SOLVING THE PROBLEM OF CRIME

F THE mighty machinery of the United States of America would be set into action exploring the cause of crime and eliminating it, the crime question would be settled in a very short time. The cause of crime is found in the seed which flourishes and scatters its productive fruit throughout the length and breadth of the land. Theaters, novels, detective stories and the so-called "funnies" in practically every magazine and newspaper are the direct cause of the 20th century crimes. All through ancient history is found dramatized and glorified criminals. Each succeeding generation gets a little more dramatic. Each succeeding generation required more and more stimulus in their expression. Sane and sensible sports no longer satisfy their thirst for excitement. Duals, bull fights, dog fights, rooster fights, became too tame and there was instituted boxing matches between men. A clean fight gave these morons of the ring no thrill; they were used to seeing blood spilled. Thus the vicious side of man was fed.

At the beginning of the 20th century the harvest from these destructive elements was brought to capitalization. Yearly there has been greater facilities for encouraging crime and creating criminals. Ascension Day

ANUARY first is the day of ascension. In nature it is the day when the seeds begin to move with new life in preparation for the Spring or the resurrection. In ancient days, before calendars were in vogue, people counted time by the moon, by the sun and by certain stars. They knew when to plant, when to cultivate and when to harvest and the observance of certain seasons was established. Just as time has changed customs in the memory of your days so these ancient days not only created customs, but changed them. A Remarkable Revelation

Psychic Experiences

A BOUT two years ago I called at the executive offices of the "Occult Digest" and met a genial person of deep spiritual understanding. Instantly I broached the subject of the science of names, which had been my special study for some years past, and wanted to know if there was any printed matter on that subject which I could purchase. She did not know of any. Then I asked her if she believed in such a science. She said she did, and told me of her experience in attending church services one Sunday morning, conducted by a Swedish pastor. She said she listened to his sermon delivered in the Swedish language and understood it so well that she translated it into English to her Swedish friend after leaving the church. I asked her if she understood French; she said she did not read or write in French, but could understand it from the sound of the words, so I began reciting Massenet's "Elegie" in French. Just as I began: "O doux printemps d'autrefois," she remarked that she saw budding flowers, green leaves, and beautiful trees in a distant land, reminding her of springtime. I recited the entire verse, and she did not miss one word. Her interpretation was perfect.

Such a remarkable test is sufficient evidence that words and names are so delicately correlated, that some kind of system could be evolved whereby we could understand the meaning of names as readily as the meaning of words. Furthermore, a name has the same relation to a person, thing, animal, country, nation or government, and even an organization, as the title has to a book. So, if you mention "Paradise Lost" or "Les Miserables," you immediately have the history of that literary masterpiece in your mind's eye. Is it not therefore logical to deduce that if you mention the name of "Ethel" the history of that name should reveal itself to you? Is it not logical to deduce that at the mention of 1937 you should be able to see just what kind of volume Father Time is presenting to mankind? Yes, indeed, it is possible to analyze the significance of any year as applied to a person, nation or government. It is possible to foretell which political party will be in ascendancy during that year, which corporation will succeed, which cities will thrive or degenerate, which nations will be dissatisfied and which will be profited.

Aside from their phonetic values, names have color, degrees of strength, power, weight, appeal, durability, metallic qualities, elemental nature, and

dozens of other traits which characterize them as individualistic potentialities.

During the World War I was extremely interested in the elusive "EMDEN," the German cruiser which created havoe in English shipping, but when she met "Sydney" the Australian battleship, off Cocos Island, I knew she was doomed.

During the last election, my friends were jokingly alluding to my prediction of President Roosevelt's re-election as purely an imaginary one. I told them there is only one Republican candidate who can defeat Roosevelt, and the name Landon did not carry sufficient power to overcome the present incumbent at the White House. The Republicans could have nominated THAT ONE candidate who would have won the election, but they could not boss him; he entertains President Roosevelt's ideas and would have continued his program of rehabilitation. This one candidate would probably win the 1940 nomination if the Republican party wishes to survive.

The foregoing excerpts as to the value and significance of names would convince the astute skeptic as to metaphysical matters, that possibilities along these lines are fathomless. This knowledge came to me from astral planes during my silent meditations and it is yet far from perfection, but it is revealing itself and enlightening my understanding gradually.

During the year 1901 (or, it might have been the latter part of 1900) I was shaken out of my bed at 5 o'clock in the morning and felt someone was standing by me and talking to me. I opened my eyes in bewilderment and saw in the dark room a miniature of the Battle Creek sanitarium in flames. I gazed and wondered but could not move. The figure standing in my room then told me that within two weeks the Battle Creek Sanitarium would burn down. I leaped out of my bed and turned on the electric light. There was nothing and nobody in the room. About 9 o'clock that morning I went to the office of Battle Creek (Mich.) "Daily Moon" and saw Mr. Barnes, then editor of said daily. I told him of the strange experience. He wrote it down in his diary and told me to come back to see him after the expiration of two weeks.

The two weeks had expired, but I had forgotten about it. As I walked along the main street in Battle Creek, I saw dozens of residents coming toward me and congratulating me for something which I could not understand. They showed me several papers

from Detroit, Buffalo and Chicago giving an account of my prediction. The Sanitarium had been consumed by flames, Mr. Barnes had wired the United Press and the dailies had printed the news. I received letters from all parts of the world concerning this experience, but I had no means of keeping up my correspondence.

About fifteen years ago I was standing in the front room of my apartment and looking out of the window. My mind became blank and a column of white clouds appeared before my eyes. Just then I heard someone running up toward me crying: "Look out for the baby." This was repeated three times. I looked back and saw my little girl about ten feet away, whose hair was being curled by her mother. I asked them if they were talking to me or if they heard a voice, but neither had heard nor seen anything. I told my wife that something would happen to the child in the following three days, and we should be very careful as to her whereabouts during that period.

Three days had elapsed and I was driving past a boulevard, my wife and child occupying the back seat in the car. I slowed down but did not come to a stop. Just as I cleared the boulevard, a large yellow sedan coming at the rate of fifty miles per hour struck my car with such a force that it overturned it and all three of us were pinned under it. I turned off the ignition, and extricated myself, then the child, then my wife. Would you believe that there wasn't even a scratch on that child? I wasn't even bruised and my wife had a few small cuts on her wrist.

The Astral Plane is invisible to our physical eyes, but if and when we become receptive to the vibrations of that plane, we establish a contact, we attune ourselves to it and we see, we hear with our spiritual senses. This state of living is the happiest one upon this earth, because thereby we create a spiritual dynamo within our physical frame which emanates health, cheer and abundance to all those surrounding us. We can heal the sick, we can raise the downtrodden and we can guide into the paths of light those groping souls who do not know why they have come into this world and whither are they going.

If you do not see and hear, hammer away, hammer away on your psychic nerves. Unless you can develop your psychic brain you cannot reason on psychic subjects. Develop your psychic nerves, they feed the psychic brain.— Effa E. Danelson.

More Occult Fragrance

SINCE my contribution of an experience entitled "Occult Fragrances" in the November issue of this magazine, I have incidentally noted by the newspapers the transition of "Cheiro," the world's most noted palmist; one who was also a mystic and who had spent most of his life in the study of the occult.

As the strange phenomenon, which occurred at the time of his passing from this earth plane, included one of the many phases such as the one I have termed "occult fragrance," and being of deep significance, little understood and more often questioned by the skeptically-minded, I thought it worthy of further consideration here and as an added testimony of the truth of my former experience, as well as be of added interest to the readers of the OCCULT DIGEST, who may or may not have heard or read about this wonderful public character. As it will necessitate the quoting of more than usual, I hope the kind and patient readers will bear with me. I shall here then quote the statements made in The National Spiritualist December issue, 1936, by Mrs. Phelan, the nurse in attendance at the time of the passing away of Cheiro:

"'I am a registered nurse,' said Mrs. Phelan.

"'I've seen hundreds of people die and I don't believe in spooks. I came to this house four days before the patient passed away. I did not even know his name when the doctor called me.

"'At about midnight on the night he went, I checked his condition for the chart and noted that he was sinking rapidly. I went in and told his wife and Mrs. Frances Kernan, who were in the house, that he could not last long.

"'They were just asking me how long I thought his strength would hold out when the clock struck one. My wrist watch showed 12:15. I thought nothing of it, except that perhaps the big clock on the stairs was wrong. Twice again at about ten-minute intervals it struck one. He died at 1:05 by my watch.

"'In the last hour I went outside his room and sat at the head of the stairs, reading. Suddenly they began to creak as though an army of people were coming and going. My hair stood on end, although I am never easily impressed by such things. I switched on the big flood lights at the head of the staircase. Nothing was visible there, yet I could have sworn scores of feet were moving on those steps.

"'At the last moment the whole house was filled with an over-powering fragrance of flowers. There were none in the room and none outside, yet we all smelled it and could still smell it in the morning.'

"Mrs. Kernan, a friend, and the widowed countess corroborated these statements. They said they were in separate parts of the house during the night."

In the foregoing we have an instance of such a fragrance which remains to be identified with some invisible or unseen source, being or intelligence, and which may be said to be occult because there seems to be no one to whom we may turn for a comprehensive and satisfactory explanation or interpretation. All attempts of the average person to explain or interpret such things are inadequate to meet the demands of the sincere seeker of Truth. While I myself do not claim to be able to explain such things at all times and under every circumstance, I feel privileged, however, to offer some suggestions here whereby the more seriousminded reader may be able to think about and form his or her own conclusions, as all progressive beings must sooner or later learn to think more for themselves on this earth plane as well as on any other transcending this one; for the true purpose of every soul-being is to experience and express more and more love, perfection and goodness as well as hereafter. Such thoughts may not seem to be related to the subject here, but they will help to take much of the mist out of mystery, and help us all to see more clearly by the light of our own soul.

In the instance then and in consideration of the foregoing fragrance we cannot state positively as to its intended purpose or spiritual significance. Yet if we knew we would be wonderfully blessed in knowledge, wisdom and peace of mind. Personally, I would be the last to question that this fragrance might not have been intended as a signal or token of the departure of the self-conscious soul for the purpose of inspiring others with greater faith in their own immortality; or perhaps significant of the delight of some other soul or host of souls in the invisible world strewing the pathway with invisible spirit-flowers for the newly arriving soul. As flowers are symbolic of thought ideas, their fragrance does also convey thoughts and truths inadequate to words. As we do many different things in many different ways here on earth, so the soul most closely associated with another might make its presence known by endless different means.

The phenomenon of the soul, the psychic and the spiritual astound us only

because we have become too self-centered and self-absorbed in the petty things of this work-a-day world. As we let go of these ever-changing objects of sense and let go of all our prejudices, false beliefs, man-made doctrines and preconceived opinions, the mental fogs and mists of our own making will clear away and we shall both see and realize the truth of that which is most true, perfect and delightful here and now as well as hereafter.

It is indeed wonderful to realize that the borderland of the Spiritual World where still live the souls of those who have passed on is just as close to ourselves as is our own faith and belief.

Without the recognition of the spiritual there can be no complete and satisfactory understanding of the mystery of life and of so-called death. Those who claim that "all is Spirit" and that matter does not exist and who deny the reality of every human emotion, deny unknowingly also the All-ness and the tangible Ever-Presence of GOD. The Right emotion at the Right time in the Right place may be as important as anything else, and as the ways of GOD are infinite, who would attempt to explain such a mystery as that of perhaps some mere strange and unidentified fragrance or its influence, help and assistance for those who must be made to think or perhaps need such a more direct tangible demonstration for their future good and unfoldment here and now.

"THE DESTINY OF

TO SECURE an adequate method of appreciation of anything, it is necessary to place the subject-matter in its true perspective. This is the only way to get accurate understanding of its relative being. To know its actual relation to the force generating it, is essential to understanding.

When an attempt is made to study the evolution of a leading nation, this essential method, based upon perspective, requires consideration not only from a material and worldly angle, but from the spiritual viewpoint as well.

We are thus naturally led to imagine the possibility of a specific Supreme "mission" involved in the existence of a nation. And when we study carefully the evolution of America from this particular standpoint we find that certain historical events stand out in bold relief and acquire special significance otherwise obscured by the superficial and factual treatment they receive ordinarily in textbooks.

This new perspective, which is broader, results from higher considerations. Only from this higher viewpoint do we behold the true whole of the evolutionary panorama. Consequently, we can gauge more accurately the relative importance of events, with the result that the various historic happenings in America acquire a new meaning, reflecting more accurately their essential evolutionary character, and pointing conclusively to the probability that these United States were "earmarked" and destined to be instrumental in the execution of an important mission.

There is one outstanding fact which strongly supports this contention: the apparent calculated "reservation" for future use. This immense American

continent remained unknown to the white races many thousands of years while they lived on the old continents.

In the evolution of Christianity, great significance attaches to the fact that this continent began to be settled by the white races only a few hundred years ago, despite its actual proximity to the cradle of the human race and to the centers of the oldest known civilizations.

The paramount significance lies in that state of "conservation" in which this continent remained all these centuries—virgin and unknown—notwith-standing its immensity and this very real proximity to the old world which makes the continued isolation all the more extraordinary and all the more significant.

This is indeed very remarkable because at the extreme northwestern point this continent is hardly 55 miles distant from Asiatic land, and Greenland and Iceland are situated comparatively close to its extreme northeastern coast.

We know that erroneous conceptions about the form of the earth retarded discovery, but still history reveals that Scandinavian settlers occupied Iceland as early as 875, and that some lived on the shores of Greenland in 985. Yet, from five hundred to six hundred years elapsed between these early northern settlements comparatively nearby and the heralded discovery of America by Christopher Columbus, who first approached the North American continent at the opposite geographic extreme, when he landed at San Salvador, one of the Bahama Islands, also known as Watling, in October, 1492. And it was not until 1620, that is more than seven hundred years later, that the first Pilgrims crossed the Atlantic Ocean on the Mayflower and landed at Plymouth, marking the new era of steady influx and definite acceleration of an immigration move which was to persist for nearly four centuries.

The early civilizations which rose in different parts of the old world invariably drifted into abuse of the Almighty's munificence... and invariably after periods of evil and abuse, the fall of these civilizations ensued.

Meanwhile, throughout all these centuries this continent was being held in reserve, uncontaminated by all these excesses committed by the white races elsewhere. Apparently it was being held for a specific purpose. Then, a few hundred years ago, the world was considered ripe for a long-term Chris-

tian endeavor which should transcend anything heretofore undertaken in behalf of mankind.

It seems that by Supreme Decree, America was to then begin its part in the preservation and growth of a Christian civilization.

Through her, through America, the whole world was to be taught a lesson, a fundamental lesson of paramount importance to Christianity and, while this was decreed, the Supreme Forces also foresaw the need of the incipient American immigration move, to prepare during the next few centuries a sanctum where Christianity could continue its onward march unhindered by contrary forces.

That this is the true destiny of the United States becomes more and more obvious as major event after major event is consistently and persistently characterized by the same tendency. And as if to leave a mystic message of predestination, even the geologic evolution of the continent seems to bear this out. Close to the very spot where the Pilgrims landed is the Adirondack mountain range. It was the section of the American continent which first rose out of the waters, followed by the gradual emersion of the Great Lakes region, and later on by the slow rise of the Blue Ridge region of the south.

Even if considered only as a mere coincidence it is interesting to note that the sections of the country where the largest centers of population are to be found today happen to be, broadly speaking, in the two regions which first emerged from the ocean in prehistoric times.

This country was originally settled by people eager to enjoy complete religious freedom, by oppressed individuals whose liberal and Christian conceptions of life made them rebel against despotism then generally prevalent. It is a noteworthy fact, deserving emphasis, that both the very earliest east-coast settlements in Florida by the Huguenots, and the first pilgrim establishments in New England were made up largely of people who above all craved religious freedom. The history of America thus furnishes ample justification for the claim that it owes its origin essentially to the intuitive urge for a true Christian commonwealth which drove the early colonists instinctively to the shores of America, country of natural magnificence and abundance, where essential Christian principles should give all an opportunity to enjoy all of God's wonderful gifts.

The early colonists succeeded in living together peacefully and happily. They showed a strong spirit of appreciation which is still manifest, for it has been perpetuated by the national yearly observance of Thanksgiving Day, a befitting American institution.

The successive historical happenings conform to the pre-ordained course of events. And the expression, "In God We Trust" on our coins, the observance of prayers at the opening of Congress, the form of oath, "So help me God," offer beside the annual national thanksgiving manifestations, additional indications that notwithstanding misleading surface appearances and occasional strayings, we are really conscious of the fact that this is a blessed country.

As for the lesson, it has been revealed and is being revealed constantly. It forms the principal factor of progress in our evolution and did prevail significantly throughout its whole period in a most predominant manner. It is so outstanding, so glaring as to be blinding and its significance got lost in its very obviousness. It is the peaceful amalgamation of nationals of various countries, of many countries; the successful amalgamation of people who heretofore, under the influence of hatred and prejudice, steadily nursed, had been mortal enemies. Once in America (away from insidious efforts) these good European people began to fraternize cordially. They lived together, thrived together, they intermarried. And the lesson intended for all was very plain. Obviously there exists here a most magnificent and very convincing proof that strife among people of different nationalities can be avoided. The rapidity and the thoroughness of our successful amalgamation evidences it and is without parallel in the history of the world. It must be due to a Supreme Force which intended to demonstrate in this formidable manner that those who under certain circumstances had been led to believe they were mortal enemies, could, in this, God's country, live together peacefully, in harmonv.

To further educate humanity regarding its true mission and to demonstrate the limitless possibilities of harmony, events of intermarriage developed situations as a result of which an individual, once a mortal enemy of a family of different nationality, became here the happy grandfather of children born to the daughter of that family.

Yet, all of us should be enlightened to a great extent. After all, the soul, bound to this earthly shell we know as physical body, is seeking for enlightenment.

There is no reason for discouragement because our physical state seems not so good as our neighbors. Sometimes the experiments call for a certain mixture of heartaches, sorrows and failures before the successful result is achieved. Sometimes negative experiences in great numbers are required before enlightenment is reached. Even Dean Inge said, "If we want to be invulnerable, a hard heart and a good digestion will do more for us than the Christian virtues." Which proves to us that enlightenment is yet a few experiments off for Dean Inge, all depending as to our acceptance of Christianity.

The Buddha signifies in Sanskrit, the enlightened. For twenty-five centuries it has held steadfastly to the same meaning. Why should we Christians call Buddhism allegorical and legendary because Siddartha was miraculously conceived? Was not the whole world conceived miraculously? If we would take to them enlightenment we should learn first not to scoff at their miraculous conception when we are offering to them our own. To the so-called heathen mind one miraculous conception is as good as another and as feasible. If we prove to them that their's is impossible

sibility of our own.

Is it not true that an evil and illconsidered action may lie dormant for a considerable period and then suddenly break out bringing calamity into the lives of people many years after the act had been perpetrated? Have we not seen instances where offspring had been made to suffer for sins committed by their parents? And have we not seen this punishment following even to the third generation and beyond? At birth the new-born soul is separated from the whole life and nature to become an individual with the limitation of powers which the individual has, to live in error and ignorance; that Buddhist belief is essentially Christian for both advocate that man is born to sin thus making birth necessarily an evil thing. Then the province of man seems to be working up and out from the evil with which he has been saddled by existence. It seems that the Creator was not satisfied with what evil man might pick up by his own instrumentality through his environment, but man must be started out weighted down with sin from the moment he is deposited, a mite of humanity on this sphere.

That is a superstition foisted by an ignorant and unconsciously Godhating clergy on self-deceived souls; that is creed, not enlightenment. By understanding that our experiences,

whatever they are, are necessary experiments in this great laboratory of life, we get closer to the great experiment. WHAT is the matter with you, or can it be possible that there is nothing the matter with you, which would be extraordinary, since there is usually something the matter with each and every one of us—and YOU are probably no exception to this rule. So I repeat: what IS the matter with you?

Are you suffering from an inferiority complex, or an unhappiness complex, or a poverty complex, or perhaps some other kind of complex that is not so easily located or described?

If you ARE—then something surely is the matter with you, and it surely should be looked into.

Are you willing to look into it with

Let's begin with a few pertinent questions: are you happy, healthy, successful, prosperous—or do you lack one or more or ALL of these life-necessities?

If you can answer YES to the first four questions you belong to the fortunate and infinitesimal minority; but if you belong to those who lack something or everything you belong to the overwhelming majority, and you are asked to answer this even more pertinent question: If you lack one or more or ALL of these life-attributes—WHY DO YOU LACK THEM?

Perhaps you'll say, as many have said, if I knew why I'd soon change my lack into prompt possession.

But would you-will you?

For, my friend, I'm going to give you a simple rule which will, if applied to your state of lack—no matter what it may be, change it into a gracious and satisfying plenty.

Now when I say that this rule, if followed, will change life-conditions, I mean exactly that. I don't mean that any half-hearted following will do it—any more than the half-hearted doing of anything will bring satisfactory results. You can't expect to loaf on a job and at the same time do the job well.

However, you CAN change your lack into plenty if you will do YOUR part; and the beauty of doing your part in this instance is that it is so very easy to do.

Now for the rule—here it is; and remember, that although it is very simple, it WORKS.

Let us suppose that your particular lack is caused by unhappiness that has been brought about by various unpleasant and undesired things. Begin the rule by telling yourself that you are HAPPY RIGHT NOW and that you LOVE everybody and everything that is connected with your life in any way.

Of course it is quite probable that according to all appearances, and according to your present feelings and beliefs you are NOT happy right now and you do NOT love every person and every condition that is connected with you, and you may even think it

foolish to tell yourself these things when you are convinced that they are untrue.

But, my friend, this rule doesn't require that you BELIEVE that you are happy right now or that you love everybody and everything right now: it doesn't require the impossible of you. The only thing it does require IS that you follow the rule by telling yourself with every bit of earnestness you can muster that you ARE HAPPY, and that you DO LOVE everybody and everything connected with you; and if you do this correctly, that is: if you tell yourself these things with GREAT EARNESTNESS, you are bound to forget your present unhappiness, and your present probable dislike of some people and some conditions, at the IN-STANT OF TELLING YOURSELF THESE THINGS, and this is all that is required to begin with.

Talk to yourself about being happy and loving everybody and everything every time you think about you really want to change your present lack into the possession of plenty, you will think about it often. The Secrets of Handwriting Revealed

THOUGHTS AND ACTIONS

ALTHOUGH muscular co-ordination is very necessary no one any longer doubts the statement that thought is the force behind all action. The more forceful the thoughts are the more definite will be the actions that follow. Persons who think weak and indefinite thoughts are undecided in their actions, and as a result they are too easily influenced by circumstances or by other people. When this is the case such an individual very often develops some trait such as obstinacy as a sort of self protection against others.

However, there is one very important point that must be considered and this is that it is not with the whole brain that a person thinks. The average individual uses only a small portion of this major center that he or she has developed for some particular purpose. This is one reason why many scientists or other men and women who specialize in certain branches become They develop one or more parts of their brain through which their particular interests operate at the expense of the rest. The result is that they lose interest in many other things outside of their own line of endeavor. Some specialists have been known to lose all taste for music. Others become social failures because they do not care to mingle with anyone except those engaged in their own field, while others become woefully deficient in mathematics or something else that is outside their own interests. So, while a man or woman may be highly efficient in his or her own field the same persons may be at a loss how to act or what to do in connection with something else simply because their thoughts have not operated sufficiently through certain channels.

Assuming, then, that the writing of a person proves that he has a highly analytical brain and a mind for figures. At the same time the condition of the loops below the line disclose the fact that he is not of a very sociable nature. He may like people and be of a friendly disposition but he is not a good mixer. This always shows in the slant of the strokes and the condition of the writing. Such a person would make a good auditor, comptroller or professor of mathematics. However, no matter how efficient he would be in his work he would never be a social success. He could always be depended upon as far as facts and figures are concerned but in mingling with others, especially strangers, he would be almost a total loss. The reason for this is that such people develop that part of their brain that handles figures and everything pertaining to calculations to the detriment of their sociability.

By the way of contrast let us next consider a person who has no head at all for figures but is a good mixer of

the happy-go-lucky type. In instances of this kind the loops below the line are larger and the formation of the letter "n" lacks the exactitude of the analytical and precise person. Many times the letters run out of their regular formation and the writing has a straggly appearance. The condition of the script proves such a person is active and as a rule they go rapidly from one thing to the next.

Very often the "m" discloses the fact that they are not very particular and the "i" may show that they overlook details. It all points to one thing and that is their desire to get matters done. The crossing of the letter "t" may show that they wait a while before they undertake a task but when they have done so they keep at it until they are through. While persons of this type sometimes are inclined to be thoughtless because they are in such a rush they are also honest. This, of course, always shows in the formation of the "a" or the "o".

Where the analytical and precise person thinks in terms of exactitude the physically energetic person thinks in terms of action and generalities. These different ways of thought influence the action and the writing of the individual in question. The former is accurate in details, the latter is not.

In the first paragraph we mentioned people who think weak and indefinite thoughts. Indefiniteness in thinking is always disclosed in the condition of the letters. The strokes are not strong and there is no force disclosed in them. This is simply because the individual in question lacks mental driving power. Such persons are seldom if ever forceful in action or in their association with other people. Their personality suffers and they follow the lead of more energetic individuals.

Indecision is another indication of indefinite thinking. This weakness is always disclosed in the formation of the base line and the condition of the finals. Such an individual is of an unsettled nature. More often than not the mind of such a person swings from one thing to another without forming any positive ideas concerning matters in general. This in itself is bad enough but what makes matters worse is that people often take advantage of persons who are weaker than they are. As a result people who are indefinite in their thoughts often develop a streak of stubbornness in order to protect themselves from others. This negative trait is to be found in the formation of the letter "t" although it may also be disclosed in the letter "h" and also in the "e".

That stubbornness is a form of thought that influences the action of the person concerned is something that has been found to be true by many. When this trait is very strong the individual in question often refuses to budge

either way regardless of right or wrong.

However, when a person is capable of strong and forceful thinking it is very much different. The letters in themselves may sometimes run out of their regular formation, but when they do the finals will be strong enough to prove that the individual concerned is capable of entertaining forceful thoughts. This also shows in the strokes themselves. Such a person is definite in his actions. He knows what he wants and forms his own ideas in regard to matters in which he takes an interest.

Because he is of a positive nature he does not change his mind when others disagree with him. He is prepared to defend whatever ideas he may have and as a rule he is in a position to explain his viewpoint. This is not due to stubbornness but to positiveness that is either natural or has been developed by practice and effort. People of this type are energetic and give the impression of being resourceful. The base line brings out the fact that he is decisive and he is capable of directing his thoughts.

Many persons are direct in their thinking and as a result go at a problem in a definite manner. When they are going to do anything they want to go at it without a fuss or unnecessary ado. This often shows in the formation of the letter "t" especially when this is the initial letter on a word. Very often such persons are of a thoughtful and serious nature. Trivialities and boisterousness goes against them and they spend much time in meditation and reflection. Some of these traits are disclosed in the crossing of the "t" and the formation of the The capital letters also help to establish the characteristics brought out in this paragraph.

As a rule the class of persons discussed in the foregoing paragraph are of the mental type. Their mind is occupied with intellectual pursuits that do not require much physical effort. As a matter of fact many an individual of the intellectual type uses his or her mind in order to avoid that which requires physical activity. BECAUSE illness and affliction so frequently burden the life of man we have a right to expect that those who formulated the spiritual doctrines of the past, which were intended to explain the significance of events and how to take advantage of them, should have commented on these tribulations in their symbolic writing in the sky.

When the Sun is in this sign it is moving to-ward the Autumnal Equinox where days and nights are equal, and after crossing which the forces of death prevail and the nights become longer than the days. The forces of Light are still triumphant while the sun remains in any part of Virgo, but the closer the Sun draws to the next sign, Libra, the weaker becomes the power of Day and the more Night is able to inflict its encroaching power of evil upon the solar waning strength.

The last decanate of Virgo, therefore, where the Sun may be found from September 13 to September 23, is the most appropriate place in all the zodiac to represent the afflictions to which man is heir, and his persecution at the hand



It is unnecessary here more than merely to point out that the Sun each year dies on the Autumnal Cross of Libra, even as the Son of Man gave up His life on Calvary; or that preceding this far-reaching tragedy the gentle Nazarine was vilely persecuted and made to wear a crown of thorns, of sim-

Why "Planetary" Numerology?

WHAT you are determines your course in life, your ultimate destination and the attendant circumstances you will experience. Will you go onward boldly, fearlessly, with your head up, eyes bright and challenging, step firm, with erect mien, confidently expecting success and happiness? To go thus opens doors of opportunity, fast barred or entirely concealed from the view of one who is downcast, fearful or in any way lacking in positivity.

"Knowledge is Power," but so surely as this is a well known fact, so is its opposite, IGNORANCE IS WEAK-NESS. Before you may lay the outcropping of a rich vein of ore which would bring you the realization of your most extravagant dreams, nearby may be the prospector's hammer or pick which would crack wide the drab outcrop to expose its richness, but you do not know how to recognize what is before you so that for you this wonderful richness might be said not to exist.

What you are is only effective to the extent of the range of knowledge and belief, conscious or otherwise, which you possess. You may, and undoubtedly do, possess potential talent and powers which would lift you well out of the rut you are traveling, or perhaps make a streamlined, deeply upholstered vehicle for traversing the same rut if that were best for you, but you must believe in, recognize and develop such powers before they can be of service and thus become an active part of what you are.

You will observe that knowledge is needed in two ways: first, the knowledge of the possession of a particular talent or latent ability; second, the knowledge of how to put that latent ability into action. Not until both of these points of knowledge are fully possessed does the latent ability become part of what you are.

The next thing to consider is how will you become aware of the latent powers which can change your life and circumstances. To get a better understanding of this subject let us consider some of the facts pertaining to the forces that stamp their characteristics on the plastic matter which is the brain of an infant at the moment of birth.

The part of the human brain which is used in conscious thinking is a mass of cells which constitute a sort of galvanic battery. This generates electrical impulses or waves of varying lengths and intensity of vibration. Confirmation of these statements is at hand in a clipping from a recent edition of a newspaper which tells of experiments by eminent scientists on the brains of both

humans and monkeys with a sensitive instrument which not only made a record of these waves of electrical energy, but also showed that the waves varied according to the degree of concentration or emotion.

The brains of a few people are syntonized, or in perfect sympathy. Others can be brought into such a state of sympathy as is sometimes found in telepathic communication. Still others can be harmonized only in part and yet others are violently opposed.

The position of the Planets at the birth of an individual determines the talents, latent ability and dominant characteristics of the individual, because the cells comprising the galvanic battery spring into activity in response to the pattern of the heavens or set of vibrations which is in operation at that moment. It almost invariably transpires that one planet is in a position which causes it to dominate.

Various parts of the brain are given to the different types of faculty. Thus Saturn rules the Devotional group, ideality, reverence or veneration, philosophical speculation, etc. Mars rules the Self-Care group, self-defense, executive action, destructiveness. Now when a Planet is dominant at birth the child will be given a definite trend in the affairs of life according to the tract of the brain and particular group of faculties ruled by that planet. Should it be Mercury, for instance, the child will be swayed in life by the intellect and all that pertains to intellect or stirs and appeals to that tract of the brain to which Mercury is allied. More than this is involved, however, for let us suppose another planet were in conjunction with Mercury at that moment then the intellect would find expression through the group of faculties controlled by the planet or luminary with which the dominant planet was conjoined.

Properly speaking, you may say these facts are in the realm of Astrology, and truly they are, but you must bear in mind that Planetary Numerology is based upon Astrological facts and merely narrows these facts down to a somewhat finer focus on the life of an individual.

Therefore, to determine the potential powers and dominant faculties of an individual it is only needful to consider the Numerical Symbols of the planets as contained in the birthdate. The Mounts

THE fleshy pads of flesh located on the different parts of the hand, one being under each finger, one at the base or the root of the thumb, and two at the percussion or outside parts of the hand are called "Mounts."

The names of the mounts are Jupiter, Saturn, Apollo (sometimes called Sun) Mercury, Mars, Luna (sometimes called Moon) and Venus.

The names applied to the different mounts do not necessarily mean any direct connection with the planets of those names, but these names have been used for thousands of years and the characteristics assigned to them do not contradict the influences said to be given off by the planets. Definite qualities have been associated so long with the names of planets, that their mere mention recalls them, therefore the terms are used to simplify qualities that it is desired to describe. In this connection, I wish to say that I do not for one moment deny that there may be a connection, and a great one between the two, but I do not wish to consider it in conjunction with this study of the hand, which I believe to be, in every way, complete within itself.

The scheme of evolution for humanity as we at present understand it, is that in the beginning seven distinct types of people were first created. Each of these types represented certain qualities, certain aptitudes, certain virtues and certain faults. A combination of the qualities represented in these types was necessary for the harmonious operation of the universe.

The "mount types" indicate the particular direction in which the inherent forces and energies are best used to bring about the most useful results. The first aim, therefore, in examining the mounts is to find which is the strongest one. Whichever it may be,

it will show that the qualities of that mount type are the leading ones. More often than not, a hand will have two mounts equally developed, and in such cases there will be a combination of the two types represented by the mount. To determine which is the stronger of the two mounts, if one of them has a deep vertical line on it or is harder or redder than the other, this will be the leading mount and the characteristics of that mount will predominate.


The mount of Jupiter is located at the base of the index finger and when deficient indicates a cold, self centered nature, a want of dignity and often a lack of self-respect. The mount of Saturn is located at the base of the second finger and when deficient the indications are that the individual will lead a rather insignificant life. He will take life as he finds it, doing little to change conditions either one way or the other. When full, the indications are of prudence and wisdom, a nature grave and sensitive. When excessive the indications are of a melancholy outlook, one who has a persistent dread of the after life. Thus its virtues are: prudence and reliability. Its failings: fear of consequences and indecision.

The mount of Apollo or Sun is located at the base of the third finger, and when deficient the indications are of a deficiency of artistic ideas and tastes, no desire for adornment, a nature tending more to materialism than to anything high or etherial. When full, the indications are of love of music, art, literature of a pictorial order, one who loves beauty, perfection, also the applause of the world. When excessive, the indications are more toward a tendency to do anything for the sake of applause or popularity. Thus its virtues are: refinement, courtesy, love of art. Its failings: frivolity and unreliability.

The mount of Mercury is located at the base of the fourth or little finger and when deficient indicates a rather low development of intellect, little capacity for science or literature. Such a one is likely to lead a rather dull, negative existence. When full, the indications are for love of change, a

desire for excitement, together with eloquence, cheerfulness and activity. When excessive, the indications are of impudence and falsehood, also a love of gain regardless of the means employed. Thus its virtues are activity, adaptability, quickness, promptness. Its failings are: deception, changeability, impulse and often dishonesty.

There are two mounts of Mars, one located on the percussion of the hand below the mount of Mercury and the other below the mount of Jupiter. When deficient, the indications are of a cowardly spirit, a want of self control, an inability to either take the lead or initiative or to govern others.

When full, the indications are of courage, passive resistance and reso-There is ability to lead and command, together with ability and enthusiasm in all undertakings. mount of Mars located under the mount of Mercury and sometimes called upper Mars, indicates passive courage. The mount of Mars located under the mount of Jupiter, and sometimes called lower Mars, indicates active courage or aggression. Where excessive and spreading out into the center of the hand, the indications are of defiance, one violent, cruel and insulting. This formation tends to make the individual hot blooded and impetuous, and unless these tendencies are controlled by other indications of the hand, there is often sensuality and tyranny. Thus its virtues are: courage, decision, energy and enthusiasm. Its failings: defiance, harshness, cruelty and tyranny.

The mount of Moon is located at the base of the thumb, sometimes called the root of the thumb. This mount is separated from the mount of Mars by the extreme end of the middle line or line of head, going across the hand and reaches to the center of the hand at the base of the hand, but does not enter the hollow of the palm. This mount is bordered by the line of life but does not extend into the base of the thumb.

When deficient, the indications are of absence of poetical tastes and imagination, a dreamy, sentimental nature, love of mystery. There is often intuitive perception, reliability in dreams and presentiments. However, there is not much power of expression and little self reliance. Where excessive, the in-

dications are of irritability, caprice, a morbid outlook, and often fanatical imagination.

Such a one would often take pleasure in mournful and painful thoughts. There would be a sort of half mad joy in cherishing pain and woes. Thus, its virtues are meditation, emotional sympathy, intuition, tenderness. Its failings, irritability, love of change.

The mount of Venus is the root or lower part of the thumb on the palm side of the hand. It is enclosed by the line of life running around its base.

When deficient, the indications are of a sordid, mean nature, with no taste and often an absolute dislike of the opposite sex. There is little life force or vitality. When full, the indications are for love of beauty, music, dancing, a tender, affectionate nature. It bespeaks love of pleasure and a benevolent nature, one desirous of giving pleasure to others, a love for society. Where excessive, there is usually a fondness for material and sensual pleasure, a nature often given to debauchery, vanity and flirtation. Thus its virtues are: affection, service, benevolence, agreeableness. Its failings: love of sensualism, inconstancy.

The manner in which a mount may be judged to be deficient, full or excessive is by comparing it with the development of the whole hand. Thus, where the mount of Jupiter is deficient, the hand would appear lean and small in that particular part of the hand. Where the mount is full, there would be a well developed pad of flesh on that part. Where excessive, that part of the hand would appear large in proportion to the other parts of the hand.

In examining a hand, it is often found that two or three mounts show an equal influence. This indicates that the nature will show a combination of the qualities indicated by the mounts, with the strongest mount qualities predominating. The mounts showing the least development, indicate the weakest parts of the nature.

Where the mounts show an equal development, the indications are of a harmonious outlook on life. Such an individual is unusually well balanced and will go through life without much friction. However, such a life will be devoid of great pleasures and an absence of great troubles.

that which makes it necessary for them to use their muscles.

This desire for physical action is always disclosed in the formation of the letter "p". The speed of the script also has a good deal to do with it. ilar import to Corona Borealis, placed by the ancients in the sky to mark the tribulations of the Sun before it temporarily succumbs each year to the forces of darkness.

The fruits of life, whether they be tares or wholesome grain, are harvested from experience. What that harvest shall be is not determined by the nature of the experiences, but by the mental and emotional reaction toward them; for both the physical conditions attracted in the future, and the spiritual values garnered, are dependent upon the seeds of thought thus sown and tended in the finer form which find heading in the character. In the final winnowing all except the golden grain of character is blown away as tares and chaff.

Constellated Virgo teaches the advantages of physical life if man is to acquire that variety of experience which enables him to gain wisdom. The first decanate of the sign reveals that such experiences as come to hand, whatever may be their nature, if discrimination be applied to them, may be made the source of spiritual values. And the second decanate points out the weaknesses peculiar to each of the twelve signs, and how, through proper labor, these may be converted into types of strength.

Each zodiacal sign also is associated with its own particular type of affliction. The illness that one sign brings is not the same as that indicated by another. The loss attracted by one sign when it is discordant, is not the same type of loss which another sign brings when acting as an affliction. Thus are there twelve different sets of difficulties which man should understand.

To represent these, the crown used to picture the reward of character triumphing over tribulations, was given twelve spikes of hard, unyielding iron, one spike for each type of affliction. Such is the significance of Corona Borealis. Because the call of duty so frequently when followed leads to the relinquishment of fond desires, and because those born while the Sun is in this last decanate of Virgo so frequently must hear this call, the Key-word appropriately is Renunciation.

One whole book within the Bible is devoted exclusively to a discussion of the spiritual teachings which those still more ancient sought to picture as the Northern Crown. In the Book of Job many wise sayings relative to life and its problems can be found; and the story of the afflicted hero is replete with sage advice.

Job was an unusually good and devout man who had prospered exceedingly in all ways and gave constant praise to God for his many blessings. But there came a day when the sons of God came before the Lord and as so frequently happens on earth when good people gather together for some worthy purpose, Satan came among them.

"And the Lord said unto Satan,

Whence comest thou? Then Satan answered the Lord, and said, From going to and fro in the earth, and from walking up and down in it." Thus was the answer given then, some thousands of years ago, the same as that which we should expect today, for certainly trouble has lessened little in this world.

In the course of the conversation which followed the Lord pointed out to Satan what a fine, upstanding model of rectitude Job had proved to be. But Satan, like some people who glory in detracting from the merits of such as receive high commendation, was unwilling to admit the real worthiness of anyone. He contended that Job was a good man merely because he had a fine family, had honors and wealth, and practically everything else he desired, but if these things be taken from him his holiness quickly would depart. So it was arranged that a test should be made. Satan was to have power over him in all ways except that he must not touch his body.

Thereupon, in one catastrophe after another, Job lost his property, and his children, until he had no possessions left. But with the wisdom of those who understand Spiritual Alchemy he maintained as the Lord gave him these things they really belonged to the Lord. They had been given him for use and only for so long as it served the Lord God's purpose.

Satan was chagrined at the outcome of this trial of Job's worthiness and as might have been expected of Satan, when the worst of a deal fell his way, he whined around that it had not been a fair trial. In any real test, he held forth, the man's body must be subjected to affliction also; for, after all, it was not much of a blow no matter what a man lost, if he kept in good health. But, he contended, if Job were sick unto death he would renounce his holiness and turn to evil ways.

Thus was it arranged for a second test in which Satan should do anything he desired to Job so long as he spared his life. Then it was that Job's friends turned against him, that he broke out from head to foot with boils, and that one misery after another came to afflict him and in his wisdom he gave voice, among other things, to this oft-quoted thought:

"For the thing which I greatly feared is come upon me, and that which I was afraid of is come unto me."

There is no surer way to attract a catastrophe than to fear it. Fear, unlike caution, is a negative condition which is never of the slightest benefit to anyone. Even apart from its influence in attracting the event thought about, the emotion acts immediately through the adrenal glands to prepare the body for meeting an emergency.


Yet the emergency, if it actually arrives, can be met with much greater success if the brain is not clouded with the emotion of fear. The adrenalin se-

creted into the blood stream through the influence of fear releases sugar from the liver into the blood stream, giving an additional fuel supply, but the emotion of fear inhibits rational thought and tends so to dominate the nerve currents that the orders they carry are not clear and lead to inefficient action, or in extreme instances to temporary paralysis.

When frequently recurring, fear depletes the adrenalin supply. And as, in large measure, the blood depends upon this endocrine to repel invasion, this leads to a condition favoring infection of various kinds. If Job was subject to chronic fear the chemical imbalance thus caused was sufficient in itself to cause his illness. Or worrying over the losses he had sustained would have a similar effect upon the chemistry of his body.

But aside from such chemical reactions to emotional states, to fear a thing is to hold its image vividly in the mind and to feed that image mental energy. It thus creates a thoughtform which has a certain power, acting from the four-dimensional plane, to attract into the life the thing thus thought about.

In his time of affliction Job's friends held forth the Oriental doctrine that man's lot in this world is determined by his morality and that the Lord must be punishing him thus for most grievous sins. But Job pointed out numerous examples of those deemed wicked who prospered in a wordly sense and held fast to his belief that even the afflictions which he suffered were for

some good purpose in the scheme of Divine Providence.

If it be true that individuals are undergoing training to fit them in the realms hereafter, each to fill his special place and fulfill a specific function in the cosmic organization, it is natural to suppose that each will attract to himself just those experiences which he requires to develop the qualifications he will need. Yet as the positions to be filled in the universal plan all are somewhat different, the qualifications and the training likewise must be varied.

Yet accomplishment of any worthy kind implies the ability to overcome difficulties. And to overcome difficulties even those of playing a piano or of solving a mathematical equation, there must be previous practice. People who have never had hard problems to solve are unable to solve hard problems when suddenly presented. Only those who have some experience in carrying responsibilities are selected for responsible positions.

Afflictions, therefore, as Job discerned, are not bestowed by heaven to punish man for sin, but to indicate that he has a lesson to learn from them. When he has learned this lesson he will be able to triumph over the affliction as did Job in the end; for Job was healed and the Lord gave him twice as much as he had before. Thereafter, he had a long and prosperous life. The text thus indicated is: He Who Would Live the Life of the Spirit Here and Now Upon This Earth, Seen and Known of Men, Must Have Fortitude in Times of Adversity.

"Will you ride to town today?" The third meaning for the same question. The wife knows her husband is going to town, but now she wants to know how he is going. There is a big snow on the ground, the town is several miles distant, her husband has a horse, cow, automobile, and an aeroplane, besides two good legs. Is he going to walk? Will he ride? Will he fly?

"Will you ride to town today?" the wife asks again, and this time you wonder if the farmer intends going all the way into the city.

"Will you ride to town today?" asks the farmer's wife again, and this time you have the idea that maybe the farmer won't even go to town. The question clearly shows that it is town, and nothing else about which the wife is inquiring. It is possible that, in going, however he goes, whether he rides, walks, flies or crawls, the farmer might go every place but town. But the wife asks the question once more;

"Will you ride to town today?" Now she knows by the way she asks the question that her husband is going to town, all the way to town and not somewhere else; she knows that he is going to ride and not walk or fly, but she does not know when he is going. Thus, she wants to know not how he is going but whether or not today is the day.

Suppose that you had heard the farmer's wife ask the question once, and once only. Do you believe that your powers of interpretation would give to you the purpose of the wife's question? How would you answer it if asked once? It is but a simple question, yet it taxes the powers of interpretation to arrive at the purpose and intent back of it. If we mistake in solving this little question, how much more liable are we to err in judging other words and acts of our neighbors.

When we take it unto ourselves to pass judgment on the thoughts, acts, words of our fellowman, we are indeed taking on plenty of work and trouble. When we utter an expression in explanation of word or deed, we are assuming possession of knowledge which only the individual saying the word or performing the deed, has deed, hearing the word, sives us no knowledge of the intent or purpose back of the word or deed. And as disclosed above in the conversation between the farmer and his wife, we are not absolutely positive that we have heard the word aright even after it has been given utterance.

The first step in learning the lesson of interpretation is to refuse to form snap judgments, and even in the forming thereof, refuse to allow them to pass beyond the lips. It is not the sign of possessing wisdom when one gives vent to destructive criticism; rather, it is the sign of defective interpretation, of a small brain, and the tongue of a fool.
