Men of Science Must Rend the Veil of Prejudice

WHEN MEN of science turn their attention to solving the problem of Life, using the same law they use in chemistry to ascertain the value of chemicals, their relation to each other, their independent action and their action dependent on each other, they will find the law which creates and sustains Life.

Science has solved many questions through the law of values. They treat every question that arises in a sane and scientific manner. They intelligently group and classify, assembling this in relation to that, moving like the chess player to position and relationship until they find a neutral point upon which all agree. Through the law of deduction they can mathematically, theoretically, logically and compactly, to the minutest detail give the solution and the reason for this and that with an actual and definite law put into action by the creation of their imaginative brain child. The men who can make a mechanical heart find it difficult and beyond their imagination to correlate the facts which they have in their possession for the establishment of positive communication between two minds separated by an imaginary line drawn in the beginning by an unknown quantity in the organism of the mind in the earliest days of man's recognition of a power outside of himself.

Death silences the physical activity — Death closes the channel through which a man demonstrates individuality, wisdom and purpose of living. Death takes the form which our eyes are accustomed to see, stills the voice our ears are accustomed to hear, removes the arms which once embraced us, yes, but Death does not change the immortal form, the immortal voice. That remains intact, one might say, from the beginning of Time and through the continuation of Time. For man to realize that Death is a physical transition man must act and react by the law known to him as the unknown quantity. Once man enters into the laboratory and through the process of deduction separates Life from the physical form he will comprehend the greater value in the loss of the lesser.

Man has advanced through continual experimenting. He has brought from the silence voices and sounds. Man must go a step farther — he must experiment until those in the now called silent world can be heard. The voices of the loving dead are filling the air everywhere and man must lay aside the prejudices of the past, the useless theories of the present and must go into the silence of his laboratory and build an instrument which will pick up the loving greetings of his loved ones. Man must go into the laboratory of his infinite intelligence and wrest from the past the records which are written in the ether for the edification of those who cannot comprehend through the measure of their physical natures.

When scientific men lay aside their own prejudices and the prejudices of the past and open a new ledger on which to write the findings of the thinkers and observers of law through the eyes of the progressive age in which we live, the voices of the past will be heard in proclamation, establishing a new law in this Aquarian age. Scientific men must lay aside the crude mechanisms of the yesteryears and use the finer instruments of the coming years.

Behold, old things shall pass away and the new shall come forth clothed in the robes of understanding, lighted by the lamp of wisdom of the present age.

What the Government Should Do

THE Government should make a drive on the land holders of this country. There should be a census taken to determine how many people would like to own a small piece of land on which they could raise enough to care for themselves and buy the necessary things which they do not raise. When this is done the Government should claim the land now held by syndicates to make farm colonies for this class of people, in each State where land is now being held and not used. These people should be given the choice of living where they can be most contented and where the climate agrees with them. There could be schools, churches and manufacturing plants established.

There should be a census of industry taken by the Government and these industrialists given an opportunity to share with the working people the privilege and the right to earn their livelihood and if they refuse to do this their industries should be confiscated by the Government under a declaration of war to save industry for the people.

Four years ago President Roosevelt set up institutions to compel corporations to recognize the rights of the workers; the Supreme Court saw fit to declare these laws unconstitutional, throwing the strength of the Government to the opposition of the welfare of the Nation. This year he has been authorized to restore these laws and he must not take the part of the watchful waiter.

This country must have its resources developed and protected.

The public utilities must be taken out of the

hands of private ownership.

Government property and Interstate commerce must be wrested from the hands of the financial bootleggers and restored to the people.

Lobbying in the Halls of Legislature by finan-

cial interests must be stopped.

Provision must be made for future generations. HOMES must be erected and maintained for the generation now coming to the school age.

The Social Security act in its present form is not adequate to perform the task it has been given to do. There are too many easy-job men angling for permanent positions for the interests of themselves and their immediate families. The Government must be ever on guard for the President is beset from every angle for special privileges. His enemies in the past created this group — his enemies of the future will propagate it, but he is a fisherman and he knows the gale—the direction in which it blows, its strength and how to set his sails. He will meet with great opposition—he will be defied, maligned and many traps will be set to catch him in an unguarded moment; treachery at home and abroad by his most trusted and selfstyled patriots. Dreams Do Come True!

SOME dreams do come true! How-ever, the greater portion of them do not indicate future events, because, like our wakeful thoughts, they are both negative and positive in nature. Negative dreams are a more or less distorted jumble of thoughts from our past experiences and may indicate the trend of our everyday thinking habits from which worthwhile conclusions may be drawn through such means as psychoanalysis. Positive dreams either naturally or symbolically indicate some future activity within our mental realm, and they constitute a projection of the subconscious mind into the future state: the awareness of which depends upon the ability of the dreamer to bring the undistorted facts up into the objective mind upon awakening. It requires a peculiarly delicate connection between the objective and subjective mind to do this, therefore, dreams which portray the future are noted much less often than are those of a negative design.

I have not always believed that dreams could portray future events, having been taught during the process of education that such beliefs were purely superstitious; but experience has taught me through a bitter lesson that some dreams may either actually or symbolically envision future events. It must be remembered that positive dreams are entirely different in nature from the negative ones. They are vivid, alive, and so tenacious that you seem unable to forget them. Even when you have assured yourself that they mean nothing you will find them returning to your mind repeatedly, and when they persist in this fashion you must give them consideration.

My first experience along this line came in the year of 1917. My mother and my seven year old nephew came to live with me. My nephew's name was Theodore and he was just three months older than my own son. I loved him dearly for he was an adorable child. He did not get along very well in his school work and the nurse there said that his eyes needed attention. I took him to an oculist, who said that it would be necessary to have his tonsils and adenoids removed before his eyes could be properly fitted with glasses. I consulted a physician and we made arrangements to have an operation.

The night before this operation my mother vividly dreamed that someone came to her and told her that we must not operate on Theodore. She was filled with fear and then thought that we carried out the operation and when it was finished someone came to her carrying a tray upon which lay Theodore's heart. Mother cried out that he could not live without his heart, and

was so terror stricken that she awakened. She could not sleep during the balance of the night. In the morning she told me about her dream and insisted that I call the doctor and tell him that we would not have the operation done. A dear friend, a school teacher, was present and we both thought that the dream was due to worry. We carried out our plans and the operation was successfully performed without excess hemorrhage, but in a day or two pneumonia developed. We knew that he had been carefully cared for but a few days later we were astonished to find that three weeks prior he had been exposed and was now developing whooping cough. The final result was a fatal streptococcus infection. The illness was a prolonged one. He died in my arms and his last words were to tell me how dearly he loved me. So deeply was one of the nurses touched with the pathos of the case that she vowed never to care for another child during illness. The physician who operated was forced to go away for relaxation due to nervous strain. I was heartbroken and nerveshattered. This experience changed my whole outlook regarding such matters as dreams and psychic experiences, and I can truly date my active interest in Occult Philosophy to that time.

A short time after the above experience I moved miles away from that city, then to my present home. Years later I studied the Science of Astrology and was elated to know that one could discern much of the future through this method; but like all students of Natal Astrology I met with the disconcerting problem of uncertain birth-hours. I resolved to do all that I could toward having correctly registered the exact time of birth of as many infants as possible who were being born in the present time. I then began to interest every physician I knew in the age-old science of astrology.

The physician who had operated on my nephew was then at the head of the obstetrical department of one of the largest hospitals in our state. So while visiting in my old home town I called to see him. As I entered his office I noted the time and later erected a horary chart for that moment, inserting therein the planets according to their location on his birthday, for like many others he did not know his birth-hour. When the chart was finished I was dismayed to find that he was approaching what seemed to be a fatal illness. I did not dare, nor would I predict his death, but I did advise him to give serious and careful attention to his own health. As the chart I used was of a horary type I could not predict the time of the event.

On the night of February 2, 1933, just three months after I had visited my physician, I went to bed as usual and awakened some time after midnight. As I was drifting off to sleep again I was caught by a positive dream. I knew that I was dreaming. I have read that mental scientists state that no one dreams in terms of color, but that is untrue in my experience for as my dream began I was in a field of very green and thrifty clover. I approached a house wherein was my own family. They were unaware of my presence when I appeared before them and I realized that my psychic body was free. I knew that while in this state I could go where I willed and for some unaccountable reason I willed to go to my physician in the distant city. As I did so I noticed three ears of yellow corn lying at my feet. I stooped and picked them up but replaced two of them, then, carrying one, I was instantly in my old home town. For a moment I was bewildered for I did not know the home address of my physician and I knew it was then night time; but upon consideration I remembered that I could will myself into his presence, which I did, and arrived at a house by the side of the river. I knew this was not his home and had the impression that it was a place for relaxation. His wife and two grown children were there with him. He insisted upon shaking hands with me but I refused, trying to explain that it was my psychic body which he was seeing and telling him that if he touched me I would immediately be at home in bed. However, he failed to understand and approached me with outstretched hands. I arose to a height above him so he could not touch me and then tossed him the ear of corn, telling him that I would return again and again. I distinctly saw myself returning home and then awakened.

I was so impressed and agitated by this dream that I got up and wrote it down with the date, etc. I could not free myself from the experience for days, yet I did not dare write to my physician for fear of making myself ridiculous. On the morning of February 22 my son received a telephone call from his aunt in this same city, asking that he come there at once upon some urgent business. I went along and shortly after arriving there I called my physician on the telephone for I was sure that something unusual had happened to him. It was during his evening office hours but no one answered the phone. I then called the physician's exchange and the girl there asked me if I did not know that my doctor was in the hospital very ill, in

I know that when a housewife feels discontented with her home, she jerks out all the rugs, puts them on the line, takes a broom and beats them until no dust is left. Then she leaves them there for the sun to purify. Next she mops under the beds and even cleans out the dresser drawers, throwing away the useless and keeping the beneficial. After this is over, she lives in peace with herself until she is again made discontented with the accumulation of dirt.

The church organizations need to have a good house-cleaning. There is nothing wrong with the Teachings of Jesus. Christianity is just the same now as it was when He explained it to us through His great works.

"But if the salt have lost his savor, it is thenceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out, and to be trodden under foot of men."

These organizations—not Christianity—have lost their savor. I shall prove it by facts which happened in my home town.

Though my home town is only a village, the inhabitants are human beings, the same, practically, as are in New York, Russia, or Mexico. They cry and laugh; they hunger and thirst; they search vainly for happiness. Just as the people of large cities and of other nations, they have grown more discontented and restless of late; because they have taken the wrong road to happiness, that of the mammon instead of the road to God. "No man can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one and love the other. You cannot serve God and mammon."

"Make not my Father's house a house of merchandise."

Didn't one of our organizations have a "Pure Food Show" in the church, and sell everything from second-hand clothes and lard to hamburgers? Another church gave a party inside the House, and had a prize drawing. Fifteen cents to fish and you got a prize worth at least three cents.

Every summer at revivals another one takes up donations. Mr. Jones has to tell aloud what he gives and the name is again called with the amount given. The big members are afraid not to contribute large donations because they do not want to be thought stingy, and how they do love the praise of men. The poor washerwoman — well, they will take all she will give, too. The preacher understands his psychology—"For they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God." Such are some of the leaders of our flocks.

"And why ye take thought of raiment?"

Go to church and look at the congregation. What do you see? Gorgeous clothes, cocky hats, paint, dyed hair and eyelashes and permanents. Everyone is trying to improve on Nature. What God must think of His worshippers! Do you suppose that they are fooling Him? "Be not deceived; God is not mocked; for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap." I know of at least fifteen ladies who make a dress for each day of the revival. They plan for them weeks ahead, so that they can outdo the others. They even go so far as to hang them up when finished in the closet in order of the days they are to wear them. It seems that they are thinking of everything else rather than showing mercy on the poor members who have only one Sunday dress, and of giving to the needy.

"Thou shalt not bear false witness."

Did you ever visit a Church Sewing Circle? "For it is a shame for a woman to speak in the church." This circle is one of the biggest gossiping centers ever organized, and I say it without feeling that I have exaggerated. We have had young girls who were certainly in need of The Physician to be thrown outside the church doors because of talk started in these circles.

"Give good measure, press down and shaken together and running over."

There are the Christian business men who go to church on Sunday and then on Monday give you the little end of a deal, and the doctor who goes to the services and then comes home and charges eight dollars to visit a poor sick man ten miles away.

Visit a church ice cream supper and see how much cake and ice cream you get for fifteen cents. Or to one of their dinners for twenty-five cents. If you haven't eaten with them, you should by all means, in order to understand fully what I mean. Of course they are

trying to make money; but are they asking for donations or are they giving a measure pressed down as a Christian organization should do?

"Take heed that ye do not your alms before men, to be seen of them; otherwise ye have no reward of your Father which is in heaven."

I sigh in sorrow at our Christian world when I say that I could give fifty cases in my home town such as the two I have given here:

Widow Jones needed quilts for her four children and so the Church women made her three out of old overalls and rags; they made the stitches so big that a dime could be run under most of them. Then Mrs. Thomas' house burnt. Mrs. Thomas was a big member. She owned much land and was a member of the Eastern Star. So these same women gave Mrs. Thomas a shower and she received so much that the things could not fit in one room. She got nine beautifully quilted quilts, one having 9,850 diamonds pieced together and quilted with the neatest of stitches.

A baby shower was given to poor Sarah Brown, who had five other halfclothed children. She was given enough to fill a shoe-box. No names were pinned to the articles, the most expensive costing fifteen cents. Then within the same week Mrs. Harrison was given a baby shower. Mrs. Harrison was a member of the Eastern Star. So she received enough gifts to fill the back of two V8's, the most expensive costing fifteen dollars! Names were pinned to each article, so that as they sat in a circle around the expectant mother the ladies could examine and praise the gifts. "For they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God."

"Blessed are the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God."

Everyone knows of malicious information given by so-called Christians, or of lives made unhappy by gossip carried, or of other variances uprooted; but there is one thing which should be brought to light: How can Christian organizations take up the Flag of War and conscientiously shout: "Let us kill to save our honor"?

NEPTUNE, THE ELUSIVE

covered, in September of 1846, it was a notable achievement and one dreamed of for fifty years by the leading astronomers of the world.

Its physical habits and eccentricities were noted and catalogued. The fact that it had but one satellite—that its diameter is 34.800 miles and that it receives only one nine-hundredth of the light from the sun that the earth does, was intensely interesting.

But it remained for those silent and patient researchers, the occult minded astrologers, to delve into further facts which are far more important to the waiting world, for they open a new vista of thought for thousands, leading to both mental and spiritual development.

Since it takes over a century and a half for this ponderous planet to circle the skies, its arrival in one particular sign and the changes which it causes during its stay in it of fourteen years, becomes most illuminating.

How a planet 2,791,500,000 miles from the Sun can affect us, may be explained to the thinking person through some scientific facts. Neptune is watery and vapory and gaseous in physical nature, these facts immediately suggesting the elusive or highly idealistic, utopian qualities all astrologers attribute to it when well placed in the birth chart, while the opposite, or chaotic and peculiarly unstable conditions, result from the poorly placed Neptune at birth. The etheric nature of this planet and its highly gaseous composition, so easily affected by universal vibration, makes the effects of Neptune readily understandable to the occult scientists and the lay student is also getting a clearer understanding as the human mind and intellect expand in keeping with our recognition of the ever forward evolutionary trend.

In astrological practice Neptune is accounted as being dualistic, comatose, neutral and convertible, negative materially and positive spiritually. It is said to be the planet of Divinity and, in the senses, to rule psychometry. Its colors are those of ocean water and the varying shades of amethyst and lavender, an irridescent blend. It has an affinity for Friday, being the higher octave of Venus. It is the ruling planet of the 12th Zodiacal sign, Pisces.

However, to study Neptune from his material and physical aspects would be to know little or nothing of his real nature-in fact, it would be as reasonable to judge the disposition of a man by the cigarette he smokes, but if we study Neptune through his relation to other standards we may be able to deduce some interesting facts.

Almost everyone knows that the vibrations which cause heat and light come from the sun, and where light and heat radiate we have force or

WHEN the planet Neptune was dis- energy. Physical scientists know that throughout the world and its surroundings there is a tenuous substance called ether, pervaded by everything that is solid, liquid or gaseous. In this ether all things are formed of one and the same material, an elementary substance in the form of ions. Each ion is joined to or is being actuated by a charge of electricity. These are in rapid motion and the nature of the charges and the speed and direction of the movements determine the nature of all the infinite forms of matter, in all grades of density, from gas to solids.

> So ether is the essence of all matter, always affected by force, of which electricity is only one form of manifestation. Every vibration travels through all space.

> Hertz waves vibrate 6 million per second.

> Infra-red heat waves, 100 million per second.

> Light waves, red and violet, 400 billions per second.

Ultra violet, 2,000 per second.

N-rays and X-rays, probably trillions per second.

So, sound which is audible to our ears, may be detected by a sensitive flame, and light invisible to us can be made visible by some flourescent substance or demonstrated in chemical action. But to many of these waves, we have no mode of response. So whether we speak of X-rays, electricity, light, color or sound, we are speaking of vibration and vibration is energy. Since light, heat, color and sound are closely related, we may deal with them according to their vibrations, and these determine whether they are light, heat, color or sound.

It has been proved by scientists that the nervous system of man is a perfect telegraph unit. This nervous system is sensitive to the peculiar electric action of atmosphere wave-lengths, and is approximately 5,000 miles in length. This radio sensitivity enables one to receive impressions from inanimate objects as well as mental images. (Star-

Heat, light and color produce their sensations through etheric vibrations, each bearing some affinity to the other and with the primary celestial orbs. These differ in quality and act through the nervous system of the human frame in accordance with its sensitiveness.

Different colors have different wavelengths. Red is the greatest, then orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet. X-rays are invisible to the eye.

If the vibrations are transformed into sound waves, we hear what we cannot see or feel. The radio has vibrations which are invisible and inaudible, yet they travel through all

materials. If we tune in, we hearotherwise we remain oblivious.

It is obvious that we should not remain blind to the truths which confront us and the correspondences which bind the fabric of the universe together.

Science shows that the planets are composed of the same elements as the earth. The universe is composed of various forms of energy and elements produced by such energy. This is radiation of different frequencies. Invisible and inaudible radiations are used for killing microbes with ultra-violet rays. They use high frequency generators to grow plants in place of sunlight. We know through the study of vitamines that light is brain-food.

Radiations from the planets affect humanity through the nervous system. Every substance contains molecules and electrons which are subject to radiations of different frequencies. Radio-active elements are found in the atmosphere as well as on land and in water. All elements respond to certain frequencies and break up and form a different substance.

It should be borne in mind that the law operates in all parts of the universe and not in certain parts. Nothing is so ridiculous as the would-be scientist who balks at admitting this truth. When we pursue the trail of truth we must go where it leads us!

The permeability of matter has been studied by scientists for a long time. Sir David Brewster notes the passage of carbon through solid wood by means of electric fluid, and by an electric current an acid may be separated from its sodium base and passed through the dilute syrup of violets without changing the color of the solution. The question then arises, in what form was the carbon in the one case and the acid in another when they passed through their respective media. Obviously their atomic vibrations were temporarily raised in such degree by electric action as to change them from their normal characters. (Sepharial.)

Everything in the universe has an aura of its own-an emanation of light and color. This is usually from one foot to three in depth around humans, and fourteen miles deep around the earth. This aura is constantly changing according to the vibrations impinging upon it from other auras and planetary bodies.

Those whose sight is highly developed state that the aura around the head is blue. At the feet it is red. The right side is grey blue, the left yellow. This corresponds with the visible heavens, as blue is associated with the midnight point, red with the South and mid-day; the neutral to the East and dawn; the yellow at the West and sunset.

A PROOF OF SURVIVAL

THE learned psychical societies of America and Great Britain persist in declaring that incontrovertible proofs of survival after death have not been satisfactorily produced. They have had thousands of experimental seances, investigated automatic writing of messages, have sought out purported ghosts and other so-called spirit entities who have appeared in various communities. "Not evidential" is their invariable comment.

What, then, can be considered as coming strictly under the requirements of evidence? Much of the material collected by the British Society of Psychical Research and its American counterpart has, they frankly confess, inexplicable features. But they appear to take the attitude that where there is a doubt it is prudent to adopt a negative attitude. The courts of law have rigid and well-established rules whereby that which can be accepted as evidence can be easily determined, and is or is not admissible. Can we not, then, find a common ground of acceptance for what is prima facie proof of the truth of psychic revelations?

Let us see if this cannot be done. Let us weigh carefully a new technique of proof in regard to survival after death.

Lurking hidden within that mysterious and obscure border-line between the known and the unknown are many facts awaiting capture. We grope and hunt persistently in this domain, using every resource of skill and science; intrepid and courageous hunters now and then emerge in triumph dragging another fact into the light of day-and the world has a new thrill. Beyond doubt the most elusive of all the demonstrable facts sought by man is the proof of survival after death. The matter-of-fact generation of today is asking why can we not have knowledge, instead of faith, regarding a world beyond this one?

It is a singular thing that while the Bible is full of references to spiritual visitants to this earth, that many who accept it as a "holy" and inspired book unhesitantly refuse to accept latter-day manifestations of the presence of spirit entities amongst us from the world beyond.

Let us be logical about this. If survival is certain, if there is a considerable amount of testimony regarding it which psychical savants frankly admit is inexplicable, what shall we do with these revelations? The judges admit they are not fraudulent, nor tricks of hypnosis, mental telepathy or other mundane sources. We don't want to seem unjustifiably credulous, nor, on the other hand, can we refuse to be just.

And yet, how shall we label these baffling expositions and disclosures? How shall we be able to find and use a decisive regent with its results as sure as those which the chemist finds through his laboratory tests, or the assayer when he determines the value of ores in his crucible? To be conclusive and acceptable beyond question, proofs of survival must be as demonstrable as a mathematical problem which is solved through the use of known principles, or as proportions of hydrogen and oxygen inevitably produce water.

It would seem that in reviewing the results of psychic experiments and phenomena during the past years that one investigator has inadvertently stumbled upon what may prove to be a long-sought and convincing key to prove the continuance of life after death. As a new technique of proof it

yet remains to be tried out; but the important fact is, that an instrument seems to have been discovered and that we should use it to discover whether it is potent and infallible. We believe it is. Singularly enough, this investigator did not appear to regard his discovery as an important find, nor to have followed it up.

What, then, was the unrecognized sign-post that this investigator passed by? It was no more nor less than a thumb-print, clear and distinguishable, which a spirit entity had imprinted while materialized from the ectoplasm of a medium. If we remember right, the materialized one even suggested that thumb-print clearly. The pity of it is that when the medium said that the personality of this spirit form could be irrefutably proven by comparing this thumb-print on the wax with an old razor-blade used before the death of this entity, that the razor-blade thumbprint was too blurred and indistinct to make comparison possible!

But the important fact remains that this ectoplastic personality was able to make and leave his thumb-print. It has since been seen and verified by several people. The unmistakable impression of a thumb is there, recorded on the wax. Well, shall we stop there, and merely comment that this revelation is an interesting experiment in psychic phenomena?

This would hardly seem to be the way in which the scientist reacts, or the chemist proceeds when an unlooked-for element bobs up in the laboratory. Many a great discovery in physics and science has leaped into notice through the surprise visitors to the test-tube. Let us, then, grant this psychical disclosure with at least similar recognition.

If this spirit personality has left his thumb-print with us, others who have passed on can also do so. The writer suggests that all of us who have had some contact with occult and psychical phenomena adopt some general and definite plan for the recording of our finger-prints at this time. The many psychic societies and groups throughout the world should each provide cards of uniform size and data for this purpose. The finger-prints on these cards should be accompanied by its verification by one or more well-known persons within the organization, or attested by an official of the city. Personal data and peculiarities should also be included and such other facts as will aid in positive identification. Such data, after being made, should be deposited in a central office for future reference.

Since few of us are able to "come through" after death, it would also seem advisable that as many of us as possible should now, at this time, make these finger-print records.

If we, now amongst the living, have our finger-prints and other personal data recorded, verified, and filed in a central office, should it not constitute satisfactory, incontrovertible evidence of survival, if, after death, some of us are able to return and make fingerprints which correspond exactly with those we thus made while in life?

It is urged that steps be taken by those interested in trying out this experiment; in formulating a general system whereby such records can be made and filed.

Who can predict the importance of the future results? If successful, should this not awaken thousands to the realization that, after passing over, we are neither dead nor sleeping?

"Singleness of Thought"

THE psychologists place a lot of faith in thought. They say that everything in life of man is traceable to thought. The accomplishments of Edison and Wright and Burroughs were successfully accomplished in their minds before the world knew about them. If their inventions had failed, they had failed first in the minds of the inventors. Success or failure must begin with thought. Sir Isaac Newton was asked how he happened to discover the law of gravitation. "By always thinking about it." was his answer. Newton's thought was that he would one day solve the problem of gravitation. He did not consider that he might fail to find the solution; his thoughts were all directed toward the discovery of the mystic power which we now know as gravitation. Seeing an apple fall from the tree started his mind to working and wondering about the force which seems always to compel objects to fall to earth. From thenceforward, he exerted all his powers of thought in solving the problem and the result was success.

Thought brought success to Edison and Wright and Newton and all the rest of the notables who have achieved, only because they learned the lesson, "concentration." They were able to accomplish because they fixed their attention on the things they were doing to the exclusion of all else. They solved one problem at a time. They did not disrupt and scatter their powers by attempting to do many things at once. That is the habit of the man who fails. It is impossible to drive an oxcart and fly an aeroplane simultaneously. It is just as impossible to invent an aero-

plane and discover the law of gravitation simultaneously.

Singleness of thought is the explanation of the achievements of Edison and Wright and Newton. It is only the single thought that can penetrate to the inner man and work back into concrete fact. The individual who concentrates on a dozen thoughts is not concentrating; he will never work one of his dozen of thoughts to a successful conclusion. Like the Austrian emperor who began hundreds of important projects without finishing one, he will leap about from thought to thought and act to act, and go through life without purpose or accomplishment.

If you feel the need of a hat, buy it just as soon as you find one that meets the requirements of taste and pocketbook. If you look for a day and are unable to make a decision as to the hat you want and finally go home without making a purchase in spite of the fact that you need a hat and have the money to buy one, you have lost an important battle with your imagination. Go back as soon as possible and buy the hat you think looks best on you. Don't give a thought to the hundreds of other hats you saw which looked good or better or worse on you; but confine yourself to one hat and one only. That is singleness of thought crudely explained. The result will be the purchase of a hat, and if that is the only thing you accomplish that day you will at least have accomplished something. That will convince you that singleness of thought leads to singleness of purpose.

Whatever you start out to do, you will do only after you have learned the lesson of singleness of thought. Try to put on your overshoes and your shirt at the same time. You will do neither. No accomplishment deserving of the name is born without a singleness of thought and purpose.

"With Regard to Cost"

The action of man is justified by two things: the end of the road and the direction in which the road travels. If the end brings finally, sorrow and pain and regret, it were better that the action be dropped while yet it may. Oftentimes, the end is to be judged by the direction in which the road travels, though not always. Holmes said, "The greatest thing in the world is not so much where we are, but in what direction we are going." Thus, it would seem that the final goal we are to reach is to be judged by the road we travel. If the road we travel brings sadness in the hearts of others, if the road we travel works hardships into other people's lives, if we feel dissatisfied, and morose, conscience-stricken, we are

If we would reach the goal to which we aspire, it were well to have some regard for the cost. If upon regarding the cost, we find that we are not paying too much for the thing we get, we are assured that we are going in the right direction. Socrates considered the cost before he set out on his journey. And then, after he knew he was going in the right direction, he calmly disregarded the cost, the hardships, the agonies to which he must be subjected along the way, and went forward happy with the knowledge that he was traveling in the right direction. Socrates knew that it was his divinely-appointed mission to force upon his fellow men self-knowledge, and conviction of ignorance. What man with an inspiration of that nature could ever travel the wrong road? Selfknowledge, Socrates felt, would be the first step toward betterment. He felt that no man was willingly bad, and that vice was ignorance. Thus, with the abolition of ignorance among the youth, vice and evil would at that moment disappear.

Every youth appearing in the market place and the streets and public resorts was sure to find Socrates there with his words of wisdom. But the adult Athenians laughed at Socrates and called him fool. And when at the fair he exclaimed, "How many things there are that I do not need." they knew that he was crazy, for even then he had but one piece of clothing and naught but bread and water for food.

The Secrets of Handwriting Revealed

THOSE WHO WALK ALONE

IN AN article some months ago we discussed the tragedy of the misfits. This was in connection with vocations and professions and the misfortunes caused men and women who are misplaced. There is, however, another type of misfit that goes through life and often suffers untold misery. The intensity of their suffering depends upon the various traits that go into the building of their character as a whole. The unfortunates that we here refer to are those who walk through life alone. The friendless or rather those comparatively friendless, the social misfits and the persons who for some reason find it difficult to make friends.

Of course, the reason why some people find it difficult to get along with others or to make friends varies with the individual. In one person it may be one negative trait. In another it is something entirely different. In some persons the social urge is not developed. As a rule these people do not care to make friends and it is only natural for them to want to be alone. However, the average person wants to have at least a few congenial friends and suffers intensely if they should happen to lose one. In any case the sociability of a person is no stronger than some negative trait permits it to be. That is, a person may be capable of being sociable and very friendly except for one particular characteristic, but this single negative trait, whatever it happens to be, undermines the natural sociability of the person concerned. Everyone who has difficulty in making friends should take stock of himself or herself and make a sincere effort to locate the difficulty and if possible remove it.

Men and women in whom the social urge is not developed usually place this evidence in the loops below the line. The formation of the "t" or the "i" may prove them to be even tempered while the condition of the script as a whole shows that they are of a friendly nature. It is only that they do not seem to crave the companionship of others to any great extent. Yet, even in instances of this type the person concerned usually is found to have at least one congenial friend.

It has been noticed that people of this type sometimes have an unfortunate tendency to antagonize those with whom they come in contact. They can not mix with the average person and those they meet instinctively sense this and just as instinctively resent it. The trouble is that when the social urge is not developed it has a decided tendency to give the party concerned an air of aloofness that is difficult to penetrate.

Often people in whom the social urge in not developed spend much time reading. The condition of their writing has also disclosed that many of them are spiritually inclined and take a good

deal of interest in religion, theology or something similar. Sometimes the formation of the "p" proves that they like the woods or life in the outdoors. They can go for a long hike all alone and enjoy themselves. It has also been found that some of them are not very good conversationalists. This is always disclosed in the formation of the "a" or the "o". They think about what they read and what they see. Very often they form some very interesting ideas concerning matters in which they take an interest. However, the fact that they have difficulty in expressing their views makes it hard for them to explain their ideas.

Some time ago a young couple came to see us. Their handwritings were as different as any scripts could possibly be. Yet the loops below the line in both specimens proved beyond a shadow of a doubt that neither one of them was as sociable as it was possible to be. The young lady in question was of a friendly nature and liked people. It showed in the condition of the script, the dotting of the "i" and the depth of the strokes. She could meet people and was friendly but when it came to real friendship she drew the line. She simply did not care to make many intimate friends and as a result kept to herself and gave the impression of being distant.

So far as the young man was concerned the slant of the script showed that he is of a very hasty and impulsive nature. He does not hesitate to show how he feels about things. The "a" disclosed frankness in his speech and he admitted being able to talk to anyone. He had the ability to get along with others and his nature is such that he is always reaching out for other people. He wants to know them and exchange ideas with others. Yet, when it comes to forming deep friendships he draws back. He instinctively draws people to him then he holds them away. Quite naturally this puzzles those with whom he comes in contact and he is a puzzle to many, but it is all caused by conflicts in his own nature.

Sometimes an overdeveloped sense of pride is the reason why some people are not as friendly as they could be. This is always disclosed in the condition of the letter "d". Many times this trait is developed to a point where the person concerned is egotistic and conceited. People who are social climbers quite frequently bring out these traits in their writing and more often than not they are guilty of being snobbish.

Persons who possess these traits are much too prone to ignore those whom they consider to be social inferiors. This is something that a good many people need to watch out for because there are very few things that drive others away quicker than to make them feel inferior. It is all very well to have high standards but they should not be measured by social positions.

There are many persons who would otherwise be very likable and pleasant except for their vanity. Because of this trait they lose friends that could otherwise be valuable in more ways than one and their own personality suffers. In the handwriting of persons of this type the loops below the line often vary. Some of these loops disclose a certain amount of sociability while other loops prove the person concerned does not care to be friendly. This goes hand in hand with the vanity because such a person will accept those whom they consider worth while but will close their friendship to others.

Where the letter "d" discloses vanity and the position of the strokes in the writing proves the individual in question is naturally distant this negative trait is intensified. Many times the person in question is so brittle that he or she seem to be afraid to stoop for fear their dignity will suffer. In most instances this is cold vanity that has not the slightest consideration for others. Is it to be wondered at if people of this type go through life without making any real friends?

A very sensitive nature also disclosed in the letter "d" may also cause a person to lose friends and feel alone. This is especially true where the slant of the writing and the condition of the strokes proves the person concerned to be emotional and who possess deep feelings. Such persons are very impressionable and as a result remarks or actions of others go very deep. The writing was that of a young man and although the slant of the writing proved that he was emotional the "d" did not disclose any exceptional sensitiveness. The "t" and the condition of the writing proved that he was even tempered yet he did not make friends the way he should. In this case the capital letters brought out the fact that he was lacking in self-assurance. Most of the time he was afraid that people would not like him and he kept to himself too much.

More often than not the type of persons mentioned in the two foregoing paragraphs are the friendliest people on earth. They are not difficult to get along with unless there is some mean trait that swings the emotions into some negative channel.

The latter was just the case with a woman whose handwriting we analyzed some time ago. She was also very sen-

Finger Nails Interpreted

IN THE examination of hands, a careful investigation of the finger nails should be made, for from them can be correctly gauged the general health, the tendency toward certain diseases, as well as the habits and characteristics of the subject.

In order to lay the foundation for a good understanding of these matters, let us consider the biological aspect of the nail. Each nail is composed of two parts: first, its visible body; second, the root, which is imbedded under the skin. There are great nerve centers under the nails, and the nails themselves owe their color to the color of the blood in the capillaries under them. When these nerve centers are operating in a healthy manner, this fact is reflected by the texture of the nail, and on the other hand, when the nerve centers are impaired, this condition leaves its impression on the nail texture by changing the quality of the nail itself. Scrofula, arthritis, hysteria, tuberculosis, paralysis, kidney, liver, intestinal and other disorders, leave their record upon the nails.

As a general rule, the smooth, well rounded and rosy nail is the healthy nail. This is especially true when the nail is of medium size, without spots or ridges and well arched.

Nails ridged along their length often indicate a tendency toward rheumatism, sluggish liver, congested kidneys, ulcerated stomach or intestinal trouble. Transverse ridges indicate past illnesses.

The time element by which we are enabled to gauge the periods of illness, is based on the distance between the ridges or grooves. It requires, ordinarily, about nine months for a nail to grow. The nail is measured from the base to the tip.

Practical Lessons in Palmistry for the Lay Reader

With neuritis, an inward curve of the nail is seen, whereas with arthritis, the nail often becomes brittle and deformed. A tendency towards paralysis flattens and whitens the nail. Anemia often causes the nail to take on a whitish, bluish color. Tuberculosis alters both the shape and the condition of the nail.

Long nails do not appear to indicate as great physical strength as the short, broad type. Long nails, with a distinct bluish tinge, often indicate delicate health and poor circulation. Where the color is dark blue, with a ridge at the edge, the indication is towards anemia and digestive troubles. Short small nails often indicate a tendency towards heart trouble.

Short, broad nails indicate better health than the smallest nails and there is usually greater vitality in every way. The health indications which this type of nail is more subjected to are those of the throat and the bronchial tubes. Often there are afflictions of the feet and the ankles. This sometimes includes rheumatism.

Long, broad nails often indicate a tendency towards nervous exhaustion. Individuals with this type nail often work at high tension, are highly strung, and for this reason are more subject to nervous troubles.

Short, narrow nails often accompany a languid, dreamy disposition and show a tendency towards curvature of the spine.

Deformed nails, unless such is caused by injury or operation, frequently indicate diseases affecting the blood and the bones.

Nails, pink in color, indicate normally good health. Where the color of the nail is irregular, varying between pink and white, or white and pink spotted, the indications are that the blood is not in good condition. Pale nails often indicate lack of vitality, whereas blue color shows not only a bad condition of the blood but often relates to ovarian trouble with women.

Where the tip of the nail seems to reflect a bluish-red color, the indications are of bad intestinal elimination, which tends toward slackening the other vital forces and often causes drowsiness and languor to the body.

White spots on the hands of children often indicate irregularities in the functions of nutrition, blood supply or nerves, whereas in adults, the danger is of a nervous breakdown.

In youth, the normal nail is soft and pliable. In old age, hard and brittle and sometimes scaly. In middle age, the normal nail is of good shape and well colored, without spots or blemishes.

A thick nail, in either man or woman, indicates a tendency toward a long life.

Disposition as Shown by the Nails

In disposition, long nailed individuals are sweet tempered. This type is often referred to as the aristocratic type. It is distinctly the sign of the honorable, frank, open minded person, idealistic and often romantic. They are also more impressionable, and as a general rule, their owners take things more easily than nails of other types.

Short Nails

Short nailed persons are usually good critics. They love argument and usually come off well in a debate. They are usually quick, keen and shrewd in their judgment. They are fond of taking notice of things in detail and possess much courage and aggressiveness. They have a keener sense of humor than the long nailed and are quicker and sharper in temper, and are very often skeptical of those things that they do not understand. It is the type nail that demands facts and refutes theory.

The short, broad nail indicates the domineering nature, often pugnacious, with a tendency to meddle and interfere in the affairs of others. There is the tendency to pick a quarrel on the slight-

est pretext.

Club nails are those that are so short and broad that they show hardly more than a band across the tip of the finger. The attributes of this type nail are often those of brutal stubbornness and carping criticism. If, however, the whole hand is otherwise good, these characteristics may become modified.

The wedge-shaped nail indicates the sensitive person, one easily offended and quick to fancy slights.

The filbert-shaped nails indicates an unusual capacity for self control, one sensitive and refined and often intuitive. Such a shaped nail, bespeaks one not easily aroused to anger, but when they are, they do not forgive nor forget. Where such a nail is white in color, there is little force or aggressive quali-

Round nails often bespeak a quick and hasty temper, but one which is soon over, leaving no grudge or ill will behind.

Square nails indicate a love of order and authority. Their owners are often exacting and narrow in their views, but at the same time, just and upright, so far as they themselves are able to define the terms.

Large, well formed and shaped nails, indicate considerable force of character. together with the ability to execute and carry out matters to their logical conclusion. This type nail often indicates good business ability.

Small nails indicate a negative nature. Such individuals often have ex-

cellent ideas, but the ability to carry them out seems to be lacking. There is often a certain amount of passivity connected with this type nail which prevents great achievement. However, where the thumb is large, and well formed, this tendency is often overcome.

Where the nail is long and dark colored, the tendency is to be cunning and deceitful. They are often cruel in disposition, unless the rest of the hand is favorable.

Color of Nails

The color of nails is a very important factor in estimating disposition.

White nails bespeak the cold, cynical disposition. Sheel pink color denotes the healthy, vital, happy individual, whereas the deeply pink nails indicate a quick temper. Red color shows an excess of

vitality, intense ardor, and often short temper.

Yellow nails indicate the moody, apprehensive type. Often this color nail bespeaks the unsociable and irritable, one silent and morose.

The blue nail indicates a want of circulation, and often expresses itself in silent unresponsiveness.

Texture of Nails

Nails show a texture either coarse of fine, in the same manner as the skin. The texture of the nail is an excellent gauge as to the coarseness or fineness of the nature of the individual. Care should be taken in distinguishing between the coarseness of the illiterate, undeveloped type, and those who by hard work have merely coarsened the cuticle of the hand.

"Where do you get your teachings of Christianity from?"

The Bible."

"I thought one of the commandments was 'Thou shalt do no murder.' 'Do not kill.' Remember this? 'Put up again thy sword into his place: for all they that take the sword, shall perish with the sword'."

"If my country needs them, I'd hate to know they were afraid to protect us."



When a man's body lies horizontally, with the head to the North, the colors are the most brilliant, passing from blue at the head through blue-green to dark green, light-green and yellow, golden yellow and orange to red at the feet. If the body is slowly revolved so as to pass through the successive points of the compass, a series of remarkable changes takes place. The original colors are no longer seen but the blue at the head undergoes successive changes by the admixture of the other colors according to the angle of deflection. (Sepharial.)

Planetary vibrations impinging upon the magnetic aura of the earth affect man whether he is conscious of it or not. Experiments show, by directing the rays of Jupiter and of some of the fixed stars through the telescope to a selenium screen at the distance of ten feet, that the comparative effect was of a candle 1; of Procyon 0.261; Cygnus 0.262; Aldebaran 0.279; Orion 0.685; of Jupiter 3.272.

The twelve signs of the Zodiac, with their vibrations and colors, groupings of planets in different years, affect not only the people on the earth but the vegetation, business and mental conditions.

As the movements of the stars and planets are regular and rhythmical, there are cycles of thought and action, events which come regularly affecting the world's affairs and weather according to the energy, color and vibration of the auras. Some of these cycles are favorable and some are revolutionary and upbuilding. For instance, the man born during the last ten days of March and the first twenty days of April has many obstacles and difficulties between the ages of forty-nine and fifty-six. Persons born between the last ten days of July and the first twenty days of August, feel this retarding influence between the ages of twenty-one and twenty-eight.

Countries and nations feel this more or less keenly, according to prevailing conditions existing, all things in the universe experiencing an ebb and flow.

All planets have a different rate of vibration, color, force and sound. Mars radiates energy and a red ray. This energy drives the snowflake and the crystal to its geometric shape, everything being created according to its own rate of vibration.

Everyone is concrete symbol, embued with certain planetary vibrations existing at his birth—the various configurations and horoscopical conditions which link am to everything in the universe whether it be to a star fish or a star.

If these radiations are harmonious, his life is normal and comparatively happy, with opportunities for progress both mental and spiritual. If inharmonious, then his experiences teach him lessons which produce more harmony and peace in his next incarnation.

Since the exertion of the will has everything to do with whether a man overcomes or succumbs to the condi-

tions which hem him about is of the greatest importance and should be considered first in the education and development of his mind and heart.

By knowing, man learns to use and profit by the favorable vibrations at his birth and avoid many a pitfall in

The effect of color on the emotions is well known, yet it is interesting that red is stimulating, orange is tonic, green is passive, blue sedative, etc. Saturn is blue: Jupiter rays are purple; Mercury rays are violet, the highest in vibration and mental in nature.

So herbs and chemicals affect the physical body through vibrations and effects which have their source in the Zodiacal signs. Aries is exciting, Taurus demulcent; Gemini strengthening, etc., each having its own effect on the material plane and physical body.

The planets, too, have their effects for the Moon contracts; Mercury neutralizes; Venus soothes; the Sun relaxes and expands; Mars stimulates; Jupiter nourishes.

We have the essence of the stars in us, and the human body is a constellation of the same powers that formed the stars in the sky. When one thinks of Mars they think of iron. This law of correspondences obtains throughout the universe, and by taking advantage of law we are able to "rule our stars" more or less and not be ruled by lesser adverse impulses.

A person born with most of the planets above the meridian is more positive than one born when the planets are below the meridian, the latter being more sensitive and negative. Kaiser and Napoleon had Mars in their mid-heavens.

So we might consider the world as a center of a great kaleidoscope, undergoing changes of color from hour to hour. and making corresponding changes in the feelings and affairs of people according to their sensitiveness.

Ernest Fox Nichols, late professor of chemistry at Harvard, segregated a ray of light from Arcturus and in order to do so he was obliged to use an instrument so sensitive that it registered the heat of a candle at the distance of

It is absurd to think that the great minds of the past, the men who planned and built the pyramids, those astronomers and astrologers who calculated eclipses without telescopes and such scientists as Camille Flammarion, Newton, Copernicus, Demoncritus, Aristarchus, Pythagoras, Mercurator, Napier who invented logarithms, Hippocrates, Flamsteed, Keplar, Dalton and scores of others, were laboring under a delusion and did not know what they were doing.

If we take a few minutes to study the position of this wondrous planet Neptune during 1932 and until late in 1942, we should bear in mind what the sign Virgo signifies. First, it is

Why should one not believe that such experiences are warnings and that they do portray future events? There is no teacher quite like experience, even though one may sometimes suffer deeply therefrom. I do not hesitate to state that I sincerely believe that dreams of a positive nature do portray the future in either a natural or symbolical way.

the communication one with the other before the physical death. 

sitive but in this instance the condition of the strokes proved that she was of a highly sensual nature. Added to this the compactness of the writing showed that she was self centered and the "n" disclosed a critical nature. These negative traits eliminated much of her real friendliness as well as sympathy. She was selfish and critical and she was always criticizing other people. However, her own sensitiveness made it impossible for her to take personal criticism and if anyone said anything to her she felt terrible. As far as acquaintances are concerned she has many but when it comes to trustworthy friends there is more than a grave doubt.

Jealousy is another trait that has driven away many a friend. This negative characteristic is to be found in the formation of the capital "I" as well as in some initial strokes on the words. Jealousy automatically causes all friendly feelings to close up and the person concerned gets a biased view of things in general. It does not make any difference what the cause of the jealousy happens to be. The effect is the same.

There are so many people who are self conscious that it shows in a high percentage of the specimens that come to our attention. Some of those who have studied human nature claim that this trait has caused more suffering than anyone will ever realize. Self consciousness always shows in the "m" or the "n" and proves the individual in question is the victim of some kind of fear. Many persons suffering from self consciousness are too timid to mix with others. Very often they are alone even if they happen to be in a crowd and if the attention of others should be cen-

tered upon them they get so nervous that it is impossible for them to be themselves. To meet strange people and make new friends is often extremely difficult for them and for this reason they cling tenaciously to the few they are fortunate enough already to possess.

Then again there are men and women who go blundering through life doing or saying things that drive others away. They do not realize it but often the finals on the words in their writing proves that they are emphatic and outspoken. They are too blunt in nearly everything and tactlessly hurt people so that they are not popular or even well liked. In their blindness they often blame others for the lonely life they lead

Many a promising career has been blighted by the negative traits brought out in this article. Sometimes the possession of one of these characteristics has caused the person concerned to lose out. In other instances difficulties have come about through a combination of two or more. At the same time there are many other traits not mentioned here that bring about loneliness, and there are reasons why people are not good mixers and yet they work their way to fame and responsible positions.

Two of the greatest Presidents this country ever had did not make friends very easily. Nor did they care very much to mix socially. One of them was so backward that at his own wedding some people did not know he was the groom. Yet both of these men were successful and loved by all who really knew them. They had courage to be themselves and to carry out their own plans regardless of opposition.

celebrating the attainment of wealth.

But the Moon rules the common people; those who sweat and toil and hope for jobs; and thus Labor Day falls on Monday, the day of the Moon, while the Sun is in that section of the sky pictured by the greatest toiler of which we have tradition.

Although Samson slew a thousand men with the jawbone of an ass, perhaps the most remarkable of his works was his use of foxes to destroy the crops of those who had treated him unjustly. Foxes, of course, in ancient times as well as in those more modern, are universal symbols of shrewdness and cunning.

The international policy of certain nations at the present day is to incite rivalry between other nations which might become a menace to their plans. While these quarrel and wrangle, the nation at the bottom of the difficulty is able to obtain the things it wants without molestation. The others are too busy endeavoring to get the best of each other to notice lesser things.

But whether incited deliberately or not, such strife between nations, between factions within a nation, or between antagonistic groups of thoughts within the finer body of man, tend to weaken each and to make destruction of the whole more easy. It was not that the Maya were lacking in fighting ability that the Spanish conquered them with almost no resistance. It was because for the three hundred preceding years there had been constant warfare between the tribal groups within the nation; and some of these tribal groups were not averse to witnessing their adversaries despoiled by the Spaniards.

Great Britain has not found it difficult to rule a population of some 200 millions in India, because some 60 million Mohammedans prefer British rule to that of their enemies, the Hindus; and because the Hindus prefer British rule to that of the Mohammedans. It is because of this antagonism between large factions that has enabled 100 thousand British soldiers to keep masters of the situation.

When Hindu and Mohammedan meet, the fires of hate start blazing and only for the presence of British soldiers are they prevented from causing great destruction to life and property.

The inevitableness of the destruction of the fruits of human labor which follows such antagonisms, either among people or among the thought groups within the astral body of man, is well set forth in the story of Samson's foxes. Cunning was pitted against cunning, shrewdness against shrewdness; as often we have witnessed the efforts of people, each to get an unfair advantage of the other, bringing disaster to both.

It seems that the Philistines were harvesting their grain; some of it still standing and some of it cut and placed in shocks. To avenge himself upon them Samson caught 300 foxes, paired them off, with the tails of each two united

Thursday would be more fitting for by a firebrand one end of which was tied to each of the tails.

> The worst quality of the sign Virgo, of which Samson represents the middle decanate, is criticism. And the mental qualifications for keen criticism as well as those for unfair practices in bargaining, are well expressed by a fox. Criticism, however, may be either constructive or destructive. It may point out a more advantageous way of doing something, a better line of conduct to be followed in which case, if the criticism is sound it may be helpful and constructive.

> On the other hand, more frequently than not, criticism takes the form of deploring what is done, pointing out weaknesses without indicating how they may be strengthened, and fault finding in general. This type of criticism often is engaged in by political opponents, by factions within an organization and by people in their domestic associations.

When people are subjected to destructive criticism they are apt to reply in kind, and the heat of the controversy is well symbolized by a burning brand. Thus the consequences of such bickering between individuals or between larger groups is dramatically described in the account of what happened when Samson lighted the firebrands between the tails of each pair of foxes and turned them loose.

The foxes ran frantically through the standing grain setting it afire. They tried to find shelter in the shocks of grain that had been cut and awaited to be taken to the threshing floor from the heat that scorched them. And when the grain fields were thus ablaze they fled to the vineyards and olive groves hoping to find refuge from their torture. Instead these also were ignited, so that the crops of the year, of all kinds went up in flames. Nothing was left to the Philistines to show for their toil.

Such is the common result of destructive criticism. It kindles the fires of hatred and destroys whatever labor already has accomplished. It is a consuming influence which leaves nothing in its wake but bitter ashes. And it is just as destructive when applied to self as when applied to the endeavors of

The constant calling attention to the faults and imperfections of any person, including oneself, brings the image of the undesirable action or quality before the unconscious mind. When we think about a thing we are supplying it with thought-energy. Therefore, the more we think about an undesirable thing the stronger it becomes within our unconscious mind. Traits of character feed upon the attention given them.


This does not mean, of course, that we should ignore weaknesses, or neglect to strengthen them. But finding fault, especially when such criticism arouses an emotional reaction, merely impresses the defect more strongly through the power of suggestion, upon the unconscious mind, and makes it more difficult

an earth sign ruled by the planet Mercury and it represents religion, science, philosophy and literature as well as chemistry, food, grain, communications, travel, medicine, nursing and healing.

Neptune is called god of the Sea, and represents love, brotherhood and renunciation, but its higher phases operate after regeneration has taken place. Its influence seems evil for material things but good for spiritual things, so that we may look for many changes in all matters which Neptune and Virgo rule during its stay in the sign which ends December, 1942.

A better understanding of Neptune's influence may be gleaned from looking back into history and studying periods in which Neptune was in Virgo. We would expect to find, besides wars and revolution, many outstanding events of an intellectual, scientific or religious kind, and some of these are as follows:

In 1763 and the period in which Neptune was in Virgo the one preceding 1928 by 165 years, we find that the Royal Academy of Arts was founded in England, with Joshua Reynolds at its head. (1768.)

The first edition of the Encyclopedia Britannica was printed and three years later Priestly discovered oxygen.

Delving into the preceding period again for information concerning the secrets of this subtle and elusive force, we find it brought Napier's invention of logarithms which he stated would better enable him to study astrology. Bacon and Shakespeare also regaled the world with their literature, the Bible was translated and printed seven years later. (1611.)

1605 brought the irrepressible Don Quixote and in 1610 the first telescope was invented in Holland and the Catholic League was formed under the Duke of Bavaria.

The next preceding period of fifteen years, brought out the events of 1433 to 1448. In this period we note that Ulugh Beg compiled the star tables, and the next year was marked by the first use of movable type for printing. Joan of Arc heard her voices and a year later was taken prisoner.

1446, under the influence mentioned, we find the birth of Pergugino, the founder of the Roman School of Painting in which Raphael studied, and 1447 was the year in which the Library of the Vatican was built.

The next preceding period of Neptune in Virgo was 1268 to 1283 in which Bonaventura, the great mystic, flourished; also Thomas Aquinas, the great scholar; the year 1270 was a great scientific and literary period for Spain, and in 1280 Roger Bacon became a pioneer of science. In 1280 Robert of Gloucester became the author of the metrical chronicle of England.

The preceding period marked the founding of the Knights Templar, the next one made Flanders the seat of

Western industry, while the next, from 773 to 778, was called the Golden Period of Learning in Arabia, and was the time of Paulus Diaconus, historian of the Lombards.

The next preceding period, 610 A.D. was the time of Mohammed and the beginning of the Tang Dynasty, the Golden Age of Literature and the beginning of the Mohammedan Calendar.

The year 278 brought the Neo-Platonic Philosophy and the Gregorian code of Civil War.

A golden thread of similarity gleams through this woof of time to make this remarkable sequence of events significant to thoughtful students. Each period is marked by advances in literature, science, invention or some outstanding event peculiarly characteristic of Virgo stimulated by the Neptunian ray. Researchers find the era before Christ even more remarkable but far more difficult to verify.

Shedding new light on old truths proves that the universe is a symbol and everything in it symbolical. To read patiently, weigh facts deliberately and judge impartially brings wisdom and security. The uninformed are prone to disbelieve that which they cannot understand.

Virgo is the house of study and learning; of gardens, libraries, deeds, charts and plans; of priests, chemists and philosophers. The ancients called it the Garden of Eden, an eternal abode of happiness, the Tree of Life in the center. It was the union of the spiritual and natural body and was deemed a sign of cloister thoughts and religious principles.

The criterion of consciousness is response to stimuli. This can be seen in vegetable and animal life or chemical action. The rose, conscious of sunlight, unfolds its velvet petals. The sunflower turns its face to the sun-god from sunrise to sunset. Mankind responds to solar rays, denying their power while responding. Many deem it unreasonable that their puny actions should be influenced by the Sun or Moon. Occult researchers have learned that what is reasonable may not be true and what is true is often unreasonable. When we know more about radiation, vibration, light, color and sound, we will begin to understand what God really is.

Far back in the mists of antiquity, or mythology, we learned that Neptune ruled the sea. A curious incident of the great earthquake of 1908, in southern Italy, confirmed many in this belief. Old Messina, the richest and most beautiful city in southern Italy, with twenty-four smaller towns along the Siculo-Calbrian coast, was utterly destroyed by earthquakes, burning lava, devouring flame and a 150-foot tidal wave. No such devastation and desolation had been known since the days of Pompeii. Under the wreckage lay thirty thousand human bodies.

to overcome. Children who are continually criticized by their parents are receiving strong suggestions which increase the difficulty of adhering to a better line of conduct. And if it gains enough strength through this internal dissension it will start a consuming fire within which, like Samson's foxes, will destroy the fruit of all our efforts.


Constructive criticism, on the other hand, while recognizing a weakness as such or that a type of conduct is unworthy, does not dwell upon this aspect of the matter. Instead, it concentrates its attention and energy upon the correct line of conduct, or the proper way to strengthen the observed weakness. The thought-energy thus flows into and feeds the action which is desired, instead of its opposite. In this manner not only is the mental image of the undesired thing strengthened, but the image of the undesired thing is weakened through lack of thought nourishment.

In self culture it is quite as important

to feel satisfaction when one is doing one's possibilities. If one expects more than lies within the powers of accomplishment there will be certain failure accompanied by the feeling of dissatisfaction. This feeling of dissatisfaction, in its turn, directs energy into channels which are destructive and lessens the ability in the future. When one has a biased appraisal of one's own powers, unjust and destructive criticism toward oneself may readily result.

On the other hand it is quite as easy for some individuals to feel that they are living up to their possibilities when they are living far below them. Their appraisal of their abilities is too low and they have a feeling of satisfaction from accomplishment which is much less than it should be. Yet this does not signify that they should be critical of themselves in the destructive sense; but merely that they should recognize that they should strive for a more lofty goal.

Because we learn to do through doing the teaching is: Perform Conscientiously Whatever Work Comes to Thy Hand, and Because of Thy Experience, Greater Things to Perform Will Be Given Thee.

they made of him a corrupter of youth. When offered a chance to escape he bravely refused because he said his very deed of escaping a lawful punishment would teach young men by his example to break the law.

Hemlock could only take from him his physical existence upon which he placed no value, but his cowardly escaping from lawful punishment would set an unworthy example which nothing could efface.

Considering the cost which was death, Socrates decided that the future of the youth of his country was more important, and he happily sacrificed his life for that grand principle.

Catherine de' Medici considered not the cost to those around her in working toward her bloody goal. She compelled her weak-minded son, Charles the Ninth, to consent to the Bartholomew massacre, and on a certain day at an appointed signal which she herself gave, there began a carnival of blood in which Christian murdered Christian, and all the rest of the world stood aghast. During the weeks of the historical murders, the streets, the gutters and the River Seine of Paris, ran blood. Afterward, Catherine compelled her son to acknowledge before the Parliament and the world that he was responsible for the horrifying crime. Catherine did not consider the cost of her acts. She was not warned by the sign posts along the road of the terrible goal toward which she was traveling at break-neck speed. Unlike the heathen Socrates, who pursued his way to happiness without regard to cost, she, the Christian, pursued her way to a miserable existence likewise disregarding the cost.

If the acts bring unhappiness and sorrow and grief and misfortune into the lives of those you touch, they are the infallible sign-posts pointing out to you that you are on the wrong road. Consider the cost to yourself and to those about you before you go on. And before you continue traveling the same road, ask yourself the question, "Is it worth it?"
