Without Fear or Favor

THE HURDLE

WHY SEEKERS OFTEN FAIL

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OCCULT students are seekers by nature. They desire to find "The Truth That Makes You Free." Where a few succeed, thousands are doomed to failure.

While occult science is heralded from the housetops, discussed in a dozen publications, lecture courses offered by the score in every large city in the country, yet the real occult truth somehow eludes the average seeker.

Many students follow half a dozen teachings at one and the same time, a procedure that cannot do otherwise than bring about a veritable mountain of mental confusion, leading the student nowhere except to failure and discouragement.

While there is a "straight and narrow path" that leads directly to Truth, Life, Initiation and Immortality, this path is hidden among the thousands of false claimants to the true teachings.

The average man is not capable of judging the true from the false. Even students who have followed various teachings for fifteen or twenty years are often no nearer the real truth than the beginner.

There are, however, numerous ways of recognizing the true teachings based on the ancient Wisdom.

First of all, what constitutes the true teachings? Why should man desire a knowledge of occult science? What is meant by the ancient Wisdom? What is Initiation? What is Immortality?

All of these questions can be answered easily and quickly.

Just consider the first question. What constitutes the true teachings? Every teaching incorporating the ancient Hermetic Wisdom has a four-fold program of development. These include:

- 1st—Development of Bodily Health.
- 2nd—Mental Development.
- 3rd—Soulual Development.
- 4th—Material Success.

It is well to consider these four objectives one by one.

Bodily health is of prime importance in the mystical teachings of the ancient Fraternities, such as the Confederation of Initiates, or the *Fraternitas Rosae Crucis*, because unless man enjoys health, it is impossible for him to kindle the Ineffable Fire necessary to burn up the dross in an effort to achieve Initiation and Immortality. As here suggested, Initiation is not simply a ritual that can be performed in a single evening, but an Initiation that requires several years for its fulfillment, bringing about a regeneration of the entire being.

Any man or woman in ill health is not and cannot be permitted to undergo

these experiences before the body has been brought to a perfect state of health. That is why the Secret Schools first of all teach man to rejuvenate his being and bring the bodily temple to perfect health.

Mental development is necessary because the carnal, material and mortal thinking mind is the master builder and architect for body, Soul, and material success. All developments start with the mind. While the Soul is far more important than the mind, and while the Soul ultimately will entirely replace the mortal thinking mind the Soul has no power for development, except through the mind.

In every walk of life, in everything that man does, in his every ambition and desire, the thought is always born in the mind. Therefore mind development is of prime importance. But any teaching stressing mind development as covering the entire teaching is just as much wrong as the doctrine which erroneously teaches that salvation of the Soul is possible through faith alone.

Soul development is the ultimate aim, desire and ambition of every seeker on the Path. Body and mind exists only during the life of the body. At death, the body goes back to earth, while the mind, which is the result of a coming together of body, Soul and spirit, disappears into nothingness when the Soul leaves the body. Thus after death only the Soul remains. Only the Soul has any claim to Immortality.

The Soul in man exists mostly as a seed. It is a tiny spark impossible of self-development. To bring this Soul spark into individual consciousness is the great work of the student of Neophyte. Every effort of occult science, every teaching of the Secret Schools, every action and thought on the part of the sincere student must in some way have as its ultimate aim, the awakening of the dormant Soul within the bodily temple.

The Soul is recognized as "the still small voice within," as also "the subconscious mind." That this Soul is undeveloped and dormant in most human beings is best illustrated by the fact that only a very few students have brought the Soul sufficiently into a state of consciousness where it is possible for the individual to carry on a conversation with his own Soul, securing wisdom and knowledge, answers to all of life's problems, and understanding too sublime for the comprehension of anyone not an Initiate.

Material success is necessary for the Initiate, for unless he has a sufficient

accumulation of the world's goods to be free from financial worries, he is incapable of rendering service to mankind. The Law is: Serve the self first, and then all mankind.

Financial and material success is the fourth development demanded and insisted upon by the Secret Schools. This does not mean that the neophyte must live in poverty during the initial stages of development, but it does mean that his character, will power, worthiness and spiritual ambition will be tested to the utmost during the training period.

There may be financial losses, the satisfying of old obligations, extraordinary demands from family or society, or even the facing of death, all of which are tests and problems which in one way or another must be successfully dealt with before the neophyte can expect Initiation and enlightenment.

The Initiate must be able to face poverty and riches alike, without being affected by either. In his travel toward Initiation he undergoes many changes in character and beliefs. The passions of hate, pride, jealousy, selfishness, etc., fall by the wayside, being transmuted to love and good will.

While the ritual Initiation is not the real Initiation, it nevertheless has a purpose, as it reviews what has gone before. It recalls to the mind of the Initiate the experiences of usually from one to five years on the path before Initiation became a possibility in the life of the neophyte.

Initiates are not such because of undergoing a ritual experience. They are Initiates because through trials and tests, success and failure, patience and obedience, they have followed the instructions of a master teacher and located the high altar of the God or Christ within the sacred center of the human temple.

The finding of this center is the task and obligation of every neophyte on the Path. No man on earth, having found this center, is permitted to mention its location to any living human being. It is the task each man and woman must accomplish individually, and the finding of this center is called Initiation. The teacher can do no more than point out the path. The neophyte must do his own work. This task may require either a longer or shorter space of time, depending upon the application and enthusiasm of the student. In the Bible this time is usually stated as 40 days, but here the "40 days" does not actually mean 40 days, but simply an indefinite period of time that may be 40 days or four years. Ultimately each and every human being must undergo this Initiation, as it is the "straight and narrow" path that leads to Soul

Consciousness and Immortality while the Soul is still in a human body.

Man is on earth for the definite reason of achieving this Initiation. Failure in this can result only in one thing. Jesus proclaimed the Law time and again by saying: "You must be born again." Man returns to earth time and again, perhaps for thousands of years, until ultimately he realizes his mission on earth and works for the accomplishment which is the purpose and reason for the birth of a Soul into a human body. Immortality must be achieved while the Soul is in a human body. Once the Soul leaves the body, it loses its working instrument and must necessarily exist in a dream-like condition until offered another opportunity for rebirth and Soul development.

One of the greatest of all "keys" to Soul development is love. He who has most love is nearest God. He who renders unselfish service, thinks of the welfare of others rather than himself, comes very near living up to the Divine Law: "Love Thy Neighbor as Thyself," or "Do Unto Others as You Would That They Do Unto You."

From these various thoughts the student can readily see that anyone offering Initiation through the ritual of a few hours cannot be otherwise than a fakir who is not acquainted with the teachings of Truth and Wisdom.

The average student of occult science takes up a course of study, and because he can see nothing wrong with it, he believes himself to be on the Path. In most instances, nothing could be further from the truth. For every thousand students who believe themselves on the true Path, only one has actually found the way. Students are often highly enthusiastic about the study for anywhere from a few months to ten or more years, only to ultimately find that the study is leading nowhere and leaving him exactly where he started, a seeker after truth.

Among the most destructive of all occult teachings on the face of the earth are those movements which appeal to the selfish nature of man. They induce man to believe that he can secure or achieve anything through blind faith. They try to make man believe that he can secure anything by simply asking, or perhaps better stated, by saying that they teach the "gim-me's." Give me this and give me that. This teaching does more to tear down man's character than anything else, and it is a totally false teaching.

The Law does not permit man to receive anything through blind faith, un-

less the objective has previously been earned. The Law is: "Faith without works is dead." When man decides what he would like to have, and then sits back and expects the Law to fulfill his desires, he is simply wasting his time and effort.

In a book, "Imperial Mastership," the author says:

"It is an accepted fact that the man who is only lukewarm in his interests is not one who will accomplish great works. But he who is intense in his desires and in his love-nature and who, being thus intense, i.e., polarized, is willing and ready to make any necessary sacrifice in order to achieve his desires, is the one who will succeed. There is no power in Heaven or on earth that can resist the mighty Will of one who bespeaks the "I Will," and who firmly holds to that intense resolution irrespective of what may befall, and who is willing that life itself shall end rather than that he give up his efforts or desist his quest.

"The Master Jesus voiced this Law when he said of such: . . . 'whosoever shall lose his life for my sake, the same shall save it.' Though it may appear temporarily that one loses everything and is rendered for a time lowest in the ranks of existence at the moment he is so reduced, the Fates themselves, if necessary, will turn and render him aid, and he will begin his climb upwards and continue until he has attained the summit.

"This is the Great Law: 'Just as one is willing and mayhap has sacrificed and suffered in order to succeed, so will he, in like intensity, be able to live and enjoy. The intensity of suffering and the willingness to give are merely the measure of his possibilities and capacity of enjoying and succeeding.'

"It likewise follows that in most instances man can readily judge the tree by its fruits. All the Hierarchies of the Spaces are arrayed on the side of the man who has spoken the 'I Will' and who has proven it by the fact that he has refused to give up, or to let go, though earth and heaven, men and gods, seemed to be combined against him and his efforts.

"Nothing in earth or heaven which is worth while is ever gained without making some sacrifice, unless, as sometimes comes to pass due to the reaction of the Law, one has previously earned his "reward." The things man is able to buy, because he has the ready money

or other medium of exchange, never can bring the satisfaction that do the things for which man had to save and suffer. Man feels the value of such things because they are part of his life, and in many instances, bought with his blood."

The man who achieves is he who selects a definite goal and then works towards it. Man must be willing to suffer and starve for the accomplishment of a desire. He must visualize his desires, and then keep them in mind constantly, while at the same time expending every effort possible for the accomplishment of his desires. Once he does this, nothing on earth is impossible to him. Every power in Heaven and on earth co-operates with such an individual. He may be faced with almost insurmountable obstacles, but if he sticks to his desires, come what may, he will overcome every problem before him and achieve complete victory.

Perhaps one of the greatest of all causes for failure is the continuous change of the objective. When man starts out to accomplish a definite task and then a few weeks or a month later changes his desire to something else, cannot expect to be successful in his undertakings. The Law is: Find your greatest desire and then stick to it, come what may, until the desire is completely fulfilled. The man without sufficient will-power to stick to a task until it is accomplished, is defeated almost before he begins. Even while at work for the success of his desire, he is thinking of other possibilities, other fields, always seeking something new, with the result that he makes success an absolute impossibility for himself.

It is also well to remember that one of the greatest of all essentials to success is silence. When an individual decides upon a desire for accomplishment, he often begins by telling his friends and acquaintances what he has in mind and what he will do. Such action depletes his forces by sending them out before they are ready for birth. Consequently he makes success very difficult. Many business undertakings have become failures because someone told others about the contemplated project before the plans were ready for launching, with the result that others adopted similar plans, friends discouraged the idea for one reason or another, and before it is fully realized, the ambitious and much-desired plan or action has gone up in smoke (talk).

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AFTER ARMAGEDDON—WHAT?

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ALTHOUGH we are solemnly advised to "Follow after charity, and desire spiritual gifts, but rather that ye may prophesy" those who sincerely endeavor to follow that scriptural advice soon find it a most thankless expenditure of effort; rendered thus by the various forms of ostracism and ridicule practiced by those loudly proclaiming themselves followers of The Christ. Nevertheless, I shall attempt to point out a few of those things most likely to be in effect after The Battle of Armageddon.

Inasmuch as so-called civilization is merely a sort of stucco-like finish, as it were, plastered upon the outer surface of man the savage, there is every indication that this underlying savagery will come prominently to the fore during the next and last Great War. Within this period man, with the aid of his modern destructive equipment, will succeed in destroying from one-third to two-thirds of the inhabitants of our civilized world. But only those who are psychic or who acknowledge the power and presence of Spirit will survive this ordeal to enter into the Aquarian Age.

This great carnage will be the answer to man's abandonment of his close touch with spirit guidance—the priceless legacy with which man started on his voyage down through the ages. However, this slaughter will not be suffered by the so-called savage or primitive tribes, for they never lost the spiritual contact that was the original heritage of all mankind.

Many of us have listened to discourses upon the following Bible passage: "For now we see through a glass, darkly; but then face to face: now I know in part; but then shall I know even as also I am known" — 1 Cor. 13:12. This verse is descriptive of conditions after the advent of man into the coming Aquarian Age and is clearly illustrated by the following recent incident: A mother and daughter were seated in their living room in company with two women with whom they had been well acquainted back in their home town in the Middle West. These two women had borne a reputation for being entirely too friendly with the husbands of other women. Within a few minutes a friend, well known as one living a good clean life and being bitterly opposed to immorality, unexpectedly dropped in and was introduced to the two women. At the sight of this friend the first two callers seemed to shrink down into their chairs and could only sit and stare. Both the mother and daughter "saw" this friend to be surrounded with a radiant white light—a brilliant aura. A few minutes' casual conversation and the friend po-

lately withdrew. After her departure the two callers appeared to be very uneasy, were unable to carry on a conversation, and soon left. Immediately afterwards the mother and daughter came to the writer and gave an account of their experience, the first of its kind to them. Both mother and daughter described the beautiful radiant white light surrounding the friend, while the other two callers were seen surrounded, one with a dark grey and the other with a brown appearing cloud—it all was so inexplicable to them. This incident was explained as being illustrative of the biblical passage cited above; both passage and incident being considered as indicative of the conditions that will exist during the coming Age, now so close at hand, for then all will know each other and be known exactly as they are—WITHIN!

Let us consider the effect of such conditions upon people in general. Imagine a gunman with murder in his heart, following his intended victim for a suitable opportunity, being suddenly seized by an officer. We can imagine a colloquy somewhat as follows: "Hey, mug! Just who do you intend killing now?" "I ain't gonna kill nobody!" "No? So you say!" "Well, you ain't got nothin' on me." "Listen, mug! You'd better learn to watch your thoughts. When I see you surrounded by a cloud of dark green that is shot through with flashes of deep red, you're not fooling anyone but yourself. I want that rod!" Officer frisks him and gets the gun that all the time he knew was there. "So? I can see you're innocent, all right. Come along with me!" and calls the "black Maria." In court the prisoner denies all guilt, but the judge, prosecutor, jury and spectators "see" the TRUTH; even some of the friends of the accused "see" it and tell him about it. Just how long will the underworld continue its evil ways under those conditions?

Jazz with its sensual implications, even when disguised under the pseudonym of "swing" or any other innocuous term, will have disappeared and in its place will be a type of music, spiritual and inspiring, that will perhaps be based upon the characteristic negro spirituals. Is it not rather disheartening that when many were expecting a typical American type of music to be evolved from the present day jazz, Dvorak, a gifted composer from a foreign land should recognize the true American spirit in our Negro spirituals, entirely ignored or overlooked by our native composers, and upon them founded his immortal New World Symphony?

There will be a decided change in the religious thought as taught and practiced in this country. Many of the

great church organizations will go down into oblivion, accompanied by many of the strange weird sects now flourishing. This change is vitally necessary and due entirely to the fact that the teachings of many of the so-called Christian organizations are NOT TRUTH and therefore are NOT the REAL TEACHINGS of Jesus the Master. We quote what a devout Christian and thinker has written: ". . . the Christianity the world has tried and which apparently has been found wanting, has not been the religion of Christ. Indeed, it has had very little to do with the message of Jesus. It has been Christian in name but not in fact . . . the Christianity of the church, the Christianity of the creeds, the Christianity which has failed to fulfill the hope of its promise, obscured the Gospel of Christ."—Horace Westwood.

In addition, the Bible is full of mis-translations, about which the church has remained silent. Not only has it remained silent, but it has based a principal tenet of its teachings upon these same mis-translations. In corroboration, let us examine two familiar passages from the Bible as typical examples of the current Biblical translations. Seven words, one of which is *regel* (Hebrew), meaning *foot*, are translated into *coming*, and ten words, one of which is *chedel* (Hebrew), meaning *cessation*, are rendered into *world*. We read: ". . . Tell us, when shall these things be? and what shall be the sign of thy coming, and of the end of the world?"—Matt. 24:3. The word here rendered into *coming* is *parousia* (Greek), meaning *a being alongside, presence*, while the word rendered into *world* is *aion* (Greek), meaning *age, dispensation*. Supplying the words expressing the proper meaning, this passage reads, "Tell us, when shall these things be? and what shall be the sign of thy PRESENCE and of the end of the AGE?" The word *parousia* is rendered *coming* twenty-two times in the New Testament instead of its true meaning. Another instance of glaring mis-translation reads as follows: "So that ye come behind in no gift; waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ"—1 Cor. 1:7. The word here rendered into *coming* is *apokalupsis* (Greek), meaning *revelation*. No doubt this required far too much stretch of the imagination for even the translators as they put *revelation*, the correct word, in the marginal notes. Instead of teaching that the spirit of the Master was PRESENT and could be contacted (see Matt. 18:20), the church has been teaching that HE was *coming* at some indefinite, unknown, future time.

Thus when the REAL meaning is brought out, these and many other pas-

The ancient philosophers realized that an impure mind, with its demoralized will-power, is capable of effecting the same diseased conditions in the digestive secretions as would result from the ingestion of putrefying food itself. For it is over the wireless or fiberless currents of the human radio, playing on every receiving station in the physiological field of the body, that the mind has the power to influence, for good or for ill, the selective affinities involved in the digestive and nutritional processes of individual life.

The vibrations induced by each thought transformer radiates a glow of a color characteristic with the spiritual quality of the thought form or pattern. WHEN the seventh seal, which is the Conarium or Pineal body, has been opened unconsciously or consciously, we see with the mental or subjective eye and at this time are able to see the seven psychic colors. Jupiter is purple; Mars, red; Venus, yellow; Mercury, violet; Moon, green; Saturn, blue, and the color of the Sun is orange or perhaps we should say gold. You may see these colors when your eyes are closed at night when you are fully conscious, between wakefulness and sleep, or they may manifest at any time of the day or night. When an individual has reached this stage of consciousness he will not be a passive personality in touch with the astral or desire world, but a *positive* individual in touch with the mental or thought realms.

Serene patience is requisite to one who would seek the truth of spiritual knowledge.

The prodigal son on his journey back to his father's house leaves all his gay companions, his desires, his love of the flesh-pots of earth behind him, and all material loves he drops by the way side. He journeys alone, in silence, over the mountain tops of consciousness. He like the eagle must learn to fly alone; blackbirds and chattering magpies fly in flocks, but the eagle in silent strength flies alone o'er the mountain tops.

Aries is called the first vital wind; this sign is ruled by the planet Mars. In this aspect Mars is positive and stands for creative mentality. Pluto in the serving sign, Scorpio, stands for the creation of generation, and is a passive attribute. When we learn to use the strong energetic sex-force of Pluto in Scorpio and transmute it into creative energy on the higher planes through the sign of Aries, then, and only then, will the Son of God have a chance to be born out of the Son of Man. Of course you know, or you ought to know, that Pluto in Scorpio rules the sex-organs, and you should know that this vital fluid mis-used lessens the brain power. When we learn to control the passions, appetites and the anger of Pluto in Scorpio, we will have learned how to reverse our spheres and will have brought the Plutian energy into the sign Aries where it will create for us on the mental and spiritual planes. *This is the rose or the pink light.*

Taurus is the second vital wind. This is the blue light ruled by Venus, who in this aspect is positive and stands for will-power, determination and divine love, Venus, in the serving sign. Libra stands for physical and

earthy love, and is a passive attribute; these physical and earthy loves are only steps on which we climb *upward* toward the Divine and only love. When we have reversed our spheres this Venusian energy will work through the sign Taurus and we will be more tolerant and have a kindlier feeling toward all our fellow-men. *This is the yellow light.*

In our search for light we discover that until 3,000 years B.C. ancient astrologers used only ten signs. They joined Virgo the Virgin, who has Christ-like qualities to Scorpio, sign of the sex-force or electric power and balanced them through the sign of Libra. These "*three in one*" were used as a central point for all zodiacal energy and were called "Enoch," the perfect man beloved by God. I am inspired to write that 2,000 years hence when humanity ushers in the *Capricornian age* there will be a new planet discovered in the heavens which astrologers of that age will claim to rule Libra.

Gemini is the third vital wind. This is the yellow light, and is ruled by the planet Mercury. Mercury is positive in Gemini, and denotes the super-conscious mind. Mercury, in the serving sign, Virgo, stands for the conscious mind and there are some times when it stands for the scarlet woman. Mercury is a passive attribute in Virgo, but, when the spheres are reversed and the Mercurial energy plays through the sign Gemini, it will denote a super, sub and conscious mind of great insight. These three vital winds are a triad and are analogous with—the Father—the Son—and the Holy Ghost—Mars in Aries, or the creative energy of the mentality denotes the Father. Venus in Taurus, will power, determination and Divine love denotes the Son, while Mercury in Gemini denotes great wisdom and is analogous with the Holy Ghost. *This is the violet light.*

Vulcan is the lost orb of the ancients and we believe that when the sidereal year of Sagittarius is made manifest, Vulcan will have shown himself to the astrologers and that they will name him the ruler of Virgo.

The above triad is the *first mental triad* and deals with the spiritual worlds.

Pisces is the fourth vital wind, ruled by Neptune, the higher octave of Venus. Neptune is positive when one has reversed their spheres and proves to be the psychometry or inner touch of intuition, a Divine touch. *It is a radiant, iridescent light.*

Aquarius is the fifth vital wind and is ruled by Uranus the higher octave of Mercury. Uranus is positive when the spheres are reversed, and is the clairvoyance or inner sight of intuition. *Uranus is the pure white light.*

When Vulcan is again discovered, astrologers will possibly find that it rules the clairaudience or inner hearing of intuition: this will then make a *triad on planes above the spiritual*. We will have six vital winds of which Vulcan will be the head (as the Christ was the head of the twelve disciples). Vulcan will rule the seven serving signs and the five vital winds.

This triad rules through contact with the ego and angelic worlds.

When man makes contact with the energies of Neptune through the mystic mind and Uranus through the occult mind, he has begun to awaken his spiritual faculties and beholds in their heavenly aspects most wondrous light, understanding becomes knowledge which becomes the most dominant power in his life. Man who resolutely follows the path of devotion and purity of mind and body will surely become conscious of immortality, and he will attain a spiritual calmness which will manifest as poise in all conditions of life. It is only a matter of centering your mind on *deathless Christ within* instead of on *the personal outer self*, which is under the sway of alternating death and birth in fleeting forms throughout all eternity. You alchemize your being, or change your mind, from the mortal to the immortal mode of thought. THE SEASON OF BIRTH FOR

THE season at which people are born," as Ellsworth Huntington remarks in his recent work on season of birth, "has greater importance than is generally supposed." Without attempting to explain the application of the Einstein theory of relativity to the season of birth and human abilities, and without attaching any undue significance to the intelligence tests made by Rudolph Pintner and George Forlano upon children born in or near New York City during various months, let us make a brief inquiry into the season of birth of American presidents, vice-presidents and presidential nominees of major political parties. Some attention may well be given to kings who have been sovereigns of American territory, or whose influence in America has been appreciable. Let us attempt to discover if there is any similarity in the lives of statesmen and rulers born during the same month, if there is any similarity of events in their administrations and reigns, if there is any similarity in their personal character. In deference to astrologers, who have long entertained us with their vague generalities in many family gift almanacs, let us make use of the signs of the zodiac instead of calendar months.

SPRINKLER

The sign of the Sprinkler represents an ancient month which in our calendar extends from about January 16 to about February 14. The more prominent kings to which it has given birth—Henry VII, king of England, Sebastian, king of Portugal; Frederick the Great, king of Prussia; Carlos III, king of Spain—have been national heroes or enlightened despots. Perhaps the most distinguished American president has been Domingo Faustino Sarmiento, who was called to the presidency of the Argentine Republic from his post as ambassador to the United States. Perhaps John Hancock, the first president of the Continental Congress of the United States, is more worthy of remembrance than subsequent presidents born under this sign. As major party presidential nominees, we have Aaron Burr, 1800; William Henry Harrison, 1836 and 1840; John Charles Fremont, 1856; Abraham Lincoln, 1860 and 1864; Horace Greeley, 1872; Samuel Jones Tilden, 1876; Winfield Scott Hancock, 1880; James Gillespie Blaine, 1884; William McKinley, 1896 and 1900; Franklin Delano Roosevelt, 1932 and 1936. All were opposition candidates to the administration in power. James G. Blaine's nomination by the party in power was a repudiation of the leadership of President Arthur and a protest against his administrative

policies. None have been elected except after a panic or depression. William Henry Harrison did not meet with success until after the panic of 1837; that of 1857 preceded Abraham Lincoln; that of 1873 preceded the election of Samuel J. Tilden; that of 1893 preceded William McKinley; the depression of 1929 preceded Franklin D. Roosevelt. During each administration, if it has lasted more than one month, there has been either a war or grave emergency which required huge expenditures from the public purse. Each administration produced a new birth of freedom. When John Hancock was president of the Continental Congress, the American colonies became free and independent states. The slaves were emancipated by proclamation of Abraham Lincoln. The Cubans were liberated by administrative action of William McKinley. Under Franklin D. Roosevelt, we may hope, the tyranny of economic royalists has been eradicated from our midst. The Filipinos have been granted autonomy with an option on complete independence. There have been no failures after a second nomination, but not a single president born under the sign of the Sprinkler has been able to complete two terms alive. On the eve of the Constitutional Convention, John Hancock resigned his second term as president of the Continental Congress, over which he was unable to preside because of the gout. William Henry Harrison died in office. Abraham Lincoln and William McKinley were assassinated. Franklin D. Roosevelt, because of the Norris "Lame Duck" amendment to the Constitution, will never be able to serve for the entire time for which he was elected, even if he should be re-elected until he dies. The expiration of his term has been moved up from March 4 to January 20. When Samuel J. Tilden was elected to the presidency by a popular majority, his inauguration in 1877 was prevented by an electoral commission created by act of Congress introduced by James A. Garfield. The nation was thus deprived of the services of Samuel J. Tilden as president, and he was not permitted to lay down his life for his country. In 1880, James A. Garfield was duly elected president by a plurality popular vote, and during the year 1881 he was inaugurated and assassinated. There have been but two vice presidents born under this sign: Aaron Burr, the last elected by a Federalist vote; Charles Curtis, the last elected by the Republicans. To these we might add Alexander H. Stephens, the first, last and only vice-president of the Confederacy. If these data are sufficient for any theories or conclu-

sions, we might state that politicians and statesmen born in America under the sign of the Sprinkler have been fitting opposition candidates; that their services are acceptable to their country in time of need or public distress; that if they accept a second term or a term following renomination, they risk their lives in so doing. If the present recession should result in widespread public distress, it would seem that the seasons are most favorable to the election of either Robert M. LaFollette, Jr., or John L. Lewis.

FISH

In the sign of the Fish, the sun has witnessed the birth of notable sovereigns and illustrious presidents, including Charles V, the most eminent Holy Roman emperor of modern times; Queen Anne, first sovereign of the United Kingdom; Victor Emanuel II, first king of united Italy; Jose de San Martin, liberator of the Argentine Republic; that illustrious Venezuelan patriot, Antonio Guzman Blanco; the noble Mexican dictator, Antonio Lopez de Santa Ana; Joseph Jenkins Roberts, first president of Liberia; Sam Houston, first president of Texas; and our own incomparable George Washington and Andrew Jackson. Both of these presidents of the United States came into power with the tide of political upheaval, and both departed with the ebb tide of political dissension. The flood tide was not strong enough to elect Charles C. Pinckney, DeWitt Clinton and William Harris Crawford. It seems that military achievement is prerequisite to the popular election of a nominee born under the sign of the Fish. The vice presidents also have an enviable record. It was Henry Wilson who introduced into Congress the act of incorporation for the National Academy of Sciences. It was while Thomas R. Marshall was vice president, and regent of the Smithsonian Institution, that the Academy was authorized to organize and requested to perpetuate the National Research Council. As we look upon the array of present politicians born under the sign of the Fish, and recall the glories of their predecessors, we are reminded of the exclamation of the sorceress in the *Arabian Nights*: "Fish! Fish! Art thou doing thy duty?"

RAM

In the sign of the Ram, the Sun has witnessed the birth of many sovereigns and presidents who have developed constitutional government, among them George I, king of Great Britain; Joao IV, king of Portugal; Wilhelm I, emperor of Germany; Benito Juarez, president of Mexico; Thomas Jeffer-

son, James Madison, John Tyler and Grover Cleveland, presidents of the United States. Statesmen born under this sign have been frequent nominees of major parties. Thomas Jefferson was nominated in 1796, 1800 and 1804; James Madison in 1808 and 1812; Henry Clay in 1824, 1832 and 1844; Grover Cleveland in 1884, 1888 and 1892; William Jennings Bryan in 1896, 1900, and 1908; Charles Evans Hughes in 1916; James Middleton Cox in 1920; John W. Davis in 1924. Only those endorsed by a majority president have been elected. Thomas Jefferson, before his nomination, was secretary of state in the cabinet of George Washington; James Madison was secretary of state in Jefferson's cabinet; Grover Cleveland was endorsed by Samuel J. Tilden, an elected but not an inaugurated president. Henry Clay, who was secretary of state in the cabinet of a minority president, did not fare as well as Cleveland, with the endorsement of a majority president *de jure*. Presidents born under this sign have always striven to keep the nation out of war, but wars have always taken place either during their administration or those of their successors. Under Thomas Jefferson there was war with Algerian pirates. Under James Madison there was war with Indians and British. Following the administration of John Tyler there was war with Mexicans. Following the retirement of Grover Cleveland there was war with Spain. Each had opportunity to acquire territory. Louisiana was acquired under Thomas Jefferson. James Madison had opportunity, during the war of 1812, to acquire British or Spanish territory, and Florida was purchased during the next administration. Under John Tyler Texas was annexed. Under Grover Cleveland the petition of Hawaii for annexation was denied, but it was accepted during the administration of William McKinley. We are indebted to Thomas Jefferson for our declaration of independence, to James Madison for the bill of rights in our constitution, to Grover Cleveland for clarification of the Monroe Doctrine. The vice presidents born under the sign of the Ram have felt rather restricted and cramped in the vice presidency. Thomas Jefferson opposed John Adams for re-election as president. John C. Calhoun deserted John Quincy Adams to join the forces of Andrew Jackson. As vice president under Andrew Jackson he resigned. With John Tyler as vice president, William Henry Harrison was able to survive only one month as president. With Franklin Pierce as president, William Rufus King could not stand the strain of the vice presidency. After one term as

vice president with Ulysses S. Grant, Schuyler Colfax could not be induced to accept another. Perhaps there are enough data to warrant the conclusion that nominees born under the sign of the Ram can be elected to the presidency only when they have the endorsement of a majority president; that as vice presidents they are seldom an asset to their administration. There seem to be no candidates for nomination in 1940 who have the endorsement of a majority president.

BULL

The sun, in the sign of the Bull, has witnessed the birth of many a distinguished princess, including Isabella, queen of Spain; Mary II, queen of England; Catherine the Great, empress of Russia; Elizabeth, princess royal, heir apparent to the British crown. King Ferdinand, the consort of Queen Isabella, was born under the same sign. We also have the less royal William the Silent, Oliver Cromwell, Napoleon III, and Adolf Hitler. American voters have had opportunity to elect James Monroe, James Buchanan, Stephen A. Douglas, Ulysses S. Grant, and Alton B. Parker. Monroe, Buchanan, and Grant, who were elected, served their country in the president's cabinet before their nomination. Each came to the aid of the president during a grave emergency. Monroe, during the war of 1812, served simultaneously as secretary of state and secretary of war. Buchanan served as secretary of state during the Mexican war. Ulysses S. Grant, after he was made commander-in-chief of the Union army by President Lincoln, turned the war tide of defeat into victory. He was later called to the cabinet as secretary of war by President Johnson during an unusual emergency. Monroe and Grant were nominated during the campaigns which followed the emergency in which they served. They were elected by overwhelming majorities, and their parties remained in power for several administrations thereafter. Buchanan in 1848 was denied his party's nomination, and the opposition was victorious at the polls. When he was nominated and elected in 1856 as a minority president and inaugurated amid the panic of 1857 at the advanced age of 66, it was too late to save the Union from secession, to prevent a civil war between the states, to arrest the decline and fall of his ungrateful party. He was not destined, like James Monroe and Ulysses S. Grant, to usher in an era of good feeling, an era of improved methods of transportation and communication, an era of increased prestige for the United States in foreign affairs. But the administrations of these three presidents are similar in that during

each important states were admitted to the Union. Under James Monroe, Missouri was admitted as a slave state, after debate and compromise. Under James Buchanan, Kansas was admitted as a free state, after exercising its privilege of self-determination. Under Ulysses S. Grant, Virginia and Texas were readmitted to the Union without restoration of territory or privileges lost by secession, and Colorado was admitted during the centennial year of our independence. When, in 1880, the Republican party denied the nomination to John Sherman, after his distinguished service as secretary of the treasury, there was a loss of prestige from which the party never fully recovered. In each of the next three Republican administrations, there was either an assassination or a panic. In 1884 and 1892 the election was lost to the Democrats. There have been two vice-presidents born under the sign of the Bull: Levi P. Morton and Charles W. Fairbanks. After their respective inaugurations we had the panics of 1893 and 1907. We thus have established precedent for the statement that a statesman who has served in the cabinet may be elected to the presidency; that, if a statesman born under the sign of the Bull does serve in the president's cabinet during a grave emergency, and is not nominated for the presidency by the administration party during the campaign following this emergency, there may be grave and momentous consequences to our political, social and economic structure. It may not be possible to avert these consequences by nominating him for vice-president. The present secretary of the treasury, Henry Morgenthau, Jr., was born under the sign of the Bull.

TWINS

The sign of the Twins, used to denote an ancient month which closed shortly before the summer solstice, may claim many illustrious sovereigns, including Charles II, whose sovereignty was more acceptable to the British than the independence which they had achieved under the Commonwealth and Protectorate; George III, an idol of his British subjects, but not acceptable in America; Queen Victoria, adorable among the British, but not acceptable to the Hanoverian subjects of her uncles; George V, the glory of the British Empire, but not acceptable as a sovereign to the Irish; Philip II, whose stoic fortitude arouses profound admiration among all who appreciate Spanish culture and ideals, but not acceptable to his Dutch and English subjects; Alfonso XIII, the pride of Spanish monarchists, the anathema of republicans; Nicholas II, whose reign as czar of Russia is replete with mysteries

TRUE democracy is a government of the people, by the people and for the people. If the people at large, as individual citizens are lacking in wisdom, it is to be expected that the delegates chosen to represent the people shall also be lacking in wisdom. In order to have a high form of democracy it is necessary to educate the individuals who go to make up the democracy. In this land of the free, the United States of America, certain delegates, being citizens in this physical outer world, are elected to office to become human law makers, to enforce these laws and to judge other humans by this human code of laws, set up by a human idea of what the conduct of man should be.

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Mystery of the "Northern Lights"

SEVERAL years ago one of my great desires was to publish a work on "The New Conception of the Earth and Its Unknown Interior" as a result of some research and writing I had done along the same line. But just recently, however, I was impressed by a vision to postpone the publishing of the same until after the completion of what will be known as the world's greatest 200-inch reflecting telescope now being built by the California Institute of Technology at Palomar Mountain, Southern California. During the time of its construction during the next two or three years, the astronomers, the scientists, the Truth seekers and even the most dogmatic theologians are anxiously waiting and hoping that perhaps the greatest astronomical discoveries of the ages will then be made. It is probable that new and unknown extensions of the universe and space will be revealed. We shall also learn more about the mysteries of "sun spots" and the probability of life and beings on other planets become more established. Thus we shall then also realize more and more that we are living, as it were, in a new age.

If therefore what I shall here declare concerning the "Northern Lights" shall not be contradicted by any such or any other new discoveries by that time, all that I have here stated shall continue to stand forever as proof that, *Truth and knowledge have always existed* and shall always be attainable for all who are sincere and have an open mind.

Our present little telescopes have not yet penetrated but comparatively a few inches of all possible endless space. In the light of Truth we are still as little children not realizing the possibility of other stellar systems far, far beyond our present telescopic vision or imagination. Even the earth upon which we are now living; we know as yet comparatively little about it; in fact nothing, as for instance, what exists or lies below the depths of only 400 miles of our own earth's surface. It is also one of the great mysteries of our own earth-globe or planet that has not yet been solved. Perhaps because the DIRECTIVE INTELLIGENCE of the heart of this earth like all other planets has not yet been sufficiently realized.

Thus it would be safe to predict that physical science alone will always be limited until men shall have also unfolded or developed the possible latent X-ray vision of their own higher mentality, for that would enable them to see through even the shell of this earth-globe which I also contend is approximately only 800 miles thick. Most people who have already heard or thought

about the possibility of this earth-globe of ours as being hollow have nevertheless thought and concluded that, "It would be a pretty dark place on the inside, anyway," forgetting however the most important fact that, there are many other light-rays besides the sun and those known to science whereby even man himself might be guided in the unknown deeper regions of this earth's interior had he been destined to live there instead of on our present outer surface.

This being but a part of one of the chapters of the work mentioned on the proposed new and more natural structure of this earth-globe, it may not seem directly related to that which is occult or truly spiritual, nevertheless it is none the less so since the structure of the cosmos and its phenomena of the heavens and the earth are also the creations and the reactions of all of the collective forms of individual lives and beings on this earth's interior as well as those of our own outer surface.

The *Right* conception of our own earth-globe and the *Right* conception of our own true nature and its relation to all other individuals should enable us to also realize more and more the possibility of life and beings on other planets. And though we believe or might merely fancy dwellers on other planets also having telescopes by which they might get faint glimpses of perhaps our own northern lights, they might be equally mystified as we are as we continue to wonder and speculate about theirs, as for instance, our theoretical conclusions and speculations about the planet Mars and its white caps or patches at its poles, or Saturn with its luminous rings around its equator.

The greatness of a mystery is often concealed in its simplicity and *the solution of one problem or mystery often explains many others*. For this cause and reason it is equally important that I first explain to the more interested reader of this subject, the relative possible truth of the true nature and structure of our earth-globe and out of which emanate the etheric and magnetic vibrations which are the primary cause of this great and wonderful phenomenon.

With the foregoing in mind I feel more free to state that, possibly one of the best proofs that this earth of ours is a hollow globe and proof for also an interior body of light or sun of its own, is the phenomenon of the aurora borealis, popularly called "northern lights," and which as yet has not been satisfactorily accounted for or explained by any science. This varied and luminous phenomenon of

the heavens, sometimes of great beauty, and which appears very often in the northern hemisphere at about the spot in the heavens toward which the dipping needle points, has also been accounted for more or less by science as being associated with the earth's magnetism; but it too may be said to be in support of this concept, *due also to electronic or electro-magnetic radiations from the proposed interior sun or central body of light* in the interior of the hollow earth's globe.

As the northern lights more properly speaking spread out from a region above and surrounding the magnetic North Pole, and as the earth's shell below the upper Arctic sea and pole is proposedly extremely thin and even porous enough at some places to permit the flow of water from the interior into our own Arctic sea, it would be most natural for the magnetic rays created by the proposed interior sun to penetrate these ends of the globe more easily than at the equator.

The same may be said to be true of the South Pole where may be seen the Aurora Australis or "southern lights" which appear in similar varied shapes and forms often as thick, brilliant curtains of light, hanging over the heavens and down to the earth's horizon. Photographic pictures and drawings of these southern phenomena can be seen as well as other facts obtained in the records of auroral observations made by the Australian Antarctic Expedition, 1911-14.

Just recently on the night of January 22, 1938, the phenomenon of the aurora in all its splendor appeared in the United States for the first time in 50 years, except for some in a lesser degree in 1921. The display extended south as far as Tijuana, just across the Mexican border. At Descano, 40 miles east, Federal forestry officials were routed out of bed at 2 A. M. by reports of fires. As the greater displays of this phenomena appeared after midnight while most people were asleep, very few saw this perhaps once-in-a-lifetime phenomenon.

For those who may have been asleep on the above recent occasion and who may not have even noticed the newspaper reports the following day, it may be further interesting to relate another of the many similar surprising incidents and human experiences. At Santa Paula, Southern California, the assistant county fire warden was also awakened at 3 A. M. by telephone informing him the whole country was on fire and that the sky was a blazing red. He jumped into an automobile and after driving more than thirty

The Significance of Horse Sense

A HORSE immediately suggests two things, speed of travel and ability to carry a rider. The head of a horse, the animal's body missing, conveys the thought that the intelligence factor is to be considered rather than the physical propensities. To have Horse Sense is phraseology with which most people are familiar, even though it is not a refined expression. It indicates such a correct appraisal of circumstances that action of practical value can be based upon it. Yet the full significance of the Horse Head, Equulus, as a universal symbol employed by the ancients to convey information, is not apparent until it is remembered that the sign Aquarius rules astrology, and that Equulus pictures the astrology-decanate of the sign.

To be more explicit, the planet Uranus rules astrology, and the Aquarius-decanate of Aquarius is specially under his dominion and thus has an unusually close affinity for the starry science. Furthermore, individuality and inventive ability, wherever found in marked degree, denote the Uranus or Aquarius influence. Hence the key-word for this section of the sky where the Sun may be found each year from January 20 to January 30 is Originality.

Those who feel that they have so complete a grasp of the laws and principles through which nature operates that nothing can transpire not explained by the text-books used in formal education, jump to the conclusion that astrology is "exploded" merely because they do not perceive how it works, and because their teachers have so informed them. Yet such as so glibly proclaim there is nothing to astrology are free to admit—at least our foremost astronomers have thus admitted—that they have never tested the science out experimentally, and, in fact, would not know how to go about it to set up and read a birth-chart. Utterly unfamiliar with the rules, and often attributing to astrologers' claims to omniscience which no well-versed astrologer ever makes, they merely echo what happens to be academic fashion.

Horse Sense, which the general populace often possesses in greater degree

than those who are bound by the tenets of formal schooling, demands that before condemning anything as untrue it should be tested out in actual experience. Theories are very fine, but the man in the street who has had numerous practical contacts with life, has come to realize that the accepted theories of the schools often fail signally in actual practice. He, therefore, is much less willing than the college professor to discountenance something just because he has no ready explanation for it. Following the dictates of experience, his Horse Sense informs him that the best way to find out if a thing works is not to theorize as to its possibility, or probability, but actually to test it out in practice.

Thus we find a peculiar situation in our land; the so-called learned schoolmasters denouncing the public because, more and more, that public is coming to lean on astrology for help. And the public, in spite of the condemnation of the schoolmasters who depend merely upon theories in such matters, gaining more and more confidence in astrology; because they have had the opportunity to test it out through actual experi-

ence. If a thing actually works and is decidedly helpful, the man in the street is not unduly concerned whether or not it breaks the conventional traditions of scholastic opinion.

Such gain in the popularity of astrology is made in the face of the unusually severe handicap that those who know almost nothing of the science, who are really astrological quacks, through their flamboyant advertising are able to draw people into their clutches and give them misinformation under the astrological banner.

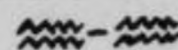
Because the public has had so little opportunity, in the face of academic condemnation, to become informed as to what can and what cannot be done with astrology, and as to what constitutes a correct birth-chart, or even that it should be progressed if the time and nature of events likely to be attracted are to be given, it is easy for rank charlatans to flourish under the pretense they are astrologers, and to fleece the public of money.

This also makes it very easy for the academic upholder of conventional tradition apparently to disprove the

When the energies of the vital winds play through the mind of incarnate man the aura will be seen.

We will tell you how to see the health aura and from there you can find the other auras with your own initiative and powers.

Sit or lie with your profile against the bright sunshine, close the eye on the sunshine side of the face, now look at your nose with the other eye (the eye on the dark side of the face) and you will see a violet grey mist faintly luminous extending slightly beyond the nose; this health aura is never over a fourth of an inch wide and of course it extends over the whole body. The etheric double is seen beyond the health aura; this double never gets far from its counter-part; it is very unlike the astral body in this respect, as the astral body can be thousands of miles from its physical counter-part. The etheric double is a counter-part of the physical body but is built up of etheric substance on a higher vibratory plane. The same holds good through astral substance, mental substance and spiritual substance; the different bodies always work in planes made up of different degrees of vibratory rate and substance.

In 1911 the existence of the aura was proven scientifically through mechanical and chemical means. Dr. Karlner of St. Thomas hospital, London, England, prepared glass screen slides containing a chemical named dicyanin. He claimed that looking at a nude figure through this glass screen a person possessing good eye-sight could see the aura of a physical body. This is a scientific fact. I will go one step further and say that anyone, if they look for it, can find their aura after

practice, and it does not take clairvoyance either, just a centering of attention.

A student who cares to study the etheric double will find that there are numerous straight, white, very fine lines emanating from the body and particularly the head, which resemble rays of white light; these are magnetic rays and constitute the magnetism derived from the astral, mental and spiritual planes, the etheric double holds the astral and physical bodies together.

The physical and astral planes give us the personality aura. The mental planes an individuality aura. The spiritual planes the spirit aura, or spiritual body, sometimes called the auric egg. It is through this body the contact with the ego is made.

I have heard it often said the aura is of such or such a color. There is no set rule for the color of the aura, only when we speak of the inner aura, does this rule hold good. This inner aura is made up of five colored bands that change in color according to the physical emotions; this innermost aura deals with the five physical senses of the human body.

At this point let us use mental alchemy and step through our own aura. If one can do this and apply the law of astrological signatures or the law of correspondence to their findings they will have a greater understanding of the natural laws which activate the human body through the energies of the planets and the constellations.

miles, learned he was chasing the northern lights. Another observer over 100 miles away described the aurora as having spread upwards beyond the zenith of the sky and then it diffused toward the east and the west until it covered half of the heavens.

Radio, telegraph and teletype communications were also disrupted throughout the night including areas of Alaska and Canada, as well as in this country. While talking about this phenomenon on the following day, it was also surprising for me to learn how little some big city people know about this world and the universe in which they live. Said one of these several different uninformed adults to me: "I don't know what you mean by the aurora or northern lights. Why! I never knew there was such a thing." Most people, however, and all who have lived for any length of time in the far north, as in Alaska where this wonderful phenomenon occurs most frequently and who have actually seen it, would of course know and like the scientist would be more interested also as to the real cause for it.

But since even modern science has not as yet been able to give a satisfactory and fully comprehensive explanation of the cause for this phenomenon which has awed mankind for ages, I do not offer this as a challenge but rather as an explanation at this time; and in so far as this explanation will be in support of the proposed new conception of this earth, namely: that this hollow earth-globe of ours is also illuminated on its interior by a central body of light or sun as I shall also explain elsewhere, and that these magnetic vibrations are able to penetrate this proposed 800-mile-thick earth shell of ours.

The thought and question as to the actual heights of these auroral displays is equally wonderful when we realize their magnitude as they pierce into space hundreds of miles above the horizon, while the rainbow, which may be seen when the light of the sun or moon shines on falling rain or a fountain of water, never extends beyond the lower side of a cloud.

According to my own estimation and approximation, the "roof" of our atmospheric space-sphere is about 200 miles above us; so it is probable that these most frequent phenomena in the

far northern regions which sometimes extend from horizon to horizon, may reach to the height of 200 miles at times and also possible that the more diffused parts of sections of it may reach up to perhaps 400 miles into the second space-sphere. It is within reason then to also consider that the tremendous size of this electro-magnetic phenomenon might even be visible to the great telescopes of dwellers of other nearby planets such as Mars, as afore mentioned.

Hereto I also contend that the frequency of the aurora as well as its ever-changing diversity of shapes, sizes and colors are caused also by this globe's interior atmospheric conditions, as well as our own variable atmosphere; for the cosmic law of periodic and seasonal change (action and reaction) is, as I must repeat, as much in operation in the atmospheric regions on the interior of this hollow earth-globe as in or at any other point in endless cosmic space.

The irregularity and appearance of the aurora so far down south near the equator where the shell of this earth is proposedly the thickest, is likewise due to the same cause as well as due also to other changes taking place on the interior of this hollow globe. Probably also equally so in conjunction with the opposition of some other planetary influence, as for instance, the large sun spot which was so visible daytimes just before and after the foregoing far southern display.

Accepting then, propositionally that the cause of the phenomenon of the northern lights as well as that of the Southern Hemisphere are primarily caused by etheric and magnetic conditions within this proposedly hollow globe, it should be equally reasonable to contemplate the possibility also of other life, beings and intelligence within this earth-globe, since there could be no action without some being or intelligence to cause it. And while this too may as yet seem radical or as I may say, too occult for the limited mortal mind to comprehend, *it is nevertheless in harmony with the spiritual nature of man which is equally of a fourth-dimensional nature.* This should help to explain many other things besides the northern lights which science has not yet been able to explain sufficiently up to this present day.

claims of astrology. All he has to do is to answer the advertisements of those who for a dime will tell your fortune from the cradle to the grave. To these he gives birth day and birth year, such seldom even asking for the precise data necessary to erect a correct birth-chart. Then when he has collected a series of readings from these ten-cent advertisers, he has all the evidence he needs that astrology is false.

He does have, it is true, plenty of evidence that those who advertise to give something of immense value for almost nothing are charlatans. But he need not go to the get-rich-quick pretenders to astrology to prove this. He could learn it from a dozen other types of get-rich-quick advertisements found in the same periodicals from which he obtains the addresses of the fake astrologers.

But even with an array of such evidence he does not convince the man in the street, because that man already has learned that if he goes to a doctor, a dentist, or to any other professional man who makes exaggerated claims, and whose omnipotent services can be procured for a mere pittance, that he will be defrauded. He has learned not to expect something for nothing; and that in employing professional services of any kind it is necessary to consider reliability; and that those who have established themselves through merit do not advertise in the P. T. Barnum manner.

Primarily the birth-chart is a map of the astral body of the person then born. As a photographic negative bears the impress of light-waves reflected from the thing photographed, so the birth-chart pictures what the astral body of the individual then born contains.

This astral body holds within its organization all the experiences and mental states that the soul has had up to the time of human birth; these organized into stellar cells and stellar structures which form the character. The astral body, which the birth-chart maps, is thus a form built by mental and emotional states; and it is the function of the birth-chart to convey to the astrologer precise information regarding these mental factors and their relation one to the other as affecting the abilities and character, and therefore the destiny.

The relation existing between the most active, or dynamic, thought-built structures in the finer body, are mapped by aspects between the planets in the birth-chart. Relationships that are thus so constant and powerful build a line across the astral form, from one group of mental factors to another and this line which is mapped by an aspect, acts as an aerial to pick up energies which are broadcast from each of the planets involved in the aspect. Thus are those more pronounced factors of the character supplied with additional energy from their four-di-

mensional environment. Whether that energy when received adds harmony to the astral body, or adds discord, is determined by the way the mental factors were organized, which is mapped by the aspect.

Thus from a consideration of the character, which is mapped by the birth-chart, it is possible to determine the natural abilities and the normal trend of the events attracted; for these are shown by the organization of the character. This does not mean that the individual cannot develop abilities other than those shown in his birth-chart; but that experiences before human birth already have developed certain types of ability and he can utilize these natural talents with great ease. To develop qualities which are not shown in the birth-chart requires great expenditure of energy; for it means building into the character qualities which have had no previous existence there.

Ability, however, is only a part of the requirements to make a success of any enterprise. The environing circumstances must also be such that they will not attract calamity. Flood or hail may overtake the most skilled farmer. Fire may destroy the property of a competent merchant. Accident may cost the life of the most adroit aviator. Yet such occurrences are not blind luck; they are conditions which are attracted to the individual by the discords present in his astral body, and which are mapped in his birth-chart. A person of less ability often makes a success where a person of great ability fails, due to circumstances beyond the range of skill to prevent.

Furthermore, the birth-chart, in mapping harmonies and discords, reveals whether or not the individual will attract fortune or misfortune if he engages in a certain occupation. Thus it is the function of the birth-chart to reveal not only the natural talents, but also under what surroundings the individual can use them to be of greatest benefit to himself, and to be able to contribute his utmost to the advantage of the world.

When, according to definite ratios, the planets in the sky move forward to make progressed aspects, these release energies within the astral body of man in such a manner that temporary lines are built across the astral body. These lines act as temporary stellar aeri-als which pick up in unusual volume the energy broadcast from the planets mapped by their terminals. Whether the new energy thus picked up, radio fashion, and added to the thought-cells of the astral body is harmonious or discordant and to what extent, is revealed by the particular aspect.

As such stellar lines, or aeri-als, leading across the astral body, terminate in certain compartments of the finer form, each of which contains the thought-cells relating to specific departments of endeavor, it can be known

The police lie detector has nevertheless decisively shown that every time a criminal tells a falsehood, a quickening of the pulse is recorded. Are we therefore not justified in assuming that in honesty and integrity lie one of the great unsuspected underlying basic cures for high blood pressure? An optometrist, talking to his patient while examining her eyes, knew that she had told an untruth or in any event made a very exaggerated remark, as her eyes through the retinoscope in his hands suddenly revealed an error in refraction. Research has suggested a possible vibratory connection between the sun whose brightness illuminates the world, and the physical eye which radiates light to all material objects. Just as the pure and holy light of the wise sun drives away all darkness, will not likewise the eyes—the windows of our soul—be cleansed of all impurities when the veil of deception is lifted to no longer stain and dim the iris which reflects every physical irregularity? Is it therefore not feasible to assume that defective vision may in some measure be attributed to the blind spots in our character, thoughts and motives?

Splendid and rapid strides have been made in the realm of rational nutrition and healing in making available foods and remedies for the diabetic. Yet have not all these been powerless to regenerate the degenerated pancreatic cells so indispensable in sugar metabolism? Might not the thought suggest itself that fear, worry, anger, our fighting instinct, sexual excesses and other assorted forms of mental, moral, emotional and physical misconduct cause such a tremendous leakage of vital force that copious quantities of sugar are constantly being called and forced into the blood stream to replenish the sudden diminution of energy? When continued and persistent demands

are made upon the human edifice for sugar for quick energy, might not this cause a faulty metabolism to turn almost everything ingested to sugar and thus make available at all times in the blood stream an emergency reservoir, alert as a sentinel on duty if suddenly called upon for the rapid formation of sugar whenever heavy leakages of vital force occur? Diabetes as well as other diseases can be conquered only by the discovery of their CAUSES—and these lodge deep-seated in the interior recesses of our thoughts, feelings and motives or morals.

That is how the vital human engine becomes side-tracked and ultimately disconnected; then cellular systems set up on their own in the form of cancer, tumors, ulcers, microbic invasions, using the remnants of the great disorganized life to generate noxious growths or insurgent cells of a descending vibratory order. It starts the spectacle of a state or commonwealth breaking down into anarchy under the stress of vital disunion and moral corruption. Is it not reasonable to conclude that the anarchistic or insurgent cells in cancer are merely the end product—the outward manifestation of a persistent inward alienation in consciousness—a divorce or violation of the Laws of Harmony, Love and Unity? For in due time the vibratory forces of equity, or laws of compensation assert themselves, and the intruder, caught in the rebound of the force he himself generated, is compelled to yield in retreat under fire his usurped health possessions through the mansions of death. Hence to separate man's physical and moral or psychic natures is erroneous for any real understanding of life and the promotion of health.

It is an incredibly easy task, as well as an incredibly fruitful one to dispel unbrotherliness in our attitude of life, and displace it with feelings of tolerance, sympathy, patience, charity and good-will towards all that lives. Let us therefore wage ceaselessly with indefatigable energy the great battle between the two opposing forces in human nature—GOOD or GOD which fights for its right to live or EVIL, i.e., the demoniacal spirit which refuses to die—fighting each other since the mythical Cain and Abel all down the frontiers of recorded history.

that baffle the intelligence of historians. There has been no American president born under this sign. No president perhaps could command more admiration and profound respect than Patrick Henry and Nathan Hale. Attempts to elect a president born under the sign of the Twins have never been successful. In 1852, the Whig party, before passing out of existence, attempted the election of General Winfield Scott. In 1868, the older Democratic party nominated Horatio Seymour. Before 1872, it had ceased to be a major party, the present Democratic party having been founded in 1876 by Liberal Republicans. The Progressive party retired after nominating Robert M. LaFollette in 1924. A few years after inaugurating Jefferson Davis as president of the Confederacy without consulting the will of the people, the Confederacy ceased to exist. Shortly after Brigham Young was nominated for the presidency of a proposed republic of Deseret, he was named territorial governor of Utah, and plans for an independent republic were abandoned. Garet A. Hobart, the only vice-president born under this sign, survived only a year in office. Can it be said that, to a statesman or politician born under the sign of the Twins his nomination for the presidency may prove fatal to his party and his nomination for the vice-presidency may prove fatal to himself? The most prominent statesman of the present day, James A. Farley, postmaster general and chairman of the Democratic national committee, was born under this sign.

CRAB

The sign of the Crab was used to denote an ancient month beginning about the time of the summer solstice. The sun in the Crab has witnessed the birth of most remarkable British kings—Henry VIII, James I, and Edward VIII—and only successful nominees for the presidency of the United States, both of whom were in the line of succession before their nomination. John Quincy Adams was drafted for a second nomination, but was defeated. Calvin Coolidge, when requested to become a candidate for a second nomination, did not choose to run. The vice-presidents—Elbridge Gerry, Daniel D. Tompkins, George Mifflin Dallas, William A. Wheeler, and Calvin Coolidge—have all been able supporters of their administrations. All worked in harmony with the president. Perhaps the most prominent Americans of today born under this sign are Paul V. McNutt, resident commissioner in the Philippines; Vic Donahey, chairman of the Congressional committee to investigate the TVA; Ulysses S. Grant, whose name alone might prove an asset to

any Republican ticket. While their acceptance of presidential nomination without being in line of succession would be contrary to established precedent, they might impart much-needed strength to their parties as vice-presidential nominees.

LION

The ancient month of the Lion has given birth to dictators of many species and genera. The British throne was never occupied by a more successful monarch than the unhappy King George IV. When he was called to the throne as regent, after his country had been despoiled of her American colonies in a disastrous war against all the powers of this world, little was it dreamed that he was destined to die as monarch of an empire upon which the sun never sets. As Prince of Wales, he became a dictator in men's fashions, and even today London sets the styles. Notwithstanding his reputedly asinine intelligence, he was more successful than Napoleon I, emperor of the French, with his reputedly superior intelligence. The most distinguished American president has been General Simon Bolivar who, as president of the United States of Colombia, wielded a dictatorship over territory now embodied in the republics of Colombia, Venezuela, Panama, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Peru, and Bolivia. Haitians may recall Toussaint l'Ouverture; Texans, Mirabeau Bonaparte Lamar. Herbert Hoover is the only major party nominee and the only president of the United States of America born under this sign. As food administrator, with dictatorial powers, he demonstrated most acceptably how the distribution of food may win a war and afterward relieve distressed women and children in war-stricken areas. But during his presidency, when the capital was besieged by the Bonus Expeditionary Forces, they were not provided with enough food to win his campaign for re-election. The only vice-president born under the sign of the Lion has been George Clinton, whose long dictatorship in the state of New York terminated by his promotion to this higher office. Perhaps the most distinguished service has been that of Lewis and Clark. Statesmen born under the sign of the Lion have declined to establish precedents or to make any promises other than those exacted by the provisions of the Constitution. Their conduct after assuming office is unpredictable. Most prominent among contemporary statesmen born under the sign of the Lion are Benito Mussolini, premier of Italy; Hugh S. Johnson, former director of the NRA; Harry L. Hopkins, director of the

FERA; Martin L. Davey, governor of Ohio.

VIRGIN

Labor Day occurs during the ancient month of the Virgin, which was dedicated to virgins who toil. The month has given birth to notable sovereigns and princes—in England, to Queen Elizabeth and William IV; in Saxe-Coburg-Gotha, to Prince Albert; in France, to Louis XIV, Louis XVI, and Cardinal Richelieu. The most notable American president has been Porfirio Diaz, for many years dictator of the Mexican republic. In all of the reigns, incumbencies, or administrations that have endured for twenty years or more, history records a golden age. The most notable citizens of the United States have been Friedrich, baron von Steuben, and Gilbert, marquis de Lafayette, who valued their American citizenship above their birthrights. Their descendants are eligible to membership in the Sons of the American Revolution, sometimes in the Society of Cincinnati. There have been three major party nominees born under this sign: Benjamin Harrison, William Howard Taft, and Alfred M. Landon. Benjamin Harrison and William Howard Taft, who were born in or near the city of Cincinnati, and reared in Hamilton County, Ohio, on soil of which the virginity was broken by Revolutionary veterans, were elected to the presidency. Alfred M. Landon, who was born in Pennsylvania during the absence of his mother from her Ohio home, could not be elected. Both Benjamin Harrison and William Howard Taft were renominated by fellow Republicans who wished them to remain longer in the presidency, perhaps long enough to produce a golden age. Their campaigns for re-election might be taken to prove conclusively that there are considerations more earnestly desired by American citizens than a golden age. We have had three vice-presidents born under the sign of the Virgin. Hannibal Hamlin, who was born in Maine, was elected by a plurality vote. Thomas A. Hendricks and Charles G. Dawes, who were born in Ohio, were elected by a majority popular vote. It would seem that birth in Ohio to parents of revolutionary ancestry is prerequisite to election. For presidential nominees, Cincinnati seems a most favorable site. Perhaps our patrician families may some day produce a statesman who will bring us a golden age in a brief administration of only four years.
