

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# Modern Spiritualism Celebrates 132nd Anniversary March 31st

Andrew Jackson Davis

For ages man has propounded the question of Job: "If a man die shall he live again?" From the beginning of time religions throughout the world, primitive and modern, Pagan and Christian have taught and spoken of the immortality of the soul and the life beyond the grave. Psychic phenomena and spiritual revelations have been

recorded by man from time immemorial, but scientific proof of the existence and personal identity of the individual was not established until after the rappings at Hydesville. It was on the 31st of March, 1848, that this divine revelation was given to humanity through the Fox Sisters. (And a child shall lead them.)

Modern Spiritualism did not come to man by mere chance. Its coming was predicted to the world by that great philosopher and seer, Andrew Jackson Davis. The prophetic power of Davis, also known as the Poughkeepsie Seer, can only be denied by the skeptic if he ignores the record. Before 1856, he prophesied the coming of the motor car and of the typewriter. He predicted the coming of Modern Spiritualism in 1847, according

to Doyle, but we have it on good authority that the following predictions were made by Davis in 1829 or 1830. "Mines of treasure will be discovered in the earth, and Floods of Spiritual Light will descend from Heaven." Both of these vast outpourings were where it was predicted to occur in the year 1848. The authenticity together with the date of this prophecy have been confirmed by numerous

communications from various Shaker Communities, and in further corroboration of its truth we call your attention to the fact that the discovery of gold in California and the emergence of Spiritualism through the Hydesville rappings occurred in 1847-1848.

Where due credit is given the Fox Sisters in establishing a code which brought about interworld communication and aroused the curiosity of material scientists to a degree where they deemed it necessary to investigate the phenomena of Spiritualism, and though many of them entered the seance room biased and with a preconceived idea of what they were going to find. The return of Spirit entities is now an established fact, scientifically proven by such men as Sir William

Crookes, Prof. Wallace, Oliver Lodge, Conan Doyle and many others too numerous to mention. It was Davis who played a major part in establishing Spiritualism as a philosophy and religion. A very interesting fact can be found among the personal notes of Davis, March 31, 1848, he wrote; "About daylight this morning a warm breathing passed over my face and I heard a voice, tender and strong, saying, Brother, the good work has begun - behold a living demonstration is born." Davis says he was left wondering what could be meant by such a message, but it was soon learned that it was the

millions in our own United States, whose numbers include authors, editors, doctors, lawyers, clergymen, college professors, judges, statesmen, traders, operatives and mechanics, in a word -- all gradations of rank and all classes of thought. Yes, through the beneficient action of the mighty though invisible hosts, who constitute the legions of the modern spiritual army, thousands of darkened minds have been snatched from hopeless belief in the horrible doctrine of annihilation. The crippled limbs have been made straight, the blinded eyes opened, the dull ears unstopped. The homes

# The Religion with the Greatest Reach

The scriptures tell us that God is Spirit.

The foundation of Spiritualism is as old as time. Yet we must always have dates where things began, and we must have our histories. So, we say that Modern Spiritualism began in 1848 with the rappings of the Hydesville manifestations. This is misleading because in 1846, Andrew Jackson Davis published and copyrighted Nature's Divine Revelation. That was two years before the Hydesville rappings.

The rappings of the Fox sisters, without taking any glory away from the girls, came in a long line of other rappings reported around the world. All due credit should be given to these girls though, as they were the first to systematize these strange sounds so that an intelligent communication could be established with those from the other side. And this is the cooperative effort which brought us our understanding of the phenomenal religion, philosophy and science of Spiritualism.

Spiritualism is not based upon what has in the past been given. If we cannot produce phenomena today, then we are no different from any other religion. The Christian religion had phenomena in its early days. It divorced it, and so when it comes to the scientific investigations you do not find Christianity listed in science. It is looked upon as a belief.

The press that we Spiritualists so often feel is slated against us is not the sore spot it may at first appear. Reports of psychic experiences and unexplained phenomena dot the news daily. All along, these articles of support have appeared.

I recently started to discard some old copies of magazines. Among the pile of rubble I happened to notice the January 1946 issue of *Reader's Digest*. Visit your library and look up the story of Lt. Commander Robert Rew and his ship, the U.S.S. Beagle.


"Examination confirmed not only the fact that the gear teeth in the steering machinery were jammed but also that the telemotor system was out of commission. It was physically impossible to cause the rudder to turn by turning the wheel on the bridge! But all through the most frightful night of our lives the ship was under control. None of us has been able to offer a rational explanation. There just isn't any. It's so incomprehensible that chills go up and down the back of my neck whenever think of it.

"I made an exhaustive investigation, hoping to get some explanation that would be rational. The investigation only corroborated all the circumstances. So there is nothing I can do except record the irreconcilable facts in as conservative a manner as possible. When the impossible happens, it deserves to be recorded, if only by inference, even if only in the log of one of the obscure ships of the United States Navy. Fortunately, nobody, in all probability ever will read the log of the U.S.S. Beagle, once it is filed away, and none of us will have to explain.

"But before dropping the subject, I would like to say that those of us who realize what happened are unutterably thankful. We owe our lives to this thing which couldn't happen but did."

The log was read and the article which appeared in the January issue of *Reader's Digest* was written from letters by the commander to his mother. The incident which sparked these letters and the entry in the navy log, occurred during a typhoon off Okinawa.

As I re-read the article I felt sure that man will always be presented with the unexplained, if he but has the eyes to see and the open-mindedness to admit the truth.

As Spiritualists, we should never be guilty of allowing newcomers to leave the church empty-handed. This is a tragic mistake that simply cannot be ignored.

We pray for greater attendance and membership in our churches and yet we do little or nothing about it. No newcomer should ever leave your church empty-handed! Give each newcomer a free National Spiritualist magazine and a handful of free Spiritualist literature. Have a rubber stamp made with the name and address of the church and on each piece of literature stamp this information.

By giving away all of the free Spiritualist literature that you can you are helping to answer your own prayers. Remember that there is a natural law that governs giving and receiving.



If you want to receive new memberships in your church, and have greater attendance, you must *first* harmonize with the law by giving.

As ye give, so shall ye receive.

### The Invisible

In the Bible we note one of the Master's great gifts demonstrated before the multitude. It was one of His great adventures into the great beyond. He believed that there was nothing hidden that



should not be revealed. But He realized that many times the revelation would not be understood. Therefore, He spoke in parables. He did not give death power to hide the departed, but He recalled the daughter of the ruler of the Synagogue. He recognized that in doing so it was His opportunity to strengthen the faith, in the power of God, not only of the parents and their household but of the assembled multitude.

When we read carefully His prayer at the tomb of Lazarus, as recorded in the 11th Chapter of St. John and meditate thereon, we will reach an understanding of His faith and of His technique as followed in the performance of most of His healing gifts.

"Then they took away the stone from the place where the dead was laid. And Jesus lifted up His eyes and said, 'Father I thank thee that thou hast heard me. And I know that thou hearest me always; but because of the people which stand by I said it, that they may believe that thou hast sent me.' And when he had thus spoken, He cried with a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come forth!' And he that was dead came forth, bound hand and foot with graveclothes; and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus said unto them, 'loose him and let him go'."

In reality, nothing had changed, but to human conception the fog of death had been beaten back.

Jesus found a world of men who had submerged themselves in the horrors of adverse beliefs, believing in sin and the reality of disease and poverty. They were like angels or Gods who had fallen into the black pits of ignorance and disease. Their rescue and deliverance could come only through the medium of His teachings. The Christ truth revealed the untruth of their false beliefs and established the truth of their divine selfhood. Jesus came to be known as a savior, a deliverer, because He brought to men a knowledge

of the truth of their relationship to God.

The *Master* believed in the God of things as they should be. He believed and taught that the Father had already accomplished everything. All that we needed was to become aware of the *Life Abundant* and it would manifest for us. God wants us to desire greatly, and His ideas for us are infinitely more important than our ideas for ourselves.

The daughter of the ruler of the synagogue, Lazarus and the Master, all preserved their identity after so-called death. Whether we take these episodes as history or parable, the point is emphasized that personality cannot be lost. It still exists and at some date communication will be perfected between the so-called dead and the living. The scientific discovery will lead to the obvious conclusion that there is no such thing as death. The past has been a nightmare from which we shall one day awake to a realization that those who have passed beyond our physical sight are still existing in a higher and more harmonious vibration.

The interesting feature of this lesson is that it reveals the Master's concept of a perfect world in which we live, move and have our being; a world maligned and misconstrued by the physical senses, but a universe where every demand of the individual is realized, and a universe to be drawn into utility by assuming its existence.

The Holy Ghost that points us to the truths of that invisible world is our own desire that rises unspoken from the needs of the individual. We must ever demand, argue, reason and think in favor of what we want to exercise in our lives. We should keep our mind concentrated on the great and splendid things which we would like to do, and to have; then, as the days go gliding by, we will find ourselves unconsciously seizing the opportunities that are required for the fulfillment of our desires. We become like that upon which our hearts are fixed; like that which we think about most earnestly and most frequently. Repetition builds within us a habit of thinking, which after a time, dominates all our other mental activities. We cannot want or desire that which does not exist in reality. The range of the operations of this faculty extends all the way from the completion of our simple physical needs to the fulfillment of our highest and deepest spiritual longings.

Men tell us that they do not pray because to them God is not real, but a truer statement generally would be that God is not real to them because they do not pray. Prayer is spiritual realization, through prayer we realize the richest blessings of God. Granted a belief that God is, the practice of prayer is necessary to make God not merely an idea held in the mind, but a presence recognized in the life, and a realization that God is the life of all that lives. We must learn to live in the world in which there are no external powers, and to think of the only power that exists at the very center of our being. This is the power of God.

All power is invisible. We see only its effects. The man who says, "I will believe only what I see," is doomed to imbecility. He cannot possibly know that the wind blows, for the wind is invisible. He can only see its effects and feel its influence.

#### God The Invisible Cause

Neither can air be seen but we know it is one of the most essential properties of life.

The man who forever deals with *Invisible Cause* soon realizes that knowledge of the invisible is the only power. Again the man who says, "I will believe only what I see," if he lives true to his statement, will be forced to doubt even his own existence.

Strictly speaking, no man ever saw himself. When he gazes in a mirror, what does he see? At best but a photograph of his outer appearance; any optometrist will tell him that the photograph depends upon the contour of the eye. He looks at his friends, at his wife and at his children and sees photographs of the bodies they inhabit; but never a glimpse of the real, the *Invisible Cause* that built and inhabits that body.

The body is the thought instrument of the mind, and no one has even seen his real body as it is in the sight of God, except through the mind. The character of the body depends upon the character of that which built it. The body of flesh and bones that the eye beholds is not the true body anymore than the heart of flesh is the true center of love. The body of Christ has a mystical significance for us. In truth, this body is our own ideal, mystical body that appears when our physical body is redeemed from adverse, and is spiritualized through spiritual truth.

In First Corinthians, 3:16-17 we find these words: "Know ye not that ye are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwelleth in you?

... for the temple of God is holy, which temple ye are."

The biblical statement that no man has seen God at any time, is not only true about God but true also about all living things. We pass along the road, we see the body of an animal that has become inanimate, killed by accident, we shall say. If the body is the animal, the animal is still there; an hour ago it would have scampered away at our approach, now it has no more power to move than the stone on which it lies. That Invisible something which caused it to move is not there, although it looks the same to all outward appearances. No scales can be adjusted delicately enough to detect any difference in weight a second before and a second after the so-called death. Men of science have been laboring for years trying to devise scales that will note the difference but none have been successful as yet in perfecting a mechanical device of 100% accuracy, as timing enters into the question of proof.

Thus a moment of earnest thought on the simplest subject will show us that our every day life is clothed with mystery.

In the very midst of things seemingly most solid we walk amidst shadows, and our fellowship is with the Invisible and the Eternal. As Carlyle so vividly and dramatically declared: "Sweep away the illusion of time; compress the three score years into three minutes; what else was He, what else are we! Are we not Spirits that are shaped into a body, into an appearance; and that (which fades) away again into air and invisibility! This is no metaphor, it is a simple scientific fact; we start out of nothingness, take figure, and are apparitions; round us as round the veriest specter if Eternity; and to Eternity minutes are as years are eons."

The human body and all material things seem very tangible and real, so much so that we call them matter. But matter is only a mistaken sense of things, an illusion, opposite of spirit and therefore all problems must be treated as mental. Matter will disappear as our human sense gives away to spiritual perception. The disappearance of matter does not mean that the foundation of the earth will slip away, nor will individuals disappear or lose their identity. It simply means that the heavy, cumbered suffering sense of ourselves will give place to the free, bouyant, spiritual sense of God. Because the formations we see around us are not solid matter, but are creations of thought, we have dominion over all of our so-called problems. By handling them as mental creations, we make all adjustments within our own consciousness. Truth presents the facts to the individual, arousing him to the true situation of affairs, despite the evidence of the senses.

Jesus Christ looked at all experiences through the eyes of reality, by His correct view, or spiritual sense, He was able to heal diseases and raise the dead.

All who would reap lasting results from spiritual meditation must enter into this realm of thought. If we live on the surface and accept the appearance for the fact, we will ever be mocked by delusions. Materiality will weigh us down and imprison us. We will attribute power to that which has no power, and worship the creature rather than the Creator. The tendency even among men of science is to do this very thing. We stand in awe before the many products of man's thought without thinking of the mind itself that is greater than any of its products.

How wonderful is the wireless transmitter, sending vibrations through space that can be recorded accurately at the receiving station thousands of miles distant. No man can see the vibratory motion, and yet there before our eyes is proof positive that information has been sent and received. The dreamer's dream of yesterday is the accomplished fact of today.

Man is a radio. Does mind answer to mind in the same mysterious manner? Can we not actually tune our minds that we may receive only the constructive and uplifting thoughts from every source? Are not these influences around us coming from invisible sources? Can we not become influencing spirits while in the flesh?

We cannot think destructive thoughts, act mean and selfish toward our fellow man, and not record their poison vibrations and devastating influences in our own cells and blood stream. We cannot hate in private and pretend to love in public and still vibrate in harmony with health and happiness, and the more abundant life. When we radiate thoughts of good will and health, benevolence and love, we open every cell in our body to a more abundant inflowing of divine life and light. It is with this phase that we are concerned. The opening of the mind to the possibility of these things is the day of days in human experience. The boundaries of matter disappear, when omnipotence and omnipresence is realized. No longer do we depend on things seen for support. We are aware of invisible guidance. Matter becomes our obedient servant and the bodies we inhabit, palaces of delight. We become Invisible Helpers to all constructive thought and all harmonious action. The laws of nature befriend us. Then, to think is to act; and simply to wait expectantly is to receive abundantly.

Was it not of this of which Ralph Waldo Emerson spoke when he said: 'He who finds God a sweet enveloping thought never counts his company." For what, after all, is God but the intelligent principle of all harmonious action? In the past, God has been portrayed as an austere monarch, sitting outside the universe, who must be served with fear and trembling bodies; some have even portrayed God as the great Servitor.

Our modern mystic, Cannon Wilberforce, has pointed out that God has actually laid down His life for us in nature; while Emerson declared, "As a child rests upon the bosom of its mother, so does man rest on the bosom of God"; Jesus realized this when He said: "It is not I but the Father who doeth the work."

No human words can explain the fullness of joy of the experience of the indwelling and overshadowing presence. The Psalmist has said: "In thy presence is fullness of joy." -Psalms 16:11

Just as man lives in every part of his body so does God live in every part of His universe, and man is but a cell in the great cosmos of God. Paul saw this and declared: "In Him we live, move and have our being." When we consciously live in this thought we realize that "all power is given to the son." There is no fear of lack or failure. There is an abiding intimacy, as between the air and the lungs. God is no longer just a name on our lips but an abiding presence, and we can as the poet says:

"Speak to Him for He hears, And Spirit with Spirit can meet, Closer is He than breathing, And nearer than hands and feet."

As the sands of time are running out of the hour glass of 1979, I pen these words. It is well to try to take spiritual



inventory of the efforts of the past, and the unsolved problems we carry over into a new year, yes a new decade.

It is very early in the morning between 3 and 4 a.m., when I am so often wakened, to enter meditation and prayer during the best stillness of the world - to commune with the higher dimensions of Spirit.

After more than 50 years in Spiritualism, I have learned to release material things and replace them with spiritual ones, in recognition of their greater value. There are a few books I especially treasure, not for themselves alone, but for the divine manner in which I came to possess them, and for the eternal wisdom within their pages. Many years ago, Rev. The early influences of my childhood, the experiences of later years, and more than all, that unutterable yearning for beauty and harmony, which I felt dimly conscious was somewhere in the universe, all tended to drive me back from the world, to the revelations of my inner life - to the heaven within me. As we progress in our studies, we become more and more aware of the Life Force about us. Often we are asked, "What is meant by vibration?" Let me explain briefly that vibration is *intense*, rapid motion.

All of Life is in a state of constant vibration. Science also tells us that every particle of every thing is in vibration. Everything vibrates according to its own given rate.

Our physical eyes behold various things - but we actually see them according to certain rates of vibrations. These blend together to form the object which we envision. Thus a table becomes a table to us, and a chair appears as a chair. One thing differs from another because of its vibratory rates.

Our ears hear, but only up to a certain rate of vibrations. There are sounds far beyond the limits of the human ear. Sound vibrations may be explained somewhat as a keyboard of a piano. We all know that from any given note on this keyboard to the next one like it, either up or down, forms a space of notes called an octave. Middle C and the C an octave upward are of different vibrations of sound. Each note is of a

different vibration of sound. The higher the note, the higher the sound vibrations. There are also sounds, upward and downward, beyond the keyboard, which have vibrations so high, or so low, that they cannot be heard with our physical ears, but which may be heard psychically or spiritually. Some animals have a more acute sense of hearing than do human beings. Dogs, for instance, are able to hear sounds far above those of man.

Light vibrates according to various rates, in wave-like undulations, through the ether. The air about us is in constant vibration. Everything we sense or feel, or smell, is likewise in accordance with rates of vibrations which we feel are those of peacefulness and calm. We are cheerful in good health. Should these conditions change and become disturbed, the vibrations of which we are a part also become disturbed, and become as a stormy lake with its choppy waves. These waves of vibrations buffet against us, and for a time, everything which we attempt to accomplish, becomes useless effort. Sometimes these vibrations become as tempestuous as an angry sea, and we seem to become as a tiny sailboat, bobbing up and down like a cork, at the mercy of the waves.

When such conditions occur - and they

frequently do occur to each of us because we are human, and we have permitted our mental capacities to slip into improper thinking channels and become muddled and confused - it is better just to stop trying to force an issue. Instead of trying to swim against the waves - let us drift with the tide; we can do this by letting go of our dogged determination and place ourselves in receptive meditation, so that the influx of Infinite wisdom and light and guidance may again flow through us and be absorbed by us.

Frequently we sense the atmosphere, or condition or vibration of various things. Houses or stores may seem to be unlucky and this is due to the negative states of mind of those persons who formerly occupied them. Hospitals and other such institutions usually have a depressing effect upon us. It is possible, and very necessary to treat these places spiritually, just as one would treat an individual - sending forth God's positive rays of love and light. We all know that the opposite is also true. We have all experienced the feeling of restfulness and peace, when entering certain homes or treatment rooms or offices, where positive vibrations of God's love and understanding and power, are ever present.

In like manner we sense the vibrations of different individuals. We are perfectly at ease with some persons, as though we had been friends since the beginning of time. There is something of a magnetic nature between us, which seems to draw us together. With others, the reverse is true, and we

experience an exceedingly uncomfortable feeling, and seem to be poles apart.

It is through these rates of vibrations that a Spiritual Healer "senses" and becomes aware of, the seeming imperfections of his patient. The Healer knows that mind power affects the vibratory rates of every individual. He knows that right thinking will change and improve any condition. Thus the Healer must inject into the thinking of his patient, that mind power is a golden key - that every child of God has the power to direct his own thinking in any manner he chooses. If mind power is used in positive, constructive channels, every child of God will be able to rightly chart his course, and pilot his ship of life out of a troubled sea, into one of calmness.

It is necessary for the Healer to repeatedly direct the thinking of his patient into positive, constructive pathways - by affirming the power of the Infinite Intelligence within each one - since we are each of us in God, and He is within us. This sets into motion, immediately, the curative forces of spiritual vibrations, which are received and absorbed by the patient. Gradually then, right thinking becomes habit, and gradually the physical body is restored into balance.

Remember always, that mind power can and does affect our own vibratory rates. Vibrations we have with us always. Life itself is in constant vibration, physically and spiritually. Every single particle vibrates - according to its own given rate.

# Spiritual Phenomena and Immortality of Man's Soul

One writer says: "Those whom you call evil spirits are also the spirits of those who have lived on the earth plane. Many of them have lacked opportunity, want of proper education, and the influence of wrong social conditions. They have passed through this world and into the Spirit World in absolute ignorance of spiritual laws. They are, however, no worse than mankind who has sent them into the Spirit World, and they are still our brothers and sisters."

Now we come to the second part of the challenge made by Mrs. E. Y. Walker: "to produce any other scripture, except Satan's statement, to indicate...that the dead were alive anywhere..."

Jesus died: "When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, It is finished: and he bowed his head, and gave up the ghost (spirit)." St. John, 19:30.

Jesus lives again: "And when she (Mary Magdalene) had thus said, she turned herself back, and saw Jesus standing, and knew not that he was Jesus." St. John, 20:14.

Jesus appears before Mary and gives her a (spirit) message: "Jesus saith unto her, Touch me not; for I am not yet ascended to my Father, but go to my brethren and say unto them, I ascend unto my Father and your Father; and to my God and your God." St. John, 20:17. As further evidence of the "dead being alive," I will produce the following scriptural references:

Spirit of Samuel appears to Saul - I Sam., 28. Spirit releases Peter and John from prison - Acts, 5:19.

Three spirits appear to Abraham - Gen., 18:1-17

Two spirits appear to Lot - I Kings, 19:1-11. Angel appears to Elijah - I Kings, 9:5-18 Moses and Elias appear to Christ on Mount -Mat., 17:1-8.

Now, what had Satan to do or say in connection with these spiritual manifestations? And when Mrs. E. Y. Walker states that "the Bible makes plain that there is a reality in Spiritualism, but no good in it!" does she not contradict herself? I beg to appeal to her common sense and ask why these spirit manifestations recorded in the Bible actually serve a good purpose; and yet, still

governed by the same natural laws - and natural law never changes - spirit manifestations of today are "No good," but the work of "evil spirits," or "fallen angels"? If "the Bible makes plain that there is a reality in Spiritualism" that our loved ones can come back and talk to us, cheer us, protect us, guide us, help us, heal us, teach us, is there no good in that? If not, then I am ready to declare myself an atheist of the 33rd degree!

The third point I wish to prove in this reply is an answer to the first part of the challenge, "to produce any other scripture, except Satan's statement, to indicate that the human soul was or is immortal..." Now in order to do this, we must understand what is meant by "human soul". We all agree that "immortal" means death-proof.

Mrs. Walker defines "soul" as "the combination of the two, body and breath," and the separation of "these two elements (body and breath) would destroy the soul." For the sake of argument, let us agree to that, just for the moment.

#### Ruler Appeals to Jesus

In the Bible we read where a ruler (Jarious) appealed to Jesus, saying, "My daughter is even now dead: but come and lay thy hand upon her, and she shall live." Mat., 9:18. Now, if she was dead, of course her breath had separated from the body; therefore, destroying her soul. But still further we read: "But when the people were put forth, He (Jesus) went in, and took her by the hand, and the maid arose..." Mat., 9:25. After which, the news was broadcast over the land.

Can the soul, once destroyed, be restored to life again? No! No more than the physical body can be resurrected. A soul may be cast into darkness (sin, ignorance) but never destroyed. Spiritualists also teach that the "doorway to reformation is never closed against any human soul, here or hereafter." Evidently, the daughter was either in a trance, or her spirit had temporarily left the physical body, which Spiritualists of today claim is actually possible.

This writer knows of several instances where children were thought to be dead, and their bodies were resting in the coffin awaiting the funeral ceremonies, when suddenly they awoke, complaining of hunger, and apparently none the worse for their experience. There are many instances given where people were in trance, and thought to be dead, and have been buried alive. In

the British Museum there is a vignette from the papyrus (no. 10470) of Ani, about B.C. 1400, showing Ani's soul revisiting the mummied body on a bier in the tomb.

Therefore, the soul of the daughter must have been very much alive, and we must disagree with

Mrs. Walker's definition of the soul.

The spiritualistic conception is that there are two bodies: the physical which dies at death, and the spiritual (the soul) which is immortal. The spirit dwells in the spiritual body, and ethereal body. So we have a physical body, an ethereal body (the soul) and a spirit. The vision of a spirit, then, is the manifestation of the spirit through the soul or ethereal body. The physical body disintegrates at death; while the spiritual body is eternal.

#### Is the Soul Immortal?

Here is the scripture "to indicate that the human soul was or is immortal..."

- (1) "There are also celestial (spiritual) bodies, and bodies terrestrial (earthly bodies)..." I Cor., 15:40.
- (2) "It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. There is a natural body, and there is a spiritual body." I Cor., 15:44
- (3) "For if the dead rise not, then is not Christ raised? "And if Christ be not raised, your faith is in vain, ye are yet in your sins." I Cor., 15:16,17.
- (4) "For the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.

"For this corruptible must put on incorruption and this mortal must put on immortality.

- "...then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written, death is swallowed up in victory.
- "Oh death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?" I Cor., 15:52-55.
- (5) "For which cause we faint not; but though our outward man perish, yet the inward man is renewed day by day.

"For our light affliction (death), which is but for a moment, worketh for us a far more

exceeding and eternal weight of glory;

"While we look not at the things which are seen, but at the things which are not seen: for the things which are seen are temporal; but the things which are not seen are eternal." Il Cor., 4:16,17,18.

- (6) "We know we have passed from death into life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brother abideth in death (darkness, sin, no spiritual progress).
  - "Whosoever hateth his brother is (like) a murderer: and ye know that no murderer hath eternal life abiding in him." I John, 3:14,15.
- (7) "And Jesus answering said unto them, the children of this world marry, and are given in marriage:

"But they which shall be accounted worthy to obtain that world (spirit world), and the resurrection from the death, neither marry, nor

are given in marriage:

"Neither can they die anymore: for they are equal unto the angels; and are the children of God, being the children of the resurrection (death)" Luke, 20:34-36.

- (8) "...our Savior Jesus Christ, who hath brought life and immortality to light through the gospel:" II Tim., 1:10.
- (9) "Who (God) will render to every man according to his deeds: "To them who by patient continuance in well doing seek for glory and honor and immortality, eternal life." Rom., 2:6-7.
- (10) "What fruit had ye then in those things whereof ye are now ashamed? For the end of those things is death. "But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and (for) the end (ye have) everlasting life (immortality)." Rom., 6:21-22.

#### Conclusive Evidence

Isn't the foregoing sufficient biblical evidence of immortality of the soul? And did Satan have a single word to say about it? No!

Allow me to name, beside those of Conan Doyle, and Oliver Lodge, a few of the world's greatest thinkers who believed during their material life of a life after death -- immortality of the soul.

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# Centennial is Alive and Back

Centennial provokes the name of James A. Michener and Colorado. Another Centennial which has been around since the late 1920's is that of the Centennial State Spiritualist Association. Surprisingly enough, Colorado is the home territory of this spiritualist association of the National Spiritualist Association of Churches.

The earliest available records suggest that the First Spiritualist Church of Pueblo was the first chartered by the State. For forty years the original pastors, Mr. and Mrs. Johns, were the backbone of the church. At their death in 1966, the church was disbanded. Centennial has chartered 17 different churches in behalf of the National Spiritualist Association of Churches since 1926.

Since the first chartered church in Pueblo, residents and members of Centennial have tried to maintain an active spiritualist faculty. Even now Mr. Charles Black, State President is actively engaged in this same effort.

Over the years six different doors for Spiritualism in Pueblo have welcomed the public.

Incomplete records exist for four of the churches: Philosophical Spiritualist Church in Colorado Springs, the Church of Spiritual Light in Boulder, the Denver Spiritualist Church of the Word, and the First Temple of Harmony of Pueblo.

Many great mediums have come and gone since the first N.S.A.C. chartered church hung out its shingle. However, the pages of history list only one Rev. Anna Schisler, pastor of Spiritualist Church of Truth and Science. She was perhaps the first Colorado medium with the uncanny ability to talk to animals. What made her remarks to the little creatures especially interesting is that many who visited her would state emphatically that the animals always did what she asked! It is an injustice to mention only one of the long line of excellent mediums who have held the banner high in this great state.

The present Colorado Springs church is not a by-product of Rev. Schisler. It has been held together despite internal conflict. At one point the First Spiritualist Church of Colorado Springs was nearly erased from the N.S.A.C. banner. Only action by the former State Board President recovered the church charter.

Out of the seventeen churches which have been authorized by Centennial since 1926, just two remain. The Temple of Harmony Church in Denver and the Colorado Springs church.

Spiritualists dot the Colorado scene but not in unified voices or sufficient numbers to stand the cost of supporting additional houses of worship. Centennial has made numerous probes to re-start disbanded churches, but the single biggest problem is lack of responsible leadership.

In 1981, Centennial will host the National Convention. Plan on attending. The Denver church represents one of the finest structures available to Spiritualists anywhere in the world. Sound management over the years has insulated it against the ravages of inflation. The services are well attended and opportunities for new friendships await.

# The Thorn - Pretended Mediumship!

Eternal vigilance on the part of intelligent Spiritualists is the price that must be paid for the up building of deserved and enduring confidence in any and every phase of mediumship.

The conflict between truth and error, separation of the simulated from the actual demonstration, is as old as the records of humanity

and will be as endless as time itself.

The pages of the Old Testament contain denunciations of many false prophets whom Jehovah never sent to speak in his name. Again in the Epistle of John there was urging that every spirit be tried or proven, because many false prophets had gone out into the world. Every generation has had a part in this perpetual struggle and helped their successors on the pathway to truth.

The United States Government never relents in its efforts against counterfeits, or its money or circulation would soon be debased and give way to

paper and coin of uncertain values.

Enforcement officers are steadily busied in apprehending violators of the narcotic laws, bootleggers and criminals of all grades. The civic eye never sleeps in efforts for self-protection. Spiritualists cannot afford to idle on *indifference* if they would give to the world the best that mediumship holds for the children of men.

The press of Los Angeles reports that William Estep and Sarah Moore, after punishment by a local court, announced that the couple will henceforth operate as public entertainers and discard the mask of religion in working a confidence game for personal gain. If their printed record is accurate, they should never have posed in any other than the amusement class, for wearing the name *Reverend*, bestowed independently of the N.S.A.C. and its auxiliaries, did not carry with it a baptism of ordinary honesty in their methods.

The man is said to have testified in the court trial that convicted the pair: "When departed spirits fail to respond promptly to requests for their appearance at Spiritualistic seances, it is sometimes necessary to impersonate them to keep the audience from the product of the surdices of the services restless."

the audience from becoming restless."

That slur upon the sacred gift of mediumship should rouse every sincere demonstrator of any phase to most conscientious and continuous endeavors to prove its falsity over and over again.

Only people who have been fed up on brazen

trickery will acquire an artificial appetite that demands a satiety of deception instead of only truthful demonstrations. Impersonations once practiced to save the operator's reputation and satisfy his need of dollars easily repeats itself until only manifestations of that class are given by him. The blunted conscience of the trickster measures success by popularity with its victims and not by the high character of his work.

Truthful clairvoyants describe only what is shown them at the time in which they speak; honest clairaudients report with greatest possible accuracy simply what they hear at the present moment; worthy materializing mediums never carry a stock of gauze, masks or similar paraphernalia and have no confederates. Willful impersonation grows in frequency and every detection of it undermines any existing confidence in mediumship. Only honest methods can withstand assaults of the critics.

# The Power of Prayer

# But Do You Understand What You Worship?

(Sir Oliver Lodge's preface to 'Ancient Lights', written by Mrs. St. Clair Stobart.)

"Ignorance of what are often called psychic, or more accurately metapsychic phenomena, is so thorough and widespread that people can fail to perceive that the Bible, which they are so familiar with, and regard with such reverence, is saturated with metapsychic or mediumistic phenomena of every kind. Even so it is possible for people to be familiar with chalk and limestone and other stratified rocks, and to use them as building material, and yet fail to perceive that these same rocks are packed with the remains of creatures akin to the living organisms which exist today. Anyone can point out the truth; it needs no learned geologist to call attention to a patent fact; and the corresponding fact of stratified literature we call the Bible is so conspicuous, when pointed out, that only mental blindness can ignore it, and only stubbornness deny it.

For such people to deny the reality of psychic phenomena is preposterous. Such phenomena may be disliked, as many of the legends in the Old Testament are instinctively disliked, but they cannot be acceptors of the Bible and be consistently denied.

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Spiritualism came into the world to restore faith, and to add to faith knowledge.





#### Remembering Elsie

The Spiritualist Lyceum Parent-Teachers' Club of Michigan was born in October, 1944, as the result of a vision received by its founder - Elsie Butler Bunts. Retiring one night feeling rather depressed and discouraged because of the seeming lack of interest in the Lyceum movement, and the problems presented by the need of trained teachers, it was some time before she slept.

Suddenly she was awakened to find a light directly over her head in which appeared the smiling face of a woman. Strangely familiar was this face and as she spoke, recognition became plain. It was the face and the voice of Rev. Elizabeth S. Schauss and her words were clear and distinct, "Spiritualist Lyceum Parent-Teachers' Club." The light faded and the presence left that

room with a smile but the words remained in the mind and heart of Elsie and the result was the organizing of the first Spiritualist Lyceum Parent-Teachers' Club.

Its purpose was to band together the parents, teachers, and officers of the Lyceum with a view to the study of Lyceumism, teaching methods, child training and the directing of social activities; also to help organize and maintain more and better Lyceums wherever the club could be of service.

Among the first projects of this new club was the issuing of the *Lyceum Spotlight* as its official publication. The first issue was published in mimeograph form in January, 1945. In January, 1947, it was officially adopted by the Spiritualist Progressive Lyceum of the N.S.A.C.
