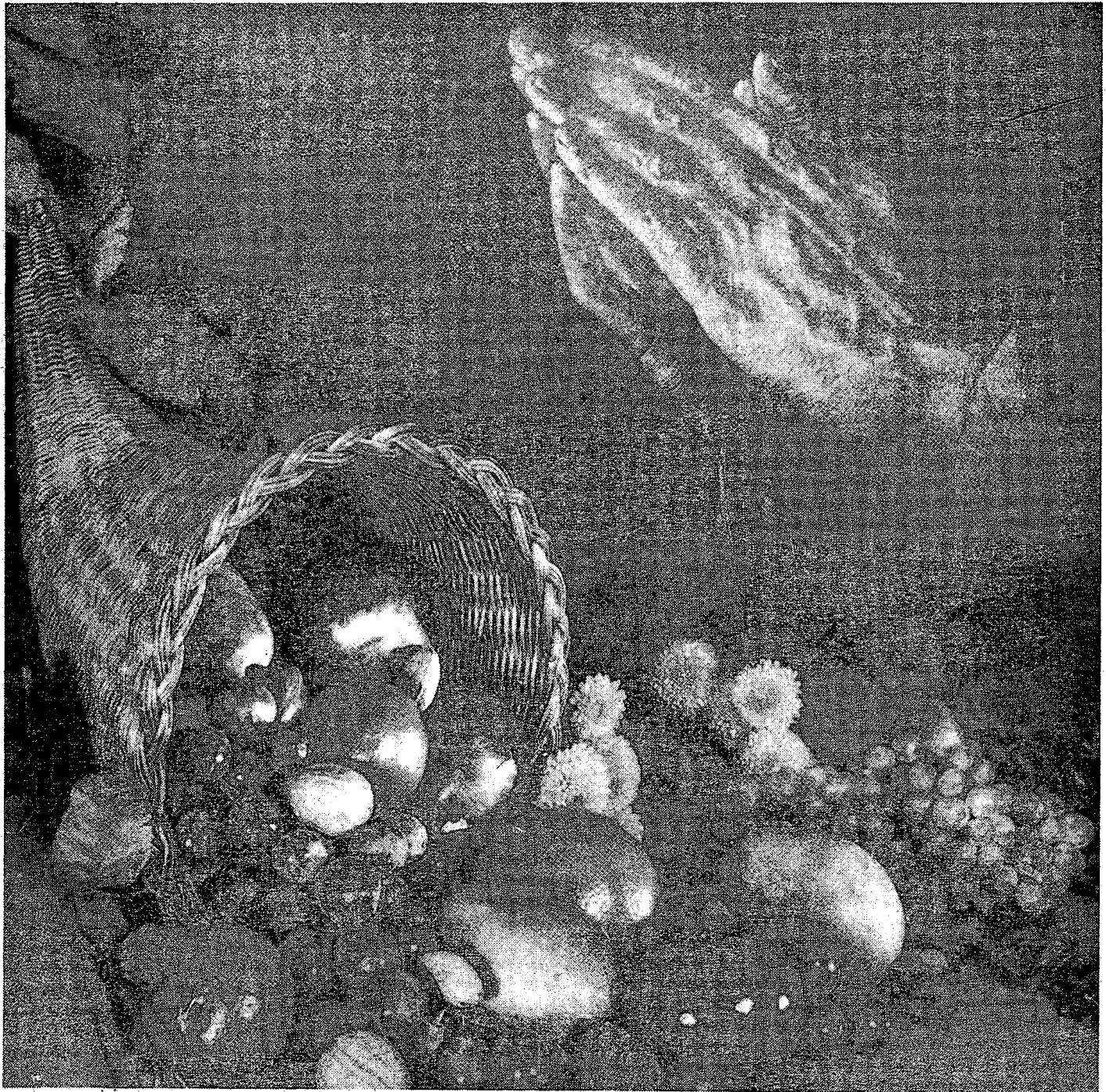

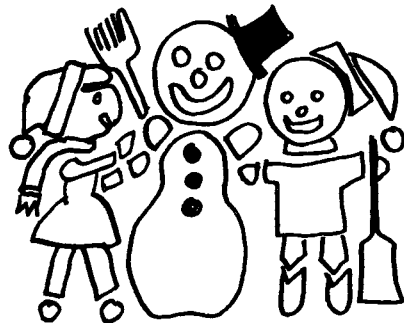

## Wonderful Blessings: Our Forgetful Brains

At first, the talent the human race has for forgetting may seem suited to a case of poor judgment. But we are a people who race through the day, filling our heads with trivia, attempting in some cases to crowd out the essentials of life which stare so profoundly at us each evening from the TV screen and wage war at the breakfast table from the newspaper.

Running around in our heads are perhaps as many of thirty different chemicals, many which can produce the same effects as hallucinogens, amphetamines and mood elevators. These chemicals can turn us on or off, and depending on the amount of information we attempt to drown our intellects in, stress develops. The shorter the interval

for compressing all the facts of the day, the greater the stress. And after a hard day at the office, on the line or behind the wheel, the ability to forget trivia is vital.

When we perform our job, short term memory becomes immensely important. If we retained a complete track record of every move made with the hand or the leg or the finger in performing our job, our brains would quickly become one large traffic jam. Now, add to this the additional input of spiritually communicated information and you begin to understand how vital a short term memory can be. The ability to remember meaningless digits performed in a simple calculation only accumulates more trash in the

acquisition of an answer. Our senses are assailed from every direction -- touch, taste, sight, hearing and smell.

The sixth sense -- our psychic sense -- is a God given talent which only improves with practice and good exercise. However, if we had to amass every thread of data projected at us along with the rest of the inputs, the clear highways of communication between ourselves and the spirit friends might become a roadway of traffic, bumper to bumper, totally impossible to clear in order to make sense out of a simple message to someone waiting, hoping, praying for word from another no longer able to speak for himself.

# That Fleeting Glimpse Through the Hidden Doorway

Ask a psychic how she sees and the answer may not always seem plausible. A Spiritualist may offer an entirely different explanation. In a very delicate sense, both replies may be completely right, yet only account for part of the image or message transfer. However, among all people, psychics and sensitives alike, there is a point at which a common denominator prevails.

Each of us feel, touch, think, respond and sense (perceive thoughts and things beyond our physical dimensions--beyond even life!) through a mechanism common to all in the body. In the fabric of our skin and tissues lie tiny receptors, which, when stimulated, release a chemical secretion that generates a correspondingly long or short surge of electricity. Imagine, if you can, the taste buds in the tongue sparking a chemical bath which signals through charged neurons to the brain that the food being eaten is very sweet. Of course, the senses of smell and taste are closely akin and one without the other, can, at times, vastly weaken the keen perception some individuals display to a remarkable degree.

The chemical bath serves to provide (or supply the battery) the energy which carries the message upward to the brain. The touch of Spirit often by-passes these tiny pedals in the skin tissue which release the chemical flow into the system, working instead, directly upon the telephone lines which carry the information, or still more directly, upon the brain itself where the density of neurons may reach 100 million to the cubic inch. These neurons

comprise the densest information storage capacity yet recognized by man.

In sensitizing a message, Spirit is capable of structurally arranging its energies to *imprint*, bit by bit, information upon the number of neurons required to paint a complete image. So, it can be said that a medium (or psychic) sees within his head very much as if the same sight had been observed by the unaided eye. This sight is relayed back into the process centers of the brain where the rare impulses are aligned and fed into a result production center such as to hear or to see. Touch, taste and smell can also be communicated in this fashion. This is easily the simplest way for spirit to communicate because the physical barrier is minimized and, for the most part, by-passed. Of course, when we are dealing with the three senses, other than hearing and sight, the brain must respond to the incoming neurons with a reply. Although the process centers within the brain understand, at times, physical response is called for, such as during pain or heat or cold. In such cases, the brain repljes down the spidery filaments representing the interconnected nerve cells. According to the information dispatched the muscles (or automatic reflexes) are stimulated by a second chemical bath and motion occurs.

The sensitive branches of the neuron are referred to as dendrites and through cell bodies of the neuron each bit of electric current accumulates in the axon, the trunk end where it passes to another neuron and so on up or down the line.

It is important to note several things at this point in our discussion and that is exactly what you, the reader, and I, the writer, are sharing -- a discussion. For this is information earned and gleaned from both science and spirit force. Obviously, there are many other ways in which spirit can impart a word, a message or greeting to us. But this is one of the most common ways in which it is done. Now, all images received are not in color. Some arrive as vague outlines assuming a positive -- usually something which is readily recognizable to you. Relative size varies. Occasionally, the image will tend to exaggerate some special point to help focus the attention of the receiver on the thought being directed. For example, faces may come as miniature paintings encased in a cameo like setting. They can just as easily come full size, imprinted over the face on another or floating, without borders in space.

Here, we are talking about the rudimentary beginnings of spirit communication. Regardless of the communication, each relayed thought operates by natural law. Although not every spirit understands the law, standing behind that spirit is another, more advanced, who understands how to code the charged neurons of the brain so that a picture or symbol may be carefully etched in the temporary memory of the receiver. This is why these thoughts or impressions are often very fleeting and extremely difficult to freeze the images for later recall.

A law does not require anything to happen. It is,

# How Do We Know God?

A continuation into the question and argument of our understanding of this great force. Visible yet invisible!

*So God created man in his own image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them.'*  
1:27 Genesis

And so man spake these words uttered first long ago and designed for himself a belief everlasting that has sent forth the word of God into every land and in every tongue. Theology of the Bible was born!

Like Father like son. Both the maker and the created are of kindred spirit, for does it not say so in the Book of Books?

The harsh invisible force which accepted an eye for an eye and a life for a life in the Old Testament now took on the cloak of personality and began something which could be held and greeted by the imagination. The First Cause assumed a moral attribute. It needed only *consciousness* and *will* to build a complete character. Whether an actual being redognizable in form to that of a human life no longer mattered once this verse of the

Bible addressed man.

Man had in his blood the trace of the great king, God, the creator of all, of everything, so it was only natural for the mental race to link in spiritual affinity man's place in the heavens and his intercommunion with his God, the creator, began.

This series of articles is not an attempt to belittle the Bible, but to open the minds and the eyes of Spiritualists that they may see and understand what ramifications a simple statement can hold.

Had man the eyes to see and the mind to understand then the gross and anthropomorphic conception of God so common in the early ages of the world would never have developed, for no where else can we find passages to support such false ideas. We see and yet we do not see for the words spoke of a spiritual relationship, a spiritual world and represent a point from which to begin to see and understand. And here our priests and theologians sought through mischievous interference to capture the sweet innocence of man's desire to reach out to a force greater than himself.

Creeds evolved to firm this

attitude and shape the concepts of worshipers. Science foreign to the simple understanding of the people evolved out of necessity to separate the great teachers of religion of the land from the many who had no choice but to follow.

Today, orthodox is little different than this, for it binds man to a yard fenced in and offers a carrot for all his ills and aches that can be bought and paid for even at the very last minute of physical life. And is this not an idea similar to that simple Bible passage which some understand as absolving man of his responsibility and obligations. Vain is the blind with sight. He *without* sees more and understands better the light which comes not to his brain.

Some marvel at nature and conclude that within the sight of these things lies the deity. But consider. The universe, that part which we understand and know of through science, has come about in a chain of evolution. Yet, God has only come to realize Himself and attain self-consciousness, in man in the last 2,000 years. And why should it take a simple creature that walks on two legs to complete the greatness of God. In whoses eyes?

If the object we see and feel is also the subject to which is given the sight and the sensation of touch, then everything exists in God and nothing else is. For God is the universe and not the universe God. This was the conclusion of Schelling when he identified the subject and the object and made them the manifestations of God or the absolute.

however, the channel by which things occur when a precise formula is followed. The laws are not results; they represent only the means by which something can happen or a change occur. And in the world of spirit where subtleties finer than those known of this earth represent the world and the life, even airy things like thoughts have a heavy

impression. It is in the communication between these different densities (the earth and the Summerland) that light and airy things do not register with the same impact. Never is it an easy task for spirit to close this gap in the two dimensions which separate the hard, denser material life and the finer, thought forms of spirit.

Hegel, on the other hand, denied this concept and advanced his own, a universe of relations. He conceived of everything as a process of thought, greater or lesser in application. In his view, deity was not a self-existent reality, but a never-ending self-decision. However, his view stopped short of allowing it to realize itself fully manifest in the human consciousness. The mysticism that shrouds the pantheism of the Hegelian system should appear obvious.

The crystallization of pure philosophic thought led Schelling to accept the Gospel and its revelation as one of the modes in which God manifests Himself in history. Hegel chose to transform Christianity into a system of regularly evolved ideas, altogether independent of historical evidence or testimony such as the Gospel.

The banner of argument was next raised high by David Frederick Strauss. Here enters the extreme, for Strauss stands very near atheism. With the Hegelian armor as his shield he gathered the Gospel into his mind and through his conclusions scattered it to the four winds of the earth. He could never be called a rationalist or a supernaturalist. He identified God as a process of thought, without separate individual existence. God was in his words, only where existence was for outside of the eternally unfolding universe, he could not find God. Neither a personality nor a personal God was found by his mental probes into the consciousness of thought.

Joseph Cook's transcendentalism offered a new consideration:

Within you there is thought thus you are sure you are a thinker. By the same sample, but direct line, you conclude that

there is a thinker in the universe because there is thought in the universe. Of course, there cannot be thought unless there is a thinker to think thoughts. But by definition and understanding found in this world, a thinker must be a person. Therefore, it is apparent to all who approach the question of God with an open mind that there is a personal thinker in the universe.

In exploring the question further we find the scales of balance attempting to weigh, through rational thought, the idea that personality must be superior to impersonality.

Professor Garbett's Personality of God, page 26, "It is clear that anything which does not possess personality, or possesses it in a low degree, whether it be like the earth, however exquisitely modeled into beauty and sublimity manifold, or the beasts of the field, however marvelous their living powers, must be inferior to ourselves. And therefore, Almighty God must be a person likewise. For if not, He would be inferior to ourselves, contrary to the supposition on which we go. And the very name imports that. He is, at all events, the highest of all beings...."

Garbett goes on to ridicule the intellect as being abandoned to "lawless tyranny of imagination." In his opinion, it then becomes drunk with the maddening wine of intellectual licentiousness and creative speculation. His carefully stroked descriptions are eloquently painted as he considers God to be a figment of the imagination conceived as infinite in power, one whose energy leaps from the very bosom and floods the abyss of space itself, pervading all living things, all glory in creation, thus filling the universe. Continuing his description of this wonderful God, he credits by

the same reason, that God lacks self-consciousness and has not a choice of anything of that which makes humans to their fellow men objects of love and hope, dread and hatred, joy and misery. "...piling postulate on postulate into the empty air, till you reach, in haze and mist, the limbo of unreality, set up this blind, and dumb and deaf abomination, with a crown upon its head, on the throne of Him who is, and was, and is to be, the living Jehovah. Why, in such a case though the spirit within us is clothed in perishable dust and ashes, we should be far superior, in the order of intelligent being, to such a Deity with all his immensity." The last and final quote from Professor Garbett's Personality of God shows only too well that no single concept of the Most High is held at any level of understanding. What appears to one intellect as acceptable challenges the good sense of another, further illustrating the frustration of defining God.

## Gas Prices Bring Togetherness

A recent news story carried by the Associated Press news service out of Reno, Nevada, was especially worth re-printing.

Soaring gasoline taxes and weekly hikes at the gas pump have made one major contribution, according to a University of Nevada - Reno sociologist. Dr. Rebecca Stafford said that parents are spending more time with their children.

Although TNS wonders about any other hidden benefits which may arise, it does have one thought along this line. Will a return to togetherness encourage the family that spends more time together also worship together?



# A Lesson From The Past

I am now living on the borderline of the two planes of life's unfoldment, seemingly a neutral field between the two, and helping in the *accouchement* of souls as they seek admission into the higher astral plane from that of mortal life.

"...You ask hard questions. I

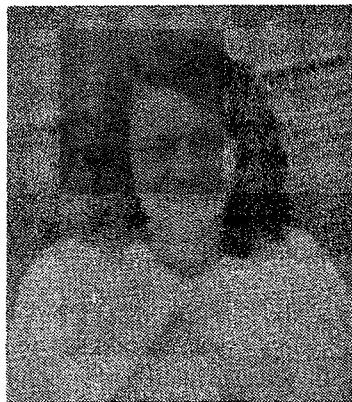
have always considered loyalty as not having any order. You are either loyal or not. I can only assume you mean which would come first if there was a conflict of loyalties, such as those old college ethics questions. Would you steal to feed your family? Would you kill to save your child? I am not a conscientious objector. I believe war is wrong, yet if my country needed me, I would do and have done whatever was necessary.

"I could hardly believe that we are all guided by Spirit without believing that the leaders of this country have similar guidance. President Lincoln sought such guidance often, yet he presided over the bloodiest war in our history. No doubt, the foot soldiers thought he was a madman, or a despot, but our country survived. I try to live my life to avoid ethical conflicts. I don't search out situations where my loyalty or principles have to be comprised. If my employer wouldn't let me off when my family needed me, I would immediately find another employer. If the government said my child had broken the law, I would support my child with love and understanding, regardless. But, if he or she was guilty, I would expect the price to be paid."

Life for Paul is as hectic as when he was in the service. Only, it's safer. For 22½ years he was a flight engineer in the Air Force. Credited with 30 missions over North Korea, 66 cargo missions in Viet Nam, he bears scars and memories along with the medals. Paul has also served as flight examiner, giving the final stamp of approval to National Guard flight engineers all over the free world.

Today, he looks to his religion for courage to face his faults. As he said, "The material rewards and spiritual blessings

are only a by-product of it's proper application to my life." However, there was a time when Spiritualism was just another pretty face. It all started with an invitation to church and another to coffee. At the time, he had just accepted a previous invitation and was along for the ride. Paul never forgot the lovely student who singled him out at message time. "I didn't remember too much about the discussion after church I only had eyes and ears for the medium," he related. This first meeting took place in September, 1945. On April 6, 1946, Peggy as friends now often



address her, and Paul became husband and wife.

The 8 to 5 daily grind for Paul consists of keeping the Pioneer Central School functioning. He's the Maintenance Mechanic, charged with correcting electrical headaches, plumbing problems and anything else which goes astray.

# Spiritual Healing

We are frequently asked to send healing treatments to those who are absent, and who cannot participate in the laying on of hands. Those persons referred to in this particular case have also asked, frequently, just how this can be accomplished.

Since every practitioner or commissioned healer works somewhat differently, there may be slight variations in the manner in which absent healing is conducted. As a rule, however, the pattern would follow along these lines:

The healer enters into the solitude of his own sanctuary in meditation and concentration. He projects his consciousness from the mundane to the spiritual plane, in so doing, requesting spiritual knowledge and guidance. In doing this the healer draws upon the limitless storehouse of God supply. He then visualizes the person, if possible, to whom the treatment is being directed. While in this meditative state, he calls the person by name and requests cooperation from the unseen healing

forces in directing their energies into that person.

The healer must mentally direct the thinking of the patient into positive, constructive pathways. He must visualize the patient in perfect wholeness, giving thanks that the influx of peace and harmony has been established within the patient's physical body. The healer must affirm the presence of the Heavenly Father within the patient. This procedure is time consuming but it is repeated for every individual requesting an absent healing treatment.

When using the healing chair, for one individual requesting a treatment for another, the same procedure is again applied. However, passes made over the body are made in the name of the afflicted one.

Absent treatments require absolute concentration. The mediator between the patient and the spirit forces, of course, is the healer, who requests the intervention of unseen healing forces.

Healing affirmations and prayers are constantly sent into the Cosmic, reaching persons who are many miles distant.

# Happy Endings Do Occur

Despite the doom and gloom which paints the nightly TV news and fills the daily newspapers, a few stories with happy endings still manage to find their way to the surface. In view of the overly stressed condition of the Earth it may be very probable that a *good news* newspaper would go begging for subscribers. Fortunately, this is not a contest to test that question. Two entirely different events caught our attention this past month. The first concerns a puppy that cheated death twice! The second concerns a mother, who was almost too expensive to save!

Destiny took two shots at a three-month old pup, an apparent cross between a St. Bernard and a Labrador retriever and lost. The first came on a Friday when a speeding 100-car freight sped over the little rascal. The locomotives, all cars and a caboose hurled overhead. He emerged scared, but unharmed. Five days later he fell into the hands of the local animal shelter and was facing death in a nitrogen chamber. A local reporter in Redding, California picked up on the story and fourteen people voiced interest in the puppy in the nick of time.

The bright lights of Las Vegas can shock visitors into believing that the only shortage of electric power and electric light bulbs is in the vivid imagination of the news media. It's a town of magic, corruption and culture and a *heart*. Money has often been won and lost at a pull of a handle and a flip of a card. Entertainment is a 24-hour business and for everybody there is something.

You wouldn't think that a young mother, just

25, would be left to die in a hospital because the expense of surgery was too great. A team of doctors determined that the young mother had just six weeks to live. No more! Her heart was failing fast. The husband tried all the agencies where money was supposedly available for those who needed it. He had a job, a good job, but not one which would enable him to walk into a bank and receive a loan for \$25,000, plus hospitalization. Everywhere he turned, the answer was no. He even convinced the doctors to consider doing the work free, if the hospital would carry the costs also. The hospital refused, stating that the charges would only have to be passed along, so it could not do this in good conscience. The hospital was in a different state than Nevada, where the girl was from.

Attempts to interest the public brought in just over \$800.00. Television stations and radio stations joined with Nevada newspapers to carry the story and ask for financial help. But nobody heard the husband's pleas. The doctor didn't mind his name being used. The hospital didn't object either.

The woman required a heart transplant to save her life. Nobody seemed to care. And yet two firms in Las Vegas heard the cry and each wrote out a check for \$20,000, enough to cover all costs.

Amazing! The checks were written by two casinos in town. The Nugget and the Circus. The drinks in these gambling houses are free for all who spend. The profits are pretty good too. But isn't it strange that a human life was more precious to the owners of these two casinos than to State and government agencies and the general public.

# Jesus of Nazareth: God or Man?

## Foreword

*Most Spiritualists have been aware from common sense reason that a man cannot be the Creator of the Universe. The more sensitive among them know it by Intuitive Truth. The value of Rev. Sprague's book is, that for the benefit of Bible students he establishes and proves by the Bible itself that Jesus was not God.*

*It is well for everyone to be aware that this information is available in the Bible for their reference. Obviously many more Bible quotations could not be included in this condensation.*

## Part I

Unending controversy revolves about the identity of Jesus of Nazareth. Most denominations of the Christian church, despite the increasing numbers of doubters among them are compelled to be preponents of the theory that Jesus is the Supreme Being and Power of the Universe. The reason being that it is incorporated in their Creedal Doctrine and Confession of Faith.

In general it is based upon the doctrinal theory of the Trinity, which is regarded by the theologians themselves as a great mystery to be accepted merely on faith.

There probably has never been a successful effort to explain it in a rational manner so that the layman might have some comprehension of its purpose. The Trinity thus remains as

incomprehensible obfuscation of religious faith.

Rev. E.W. Sprague says, "let us resort to the scriptures and let the Bible decide, and allow the light of modern intellect to reflect upon the opinions of unknowledgeable men in an early day."

The disciples of Jesus repeatedly declared him to be the son of Joseph in a physical sense. To quote the apostle Paul (Romans 1:3) "Concerning his son Jesus Christ our Lord, which was made of the seed of David according to the flesh." In Timothy 2:8: "Remember that Jesus Christ of the seed of David, was raised from the dead, according to my gospel."

In order for Jesus to descend from David it was necessary for Joseph to have his actual father, for Joseph is said to have been of the line of David. If Joseph was the father of Jesus, the Holy Ghost was not his father, because a child cannot have two fathers. Mary mother of Jesus said (Luke 2:48) : "behold, thy father (Joseph) and I have sought thee sorrowing."

Matthew 19:17, Jesus says: "Why callest thou me good? there is none good but one, that is, God..." Jesus admitted to being less in perfection than God. Luke 2:52: "And Jesus increased in wisdom and stature in favor with God and man." Almighty God would not need increase. Paul says (I Timothy 2-5) : "There is one God and one mediator between God and men, the man Jesus Christ." Paul thus separates the personality of Jesus from God. Jesus said in John 8: 15 & 16: "Ye judge after the flesh; I judge no man. And yet if

I judge, my judgment is true; for I am not alone, but I and the father that sent me." In the many references of Jesus to "My Father," he evidently refers to God the same as any other man when saying, "Our Father who art in heaven."

In John 14:12 Jesus says: "Verily, verily, I say unto you, he that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father." If Jesus was God, shall those who believe on him do greater works than God? Luke 6:12: "And it came to pass in those days, that he went out into a mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God." Did Jesus pray to himself all night?

Rev. Sprague says in the four gospels Jesus calls himself the "son of man," sixty-seven times. Others call him the, "son of man" four times, but call him "Master" many times. John 8:28: "Then said Jesus unto them, When ye have lifted up the son of man, then shall ye know that I am he, and that I do nothing of myself; but as my Father hath taught me I speak these things." God need not be taught but the Father could very well be a higher spirit influence that taught Jesus.

Jesus never calls himself "God" or Supreme Ruler. Is there good reason why there is not a single passage of scripture in which Jesus is called God? The neighbors of Jesus did not respect him as God. Matthew 13:55 & 56: "Is not this the carpenter's son? Is not his mother called Mary? and his brethren, James and Joses and Simon and Judas? And his sisters

are they not with us? Whence then hath this man all these things?" Matt 13:57: "And they were offended in him, But Jesus said unto them. 'A prophet is not without honor, save in his own country and in his own house'."

Obviously his neighbors were unaware that they rubbed shoulders with God. His brothers and sisters were not conscious of being half-brothers and half-sisters of "Almighty God", but apparently regarded Jesus as their brother. His mother never suspected that she was the mother of God.

In the garden of Gethsemene Jesus prayed. (Luke 22-42) "Father if thou be willing,

remove this cup from me; nevertheless not my will but thine be done." Verse 43: "And there appeared an angel unto him from heaven strengthening him." Angels are spirits and spirits are angels. Jesus continued to acknowledge a higher power until his passing. John 10:29: "My Father, which gave them me, is greater than all." While being crucified Jesus said; "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?"

In the face of all this evidence from the Bible itself that Jesus was not Almighty God, why do Christians persist in ignoring what is said in the Bible? They seem to stand

insecurely upon a single verse. John 10:30: "I and my Father are one."

Spiritualists understand this statement as confirming the unity of spirit. Man is an infinitesimal particle of Universal Spirit and consequently God is in man and man is joined to God, whatever the nature of God may be. John 14:20, Jesus says: "At that day ye shall know that I am in my Father, and ye in me and I in you." Jesus shares his divinity with all mankind.

John truthfully said (John 1:18—: "No man hath seen God at any time..."

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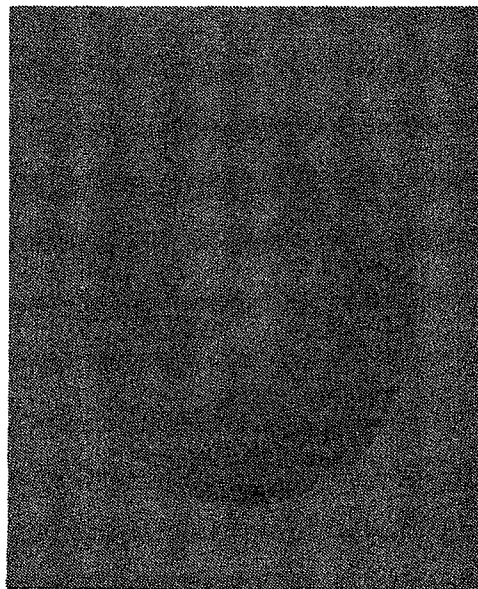
## The Likeness of Jesus

Most of my limited experience in visiting Spiritualist churches and attending their classes and seminars has shown that we do present well organized lectures. It is to our credit that many of our ministers have spent many hours researching material in the study of Spiritualism, and equally as many hours preparing notes for Sunday's service. We stress our knowledge of the Declaration of

Principles upon which Spiritualism is based. (Most of us know them quite well.) Much to our credit, again! As it is stated - 84% of the Christian-Americans *believe* in the Ten Commandments, whereas *less than half* could identify what they are!!

As we continue to spread our teachings, we should remember our need to continue our studies, research and writings in the field of Spiritualism so as to maintain a high level of ministerial practice. The pendulum is swinging back in favor of preaching and as Spiritualists, I believe we have a good "heat start" in maintaining an upward trend towards increasing our followers.

The article posed the following question: "Where are the *good* preachers? Answer: "Right where they've always been - few and far between." Aren't we fortunate to be among the "few and far between?"

Over the years Spiritualism has suffered one hatchet after another. Unfortunately, we haven't been lucky enough to accuse the major oil companies of buying up the patents. In time, the best just fade away or become sensational news for the yellow press which probably introduced them to the public. It's just too bad that there isn't something easy, quick and painless on the market. A couple of cassettes and a few pages of reading material seem to perform wonders in speed reading classes and gardening sessions. There just ought to be a fish carburetor for would-be Spiritualists too! Don't you agree?

Perhaps that's the whole problem. Since everything else can be mastered in a twinkle of an eye and a flip of a cassette, some of us still expect the same

of healing and mediumship. Oh sure, there are short cuts to the business end of learning and hundreds of new books on the market each year just to teach this latest version. However, most of the books are written to entice readership, not generate immediate gurus. Just as the most romantic or tainted novel entertains the emotions, so these forms of speed courses entertain the desires expressed by the brain. For some, hypnosis eases the task of learning. But like all magic formulas there's a strong possibility that in the distant future, say 20 years or so, you just may wake up and be totally unable to remember how the past 20 years were spent.

The market offers dozens of drugs to help the novice arrive at mind expansion. The trouble is no drug leaves its user in control or allows the journey to end where the original trip-tik called for. Another problem here is that fact, fiction and emotional desires easily become lost in a maze of which is which. The Godheads which use this general method have been said to take their practice from our brothers and sisters in the east. Correction. Over there sisters are secondary and the use of such drugs has only emerged in the light of the tourist invasion from America and other rich countries of the west. Women are never treated to such expensive tastes unless they can pay for it. Consider the situation.

In India, rats are free to eat the grain and destroy the harvest. A loyal member of the faith

would never kill one. In Arab lands the rule is an eye for an eye, a life for a life. Fear governs. But education is producing a new threat to the survival of OPEC and its Arab finance ministers. Apparently, it doesn't pay to share the knowledge of the world or teach talents which lead to the eventual replacement of most American technology in these countries. Education suggests equality and equality means a share of the profits. And sharing isn't easy to achieve with order. Recall the sale of Alaskan oil leases and the stir it caused in the state of Alaska and the Congress of the United States. Seems somebody was always shortchanging someone else. The difference is that some of our foreign *friends* do not debate matters, they take over religious centers, embassies and assassinate discontented elements. The high lofty ranges of Tibet are no longer the glorious centers of spiritual learning in the world. The effects of modern society and its twisted but nevertheless harsh realities manages now to tax the image of the past. Tibet is the past and in terms of its great gifts to the world is best served in memory. The country marks the crossroads between China and Russia, and journeying down its streets are as many enemies of each other as neighbors.

With an understanding of Spiritualism many things are revealed and mystic ideas dispelled. Truth has an answer available to all who seek. Of itself no dollars will flow into the

advocate's hands simply because he admits to the world he is a Spiritualist. In fact, it is often easy to earn one's living through an ability recognized under the umbrella of Spiritualism as given from the Summerland, provided the tongue is quieted and the identity held back. Be an astrologer. Practice I Ching. Or toss bones. You'll make a much better living and be readily welcomed into the home. But Spiritualists find a less game response. It's really strange. When people are in trouble they openly welcome the *weird* ones called Spiritualists.

Education rocks the cluster of remaining believers much the same way as it has the rulers of Eastern and Arab lands. Many of the young ones who enter the flock arrive delighted with the opportunity to become one, but leave within a few short years because they have obtained the necessary training. A course with Morris Pratt Institute provides the standard. These courses are excellent distillations, but obviously they are bias, just as you would find the material sponsored through any religious order or church to be in reality.

The real opportunity to learn and grow in spiritual awareness comes in the church, in lesser or greater degrees depending on the availability of time and the desirability of having fresh recruits to some day climb the ladder. Some of these church circles are especially rewarding and beneficial. Others are not. But isn't this true with any organization, club, or church activity. Spiritualists don't have a patent or dominance or personality clashes. It's unfortunate, but these situations exist.

What is excellence? And how do we reverse the dwindling respect. Ten years ago it was common for those receiving a

reading in the church or a message to stand. Darn. I wish the fish carburetor was for real and that a few of the real talents which made this religion proud were still around.

In desperation some of our churches have tried to liven up things by inviting in new wonders and the latest fad, which appears to have captured great following. A number of these have fell out of grace. But like bad pennies continue to show up on occasion. Once the Rev. Sun Myung Moon was held in high regard in his native Korea. Then he enjoyed exalted status, but indications suggest that he managed to purchase his glorious respect through gifts and money showered upon President Park and poured into his pet projects. Today, Moon's unorthodox brand of Christianity is disapproved of and held in contempt. Favorable mention of Rev. Moon or his Unification Church in books or articles is condemned under the government controlled press. And hostile reference is openly approved. Every dog has its day and it appears that Rev. Moon upset the apple cart one time too many.

There is no earth-bound perpetual-motion machine and no fish carburetor or magic pill to pop in your gas tank and drive away on. I believe that Spiritualism is better than any gimmick. Right now I'm at that stage in life where I count the references to it. The TV has helped a lot, so has the radio and the newspaper. But for every scrap of valuable reference there seem to be the many which detract or imply something totally opposite in belief. Of the many churches the National Spiritualist Association of Churches counts, if but half entered into a time-share cooperative pact designed to

relay good and worthy information about its order we would have the start of a true public relations network, geared to report on happenings across the nation and perhaps join to poll efforts in erasing damage or falseness which often receives the greatest attention by the news media. Instead we are directed by others, and follow the course of dwindling numbers. Although fantastic growth possibilities exist, without earthly finance we isolate, one from the other, afraid to invest in the positive value of cooperation.

I for one wish to be known as a Spiritualist, not just remembered as one of a small band which once existed!

You needn't constantly grieve over the misfortunes of others to have a real concern for people. Sometimes it may be in your power to help others. Sometimes just having a willing shoulder to cry on proves a big help to a distressed person.

We must be aware of the effect our actions and words may have before acting rashly. The Golden Rule won't be so hard to fall on if we are keenly aware of the effect of our words and actions.

## Worship In China Carries Unique Price

The day of the Chinese Red Guard has gone. Reform of a different, more western tone has replaced its terror. These are the good days for the Chinese Christian church. The Chinese Government is trying very hard to make life more acceptable, so concessions, even of a religious nature are being made. The best example of this is that the clergy of the approved Catholic and Christian church receive \$50 a month, which is above the wage of the average city resident. Collections in the churches are up, a good sign that the nearly three and one-half million faithful are pleased with the change from their former

catacomb existence which was required under the harsh rule of the Red Guard. Soon, 130,000 copies of a Chinese language Bible will be running on the presses. The 10 million of the Muslim faith have received permission to visit Mecca. Twenty bishops of the Patriotic Catholic Association have been consecrated, without Papal approval, of course.

Restrictions have been lowered and for a very sound reason. The government of China wishes to demonstrate unity of purpose and country. China's religious group must become an extension of the central government's announced

ideology; they must support the Chinese brand of communism, accept government control of their institutions and renounce all ecclesiastical ties with foreign churches. To outsiders unfamiliar with the oriental mind these decrees may seem harsh. But the old China is gone. In its place has come an old idea in new dress - the propagation of religion in China should be the work of Chinese thought and deed.

Religion always carries a certain price. In China the price is acceptable, perhaps because for the first time in many years the people are being considered on par with ideology.

# The Law of Cycles

The *law of cycles* increases our individual and collective understanding enabling us to live more beneficial lives.

*The World Book Encyclopedia* states that a cycle is a pattern of events that occur or seem to occur regularly. One of the most common cycles is found in some places where the difference between high tide and low tide repeats every twelve and one-half hours.

The price of British wheat, according to records that go back to the signing of the Magna Carta in 1215 suggest cycles. One crest in this fifty-four year cycle came about 1925, and another is expected in 1980. Cycles also occur within cycles, as was evident in wheat prices during the second quarter of 1978.

Larger cycles in human history seem to vary. Many scientists believe that the eleven year cycle in the number of sunspots influences the weather, longer cycles related to the weather stretch to 510 years. According to studies by the University of Kansas, some cycles seem to indicate that wars and changes in man's thinking occur also in regular periods.

The *Voices of Isis* contains an interesting passage, "There can be no concept of life outside or apart from vibration and all vibration is cyclic.

"Everything manifests in cycles, from the sprouting of the tiniest blade of grass; it's fruition and decay to the time and seasons of suns and systems.

"Every event is marked by cycles, a period of activity, a period of rest, corresponding to the downward and upward sweep of manifestation or the outbreathing and inbreathing of the great breath of God.

"The life of each individual is also a by-product of cycles within cycles. All students notice periods of great spiritual upliftment followed by periods of depressions and numbness. Extremes can only be overcome by a working knowledge of the law of cycles."

The field of bio-rhythms has proven that every person, each month, goes through a high creative, physical, and mental cycle. One has to be able to recognize his monthly and yearly cycle flow to work at the highest level no matter in what parts of the cycle one finds himself.

We have all experienced these ups and downs. Astrology goes along with this idea. Although man

is in control of his own destiny, he must learn to work with the natural laws.

Everything has a rhythm and flow - the seasons, tides, nature, even the human body. If we are going to use or absorb this law to our own benefit, and to the benefit of others, we must learn how we fit it into our lives. The culture force flows in cyclic waves and in a cycle corresponds closely to a century of earth life.

Curtis, the author of the *Voices of Isis* suggests that, "The ebb and flow of the great force is first downward. The first quarter of the century it passes from the spiritual world into the mental and psychic; the second quarter, down into the physical and then in the last half back again into the spiritual plane, following the reverse order."

There is the cycle where we learn everything is great. Next comes the cycle of assimilation, where we firm the knowledge in our minds. This period is followed by the time when we use what we have learned.

We are all aware of how our mental state affects the physical. Scientists are learning that more and more physical ailments are brought about by the mind.

I have a friend with a serious illness. Most of the time she is able to cope fairly well with her illness, but when members of her family verbally remind her of her illness, she gives up and retreats to the hospital. The pressure just becomes too great.

Many speakers talk about the power of the mind and how it affects our lives - likewise the law of cycles affects our lives. How can a person who has an intellectual understanding of the natural laws completely disregard those laws? One can only assume it is part of the learning of the lessons that we talk of in Spiritualism.

The law of cycles is extremely complex and indeed would take much study to gain a slight understanding. There are cycles to everything: nature, seasons, tides, life, birth, death, etc. Each one has positives and negatives. This is where we need to relate the other natural spiritual laws to the law of cycles.

In any period of your life it is what is being done with the natural laws of desire, love, harmony, balance, cause and effect, activity, passivity, compensation, as to how or what type of cycle you will go through. It is how you use the knowledge gained that makes a significant difference in an individual's life. This is the *golden key*.

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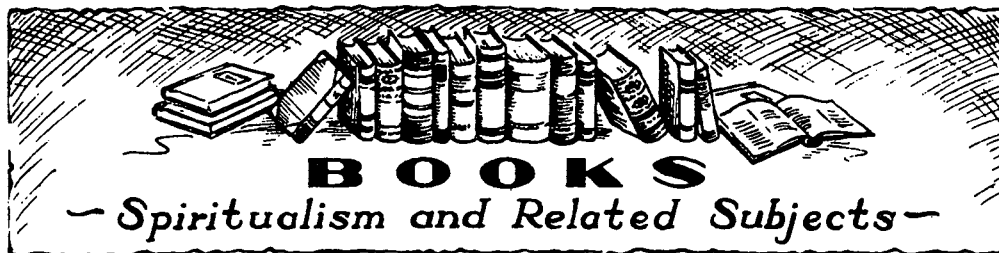
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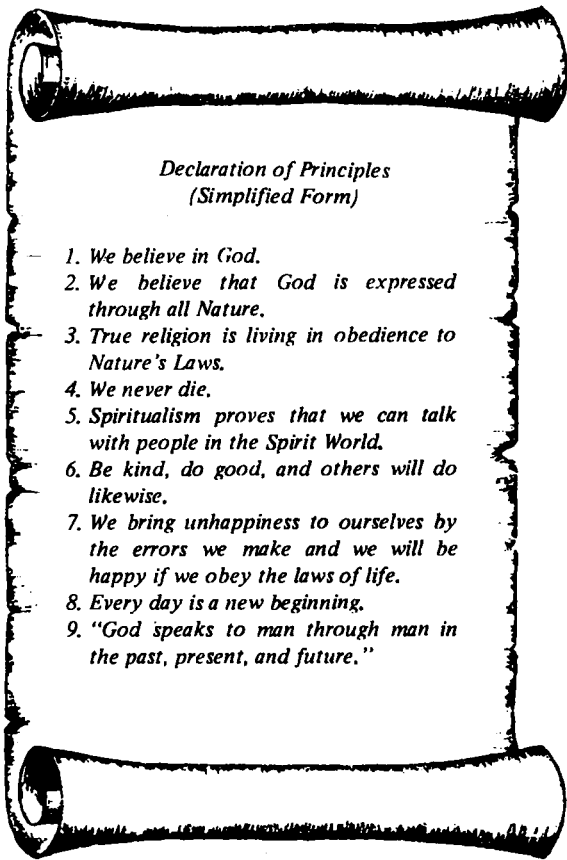

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# A Shrine to Faith

A man's home is his castle. It takes a lot of personal conviction to underwrite an investment in a church with your own home. The present Temple of Harmony stands today, an example of the confidence of six property holders. Peterson, Parkhurst, Bacon, Miller, Haskins, and Welch. These were the men who put up their homes as a guarantee of payment against an \$18,000 loan, for 20 years.

Faith, charity and dedication mark the history of this church, which first opened its doors in 1932. Then, the membership gathered in a small store, located in the 100 block of South Broadway, in Denver, Colorado.

The national organization has not always fared well among the voting membership. In 1935, the church members elected to take an independent course and left the National Spiritualist Association (N.S.A.). Five years later the controversial membership returned the church to the organization. In 1940, the same year, the church was incorporated. Much of the responsibility for bringing the church back was due to the tireless efforts of pastor and Reverend Ida Fleming, a strong advocate of the N.S.A. She remained actively at the helm until her death in 1961.

The present building at 3375 South Dahlia Street, in Denver, is the third building to bear the name, The Temple of Harmony. The second building, at 333 West Ellsworth, received its first consideration from a benefactor, who chose to leave the Temple of Harmony two parcels of ground. Alex Bourg arranged financing after the 1945 bequest and purchased additional land, suitable for a parking area.

Construction was underway by 1947. Easter Sunday, two years later the membership assembled to hold its first service on the grounds of the church which was nearing completion. The labors of the many were enjoyed richly, week after week, until this structure fell prey to urban renewal plans. The structure conformed to all municipal codes, but the 300 block of West Ellsworth had been designated for construction of a federally financed Senior Citizens Complex, so the church was condemned along with other buildings on the block.

Government appraisers offered a settlement of

\$50,400. Despite the inadequacy of the sum, no alternative was allowed. Suitable accommodations required more funds. After considerable effort and time the Board became aware of the present building, the former home of an orthodox congregation seeking larger facilities in a different part of Denver. All attempts to obtain the asking price landed on deaf ears. The petition to the N.S.A.C. was declined. Local banks rejected the request. For a while it seemed that all the doors were closed to our efforts. Until, that is, Majestic Savings agreed to broker the mortgage, provided property owners could be found to act as underwriters and guarantee the loan. The \$18,000 note carried a 20-year pay back, however, dedication by an active membership cleared the church in 12 years.

Participation in church activities continued to grow over the ensuing years. It is this loyalty which had solidified the Temple of Harmony as a viable center where members gather regularly to pray, to receive healing and to learn.

Plans are currently under consideration for a new church wing. Attendance exceeds suitable classroom and social areas. These areas will be included in any final expansion plans undertaken.

Among the little improvements installed since the new church was completed are the automatic lawn sprinkler system, and a public address system, with phones for the hard of hearing. In the past fifteen years the parking lot has been blacktopped twice.

On several occasions the Temple of Harmony has been attended by representatives of the news media. In each case, the event has held new promise of understanding and mutual respect. A few of our members have also been of assistance to the Denver police in solving local crimes. Over the years, the church has experienced the good fortune of attracting representatives of colleges and learning institutions of the area. The first visit usually leads to another.

Regular services are held every Sunday morning and evening. Coffee and doughnuts after the morning hour lead to good friendships and communication among members. Every Thursday evening a message and healing service is conducted. This service draws the biggest crowd outside of regular members.

Church dinners and planned activities make for the steady passage of events at the church.

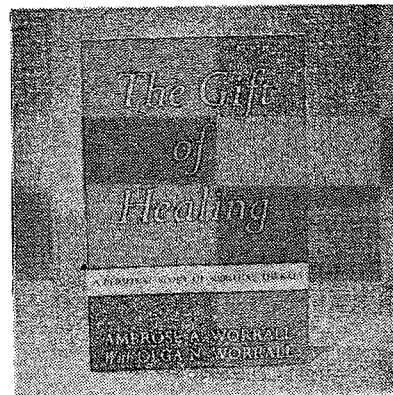
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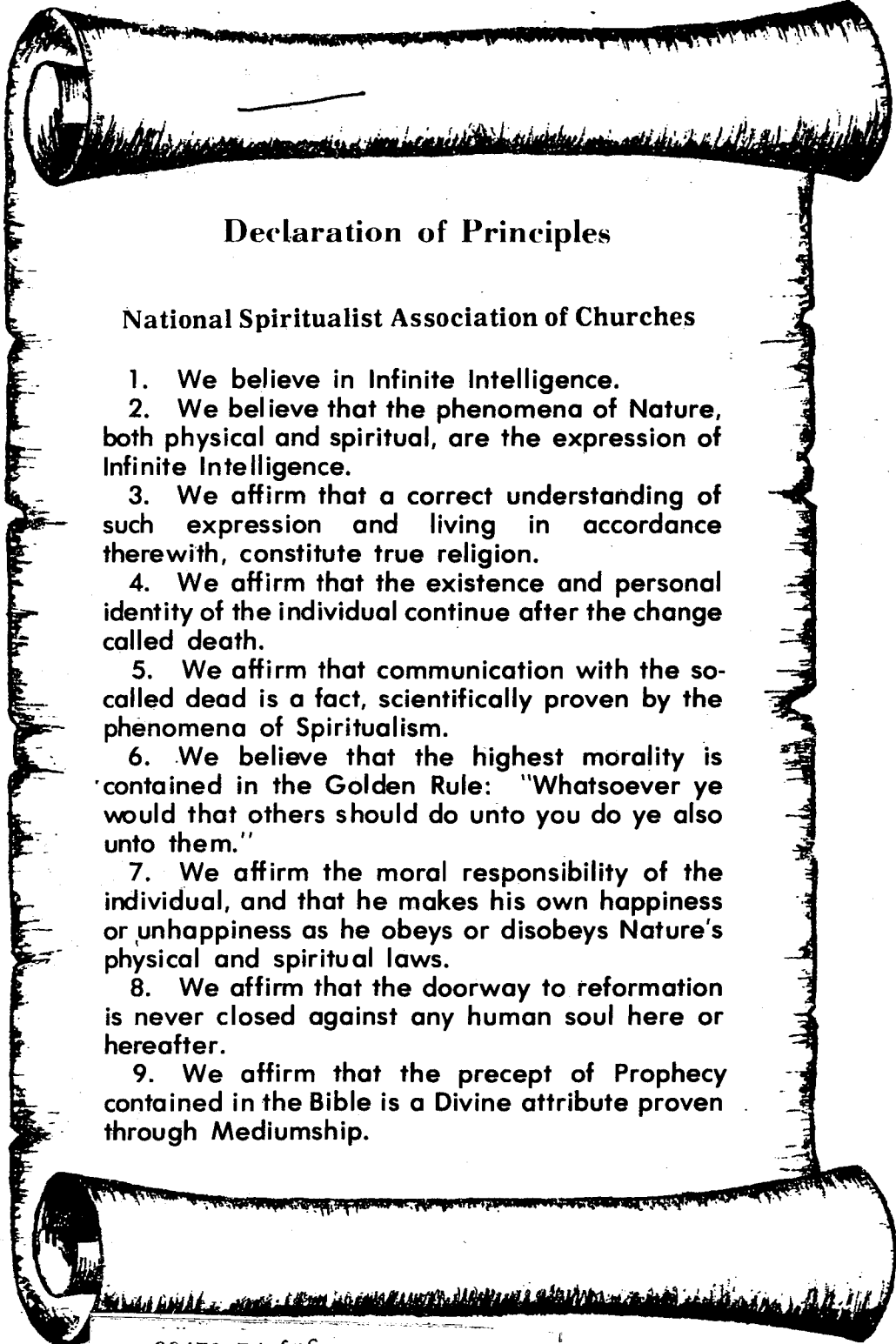
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## Declaration of Principles
