

And when he had set the brands on fire, he let them go into the standing corn of the Philistines, and burned up both the shocks and also the standing corn, with the vineyards and olives." Sampson did this to get revenge on his father-in-law for taking his wife from him.

We read in the newspapers that "specialists" cast guinea pigs into a furnace to see if they could get the same lung effect in the guinea pigs that was found in a woman who was supposed to have crawled into the same furnace some time before.

Sampson was a man blessed by God and was given strength time and time again to slaughter his fellowmen. Specialists are licensed by the law to carry on scientific investigation. Just what the Massachusetts man had in mind is not made plain; however, he was made an example to prevent cruelty to animals.

Every day, everywhere, children are tying cats and dogs together, tying tin cans to dogs' tails and doing innumerable small things to inflict suffering on dumb animals. Could not this specific brand of cruelty be the result of an inferiority complex? Our later scientists, psycho-analysts and psychologists would tell us that "animals," "tails," "tying" and "fire" are ideas buried deep in the consciousness of the child. Torture, revenge, and delight in watching suffering are buried thrills which under certain emotions are brought into action.

This story of the three hundred foxes may be allegorical, but it produces complexes in the child mind which lead to childish pranks, too often laughed at by their elders. Later in life this same emotion develops into hate, revenge-seeking, love for sensation, or desire to delve into the mysteries of life.

Examples register on all the tissues of the body. Precepts register only when the brain cells are developed sufficiently to receive the spoken word. An act forces its registration on the tissues, while a precept must be compelled to register.

Shall we condemn the Massachusetts man for the deed done in his flesh that may have been incited by a historical event or allegorical story read by his ancestors for over one thousand years, or a practice carried on by a group of men protected by the law, causing dumb animals to suffer?

What would ye have men be that they may do the right and free humanity from this blight? Make ye not such examples before children if ye would have them follow the precepts of the teachings of great masters.

### The Income Tax

F THE PROPOSED state income tax law passes the Illinois legislature, it will be the "straw that will break the camel's back," unless it be taken from the surplus of those who have an over-abundance of wealth. A too heavy general tax becomes a canker sore to the struggling home builder of the state. Personal property, school and road taxes are permissible, provided they are uniform, but the income tax is the rattlesnake that kills the struggling and already over-burdened man and woman whose salaries are inadequate to their needs. The amount allowed which is exempt from tax is often not sufficient to provide for one person for a year, and to expect a man to care for his wife and children upon it is preposterous.

# The Shortest RADIO Waves DISCOVERED (How They Are Relayed To Every Radio Cell in The Human Radio Station

A LL living things are composed of one or many radiant cells. The blood, tissues and organs of the human body are made up of an infinitude of "radio" cells. The cells of the brain contain the

The cells of the brain contain the same substances as the cells of the liver, spleen or muscles, or any other organ. The only difference is in their arrangement and proportion.

Each and every cell in the human body station consists of a fluid atmosphere composed of the dualistic, complementary (vitamin) coloray potencies known as nucleus and protoplasm in physiology.

These radio cell stations vary in

contour but not in structure or function. What is true of the construction of the radio cells of the brain is equally true of the cells composing the various other organs of the human station.

But the products of the receptions and the broadcasting taking place between the constituents of the radio cells and those of the radio-active blood system are different; that is, the stomach cells produce stomach cells and gastric juices, the liver cells produce liver cells and bile juices, whereas the brain cells produce brain cells and cerebral juices, etc.

The nucleus, like a sun, is also a receiving and broadcasting station in each radio solar cell system. And just as the levic coloray waves of air, water and sunlight "blended" and combined with the gravic coloray minerals of the soil, contain the nourishment in the vegetable kingdom, so do the coloray gases and fluids in and around solar cell systems contain the nutriments in harmony or discord (dis-ease) to oscillate and produce or manifest their existence in the solar planetary system of the human station.

The sun (nucleus) of the radio cell solar system is the receiving station and the broadcasting station of that planetary system, and receives its incoming colorays from the liquid atmosphere surrounding it, which are supplied by the blood stream. By a reverse process, the static wastes of the cell system are broadcast to the blood stream to be refined, neutralized and eliminated by way of the excretory system.

Whatever the liquid atmospheres of the solar cell systems receive from the blood supply the nucleus-sun station must and will accept up to a certain maximum, and whatever the sun station broadcasts or throws off as discord or waste, the atmospheric blood stream must accept and carry away.

The coloray atmospheres of the planetary solar cell systems are mostly liquids. The form-elements of this atmosphere build and rebuild the cells and are complementary coloray affinities. The sun-nucleus and the proto-minerals which are interdependent upon each other exist not only in the atmosphere of the cell systems but also in the sun-nucleus as well, in a more levic amplitude or state.

None of the fluids or cells of the body can survive when deprived of either of the complementary coloray elements, the levic sun-nucleus or the gravic proto-minerals.

Thus the radio man station cannot live, grow, maintain or gain health without continually supplying this complementary coloray balance derived from beneath and above the Mother Earth surface, thriving in the identical way, on the same coloray elements of the air, light and minerals foods as plant life does—a double coloray blend between the levic colorays and the gravic mineral colorays. Above the earth line we have the levic primary

colorays of the radio sun station, and beneath the earth line we find the gravic coloray minerals of the Mother Earth station—the "crest" and the "trough" of the vitamin coloray form-elements, the missing link in dietetics.

Therefore, we remain healthy as long as we can get the right quality and proportion of food, and like the plants, we wither and suffer from static discord (or dis-ease) if we get too little or too much of either or both kinds of food colorays.

The coloray elements that aid in keeping the radio cells harmonious and healthy and prevent them from discord and decomposition are the gravic coloray minerals in the food which the human station never recognizes by taste or smell, as they get into the blood and organs through the medium of air, water and food consumed.

Hence the harmony and health of the average huntan station is a matter of chance.

The blood and flesh composed of the radio cells will become static and distintegrate inside the human station as well as outside the station, unless it is "tuned in" and blended properly with the levic primary colorays of the sun station and the gravic primary colorays of the Mother Earth station working in an oscillative unity with the food consumed.

To maintain or regain harmony (health) and prevent or "tune out" static (discord or disease) of the radio cells, the organs of the human station must be continually supplied, from water, air and food, with the right variety and proportion of the coloray minerals to combine the normal products or neutralize the abnormal static poisonous products which the planetary cell systems manufacture in health as well as in discord or disease.

Therefore, the living radio cell station has the potential receptivity of "tuning in" and blending the levic and gravic (vitamin) colorays to manifest radio-activity and broadcast harmony (health) or discord (disease) according to the condition of the atmosphere surrounding the cell station. If there is too much continual static-discord, the cells will disintegrate by the aid of [Continued in page 30]

Of all the flimsy excuses for not doing good, none is more absurd than that of pretending that we have no right to change karma, because every one gets what he deserves. other, and very much more important. That which will be beneficial to many must be looked upon as better than that which will benefit only a few.

Those who have no faith in a hereafter cannot be blamed so very much if they only think of getting all the pleasure they can out of this earth-life, robbing and cheating where they can not get what they want by any other means. Those who have a second-hand belief in another life but think that they can be forgiven if they do some wrong to help themselves, will usually not hesitate to act selfishly, and will do as little as possible for their neighbors, unless they see some benefit to themselves in doing so. Even this is to some extent excusable; for those people are thinking of themselves as entirely separated from other beings, and don't care what happens to others, as long as they themselves are on the safe side.

But then we have another set of people—those who believe, or pretend to believe, that helping others is the best self-help of all and that selfishness is the greatest hindrance on the path towards perfection and happiness. How many of them show by their acts that they have such a belief? They want others to show it, and their spying on their associates is very keen. Nothing seems to make them happier than the discovery that some of their fellow believers don't do as they preach. They seem to want something like this as an excuse for their own delinquency. Why don't they copy those who fulfill the good law instead of those who do not?

The law is plain. "Sow kindly acts, and thou shalt reap their fruition. Inaction in a deed of mercy becomes an action in a deadly sin, Thus saith the Sage. Shalt thou abstain from action? Not so shall gain thy soul her freedom. To reach Nirvana one must reach Self-Knowledge, and Self-Knowledge is of loving deeds the child." (*Voice of the Silence*, 31-32.)

I have heard many repeat these truthful words about loving deeds who very carefully abstained from following the advice, but considered it essential for others to do so instead, and who were the first to accuse these, if they were no better than their accusers. They liked all kindly acts shown to themselves, but preferred "inaction in a deed of mercy," when someone else needed help. They acknowledged that it was duty to help, but were satisfied when others did so—as if the law had not been for them, as if they had been exceptions to the rule.

I remember well the attitude of many theosophists towards Mme. Blavatsky. Her misfortunes were "karma"; we ought to abstain from helping her, because she deserved what came to her. But if we had helped --why would not *that* also have been karma?

"If the Masters wanted H. P. B. to have plenty of

money, they would give it to her themselves, or they would arrange so that she could get it," said one of the wiseacres. "They c o u l d make the money as easily as they can make tea-cups and duplicate brooches. The fact that they don't give things to her shows that she shouldn't have it."

"A clever way of excusing ourselves from doing our duty," I answered. "I don't believe that Masters are counterfeiters or thieves, nor that they would ever prevent us from earning 'good karma' by doing what we can. Let us not excuse ourselves, but try to emulate Countess Wachtmeister and the Keightleys in doing what we can, without being scared by the spooky idea that we interfere with karma when we do good. If we were to wait until we are omniscient before we tried to help in any case, we would never amount to anything in this world, nor in the next."

People nowadays are well aware that diseases can be healed not only by allopathic and homeopathic drugs, by diet, by electricity and by manipulation, but also by chromopathic and other methods. To deny a disease and say that it does not exist except in the mortal mind is a sophism, as long as it is actually weakening the body and is apt to kill it. In that way we deceive ourselves. Why not use some means to get rid of this evil, without waiting for omniscience to tell us whether it is time to cure or to let it kill? Some people say that we can gain this omniscience by astrology. If we had some infallible astrology, perhaps we could. But where is that astrology? And where are the infallible astrologers that use it? Better stumble along and do good, karma and astrology notwithstanding, than to play at "inactivity in a deed of mercy" and commit the crime of "action in a deadly sin."

My old friend William Q. Judge used to say that healing by mental means was unwise, because it hindered the disease from going out from the body the natural way and drove it into the astral and mental planes, making the patient sick astrally and mentally instead of physically. What W. Q. J. meant by his expression "healing by mental means" was to heal by suggestion or by hypnotism. In both cases the reality of the disease is denied. This seems to drive the disease *in* instead of *out*.

Once I was asked whether I considered it to be right to heal those that did not want to be healed. To take away anything that is thought to be desirable for some reason would hardly be kind. I knew a case where the sick person was petted and his work done by others just because he was sick. He was paid for that which other people did for him, and he was praised and promoted for what they had done. He existed on what others did for him because he was sick; he lived on his own sickness, as the physicians live on the sickness of other people. As long as he liked such a life it would have been mean to deprive him of his means of existence.



the body. Because of this deficiency a man may suffer from the most terrible ailments, impossible to cure until the element fluorin is supplied, in FOOD form.

Whenever people inherit a lack of a chemical element, certain parts, functions and organs of the body are more or less defective. This, together with the leading chemical elements utilized, results in a certain shape and size of body, tissue structure, color of skin, kind of hair, nails, teeth, as well as characteristic symptoms, ailments and diseases, calling for certain foods. It results in a distinct type in general appearance, anatomical build and temperament.

Fluorin hunger of a dietetic origin does not affect general appearance nor anatomical build, but when of an inherited origin, it does. The Pargenic, or Fluorin-hunger Type has fixed moods. He has still and sulky spells. He may sulk for weeks for no seeming reason. He may sit and listen for some time and say nothing, then all at once, he arouses and converses in a critical, sarcastic, bitter, caustic and cynical manner. As a rule, he makes no effort to please people, and has very few friends, except those he gains through admiration of his mental capacity. He comes and goes when he pleases, acts, speaks, studies and writes according to his own notions, keeping his plans to himself. He is close-mouthed, especially about his own affairs and people know nothing about his soul life, his internal worries, his struggles with others and with himself, his disappointments, secret plans, silent inten-tions and repressed emotions. He is morose, abstract in mind. His dislikes are eternal; his hatreds, notions, suspicions, fears, delu-sions and latent diseases always prevail. He is inordinately conceited, and thinks no one so great as he. He feels he is a law to himself and to others, all sufficient. He never asks advice. He learns more from his own reasoning than he can learn from books.

He has either a fiery-red or a clay-like or inflamed complexion, a prominent lower jaw and a more or less greasy appearance of face, neck, scalp and hair. He is inclined to baldness in spots, loss of eyelids and eyebrows. Inflamed nail roots may bother him. He has a croupy throat and suffers from bronchial ailments. The alienist in his studies of mental diseases would find this patient very puzzling, if he had to deal with him, for he seems rational, yet peculiar. He can reason like a lawyer and we find this Type among our best and most prominent lawyers. As a patient, the Pargenic complains of shivers in his brain and nerves. He complains of tremendous headaches, unbearable and continuous (that kind of headache from which our subject, Oscar Wilde, suffered until he died). This patient suffers from nervous shock, nerve and brain sensations of a dull, trembling, uneasy, moving.

twitching and burning nature, always centering in the stomach. His headache may be so severe that he may apply almost boiling water to his head in order to relieve the pain.

Now he has feelings of tremendous power and strength, then he appears as little in his own eyes as a pinhead. Horrible psychic experiences come to him. Brain visions of a repugnant nature haunt him. He often takes a dislike to his own family, wife and children, and gives his time to strangers. He is often gruff and surly at home, and, when he is in the mood, even in public. He is ungracious in manner unless he sees fit to hide it. Because they are so changeable in moods, they are not able to hold friends, neither do they care. They often have an intense desire to hide, and do things in an underhanded manner. They tend to a philosophical turn of mind, are deep thinkers and original. It is very difficult for them to learn from books, although they read a great deal for the purpose of thinking things out. They learn and remember that which they can work out in their own brain.

Socrates, from all we know of him, his appearance, the outline of his face and head, his manner of reasoning, his fearlessness and independence in action, his willingness to die as an enforced suicide, his genius-like ability to reason and see through human motives, indicate to us that he was a Pargenic Type of a high evolutionary order. He believed himself guided by an internal voice of warning.

These people are wonderful as cross-examiners, and make high-class lawyers, statesmen, logicians. They are inclined to look at the pessimistic side of life, always expect the worst, and are surprised when good happens. They are usually doubters of religious creeds and doctrines, scoffers of faith. They are materialistic philosophers and reasoners, when they are brainy.

#### Principal Disease Tendencies of the Pargenic Type.

Blindness, disorganization of bones, erysipelas, terrible headache, tuberculated leprosy, mania, puffy obesity, putrefaction, running sores, scurvy, scrofula, skin diseases, brain tumors, toxemia. The cure is a prolonged Fluorin diet, extending over from five to ten years; very hot baths; formic acid foods; plenty of quiet and rest, simple life, rural environment, possibly horticulture as an employment (for sake of health), control of passion, emotion and excitement. Certain sea food, dairy products, broths, greens and vegetables may be so prepared that the fluorin in these foods is preserved. Present processes of food preparation and preservation are such that the fluorin element is usually lost, we are sorry to say. This is the reason that those people who lack this element hardly ever obtain it in the ordinary diet and so suffer for a lifetime because of this chemical lack. Fluorid of lime or ammonium flurid introduced as drugs into the body have very little benefit, if not doing a great deal of harm, in the treatment of diseases of the spleen, in tuberculosis, bone induration, bony tumors and other ailments from which this Type suffers, but if physicians and dietitians would only remember the word ORGANIC when it is a question of health, all patients would gain.

If fluorin were supplied in normal quantities in the daily diet, it would be possible to prolong life or at least preserve youthfulness later in life, for people who have this element in abundance look young when they are old. It is the greatest preservative element that enters the human body. It works in the solid structures, with calcium and silicon, to preserve teeth and bones. Skulls, teeth, skeletons have come down to us from the prehistoric ages—from the Eocene and Miocene epochs, preserved in our geological museums, as perfect as they ever were, but only when self-preserved in life, by the fluorin element in the body. The skull and bones of a man who dies with a lack of fluorin in his bones, crumble and

#### OSCAR WILDE

Oscar Wilde, the Irish poet and novelist, became noted for his eccentricities in dress and manner (no doubt assumed for advertising purposes and because of his inordinate conceit). He was admired for his brilliant, caustic conversation and speeches, as well as his writings. He is described by biographers as being tall and of great corpulence, having a high (red) complexion, with fleshy, plump hands. His voice was high pitched and strident when excited.

He suffered from severe splitting headaches directly over the eyes, which haunted him until his death. His ailments, his personality, his size and type of body, his complexion, hands, as well as his life and habits generally, his genius and his wit, all proclaim him a man of the Pargenic Type.

His father, an eminent physician of his day, was known for his disposition to "sow wild oats"; while his mother was an extremely tall and heavy woman, described as almost a giantess. She also was a brilliant writer, a poet. The chances are that she, as well as her son, belonged to this Type. Damnation-Propaganda-Drive of the Anti-Evolution members of the Church societies.

The question needs no debating as to whether man came from the ape. We would sooner think that the ape was an evolution of man.

When we read of the sacrifices that have been offered, the sacrificial atonements demanded and made in the name of the Lord, at the command of God, the Creator of Man,

and think of these two great conflicting forces today one defending Religion, the other defending Science, we wonder at man's folly and stupidity.

Does Science need defense? Should religion be defended? Hasn't it spoken for itself? Nineteen hundred years have passed since the supreme sacrifice of Jesus, the recognized Savior of the World, and for countless ages before, mankind walked and talked with the selfsame God whose religion is being defended in the hills of Tennessee. Hasn't it had all the trial to which it is rightfully entitled? What has it given man? Little children are robbed today. Human lives are sacrificed and debauchery exists as of old. Has there been any evolution? We enjoy inventions today (inspired by independent thinkers) that give *time* to man. All over the world the voice is heard. Wonderfully marvelous things are man's possessions. But what progress has *man* made?

Do we need debates whether religion or science shall live? We say, "Produce—and let us judge as to which shall live!" Religion drips with the blood of the human race—year in and year out—individual, wholesale, national, and international. Read the sacred records

Before you know it, that part of our constitutional law that gives men freedom to worship (or not) will be blotted off the records of this great countryand in its place-the Hangman's Rope. It is a debate in which nations will be involved. It is THE BEGINNING of a WORLD - WIDE MOVE-MENT to deprive you of YOUR RIGHT TO THINK.





THE POWER OF SUGGESTION

G. W. Loutitt, in Rays from the Rose Cross, says, "Suggestion plays an important part in our lives." Autosuggestion is understood and practiced by every intelligent physician who recognizes imaginary ailments of some patients, and bread pills or colored aqua pura are prescribed to remove the delusion by the belief in the curative powers of medicine.

Suggestion can paralyze or kill, make or mar the course of human lives, individually, or in "group" acceptance, as when mass suggestion ruled during the Middle Ages, sweeping great areas, causing epidemics, and assorted hallucinations beyond belief.

The author says, "The belief that stones and relics have power to effect cures brings the desired results through suggestion, as in the legendary beliefs of soldiers in the Great War in a critical moment of battle, or in religious excitements where great numbers of intelligent, reasoning people fall into a faint, shout fantastic ravings, sway backward and forward upon their knees, or roll over the ground, wailing like madmen."

Gap and the world gaps with you, think for yourself, and you think alone. Suggestion rules the greater part of the world, for better or worse. If you itch to talk of vermin, it's almost sure to be felt. Eating a harmless food, and being told it is poison, has caused fatalities. Fashion governs society through suggestion. Suggestion has parted as many sewing machines from housewives as upto-date salesmen have parted cars from hard-headed husbands.

History has recorded "made to order" war propaganda that short-changed nations within a few months both mentally and financially through the psychology of suggestion. Religious faith, fear and fire are appeals to suggestion—not to reason.

As G. W. Loutitt says, "Suggestion is the parent, fear its executioner. Since we know the law of suggestion, why not use it for good instead of evil?" Why not use it for construction individually, nationally, and internationally?

#### PHOENOMENAL INCREASE OF CRIME IN INDIANA

"Indiana has just passed a law making the possession of liquor a crime, even when it has been prescribed by a physician. With a stroke of his pen the Governor has converted at least one-half of the male population of this state into criminals. After one week 250 people have been caught and sent to jail, and if the law is strictly enforced, sooner or later the state will have to abandon all other public works and devote the proceeds of taxation to building places of confinement. If any funds are left, they might well be devoted to erecting lunatic asylums for the remainder of the population which is responsible for such laws. The mania for regulating other people's habits is a far more dangerous form of insanity than most to be found in the insane asylums at present. There is one exception in Indiana-wine for sacramental purposes (all other is sacrilegious). Become a priest and you may have a whole cellar full and celebrate the Lord's Supper six times a day with impunity, or oftener if you can carry it. Virtue-of a kind-is its own reward. No legislator has as yet ventured to prescribe the size of the sacramental dram." -The O. E. Library Critic.

#### MY GREATEST DISCOVERY

One of the rarest of human virtues is an open mind. The majority of us borrow our opinions from other people, getting them from books or through our environment. 

among the people and the last part of the name is especially rich with them. If this state has so far done anything, the writer does not know of it. They are covered with a cloud of pinkish gold.

The Trentino, which was awarded to Italy, vibrates 7 and the people called are the 5-9-6, which find their average in 2. These people are alight with patriotism. The feeling they have for their soil is the strongest thing which actuates them. In the end they may turn their talent to practical uses, but not for some time. Two (2) is, moreover, a destructive force, separated from the 1 and 3. It does nothing and is subject to violent explosions, so something is likely to occur which will break up their country. They are covered with magenta and gold.

The Free State of Fiume, of which we at one time heard so much, vibrates 11-7, and calls for inhabitants of the 8 variety. This is a high vibration and should endure, for the 11 in the name is a Master Number, and the 8 of the inhabitants is another Master. They will have plenty of business sense, but there is a scarcity of workers. The 11 in the name will give them plenty of inventive skill, but the 8's are big business people and do not take naturally to laborious occupations. There are few workers shown—only one 6 and not a single 4—mostly 5's. If they use their inventive skill to make their dreams come true, they will succeed, but if they do nothing but dream, their state will eventually be taken from them. Seven (7) is a musical number, so something in music may result. The 7 also shows their attachment to their home soil, their patriotism. They cling to it with tooth and nail. They are colored with a varied light of violet, yellow, black and white, and permeated with a canary yellow for the people.

Alsace and Lorraine, which have recently changed hands, show very different vibrations. Alsace vibrates to the versatile, eager, fascinating 5, while the people deal principally with the products of the earth, as represented by 7. If this is where the potash imported comes from, the vibration fits them. They are probably alive with patriotism too.

Lorraine, which vibrates the high Master Number 11, and calls people of o-a-i-e, finds its average in 3. The probability is that patriotism appealed more to Alsace than it did to Lorraine, for people of lower vibration are more attached to a particular piece of soil.

Goritzia and Istria, just above the Free State of Fiume, were awarded to Italy. Istria may possibly be heard from.

There remains Poland. It is an old country, which kept its name unchanged. Poland vibrates 8, a Master Number, while the people are composed only of 6's and 1's. These are 7's and represent patriotism and love of home. The people vibrate lower than the country which called them, and are never likely to rise to the universal ideal held by the country. The country is covered with a light of yellow and purple.

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# Methods of Magic

#### By JACOB BONGGREN

Europe from the Asiatic motherland by one of the thirty-five minor Buddhas, with the same propriety could be given the name of divine or white magic.

The old myths of the Northlands tell that the evil magic of seid was brought to divine Asgard and human Midgard from hyperborean Joetunheim by Loki, incarnation of the selfish cunning of the lower mind, and by Gullweig, mercenary gold-thirst. In the Saga of Harold Fairhair in Heimskringla by Snorre Sturlason we read that the sixth consort of that king, Snidfrid, daughter of Svasi the Finn, by evil magic kept herself young and beautiful for a long time. We read also of her grandson Eivind Fountain and others, who injured people by their baneful spells. In our own time Scandinavians point to Lapland and to northern Finland as the home of this kind of magic, indicating that it belonged originally to the Finnish-Ugrian or Tschudic races and not to the Aryans. The Gypsies are also known to use magic, some of which at least, being used for healing, could not be called evil. The beneficent magic, on the other hand, seems to be the favorite method of the Arvan Nordics, though doubtless both kinds have been used occasionally by the Aryans as well as by the Non-Aryans.

Having had the opportunity to meet exponents of both kinds of magic, there were certain fundamental facts in connection with them that I discovered quite early. Every true student of occultism, hence also of the fundamentals of magic, who is willing to help humanity and to forget himself, will see the tremendous importance of these facts, once they are stated to him.

First, as to the teaching of the art. Magic is invariably taught by an older to a younger person, and in strict privacy. Only the pupil who has perfect and never-failing confidence in his teacher can ever himself learn magic and become a real magician. Disloyalty to the teacher, distrust of him and doubt of the truth of his teachings disable the pupil. Such a one can just as little use the finer forces of Nature as an author can exercise his faculties in writing an essay, in case he doubts his facts and his ability to present them properly and convincingly.

Faith as a stepping-stone to knowledge is just as much the foundation of magic as it is of any other science and art. If we do not accept as a starting point for comparison and for other mental exercises on our road toward knowledge what our senses present to us, we can learn nothing through our

observations. We must first accept on faith the statements of our teacher: "This is A, this is B," etc. If we do not, we will never know the alphabet, consequently we will neither be able to read nor to write. The reality of magic, at first only a theory to the student, will be demonstrated by faithfully carrying out the scheme given by the teacher, whether it be an incantation, a symbolical act, or a mental exercise in solemn meditation. The first verification transforms faith into knowledge. Next time the neophyte uses magic, he performs his part better and with quicker results. The third time he is already an expert in his art. Now he knows, and now he can perform properly what he sets out to do, for the will of the knower is united to the Divine Will Omnipotent.

It is of the greatest importance to carry out to the very letter the dictates of the teacher. Each incantation must be rendered exactly as taught, with the same intonation, in the same way. The attention of the magician must be thoroughly fixed on what he says or does. No other thought whatsoever must be permitted for the time being to enter his mind. The most intense onepointedness, which is the firm focalization of will, gives here, as in every other activity, the most perfect result.

Magic rests on the cornerstones of a few great fundamental truths which may be stated as follows:

 Everything that exists is alive. There is no dead matter. There is transition and transformation of form, but no destruction of life.

 Everything is connected with and related to everything else. There are closer and more distant relations and connections.

3. Similarities indicate more intimate relations; dissimilarities signify difterences of some kind.

 The Law of Analogy is the directory of magical relations. The Code of Correspondence is the guide of the magician.

5. Entities with bodies of finer matter obey the orders of the true magician as faithfully as they carry out in all the kingdoms of Nature the dictates of the Grand Architect of the Universe.

6. He who uses magic must *dare* and *do*, without doubt and without hesitation.

7. He must by all means keep silent. He cannot relate to others what mantras and magic methods he has himself been taught by an older person, except in private, to a pledged pupil, in the same way that it was given to him. Methods

MAGIC is the science and art of accomplishing more or less remarkable things in a perfectly natural way, but with uncommon and subtle means. Magic is called malevolent or black when performed for mercenary purposes, for spite and revenge, to help the criminally inclined and to hurt others. It is called beneficent or white when it is done gratuitously, to help, to encourage, and to protect fellow-beings.

Notwithstanding age-long attempts to kill magic by ridicule, to declare it a delusion and a snare and to call its methods ineffective, it is still alive and active, partly performed as of old, partly under new disguises, and with its new scientific name of *mental suggestion*, it has been voted a seat of honor in modern therapeutics.

It is but natural that conceited scientists do not admit rustic pagan lore to their exclusive academic circles until after its conversion and its baptism. Another name and a new baptismal garb will not change the character of the old fellow, but it will change most decidedly the attitude of the general public, which does not recognize in the well-recommended scientific method of mental suggestion the vilified "sorcery" of past centuries. Those who discredit and denounce magic always give to it the nickname of "sorcery," which means using the art for evil purposes.

The fact that magic in olden time was practiced everywhere and that it still is in use, though generally under other names and with various disguises, indicates most decidedly that man in all ages, in all countries, and in all climes, has instinctively recognized the power of mind over matter, of the invisible over the visible. Even rank materialism could not blot this splendid intuition out of human souls. People may change the name of magic as much as they like; the thing itself remains forever.

On the Scandinavian peninsula two distinct kinds of magic have been known and practiced from time immemorial. The writers of the eddas and of the sagas have many things to tell about both. One kind is said to have originated with the joetuns, the giants, inhabitants of the Jœtunheim in the arctic north. The other kind, tradition tells, was brought to northern Europe by Odin, the divine king and leader of the ancestors of our Nordic race. Seid, the malignant sorcery of the giants, might be properly called Atlantean black magic, while to the beneficent method of help and healing. which was brought to


The minister, after lifting his hands to still the passing comments on the appearance of the pair, drawled out:

THERE is a revolt in healing. During the past ten years discoveries have been made which have revolutionized the entire healing world. Until then drugging was very popular. Every drug in the pharmacopia (almost 40,000) was used to suppress or stimulate symptoms. Lately a change has occurred. We are fast learning that Nature is the only doctor and that drugs, notwithstanding the fact that they seem to help, are very injurious and rush the individual to an earlier grave.

With the awakening to the fact that drugs are harmful, physicians have turned to foods and proper living as a medium for regaining and retaining health, but that does not always prove beneficial, because the foods which are beneficial to some individuals may be harmful to others. Thousands of people die dieting because their foods have not been selected because their foods have not been selected for their individual needs. Scientists have actually discovered that it is true—what is food for one is poison for another.

For instance, a gray-eyed person will find lemon juice very beneficial, especially if suffering from rheumatism. In fact, 75 per cent of all rheumatic conditions may be cured by lemon juice. But if that same gray eye is engraved with too many white lines, or if there is a watery graycolor around the pupil, we find that lemon juice is harmful and other foods must be substituted.

This brings us to one of the most remarkable discoveries of today, known as Iriology. Iriology is the study of the iris P Iriology. Iriology is the study of the iris or the colored portion of the human eye. We have discovered that all babies are born with blue eyes. Sometimes the eyes of a new-born babe may be blackish blue, be violet blue, grayish blue, or a slightly eye brownish blue, but there is always a publicish foundation. brown, etc. You no doubt have observed it and wondered why.



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IRISH WISDOM, PRESERVED IN BIBLE AND PYRAMIDS, by Conor MacDari. Boston: The Four Seas Company. \$2.50.

This book is indeed unique. It tells us the Bible is an Irish book which has been changed to suit Great Britain and Rome; that the Hebrew language is an artificial dialect, used by the Irish and not by the Jews; that the Egyptians and the Phoenicians were Irish, and that the great pyramid is an Irish temple. In fact, says the author, Jesus never existed, at least not in Palestine. He was Iesa, the old Irish Sun god, who had dozens of other names besides. The different names of persons and places in the Bible are Irish, he says. The author translates lots of Bible names into Irish, and he gives six pages of Irish words with their Hebrew equivalents. Like a true son of Erin, he blames the English for all kinds of things; for the perversion of the Bible, for the repression of the old Irish faith; for the conquest of Ireland, started by the only pope of English birth, Adrian IV. (Nicholas Breakspear) who permitted Henry II. to attack Ireland; finally also for calling themselves Anglo-Saxons, while they were really two-thirds Irish !

It will probably be difficult for the author to convince the Jews, who still read Hebrew, that their language is nothing but an artificial Irish dialect, and to make the general public believe that the Egyptians, who left so great monuments and such a mass of literature, did not exist, but were ancient Irishmen, together with the Phoenicians. Still, it might be easier than it was for the German who some ten years after the death of Napoleon I. demonstrated scientifically that the great conqueror was a Sun myth and had never lived, notwithstanding what his still-living mother and all those who had recently seen him would say.

I suggest another name for this book —Irish Wit. The Irish are great jokers. To tell without smiling that there were and are no Jews and that the Jewish language is some Irish slang (i. e., that the Hebrew is the language of a people that never existed) is a good joke. But the best joke of all is probably this, that the old enemies of the Irish, the Englishmen, are said to be Irish.

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
Of the many new theories that Conor MacDari presents in his book, a few are worthy of particular mention. He says that the Aryans are Irish; that the Irish gave the different nationalities their religion; that Sanskrit, like Hebrew, is an Irish dialect; that the British and the Romans together invented the historians Herodotus, Berosus, Manctho, Josephus, Eusebius, Origen and Augustine, and wrote the histories to suit themselves; that they re-wrote the Irish Bible and translated it into Greek, so as to deceive the multitude, and 'that the true Pope, or Priest-King, had from time immemorial had his capital in Tara, Ireland, until the Roman Pope, with the assistance of Englishmen, conquered the Irish church, substituting it for the Roman and the High Church of England. He tells us, too, that Irish monks under the guidance of British officials wrote Shakespeare's works. So he is Irish too!

Incidentally, the author forgets his warfare against the Roman church and the British officialdom and speaks of the *universal symbolism* of religions and philosophies, which is an undeniable fact. His patriotic mistake of making that symbolism all Irish and using, as we call it, only one of the Seven Keys, will be forgiven in view of his innumerable jokes and Irish bulls, and the vivid imagination he shows throughout the book. Such wit and such imagination cover a multitude of sins.—J. B.

#### KNOW THYSELF. The Secret of Life and the Joy of Living. By Prof. Joseph J. Higgs, B. M. S., 2Ed. \$1.50.

The happy face that smiles at you from the frontispiece of this book has its own tale to tell you. It speaks of "the joy of living." The book tells you in language vibrating with happiness how much sweetness and sunshine there is in this world, if we only try to appreciate it. The author does not say that there are not difficulties and dark paths in the world, but he wants us to "see across our poor lives a splendid goal and a boundless future." "Find your work," he says, "and you will love it. Self-expression is the secret of satisfaction."

On the title-page this book is called "The greatest book of the age on the greatest subject known to mankind." Perhaps it is not quite that, though.



UNMASKING OUR MINDS, by David Seabury. New York: Boni and Liveright, 3rd edition. \$2.50.

In our day, when everyone reads about psychoanalysis, everyone who reads should know what psychoanalysis is. There are many German books written about the subject by such authorities as Freud, Jung, Adler and others, and they are gradually being translated into English, but are generally dry and technical. Here is a book which is far from dry, and the author has such a fine flow of clear, plain language, that when he sometimes uses technical terms, he is also explaining them.

explaining them. David Seabury has a well-deserved reputation as a psychologist. He has pursued his studies of psychology and psychoanalysis abroad, and acquainted himself with the most advanced discoveries and teachings in the mental sciences. On his return from abroad he became consulting psychologist at a military academy. Later he opened an office, and eventually he became a platform lecturer as a means of performing his life work more effectively. He is now recognized as one of the foremost authorities in applied psychology.

His teaching is his own. This book unites the useful essentials of such contrasting leaders as Freud, Jung, Adler, Tansley, Watson, McDougall, and the Dynamic School, to the basic teachings of James. It is presented in the same clear and practical terms that have brought him in such wide demand as a lecturer.

The very make-up of this book makes it pleasant to read, and its lucid, easyflowing language is like the sugar-coating to the medical pill. Some learned men think that they have to write ponderous, unintelligible stuff to show their learning. This author shows it in a very different way, and in a way that is greatly to be preferred.—J. B.

#### WHY I AM A SPIRITUAL VAGA-BOND, by Thomas L. Masson. New York: Century Co. \$2.00.

It is better that we call ourselves names than that other people pester us with such. And it is best of all that other people contradict us and tell us the nickname we have given ourselves does not fit us. This is what happens to Mr. Masson when he pretends to be a "spiritual vagabond." He is nothing of the kind. He loves liberty as we all do, I hope. That is our privilege in this country, to which the Statue of Liberty points the way—if we happen to come from the east.

Mr. Masson can very well say with the old Roman, "Amicus Socrates, amicus Plato; sed magis amica Veritas." He loves his spiritual teachers, but he loves Truth the best. And he tells in this book how he, the creator of the "Short Turns and Encore" department of *The Saturday Evening Post*, and for twenty years the humorist editor of *Life*, became serious minded, and how he found a way to peace, strength and assurance. He tells it in a pleasant and very interesting way.

Mr. Masson is here pointing to a way, a method, an approach to the peace that comes from fulfilling that disintegrating central lack, "vagabondism" which makes mankind so restless.—J. B.

THE UNFINISHED WORK OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMER-ICA, by C. DeVos, Coopersville, Michigan. The Author. Paper, \$1.00.

The DeVos books represent typographical art of beauty.

In this book he discusses our own country, and shows that there is much "unfinished work" here. Indeed there is. He discusses the question, starting with the unused (Masonic) seal of the U. 



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

that to make occult training a success, the neophyte must not mix different schemes and methods. He must each time faithfully follow one distinct plan and method from beginning to end. The orders given to him by his preceptor must be carried out in all their details. He must use unaltered the meditations and mantras presented to him, in the order and at the time prescribed. The same holds good with reference to magic. Such is the brief outline of its methods.

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
