# Spiritualism - What We Believe!

Spiritualism is unlike most intellectual studies with standard books and specific references which represent the last word and the sole authority on the subject. Most of orthodoxy has a principal book, the Bible, for the purpose of presenting that which is and further, that which cannot be changed in any way. However, Spiritualism reaches out to the teachings of all the masters, here and hereafter.

In Spiritualism, we are dealing with the subtle spiritual faculties lying dormant in man. We are studying the fascinating subject of "man himself, a spiritual being, an invisible part of the oversoul." Therefore, we cannot expect to be pinned down nor can we be limited in our conception of truth. For, it reaches beyond all intellectual comprehension. Truth is unlimited and infinite.

The minute we try to express the unmanifested in words or books, we commence limiting that expression. Thus, we limit truth. Truth is that which is reality. Andrew Jackson Davis, the named Father of Modern Spiritualism, defined truth as "the source of all eternal realities, the origin of all that is high, divine, infinite. Absolute truth is immutable - the same yesterday, today and forever." Therefore, we as Spiritualists realize in the preparation of teachers of Spiritualism, we cannot be limited to the



completion of a particular course but rather depend on the extent to which each student has unfolded his spiritual faculties, studied facts, and further becomes attuned to his invisible teachers.

There never was a more appropriate time to teach our children of the great truth of a continuity of life. It is a natural and reasonable teaching. It is so much easier to visualize what the teacher means when they use the word "spirit" or "ether" in this day and time for we are in the nuclear age - and this age has brought us into the understanding of gamma rays, radioisotopes, and the supersonic aircraft. It has opened our awareness to the greater vibratory forces of the universe. And, these are in tune with the natural law.

There is much more beyond the range of our five physical senses than most students realize. This in itself shows that the philosophy of materialism is incorrect. The materialist believes in only what he can see, hear and touch. He is limited to his five senses. He ignores the infinite wealth of spiritual knowledge which lies behind the material - in fact, all around him. He ignores the sixth sense as well as the fourth dimension.

If we take the life of Jesus, we find he did not look to the university for teachers to carry the message. He sought and was concerned with spiritually awakening the peoples. He found interest in the humble along life's way. Each is a part of the whole.

Let us not mistake our understanding. Let us not confine the truth of immortality to the conventional limitations of notes, courses and books alone. All the material in the world will avail the student little unless he understands and lives in accordance with the teaching he receives. Reading a book, answering a question, passing a test, does not qualify one spiritually. Spirituality is a development of the soul and each must find his own way and seek out his own development. The mere knowledge of psychic communication between the two worlds is but the first step.

Our official definition of a Spiritualist is "...and who endeavors to mould his character in accordance with the highest teachings derived from such communication." The teachings of Modern Spiritualism are the teachings of life itself. For, of what value is all the education if

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# Turn On A Magnet

And soften your water! Sound unbelievable. Well, it's not. Greater insight arrives with each passing month as our observation of the atom becomes more complete.

In the '40s and '50s, the Army made use of a simple magnetic device which often softened the water. However, since it didn't always work, it was eventually discarded and the company holding the manufacturing rights, a major water pump producer, sold hundreds of the simple cylinder sleeves with its filled tubes of magnetite and the giant electric charging transformer to a firm in Miami, Florida. Since the earth's magnetic field occasionally got in the way of a secondary magnetic field of man-made design and interfered with the simple device's magnetic flux, the new owners were told that prior established application could not be discussed and that a new market had to be carved out. As before, the device often worked beautifully. But then, occasionally, it failed to deliver that soft water or eliminate the hydrogen sulfide gas which every now and then found its way into the water system.

We know so little about the affects and effects of magnetism as compared to the solar system. Its properties are not fully understood although we depend on many of its controllable applications. Dr. Albert Einstein called it one of the great remaining mysteries.

When heated, calcium laden water precipitates calcium carbonate, which forms scales on the interior of containers. Other minerals in hard water tend to cling to the linings of pipes and containers, eventually shutting-down steam generators, pure water steam plants and water heaters, as well as restricting the flow of fluids.

But after years of research failure and marketing questions

the elusive mystic of the magnet again surfaces in the report of Frank Ellingsen of Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore. He has confirmed that magnetic effects on hard water (calcium salt) can substantially reduce the amount of scale - up to 100 percent on steam boilers. Still, the mechanism which is set into motion by the presence of a constant magnetic field remains a riddle just as it did for the Army and the firm in Miami and the original manufacturer and just as the magnetic field about the body tends to be beyond practical reach and application for other less glamorous applications.

The system of the electro-magnetic field which abides about all life - spirit included - is very elusive. Could it be that man is just not ready to receive the knowledge of this very old truth?



Lincoln was an immense personality - firm but not obstinate. He influenced others without effort, unconsciously; and they submitted to him as men submit to nature - unconsciously. Almost ashamed of tenderness, he said and did the noblest words and deeds with that charming confusion, that awkwardness, that is the perfect grace of modesty.

Through days and nights of sorrow, through years of grief and pain, with unswerving purpose, "with malice towards none, with charity for all," with infinite patience, with unclouded vision, he hoped and toiled.

Stone after stone was laid, until at last the Proclamation found its place. On that the Goddess stands.

He knew others, because perfectly acquainted with himself. He cared nothing for place, but everything for principle; little for money, but everything for independence. He knew no fear, except the fear of doing wrong. Hating slavery, pitying the master - seeking to conquer, not persons, but prejudices - he was the embodiment of the self-denial, the courage, the hope, and the nobility of a nation.

He spoke not to inflame, not to upbraid, but to convince. He raised his hands, not to strike, but in benediction. He longed to pardon. He loved to see the pearls of joy on the cheeks of a wife whose husband he had rescued from death.

Lincoln was the grandest figure of the fiercest civil war. He is the gentlest memory of our world.

In 1867, two years after Mr. Lincoln's death, Mrs. Lincoln visited the photograph gallery of Mr. William Mumler in Boston, Massachusetts.

She did not give him her name but went incognito and sat for her picture under another name. When she went to obtain her proof the lady in attendance said to her: "Madam, a very strange result has come upon the plate with your photo. President Lincoln is standing behind you." She answered: "That is all right. I am his widow."

Many copies were taken from the original negative and sold, both in Boston and the societies of the students of occult phenomena. One was copies on a half-tone plate in Paris, which was a true replica of the original photograph with Mrs. Lincoln. The publisher of this half-tone enlargement also had a proof from the original plate and knew the truth of the obtaining of the original negative, since he was intimately acquainted with Mr. Mumler's brother, after William Mumler had "passed on" to the next realm of life through the gateway of death.



# "Timely Reflections"

Fellow Spiritualists:

It seems that today we should be doing more to fulfill the prophecy received from the Spirit World in 1848: "We have come to unite all mankind in harmony, and convince the skeptic of the immortality of the soul."

\* \* \*

One way that I think we can accomplish this goal is to put forth a clear, positive, reasonable explanation of our philosophy. This will give our critics and those who do not understand us, a strong bridge of communication. In this way they will realize we don't want to take away any secure strongholds of their religion, but actually hope to give them a stronger faith.

As Rev. Whitwell so often emphasized, Spiritualism is so much more than a religion, but has two vital additional ingredients, science and philosophy. We cannot expect to take away anyones' own theological beliefs, unless and until we are fully prepared and capable of offering them a clear, strong replacement.

Centuries old theological teachings and religious traditions, handed down from generation to generation, are not going to be immediately discarded without considerable and yet subtle inroads on a person's thinking, and appeal to reason. For instance, I cannot believe anyone today (in this modern age of science) can believe in a literal

person - as the devil, or a specific geographical location as hell. Psychologists are gradually convincing thousands of people of the philosophy we have long espoused: that heaven and hell are states of mind, rates of vibration and zones of consciousness, or that these states of mind are the result and personal responsibility of the thoughts, emotions and actions of each individual, and not caused by arbitrary punishment by some anthromorphic being, outside of the operation of natural law.

\*

Also, we must be reasonably tolerant of the newcomer who is, at first, more impressed with the psychic than the spiritual manifestations and teachings of Spiritualism. But in order to keep them in perspective, and give them priority and value, let us repeat what Lizzie Doten, world famous medium and poetess said in 1863: "The external phenomena of Modern Spiritualism, compared to the great principles underlying them, are but mere frothe and foam on the ocean of truth." In other words the personal messages, which so attract the multitudes, are in reality the tip of the iceberg, and only the introduction to the sublime truths of Spiritualism. Those who reflect and ponder on the great source from which comes such guidance and wisdom, is the subtle, refined, yet lasting greater values of teaching a better way to think and live here and now; to awaken the spiritual qualities long before our transition, and teach everyone receptive and interested, the spiritual language by which we shall live for all eternity.

Simply, if Spiritualism is to do its real and lasting work, it has to go far beyond just interesting people who require help with their daily material problems. It must also educate them to meet and solve their problems by using their own inner wisdom and power.

In a lecture Miss Doten gave on November 2, 1863, on the Mysteries of Godliness, she states: ''As godliness was a mystery in the past, so is it in the present." And why is it a mystery? Because men understand so little of the practice of godliness. Socrates was accustomed to saying that a man was always sufficiently eloquent in that which he clearly understood; and thus a man will not look upon that as a mystery which is a part of his daily life, and with which he has become familiar through experience. As it was in the days when Jesus lived and taught, or when Paul wrote his Epistle to Timothy, so godliness, to the great mass of minds, remains a mystery. When Paul penned those words: "Without controversy, great is the mystery of godliness; God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the spirit, seen of angels, believed on in the world, and received up into glory", - he referred particularly to the life and teachings of Jesus. We, however, give to the passage a more comprehensive and extended application. If the mystery of godliness was made manifest in the life of Jesus because of His divinity, then do we say to the men of the present

day, "Beloved, now are ye also sons of God?" And if the "Word was made flesh, and dwelt in the midst of men," in the person of Jesus of Nazareth, then that same word is incarnated, in greater or lesser degree, in every human being, be he rich or poor, black or white. In the same way, every one possessing a living soul is a manifestation of the mystery of Godliness. When a man goes

could not be translated into human language. It could not be written in books, but it was felt in the soul, and made manifest in the life. Godliness, true spirituality, cannot find expression in words, and so it must of necessity manifest its' divine beauty in the life.

And so, fellow Spiritualists, if we are to fulfill the prophecy

of 1848., let our lives, individually and collectively, be such a clear and convincing demonstration of spirituality and godliness, that by our good works we shall be known and so influence the thinking and living of our times, and thus of all times that follow - of eternity.

into his own nature, when he understands himself and reads the mysteries of his own being, when he looks away from his positive and earthly necessities to his divine possibilities, and sees how vast is the range, how infinite his capabilities, then he begins to understand something of the mysteries of godliness. The church has used this phraseology in the past, but didn't know what it meant. In the past, there were some true and sincere souls in the church who made clear manifest (both by profession and practice) that in part at least, they comprehended the mystery of godliness, (which is the highest spirituality, not Spiritualism) and let it flow out into the beauty and harmony of perfect lives, the church looked at them with a doubtful countenance. There was such a thing as being too holy, and the church felt that such lives were a reproach to it's self-righteousness and hypocrisy. The church was not familiar with the manifestation of true godliness, and consequently looked upon it as something that threatened the internal peace and success of its' stereotyped plan of salvation. It

Spiritualism, our religion, has its definitions, setting out the various branches of Spiritualism. Spiritual healing has a definite place in our religion, because there are many hundreds, yes, thousands of people who turn to our Spiritualist Healers, and obtain results, which they have failed to receive in other branches of healing.

## The Law

# Certificate of a Healer

This case was presented at the 52nd Annual N.S.A.C. Convention in St. Louis, Missouri.

I have in my hand my certificate as a Spiritualist Healer, issued by our State and National organization and I want to refer to it in the remarks I wish to make.

We have all seen demonstrations in our religious services that have been conducted in a manner that did not measure up to what they should have. It is only fitting and proper that we discuss these things in order to understand what we approve of in public healing services and in private.

I am very much in accord with having a time designated for the healing service, and a place provided where the healing may be done, away from the eyes of the public. There are those who are sensitive to the public gaze, which does not leave them receptive to the full benefit of the treatment which might otherwise be derived.

Aside from the public healing service, spiritual healing has a very definite part in our movement in the private work. It is in that part of the work that we are apt to overstep the bounds or get out of line with what we recognize as being legitimate spiritual healing. From this angle, I speak out for "Healing in Spiritualism."

I have two healing centers in Ohio and my work there has recently been brought into the courts. On that occasion some points were brought out that I wish to bring to your attention.

It matters not how good the healer is, or how little or how great his work has been in the movement, there are certain things which must be kept in mind. He must keep within the laws of the civil government. Therefore he must know what those laws are and what are the limitations concerning our practice in healing.

I have heard the statement made that our certificates were not worth the paper they were written on. Friends, I want to tell you it has been

very definitely proven that our certificates are of real value. If properly obtained and properly used, the courts are ready and willing to recognize and respect the value of our certificates of spiritual healing.

On the occasion of a trial, held in the city of Columbus last spring there were present two officers of the Ohio State Spiritualist Association who took the stand in my behalf. They explained that in order to acquire one of our certificates, a Spiritualist healer must have prepared himself and pass a State examination showing, not only an understanding of our philosophy as it deals with healing, but also submitting testimonials that his work has produced definite and satisfactory results.

This certificate, the back of which is marked "State exhibit D," was read several times during the course of the civil trial. The reference to that certificate, the explanation of whose signatures were attached thereto, and who they were in our organization, state and national, carried much weight before the judge and the jury.

But the main point is not so much the fact that I had been recognized by state and national, but the fact that I had kept within the limitations of the civil laws and the laws of our national and state organizations.

In summing up to the jury my attorney called attention to the fact that, "No evidence had been introduced, showing that 'this man' at any time did any of these things, which are prohibited by the State laws." The result of this lengthy but well contested trial was that the case was dismissed.

I believe that at no time should we let down or relax the rules when issuing healing certificates. To be able to function efficiently as a spiritual healer, one must understand, and be able to explain to the patient, the philosophy and religion of Spiritualism and the laws of spiritual healing.

# **Invisible Helpers**

Plato said, "Between God and man are the demons who are always near us, though commonly invisible, and they know our very thoughts."

When Socrates was asked why he busied himself so with private affairs, he spoke thusly, "The thing that hinders me is this familiar spirit, this divine voice, which Meletus has endeavored to ridicule. This spirit has stood by me from my infancy. It is a voice which does not speak, except when it means to take me off from some resolution."

Throughout all past ages when thought rose to stand above the pack and rabble, the belief has prevailed that spirits, both good and bad, interfered in the affairs of mortals. This idea of spiritual guardianship was most strongly evidenced in Greece. The most talented and financially able men chose a life conformable to the suggestions of their presiding spirit guide.

Pythagoras claimed to visit the spiritual world and hold converse with departed spirits. In his writings, he gives a description of the spiritual condition of the homes of Homer, Hesiod and others.

Roman warriors often insisted that they were led into battle by gods.

Old Testament Bible readers

steeped in faith find frequent reference to angels and spiritual helpers who played an important part in shaping the destiny of the Jewish people. Within the pages of the New Testament are found a mine rich in spiritual happenings. Although it really isn't necessary to quote even one example, I favor the marvelous seance on the Mount of Transfiguration, where Moses and Elias appeared and Jesus was transfigured with their images.

In its early days the Christian church taught most consistently the doctrine of angelic guardianship.

Cusebius declared that he heard Constantine speak under oath, that when he was about to go into battle and attack the tyrant Maxentius and was feeling doubtful as to the outcome, he laid peacefully in rest with his men about him. He and his soldiers saw a luminous cross in the heavens, attended by a troop of angels, who spoke as one "O, Constantine, by this sign go forth to victory."

is interesting to observe that while the Greek church has retained this doctrine of truth, the Roman Catholic Church has held to it inconsistently, for on the second day of October of each year, the faithful Greeks celebrate the feast of the Guardian Angels. This is a time when prayers of thanks are offered. True, communication and aid from beyond is recognized but when extended to the unfaithful or of another denomination, then angelic quardianship is considered the work of the devil and it is repudiated.

The Protestant, whilst proclaiming in his creed that he believes in the communion of saints, scoffs loudly at the Spiritualist because he claims to communicate with his spirit friends. The saints are beyond his grasp, thus he can be but less.

ho of you have not heard or read that beautiful story of Joan of Arc, the Maid of Orleans, a simple, untutored peasant girl who, under the guidance of angelic voices, became a soldier and led the armies of France to victory over the lordly English? Yes, her life was taken, but in death her defeat made her a memory everlasting and eventually provided the force which drove the French to victory.

Modern Spiritualism rehabilitates upon a rational scientific basis the fact that millions of spiritual beings walk the earth when we wake and when we sleep. They have a tremendous influence over the lives of mortals.

Who are these spiritual beings? I have heard it said that there is a difference, a great difference, between the angels who appeared to men in Biblical times and those spirits who greet men and women in this day and time. So, if there is a difference, wherein does it exist?

St. Paul explains that "angels are the spirits of just men made perfect" and then he said, "are they not all ministering spirits sent forth to minister to those who are heirs of salvation?"

Sometimes we forget that the word angel is a title, indicating station or intelligence. At this point it is best to ignore tradition and the more standard definitions given for angels. Accept that an angel is an intelligence who ministers, who carries a message of love and comfort to another.

Jo further understand what an angel is, let us ask the question once more. Who are these ministering spirits? They are simply the men, women and children who have passed through the gateway of death into the life eternal. Our fathers and mothers, sisters, brothers, children, neighbors and friends. These friends and loved ones are just as much interested in us after death as they were in life.

Death does not touch the soul, it only frees it. Death cannot change the nature of an individual. Love triumphs over the spoiler, death, and there can be no question but that our loved ones are just as anxious to help us as while with us in the body.

assist us? This is an important question. "If spirits can come back and help us, why do not my friends come and help me," and this is the answer you must recognize. For spirits know the terrible struggles and the grave pain their friends face and often endure. When they show interest in a life they become acquainted to some degree with the problems which must be overcome.

The story of the Return of Peter Grimm offers an excellent parable. If you have not read it, do so soon. It illustrates very forcefully the difficulties under which spirits labor in their attempts to communicate with

their mortal friends. Here was the case of a man, who whilst good at heart, was a benevolent tyrant. He had a nephew and an adopted daughter and he thought it would be just the thing for them to marry and in that way keep his property intact. It never struck him to speak to either one about this, or that they might have completely different ideas in mind. He selfishly assumed this plan was right and decided to help shape their future plans. After exacting a promise from the adopted girl that she would marry the nephew he died suddenly. When he awoke on the other side of life following death he discovered what a great mistake he had made, and he began to devote himself to the task of trying to rectify it.

First he tried to reach the nephew but all that accomplished was to cause the nephew to feel uncomfortable. Next he tried to reach his adopted daughter. She seemed to feel more. His presence enhanced her own inclinations not to marry the nephew whom she did not love. However, she had made the promise and valued it accordingly. Try and try as he would things did not go well and his mistake continued in force. At long last he was successful in controlling a poor invalid boy and through his lips forbade the impending marriage.

In studying the difficulties of spirit communication, we need to constantly bear in mind that we are living in a world dominated by immutable law that when spirits attempt to manifest they must conform to those laws and to this world. Spirits are not supernatural beings, possessed of supernatural powers which enable them to do what they please regardless of conditions.

The next fact we need to remember is that spirits are just people existing in a less dense substance. They have discarded their physical bodies in passing through the change called death and have entered into a slightly different relation with nature. Other than that they are the same character. Just the same mentally, morally and spiritually. They are just what they succeeded in making of themselves during their early career. Talents cannot be developed instantly, without effort, by some miraculous process. It is very essential that investigators and Spiritualists should grasp the full significance of this statement. Communication with spirits has frequently proved a curse because of the mistaken idea that all a man had to do in order to become infinitely wise was to die. If that were true, it might be a blessing to kill off some people right away instead of waiting for nature to run its course.

The fact is that many, many spirits do not know as much about worldly affairs as do we. Why? The answer to this is simple enough. Because they were lacking in experience before they passed over, and they have had no opportunity to strengthen that knowledge since. Allow me to illustrate. My father was a good man, but he was a financial failure. If he had a shilling it burned a hole in his pocket, as he was always anxious to get rid of it. Now, supposing I had \$10,000 to invest, and my father, through some medium, was to start offering me advice as to the kind of investment in which the money should be placed. What do you suppose I should say? Perhaps, I would say, "Father, I don't doubt your interest in my welfare, but where and how did you gain this experience which now qualifies you to advise me how to invest this money?" That's what I would say.

I believe that it is a good rule to "try the spirits." Test them as to their fitness to advise you. I did and would.

Let us return once more to the question as to why our spirit friends seem on occasion to fail us in our times of need. It may be because they do not know how to help. They have not as yet become acquainted with the laws involved and consequently are cut off because of their lack of experience. It may be, however, that the difficulty lies with you. Possibly you do not possess that degree of sensitiveness which will permit you to respond to the impressions of your friends in spirit life. This sensitiveness is a constitutional qualification with which many people are born. You are not to blame if you do not possess it. It is a matter of heredity. Age or morality, or intellectual development has primarily nothing to do with it.

nother fact is clearly demonstrated as a result of our communicating with spirits, namely, that spirits are of varying degrees of development intellectually, morally and spiritually. Many of them have obtained little advancement over us. They are possessed of a more refined etheric body through which they enjoy a conscious relation with the plane of nature slightly above the physical. The measure in which they can help us is largely limited to casting their loving influence upon us. An influence which even those who are not mediums in their more sensitive moments, may feel, and have the clouds of despondency lifted. For when the presence of love is strong, when, for example, loved ones gather, others detect warmth and happiness in abundance and although they may never see or feel others around, they sense the love which flows out and around, as if that love comes from you.

There are hosts of spirits, vastly in advance of ourselves, highly progressed spirits who have climbed to the altitude of a spiritual life, and whose vision has been widened and enlarged. They are really God's ministering angels whose mission it is to minister to humanity, helping to bring to birth, in mortal minds, nobler ideals. They strengthen the reformer, inspire the prophet, and poet; they touch the souls of men with fire from off the altars of heaven; they visit the sick and smooth away the lines of care from the weary and sad of heart. Sometimes they visit our legislative halls and are able to make their influence felt there. They visit battlefields and help the victims of war.

Oh yes, there are hosts of unseen helpers, but for us to reap the benefit of their spiritual influence, we must become spiritually minded; we must open the windows of our souls to let in the light from above. When we learn this secret and conform to this law, we shall find ourselves encompassed by a cloud of

witnesses ready to help us. We shall find that we need not suffer so much from the ills of the flesh, but by coming under their benign influence we can be lifted up to a plane of vibration and thought where the weaknesses of the body will vanish as the mist before the rising of the morning sun.

We shall find that we can be helped mentally. Minds will be illumined and may become channels through which is poured the thought which represents the experiences and wisdom of those exalted souls who have reached nearer to the realm of causes.

We shall find ourselves blessed spiritually, endowed with a larger vision, a greater love for all humanity. We shall attain, under this blessed guidance, to those heights of spiritual unfoldment where we shall truly be able to recognize that we are all children of the same Divine Parent, joint heirs to immortal life. When the time comes, there will be no more wars. Selfishness and injustice will pass away and peace and good will, will prevail on earth, as it is in heaven. Bear in mind, however that these are spiritual helpers. They are willing to help us, but not to live our lives. We must do our part, make the most of our opportunities, develop our own talents, remembering always that God and the angels help those who help themselves.

Do not believe everything you are told, for though the great unseen world contains many a wise discerning spirit, it also has in it the accumulation of human folly, vanity, and error; and this lies nearer to the surface than that which is wise and good. Never for a moment abandon the use of your reason.

# An Argument About God

"There is no other cause proceeding than His own will, no other matter than His own power, no other workman than His own word, and no other consideration than His own infinite goodness." Sir Walter Raleigh

In the Complete Preacher, October, 1877, Joseph Cook argued that only two things exist in the universe - mind and matter. As he reviewed the subject, the inertness of matter prohibited it from originating force or motion. So, thus being true, the force which rests within matter must come from the mind. And since both arrived before man set foot upon the earth his next conclusion was obvious - mind is God.

"Consider my Aristodemus, that the soul which resides in thy body can govern it at pleasure; why, then, may not the soul of the universe, which pervades and animates every part of it, govern it in like manner? If thine eye hath the power to take in many objects, and these placed at no small distance from it, marvel not if the eye of Deity can, at one glance, comprehend the whole. And as thou perceivest it not beyond thy ability to extend thy care, at the same time, to the concerns of Athens, Egypt, Sicily, why thinkest thou, my Aristodemus, that the Providence of God may not easily extend itself through the whole universe?'' Socrates' Memorabilia, 1,4.

Book IV of Hooker's Essays offered a simple point on which man has often used to defend his existence. Since man exists, he is a something. His knowledge of that existence confirms his awareness. When examined with the intuitive certainty that something cannot grow from a bare nothing, he recognizes being brought into substance his being, as it did the first of any substance. His argument grows along these lines as he underscores the need for all things to have a beginning from another. In fact, he concludes that all the powers must be owning to, and received from, the same source. And since man is a thinking being, this eternal source, this power of all, must be a knowing, intelligent being.

"Were we to find in actual existence a personal power to whom nothing is impossible, and learn that he is about to produce a universe, we should expect to see produced just such a wonderfully strong nature as we actually have - a nature peopled with strengths, momenta, brawny agencies of most imposing forms and magnitudes. A weak system, a system that is puny in its operations and trifling in its effects, would misrepresent Him...' Peter Mundi

"Much of what we confer upon Infinite Intelligence comes from the fact that we find ourselves residents upon a plane of life moulded and populated with living and inert forms. We allure to Him by the abstract terms which come to light and to mind as we view and describe the events and sights which around us abound. It is difficult not to think of the author of all this as the First Cause - Infinite Intelligence or God." Whewell's Morality, Vol. 2.

Much is inferred about God from this pillar of life. Hugh Miller in Testament of Rocks professes the argument of reason as he suggests that the design of life, the creatures which populate the earth and adapt to the changes set by environment, that these are the works of a Creator, rather than from the complex mechanisms, that He who wrought of old, after the manner of a man, must have, in his intellectual character, certain man-like qualities and traits.

The idea of the church as the central faculty of a community existed long before Jesus of Nazareth became a viable force for good. Many of his lessons must have riled the leaders of the central church, as he spoke not of building structures to God, but of releasing the spirit within to build man into a temple of God in the daily walks of life.

Emperor Justinian prohibited this training and attempted to inaugurate an official state religion through the Roman Empire. As it represented another means of controlling the populace in isolated corners of the then known world, he could not recognize an inner spiritual temple accessible on an individual level.

The doctrine taught by Jesus tested the mental ability of men. Mentally, the multitudes were unprepared for the philosophy of mysteries. It was simpler for most of them to accept the prescribed doctrine of faith and blind belief. So, creeds of belief were written, doctrines formed and dogmas created and enforced that took advantage of man's limited understanding and high rate of illiteracy.

The visible church gained great power and played an influential role in politics, as well. What greater fear could the church overshadow the populace with other than controlling the very destiny of the human soul?

Unfortunately, the church still refuses to move from the static theology of ancient precepts and look through the telescope of modern truth. They are still teaching the same doctrines. However, secrets of the new age are now being explored. The mind of today refuses to believe God is so limited in understanding that He made a mistake when He created man, as expressed in the Old Testament. If God, himself, has to repent, what is the fate of all mankind? Whether we like it or not, the revolutionary consequences of hundreds of years of revolution are upon us. 

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
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# **Ghosts in Photographs**

by Fred Gettings Published by Crown, N.Y.C. 1978

The subtitle of this excellent book is "The Extraordinary Story of Spirit Photography," which is an apt description of the contents. Spirit photography began in the mid-nineteenth century in Boston, when William Mumler discovered the figure of his cousin (who had passed into spirit twelve years earlier) on one of the plates he had photographed. One of Mumler's most famous photographs was of Mrs. Lincoln, taken in 1865, shortly after the President had been assassinated. Standing behind Mrs. Lincoln, one can clearly see the figure of Abraham Lincoln laying his hands upon her shoulders, and looking directly at his wife.

This remarkable book offers clear, undeniable proof of survival after "death." Shortly after the art of spirit photography became widespread, images of individuals who had passed on began to appear on the photographic plates, and final photographs, often without the intention or wish of the photographer. Although there were many attempts to prove these photographs fraudulent, there has never been enough solid evidence to do so. According to the author, the case remains "open" today.

Page after page reveals photographs with the face (and often the full figure) of someone in spirit. When people who had been photographed compared the faces of those in spirit appearing in their pictures, with pictures of them taken before their passing, it was clear that they were one and the same; but the expressions of those in the photos who had passed on were not quite the same as their expressions in photos taken before their passing. This offered ample proof that the pictures were not superimposed, thereby ruling out fraud. Many scientists investigated spirit photography under test conditions, going so far as to purchase all materials for the photographer to use at the laboratory. These scientists observed every step of the process, from start to finish, often performing the various photographers jobs personally, right through to the final developing of the pictures - only to find those in spirit appearing on the finished product! This happened too many times for it to be coincidence. Some of the early photographers had mediumistic abilities, which helped them in the work that they were doing.


Fred Gettings has written at length on subjects as diverse as art, the zodiac and the occult. It is apparent that he believes in spirit photography, for he has written a cogent, striking narrative of one of the most remarkable phases of Modern Spiritualisms' history. What is even more remarkable to my mind is the fact that Mr. Gettings has not become a Spiritualist, especially after having seen the Truth in the more than one hundred amazing photographs in his book.

We have had our own wonderful experience with photography during the summer of 1978, when we visited Lily Dale. We had taken a photo on the path leading to the pet cemetery, and when the picture was developed, there was the small but unmistakable outline of a dog. When we would show it to friends, they would always ask: "Whose poodle is that in your picture?" I sent the picture to Kodak and Fotomat, but they could not tell me what was on the picture. All that they could tell me was that they were certain that it was not a speck of dust, a scratch or some mark accidentally put on the picture by the processing lab. It did not appear on the negative.

Spirit photography offers additional concrete evidence of the continuity of life; what could be considered more evidential than a photograph of someone in spirit that can be seen again and again.

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
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
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
