

Spiritualism are not new subjects to the public. The two words go back many years to our forbears and to Europe. Almost every European nation has its legends and famous men who have witnessed apparitions which appeared at prophetic times in their lives.



Spiritualism in Scotland

One of the most interesting books written about the phenomena in Scotland is by H. V. Morton, author of *In Search of Scotland*. In the volume, he mentions a meeting with T. T. Linskill, Dean of the Guild of St. Andrews, the writer of *Ghost Stories*.

Mr. Linskill's gift for ghost stories may have been related to his escape from the disastrous Tay Bridge railroad accident in 1879. According to reports at the time, he was the only survivor out of a train load of other passengers who perished in the water below the bridge.

As a result of an interchange of ideas, Linskill narrated the extraordinary story of deceased Brother Plater, a monk, who took a fancy to a billiard marker and chatted with him while the man attended to his duties.

He asked the billiard marker to dig for his bones, where his untimely death had occurred. The monk as the story goes, sought a Christian burial. The Scottish marker was reluctant to dig, especially when he realized the request was being made by a deceased resident of the cemetery. Nevertheless, digging continued and the bones were discovered.

He wrapped Plater's bones in the garment of an Augustinian brother and as requested buried the remains. The marker, however, complained to Linskill afterward that from that date on, Plater made an absolute pest of himself. Finally the Scotsman fled to Australia to escape the spirit.

Another tale which caught Morton's attention was the tale of the Fairy Flag of Dunvegan Castle in Skye, for 100 years the home of the Macleod of

the Macleod. Incidentally, it is the oldest inhabited domicile of its kind in Scotland.

The castle is said to be surrounded on three sides by moats and on four sides by *spirits of the departed*. The history of Dunvegan is the center of attraction for the Western Isles.

Twice a week the castle opens its doors for those who wish to see the Fairy Flag, a fragment of cloth which is worn with age and looks like a yard of silk. It is housed under glass. Supposedly it's a Saracen banner reportedly wrestled from the Infidel during the Crusades.

The story is told by the caretaker of Dunvegan that when an heir to the Macleod of the Macleods was born, a nurse hurried from the tower where the child slept in order to attend the festivities. She was ordered to fetch the offspring to be exhibited to the clansmen in the big hall below. When she returned to the tower she found the baby enveloped in the Fairy Flag, which was far away in another part of the castle.

Almost instancously voices were heard chanting that this emblem would save the clan in dire need. It would be waved three times in case of emergency.

As it happened the flag was waved twice, first when the Macleods were attacked by the Macdonalds, who with a huge force at Waternish ransacked the church at Trumpan. The Macdonalds thinking themselves heavily outnumbered, lost heart and panicked; action which led to their being killed.

When the Flag waved a second time it signalled the end of a cattle plague. In addition to this, there was a legend that if the Flag was waved for an insignificant cause, a curse would fall on the Macleods. Legend has it this way:

- 1. "The heir would die."
- 2. "The Three Maidens (rocks at Dunvegan) would be sold to a Campbell and when a female fox gave birth to young in the turret the fame of the Macdonalds would depart the estate, and the land sold."

The Macdonald clan would also decrease according to this legend. Subsequently, in 1799 an agent of the Macleods named Buchanan took it upon himself to test the curse. After contacting an English blacksmith, he requested him to open the iron box where the flag was laid. Almost immediately came news that the heir was blown to

hits in the H.M.S. Charlotte.

The Maidens were sold to Engus Campbell of Esnay, and a tame fox, the pet of a Lieutenant Maclean, visiting in the castle gave birth to babies in the West Tower. Soon after, the Macleod fortunes dwindled. The next chief tried to recoup the family fortune but as of the date of the interview by Morton, only three Macleods remained, all less prosperous than their ancestors. Spirit prophecy or fate?

Mr. Morton attests the authenticity of the tale

through a native of Glasgow:

"Ye're wrang when ye say the flag will not be waved a thurr'd time. It will be. When the last Macleod dies, the flag will be waved for the thurr'd and last time and it will crumble and vanish awa".

Spiritualism in England

Among English authors who witnessed strange events and testified to spirit control was Percy Bysshe Shelley. In the *Fatal Gift of Beauty*, A. B. C. Whipple mentions that Shelley lived at the end of his life near the Bay of Lerici, Italy. On May 4, 1822, he almost capsized in his favorite launch the Ariel, with Captain Williams at the helm. By evening the moon came out and Shelley walked to and fro. He stopped suddenly and grabbed Williams by the arm. "There it is again," he said. "There".

He saw by the light of the moon, the spirit of Allegra, Byron's dead daughter, rising from the waves. Allegra had died at Bagnacavllo in a convent at the age of six. The following week more visions did Shelley see. When he was alone, he encountered an apparition which spoke to him, "How long do you intend to be contented?"

On Monday, July 1, he set sail for Leghorn in his Ariel, again with Williams and a new sailor, Charles Vivian. On Friday, a storm arose which kept the prudent on land. After six days and long waiting, two bodies were washed ashore, one Williams at Vareggio and the other, Shelley at Migliarino.

A third body of Charles Vivian was found, and burned at Lerici. Shelley was drowned in the Bay of Spezia but the body was burned and buried on the shores of Migliarino. Thus ended the life of one of the noblest poets of all time, and another story from Europe in which spirit apparently played a role.

In the words of Eileen Garret, "Spirit has no dimension. Spirit has no weight. Spirit always has been and always will be. It is that divine substance which is man. Even though we see it encased in a house of clay commonly called the body, spirit still exists as that part of God in man."

Spiritualism in Germany

History has left many references to Germans with second sight. Ludwig Von Beethoven once told Lily Yeats, sister of the poet, that his "music would be transmitted through the air to inaccessible places like light houses."

The Rhine and Its Castle authored by Monk Gibbon relates the legend of the Archbishop, Elector John Hugo who witnessed a strange vision in the Palace of Phillipsburg, Ebrenbeisten on the eve of Epiphany, 1701. The following story was told to his co-adjutor, Bishop Verhost.

While working on news dispatches from Vienna, "he suddenly stopped, took a candle and with a prayer book in his hand" stepped into the balcony of the church. He noted despite the lateness of the hour that the building was filled with people -- living and dead.

A funeral was in progress. Among those present were his sister, Eva, bridal flowers in hand. She had died at fifteen. With her was a brother with a myrtle wreath, a red bow concealing the wound which caused his death incurred in battle in Hungary 37 years before.

Another deceased sister, Frau Von Quadt, stood nearby a sister in the living who had dined with John Hugo the previous night.

As the elector watched, he saw a coffin lowered into a grave, the coat of arms broken and thrown into the vault as was the custom when the last of the lineage died.

Very much disturbed and darkness coming on, blocking out the scene, he returned to his bedroom.

Ten years later, the seventy-seven year old man passed away and his coat of arms was broken and cast into the grave exactly as he had witnessed it before. At this ceremony according to the story, a Herald proclaimed, "Orsbeck, no more an Orsbeck".

Religion and World Citizenship

Citizenship implies a native or inhabitant of a town or city who enjoys political rights. Should the term world citizenship be limited to a political or geographical unit? No. Not if the human race can rise to the concept of unity, regardless of creed, color or economic advantage, as based on universal truth.

World citizenship means world order. One cannot exist where the other is absent. And world order, necessitating the cooperation of nations and states within nations depends on joint solutions to material problems.

Leadership small in the eyes of its people can little hope to affect the destiny of nations. Housecleaning must come first. The elimination of slums, monopolies, cartels, tariffs, oppressive labor problems and resolution of land issues are concerns which cannot be ignored. All must be resolved. The ultimate achievement bespeaks global cooperation in all fields, political, economic, religious, scientific and artistic. At the very least, mankind must acknowledge the rights of others.

In order for religion to achieve and grow it must come to grips with a relatively new world dominated by science.

Science represents, to some degree, methodology in action and presents an approach rather than doctrinal theories. A static religion admits of no influence of science. However, dynamic religion functions under the laws which govern all things--the law of change, evolution and progress--is vibrant, elastic and expansive. Recognition is sure to be its just reward. At every period and stage of his evolutionary development man has evidenced some conception of God and a greater life. Through this acceptance has come an inspired intellect, understanding and the desire to look beyond the test tube to a first cause. That first cause has been called many names, identified in many tongues.

Public awareness of psychic phenomena has opened up a new universe. The psychic stream, that is, the interaction which has taken place twixt earth life and the spirit world lies at the root of every base for every religion. This stream has brought every religion into being since the time of primitive man. It has been the force which germinated and fertilized theology, mythology, and all aspects of religious belief.

Art, music and literature often go

unappreciated by many, yet that does not destroy their validity. Psychic phenomena offers the sense of eternal life--the quest of dreamers, saints, and the aged. It parts the shadows of fear and gives fruit, as acknowledged throughout history, to the need to prepare for the change in environment called death.

The findings of psychic research, while not yet formally accepted, have established definite inroads within the scientific community. Departments of parapsychology are a fact. Accredited degrees are offered in parapsychology at some of the most distinguished universities in the land. With this growing trend toward acceptance a new promise begins to emerge-one that suggests religious forms underscored with scientific findings.

If this new, though gradual change in religious conception is valid, orthodox Christians and others must shed the hold of miracles and don an authoritarian attitude befitting this Aquarian Age. The phenomena regarded as miracles are substantiated today for their validity is in evidence at seances to the same degree and capacity as of old. No one who experiences psychic demonstrations of varying kinds, can fail to appreciate that we live under physical laws in a universe of cosmic forces. Behind the whole universe is the operation of a great power. Life is a long evolving process of self realization. We grow into character through our experiences as life goes on progressively and creatively. Thus, we must see life through in terms of totality and wholeness.

The study of comparative religion is about 110 years old. Those whose minds are fettered by the chains of an infallible book or church cannot distinguish between the teachings of Jesus and the teachings of the church. Religions and churches will never be in any way vitally united until the last vestige of belief in the infallibility of the Bible has been removed from man's mind. In application, religion is more than a concept. It is subject to interpretation as is any book which has passed through many changes, deletions and times implying differing implications. The words of this book must be looked upon for their spiritual record and not word for word material proof.

Religion is needed for the making and shaping of a new world. We need to purge patriotism of its sinister elements. For the sake of our faith, the gulf between new knowledge and old beliefs must be closed through acceptance of the psychic stream of

new knowledge. The church today is making the same mistake in regard to psychic science that it made in the last century. Future research will disclose undreamed of possibilities, especially when judged in the light of past developments. Can we doubt the existence of a power that transcends what man is or ever will be?

Personal religion verses social issues needs revaluation. Emphasis on love in religion where God is conceived as an individual needs redefining, for love is a social value.

Justice, fear, honor, and reward are the main areas of emphasis in the Old Testament. In the New Testament love is the primary point illustrated. The concept of God needs to be re-interpreted and again made the center of life for all. God in one man's life expands man toward a sense of unity with all life. God is the symbol of the highest social value. God is also truth. To love God is to love truth and the search and struggle for truth.

Religion of thought has taken the place of religiosity. Concepts and definitions of God furnish us with a complete survey of our modern religious difficulties. One difficulty is to tie up life with

experience in learning of God. Religious concepts and systems of our times have not developed the religious experience. Instead, their combined weight have contributed to our religious philosophy.

Among the numerous concepts of God are the Absolute, the World Soul, the Spiritual. God should be placed outside the realm of philosophy. Religionists and non-religionists can agree here. God cannot be reached intellectually, for how can God be reasoned satisfactorily by the intellect of a lesser?

Religious essence is an achievement of man's inner self and cannot be superimposed by church or state. Religion is what we are rather than what we do. When man will recreate his God and make his life on earth in terms of the concept which he must fulfill to reach his highest destiny, he may then secure a kingdom on earth and brother of man through economic sanity, social justice, equality of opportunity, in freedom and liberty. We build today for tomorrow. Social security takes our first consideration for a new world order. What is infinitely more desirable is *spiritual security!*



Humanism, The Search for Truth

Perhaps to those few whose pursuits are unequalled, the pure absolutes of mastering the formation of matter from mental thought lie at the very core of this life consuming chase. For others content with understanding the mysteries of time and space the more intangible fragments of philosophy will suffice. Somewhere above all natural law is one supreme truth which ties all others together in a usable and understandable knot, weaving the bases of philosophy into the truth of life and the science of tomorrow.

From time to time particles of these even smaller fragments crop into view as the tried and tested pierced the straight and narrow avenues unmarked in a life and time all but ignored by the masses slayed with the daily struggle of placing bread on the table and keeping the bill collector from the door. No easy task lies ahead for the true seeker, much chaff has been placed in front of the discerning to protect and avoid the unworthy from gaining the simplest realities of why and how. Imposed creeds and dogmas which labor the mind add little if they cannot be substantiated through individual mental and spiritual view. Too often the golden calf has been formed on the mere scrap of a fraction of a fragment, which if held a moment longer would have revealed more than direction and skirted the now evidenced misinterpretation.

Lingering like desert gold mines, these packages of knowledge are adrift in the emptiness of the world of thought, set aloft by the very creator, who used law and order in the creation of the matter of the universe and living and breathing beings such as you and I. At some point in time the first great sphere of matter was molded into the first seeds capable of generating life of a sort.

In the days when one revelation from the heavens was enough to chart a new and different course for man's religious needs, that one pure insight carried man forward. To lesser beings come great truths, but such arrivals in no way impart the whole mystery, nor open absolutes to a stiffling audience. The fruit of a truth must be firmly rooted and complete in its definitive relationships, else all will collapse at the first serious test.

And how else could Spiritualism have stood the test of the past 100 years except without a foundation firmly based in relatable truths. The Fox sisters did more than open the door. They set a time lock on the flow of knowledge from the next dimension - a time lock which has held to this very day.

Despite the slashes of the past, Spiritualism has stood its test. Others not so fortunate have become quickly exhausted and found that a new name is not necessarily a better truth. For time immemorial the spirit world has been knocking at our door, attempting to awake the giant within. As you look through the scrap book of time you will uncover reference to Dr. Charles Francis Potter, a Unitarian parliamentarian and minister who resigned his pulpit in the Unitarian Church to start a new movement to teach what he termed, *The Religion of Humanism*.

The final philosophy adopted by this organization was so nearly akin to the philosophy taught by the National Spiritualist Association that one cannot fail to realize the pioneer work accomplished by the spirit world.

In Charles Potter's opening address he established the platform for this new religion and set forth its commandments of humanism. Remarkably enough, these commandments were simple and direct: "God," he said, "did not create the world. It evolved. The old teachings of heaven and hell were wrong. Right deeds bring satisfaction and wrong deeds their own retribution. Man's whole air should be to be, not to glorify God. Religion should be natural, instead of supernatural. Man inherently is a God, possessed of infinite possibilities."

At the time such comments and religious beliefs challenged the ruling opinion of his day.

For example, man was inherently evil and was cursed, according to the church.

A newspaper clipping written when Potter resigned the pulpit credited this to him: "There is truth in all religions and much truth outside of religions. No man can look to some other man or God for improvement, for improvement comes from within. Suffering is the natural result of the breaking of a law of right living, instead of being a manifestation of hell on earth.

"All religions up to the present time have been established upon the question of immortality. At the time that Spiritualism came into the world there was a mighty united effort of the men across the sea who were trying to demonstrate or discover whether immortality was a fact. The scientist of that day was seeking the soul of man in the body and because he failed utterly it was announced to the world that immortality was not a fact.

"The aspect of the world is changing. No longer are the people of the church satisfied with sermons on hell fire. You seldom hear one any more. No longer is the pew afraid of the pulpit, but

the pulpit is constantly wondering what the pew may be thinking and may do. The religious world is vitally alive. There is life in the theological world as well as the outside world.

"You have had, placed in your hands, the commandments that shall lead men, not to the end of human life, but to an understanding of spiritual life and onward into eternity. Human life but fades away into the glory of other days. Men have struggled through darkness and doubt. Men have wandered along the avenues of misunderstanding, their hearts have bled. Now they have been touched by the power of the most high. They have responded, and the light grows until at last the dawn of the glorious day has come. There comes from the other shore the message of life eternal that shall keep us while here, and it is leading from out of the past into the new. The sun is shining and it is only midday. But the great afternoon is calling us. Sunset shall follow. We see the breaking of the morning of the future, in which we shall live and by our religion pilot the way to the eternal soul divine.

Guides or Controls . . . Is There a Difference

The majority of Spiritualists lack a clear understanding of the difference of guides and controls. All too often one of the helping band is singled out and favored above all the rest. Occasionally, one entity is called on repeatedly, totally without regard to the band which works in the shadows. Times like these must try the very patience and souls of guides, teachers and the bossman, the control. To be by-passed is one thing, but openly ignored and not credited for deeds done is quite another!

During the writing career of Mr. Ernest W. Oaten, he penned valuable counsel on the roles of guides and controls:

"A good deal of confusion exists in the use of the terms, guides and controls. Around every medium there gathers during the course of his or her development a certain band of spirit people, some of whom may be interested in the individual as a person; others who are only interested in the mediumship and in the results which it can produce.

"The members of this band are more or less constant in their attachment to the medium. Some of them attend to matters of health; others, to the mental and psychic expansion; or stand for protection from interference by unworthy spirits; and last there are those who direct the flow of his mediumship.

"The duty of some guides seems to be that of carefully selecting the spirits who shall be allowed to communicate through the medium, or determine those who shall be described by him; and collect information which shall be evidential or helpful. Others, again, may be concerned with the philosophy and general teaching which shall be conveyed through him. But whatever their individual part, they all work under the guidance of a chief guide, which is usually selected by them, and very seldom appointed from above.

"The loyalty of the whole band to the selected chief depends upon the love and respect they have for him, and their confidence in his power and ability. Hence, will be seen the necessity of a *chief* who has been chosen *by the band*, rather than appointed by external authority. We all work willingly for those we love and respect.

"Such a band may run into large numbers, and must consist of individual spirits of many grades; for protection must be afforded from -- and assistance given to -- spirits of high and lower degree."

When I meet individuals who tell me that their guides come from the seventh sphere, I know that they have no knowledge of mediumship!

The building of a cathedral needs the assistance of the laborers who excavate the foundation; the cement-mixers and stone-dressers who prepare the materials, as well as the artists who carve the frescoes. It is only necessary that they work in harmony under the architect and conform to his plan.

Such seems to be the chief function of the guides, and they change but seldom. Often, however, in the course of early development, guides come and go until the mediumship becomes stable. This is so because the members of the band have to be tried out as to their suitability. One may be chosen and tried for a few weeks or months, and then discarded as unsuitable and another introduced.

That is the process of building a band, each member of whom is selected after trial of his suitability for a particular work.

Such selection, if wise, is made without reference to color, creed or nationality.

Once the band has been selected, changes are rare!

Now *controls* are a different matter. They are allowed to use the medium under the supervision of the guides, who must be satisfied as to their fitness and qualifications.

For example, Feda, the guide of Mrs. Leonard, while giving seances to investigators, may allow spirits of deceased relatives of the sitter to control her medium for the specific purpose of conveying information. If Feda is not satisfied as to the spirit's competence to take charge of her medium without harm, she collects and conveys the messages. Death does not grant immediate knowledge of physical control of a medium. It may be that some are ignorant of the processes of control. Perhaps Feda judges the spirit too aggressive and vigorous for the sensitive body of the medium. Perhaps the spirit is too excitable. Or, the spirit could be psychically incapable of blending with the medium's aura. If any of these ifs exist, Feda acts as a mediator, passing on the messages!

Or, again, a trance medium may be asked a specific question which none of the guides feels competent to answer. The chief guide will then

endeavor to find some knowledgeable spirit. The selected control takes possession -- does his job -- and may never be heard of again.

While a guide is more or less constant, a control is an occasional visitor. Such are controls. They are individuals introduced for specific work at specific times, and are not permanently connected with the work of that medium.

The upbuilding of a successful band of guides is one of the most complex pieces of human organization that I know. It generally works very smoothly, and the earthly observer sees only results.

The chief guide is seldom the one who is the chief communicator or who uses the medium

frequently. He or she is rarely heard or seen. He employs those with special abilities to do the work, but with his large outlook, wise judgment, and deep knowledge, remains satisfied to keep his hand on the machinery and ensure the results.

It will be gathered from the above that many permanent guides are seldom or never heard of by the circle. Their work is behind the scenes, in preparation -- the regulation of the supply of power; the collection of information; and anticipating the needs of the circle, plus much more.

Lucky is the medium who gains the friendship of their band. Their assistance is automatic, but friendships must be earned to be real!

You have correct information regarding this question. No doubt your public library carries books on the origin of this mythical place called hell.

An open heart is the primary requisite for spiritual development. Feelings of ill will are the death of your own spirit. How can you hate or dishonor any other life and not demean yourself?



The Law of Attraction

The inter-play between the spiritual and material in the name of the law of attraction goes beyond one's wildest dreams. In striving to put this law into operation it's important to understand what makes it tick!

Again, it would be foolish to think that anyone could cover such a vast law in one article.

"The law of attraction is one of the most important and fundamental laws, as it is the law by which not only the animate but inanimate structure of the universe is held in perfect union," as stated in the Advanced Course of Modern Spiritualism.

Atoms, both animate and inanimate, vibrate at the same rate. It is the law of affinity operating in the four kingdoms - mineral, vegetable, animal, and spiritual. Science does not yet openly acknowledge the spiritual kingdom, but psychic science does. In fact, some scientists claim the law of affinity is analogous to the law of gravity, and applies to physical objects only. Others admit candidly that there is more! Much more than mere physical facts.

Although man is conscious of the power of attraction and accepts it as a universal, though somewhat, mysterious force in nature which governs all things. Even the most able scientist is unable to adequately explain it. What information we have has come from scientists and philosophers who have attempted to find a common ground. One absolute fact that Spiritualists assert is that laws are avenues open to all for all time.

Everything is composed of atoms. The auric emanation from an object, due to its atomic weight determines the vibratory, magnetic power that attracts other objects to it. Directly, though not always evidentially, new forms and many unexpected events occur. Herein, is the proof of the reality of this law's constant activity. There is no cessation of this law. There is no such condition in the universe as inaction or stagnation, or what is commonly termed death.

Attraction and repulsion are equally important expressions of this law which governs all ascertainable phenomena, including psychic demonstrations. Repulsion may convey a wrong impelled by a thought, a person, or an object. Some idea of aversion or dislike immediately grips us and we find ourselves trying to evade what proved antagonistic toward the thought, or the person.

In studying personalities, we know by results that like attracts like. The affinity of the magnetism resulting from the atoms produces the auric emanation. By the same power certain atoms or bodies repel each other causing one to recede from the other. The thought that should be conveyed to the mind is one of the propelling atoms, according to their vibratory magnetism. To relieve the confusion which has arisen in the minds of students regarding the term repulsion - many writers and teachers of science substitute a phrase that is less confusing and call the law attraction and repulsion, or propulsion.

Nothing in this universe just happens. Through the law of attraction the great law of cause and effect is being satisfied. Man, through exercising use of the attributes of his mind, is capable of directing vibrations which make the contacts that lend assistance to this law of attraction.

A general knowledge of this law is important. Knowing, even in a meager way, how the law operates, man has grown more conscious, more careful of his thoughts and acts, in an effort to safeguard himself from attracting that which is harmful to him, and to the attainment of his ideal.

In unfolding mediumship, ever be conscious that the law of attraction is ceaselessly operating, and that you are attracting according to the life you live, and to the degree to which you exert conscientious effort.

Bucminster Fuller, architect and philosopher and 20th century visionary commenting on the universality of the principle of attraction has said: "I'm utterly convinced that we are all here for one another that every experience that everyone has is relevant. It all counts, the universe is so extraordinarily well-designed that it needs all those experiences."

Whatever one gives out in life will be given back. It may not return in the same way or shape or form as expected, but it will return, have no doubt.

Just as the needle of a compass tends to align itself with the earth's magnetic poles, so does the human mind align itself with the more powerful field of consciousness. In the case of a free magnet, the needle is drawn to move towards the object of attraction. In the case of the mind, if material desires are strong it will be attracted to similar objects and ideas. If on the other hand, spiritual ideas are predominant, it will be attracted to things of a spiritual nature. Only man himself can cease to

keep either positive or negative desires active by his intention, in the same way an electromagnet is kept active by the flow of current through its coil of one thing. We can be quite certain, as long as we think of choice as eternal to us and separate, we will be bound by "fate". But upon the realization that we can make our own destiny and that it is our own inner most choice that shapes our circumstances and the things which are attracted to us, we make available an ever increasing number of fields in life for ourselves and others to harvest.

As Albert Schweitzer wrote "No ray of sunlight is ever lost, but the green which awakens into existence needs time to sprout and it is not always granted the power to see the harvest. All work that is worth anything is done in faith."

The factors governing the law of attraction -faith, freedom, and fate are within our providence. How we utilize these factors can determine our ability to attract that mysterious and often elusive ingredient of life known as good luck! To explain in actuality what this really means, obtaining the elusive ingredient known as good luck in life, the simile of Gersham Scholem is most helpful and should be remembered as an important principle of the law of attraction. Scholem said, "...if the whole universe is an enormous complicated machine, then man is the machinist who keeps the wheels going by applying a few drops of oil here and there at the right time. The moral substance of man's actions supplies this oil, and his existence therefore becomes of extreme significance since it unfolds on a background of cosmic infinitude."

Ralph Waldo Trine said, "About the law of attraction that is the spirit of Infinite plenty, the power that has brought, that is continually bringing, all things into expression into material form. He who lives in the realization of his oneness with this infinite power becomes a magnet to attract to himself a continual supply of whatsoever things he desires.

If one holds himself in the thought of poverty, he will be poor and the chances are that he will remain so. If he holds himself, whatever present conditions may be, continually in the thought of prosperity, he sets into operation forces that will bring him into prosperous conditions. The law of attraction works unceasingly throughout the universe and the one great and never changing fact in connection with it, as we have found, *like attracts like*. If we are one with this great infinite power, this source of all things, then in the degree that we live in the realization of this oneness, in that degree do we actualize in ourselves a power that will bring to us an abundance of all things desirable.

Are you out of a job? Let the fear that you will not get another take hold of you, and the chances are that it will be a long time before you will get another, or the one that you do get may be a very poor one indeed. Whatever the circumstances, you must realize that you have within you and around you forces and powers that you can set into operation. Once put into operation, you will place a magnet that will draw you into position for the better.

Recognize, working in and through you, the same Infinite Power that creates and governs all things in the universe, the same Infinite Power that governs the endless systems of worlds in space. Send out your thought - thought is a force, and it has power of unknown proportions when rightly used, wisely directed. Send out your thought that the right situation or the right work will come to you at the right time in the right way, and that you recognize it when it comes. Hold to this thought, never allow it to weaken, and continually feed it with expectation. It'll occur just so!

The law of prosperity: When apparent adversity comes, do not be cast down by it, but make the best of it, and always look forward for better things, for conditions more prosperous. To hold yourself in this attitude of mind is to set into operation subtle, silent and irrestible forces that sooner or later will actualize in material form which may be merely an idea. Ideas have power.

This is but one of many instances in connection with the wise and effective use of the higher powers. It also carries a lesson. Don't fold your hands and expect to see things drop into your lap. Set things into operation. Do what your hands find to do, and do it well. The basis for attracting the best of all the world can give to you is to first surround, own, and live these things in mind, or what is falsely called imagination. All so-called imaginings are realities and forces of unseen element. When you are down, calmly and persistently see yourself as up. Do not envy other people who have riches as that envy is just so much capital stock taken from the bank account of mental force.

The majority of people in the world are looking for things that are practical and can be utilized in everyday life. The more carefully we examine the laws underlying the great truths we are considering, the more that we will find that they are not only eminently practical, but in a sense and in the deepest and truest sense, they are the only practical things there are.

As stated by Alfred Armand Montapert, "A person cannot become great and think small - neither can one remain small and think great.

Thought is the original source of all wealth, all success, all material gain, all great discoveries and inventions and all achievement. Good thoughts must be coupled with right methods if we would achieve desired results.

"All rewards in this life are for right thinking and acting. If we think right we will act right. No one can enjoy living unless he has a positive state of mind. How wonderful life is every day when we apply ourselves positively to the task at hand. Maintaining a positive attitude puts you in a position where you can overcome practically all of the negative things that come your way in life."

Look around you now. How can you give greater value for what you can get? How can you serve better? How can you make more money for your employers or save more for customers? Keep that thought ever in the foreground of your mind and you'll never need to worry about making more for yourself.

Oh! Oh! The 60's Are Back

The past tends to repeat itself often. High heels are in vogue again. This news is sure to make chiropractors a happy lot. Hem lines are due for a decided lift. This latest rise may be due more to the full length look necessitated by the long winters of the last two years, but, like the others, cycles repeat. So it is with trends in healing.

"Rise! and Carry Your Own Bed"

The magic and religious practices which saw the entry of spiritual healing in the field of medicine in 3,000 B.C. has been modified to fit the Aquarian Age. Everything has it's time and apparently, a cycle of operation.

Miraculous cures of the Christ focused attention on the laying-on-of-hands, and moved attention away from the more traditional temple pilgrimages of the time.

Today, what went before is receiving serious investigation along scientific lines. In time, perhaps, the mystical will be stripped away. Research has already shown that benefits, affecting psychosomatic illnesses and biological disorders, are possible. However, full accreditation is still lacking, as more data have been accumulated demonstrating the body's ability to alter changes in chemistry and seemingly, heal itself. This data, at present, outweighs the effects of *psi*.

Support of the scientific community is still long on the sluggish side. Yet, spiritual healing has triumphed for the church. In hopes of sparking a pronounced return to the spiritual, the clergy has found an ally in *psi* which renews faith and helps the body too.

The National Federation of Spiritual Healers in Great Britain has won the right to assist in the treatment of patients in the country's 1500 national hospitals. In America, gains have come slowly. The best advance to date rests with holistic healing. This is a far cry from *psi* or the more customary spiritual treatment, as it employs almost anything within the doctor's reach -- acupuncture, biofeedback training, herbal remedies, counseling, regular medical techniques and, of course, psychic healing. Nothing which might assist the patient to recover is by-passed in holistic health.

The controversy over the *ifs* of psychic surgery in the Philippines remains as fresh now as when the first group left tour bound for the country. However, it continues to prosper. The Cuna Indians of Panama's San Blas Islands practice the ancient arts of healing and will diagnose illnesses at a distance, through a substitute patient, a doll. Psychic healing is fairly commonplace in Brazil, despite a government ban a few years back.

The jury remains out on spiritual healing. Scientific approval rests on university tests in which some healers have managed to alter biological activity of enzymes and oxygen carrying hemoglobin. Something happens, that is admitted. But the missing what holds back the final stamp of approval.

Until the last thread of evidence is collected, collated and fed into a computer's memory bank, the *ifs and how* will strain the medical profession and haunt the clergy. However, since *The National Spiritualist* is an observer, it will continue to report each new part of the puzzle as it comes into focus.

Painless Chiropractics

Many specialities exist within the field of spiritual healing. And for each field many applicants vie for the title of *doctor*. One such is a St. Louis man, Spiritualist Rev. Ralph William Rector, lecturer, author and healing practitioner.

By trade, Rev. Rector is a pharmacist, specializing in homeopathy. He's been a student of naprapathy, chiropractic and naturopathy. Rev. Rector is president of Physical Institute, Inc., a St.Louis based firm which dispenses homeopathy prescriptions and provides psychic healing treatments to those who seek attention. Mr. Rector's shop is located at 7600 Broadway and is open three days a week. At 70, he's not in the business to get rich, at least, not at \$8 a visit. His prescriptions are merely suggested and offered along the same lines which you buy vitamins or patent medicines across the counter.

Rector promotes good health in his conversation and frequently cites old age as the loss of magnetic energy. The doctor's work is based on being able to restore, in the muscles, a certain amount of depleted energy. It sounds a little far out, especially when you experience no direct sensation as his hand passes over head. However, his patients say it works. What the *it* is Rector hasn't pin-pointed to his own satisfaction. He figures he's still learning, even at 70.

His most recent lectures were held in Las Vegas and Seattle, both before members of the medical profession. Medicine and the body represents an area about which he can talk fluently, at least to lesser mortals. Rector sounds like a cassette playing of Gray's Anatomy and the latest edition of the Pharmacist's Guide when he's giving treatments but he's willing to explain what it all means in relatively simple terms.

As for his spiritual awareness, he claims to be clairsentient. At times, though, he admits to having been awakened to hearing new techniques and instructions given for him to try.

The man's appearance is deceptive for one of 70, but not enough to attribute his vigorous health and younger looks to a mysterious ability.

Rev. Rector's specialty is strengthening muscles. His bone adjustments are made by strengthening the respective muscles which then pull displaced bones into place. He believes in convincing his patients, a bit unusual for a practioner. Before he *recharges* your energy level, he often insists on testing the muscle strength. This is one of the things your chiropractor would do at

the first visit. After a treatment, the process is repeated. When you can feel vertebra out of place, Rector will ask you to note the sensitivity and the bulge if any, before and after. In that way, he believes, you receive a psychological lift too.

Occasionally, patients speak of feeling something shift in the back or other area treated. That's all though, until the pain starts. And start it does within a few hours. The best comparison his patients give sounds like the aftermath of a severe series of adjustments by a chiropractor. The aches and sorenesses are there, but within a day or two all fades.

It's uncanny the way Rector works. He's not abrupt, and tries to answer every question. His magic isn't restricted to touch, magnetic passes or space, so it seems. On occasion, he treats while out of the patient's room. Put to the test he has purposefully thrown aligned bones out of place, then walked out of the room and willed them back. He doesn't say, "try me." He just likes to prove that his theories on magnetic energy can be duplicated again and again, whether he's present or not!



Andrew Jackson Davis


contact thus enabling him to write more than 30 books. One of his most memorable teachings was:

Breath of Life

Physical death and taxes, the only two things which are for sure. In the interim comes the breath of life - the magnetic power that develops, sustains and defends our body. It's the living force, always ready to spark new construction,



prepare a defense and rally bodily functions. This force is a part of every cell, part of the matrix of life.

It ascends with every breath and depreciates with every injury. Barring abuses, the force at birth is adequate to last till the last second. It might help to think of the body as a magnet. Take it and drop it and the force weakens, just as it did in experiments in elementary science classes. The magnetic power given at birth represents an investment which dissipates, although ever so slowly. Because of this gradual degradation the magnetic power within the body lasts through many abuses.

Look upon the body as a glove. Detrimental things done to the food, water and environment wear it faster. Additives which preserve, protect, color, flavor and simplify the processing of food weaken the defensive barrier. Synthetic fibers, in clothing or wigs, worn next to the body are another abuse. High heeled shoes, synthetic toiletries, fluorescent lights, fiberglass and asbestos insulation, smoke from cigarettes, engine exhausts, industrial gases and aggravated conditions of dust sweep more of this inherited magnetic power away. The effects of high power electric lines, generators, extremely loud sounds, whistles and television add to the toll and cause muscle imbalances, which in turn result in some of the bony structures of the body displaced. This alters the pressure on certain nerves. Pain and physical impairment follows. Chiropractors, Osteopaths and Naturopaths agree that these bony displacements cause much of the unhealthy conditions found in the body. However, what dissipates can be restored. There are several ways in which this can be accomplished.

Magnetic healers renew this life force, correcting the muscle imbalance, which re-aligns the bony structures. Vitamins, minerals, herbs and other treatments are at hand to help maintain this all important muscle balance.

Positive thoughts represent an extremely valuable renewing force available to all.

Tuning the ear to the sweet, loving sounds of nature is another way to regenerate dissipated magnetic power. The pleasant endless chatter of friendly animal life, bird calls, and running water help. Even the rushing sound of running water in the shower is beneficial.

Picturing beautiful scenes in the imagination work wonders. Think and walk straight. Stand proud. Take an occasional energy break by spending 15-20 minutes reading or reciting uplifting poetry.

Look to nature and soak in the beauty. If the beauty is as near as your backyard, visit it often. If not, tour an art gallery, pause at racks of post cards and place yourself, mentally, in the settings with which you identify most. Listen to music. However, avoid the harsh sounds of rock. The shock these sounds generate dissipates stored magnetic power.

Eat natural, unprocessed foods. Drink pure water. Distilled, purified and filtered water is fine. So is spring water.

Last of all, smile! It has more to do with picturing yourself in perfect health than you may imagine. In fact, believing is half the battle to good health.

When nerve pressure impairs the function or integrity of an area, the body loses some of its magnetic power and needs to be replenished. The healer who treats magnetically, accomplishes this by energizing the patient's body with a higher magnetic field, which, by the way surrounds you at all times. The energy and strength of this force are gifts from God. In this respect the magnetic healer fulfills the promise of Jesus when He said, "What I have done ye can do also."

Jesus practiced the *laying-on-of-hands*. His touch was healing. Those who touched his robe were healed, and His wonders to perform went out from His body and healed in the distance. At times Jesus employed natural elements in performing His wonders -- clay, saliva and water.

Magnetic healers utilize the magnetic forces of nature. They transfer this power, knowingly, or at the call of another, and restore the vital *life force*, the breath of life on which depends health.

Since the life force originates as a gift from God, it follows that the magnetic healer simply acts as a media through which God sends His life force to restore. The matrix which has its source within another renews from within.

Philosophy of Spiritualism and Christianity's Creed

Since the dawn of man's intelligence, mind power has unceasingly endeavored to create a code, or law-abiding way to accomplish good and eliminate evil, and clarify all man-made ideas in some definite plan or reason why we are living upon this mundane sphere. Down through medieval history a god has been looked upon by the people. Blind as this may appear it has led to a gradual enlightment over the years. And this is no small measure when centuries are compared. It seemed quite necessary, then as now, that there must be a belief in a creator, some holy divinity that rules and governs all living things; therefore, as there is evil on the earth plane, there also must be a devil. This contrast naturally brought the idea of a controversy between the two powers and its importance has grown ever since.

Immortality, the understanding that all life was eternal, had always been generally accepted, therefore with that idea in mind, it brought forth the need for a place to go to after physical death a heaven, if good, or a place of torment, if evil.

We read of Moses, a God ordained prophet, who under Spirit-guidance heard a voice, which he took to be the voice of God. It gave him the *Ten Commandments*, the laws of obedience to be given to the people; whereby they could live a good and righteous life. But in the records, years later, we learn that these commandments were simplified to two commandments by the Master Jesus, "Love one another" and "Love thy neighbor as thyself".

Jesus taught His people that love covered all *Ten Commandments*, whereas, Moses' teachings had served their purpose and been fulfilled. However, the beautiful philosophy this great master presented did not satisfy all of the people, and so-through this man-made creed, the Christian Church was founded. Later there were other churches, each with their own interpretation and religious belief, yet each applying this creed. The way of love that Jesus taught became chained to man-made ideas.

Between the lines of this creed the church has endeavored to teach a confined doctrine to force a way of belief upon masses of people who are beginning to question why their religion lacks logic. They are beginning to realize they are living in a changing world. Jesus taught, so plainly, "the truth will set you free"; yet we still find religion confined within a creed. Man is given to

understand that unless he believes the way of the church, he cannot hope for a righteous place in immortality.

Do we not have a promising understanding, as Spiritualists, for the privilege of searching for a way of life? Where we can prove all things in accordance with natural law and order? We have come to a spiritual realization that God speaks to man, through man.

We are aware that the universe is alive with sound. It is man's option to attune to these sounds. Man is an instrument capable of influencing those about him, for good or evil.

Spiritualists long ago concluded that any thinking, intelligent soul should be able to accurately sift fact from myths about the devil. Credit has built up since it was first created amid the dark ages. Everlasting hell is not part of our belief. Spiritualism removes all such mental practices as sheer ignorance and superstition, in the true understanding that such is only a state of consciousness--not a place of future existence. Evil spirits are a part of India Brahman's belief, but we have come to know that in natural law, "like attracts like". We should have no fear as long as we are not evil ourselves. Creed, Spiritualism teaches is replaced by "The Golden Rule".

When we love one another we shall hold no fear of breaking the Ten Commandments, as we strive to live to do good toward our neighbors. As Spiritualists, we learn that through a God law of love, if we make mistakes we can atone for them. Through suffering and repentance, we learn to progress spiritually. The door to reformation is never closed, only as long as we, ourselves, allow it to remain so; therefore, we need no creed other than the understanding that we alone must be our own master in the freedom and knowledge of worshipping God in Spirit and in truth. "For in Him we move, live and have our being," that we may enjoy the fruits of our Father's mansions and as we learn to unfold our spiritual gifts and potentialities, we shall become more in tune with His perpetual blessing.
