Foreword

In "Views Of Our Heavenly Home" Andrew Jackson Davis attempts to give us at least some conception of the Great Univercoelum as he names the greater overall Universe. If it would



seem to tax our imagination, he as much as says, "so be it!" To quote him: "Such contemplations are wholesome, invigorating, ennobling, exalting; and you are therefore urged, because you are a spirit, and because you are destined to live an eternal life, to think upon and familiarize your reason with questions of eternity."

Materialists believe that the marvels of the human mind are totally derived from body chemistry creating galvanic action of an electro magnetic nature to somehow act upon the human brain and it then produces amazing mental activity. They have never come close to explaining how all this is accomplished.

On the other hand many interested in Spiritualism are of the opinion that all our thoughts are derived from spirits standing by our side, making every decision for us, without allowing for any intellect inherent in the individual. This would result in the mind being merely an instrument for use by disembodied mentalities.

Both of these viewpoints are far from the truth. From the Spiritualistic viewpoint, the power of vision is not projected into the mediums mind, but is made available for the medium to attain. A form of magnetism must be present for suitable conditions.

Doctor Davis says that, "clairvoyance is as if one looked inward through their eyes instead of outward. It is an internal vision." There are many forms of mediumship from simple to highly advanced such as telescopic by which it is conceivable that all the universe can be sought out so that nothing is really concealed. Naturally this is extremely uncommon. In all forms of mediumship the senses are opened from within to a higher level of consciousness.

Following death the near world of matter melts away and the seemingly far off spiritual universe sweeps into your immediate presence.

Davis uses the term psychophonetics for what we more commonly refer to as clairaudience. Spirit sound vibrates through a finer substance than our common air and these sound waves touch only the internal ear of the spirit. This talent can be a great blessing or a great misfortune when a medium can only tune in on the lower vibrations because of incomplete development.

Davis says that becoming a part of higher spiritual consciousness can only be of briefest duration while in the physical state. The body and circumstances make such demands as to maintain a separation between the two states of consciousness. He says you cannot exist consciously in both worlds at the same time. We are subject in affect to a dual consciousness.

Human affections flow undecisively from the center of love according to attraction. It is only the will which can control it to good purpose. Mind obeys the will and matter obeys the will; for without will both mind and matter would be lifeless and formless. When will is dedicated to pure purpose it can overcome all negative conditions. When will is manifested toward evil it then becomes your devil.

To the average religious person the uncertainty, obscurity, doubt and anxiety associated with death multiplies an undefinable cloud of blackness over the tomb. However Emanuel Swedenborg from 1747 to 1770 revealed the nature of the Spirit World and that everything worthwhile was inspired by it.

Throughout the centuries there are such changes of understanding that past writings require interpretation and they in turn require reinterpretation as time goes on. As an instance Swedenborg brought new light to parts of the Bible and his writings in turn require further interpretation to be well understood today. Davis asserts that this may be required of his own writings someday.

The fact that Davis did not use fables, symbols, hidden meanings, signs and secrets adds greater permanence to his writings.

Everything is surrounded by an atmosphere of particles which form an aura and contain characteristics of that which it surrounds. A man's qualities are revealed in his aura. A dog can find his master by trailing his aura.

A Pythagorean Philosopher of the first century named Appolonius performed many healings and virtually taught Spiritualism. He was regarded as super human by people at that time.

In the history of religion there has been new dispensations following each other. Each acted as a revolution at the time. Moses rejected much of the existing religion including Pagan authorities. Jesus rejected Jewish authorities and Spiritualism rejects Christian authorities. Do these revolutions mean that God has changed each time? No the immutable is without change. All must be subject to revision in the light of truth as it becomes revealed. Man has not been capable of encompassing all truth and must forever seek to expand his knowledge of it.

Common people have always been impressed by ceremony whether from aristocracy or religious ceremonial. Davis says, "the more the substance the less the show; the greatness of truth renders the littleness of forms contemptible."

The human body is an essential instrument of spirit. Any indulgence which tends to destroy it is violation. Cheerfulness is an all healing medicine. It can contribute to health and happiness.

It is futile to depend on your ancestors for quality. You must earn it for yourself in present merit not by reputation.

The Christian religion was founded by the apostles and not by Jesus. Every important precept of the early Christians was previously taught by Greek philosophers and Roman teachers. For instance, Epictetus a Roman slave taught patience, perseverance, brotherly kindness and charity. Surely these became Christian virtues.

Nearly everyone's concept of right and wrong is greatly influenced by his hereditary environment. It is right if it conforms to what he has been raised in. True justice is another matter. It is revealed from within through intuition. Washington is quoted as saying, "Labor to keep alive in your breast that little spark of celestial fire called conscience."

Mind Power In Action

Health and healing is a goal pursued by many but achieved by few. The attributes of good health

are among the most valued possessions a person can have, for without health, little enjoyment can be found in anything. Nothing in the world is without its price. Everything, without exception, must be worked for or earned *including health*.

However, as Spiritualists we recognize means and methods of healing not yet

This intelligence is an individualized segment of the consciousness of God.

If we believe our ontology we recognize that we all have the attributes, power, and talents that we ascribe to our God. These powers have been demonstrated time and again by the great Masters of the Ages.

Unfortunately, in most people these powers, or faculties are yet in embryo - undeveloped and unawakened - available in potential but not yet in evolution.

Through long ages man has accepted many false beliefs and has acquired many inhibitions, most of these are still with us confining our minds more rigidly than prison bars and chains. We are captives of our mental ideas, slaves to our concepts and prisoners of our own thinking. Often it takes a

long time to change our thinking. Constant vigil is required to reform our ideas in order to accept greater realizations about ourselves and our inherent potentials.

Some people refuse to recognize the powers which lie dormant within. Two men of my acquaintance are particularly susceptible to the power of suggestion. Tell them they look poorly, and repeat it every few minutes and soon they go in search of a doctor. There are also people who have every type of illness and go from doctor to doctor seeking aid for their imagined illness.

These people leave the door open for illness and negative situations due to their improper thinking, actually they bring upon themselves the

very things they fear.

Thoughts are things, and this has been proven. We are the generators of thought, and thought is registered as energy. Our thoughts create, out of the divine essence of life, the effects or results which are our lives.

We are all aware of the experiment where by concentrating on the back of the neck of a person we can cause that person to turn around. In the process of concentrating we create a field of energy and direct this energy toward the subject. He feels this energy hit him at the base of the skull, and soon turns around looking for the source.

He has been affected by the energy released from the mind; it hit its mark and had a visible effect. This example is only meant to show that there is unused power within the mind that can be tapped for our own good as well as to benefit our fellow man. After getting the baby settled for the night the mother sat nearby and began to pray with all her heart to God that the child might be enabled to recover and live out its normal span of life. She prayed with great emotion. Finally she knew she had prayed long enough. She ended with words to this effect: "Father, Thy will be done."

Then she rose from the chair and returned to her lonely vigil near the bedside. During the night the child's fever broke. A few days later the doctor pronounced the child fully recovered from his illness.

A miracle? A prayer answered? Yes and No! The mother, even though she knew nothing of the laws of life, had automatically invoked one of the great principles of life. Through her prayer or petition to the Cosmic, or God, she was concentrating the psychic energy around her. Her emotions gave the prayer greater vitality, and when she placed the child in the hands of God by saying "Father, Thy will be done", she released this energy from herself and it travelled to the child. Healing was a direct result.

We as Spiritualists are learning to apply these natural laws to bring benefit to our lives. We are learning that results always follow according to our faith. Not faith as the theologians would explain but according to the energy we expend and the knowledge we have about their application.

In absent healing we concentrate the energy around us and put life into it, and then release it to travel to the object of our desire. And in direct proportion to our efforts so it is done. We are the ones who create this package of psychic energy this spark of healing. The results are according to our desire to help.

We likewise use this same energy when

concentrating on any part of our own body. We are vitalizing it and pouring the strength of mind into that part or organ. We cannot help but become well, or stronger. The next time you experience a headache, injury, bruise, etc. touch that part with your hand, and mentally command the area to be well. Simply make the mental command: be healed. Put sincere energy into the command and the results may astonish you.

From personal experience I can tell you this method works. It will work for you according to your faith and the amount of psychic energy you expend.

A man met the plague on the road to Damascus. "Where are you going?" asked the man. "To kill 50,000 people," replied the plague. A month later they met again going in opposite directions. "You told me wrong," said the man to the plague. "You said you would kill only 50,000 people and yet 100,000 people died!" "I kept my word," said the plague. "I killed 50,000 people - the other 50,000 died of fear!"

Nature operates on a perfect balance. There must be a perfect blending of positive and negative. Pain, discomfort, and even transition are all a part of the balance of nature. All forms of life are kept in balance by some other form of life.

Man is also subject to the law of balance. There must be an outlet for his emotions or his feelings remain buried within and generate serious trouble later. These feelings keep us unbalanced and eventually we become ill. Illness, or lack, is a sign of imbalance - not punishment - as religion would have us believe. Imbalance of either the positive or the negative essence means we have leaned too far to one side and must be brought back into perfect balance.

The psychic energy we transmit should be guarded carefully for it can be either good or badlove or hate! If sent in hatred, it can cause discomfort and pain to the receiver. It will also bounce back to the sender, with greater force, and cause him harm. This mental power is often misused in a moment of anger or disagreement. The power comes from the same source. Its use makes the difference.

From the nectar of the flower the bee makes a little honey. Enough for himself and a little for man as well. From the same nectar the spider makes poison to kill its victims.

Mind is the master over all matter. To show man the way to use his dormant powers and abilities and help him realize that he is a part of the consciousness of God is the purpose of Spiritualism. This is the driving force of our helpers of the higher realms.

As we study and learn these universal laws - so too shall our consciousness expand. As we direct ourselves toward the light of the Cosmic Powers within ourselves - so shall we live in peace, harmony, happiness, and health. As we make man better - so will the world be better.

"Timely Reflections"

Fellow Spiritualists:

I am trying to be worthy of the column, "Timely Reflections." On occasions, I find current events and



persons illustrative of the Spiritualist philosophy and understanding, even though it is not literally identified per se as Spiritualism. At other times, it seems appropriate to delve deeply into the rich spiritual storehouse of treasures of the Spirit, which have been taught and demonstrated by our mediums and teachers who are now in the larger, freer dimensions and expressions of the Spirit World.

Recently two specific events occurred, one receiving wide publicity, and the other more limited exposure, yet evoking an articulate comparison of true spiritual values all the world is akin to.

William O. Douglas, for more than 36 years a judge on the bench of the U.S. Supreme Court, made his transition. The history of his life and philosophy was repeated in the press media for the benefit of the newer generations. It told of the two most significant interests and activities of his life his love of the beauties of nature in the Pacific Northwest, and his undying fight for the legal and moral rights of the individual to think for himself. Oft times, he found himself greatly outnumbered in the decisions rendered by the court in various controversial cases. But he was never outnumbered in the spirit and motivation of his untrammeled, vigorous beliefs in the dignity of each person, whatever his race, creed or nationality. At his funeral, with high government dignitaries present, one of the hymns played was a favorite of Spiritualists for many years, "Shall We Gather at the River." My thought was, "Another eloquent yet unmentioned example of our philosophy so closely woven into the lives of so many of humanity who may not always call themselves Spiritualists." But are they materialists? Far from it! In the modern onrush of scientific discoveries of man's subjective nature and being, the old,

stubborn, orthodox, skeptical protest of the materialist has given way to what is almost a universal belief and faith in the continuity and immortality of the individual soul. In fact, when you examine the dogma of the Catholic, Protestant, Jew, Moslem, etc., you find it all leads to the premise of the Spiritualist - that man is spirit now, and always. What is a man's faith? What is his religion? Whatever it is called, it leads straight to Spiritualism! I am almost persuaded that it is the universal truth of pure Spiritualism which actually unites all religions. Most differ only in their historic, traditional approach to God. Is it possible we have misjudged and labelled ourselves? Are we not surrounded by millions of Catholic Spiritualists, Protestant Spiritualists, Jewish Spiritualists? Maggie Waite was a Catholic; Joseph Benjamin a Jewish medium, etc.

I will never forget at the National Convention of 1952 at Tulsa, Oklahoma, when the constitutional change was voted to add"Of Churches" to the official title of National Spiritualist Association, the main objector was Rev. Joseph P. Whitwell. Despite more than 90 years of age, he reminded us that Spiritualism is much more than a belief, faith and religion, and could more properly be identified as an organization of societies than churches, which latter appellation it did not need.

On a Public Broadcasting Station Hugh Downs recently interviewed 96 year old Robert Baldwin, who founded the American Civil Liberties Union many years ago. Vigorous and alert at this advanced age he stated his "secret" of keeping young was perhaps that he never had a fight with anyone literally or physically. Yet he had devoted many years to fighting for the *principle of democracy*, and had to disagree with millions of people without himself becoming disagreeable. Our Spiritualist pioneers called this, "Under all circumstances, keep an even mind", and associate without friction.

Of current interest, Mr. Baldwin also realistically admitted the problems and disappointment of having to deal with the political philosophy of Communism. The 1917 revolution in Russia to throw off the despotism of the Czar, has developed a tyranny of domination and regimentation in the hearts and minds of their own people, with dangerous and destructive efforts to impose such a will on others, and enslave lives and spirits.

A great unanimity of advanced souls - not only in age, but in wisdom - have openly expressed their belief in *immortality* including Benjamin Franklin, Thomas Jefferson, Abraham Lincoln, Thomas Paine, and so many others.

Every person who desires healing needs to attune his or her own mind and spirit, so that the forces can operate successfully.

If the desire of the patient is not as sincere as it ought to be; if there be skepticism, or lack of faith, or timidity, or a marked state of nervousness on the part of the person under treatment, a genuine spirit healer, backed by the influences of the spirit forces will be impressed with the right thing to do or say to bring that patient into perfect attunement with the forces; then the results which follow may be called genuine Spirit Healing.

There must be sincerity of purpose. There must be an absorbing desire free from anxiety, to be made well. There must be honesty in acknowledging mentally the least evidence of relief. There must be absolute faith that relief will come if attuned to receive; yet the lack of faith does not hinder as much as ingratitude, insincerity, a disposition to mentally dictate to the spirit forces just how and what they are to do, and a promise to the operator that if he effects a cure he will be made famous, when in fact he has nothing at all to do with the relief desired except to make of himself a willing instrument. When results do not follow, it is generally because the patient is not in

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full sympathy with the treatment, or is carrying some selfish and ungrateful thought so deeply that he does not realize that selfishness, ingratitude, jealousy, a dictatorial spirit are stumbling blocks to progress and an absolute impediment to spirit relief.

Spirit Healing forces will not receive dictation. Spirit forces will do all they can for the relief of suffering persons, when such persons place themselves willingly and prayerfully into their hands and through the operator become attuned to conditions. Most marvelous results have been attained when conditions are right - results so marvelous and numerous the recital of which would fill many volumes.

Relaxation in mind and body must be complete. Trust in the Spirit must be full. A willingness to accept the relief in whatever manner the forces are able to bring. All stiffness, positiveness, selfishness and dictation must be abandoned for the time being as disastrous hindrances.

It does not matter what we call this wonderful force; we may call it God, the Christ or Spirit; it is an acknowledged power. It works with the poor as well as with the rich. Money does not influence this power, but those carrying enmity, hatred,

Certificates At A Price
(Taken from a 1924 Associated Press release)

The Associated Press has broadcasted from Los Angeles an apparent attempt on the part of an independent Spiritualist association to make merchandise of church charters, ordinations to the ministry and certificates of healers and mediums for a money consideration, instead of bestowing same in accordance with individual qualifications and high standards.

"The president of the National Independent Spiritualists' Association, and ten other officers and directors of the organization, were named in warrants issued charging criminal conspiracy, fraud and lesser offenses.

"The warrants are based on the alleged issuance to a Los Angeles Times reporter of a certificate of ordination as a minister of the gospel, a charter for a church and an indorsement as a spiritual healer and medium, for a consideration of \$150.

"According to the certificate held by the Times investigator, who states he applied for the document under an assumed name, he is 'authorized to solemnize marriages, officiate at funerals and to perform all other duties that may devolve upon him as a minister of the gospel and philosophy of Spiritualism"."

Dates change, but many of the problems remain the same. The benefits afforded through the educational arm of the National Spiritualist Association of Churches (N.S.A.C.) attract many independents seeking certification. The programs represent the best available anywhere, despite the criticisms leveled by outside groups.

N.S.A.C. and its Bureau of Education, Morris Pratt Institute, are, in fact, the model others seek to emulate. The best is always copied. Even the protective system which automatically accompanies certification through the Morris Pratt Institute and the N.S.A.C. is the envy of every other Spiritualist group.

Productivity and Receptivity

The spiritual law of productivity and receptivity manifests itself in our daily lives, - on the various levels spiritually, mentally, materially, emotionally, and through mediumship. This law is important to all Spiritualists and all interested in growing beyond the traits of materiality.

To be a productive individual implies continuous growth on the part of the individual. Receptivity hinges on *how* open an individual is to

new ideas, thoughts, and procedures.

New things that are learned must have time to set in the mind, to later be applied in life situations. So many have said, particularly in the case of spiritual growth, "there are times for growing, learning new things, high periods, low periods, then periods for assimilating, applying and evaluating the results".

In Spiritualism we often hear people speak of spiritual growth. Sometimes I wonder if they realize the full weight of the subject. Being a receptive and productive individual requires a lot of hard work -- a lifetime process. Being a receptive and productive person totals more than talk. You may be mentally asking yourself, "Okay, what can I do?"

New Year's resolutions offer a perfect opportunity for me to reply. How did you do in the past year of meeting the short term and long term goals set in your resolutions? Review and evaluate. Do you make new goals every year for yourself? You must if you expect to grow! From time to time during the year I see how I am progressing. This is a very important feature as one needs to receive that all important reassurance.

I'm saddened that most New Year's resolutions end up disguarded within the first month. This inaction earmarks the year's first failures. A person must make realistic goals. If he does not, then he is setting himself up for failure over success. Of course, everyone wishes to be successful. Short term goals provide the *push* for long term successes. Early successes also give one extra courage to work harder to reach the long-term goals.

One observation most of us have made about goal-setting is that a person is happiest when striving to learn, grow, or reach something new. This is not meant to imply that people do not have down periods, for we all do. *Down* times are periods best for R & R - rest and relaxation. All

play or work makes life seem dull and boring.

In growing spiritually we must be open to new ideas. This, by the way, is an excellent feature about Spiritualism. It openly accepts new thoughts and ideas. A person trying to grow spiritually must be willing to do and practice those things which will help him grow. Attending development classes, praying, meditating, reading, and healthy associations are all indicative of growth. Attending church, and helping others, whenever the opportunity presents itself, represents a sincere sequence of action which will raise yourself higher. spiritually. Following nature's physical and spiritual laws adds to your worth. All the talk in the world will not make someone a spiritual being or help his spiritual growth. When ve set spiritual goals for ourselves, we must do it with our eyes open, and must be willing to do the things that are necessary. There are no short cuts to spiritual growth! But it all starts with that first step.

The exciting part about growing spiritually is when some new understanding comes to you, you realize why certain things in your life have happened. When a person experiences success in growing spiritually, there is no *high* equal to it. It reflects inner soul happiness, the ultimate -- when

one grows spiritually.

One is usually happy when also growing mentally; because he's involved in learning. This is why I have resolved to be a perpetual student, all of my life.

I have certain spiritual goals that will take me the rest of my life to learn. Mentally, I wish to become an excellent writer, lecturer, minister, poet, educator among many other desires. When the roll is called up yonder I want the toil to account for something worthwhile in the eyes of my spirit teachers. I want to learn how success really operates in a person's life so that I can help others to achieve. Mentally, I would like to learn for myself how to be positive most of the time, to erase life's downside.

Mental satisfaction is achieved differently by different people. Part of being mentally successful is being able to look in the mirror and say "I am proud of who I am". It goes without saying that wishing to be someone else doesn't work. We can all make improvements in ourselves but to be happy we must be so mentally. To be happy mentally we must constantly grow, in some way. We also must be positive in our pursuits. What we think and desire has a direct bearing on that which

we attract back to ourselves. "As a man thinketh, so is he." If we are truly to be the architects of our own mental destinies, then we must be in control of the types of thoughts we send out into the universal ethers. It would seem that in our growth we should try to develop all the parts of ourselves to the very best.

Many of us desire material growth and expansion. In fact, most of the talk today is directed at a better material life. This is quite a natural thing. Life begins on this earth plane, on the material level. Since we live in a material world we should attempt to make the best of it. This does not mean that we all need to live in gold palaces. But we should learn how to do the best with what we have -- how to turn that which we do have into the best possible uses, if material abundance is our desire.

It pays to include the art of treasure mapping, in our arsenal -- the spiritual law of desire, and attraction. Treasure mapping for material abundance can be applied at any level, personal or group, such as a church. We can cut out pictures, draw, whatever we like, but in keeping all spiritual laws in mind. It does work! We must see outwardly, visualize inwardly, desire, and attract back to us those things which we desire. However, decide what you want first. You may end up with it!

Consider developing your hidden talents. Investigate new ideas which appear fruitful. Together they may help bring you material abundance. Many people have talents which they cut-off in growth while still a child.

The emotions must be educated also. As young children we tended to be selfish, emotionally. We wanted what we wanted when we wanted it. As a rule the needs and desires of others were never considered. As we begin to grow up, usually we grow emotionally. It is when people cease to grow emotionally that problems develop. They have troubles establishing satisfactory, loving relationships, even with brothers and sisters, but especially friends, peers, mates and bossess.

Growing emotionally concerns our feelings of love, joy, sadness, courage, fear, and the ability to deal with the emotions of others. Many cannot establish successful marriages because one of the partners has not grown up emotionally. More often than not the *field of honor*, dividing the two remains fed by individual selfishness! Occasionally one will seek to dominate the other. This also shows a lack of emotional growth on the part of both partners — one for doing it, the other for allowing it to happen.

We absolutely must grow emotionally, all of

our lives! Sometimes people cannot stand any kind of constructive criticism. These individuals labor under false delusions! A lot of people have seen fit to tell me of my shortcomings but for the most part I am grateful; because I realize they were right. A person must be open and allow for this sort of thing, though.

The law of productivity and receptivity effects a medium's life. A medium must constantly be open to growth and be able to produce good demonstrations of spirit messages. I certainly would not want to go to a medium who was mediocre, who did not read books, study new ideas or try to understand spiritual laws. Of all the people in the world who need to understand the law of receptivity and productivity it should be the medium, for he or she is in the position to help many people.

If a medium is to grow and be productive she must be in constant contact with her spirit teachers, for her spirit teachers can help her grow in ways that she cannot do on her own.

When one meditates, one learns certain wisdoms often not found in literature. For the same reasons a minister should understand and be able to apply this very important law of productivity and receptivity. One should also be aware that if he knows and understands certain laws, a responsibility goes with the knowledge. Spiritual growth depends upon your help of others. In a very true sense, you commit a crime against yourself when you do not help others!

Happy people are also productive people. They are open to new ideas and thoughts. They are constantly concerned about growing, and helping others to grow.

Let us start today, to strive to manifest productivity and receptivity in our daily lives.

Our Friends The Indians

At the time of its discovery, the United States contained more than 20,000 tribes of Indians, comprising nearly one million Indians. Because of social and economic necessity an Indian community hardly ever consisted of more than one hundred fifty people. When a tribe reached a number beyond that limit its government very often became too complicated to work efficiently or the food supply proved inadequate. It then would be necessary for a part of the group to leave and start out on its own.

In the past fifty years some of the fifty-eight original parent families have become extinct. However the names of Pontiac, Tecumseh, Red Jacket, Cornplanter, etc., will live in history as great leaders of their tribes.

Through music, dances, rites and rituals, the Indian expressed his relationship to nature and the mysteries of the spirit world.

An Indian's religion is contained within his ancient dances, ceremonies and legends. His religious ceremonies reflected and expressed a deep knowledge of his own limitations as a mere human being. The primitive world in which he lived was often an unfriendly place and constantly presented him with many hardships of survival. The problems of securing food and combating diseases, for instance, were often found to be insurmountable and beyond his powers as a mere man. At these times he strongly felt the need of help of something beyond himself. In order to face the daily task of living he appealed for help to the benevolent forces in the unseen world of the supernatural.

Throughout the thousands of years of their cultural growth, the many different Indian families developed their own individual procedures of appealing to the gods and spirits for aid in curing illness, causing the animal food supply to multiply, and making planted crops and wild vegetables grow. This is not meant to suggest that the Indian was lazy or that he left the responsibilities of providing sustenance to the spirit world - the Indian worked hard at survival.

The Indian conception of the supernatural was not that of one single power or God who represented all the forces of good. All power of good and evil was felt by the Indian to be that which permeated the whole universe - presenting itself at times helpful and at other times harmful, depending upon the manner in which it was approached. The feeling among some tribes was

that supernatural power was particularly embodied in great birds, powerful beasts of prey, who were much more capable than man in the ways of protecting themselves and finding good. There are many tribal legends telling of the belief that at one time, when the earth was first inhabited, these animals had human form and later abandoned it for the powerful and more advantageous forms of feathered and furred animals. This human association with animals in legend was the basis upon which the Indian felt permitted and qualified to call upon his animal brothers for help in meeting a difficult life.



Among the Algonquins no child - boy or girl-could come into maturity without having had a dream in which the powers of nature promised success and courage in their adult life. When he entered adolescence, the Algonquin child was required to spend many lonely nights in the forest, fasting and waiting, until the Thunderbird, the Sun or other power had spoken to him. If the powers did not speak he was considered a poor, unfortunate person with little hope of success in life.

Only the young boys of the Sioux of the Plains were required to receive a vision. When the proper time came, the youth took a sweat bath in a tiny hut where steam was made by pouring water over hot stones. In this manner his outward body was made pure. He then went to a lonely spot out of the sight of human beings where his inner body was purified by prolonged fasting which sometimes lasted for as long as ten days or more. During the period of fasting he wept out of his great desire to invoke the presence of the spirits.

"Have pity on me! Have pity on me!" he would cry. Sometimes he might even cut off one of his fingers as an offering. He would cry, "Oh great spirit of the Sun I cannot offer you animals or plants for they are not mine to offer. They already belong to the great Wakanda. I therefore, can only rightfully give you of my own flesh and blood."

There are many methods among the different tribes to bring about a vision. In the Rocky Mountains area a youth might leap into a deep-dark pool at night and remain submerged to meet the powers beneath the waters. Some customs required the boy to wait alone until the vision or dream appeared which showed him how the world began. Among the Papago of the Southwest, a boy might wait for the wise song of the eagle to speak of him.

Whenever the vision or dream came, a secret bond and understanding was made with the spirit power. A song or formula was given to the dreamer so that he might call the spirit in time of need. This was his private password to the ears of the supernatural. For instance, if the vision was that of an eagle which spoke to the dreamer, he might paint or carve his possessions with the image of the bird or wear its claws or feathers.

Good health, hunting, crops and visions were provided by the powerful magic of the Indians' masks and medicine men.

Indians lived a primitive existence and, naturally, were greatly preoccupied with the ever present prospect of being stricken with a horrible and inescapable sickness. It is easy to understand why, then, the most powerful of all unknown powers were believed by them to be concerned with disease. Their conception of sickness was rather simple and they knew little of the symptoms of different diseases. Their main concern was primarily oriented about the basic cause of an illness and this was felt to have originated in the spirit world.

Most Indians were able to contact the spirit world through visions and experiences of fantasy from time to time. These moments, however, were infrequent and not always to be depended upon. This was the lot of the common Indian. There were however, specially favored individuals whose visions and experiences were more frequent and intense than the common man's. These few gifted persons were the medicine men whose lives were dedicated to the task of gaining power over the evil that lurked in the unseen world. Their knowledge of medicine consisted of curative herbs, bandaging, and bonesetting - nothing more. The cures they practiced were faith cures and the banishment of evil was accomplished through singing, using

feathers to brush evil away, and using tobacco smoke to blow it away. This may seem ridiculous to many people today but the fact remains that in many instances, cures were accomplished by the strength of faith received through the presence and encouragement of the medicine man. In view of what is being discovered today in the field of modern psychosomatic medicine, this curing becomes much more easy to believe and understand. The medicine man brought hope, understanding and confidence to his patient and, in many cases, these elements proved as powerful as any modern medicine would have been. Without the will and hope for life, few modern medicines have much effect.

No people ever showed more understanding or took more care and patience in the treatment of infants than the Indians. An Indian baby was treated with great respect in a family. The treatment included the consideration of the infant's intelligence in addition to its needs. What the Indian lacked in the benefits of modern medicine he more than compensated for in the use of good common sense, and the display of a genuine love for the infant at all times. Babies were thought to have a language of their own, and it was the language of the land of baby souls that the infant was thought to speak in its early youth. Everything possible was done for the infant to make him happy and want to stay alive to grow into adulthood. Sick children were often isolated from others in an effort to prevent the spreading of disease. Parents took special care to maintain a happy home, for the belief was that quarelling and unhappy thoughts could make a child ill.

From birth, the Indian children were taught to live close to the spirits and the world of light. Due to these teachings, they had no fear of death. They were taught that when the right time came they would hear the call of the Great White Spirit, and would leave their earthly body to reside in "the land of the hereafter."

by the late Rev. A. Cervin

"All religions have sprung from Spirit Communications."

"Proof of Spirit return sets aside the sentence of death."

To whom these quotations belong the passage of time has left no record. The words, however, are very much a part and parcel of the reality of Spiritualism.

Truth in all its beauty has been hovering over us since the dawn of history, but man's spiritual nature has been imprisoned in creedal darkness and has never been allowed to rise above this dogmatic tomb — with all its bewildering security, promised after death, filled with superstition and fear. And when, at last, the hour of death has come it finds men crying as infants at the separation of the spiritual and the physical, not knowing of the grand and glorious entrance into the Spirit World.

It has been a common idea in religious circles that it is sinful to peer into the future, and we are told that God has tenderly veiled our eyes, as to the future. We have but to look into the Bible to relieve the skeptical mind, then let us say that the Bible is full or prophecy. Some deny the prophecy and clairvoyant expressions recorded in the Bible, such as when Saul went to the clairvoyant to inquire about his father's animals. Those who would deny demonstrations of spirit should also deny the story of the Woman of Endor, which depicts so beautifully the fact of spirit return and the folly of man's efforts to suppress communication with the Spirit World.

Man, the creature made in the image of God, the creator, can rise to his real heights, only in intelligent understanding. To stumble along down the endless land of life without intelligent aim and purpose is the fate of those who walk blindly in ignorance. But when man's eyes are opened by knowledge, he builds and creates with understanding. Then indeed, he is a child of God.

It is recorded in the 18th Chapter of Genesis that Abraham was visited by angels, and he brought water that their feet might be washed and Sarah, his wife, prepared food and they did eat.

In Judges, 6:11, it is recorded that an angel came and sat with Gideon under an oak tree and said unto him, "The Lord is with thee," then giving unto Gideon a test by fire, he vanished from Gideon's sight.

In the 16th Chapter of St. Luke it is recorded that a certain rich man, who on earth had been clothed in purple and fine linen and who dined sumptuously every day, - upon dying, passed to a place of extreme punishment and suffering. In his agony, it is stated that he called out to "Father Abraham" to send Lazarus to quench his thirst, and if that could not be done, then at least send someone to his five brothers who were living on earth to warn them, that they might not meet the same fate as he. And it is said that Abraham replied, "Your brothers have Moses and the Prophets". Does not this recorded conversation give evidence that prophets (or mediums) are messengers from the World of Spirit? This conversation in the Spirit World (if real) could not have been recorded in our language unless it had been heard by man on the earth plane or transmitted to man by means of mediumship. Thus, from out of the world of spirit came the admonition, not to make so many mistakes and commit so many grievous wrongs on earth, and so avoid the unhappy consequence.

When all is said and done, we feel compelled to admit that all religions have sprung from spirit communion, otherwise there exists no foundation for any religion to find security in any spiritual truth.

If man has not written all that has been recorded of an after life through spirit influence, then all that has been written is imaginary, and the writings have no foundation. In which case we may as well side with St. Paul, when he wrote the 15th Chapter of Corinthians: "If the dead rise not, then has Christ not arisen and our teaching is in vain."

In the final review of life all will be dealt with according to eternal justice. If man has never heard the voice of spirit, then we must question the correctness of the First Chapter of Genesis where it is recorded that God said, "Let us make man in our own image and likeness." If not more than one God if only one were speaking, why the use of the word us? and if mortal ears did not hear that conversation, must there not be something wrong in that chapter? Could man have written a record

of something which had never been heard?

As we look behind the curtain that separates the seen from the unseen we find man in his activities in the two worlds. We find him building his tomorrow with his acts of today, painting his life's picture as he goes along, paving the way for his future with his actions of today. We know that not one of his thoughts or acts on earth shall be missing on his report card as it unfolds to him on his entry into the Spirit World, -- good or bad.

A life full of error cannot indicate progression or promote happiness for anyone. For a life lead under the guidance of angels, filled with noble deeds, charity, and tolerance -- victory is assured

and happiness is attained.

The question is often asked, "Can you prove Spiritualism by the Bible?" The obvious is not correct. The Bible is a book of records, showing a period of man's life on earth in bygone ages of crudeness, prejudice and superstition, coupled with frequent mention of spirit manifestations. Spirit manifestations of the present time are evidence of the truth of spirit communication and as such constitute evidence that because they occur today, they could have occurred thousands of years ago, under similar conditions.

Spiritualism proves its philosophy through its phenomena. "The Spirits of the Prophets are subject to the Prophets," and even time's remorseless doom shall not dull one ray of man's

spiritual glory.

By understanding the voiceless language of spirit and in being guided through life by spirit helpers, it will be comparatively easy to fill this life on the mundane plane with deeds that will raise us to higher vibrations and bring higher understanding. We are here to work out our destiny and salvation.

No more is ever expected than we can do. But we shall have to take home with us all of the product of our life's labor. Our life's accomplishment, in this arena of life, shall be our

judgment upon our entry into spirit life.

Each man creates his own destiny. In the time of Augustine there lived in Palestine a Jewish teacher who was able to gather around him twelve poor men, who believed him to be the Messiah. His teachings and his way of living so enraged the priesthood of that day that they had him arrested and then forced the authorities to condemn him to death. He was fearless of death and even rebuked those who wanted to protect him. He knew life was master over death. Therefore, to prove the truth of life after death, which he had always taught, he accepted the cruel and painful death upon the cross, and later said to his loved ones,

"Be not afraid; it is I."

Time has added much of fable around these facts and around this figure has gathered a mass of sentiment which has become the symbol of Christianity. He is the God of the many -- and other than He, they have no God.

The twentieth century seems to have lost the real Jesus beneath a mass of accumulated lore and myth, and the problem, to many thinking men, has become so acute that they cry out, "Let us strip the man of Galilee of all these robes and trappings and bring back the real truth, free from dogma, superstition and prejudice."

Let us work forward with a supreme determination to follow our ideal of truth, unmindful of the price. Let us be willing to live and to speak the best that we know, and, without flinching, assert that if spirit communion is not true, then there is no foundation of any religion, and all that has been written about man's future throughout the ages is a fabrication without any foundation to rest upon.

But thank God, today, all over the world, there are men and women who, with one accord, testify that spirit communication is a fact and that Spiritualism is true. The world has lost its fear of death and man has found absolute security in his future life through spirit communion.

Transitions

In addition to his Rochester residence, Mr. Titus retained a home at Lily Dale, N.Y. and was a well known worker at the Lily Dale Assembly. His credits include authoring several books among them "Eternal Progression".

The Arndt Funeral Home of Rochester prepared the physical body for cremation and a memorial service will be held later in the summer at Lily Dale.

Parapsychologist Passes Into Memory

American psychologist-parapsychologist Joseph Banks Rhine slipped into the annals of time Wednesday, February 20, 1980. The eighty-four year old researcher coined the term extrasensory perception. Editor of the Journal of Parapsychology, he wrote widely on psychic research, a field which was often identified as his creation. His works include Extra-Sensory Perception in 1934, New Frontiers of the Mind in 1937, The Reach of the Mind in 1947, and New World of the Mind in 1953.

Dr. Rhine received his Ph.D. in 1925 at the University of Chicago. He joined the faculty at Duke University in 1928, where he taught psychology. In 1940, he became the director of the parapsychology laboratory there. His studies were often the subject of skepticism. Nevertheless, the Waterloo, Pa. man later became accepted and classed with Freud and Einstein in their attempts to revolutionize man's perception of himself.

Although he held himself aloof from direct association with members of Modern Spiritualism, his studies indirectly helped to lend scientific credit to the work of serious mediums. His transition marks the passing of another pioneer.

Griner, Lillian, age 95, of Bloomington, Indiana, made the transition to spirit in February. Miss Griner was a long-time Spiritualist, who was active in Bloomington's Spiritualist Church in the 1920's which was lead by Daisy Lane.





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
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
