The International Spiritualist Federation announces the first North American Seminar to be held in Ottawa Friday, May 16th through Monday, May 19th.



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

Oh Blessed Easter! What an immortal gift, There are no dead, they live is the glory of the Easter story; Enshrined in tombs, free of earth's chains, Our mortal soul, too, has arisen unto Thee.

Oh Blessed Easter! As Christ triumphed over death, Angels will guide you with your departing breath; Oh death, thou lack victory, thy grave knows no fear, Hail the Easter story, it bespeaks comfort, hope and cheer.

The Promised Life Eternal

Four accounts, for our enlightenment, are offered on the resurrection in the New Testament. Each contributes another part to the ultimate lesson, affording all the blessing of immortality --God's everlasting gift.

"But Mary stood without at the sepulchre weeping: and as she wept, she stooped down and looked into the sepulchre,

"And seeth two angels in white, sitting, the one at the head, and the other at the feet, where the body of Jesus had lain.

"And they say unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? She saith unto them, 'Because they have taken away my Lord, and I know not where they have laid him.'

"And when she had thus said, she turned herself back, and saw Jesus standing, and knew not that it was Jesus.

"Jesus saith unto her, 'Woman, why weepest thou? whom seekest thou?' She, supposing him to be the gardener, saith unto him, 'Sir, if thou have borne him hence, tell me where thou hast laid him, and I will take him away.'

"Jesus saith unto her, 'Mary'. She turned herself, and saith unto him, 'Rabboni', which is to say, Master. "Jesus saith unto her, 'Touch me not: for I am not yet ascended to my Father: but go to my brethren, and say unto them, I ascend unto my Father and your Father, and to my God and your God'."

St. John - 20:11-17

Fill your hearts with joy, for this is the month in which Jesus, the Christ, gave of His blood that all those who follow would know and believe in life eternal. This, through the son of God, is the holy promise which awaits all brethren, friend or foe. For you, a Spiritualist, this represents the greatest truth - one which accounts for the messages from departed souls to be given to those in the physical who remain behind.

Easter Sunday

Once a year, Orthodox Christians unite in a belief which is more spiritualistic in nature and application than their own faith. Ministers everywhere will greet their congregation with this wonderful biblical story.

They will provide the spiritual essence of the faith - how Jesus was crucified on what has come to be Good Friday and arose the third day, Easter Sunday. *How He rose from the dead!* It is this sentence around which those in attendance will ponder and anchor their faith. It is around those words that the Orthodox Christians will emerge steeped in spiritual consciousness and awakened to another in a long line of resurgent progressions in mustering the faith and belief which sustains their trust in the Written Word of God's recognized messenger.

In a sense these words bespeak a state of confusion, for on this occasion all who truly believe will openly accept His ascension and the immortality of man, yet disclaim such of their dearest loved ones. The record given us by St. John clearly establishes proof of communication between the physical dead and the physical living. Spiritualists are fortunate for they do not have to accept the fact of His ascension solely because He was the son of God. You and I know that we too will in time stand before the same door which beckoned to Him that He might sit at His Father's side. We are all children of God.

Those who have had the great privilege to witness a genuine materialization seance would immediately understand why Mary, the mother of the Christ, did not recognize the child to whom she gave birth. The form is the same. So are the features -- the hands, the face, the hair. But somehow the coloring of the body seems less distinct, blending one into the other without clear and familiar separation. The scripture suggests that his voice was more important in establishing his identity than his image. An image which was close enough to touch!

A Pagan Holiday

Easter was long recorded as a time of festival. Was it not so that Jesus chose a donkey to ride into the town of Jerusalem. Palms were laid before him. We do not celebrate Easter for Palm Sunday nor Good Friday, but for the greatest event in the Bible *resurrection from the dead*. Proof of everlasting life!

There are many among us who would use this to prove predestination. But did He not ask that this task be taken from Him? It was His free will and obedience to His Master, Father God, that allowed Him to endure. This event recorded in a land far from the cities of rule has rocked the world. For 2,000 years man has debated its importance. That alone is sufficient, save the events which have been written in His name by those seeking to enforce their interpretation on the rest of the world.

The pagan festival for which the holiday claims origin, dates to the time of sun worship, for Easter represented the Goddess of Spring.

The festival marked a time when the wisest men were dispatched to study the stars. Long before the coming of the Christ these same studies foretold of his birth. The Zodiac also originated from the gathering of such wise men. It was the first circle to chart the affairs of man. This was the *Spring* of the year, and the sun was supposed to cross an arbitrary mark which ran from west to east. Here too came another symbol important in today's religions and culture - the cross.

When the sun crossed over, Spring was born, vegetation sprang to life, flowers began to blossom, trees filled with buds and leaves.

The First Christians

Strikingly enough, the first Christians were Jews. Their belief is best illustrated by the parable of Dives and Lazarus, in which life after death is explained. Upon death man journeyed to an underworld, a place divided into two sections, the Gehenna (an area used to contain trash and fed constantly with fire) and Paradise. According to the parable each inhabitant could see the other, even converse with those in the other land.

Modern concepts are not always realistic as shown by this old Jewish belief. It was held in great respect long before the advent of the fire and brimstone teachings of Heaven and Hell. So many different truths are illustrated within the pages of holy scripture. Knowledge is not of itself sufficient. For despite the respect of spiritual values and truths, the Jews, the very ones who spread His fame to the point where it became a thorn poised at Roman dominance, rejected him at his trial. As today, the longing was for material conquest, not a spiritual kingdom. The Jews were looking for the long awaited Messiah, one who would take the throne of David and lead Israel out of bondage - material bondage. In this regard Jesus disappointed God's chosen people. He spoke of His kingdom as "not of this world," for His mission was to awaken the spiritual love within and to anoint all with the knowledge of their spiritual home.

Although there is no account that he appeared before his principal persecuters, the scriptures tell us that the wife of Pilate sought to wash away the blood from her hands. Others spoke of the dark at midday, the rumble of the land and sudden winds.

Jesus, it was recorded, appeared to Mary, to his disciples, and to Paul on the road to Damascus.

It is written that Paul said, "If Christ be not risen, then is our preaching in vain." In accordance to one who was raised in the belief of the times, had Jesus not come from the Underworld, not been seen by the physical living, the entire faith which all had bestowed upon the son of God would have been in vain. And it is this statement assigned to Paul which attests to the main reason God set Jesus upon the face of the land and breathed into Him life. His death and rebirth proved the very foundation of His word.

The whole meaning of Easter is thus that "He is risen". Jesus rose from the grave and was victorious over death, the once believed eternal sting. In acts that followed, He demonstrated that physical death was not the end of conscious existence.

The View of Spiritualists

How do we, as Spiritualists of Modern Spiritualism, visualize Easter and the resurrection in light of these truths? The question is a fair one, for those of true faith believe that immortality is the natural birthright of every human soul. And every one of the so-called dead before the resurrection of the Christ and since have been awakened to their own blessed Easter morning. As Jesus did, we too will shed our physical body, be resurrected to the higher life, housed within a different body.

Like Jesus, we, once departed, can come back to bring comfort and cheer to those on the earth plane of life. When Mary heard her son and master speak "Mary" joy filled her heart and she went away rejoicing.

Be Not Saddened



Just as opportunity is given us will we be able to transmit advice to you of earth, which will rebound to your benefit, and to the eventual upliftment of those who shall come after you.

Little of the teachings you now possess are retained as they originally came from the teachers in the higher life.

Through ignorance and misconception by those to whom knowledge was first given, self interest, wrong ideals and wrong conclusions have often interferred in these lessons being handed down, from one generation to another.

While the import of words once used to express an idea have since lost their impact for the same meaning in another age, interpretation which changes with the times can, unfortunately, result in a complete reversal of meaning.

All of this conveys to the reasoning mind, that human language, changeable as it is, is not reliable in the conveyance of that which is governed by eternal and immutable law, and therefore, not likely to be the means which *Infinite Intelligence* would employ to convey its message to all mankind, in every age and country.

The laws of nature, as manifested in the physical universe are the same day to day, yesterday and forever, conveying to mortal man in every country, in every age, the one universal law of unchangeableness, thus carrying the internal evidence that it alone is the means by which infinite wisdom would need, or likely use, to make His will known to all, with that perfect impartiality that would indicate His eternal goodness, wisdom and power.

This alone should be enough to convince intelligent men and women everywhere that if we would know the will of our *Creator* we should seek to know and understand nature as manifested in His laws. Thus, we would be able to do the will of the Father, as it is revealed in nature. At the same time we should reject any claim made as an expression of the Father's will that is compelled to depend upon human agency for its promulgation.

The human agency is one by its very nature necessarily fallible and therefore unreliable.

Let us recognize the fact that the credulity of the past is the most potent force in holding the human race in bondage, superstition and ignorance. Skepticism and doubt, guided and directed by the torch of reason ever leads onward and upwards

As In Nature, The Human Family

In seeking to more fully understand the human family and their material relationship toward each other as a race of immortal beings, we must first accept the reality that the same universal law governing the human family also governs all the varieties of life. This same law is also manifested throughout the lower animal, vegetable and mineral kingdoms of the earth.

We have discovered a certain degree of similarity existing between some plants of the floral and vegetable kingdoms. As we proceed to classify them into species and these again into varieties of the same species we find a striking fact: all the different varieties of a general species originated from a single, common root.

All the different classes and expressions are caused by the different conditions and environments under which they have been called upon to exist and unfold.

Our acquired knowledge concerning the history of the worlds past, we think, justifies use in coming to this conclusion, even though it requires the acceptance of an unlimited lapse of ages of time to accomplish the present results.

As in the floral and vegetable kingdoms, we find this same universal law of differentiation of species and classes running through the entire animal kingdom. This may be accounted for by the same general law evident in the vegetable kingdom. So we again feel justified in our conclusion that if this be true concerning all the lower manifestations of life, then there can be no plausible reason offered when the same law is said to not hold good in the unfoldment of the human kingdom as well. Hence, we decide that all the different varieties of the human family may have sprung out of and had their origin in a single species of one common origin, all created equal and must of necessity all enjoy the same final common destiny. If then, an immortal existence has been vouchsafed for one, the same condition has been accredited for all, and by the law of adaptation, each shall naturally, in the hereafter, gravitate to that sphere of unfoldment best suited to it's degree of development in spiritual unfoldment.

There is not a single human entity which has ever had an existence on this mortal plane, even though it be the briefest period of time, that does

not retain that individuality in a higher degree of unfoldment beyond the confines of this material, mortal plane.

Immortality or a separate and distinct individuality is conferred or evolved at conception as an attribute or distinction of eternal being which belongs to all.

Not even the least significant human being can lose its God given individuality though it be blotted out of material existence through annihilation any more than a single atom of matter can be destroyed.

No fact or law can alter this condition, for it represents infinite nature in perpetuity.

No one of this human race has ever been brought into mortal existence by the action of *his* own will, but rather because eternal life was thrust upon him by the action of Infinite will, power and purpose.

The very elements of man's primitive being are co-eternal with infinity. Therefore, to the thinking mind it must appear as but criminal childishness for any one to refuse to abide by nature's decree in attempting to thwart nature by resorting to a criminal act of violence against his own physical being as that of suicide.

Man in the mortal form, upon this physical plane of existence, made but little advance in the affairs of this life or in spiritual progression and a higher expression of the true principle of humanitarianism, so long as he confined his investigations to the study of the past alone or sought to learn for the future by studying only the records of the past.

The conclusion is obvious. Each succeeding generation studying the same records of the past would probably arrive at the same or at least similar conclusion, and thus make but little advancement from that of his or society's immediate state. Similar causes produce similar effects. This also illustrates why history repeats itself so often.

So long as mankind re-examines the past, an old established custom, to gain understanding of the future, progress will be slow.

"Let the past bury its dead," is both judicious and just, in its application of this matter. It is only when men cease to scan the past *alone*, for precedent to govern their actions and conclusions and turns their attention and thoughts toward the future for knowledge, that they find theirselves environed with new fields of exploration and new conditions that call for brave hearts, strong arms and a fearless, determined mind.

The proof of this is seen in the results of the progress humanity has made in every line of

unfoldment within the past one hundred and thirty-five years.

For fifteen hundred years, in which humanity was governed and controlled entirely by the records of the past, little or no progress was achieved.

Only when they of the higher life succeeded in attracting the attention of mortal man and induced him to turn from the past and look to the future for light, knowledge and guidance has humanity made *unprecedented progress*.

If such advances in all lines of progress as we behold, manifesting on every hand, has been vouchsafed to man while only a modicum have been found fearless and undaunted enough to look to the future and follow its mandates, receiving light and knowledge from the invisible, rather than to seek it in the annals of the past, what may we expect as results when the great masses of humanity fully realize and accept the possibility of the helping hand from the higher life and earnestly seek to establish harmonious and workable co-relationships therewith.

Every one should be fully capable of seeing the beneficent blessings ushered in upon this mortal plane during the past one hundred and thirty-five years. These blessings far exceed those of the previous 2,000 years. The difference amounts significantly to the willingness of man to listen to those forces above and outside himself. He has turned from much of the darkness and gloom, the ignorance and bigotry of the uncivilized past to emerge with a more positive view of the future. The losses in customs and desirable traditions afford hope that the celestial realms, where arisen friends and dear ones dwell, will be granted frequent audience for the years ahead.

Spiritualism is small in terms of numbers but once the cloak is parted by those who seek, the effect is everlasting. It is then easy to understand why it is often referred to as a great movement. The angels of wisdom, governed, controlled and directed by Infinite Intelligence doeth all things well.

As you give so also do you receive. Do you wish happiness, give happiness. Do you seek love, give love. Do you need comfort, then give comfort to others and you shall be comforted.

Give love, and love to your heart will flow A strength in your utmost need. Have faith, and a score of hearts will show Their faith in your word and deed.

The power of suggestion frequently works havoc among those who are interested more or less in spiritual manifestations. A suggestion given, sometimes by friends, or at other times by a physician, frequently takes a pronounced hold upon some individuals. We have come in contact with cases where patients who were suffering with some physical condition were told that they were crazy. Such a suggestion may do great harm and those who are thus endangered at any time should well guard themselves against taking suggestions and acting upon them.

Spirit Healing, as we understand it, has nothing whatever to do with the operator's magnetic force or suggestive power.

Success in Spirit Healing depends upon an instrument who is able to give himself or herself up to the unseen powers with such abandonment of self, while maintaining perfect consciousness and self-control, that absolute confidence and faith are established on the part of the person under treatment.

Through this confidence, through genuine sincerity and through faith the patient comes in touch with the spirit healing power. This confidence, this sincerity and faith in conjunction with the operator's impressions received from the same great source, establishes an attunement which enables the patient to come in rapport with the healing forces and frequently there is an immediate response to the earnest desire sent out in the sea of space for relief. The stronger the aural force through a large class, the better the results.

There is nothing mysterious about it. It is all the following out of a natural law about which comparatively little is known. Some of the most successful and instantaneous reliefs have come when there was no contact with the patient.

There is a process of mental treatment The Healer sometimes employs. He understands the power of suggestion. He is conscious of the fact that at times He has strong magnetic power through which he has brought direct relief. There are times when medical drugs may be employed through consultation with practiced physicians, but our claim is that a man may have twenty diplomas from the greatest medical schools in the world; he may be a magnetic healer of world-wide reputation; he may be thoroughly versed in the philosophy and practice of suggestive therapeutics; he may be a powerful hypnotist, a divine healer, a mesmerist or what not, but if he does not possess the power through Spirit influences to bring his patient in rapport with the healing forces on the

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other side of life, he is a failure as a Spirit Healer.

Tolerance

"All things come from One, all things are sustained in One, and through the tolerance of all we will come closer to the real One."

Tolerance is a word we see in the moralist's books, or in the religious publications but we never think about it - and much less apply it to our relations with all human beings. One definition states that tolerance is a "disposition to be patient and indulgent toward those whose opinions differ from one's own". However, while churches preach the *most* about tolerance, they actually do the *least* about it for they exist mostly as confined little groups of people, who basically isolate themselves from others who do not agree with them.

It is one of the first virtues that we should seek to attain and it takes great mental and moral effort to do this. Some are born with greater tolerance than others but they are indeed the fortunate ones for they live more peacefully undisturbed by the faults of others, their blunders or differences of opinion. They live with people and accept them as they are whether weak or strong and try to mold their own pathway that will be the best for their desired goals in life. They do not become diverted from their goals by the whims of others because they have a wonderful power of acceptance or rejection. Their abstention of criticism is not the result of indifference, but undoubtedly the fruit of a broad understanding. They try to attune to God's harmonious laws so that all may find the right of individual expression. Tolerance without understanding would not be that virtue of which Christ has given us examples, but just a manifestation of an easy-going, indifferent nature. The tolerant man understands that everyone has a right to his own opinion - that truth has to be searched for and may be found through many different roads. The errors of his fellow man do not irritate him; he is anxious to help, but not to interfere merely to further his own ends.

When we find fault with others we must remember that it is easier to be charitable than to be just. Since we cannot judge in strict justice, because we certainly ignore some of the motives

that have prompted the acts, we can form an opinion only on one basis; our own viewpoint which could be wrong. When we are angry with someone let us vent our wrath on the sin and not the sinner, thus and only thus will we progress spiritually. We should try to be so attuned to the Cosmic Consciousness that we are able to tolerate and forgive - because when we are in tune with Divine Mind we never feel such petty sentiments as intolerance. To attain that serenity we must use all our efforts to fight intolerance in our thoughts first and secondly, in their manifestation - our actions. We have a natural disposition to see the mote in our neighbor's eye, but are quite blind to our own mistakes, and we easily criticize what others are doing in the very moment that we, most innocently, are doing exactly the same. If we follow the teachings of Jesus, we shall never go wrong. He forgave with complete love - can we not do as much - for none of us have been tried as He was in the long ago. Even the purest of the mystics and mediums have their trials and temptations and it is how we overcome these conditions that shows us the state of our growth. It is difficult to live through these trials, (I have been there), but they are of great help, and if we can view them as a help, it will make it easier for us to endure these trials. Many lives appear virtuous because no trouble has rippled their cold surfaces, but storm may come at any time and make havoc of a presumptuous security. Temptation clothes itself, for each of us, in the form that is more susceptible to reach our individual weak points:

- -for the mystics and the mediums -- deep spiritual tribulations
- -for the intellectual man -- complex problems of the mind
 - -for the material man -- the snares of grossly material delusions

If we analyze intolerance we find that it is born from pride, ignorance, absence of humility. Would we ever find fault with others if we were not so sure of our own opinions, creed or attitude in life? *Intolerance is one of the greatest evils of humanity*. It has at all times been a block to the advancement of civilization. It has upset religions, countries, but most of all people. We must grow out of these thoughts as surely as we can - sometimes it is a slow process, but if it is a complete one, then it will be good because of its permanence no matter how slow in being achieved. Sometimes we are irritated with what we see in others because it is such a close reflection of what we are or want to be, hence, the creation of an attitude of intolerance.

All vices and human defects, as also all virtues and qualities, are related to each other, and we may see how they encroach upon and seem to be blending with each other - there is no definite separation between them. Hence, this should grant us a greater understanding of true tolerance for the welfare of all peoples and know that they are basically trying their best and we should help them in this attempt. Look for instance how intolerance engenders hatred and anger, and how benevolence is closely related to tolerance and forbearance; like unto all things and manifestations of nature, notes of one octave have corresponding notes in other octaves, thus harmonious relations. True tolerance is harmony, formed and blended with the highest and noblest qualities of man: generosity, broadness of mind, patience, and charity. Man's inner spiritual nature is most complex. We must realize that everyone from saint to bum has weaknesses, some big and some small. But by the same token all have some good qualities in them and we must search for those. Give them through tolerance and mercy, with the right teaching instead of condemnation, some chance of redemption and you will see the small flower of righteousness begin to grow and unfold under the warming life of love. Let us try to overlook the little things that irritate us in our home and office and find out how much happier we will be and how much better things will progress. Try it for one week and see ... Then if only for a few days we have made sincere efforts though they be but few, they will be like stones added to the foundation, the building up of our character. It is possible that we will forget our good purpose; but then one day later on, we will think of it again, make new efforts, and add a few more stones. These stones will build a big mountain for your progression. A time will come for the greatest blessing and recompense, when we are able to see nearer the goal of perfection, in Divine Love and Wisdom.

"Timely Reflections"

Fellow Spiritualists:

At the last N.S.A.C. Convention, I spoke of the fallibility of judging the success and progress of Spiritualism by



statistics, numbers and quantity; rather far more accurate, true and dependable is the influence of our attitude and philosophy on the other religions and the world at large.

In the last 50 plus years, I have grown quite tired of listening to the question, "Do Spiritualists believe in the Bible, and are Spiritualists only concerned with life after death?"

The answer lies not in just our impatient reply, but rather by referring to our pioneers who over one century ago were faced with the same accusations. A good source of reference for all Spiritualists is the *Encyclopedia of Biblical Spiritualism* by Moses Hull. His answers not only strengthened the cause of Spiritualism, but gave the Christians (assuming they were open-minded) a chance and challenge to really know the early history of the Bible.

Although written in 1895, Moses Hull's words on this subject are sorely needed by the world today. As a Spiritualist, I am proud to quote from his masterpiece, as follows:

"During the first 30 years after the "Rochester Knockings", if the clergy referred to Spiritualism at all, they found it quite sufficient to say it was opposed, in its phenomena and philosophy, to the Bible; and they everywhere created the impression that no one could take hold of Spiritualism, and at the same time maintain any sort of respect for the Bible; and if one gave up his Bible, he gave up his God and his religion, and of course, *lost* his soul.

"The fact that many of the converts to Spiritualism came from that class of people the church called Infidels, and from non-professors of religion, was pointed to as evidence of the truth of the old proverb that *birds of a feather flock together*.

"If an Infidel happened to embrace what they called the *gospel*, it was evidence of the power of

Christ and His gospel to reach and reclaim the staunchest Infidel or Atheist. But when the Owens, Dr. Hare and others, who had withstood the batteries of the strongest and most thoroughly charged pulpits in the land, surrendered to the tiny rap, or the tipping of the little pine table, there was evidence that the devil was getting up a few signs and wonders in order to hold his own.

"Many of those who embraced Spiritualism had not studied the Bible and very naturally took the orthodox interpretations of the Bible and Christianity as the Bible itself. They naturally concluded the Bible was opposed to Spiritualism; but they could each one say as Job did, 'I know for myself, and not another, that Spiritualism is true.' As a legitimate consequence, they sometimes, in language rather more expressive than elegant, told the churches to take their Bibles and go to Sunday School with them; knowing Spiritualism to be a living truth, carrying evidence of its divinity wherever it went, it did not particularly need the Bible.

"Thus, many Spiritualists, without any investigation, were driven to reject the Bible. I have met hundreds of them who thought they were Infidels, and who never knew to the contrary until they heard the Bible interpreted in the light of the New Dispensation.

"Hoping that this book will serve to lead the people out of the wilderness of doubt and despair; and that when Spiritualism shall have wrestled the Bible from its *sanctified* enemies, it will not spike it, but will use it to batter down the walls of Christian superstition and ignorance, I send it out on its errand of enlightenment with the humble prayer that it may prove a Divine Benediction to its every reader."

The Bible is one of the best sacred books of the ages. It is supposedly the sacred fountain from which two, if not three of the great religions have emerged. The Hebrews base their religion almost wholly on the Old Testament; while Christians draw theirs for the most part, from the New Testament. The Old Testament is used by Christians as a background for their religious theories. Mohammedans add to these two great storehouses of religious dogma the Koran, which is largely based on the Bible, and the Talmud. While the Bible is not the infallible or immaculate book that many have supposed it to be, no one can deny that it is a great book. For centuries many Christians have swallowed it whole; they have thought it must be accepted - or rejected - as a whole. This idea has borne fruit of various kinds, the most troublesome of which has been the opposite extreme; that is, a large and intelligent class of honest thinkers have rejected the Bible as a whole.

The Bible has not only history, but also fame. It has merit. Its inspirations have been greatly read and studied. Yet it must be confessed that the age of critical analysis of all its sayings and of its environments has hardly dawned.

For over one thousand years the Bible was kept from the people; its language was dead. Translation of it into the language of the people was not tolerated. The only way it could reach the people was in small detachments, and after being diluted by a prejudiced preisthood. In the estimation of the church few crimes were greater than that of trying to read and understand the Bible. It has been only three centuries since the Bible existed in the vernacular of the people. Even then its perusal was granted by the dominant church only to keep them from reading those produced by such heretics as Erasmus, Martin Luther and others.

It has been hardly a century since the critical study of the Bible began. Even in the last quarter of this nineteenth century such men as Dr. Thomas, Professors Swing, Briggs, Smith and others were considered sinners of too deep a dye to continue in the fellowship of the popular churches. All because they believed in and practiced the *higher criticism*.

Thousands of country ministers, and some city pastors still continue in their interpretations of the Bible, as though they are as *infallible* as they suppose the Bible itself to be. They never give any thought to the newer interpretations. With them the Bible is all true, all inspired. They regard the Bible as one book, having one author; instead of two-thirds of a hundred books having more than two score of authors, from different localities, nationalities and centuries! However, on this subject public sentiment is rapidly changing, as shown by the following words of a noted minister of the Episcopal Church of Denver:

"Divine inspiration is not monopolized by this library of Hebrew literature. Inspiration has not ceased; the visions of Hebrew seers and prophets are not simply a past possession of the world; they are a possession of the world now, if there be those to receive these visions. Today men can see God and know God and receive revelations from God even as in old times. Moral inspiration has to do with all nations; it has to do with all ages; it is universal; it takes in all those of the human race that are open or competent to receive divine impressions."

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Orthodox Spiritualism Fifty-Six Years Ago

This article was carried by the *Indianapolis Times* in 1924. It is unusual to say the least as it is the synopsis of an orthodox sermon defending Spiritualism.

"Spiritualism is the foundation of all religions," Rev. Charles H. Gunsolus championed from the pulpit of the Brightwood Congregational Church.

"After ten years of study and investigation along psychical research lines," Rev. Gunsolus said, "I am convinced that Spiritualism is true. I have gathered enough facts and statistics from my numerous friends in Indiana to prove to any skeptic or doubter the truth of this statement.

"I am ready and willing to defend my position by debate and scientific demonstration that Spiritualism is true. Spiritualism does away with the orthodox theory of eternal damnation and fear. It does away with the fear of death and removes the horror of medieval theology.

"Spiritualism aims at destroying the present materialism by proving clearly that life carries on and that we are responsible for our actions. It proposes to substitute proof for faith and certainty for a vague belief," he declared.

"Investigation shows that there are more facts in favor of Spiritualism than there are theories against it," he said. "The Bible is based upon occultism, Spiritualism and angelology. It teaches that we are surrounded by angels and spirits and that communication with the unseen world is possible and feasible. We are encompassed about by a great cloud of witnesses."

Rev. Gunsolus maintained that the scriptures show that spirit writing, trumpet speaking, materialization, trance, healing, spirit levitation, spirit tests and the like are possible.

"A Spiritualist is one who believes that death makes no change in personality and that communication under proper conditions is still possible," he said.

"Spiritualism is not incompatible with any religion. It is only hostile to those creeds which would confine God's mercy to a particular sect," Rev. Gunsolus concluded.

Open Door

"The soul has the power to extend her activity to any locality she may desire. She is a power that hath no limits and each part of her, being independent of special conditions, can be present everywhere, provided she is pure and unadulterated with matter." - Porphyrios

With this statement Porphyrios thus threw light on the great destiny of the soul. A disciple of Plotinus, Porphyrios died in Rome in 304, A.D.

Spiritualism did not begin with the year 1848. It goes back to 233, A.D. and before. It goes back to the creation of the world, because *man is a spirit*.

Rev. Minot J. Savage, who was a very famous preacher in Boston during the 1880's and 1890's, said, "Man is a spirit, and has a body." The philosophy of spiritual communion is as old as the human race.

The Bible is full of Spiritualism. If people only read the scriptures in the light of the past and rule *The Book* as otherwise out of date, they reveal a genuine ignorance. The Bible is a record, just as valuable today. In fact, no author can afford to ignore it. Within its pages are written every basic plot of every best seller to hit the bookstands.

The Philosophy of Plotinus written by Dr. Inge of England around 1916 abounds in information about spiritual values.

"He to whom the eternal word speaks," says Thomas Kempis, "It speaks in the silence of the night. It is heard in the noonday of rush and activity. And he who hears it is liberated and rises to a new plane of life."

Spiritualism is made up of an audience of many different types of people. It is interesting to contrast two distinct attitudes, in this respect. "I have been a Spiritualist all my life and I have never been an investigator. It was never necessary for me to investigate the subject of communication with the Spirit World. I have generally found that investigators have been people whose lines of thought have so moulded their physical brains as to result in cerebral defects, which in turn, result in inveterate incredulity as to all spiritual things." This statement by Dr. Corson betrays clearly his feelings toward others who sought to unravel the questions raised by communication with the Spirit World. When men such as Sir Oliver Lodge and Dr. Bergson investigated they found overwhelming truth to mould their eventual convictions. However, the act of question does not result in lightning bolts and raging waves. Thank heaven there is still room for those who refuse to fully accept the possibility of communication. Such a person was Dr. John Fiske. He challenged the facts of communication but was led by his own scientific and philosophic teachings into a personal conviction that the unbroken evolutionary sequence of the life *here* and life *hereafter* remain the very same.

There is, of course, a very wide difference between a certain result as natural, even logical, and that it actually exists. Science has not yet penetrated the *simple* answer. If this *open door* between the seen and the unseen exists, as it does, then it's use must represent another manifestation of divine law. It must take place in the ethics of life -- in all religious organizations and in all developments of the higher orders of life.

This open portal in time and space has contributed much to the literature of the world, from the time of the first writing of the Greek classics to the present. Poetry more sensitive to the heart is another excellent example. Words flowing forth through this open doorway has raised the quality of life and given hope to the faith of many religions around the globe.

In this faith, indeed, stands the sustaining life bringing fresh fruit to all religions. Spiritualism vitalizes and reinforces all spiritual values and enhances the appreciation of simple truths of life.

"She has the power to extend her activity to any locality she may desire." These, the last words of Plotinus, say quite well the strength which comes in knowing you are a part of the spiritual river of life which is even now adding fresh dimensions to the religion of the world.

Glimpses in the Light of the Philosophy of Spiritualism

(from N.S.A.C. Spiritualist Manual)

Man's Individuality

In the Spirit World man retains his individuality and the unfoldment of his mental, moral and spiritual faculties is continued indefinitely by processes not unlike the manner pertaining to this world.

Matter and Spirit Always Co-related

As matter and spirit are in conjunction in man, so are they co-related throughout the universe. Spirit is able to manifest only through substance.

Music and Harmony

Harmony, or the music of the spheres as it is sometimes called is the direct result of Spirit in definite harmonious action.

The planes of action seem to be arranged and expressed, much as the octaves on the musical keyboard.

Between certain points of rhythm we get certain quality of tone in all its variations.

Starting with the octave based on natural C, the octave above or below produces the quality of tone that is expressed in the rhythm of its higher or lower pitch and thus produces its own tone, not out of harmony with the first, but when rightly placed, blending in perfect harmony with the first. So, the plane of life referred to as Spirit Life,

or Spirit World, is an expression of life and power, manifesting under perfectly natural laws, in a higher sphere or rhythm of expression than that of the mortal plane.

Mortal life, being analogous to the octave based on natural C we realize that the vibration of the Spirit World is the direct result of Spirit, in definite action, on a higher pitch or rhythm than that of the Mortal Plane.

There is an octave below the one we call "Mortal Life" which is known as the world of "Microscopic Life" which is as tangible and real as life in any of its manifestations. This octave is the lower pitch or rhythm.

All of these octaves melt and blend in perfect harmony, for the individual who is in a high mental and spiritual attitude and condition. He is then "At One" with them all and grows conscious of each and it is then that he realizes that "All This Boundless Universe Is Life," and "There Are No Dead."

Inspiration Perpetual

Inspiration, or the influx of ideas and promptings from the Spirit World, is not a miracle of a past age, but a perpetual fact, the ceaseless method of Infinite Intelligence for human elevation.

Why this impossibility? What does theory offer for explanation? For, to be sure -- there is a cause for everything!

Nothing Against Will

Any student of psychology will remember, first, that it is impossible to impress anyone to do something against his will. In other words, if the element of love or self-sacrifice is absent, the impression will be received negatively. The impression, therefore, fails to carry. Of course, if the one impressed fails to use his reasoning powers, and acquiesces, then his will could become subject to that of another. But it is obvious that there is seldom an instance where one person with such a real mind or will can be used advantageously for the good of another.

You may remember that lazy minds are here amendable, but their aid is not worth much. If any

Spiritual Sight Lost

In this deplorable state he is no more able to understand the earthly conditions and troubles that surround his mortal friend than the mortal himself. Upon this condition is brought a partial or even complete state of darkness. He loses his spiritual sight - his sense of more intellectually advanced spirits and mortals is consequently lacking. He has become in the colloquial expression, an *earth-bound spirit*.

The consequential result is, that our would be spirit guide and helper has become a floating intelligence. He can no longer help his mortal friend; the ability to travel, investigate, learn and study the earthly conditions is deprived him. Seeping with the selfishness of his own mortal friend, the spirit guide becomes powerless to aid. His mortal friend cannot possibly receive any aid from the spirit world for the gratification of selfish purposes.

Man wandered over the earth for ages, searching in all places, high and low, far and near, before he thought to look within himself for the divinity he sought. At last, slowly, dimly, he began to realize that what he thought was far off, hidden in "the pathos of distance" is nearer than the breath he breathes, even in his own heart.

Blind Souls

Blindness, one of the greatest handicaps, can also be a great teacher. When we first hear of those who have lost their sight, the idea of their new role in life seems unbearable. But is it! Observation over a period of time shows how the body and the other, intact, physical senses begin to work overtime to this necessary adjustment. It is not the least bit unusual for a blind man to develop extremely acute hearing -- far greater than he once possessed. Touch and vibration lend depth, shape and surface texture to objects which others full in sight never *see*. The little *vibrations* totally ignored by most of us paint clear pictures and help immeasurably in extending the judgment.

It amazes us to see blind people do things that we, who have full sight, cannot! Each physical sense learns to help the others compensate. Necessity and *will* unite in a working, breathing desire which provides the prodding factor to eventual success.

Another kind of blindness exists - that of the soul! Blind souls drift unaware of their handicap. Who are they? They are the greedy - the jealous and those with *closed minds*. The evidences resulting are egotistical, judgmental and frightened little souls. Blindness hampers their total life. Never are they free to enjoy living. An even greater effect is felt by all who come in contact with them. Blind souls must vent their frustrations. This release gives them the feeling of importance.


It isn't an easy task to awaken *spiritual sight*. Equally as difficult is the continuing development of this *sight*. It requires the soul to search out imperfections. It demands the release of yesterday's thinking. Once we realize the damage we do to ourselves we have a cornerstone to build upon.

As a child attending Christian catechism, I had to memorize the 13th Chapter of I Corithians. If anything was learned, it was fear and a feeling of inadequacy. Perhaps it was too much for a child to understand -- but that does not excuse my lack of understanding now as an adult. My spiritual sight was awakened into reality when I was able to grasp the meaning of our 7th Principle. "We affirm the moral responsibility of the individual and that he makes his own happiness or unhappiness as he obeys or disobeys nature's physical and spiritual laws." Then the true meaning of I Corithians, 13th Chapter, 11-12 verses became understandable. It reads "When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, but when I became a man I put away childish things. For now we see through a mirror darkly; but then face to face. Now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known."

The degree of *soul blindness* each possesses is a personal responsibility. Greed, jealousy and fear must be dealt with as we become aware of their presence. Constant reminders of the benefits are as near to us as our spiritual eyes will allow.

It is our greed for material possessions, jealousy of another's success and a mind that will not admit there is a need to change its thinking pattern that *delays* this awakening - for eventually, here or hereafter, it will become a reality.

The best way I can help myself is to polish my lenses and become so attractive to blind souls that they will want to glow as I do. If I intend to be a real Spiritualist, if I really care and want to share as I profess to, the only solution is less talk and more action or I will once again become one of the *blind souls*. I *do* have a choice! So do you!
