yourself, bring forth your own second atom of spiritual courage and realize that hole was of your own doing and must be repaired the same way. So ask rather, for Peace to surround you and that the rapids of turmoil be stilled. You are not alone on that river of life. Others more aware are waiting for your call, and are willing and eager to help. Surround yourself with those who are in canoes strong and sturdy, piloted by right thought and right action. They will act as a buffer for as long as you need while you do your own repair work. That is a loaded statement! Their canoes around you can create a tiny pocket of still water as you courageously set about your repairs. The minute you allow

spiritual courage to become spiritual laziness, you will find your protection has left you and you are alone. So quickly recognize the reason for the greatest damage—a life of negative thinking. All things manifest through the thought processes. As wrong action, difficult experiences, follow wrong thought, so, inevitably, does right action follow right thought. The protective forces you have called upon may be from the physical as well as the spirit world. What good is your plea for help, for peace and protection, if you continue to surround yourself with companions who are also embroiled in turmoil and negative thinking? Use your spiritual courage to break away from those influences. The physical courage to say no, to close the door, to hang up the telephone will surely follow. Would you deliberately hold a canoe to a spot where a broken branch hits its side with each motion of the water? Then how much more important it is to remove yourself from the destructive vibratory influences surrounding your being! There are teachers on both sides of life, but it takes courage to listen and apply the lessons. Temporary patches will eventually become firm, seamless parts of the whole, only through constant endeavor. You have no right to expect your river of life to be without the rapids of difficult experience. No one floats gently down the stream of eternity. Remember, always, though, "peace, poise and power are your birthright".*

What is courage? I choose to call courage freedom from fear. In truth there is a sense of freedom when fear leaves—a freedom to relax, to be yourself, to be happy. Fear is a thought and emotion felt and expressed through mental function. That same thought and emotion expressed through the soul faculty is faith. Lest there be some confusion in the use of the two words function and faculty let me explain: "Functions are mental expressions, faculties are soul expressions. You will find in creation a duality known as balance and counter balance. This energy flows through us and according to whether it is flowing through the faculties or functions there it does create. We know that the faculties create the spiritual body and the functions form and deform the astral body. When the faculties are closed, the power of creation goes down to flow through the functions. Therefore we say fear and faith is one and the same. The fear of falling is but the faith in the law of gravity. If function is allowed to outweigh faculty, faith in the law of gravity is over-balanced and is known as an excessive fear of falling." *LL. It is not until the faculties and functions are brought into balance, will you have freedom from the thoughts and emotion of fear. It is that balance, that freedom, that I have chosen to call spiritual courage.

that canoe as though I was paralyzed, hardly daring to turn my head. The trip was a short one, and I must confess, not very enjoyable. Fear is a most expensive and destructive commodity to cling to, physically, mentally, and spiritually. Consider the ulcers that have developed through excessive fear and worry! Consider the cancer patients that are being

or else!" that I was literally petrefied. I sat in

Consider the cancer patients that are being helped at Travis Hospital by Dr. Simonton.** He is helping those patients to counterbalance their fears of their disease with faith in recovery through meditation. Consider for a moment the healing centers across the world. Those who have transferred their fears of their condition to a faith in the Great Unseen Healing Power are the ones who are being helped. Those who cling stubbornly to their disability, who magnify their problems by excessive thought forces. those who ignore the "and I will do my part" statement in the healing prayer will gain very little help. The healing process will become apparent only when the fear and negative thoughts are directed through the faculty of

faith and are manifested by spiritual courage.

I'd like to touch briefly on another example of fear-faith-spiritual courage and ask you to give some attention to the gradual thought processess that led you to the point of signing an application of membership to this church. As you travelled your path of investigation and study, how many times did you hesitate? How many times did you wonder "dare I go in spite of the way my family feels? What would the neighbors say if they knew? How will my children be treated by their peers? When did you begin to manifest spiritual courage by balancing those fears with faith? The answer is different for each of us. My own balance began when I was able to loosen my hold on the fear of death, the fear of hell and eternal damnation by putting my faith on our 8th Declaration of Principle. But that was only the beginning.

I would like to repeat the 7th Principle: We affirm the moral responsibility of the individual and that he makes his own happiness or unhappiness as he obeys or disobeys nature's physical and spiritual laws. That, my friends, takes spiritual courage, but isn't happiness a

THINGS WE SHOULD KNOW

A few weeks ago I listened to a talk, or more correctly, a series of talks by four spirit personalities, their ability to talk to us being made possible by the mediumship of the Rev. Grace Gause, who has been the channel for the group of Spirit teachers known as the Imperator Group for over thirty years in the San Francisco Peninsula area. Imperator and members of his group were responsible for the writing of the Rev. Stainton Moses' book "Spirit Teachings" about one hundred years ago, Stainton Moses being one of the most celebrated mediums of the last century. He has joined the Imperator Group since his passing into the Spirit World, as have Dr. James H. Hyslop. who started and was president of the James H. Hyslop Psychical Research Foundation, and was professor of logic at Columbia University in New York. They have talked to our group many times during the last ten years or so, with the help of the Rev. Grace Gause, as have Ernest Holmes, Florence Shinn, and a host of others.

These spirit friends were brought to us by Hilarian, one of the group, who said there would be four from his side talk to us instead of the usual one, and he hoped that these talks would give us considerable insight in the problems and life in the Spirit World.

The first one was a Chinese gentleman who had been in the Spirit World a long, long time.

His name is Ming Toy.

He spoke reverently of the old China, the China of his day, and told us of the changes, some good, some bad, which have taken place during the years, and how the Oriental reverence for their ancestors seems to pay off, as these ancestors hover around their dear ones on this plane, trying to help in every way to improve the conditions in China today.

Ming Toy told of an occasion when Mrs. Gause and two friends were in the so-called Mother Lode area, where during the gold rush time in the 1850's many coolie Chinese were imported from China and under slavery conditions were put to work in the gold mines, and whose bodies were disposed of in caves and

crude graves.

When Mrs. Gause and her friends were walking in an area near a cemetery, Ming Toy impressed Mrs. Gause with the fact that many of the Chinese workers had been dumped in a grave practically under their feet, and Mrs. Gause, with the help of Ming Toy, were able to release these men from their imprisonment in the psychic border-land, sending them back to China on a Spiritual flying carpet, as Ming Toy called it, making it possible for them to take their proper place in the Heaven World.

The next voice we heard was that of a lady,

and as a recording was made of the proceedings, her words as we heard them are as follows: "I cannot tell you who I am, as the work I was in still exists, and I would not like what I say become public. I had quite a following and was very popular at one time and was very proud of myself. And then came a time when I left them and came over to the other side. And when I arrived here on this side I expected the red carpet treatment and everyone appreciating my presence as they had on the earth plane.

When we arrive in the Spirit World we gravitate to the place or level of our conciousness, therefore I arrived amongst people who had been as egotistical as I, and I let them know who I was, and for a long time I never bent my head to any of them. In fact, I made myself the most objectionable person that one could be. And later on I began to wonder why they were so kind, so patient, and so considerate. In fact, it almost annoyed me. But later on I condescended to talk to one of the teachers. This teacher immediately began to tell me in no uncertain terms, although kindly, the mistakes I had been making. My egotism was shaken, but after a bit of thinking I began to realize what a pathetic thing I was."

She did get things straightened out after that, and Hilarian told us she was a wonderful

person and doing a wonderful work.

The next voice to greet us was that of a musician, a lady. This is what she had to say: "I came over a musician, a singer. I could sing, and could tell people all about music, and tell them how to sing. When I left the earth plane I landed in a most beautiful place. And as God does not waste anything, when they found out I could sing and teach music, I was immediately put to work doing just that, and I am having a wonderful time helping people to sing and being surrounded by the wonderful music we have over here. And I want to tell you, no one has ever been happier than I am. I have groups and groups of singers, and if you could only hear them singing their praises to God, you would be thrilled. And those who come and learn how to sing, they go out and teach. I am having a wonderful time over here, and am happy and contented. Oh, I work. On the earth plane I did not work as I work now, but it's worth it. I want you to know that life is so wonderful when you appreciate it. Do not take life for granted. There is nothing to be taken for granted. If God has given you a wonderful voice, or has given you the ability to do mathematics, be thankful for it and praise His name.

I'm so glad they let me talk to you, and I can tell you who I am. Do you want me to?" Then looking toward one of the group, she said, "Arthur, can you tell them who I am?" And the gentleman said, "I think you are my mother." And she said, "Yes, I am Arthur's mother.

(Editor's note.—The singer was Maude Hayter Hartley, a renowned concert singer in England during the late eighteen nineties, having sung at King Edward VII Coronation dinner in 1902. She passed at the advanced age of 94 some 14 years ago, and was the mother of the writer of this article.)

The next voice we heard was that of a man who landed in the psychic belt, as he called it.

These are his words:

"I came over here against my will. I didn't want to leave my home, and consequently I resisted everything and everybody, and you know where I landed? Yes, in the psychic belt. I was vicious and ugly, and didn't cooperate with anybody, or listen to those white-robed talkers, trying to tell me what to do. Oh! There are so many of them, trying to help and guide us out of the mess we were in. What thanks do they

get? None.

"Then one time I got so weary. Out of sheer weariness I listened. This was a woman. She was so sweet, and kind. She made an impression on me, and that was to her credit. Very few people made an impression on me, I can tell you. I wanted my wife, and she was on the earth plane. Then this lady in white explained the situation, and made me understand where I was, and what I was doing, and, incidentally, what I was doing to my wife. The need for some Spiritual understanding and awareness of the continuity of life is amply demonstrated by the ease in which the musician took her place in the Spirit World and was having a wonderful time doing what she had been doing all her life on this earth plane. She had been a member of the Rev. Florence Becker's Golden Gate Spiritualist Church for years, and her background and knowledge made her transition but a step from one room to another.

So the Spiritualists and other metaphysical groups who are informed, have a gargantuan task to radiate or broadcast this knowledge to as many people as possible. Making this and all copies of the Summit available to as many peo-
